Red Dragons Empire 8 Runner-up, Postseason Qualifier in 2018

Cortland placed second in the Empire 8 with a 5-2 league record and finished 7-3 overall during the 2018 season. The Red Dragons' three losses were by only a combined 13 points. Cortland earned its 23rd postseason berth as the Empire 8's qualifier for the New York Bowl, but was denied a chance to successfully defend its crown as the game was canceled due to the lack of a declared opponent from the Liberty League.

Cortland set school records for scoring average (39.3 points per game) and passing yardage average (295.9 yards per game), while quarterback **Brett Segala** set a school regular-season mark with 2,671 passing yards.

Jake Smith earned D3football.com All-America and All-East honors on special teams (two blocked kicks) and **Cole Burgess** was an All-East kick returner (28.7 yards per kickoff return, two touchdowns). **Nick Mongelli** was named the Empire 8 Special Teams Player of the Year after making 8-of-9 field goals along with a school regular-season record 47 PAT kicks.

Smith (at wide receiver), Mongelli, Burgess and defensive lineman **Dan Appley** were all first team All-Empire 8 honorees. Segala, offensive linemen **David Aaronson** and **Russell Howard**, running back **Johnnie Akins**, defensive backs **Isaac Hicks III** and **Max Jean**, linebacker **Kyle Richard**, and **Alex Wasserman** (as an all-purpose selection) were named to the all-league second team, and defensive lineman **Tanner Olson** was honorable mention all-conference.



David Aaronson earned second team All-Empire 8 honors as a junior in 2018. One of five starting offensive linemen scheduled to return in 2019, Aaronson helped Cortland set school single-season records for scoring average and passing yardage average.

2019 Cortaca Jug Game to be Played at MetLife Stadium Nov. 16

The Cortaca Jug annual rivalry game between SUNY Cortland and Ithaca College will move for one season to New Jersey's MetLife Stadium — home to the NFL's New York Jets and New York Giants — and will be played on Nov. 16, 2019. The teams will attempt to break the Division III football attendance record of 37,355 set by St. Thomas University and St. John's University (Minn.) in 2017 at Target Field, home of Major League Baseball's Minnesota Twins.

Ticket sales began last December and will continue at www.cortacajug.com. Tickets for students, staff and faculty of each school will also be sold during the 2019 season.

"This is an incredibly exciting moment in a storied rivalry already full of amazing memories," said **Mike Urtz**, director of athletics and a Cortland alumnus. "The Cortaca Jug game is the best that small-college football has to offer and is deserving of a first-class venue such as MetLife Stadium."

The change of venue was done at the invitation of the New York City Chapter of the National Football Foundation (NFF), a nonprofit educational organization that counts several Ithaca College alumni as board members. The game will be part of a national celebration of college football's 150th anniversary.

While Ithaca and Cortland began playing each other in 1930, the Cortaca Jug rivalry originated in 1959. Friends and respective team captains **Tom Decker** of Cortland and **Dick Carmean** of Ithaca picked up a jug at a yard sale to serve as the prize for the winner of the annual game. Each year's result is painted on the Jug. The original ran out of room for scores in the mid-1980s, and the teams are now on their third Jug.

Coaching Staff



Dan MacNeill, Head Coach

Dan MacNeill begins his 23rd season as SUNY Cortland's head football coach in 2019. His teams are a combined 147-82 and have earned 16 postseason berths, including six NCAA

tournament showings. He ranks first at Cortland in both career victories and career winning percentage (.642).

MacNeill's Cortland squads played as an independent from 1997-99 and were a member of the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) from 2000-14 before joining the Empire 8. In the Red Dragons' first season as an Empire 8 member in 2015, MacNeill and his assistants were named the Empire 8 Coaching Staff of the Year, while MacNeill also was honored as the HERO Sports Division III National Coach of the Year and the D3football.com East Region Coach of the Year. Cortland finished the season 9-3, including a 6-2 mark to share the Empire 8 crown and an NCAA playoff victory before losing at nationally second-ranked Linfield in the second round.

MacNeill was named NJAC Coach of the Year in 2008 and 2012, and he was a finalist for 2008 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year honors after Cortland finished 11-2 and advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals before losing at eventual national champion Mount Union. The Red Dragons were recognized as the top Division III teams in the East by winning both the Lambert Trophy and the ECAC Team of the Year awards, and the 11 victories and national quarterfinal appearance matched school records.

Under MacNeill, Cortland won NJAC titles in 2008 and 2012 and also was first in the conference in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2010 in addition to its 2015

Empire 8 title. His squads tied for ninth nationally after advancing to the second round of the NCAA playoffs in 2010, 2012 and 2015, as well as a tie for ninth in 1997 in a 16-team field and a tie for 17th in 2005. MacNeill's teams have won seven or more games 12 times, including 10 victories in 2010 and nine in 2002, 2006, 2011, 2012 and 2015 in addition to the 11-win 2008 campaign.

In addition to the five NCAA appearances, MacNeill's teams won the inaugural New York Bowl in 2017 and qualified for the game again in 2018 (game was canceled due to lack of Liberty League opponent). The Red Dragons also won ECAC bowls in 2002, 2007 and 2012, and they played in five other ECAC postseason games. Among MacNeill's other highlights at Cortland are a 32-31 win over nationally second-ranked and eventual national semifinalist Rowan University in the 2001 season on the final game ever played on Carl "Chugger" Davis Field, and a 13-9 record against rival Ithaca College in the annual "Cortaca Jug" game, including seven straight wins from 2010-16.

MacNeill has coached 29 All-Americans, 90 All-East and 77 All-ECAC players at Cortland. Those players included two Gagliardi Trophy national Player of the Year finalists – defensive tackle Adam Haas in 2006 and quarterback Dan Pitcher in 2011 – along with 1997 ECAC Upstate

New York Player of the Year Omar Darling, 2007 ECAC Southeast Rookie of the Year Brian Haas, and 2013 ECAC South Defensive Rookie of the Year Tristan Laurore.

In addition, MacNeill's players have earned 35 All-Empire 8 awards, including the 2015 Rookie of the Year and 2018 Special Teams Player of the Year. His players also garnered 204 All-NJAC honors, highlighted by the selection of Adam Haas as the 2005 Defensive Player of the Year, Bryan Wiley as the 2009 Defensive Player of the Year, Justin Autera as the 2010 Co-Offensive Player of the Year and Dan Pitcher as the 2011 Offensive Player of the Year.

Previously an assistant coach at Division I-AA Villanova University for 13 years, MacNeill is Cortland's 11th head coach since the school's modern era of football began in 1924. He joined the Villanova staff in 1984, and he served as linebackers coach and was the team's defensive coordinator from 1988-96.

One of the nation's top defensive coaches, MacNeill's charges consistently ranked among the best defensive teams in the Yankee Conference. His 1991 squad finished the year first nationally

in scoring defense, second in total defense and fifth in rushing defense while leading the Yankee Conference in every defensive category. The Wildcats placed first nationally in rushing defense in 1992. In 1996, Villanova finished 8-4 and earned a berth in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

While at Villanova, MacNeill coached three AFCA/Kodak First Team All-Americans, one Associated Press All-American, six first team All-Yankee Conference performers, six first team All-ECAC selections and one player who went on to the NFL. He received a master's degree in educational administration from Villanova in 1994.

A 1979 Cortland graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education, MacNeill was a four-year Red Dragon letterwinner and three-year starter at linebacker and defensive tackle. He served as a team tri-captain during his senior campaign in 1978. In his last varsity game against Southern Connecticut State, he was credited with 11 unassisted tackles and three quarterback sacks.

MacNeill began his football coaching career as an assistant at Port Byron (N.Y.) Central High School from 1980 to 1982, prior to being named as a graduate assistant coach at Ithaca College. He coached Ithaca's junior varsity team in 1982 and was in charge of the Bombers' receivers in 1983.

A native of Walton, N.Y., MacNeill was an all-league defensive end at Walton Central High School as a senior in 1974. MacNeill and his wife, Sherrie, have two daughters — Mikayla and Maura.

Greg Roskos – Associate Head Coach/ Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

Recruiting Areas: Section 1, New York City

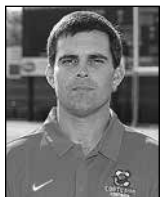
Greg Roskos begins his 11th year on Cortland's coaching staff in 2019. He is the Red Dragons' associate head coach in addition to being offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Under his guidance, the Red Dragons set school single-season records in 2018 for scoring average (39.3 points per game) and passing yardage average (295.9 yards per game). Cortland ranked in the top 25 nationally in both of those categories. The Red Dragons have been rated in the top three in their conference in scoring offense seven of the last nine years and in the top four in total offense six of the past seven seasons. His 2015 unit ranked sixth nationally in team passing efficiency, ninth in completion percentage and 22nd in passing offense.

Roskos came to Cortland from the University of Minnesota, where he was an assistant quarterbacks and quality control coach. The Golden Gophers were selected for the Insight Bowl in 2008, the second of his two seasons with the program.

In 2005 and 2006, Roskos served as a graduate assistant offensive coach at the University of Toledo. The Rockets finished 9-3 and won the GMAC Bowl in 2005. Roskos also was an assistant secondary coach at Patriot League champion and NCAA Division I-AA qualifier Lafayette College in 2004 and was linebackers coach in 2003 for a Muhlenberg College squad that won the Centennial Conference and played in the NCAA Division III tournament.

Roskos graduated from Bloomsburg University with a bachelor's degree in marketing in 2002. He was a four-year letterwinner and two-time all-conference selection for the Huskies and was the team's Defensive MVP when they advanced to the 2000 NCAA Division II championship game. A native of Scranton, Pa., Roskos graduated from West Scranton High School.



Mike Discenza – Defensive Coordinator/ Outside Linebackers

Mike Discenza begins his fourth season on the Cortland football coach staff in 2019. He enters his third year as defensive coordinator and he also coaches outside linebackers.

In 2018, the Red Dragons' defense ranked in the top 35 nationally in Division III in interceptions (17), defensive touchdowns (3), turnovers gained (25) and team passing efficiency defense (103.8 opponent rating). Cortland ranked second in the Empire 8 in scoring defense (18.1 points per game) and third down conversion defense (32.5 percent) and third in total defense (345.4 yards per game), sacks (2.3 per game), defensive touchdowns and pass efficiency defense. Discenza previously coached defensive backs in other seasons and was the Red Dragons' co-special teams coordinator in 2016. His special teams units combined to finish second nationally in Division III with nine blocked kicks that season.

Discenza is no stranger to Red Dragon Athletics – he served as an assistant director of athletics from 2010-12 and the women's golf head coach from 2007-12, and is currently the Red Dragons' equipment room supervisor.

A native of Cortland, Discenza graduated from Ithaca College in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in history. He earned a master's degree in secondary education at Widener University (Pa.) in 2007. Discenza was a defensive back at Siena College in 2000 before transferring to

Ithaca, where he also played defensive back. His Ithaca squad in 2001 finished 11-2 and advanced to the NCAA Division III quarterfinals. Discenza served as an assistant football coach at Ithaca during both the 2004 and 2006 seasons and worked with defensive backs, including an All-American, at Widener in the fall of 2005. Discenza also was an assistant football coach at Cortland High School during the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

Discenza and his wife, Lara - a former softball pitcher at Cortland - reside in Homer with their son, John.



Jon Shelton – Co-Defensive Coordinator/ Defensive Line

Recruiting Areas: Long Island (Sections 8 and 11)

Jon Shelton begins his third season on the Cortland football coaching staff in 2019. He serves as the program's co-defensive coordinator and coaches the defensive line. The Red Dragons ranked in the top 50 nationally in scoring defense in Division III in 2018, allowing 18.1 points per game.

Shelton is a coaching veteran with more than 20 years of experience at a variety of levels. He was a graduate assistant and defensive line coach at Division I University of Kansas from 2003-04 and the defensive line coach at Division I University of New Hampshire from 2005-14, followed by two seasons as defensive coordinator and associate head coach at Division II Southern Connecticut State University in 2014 and 2015. While at New Hampshire, Shelton was the developer and lead presenter of the "SMART" program, a sexual assault prevention program aimed at educating male student-athletes.

From 1998-2003 Shelton served as defensive coordinator and assistant head coach at Bryant University (R.I.). He also has coached at the University of Maryland and Montgomery Community College (Md.), and most recently was defensive coordinator at Deerfield Academy (Mass.) in 2016. Shelton was selected to participate in the Bill Walsh NFL Minority Coaching Fellowship for three years - with the Eagles in 2014 and 2015 and with the Texans in 2016.

Shelton earned a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Maryland in 1997 and a master's degree in education (counseling) from Providence College in 2003. A native of Rockville, Maryland, Shelton also attended and competed as an athlete at Montgomery Community College from 1983-85 and earned an associate's degree in finance. He is a member of the Lincoln Park Athletic Hall of Fame in his hometown.

Jon resides in Binghamton, New York, with his fiancée Caroline Dumian, and his dog and best friend, Jack.

Coaching Staff



Maurice Hart – Defensive Backs

Recruiting Areas: Section 3, Staten Island, New Jersey

Maurice Hart begins his fifth season with the Cortland coaching staff in 2019. He is the team's defensive backs coach – a position he also held from 2014-16.

Hart rejoined the Cortland coaching staff in January 2018 and coached the Red Dragons' cornerbacks and returners last fall. During the 2018 season Cortland ranked 20th nationally in Division III with 17 interceptions, and two players under Hart – cornerback Max Jean and safety Isaac Hicks – earned All-Empire 8 honors. In 2015, the Red Dragon defense recovered 17 fumbles and intercepted 13 passes to help the team rank 16th nationally in defensive turnovers. In 2014, Cortland ranked 35th nationally in Division III in passing efficiency defense and 11th nationally in third-down conversion percentage defense.

Hart came to Cortland from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, where he coached the Engineers' defensive backs in 2013. Under his tutelage, RPI led the Liberty league in interceptions and rank 62nd nationally in passing efficiency defense. The previous season, Hart coached the cornerbacks at Emporia State University in Kansas. The program led the Mid-American Intercollegiate Athletic Association and ranked fifth nationally in interceptions and finished the 2012 season ranked 23rd in the national polls with a school-record 10 wins and a Kanza Bowl Championship. Hart also coach the defensive backs at Ellsworth Community College in Iowa in 2011.

Hart earned a bachelor's degree from North Carolina Central University in 2010 while serving as a coaching intern. He played two seasons at College of the Canyons in Santa Clarita, California, where he ranked among the top five safeties in the national Junior College ranks. He earned two All-Western State Conference awards and his team won two bowl games. The Durham, North Carolina native also received a scholarship to play on the Division I level as a defensive back at Western Michigan.

Maurice and his fiancée, Desiree, reside in Fayetteville, N.Y., with their daughters, Kieryn and Kamri.



Ryan Heasley – Offensive Assistant

Ryan Heasley joins the Cortland football coaching staff in 2019 as an offensive assistant. He brings 18 years of coaching experience to the Red Dragons, most recently at Division I St. Francis University (Pa.) where he coached the offensive line in 2017 and 2018. Heasley served as offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Ithaca College for five seasons from 2012-16. He helped the Bombers

win back-to-back Empire 8 titles and make NCAA Division III playoff appearances in 2013 and 2014. Ithaca earned Empire 8 Coaching Staff of the Year during both of those seasons.

The Pittsburgh native spent one year as offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Providence High School in North Carolina after coaching three seasons at Division I Davidson University from 2008-10. Heasley also coached for five years at Washington University in St. Louis, helping the Bears win University Athletic Association crowns in 2003 and 2004. He started his coaching career at Marietta College (Ohio) in 2001.

A 1999 graduate of Bethany College, Heasley played three seasons for the Bison and served as team captain. He was a two-time all-conference honoree and won the 1997 Bison Award, given to a senior for outstanding enthusiasm, dedication and leadership toward the program. Ryan and his wife, Nicole, reside in Lansing with their daughters, Emma and Erin.



Isaac Hicks III – Assistant Defensive Backs

Isaac Hicks III begins his first season on Cortland's coaching staff working with the team's defensive backs.

Hicks played in 40 games, 34 as a starter, during his four seasons as a safety for the Red Dragons from 2015-18. He finished with career totals of 211 tackles (134 solo), nine interceptions, six pass breakups and two fumble recoveries, while serving as a team captain in 2018.

As a senior, Hicks earned All-Empire 8 honors after finishing third on the team with 68 tackles and intercepting two passes. As a junior, he also ranked third on the squad with 73 tackles and registered a team-best four interceptions. He recorded 10 tackles and an interception in Cortland's New York Bowl victory at Union.

Dalton Maska – Offensive Line/ Recruiting Coordinator

Recruiting Area: Section 6

Dalton Maska begins his second season on the Cortland coaching staff in 2019. He coaches Cortland's offensive line and serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Maska also coached the offensive line as well as tight ends during the 2018 season. The Red Dragons allowed only 4.5 tackles for loss per game – good for 20th nationally in Division III – and also ranked in the top 40 nationally in passing offense, scoring offense, team pass efficiency and total offense.

Prior to his arrival at Cortland Maska served as a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, Alfred University, from 2015-17, during which time he coached offensive linemen who earned five All-Empire 8, three D3football.com All-East and two D3football.com All-America awards. The 2016 squad finished 12-1 and advanced to the NCAA Division III quarterfinals.

Maska earned his MBA from Alfred in 2017 and a bachelor's degree in marketing from the school in 2015. He played four seasons with the Saxons from 2011-14, the last two as a starter, and was a team captain during his senior year. A native of Lockport, N.Y., Maska graduated in 2011 from Starpoint High School, where he competed in football and track and field.

Kyle Pignatiello – Running Backs/ Specialists/Strength & Conditioning

Recruiting Area: Section 5

Kyle Pignatiello begins his fourth season on the Cortland coaching staff in 2018 working with the team's running backs and specialists (kickers, punters, holders, snappers). A Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist, Pignatiello also is

beginning his second year as the Red Dragons' team strength and conditioning coach.

Over a three-season span from 2016 through 2018, Cortland's kickers have made 126-of-133 point-after kicks and 25-of-35 field goals (21-of-25 inside 40 yards). Kicker/punter Nick Mongelli was named the Empire 8 Special Teams Player of the Year. The Red Dragons ranked first in the Empire 8 in net punting in 2016 and second in 2017.

Pignatiello graduated in 2015 from the University of Dayton, where he earned a bachelor's degree in sport management, with a minor in business administration. He was a four-year letterwinner with the Flyers from 2011-14 and was the team's starting punter in each of his last three seasons. He averaged nearly 39 yards per punt during his career and twice set school records for punting average in a season, and he was a two-time conference All-Academic Team selection.

After concluding his collegiate playing career, Pignatiello worked as a volunteer coach at Urbana University in Ohio in the spring of 2015 before going to Heidelberg University, where he coached running backs, punters and kickers during the 2015 season. The Tipp City, Ohio native was a two-time all-state punter and two-time all-league defensive end at Tiptecanoe High School.

Pignatiello earned a master's degree in sport management from Cortland in May 2019.



Colin Schaeffer – Inside Linebackers

Recruiting Areas: Sections 7 and 10, Philadelphia, Central New Jersey

Colin Schaeffer starts his first season as a member of the Cortland coaching staff in 2019 and will coach the team's inside linebackers.

Schaeffer comes to Cortland from Division II Seton Hill University (Pa.), where he worked with defensive linemen and was the defensive quality control coach in 2018. During the 2016 and 2017 seasons he worked with outside linebackers at Muhlenberg College (Pa.). The Mules ranked 12th nationally in Division III in rushing defense, finished the season 8-3 and won the ECAC Asa S. Bushnell Bowl in 2017, and the previous year went 9-1 during the regular season before losing by three points to Delaware Valley in the Centennial-MAC Bowl Series.

Schaeffer graduated from Juniata College (Pa.) in 2016 with a bachelor's degree in management with a minor in English. He played inside linebacker for the Eagles for four seasons, and he also served as a volunteer linebacker coach for the program in the spring of 2016.

A native of Newport, Pa., Schaeffer is a 2012 alumnus of Newport High School, where he competed in football, wrestling and track and field. He was the football team's Defensive MVP and Offensive Lineman of the Year during his senior year and earned all-conference honors at defensive end twice.



Jake Smith – Wide Receivers

Recruiting Areas: Section 2, New York City (assistant)

Jake Smith joins the Cortland coaching staff as wide receivers coach in 2019 after a standout playing career with the Red Dragons.

Smith played three seasons for the Red Dragons from 2014-16 before missing the entire 2017 season due to injury. He returned in 2018 and caught 42 passes for 807 yards and nine touchdowns despite his playing time being drastically reduced over the final three games due to an injury.

A two-time All-Empire 8 selection, Smith finished second in school history with 29 touchdown catches, tied for second with 11 games with at least 100 yards receiving, third with 2,515 career receiving yards and fifth with 143 career receptions. As a sophomore in 2015 he caught two touchdown passes in an NCAA second round game at nationally second-ranked Linfield. In 2018 he set a school record for longest reception with a 97-yard touchdown catch at Utica.

Smith also earned D3football.com All-America and All-East honors on special teams in 2018 after blocking two kicks.

The Albany native graduated from Guilderland High School in 2014. He was a third team all-state selection as a senior. Smith earned a bachelor's degree in sport management from Cortland in 2018.



Jake Spalik – Special Teams Coordinator/ Tight Ends

Recruiting Areas: Sections 4 and 9

Jake Spalik begins his first season on the Cortland coaching staff in 2019. He will serve as the team's special teams coordinator and will coach tight ends.

Spalik coached wide receivers at Stevenson University in Maryland during the 2017 and 2018 seasons. In his first season the Mustangs set or reestablished 14 team offensive records and eight individual offensive records while averaging more than 28 points and 400 yards of total offense per game. The team ranked 11th nationally with 3,359 total passing yards. During Spalik's two years at Stevenson the Mustangs were a combined 14-8 and played in two postseason bowl games.

Spalik graduated from Brockport in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and earned a master's degree in athletic administration in 2017. A standout wide receiver for the Golden Eagles, he finished as the program's leader in receptions for a career (220), season (73) and single game (12), and he also set the school record with 2,585 career receiving yards. The four-year starter earned All-New Jersey Athletic Conference honors three times and was a team captain as a senior.

After completing his playing career, Spalik coached wide receivers at Brockport for three years and served as junior varsity head coach in 2016.

A native of Johnson City, Spalik graduated in 2010 from Johnson City High School. He was a third team all-state football player and also competed in basketball and baseball. He currently resides in Johnson City with his wife, Kristen.

The Red Dragons also qualified for the New York Bowl in 2018 for the program's 23rd postseason appearance (along with nine NCAA and 12 Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) bowl games), but the game was canceled due to a lack of a declared Liberty League opponent.

The Empire 8 football league consists of Cortland, Alfred, Brockport, Hartwick, Morrisville State, St. John Fisher, and Alfred University. The Liberty League football schools are Buffalo State, Hobart, Ithaca, Rochester, RPI, St. Lawrence, and Union. Buffalo State moved from the Empire 8 to the Liberty League for football in 2019.

About SUNY Cortland

Located atop one of the rolling hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys," the State University of New York College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School, which included among its earliest students inventor and industrialist Elmer A. Sperry of Sperry-Rand Corp. fame.

Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a four-year college providing courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, Cortland was a founding member of the State University of New York.

Today, approximately 6,900 students are pursuing degrees within the College's three academic divisions — arts and sciences, professional studies and the school of education. Twenty-seven departments with a faculty of nearly 600 offer the SUNY Cortland student body 64 undergraduate majors and almost 100 undergraduate minors, concentrations and options from which to choose.

The College's main campus covers 191 acres and includes 49 traditional and modern buildings. Seventeen of these structures are residence halls providing on-campus housing for nearly 3,300 students. The Student Life Center, which opened in March 2015, is a comprehensive recreational facility that features 150,000 square feet of space.

The College also operates The William H. Parks Family Center for Environmental and Outdoor Education, which includes three camps at Raquette Lake in the Adirondacks, Hoxie Gorge nature preserve outside Cortland and the Brauer Field Station on the Helderberg Escarpment near Albany.

At Cortland, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland participates in 25 intercollegiate sports — 14 women's and 11 men's — in an attempt to provide a broad program which meets the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The SUNY Cortland athletic program has finished in the top 25 of the national Directors' Cup Division III standings 22 times since 1996. Cortland has won NCAA Division

III team titles in nine different sports - the second-highest total among approximately 450 schools - and 18 NCAA Division III crowns total. In all, the Red Dragons have claimed 25 national team titles along with more than 100 individual national championships.

The College offers its student-athletes excellent athletic facilities. The on-campus stadium features two artificial turf fields. One field seats 6,500 spectators, the other 1,500. The Cortland football, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's lacrosse and men's and women's track and field teams are among those who utilize the facility, which the New York Times called "...a new stadium worthy of a major university power."

The Bessie L. Park Physical Education and Recreation Center features the Whitney T. Corey Gymnasium with a 3,500 seating capacity; the Olympic-sized Harriet Holsten swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500; newly updated Alumni Arena, a facility which can accommodate 2,500 spectators; a 500-seat gymnastics arena; racquetball and squash courts; a wrestling room; modern athletic training facilities; and the state-of-the-art Francis Woods Fitness Facility.

Nearby Clayton R. Lusk Field House, with its tartan-textured surface, is home for the indoor track and field teams, varsity practice sessions and recreational activities. Cortland's soccer teams, in addition to the stadium complex, also compete at the newly renovated T. Fred "Prof" Holloway Field, which has lights for night contests. Additionally, the College boasts Robert H. Wallace Field (baseball) and Dragon Field (softball), both of which have seen recent major improvements, as part of its 51 acres of athletic fields and an outdoor tennis complex that opened in September 2015.
