## 2022 Cortaca Jug Game to be Played at Yankee Stadium Nov. 12

Just when you thought it couldn't get any bigger, the football rivalry between SUNY Cortland and Ithaca College is doing just that. The two institutions accepted an invitation from the New York Yankees organization to play the 2022 Cortaca Jug at storied Yankee Stadium. The game will be held on Saturday, Nov. 12, with a 1 p.m. kickoff.

The Cortland Red Dragons and the Ithaca Bombers played the 2019 game at MetLife Stadium in New Jersey in front of a Division III-record crowd of 45,161 fans. Once referred to by Sports Illustrated as "the biggest little game in the nation," the Cortaca Jug was not contested in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic. Cortland won the 2021 game, 28-27, at home.

"We are excited about this opportunity to once again showcase this great game in such an iconic venue," said Cortland's Director of Athletics **Mike Urtz**. "What Cortland and Ithaca have is so unique at our level. It's all because of the great and storied history of both universities and their athletic programs, including football."

While the stadium is best known as the home of baseball's Bronx Bombers, it has also seen its share of memorable football games and currently hosts the annual New Era Pinstripe Bowl.

"Anyone who has ever attended a Cortaca Jug game can tell you that there is nothing else like it in Division III athletics,"

Cortland President **Erik J. Bitterbaum** said. "It has been a proud tradition for more than six decades and is ingrained in our institutional DNA. We are thrilled by this opportunity to again take this cherished event to a national stage."

According to **Mark Holtzman**, vice president of non-baseball sports events for the Yankees, it was observing the success of the 2019 Cortaca Jug game that inspired the organization to extend the invitation to the two schools.

"We are looking forward to rolling out the pinstriped carpet and welcoming Ithaca and Cortland to the Yankee Stadium lineup," said Holtzman. "We believe we have the opportunity to have a sellout crowd and we are intent on creating a memorable experience for the teams and for their fans."

"To be a small part of the history and tradition of iconic college football rivalries held at Yankee Stadium is both humbling and exhilarating," said Cortland's head football coach **Curt Fitzpatrick**. "This is an awesome opportunity for Red Dragon football to once again play on a national stage in an iconic venue. Thank you to the New York Yankees organization for the invitation."

# Coaching Staff



## Curt Fitzpatrick, Head Coach

Curt Fitzpatrick was named SUNY Cortland's football head coach in February 2020. The Red Dragons didn't compete that fall due to COVID-19, but in his first season on the field in 2021 Fitzpatrick led Cortland to one of the best seasons in school history. Cortland finished

11-1 to tie a school record for wins in a season. That mark included the Red Dragons' first 10-0 season since 1988, capped by a win over Ithaca in the annual Cortaca Jug game.

Cortland won the Empire 8 title with a 6-0 mark and was victorious in its NCAA Division III first-round game to tie for ninth place nationally. The Red Dragons averaged a school-record 41.4 points per game, and Fitzpatrick and his assistants were named the Empire 8 Coaching Staff of the Year.

Fitzpatrick came to Cortland from Morrisville State, where he served as head coach for seven seasons from 2013-19. He guided the Mustangs to four winning seasons (2014, 2015, 2018, 2019), including one conference championship title and three postseason ECAC bowl appearances.

In 2014, Morrisville finished with a 9-2 mark – its best record since becoming an NCAA Division III member – and claimed a share of the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) crown with a 6-1 league mark. The Mustangs earned a berth to the ECAC North Central Bowl, where they captured the college's first postseason championship title as an NCAA Division III member. Fitzpatrick was voted the NJAC Co-Coach of the Year by his peers and was named the D3football.com East Region Coach of the Year.

In 2019 he led the Mustangs to a 6-5 record, including a 4-2 Empire 8 mark, and an ECAC postseason bowl berth. Morrisville handed Empire 8 co-champion Brockport its lone league loss.

During his time at Morrisville, Fitzpatrick's high-powered offense averaged 31.5 points and 438 yards per game, making it one of the most potent offenses annually in the Empire 8. Under his guidance, Mustang quarterbacks were voted as the conference Offensive Player of the Year three times. A total of 49 Mustang student-athletes earned Empire 8 or NJAC all-conference recognition and 61 were named to the athletic director honor roll for their outstanding academic performance during his tenure.

Prior to Morrisville, Fitzpatrick served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Utica College from 2008-12. In his time with the Pioneers, his balanced, no-huddle offense was one of the best in the Empire 8, gained national attention and set numerous school records.

In 2012 the Pioneers featured the Empire 8 Offensive Player of the Year and three D3football.com All-East offensive

performers. The team was ranked in the top 25 nationally in six major offensive categories, including points (34.2) and yards (465) per game, and set 10 school records. Throughout his tenure at Utica, Fitzpatrick coached 16 all-league offensive performers, and off the field he developed an accountability program for the football program centering on academic and community success, in addition to administering the off-season strength and conditioning program.

A native of Fulton, N.Y., Fitzpatrick graduated from St. John Fisher College in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in management. A standout quarterback for the Cardinals, Fitzpatrick served as a team captain and was a four-year letterman. In his final season, he earned Empire 8 all-conference honors and set school passing records in touchdowns (30) and yards (2,366) while leading the program to a 10-2 overall record and an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

Upon graduation, Fitzpatrick returned to his hometown in 2005 to coach quarterbacks and wide receivers at Fulton High School, which captured the OHSL Class A league championship. He returned to St. John Fisher as a quarterbacks coach for two seasons from 2006-07. The Cardinals amassed a combined 23-4 record, won two Empire 8 crowns and were the top-ranked team in New York State each season. Fisher advanced to the NCAA semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals in 2007, and for the two seasons combined recorded more than 5,300 passing yards and 55 touchdowns.

Since 2006, Fitzpatrick has been actively involved in camps and clinics as both a coach and director. He also has served as guest speaker at numerous clinics throughout New York State and New England.

In addition to his bachelor's degree from St. John Fisher, Fitzpatrick earned a Master of Science in athletic administration from Ohio University in 2012. He currently resides in Tully, N.Y., with his wife, Molly, and three children, Collins, Oliver and Cooper.

## 2022 Assistant Football Coaches



**Patrick Rotchford**  
**Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line**

*Recruiting Areas: NYS Sections 1 & 9, OL & TE from out of state*

Patrick Rotchford was named Cortland's offensive coordinator and offensive line coach in June 2020. In the fall of 2021, Rotchford helped the Red Dragons set a school single-season record with 41.4 points per game and register 4,856 yards of total offense, the second-best total in school history.

Rotchford spent six seasons from 2014-19 as an assistant coach at Morrisville State. He was responsible for coaching the offensive line and was the team's running game coordinator, served as the program's recruiting coordinator, and was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2018.

Rotchford helped lead the Mustangs' offensive unit that ranked second in the Empire 8 last season in scoring and total offense and was first in passing offense. Morrisville also rated second in the league in scoring and rushing in 2017, third in rushing in 2016, and led the conference in total offense and rushing in 2015. In his first season at Morrisville in 2014, the Mustangs claimed a share of the New Jersey Athletic Conference title and led the conference in scoring and total offense while ranking 13th nationally in Division III in total offense and rushing. Morrisville won an ECAC bowl game in 2014 and also earned ECAC postseason berths in 2018 and 2019.

Prior to Morrisville, Rotchford was an assistant coach for three seasons at Claremont-Mudd-Scripps Colleges in California. He served as offensive coordinator for two years and also held the positions of offensive line coach (2013), quarterbacks coach (2012) and running backs coach (2011). From 2009-11, Rotchford was a graduate assistant, assistant offensive line coach and JV head coach at St. Ambrose University in Iowa, and he served as offensive line coach at MacMurray College in Illinois during the 2008-09 school year.

A native of Baldwinsville, N.Y., Rotchford is a 2007 graduate of St. John Fisher College. During his four-year career as an offensive lineman with the Cardinals he helped the program post a combined 38-10 record, win two Empire 8 titles and make four postseason appearances. The Cardinals went 12-2 and advanced to the NCAA Division III semifinals in his senior year in 2006, went 10-2 and advanced to the NCAA second round in 2004, and qualified for ECAC bowl games in 2003 and 2005.

Following graduation in 2007, Rotchford enjoyed an internship with the Buffalo Bills as a player personnel/scouting intern before beginning his collegiate coaching career. He earned a master's degree in organizational leadership from St. Ambrose in 2011.

Rotchford and his wife, Erin, were married in the summer of 2022 and reside in East Syracuse.



**Steve Cushing**  
**Defensive Coordinator/Safeties**

*Recruiting Areas: NYC and Nassau County*

Steve Cushing was named the defensive coordinator for the SUNY Cortland football program in the spring of 2022. Cushing was promoted to the defensive coordinator position after serving as the team's linebackers coach in 2021. He will work with the team's safeties in addition to his coordinator role.

In 2021, Cushing coached an All-American and three All-Empire 8 selections, and the Red Dragons ranked fourth nationally in Division III in scoring defense (10.5 points/game), fifth in total defense (213.8 yards/game), and third in defensive touchdowns (5) on the way to winning the Empire 8 title and finishing with an 11-1 record.

Prior to his arrival at Cortland, Cushing served as an assistant coach at Wilkes University for two seasons, where he coached safeties and also held roles as the team's defensive pass-game coordinator and co-recruiting coordinator. The Colonels went 8-3 during the 2019 season for their highest win total in 13 years and made their first postseason appearance since 2010.

Cushing played four years at Misericordia University as a safety and outside linebacker while being named to the Middle Atlantic Conference Academic Honor Roll. He spent the summer of 2018 as a coach at Goshen High School, where he assisted with on-field running drills for linebackers, running backs and special teams. Cushing also has experience with Youth Football in Warwick and Goshen, developing and implementing practice plans and defensive schemes and teaching proper tackling techniques.

Cushing graduated from Misericordia in 2018 with a degree in business with a specialization in marketing.

# Coaching Staff



**Jake Spalik**  
**Special Teams Coordinator/  
Wide Receivers/Recruiting Coordinator**

*Recruiting Areas: NYS Section 4, Nassau County,  
and WRs from out of state*

Jake Spalik begins his fourth season on the Cortland coaching staff in 2022. He is the team's special teams coordinator, wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator.

In 2021, Cortland's wide receivers accounted for 32 touchdown catches in 12 games, while the Red Dragons' special teams finished the season with nine blocked kicks and set a school single-season record with six blocked kicks returned for touchdowns (five blocked punt returns and one blocked field goal return). One of his special teams players, Dylan Dubuque, was named a D3football.com second team All-American.

Spalik worked with the Red Dragons' tight ends and was special teams coordinator in 2019. During that season the Red Dragons set a school single-season record and was the NCAA Division III leader with 13 blocked kicks, including a nation-high six blocked punts. Cortland finished the year with three blocked punt touchdowns. His special teams players earned two All-East honors, with Angelo Foster a second team selection and Travis Alvarez a third team choice, and three Red Dragon specialists received Empire 8 postseason honors - Cole Burgess (first team returner), Liam Casey (second team punter) and Nick Mongelli (second team kicker). In addition, Cortland earned five Empire 8 Special Teams Player of the Week honors during the season.

Spalik coached wide receivers at Stevenson University in Maryland during the 2017 and 2018 seasons. In his first season the Mustangs set or reestablished 14 team offensive records and eight individual offensive records while averaging more than 28 points and 400 yards of total offense per game. The team ranked 11th nationally with 3,359 total passing yards. During Spalik's two years at Stevenson the Mustangs were a combined 14-8 and played in two postseason bowl games.

Spalik graduated from Brockport in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and earned a master's degree in athletic administration in 2017. A standout wide receiver for the Golden Eagles, he finished as the program's leader in receptions for a career (220), season (73) and single game (12), and he also set the school record with 2,585 career receiving yards. The four-year starter earned All-New Jersey Athletic Conference honors three times and was a team captain as a senior.

After completing his playing career, Spalik coached wide receivers at Brockport for three years and served as junior varsity head coach in 2016.



**Richard Curran**  
**Linebackers/Assistant Strength Coach**

*Recruiting Areas: New Jersey, New England*

Richard Curran enters his second season on Cortland's coaching staff in 2022. He currently works with the team's linebackers and is the program's assistant strength coordinator. Curran coached the team's defensive line in the fall of 2021 where the Red Dragons' defense ranked fourth nationally in Division III in scoring defense (10.5 points/game), fifth in total defense (213.8 yards/game) and third in defensive touchdowns (5) on the way to winning the Empire 8 title and finishing with an 11-1 record.

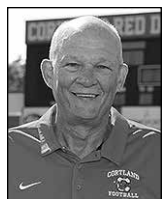
Curran's defensive line unit produced three All-Empire 8 selections, which included Nick Lardaro who was named Rookie of the Year. Lardaro, the team leader with 18 tackles for loss, also earned ECAC Division III Defensive Rookie of the Year, second team All-ECAC and second team D3football.com All-Region honors. Defensive lineman Devin Smith garnered numerous accolades as well. Smith was a first team D3football.com All-Region and third team D3football.com All-America selection and competed in the FCS National Bowl.

Curran came to Cortland from Stonehill College, where he coached the defensive line and served as video coordinator during the 2020-21 school year. In 2019, he served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Massachusetts Maritime Academy and helped develop the Buccaneers' defensive unit that ranked atop its league in scoring defense (15.6 points/game) and ranked fourth nationally in Division III for red-zone defense. Curran mentored a defensive line unit that posted 27 sacks and boasted two all-league selections, including an All-New England and All-America defensive end.

Prior to his time with Mass Maritime, Curran was an assistant coach at Red Bank Catholic High School in New Jersey for two seasons. The Caseys posted a perfect 10-0 record during the 2018 season, ranking No. 1 in the Shore Conference on its way to the Non-Public Group 3 State Championship. Curran interned with the Miami Dolphins of the National Football League during the summer of 2017, working alongside the operations department with training camp operations.

A 2017 graduate of Saint Anselm College, Curran got his coaching start as a volunteer assistant coach during the spring of his senior year. A four-year letterwinner for the Hawks, he served as captain his senior year and received his Bachelor's of Arts degree in psychology. He completed his Master of Science degree in Global Sports Business from Rutgers University in 2019.

# Coaching Staff



**Paul Shaffner**  
**Defensive Line**

*Recruiting Area: NYS Section 6 (Buffalo area)*

Paul Shaffner joined the Cortland coaching staff as defensive line coach in the spring of 2022.

Shaffner's vast coaching experience includes serving as defensive coordinator at Division I FCS Colgate University from 2013-21, head coach at Buffalo State from 2004-08, head coach at Glenville State College in West Virginia from 2000-04, and defensive coordinator at Division I FCS Lafayette College from 1992-2000. He was also a graduate assistant at Penn State for two years from 1986-88, including a national championship season with the Lions.

During his tenure at Colgate, the Raiders won three Patriot League titles (2015, 2017, 2018 and advanced to the NCAA tournament quarterfinals twice (2015 and 2018). Colgate led the national in scoring defense (9.3 points/game), total defense (237.7 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (88.77 opponent rating), and tied an NCAA FCS record with five shutouts, in 2018, despite finishing the season with a formidable three-game stretch against Army, James Madison and North Dakota State. Shaffner was a finalist for FCS Defensive Coordinator of the Year. The Raiders ranked first nationally in rushing defense (69.4 yards/game) in 2016. In all, Shaffner coached six All-Americans, three All-Patriot League Players of the Year and 42 all-league defensive players at Colgate.

Shaffner grew up and played his high school football in the Buffalo suburb of Lancaster and played collegiately at Ithaca College. He was a center on the Bombers' 1979 NCAA Division III championship team and 1980 national runner-up squad. Before graduating in 1982, Shaffner received the Sebring Scholar-Athlete distinction for highest GPA on the football team and was a senior-year captain. In October 2014, Shaffner and his Bomber squad-mates were inducted as a team of distinction into the Ithaca College Athletic Hall of Fame. He earned his master's degree during a fifth playing season at Ithaca before entering the coaching ranks at Division III Maine Maritime.

Shaffner is married to the former Donna Lueckenbach of Milwaukee. Donna is a board member of the American Football Coaches Wives Association and a past president. They are the parents of three children: Jessica, Samantha and Jake.



**Dylan Dubuque**  
**Cornerbacks**

Dylan Dubuque joins the Cortland coaching staff working with the team's cornerbacks in 2022 after an outstanding athletic career with the Red Dragons.

Dubuque played in 30 games for the Red Dragons as a linebacker and on special teams from 2017-21. As a senior in 2021 he was named an Associated Press Division III Second Team All-American at linebacker and a D3football.com Second Team All-American on special teams. He also earned Empire 8 Defensive Player of the Year honors and was a D3football.com First Team All-Region 2 selection (both as a linebacker and on special teams) as he helped Cortland finish with an 11-1 record, win the Empire 8 title and advance to the second round of the NCAA playoffs. In 2019, Dubuque was chosen as an All-Empire 8 honorable mention linebacker.

Dubuque recorded career totals of 160 tackles, including 19.5 for loss, along with three interceptions, seven pass breakups, three forced fumbles, six blocked kicks and 30 quarterback hurries. He scored three touchdowns during his senior season on a fumble recovery, interception return and blocked field goal.

An accomplished wrestler as well for the Red Dragons, Dubuque qualified for the 2019 NCAA Division III Championships, was a two-time All-Mideast Region honoree with a third-place regional showing in 2019 and a fifth-place finish in 2020, and won the Empire Collegiate Wrestling Conference 197-pound title in 2020. Despite seeing limited action due to his transition each season from football to wrestling, Dubuque posted a career record of 23-6 with 10 pins and three major decisions.

A Dean's List student at Cortland, Dubuque graduated in December 2021 with a bachelor's degree in physical education. The East Greenbush, N.Y., native is a 2017 graduate of Columbia High School, where he competed in football and wrestling.

From 1999-2005, Spicer led a powerhouse program at Onondaga Central. The program won New York State Class D titles in 2001 and 2003 and a Class C crown in 2002. Spicer was named New York State Coach of the Year in those respective classes each of those years and received the President Gerald R. Ford All-American Football Coach Award in 2003. His Onondaga teams had a combined 68-8 record and featured future collegiate and NFL stars Mike Hart and Latavius Murray. Spicer was an assistant coach at Onondaga in 1998.

Spicer most recently served as defensive coordinator and defensive assistant coach at Baldwinsville High School from 2013-21. Prior to Baldwinsville, he was an assistant coach at Hamilton College from 2006-13.

A Canastota, N.Y., native, Spicer graduated from Chittenango High in 1990 and played at Baldwinsville for three years prior to moving to Chittenango. He was chosen to the SUNYAC Men's Track and Field All-Decade Team for 2010-19.

Wiltshire earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Cortland in 2011 and a master's degree in exercise science from Cortland in 2013. A native of Apalachin, N.Y., he graduated from Vestal High, where he competed in track and field, cross country and football.

# About SUNY Cortland

Located atop one of the rolling hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys," the State University of New York College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School, which included among its earliest students inventor and industrialist Elmer A. Sperry of Sperry-Rand Corp. fame.

Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a four-year college providing courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, Cortland was a founding member of the State University of New York.

Today, approximately 6,900 students are pursuing degrees within the College's three academic divisions — arts and sciences, professional studies and the school of education. Twenty-seven departments with a faculty of more than 600 offer the SUNY Cortland student body 64 undergraduate majors and almost 100 undergraduate minors, concentrations and options from which to choose.

The College's main campus covers 191 acres and includes 30 traditional and modern buildings. Seventeen of these structures are residence halls providing on-campus housing for nearly 3,300 students. The Student Life Center, which opened in March 2015, is a comprehensive recreational facility that features 150,000 square feet of space.

The College also operates The William H. Parks Family Center for Environmental and Outdoor Education, which includes three camps at Raquette Lake in the Adirondacks, Hoxie Gorge nature preserve outside Cortland and the Brauer Field Station on the Helderberg Escarpment near Albany.

At Cortland, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland participates in 25 intercollegiate sports — 14 women's and 11 men's — in an attempt to provide a broad program which meets the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The SUNY Cortland athletic program has finished in the top 25 of the national Directors' Cup Division III standings 22 times since 1996. Cortland has won NCAA Division

III team titles in nine different sports - the second-highest total among approximately 450 schools - and 18 NCAA Division III crowns total. In all, the Red Dragons have claimed 25 national team titles along with more than 100 individual national championships.

The College offers its student-athletes excellent athletic facilities. The on-campus stadium features two artificial turf fields. One field seats 6,500 spectators, the other 1,500. The Cortland football, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's lacrosse and men's and women's track and field teams are among those who utilize the facility, which the New York Times called "...a new stadium worthy of a major university power."

The Bessie L. Park Physical Education and Recreation Center features the Whitney T. Corey Gymnasium with a 3,500 seating capacity; the Olympic-sized Harriet Holsten swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500; newly updated Alumni Arena, a facility that can accommodate 2,500 spectators; a 500-seat gymnastics arena; racquetball and squash courts; a wrestling room; modern athletic training facilities; and the state-of-the-art Francis Woods Fitness Facility.

Nearby Clayton R. Lusk Field House, with its tartan-textured surface, is home for the indoor track and field teams, varsity practice sessions and recreational activities. Cortland's soccer teams, in addition to the stadium complex, also compete at the newly renovated T. Fred "Prof" Holloway Field, which has lights for night contests. Additionally, the College boasts Robert H. Wallace Field (baseball) and Dragon Field (softball), both of which have seen recent major improvements, as part of its 51 acres of athletic fields and an outdoor tennis complex that opened in September 2015.
