Coaching Staff



Curt Fitzpatrick, Head Coach

Curt Fitzpatrick was named SUNY Cortland's football head coach in February 2020 and enters his fourth year at the school and third season on the field in 2023. Through two seasons, Fitzpatrick's teams are a combined 20-3 (.870) with two Empire 8 titles and NCAA tournament appearances.

In 2021, Fitzpatrick led Cortland to one of the best seasons in school history. Cortland finished 11-1 to tie a school record for wins in a season. That mark included the Red Dragons' first 10-0 season since 1988, capped by a win over Ithaca in the annual Cortaca Jug game. Cortland won the Empire 8 title with a 6-0 mark and was victorious in its NCAA Division III first-round game to tie for ninth place nationally. The Red Dragons averaged a then school-record 41.4 points per game, and Fitzpatrick and his assistants were named the Empire 8 Coaching Staff of the Year.

In 2022, Fitzpatrick and his staff repeated as Empire 8 Coaching Staff of the Year after finishing 9-2 overall (6-0 in the league) and qualifying for the NCAA playoffs. The Red Dragons set school single-season records with 45.1 points and 499.6 offensive yards per game.

Fitzpatrick came to Cortland from Morrisville State, where he served as head coach for seven seasons from 2013-19. He guided the Mustangs to four winning seasons (2014, 2015, 2018, 2019), including one conference championship title and three postseason ECAC bowl appearances.

In 2014, Morrisville finished with a 9-2 mark – its best record since becoming an NCAA Division III member – and claimed a share of the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) crown with a 6-1 league mark. The Mustangs earned a berth to the ECAC North Central Bowl, where they captured the college's first postseason championship title as an NCAA Division III member. Fitzpatrick was voted the NJAC Co-Coach of the Year by his peers and was named the D3football.com East Region Coach of the Year.

In 2019 he led the Mustangs to a 6-5 record, including a 4-2 Empire 8 mark, and an ECAC postseason bowl berth. Morrisville handed Empire 8 co-champion Brockport its lone league loss.

During his time at Morrisville, Fitzpatrick's high-powered offense averaged 31.5 points and 438 yards per game, making it one of the most potent offenses annually in the Empire 8. Under his guidance, Mustang quarterbacks were voted as the conference Offensive Player of the Year three times. A total of 49 Mustang student-athletes earned Empire 8 or NJAC all-conference recognition and 61 were named to the athletic director honor roll for their outstanding academic performance during his tenure.

Prior to Morrisville, Fitzpatrick served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Utica College from 2008-12. In his time with the Pioneers, his balanced, no-huddle offense was one of the best in the Empire 8, gained national attention and set numerous school records.

In 2012 the Pioneers featured the Empire 8 Offensive Player of the Year and three D3football.com All-East offensive performers. The team was ranked in the top 25 nationally in six major offensive categories, including points (34.2) and yards (465) per game, and set 10 school records. Throughout his tenure at Utica, Fitzpatrick coached 16 all-league offensive performers, and off the field he developed an accountability program for the football program centering on academic and community success, in addition to administering the off-season strength and conditioning program.

A native of Fulton, N.Y., Fitzpatrick graduated from St. John Fisher College in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in management. A standout quarterback for the Cardinals, Fitzpatrick served as a team captain and was a four-year letterman. In his final season, he earned Empire 8 all-conference honors and set school passing records in touchdowns (30) and yards (2,366) while leading the program to a 10-2 overall record and an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

Upon graduation, Fitzpatrick returned to his hometown in 2005 to coach quarterbacks and wide receivers at Fulton High School, which captured the OHSL Class A league championship. He returned to St. John Fisher as a quarterbacks coach for two seasons from 2006-07. The Cardinals amassed a combined 23-4 record, won two Empire 8 crowns and were the top-ranked team in New York State each season. Fisher advanced to the NCAA semifinals in 2006 and the quarterfinals in 2007, and for the two seasons combined recorded more than 5,300 passing yards and 55 touchdowns.

Since 2006, Fitzpatrick has been actively involved in camps and clinics as both a coach and director. He also has served as guest speaker at numerous clinics throughout New York State and New England.

In addition to his bachelor's degree from St. John Fisher, Fitzpatrick earned a Master of Science in athletic administration from Ohio University in 2012. He currently resides in Tully, N.Y., with his wife, Molly, and three children, Collins, Oliver and Cooper.

Patrick Rotchford
**Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line/
Recruiting Coordinator**

*Recruiting Areas: NYS Sections 1 & 9, OL & TE

Patrick Rotchford was named Cortland's offensive coordinator and offensive line coach in June 2020.

In the fall of 2021, Rotchford helped the Red Dragons set a school single-season record with 41.4 points per game and register 4,856 yards of total offense, the second-best total in school history. In the fall of 2022, Cortland improved on those numbers with school single-season records of 45.1 points and 499.6 total offensive yards per game (5,496 yards total), including a school-record 681 yards in a win over Wittenberg.

Rotchford spent six seasons from 2014-19 as an assistant coach at Morrisville State. He was responsible for coaching the offensive line and was the team's running game coordinator, served as the program's recruiting coordinator, and was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2018.

Rotchford helped lead the Mustangs' offensive unit that ranked second in the Empire 8 last season in scoring and total offense and was first in passing offense. Morrisville also rated second in the league in scoring and rushing in 2017, third in rushing in 2016, and led the conference in total offense and rushing in 2015. In his first season at Morrisville in 2014, the Mustangs claimed a share of the New Jersey Athletic Conference title and led the conference in scoring and total offense while ranking 13th nationally in Division III in total offense and rushing. Morrisville won an ECAC bowl game in 2014 and also earned ECAC postseason berths in 2018 and 2019.

Prior to Morrisville, Rotchford was an assistant coach for three seasons at Claremont-Mudd-Scripps Colleges in California. He served as offensive coordinator for two years and also held the positions of offensive line coach (2013), quarterbacks coach (2012) and running backs coach (2011). From 2009-11, Rotchford was a graduate assistant, assistant offensive line coach and JV head coach at St. Ambrose University in Iowa, and he served as offensive line coach at MacMurray College in Illinois during the 2008-09 school year.

A native of Baldwinsville, N.Y., Rotchford is a 2007 graduate of St. John Fisher College. During his four-year career as an offensive lineman with the Cardinals he helped the program post a combined 38-10 record, win two Empire 8 titles and make four postseason appearances. The Cardinals went 12-2

and advanced to the NCAA Division III semifinals in his senior year in 2006, went 10-2 and advanced to the NCAA second round in 2004, and qualified for ECAC bowl games in 2003 and 2005.

Following graduation in 2007, Rotchford enjoyed an internship with the Buffalo Bills as a player personnel/scouting intern before beginning his collegiate coaching career. He earned a master's degree in organizational leadership from St. Ambrose in 2011.

Rotchford and his wife, Erin, were married in the summer of 2022 and reside in East Syracuse.



Steve Cushing
Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers

Recruiting Areas: NYC and Nassau County

Steve Cushing was named the defensive coordinator for the SUNY Cortland football program in the spring of 2022. Cushing was promoted to the defensive coordinator position after serving as the team's linebackers coach in 2021. He works with the team's linebackers in addition to his coordinator role.

In 2021, Cushing coached an All-American and three All-Empire 8 selections, and the Red Dragons ranked fourth nationally in Division III in scoring defense (10.5 points/game), fifth in total defense (213.8 yards/game), and third in defensive touchdowns (5) on the way to winning the Empire 8 title and finishing with an 11-1 record. In 2022, Cortland allowed 13.5 points per game in six league games en route to its second straight Empire 8 crown. The Red Dragon defense featured an All-American and seven all-league selections.

Prior to his arrival at Cortland, Cushing served as an assistant coach at Wilkes University for two seasons, where he coached safeties and also held roles as the team's defensive pass-game coordinator and co-recruiting coordinator. The Colonels went 8-3 during the 2019 season for their highest win total in 13 years and made their first postseason appearance since 2010.

Cushing played four years at Misericordia University as a safety and outside linebacker while being named to the Middle Atlantic Conference Academic Honor Roll. He spent the summer of 2018 as a coach at Goshen High School, where he assisted with on-field running drills for linebackers, running backs and special teams. Cushing also has experience with Youth Football in Warwick and Goshen, developing and implementing practice plans and defensive schemes and teaching proper tackling techniques.

Cushing graduated from Misericordia in 2018 with a degree in business with a specialization in marketing.

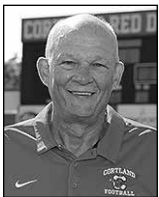
Nolan Foley
Special Teams/Safeties

Nolan Foley joined the Cortland football staff as special teams and safeties coach in April 2023. The Cortland alumnus served as an assistant coach for two seasons at St.

Ambrose University in Iowa, working with the running backs and tight ends for a season before moving in 2022 to coach defensive backs and serve as special teams coordinator.

Foley was an offensive lineman for Cortland for three seasons from 2017-19. Following an injury, he spent his senior season as an assistant offensive line coach. He served three years on the team's unity council and, as a junior, was the team's SAAC representative.

Foley graduated from Cortland in 2021 with a bachelor's degree in political science and is currently completing work toward a master's degree in organizational leadership from St. Ambrose. He is a native of Wantagh, N.Y., and a 2017 graduate of Wantagh High School.



Paul Shaffner
Defensive Line

Recruiting Area: NYS Section 6 (Buffalo area)

Paul Shaffner joined the Cortland coaching staff as defensive line coach in the spring of 2022.

Shaffner's vast coaching experience includes serving as defensive coordinator at Division I FCS Colgate University from 2013-21, head coach at Buffalo State from 2004-08, head coach at Glenville State College in West Virginia from 2000-04, and defensive coordinator at Division I FCS Lafayette College from 1992-2000. He was also a graduate assistant at Penn State for two years from 1986-88, including a national championship season with the Lions.

During his tenure at Colgate, the Raiders won three Patriot League titles (2015, 2017, 2018) and advanced to the NCAA tournament quarterfinals twice (2015 and 2018). Colgate led the national in scoring defense (9.3 points/game), total defense (237.7 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (88.77 opponent rating), and tied an NCAA FCS record with five shutouts, in 2018, despite finishing the season with a formidable three-game stretch against Army, James Madison and North Dakota State. Shaffner was a finalist for FCS Defensive Coordinator of the Year. The Raiders ranked first nationally in rushing defense (69.4 yards/game) in 2016. In all, Shaffner coached six All-Americans, three All-Patriot League Players of the Year and 42 all-league defensive players at Colgate.

Shaffner grew up and played his high school football in the Buffalo suburb of Lancaster and played collegiately at

Ithaca College. He was a center on the Bombers' 1979 NCAA Division III championship team and 1980 national runner-up squad. Before graduating in 1982, Shaffner received the Sebring Scholar-Athlete distinction for highest GPA on the football team and was a senior-year captain. In October 2014, Shaffner and his Bomber squad-mates were inducted as a team of distinction into the Ithaca College Athletic Hall of Fame. He earned his master's degree during a fifth playing season at Ithaca before entering the coaching ranks at Division III Maine Maritime.

Shaffner is married to the former Donna Lueckenbach of Milwaukee. Donna is a board member of the American Football Coaches Wives Association and a past president. They are the parents of three children: Jessica, Samantha and Jake.



Kyle Gallagher
Wide Receivers

Kyle Gallagher joined the Cortland coaching staff in 2022 and assisted with the team's wide receivers that fall. He was promoted to wide receivers coach in February 2023.

Gallagher served as an assistant coach working with the running backs and quarterbacks for the Virginia Armada of Major League Football. From 2019-22, he was an assistant coach at Maine-Endwell High School, helping the program win the 2021 New York State Class B title.

Gallagher graduated from Cornell University in 2018 with a bachelor's degree in industrial labor relations and earned a master's of management studies from Duke University, Fuqua School of Business in 2019. Gallagher was a football quarterback and baseball outfielder at Cornell from 2014-18, and continued his baseball career at Duke in the 2018-19 school year. He was second on Duke's team with eight home runs in 2019 and earned a spot on the 2019 NCAA Morgantown Regional all-tournament team.

An Endwell native, Gallagher earned New York State Player of the Year honors as a starting quarterback at Maine-Endwell High School. He earned two all-state honors and helped lead the program to three state titles.



Coaching Staff



Taj-Amir Torres
Cornerbacks

Taj-Amir Torres joined the Cortland coaching staff working with the team's cornerbacks in 2023.

Torres played cornerback for four seasons at Division I Boston College from 2015-18. He finished his career with five interceptions, 16 pass breakups and 108 tackles, 72 solo. He intercepted passes versus Miami, Syracuse and Temple as a senior, and in his junior season returned an interception for a touchdown in a win over UConn. He signed as a free agent and attended rookie minicamp with the NFL's Tennessee Titans in 2019.

Torres graduated from Boston College in January 2019 with a bachelor's degree in applied psychology & human development, and history, and is a master's degree candidate in clinical psychology at American International College.

Torres was cornerbacks coach and assisted with wide receivers at Mark T. Sheehan High School in Connecticut in the fall of 2022 and was the program's defensive backs and receivers coach and special teams coordinator in the spring of 2023. He also coached defensive backs and was head strength coach at Putnam Vocational Technical Academy in Massachusetts in the spring of 2022 and coached at Xaverian Brothers High School (Mass.) and with Under Armour Youth Football in the summer of 2019.

The Amherst, Mass., native is a 2016 alumnus of Amherst Regional High School. He was a two-time first team All-Western Massachusetts football player as well as a four-time state champion sprinter on the track and field team with three titles in the 100-meter dash from 2013-15 along with a 200-meter dash crown in 2015.



Joe Mack
Running Backs

Joe Mack was named Cortland's running backs coach in May 2023. He previously served as a student assistant coach working with the team's quarterbacks in the fall of 2021 and fall of 2022.

A native of Dryden, N.Y., Mack was a quarterback with the Red Dragons in 2019 and 2020. He graduated in the spring of 2023 with a bachelor's degree in physical education.

Mack graduated from Dryden High School in 2019. He was a three-year football starter, and a senior he set a school single-game completions record, earned first team Class C honors and played in the Ernie Davis Football All-Star game. Mack also lettered in basketball for two seasons and competed in indoor track and field for a year. Mack's father, Joe, is a Cortland alumnus and former Cortland quarterback,

and his mother, Kori, also graduated from Cortland. In addition, Mack's grandfather, Joseph Mack, played football at South Carolina and Lock Haven.



Bill Spicer
Tight Ends/Assistant Offensive Line

Former Cortland player and assistant coach Bill Spicer re-joined the Red Dragon coaching staff in May 2022 as the program's tight ends coach and assistant offensive line coach.

From 1999-2005, Spicer led a powerhouse program at Onondaga Central. The program won New York State Class D titles in 2001 and 2003 and a Class C crown in 2002. Spicer was named New York State Coach of the Year in those respective classes each of those years and received the President Gerald R. Ford All-American Football Coach Award in 2003. His Onondaga teams had a combined 68-8 record and featured future collegiate and NFL stars Mike Hart and Latavius Murray. Spicer was an assistant coach at Onondaga in 1998.

Spicer served as defensive coordinator and defensive assistant coach at Baldwinsville High School from 2013-21. Prior to Baldwinsville, he was an assistant coach at Hamilton College from 2006-13.

A Canastota, N.Y., native, Spicer graduated from Chittenango High in 1990 and played at Baldwinsville for three years prior to moving to Chittenango. An all-state offensive lineman as a senior, Spicer played two seasons at Southern Connecticut State University before transferring to Cortland to play in 1992 and 1993. He then served as Cortland's JV head coach in 1994 and as an assistant coach in 1995 before taking an assistant coaching position at Woodmont High in Greenville, S.C., from 1996-97.



Mike Conners
Assistant Defensive Line

Mike Conners joined the Cortland football coaching staff in 2022 assisting with the defensive line.

Conners spent 25 years as the head wrestling coach in the Fulton City School District from 1987-2012 and also coached the Fulton football team for 15 years. He helped lead Fulton's football team to the Section Three title and an appearance in the state finals in 2000. Among the players he coached at Fulton was current Cortland head coach Curt Fitzpatrick. Conners has also coached and served as athletic director at Oswego High School, and he's been an assistant coach for the SUNY Oswego wrestling team.

Conners earned a bachelor's degree from St. Lawrence University in 1984 and a master's degree in 1986. He competed in football and wrestling for four seasons at St. Lawrence.

Coaching Staff

Conners was a three-time All-America wrestler, winning the national heavyweight title as a senior in 1984, and he won four conference titles. He's a member of the Division III National Wrestling Hall of Fame and the St. Lawrence Athletic Hall of Fame.

A Baldwinsville, N.Y., native, Conners and his wife, Elizabeth, have two children, Michael and Timothy.



Phill Wiltshire **Strength and Conditioning Coordinator**

Phill Wiltshire began as Cortland Athletics' strength and conditioning coordinator in 2018. Wiltshire is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) and also holds a USA Weightlifting (USAW) certification.

Wiltshire previously served as an assistant coach with Cortland's track and field teams. He also was an assistant coach at Carthage College in Wisconsin during the 2014-15 school year and was a member of the coaching staff at the

University of Mary Washington in Virginia in 2013-14. He coached the school record breaker in the 60-meter dash at Carthage and the school record setter in both the 60-meter and 100-meter dashes at Mary Washington.

He also was a member of two winning 4x400-meter relays at the ECAC Division III Championships and four victorious 4x400-meter relays at the SUNYAC Championships. Wiltshire captured the 400-meter hurdle title at the 2011 outdoor conference meet and is a member of the school-record setting indoor and outdoor 4x400-meter relay teams. He was chosen to the SUNYAC Men's Track and Field All-Decade Team for 2010-19.

Wiltshire earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Cortland in 2011 and a master's degree in exercise science from Cortland in 2013. A native of Apalachin, N.Y., he graduated from Vestal High, where he competed in track and field, cross country and football.

New Name, Turf and Scoreboard for Cortland's Home Field

SUNY Cortland football's home field has officially been renamed the **James J. Grady '50, M '61 Field at the SUNY Cortland Stadium Complex** — or **Grady Field**, for short — as part of a historic million-dollar gift from **Chris Grady '79** to the university in honor of his father. The gift was announced in the fall of 2022 and the formal naming ceremony will occur during the Red Dragons' home football game versus Utica University on Oct. 7, 2023.

Grady Field will feature a new artificial turf playing surface and large video scoreboard in the fall of 2023. In addition to football, Grady Field is the primary home competition venue of Cortland's men's and women's lacrosse teams and a secondary venue for men's and women's soccer.

For Chris Grady, there's no name better to be permanently identified with SUNY Cortland athletics than Jim Grady, who played football as a quarterback for the Red Dragons. "My father had a great college experience," Chris said. "He went back for his master's there and went back summers. Cortland represented his career. As he got older, we always talked about Cortland and Cortland sports teams.

"One year, toward the end of his life, he asked if I could apply for a C-Club membership for him. That stuck in my head. He ended up passing (in Feb. 2021) of COVID, but when he passed, I said to my wife, 'A donation to Cortland in his name would be way better for him. He'll feel it wherever he is in heaven.' I think that is perfect for him."

The gift will help support SUNY Cortland Athletics and also will establish the **Christopher J. Grady '79 Scholarship**, for business economics students, and the **Terry Bedell Grady '80 Scholarship**, for physical education students. The scholarships are named after Chris and his wife. Chris said he chose to give back to SUNY Cortland not only because of his family's history, but because he views it as a place that gave him experiences that shaped his future. It's a life that's so far led him to success in the insurance industry, culminating in his current position as senior vice president of sales at Athene Annuity & Life Assurance Company. It's a company he helped to start.

Jim Grady served in World War II, graduated college in three years, and inspired a generation as an educator, coach and athletic director at Wantagh High School on Long Island. He was honored as the winningest varsity high school baseball coach in New York state and



began a post-retirement career in Chris' investment services company as a financial planner.

Chris' brothers add to the family's legacy at Cortland. Two, Michael and Jimmy, spent time on campus before transferring. A third brother, **Joe Grady '90**, transferred to Cortland and was an All-ECAC safety for the Red Dragons when the team finished 11-1 and advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals in 1988.

"SUNY Cortland is deeply appreciative of this most generous gift from the Grady family," said SUNY Cortland President **Erik J. Bitterbaum**. "This is a permanent monument to the memory of the late Jim Grady, and I hope that the deep meaning of this gesture for his family and friends is not lost on others. Jim's contributions to the world as an educator, coach, veteran, husband and father should be remembered each time our student-athletes step onto Grady Field."

"As I got involved in the college, I ended up doing many things," Chris said. "I tried out for the football team, ended up playing lacrosse, joined Beta Phi Epsilon, became president of Beta Phi Epsilon, was Men's Athletic Association president, student athletic director, manager of Roger Robinson's varsity football team, scorekeeper for basketball, a member of school senate. I was all over the place with a lot of cool experiences."
