The Bluejays have won eight of the 12 season openers under Ed Servais, including five of the last six.

2016 Preview

With the entire infield, weekend rotation and majority of the outfield and bullpen returning, the 2016 Creighton baseball team looks to claim its first BIG EAST Tournament Championship and return to the NCAA regionals for the first time since 2012.

The Bluejays earned the BIG EAST regular-season title during their first season in the new conference in 2014 and a spot in the championship game of the postseason tournament before falling to Xavier.

Last season, the Bluejays finished in second-place in the BIG EAST regular season at 13-4 and earned the No. 2 seed at the BIG EAST Tournament at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha

Creighton opened up the tournament with come-from-behind victory against Seton Hall before falling to St. John's during the second day. The Bluejays cruised to a 12-1 victory in a rematch against Seton Hall to set up a Creighton-St. John's championship game.

Creighton rallied from an early 5-0 deficit, but the Red Storm claimed the championship with an 8-7 victory, leaving the Bluejays a win away from clinching the NCAA automatic bid on their home field.

Rollie Lacy earned Freshman All-American and All-BIG EAST First Team status after leading the team in innings pitched (74.1) while posting a 6-1 record and 2.66 ERA. Junior Reagan Fowler (below) received All-BIG EAST First Team recognition and led the Bluejays with a .319 average.

"I like our roster a lot," coach Ed Servais said. "These guys have a lot of experience; they've played in a lot of big games. We hope the experience that they've had over the last several years can come into play this year and we can get over the hump."

Starting Rotation

While Lacy earned recognition a season ago, Creighton also returns senior Matt Warren and sophomore Keith Rogalla from the 2015 rotation.

Warren had a 1.80 ERA in 20 innings during conference play and finished the season with the most starts overall (13). He also earned Second Team All-American and All-BIG EAST First Team recognition following his sophomore campaign in 2014.

Rogalla made 10 starts as a freshman, tossing 59.0 innings in his first season at Creighton.

Senior **Taylor Elman** and juniors **Austin Groth** and **Jeff Albrecht** also return with experience in the starting rotation. The trio has combined for 51 starts in a Bluejay uniform.

"If we lose a guy we're not going to have to re-shuffle a lot," Servais said. "Six guys have pitched on weekends. We have three guys that have been Friday guys that for us that are back."

Junior college transfer **Austin Stroschein** will also push for a spot in the starting mix.

Bullpen

Junior **David Gerber** returns as the anchor of the bullpen after recording nine saves and a 1.69 ERA.

Sophomore **Ethan DeCaster** spent the majority of 2015 in a set-up role, appearing in 25 games. DeCaster picked up two saves as well.

Senior **Nick Highberger** led the team with 26 appearances and currently sits in ninth place on Creighton's career appearance list with 90 over three seasons. He accumulated a 5-2 record while also picking up one save.

Senior **John Oltman** also has experience as a closer.

"We have four guys that have closed games, so experience should not be an issue," Servais said. "We need to stay healthy and we need to stay focused."

Junior college transfer Connor Miller led the bullpen with a 0.71 ERA in 12.2 innings during BIG EAST play while left-handers Sam Norman and Will Bamesberger also return.

Infield/Outfield

Creighton returns its entire starting infield and majority of its outfield from last season that accounted for a .976 fielding percentage to lead the BIG EAST.

Harrison Crawford holds the third baseman position, Nicky Lopez and Ryan Fitzgerald combine for the middle infield and Fowler will start his fourth season at first base.

Crawford showed strides on the defensive side during his first season as a Bluejay while leading the team in on-base percentage (.440) at the plate.

Lopez committed only four errors in 225 chances (.982 fielding percentage) while making 43 starts at shortstop after playing third base his freshman year. He led the team in triples (6) on offense.

Fitzgerald spent the majority of 2015 at second base and led the team in home runs (four) and doubles (13).

Fowler had 537 putouts last season and ranks among Creighton leaders for putouts in a career.

Daniel Woodrow returns as Creighton's starting center fielder and lead-off hitter. Woodrow made a name for himself with speed, swiping 21 bases to lead the team and leading the team in runs scored with 57

Kevin Connolly returns in right field after making 41 starts last season and hitting for a .295 average.

In left field, **Brett Murray** returns with the most experience. He finished with 17 extra-base hits and 27 RBIs at the plate while making 38 starts in the outfield (27 in left, 11 in right) and 11 at designated hitter. **Riley Landuyt** and **Bryce Only** are each expected to contribute during their first season at Creighton.

Catcher/Designated Hitter

The Bluejays' main question mark will be at the catcher position as the lone returner with starting experience in a Creighton uniform will be sidelined with injury.

Senior **Matt Gandy** started 26 games last sesason as a designated hitter, but was a starting catcher during the two seasons prior at Chapman University.

Gandy, **Keith Oren** and **Michael Emodi** are expected to compete for time at catcher and designated hitter.

Scouting the Bulldogs (2015: 31-28, 18-12 MWC)

Like the Bluejays, Fresno State enters the 2016 season with high expectations. The Bulldogs rotation each saw action on the weekend last season.

The opening night starter, Ricky Thomas, was nearly unhittable this summer in the Cape Cod League. Thomas allowed just five runs in 44.1 innings in the top collegiate summer league.

Offensively the Bulldogs lost three of their top four hitters from last season. The lone returner that hit over .300 last season is Austin Guibor (.339).

Ed Servais Baseball (ESB) = Defense

Since taking over as Creighton's head coach in 2004, Ed Servais' teams have committed the fewest errors in the nation (586).

The Jays also hold the top overall fielding percentage during that stretch, .977.



2015 Summary

Coming off a BIG EAST regular-season title in 2014, Creighton came into its second season as a member of its new conference with a target on its back. Raising the stakes even higher was that the Bluejays would host the BIG EAST Tournament in TD Ameritrade Park Omaha. If you know anything about a team led by Ed Servais, the squad doesn't shy away from a challenge. The 2015 Bluejays were no exception.

Creighton opened the gate quickly, sweeping Cal State Bakersfield in California. Back-to-back trips to The Big Easy (New Orleans) produced a split with Northwestern State, but Tulane got the better of the Bluejays twice.

A tough test from Minnesota opened play at home for Creighton; the Golden Gophers took two to drop the Bluejays to 5-5. A road loss at Kansas State pushed Creighton under .500 at 5-6. The response was both swift and strong as Creighton rattled off 10 victories in the next 12 games to head into BIG EAST play with a 15-8 mark.

Early in the year injuries sidelined opening day starter Jack Rogalla and setup man Mark Lukowski. Rather than lament the loss of two important pieces, Servais and the Bluejays simply asked the next two men to step up. After not making the travel roster for the trip to Bakersfield, redshirt freshmen Rollie Lacy and Ethan DeCaster answered the call.

As Creighton opened BIG EAST play at Georgetown on April 2, Lacy had not only moved into the starting rotation he had taken over as the ace of the staff. De-

Caster, meanwhile, cemented himself as the eighth inning arm. Sophomore David Gerber also slid into a surprising role as the Bluejays closer, posting his fifth save in the first BIG EAST win of the year on April 4th.

After dropping the first BIG EAST contest of the year to the Hoyas, Creighton claimed the series by sweeping a doubleheader on April 4th, then took three straight from Xavier at home to move to 5-1 in conference and 20-9 overall.

The top two squads, St. John's and Creighton, faced off in TD Ameritrade Park Omaha in mid-April but weather limited the series to a split of two games.

The Bluejays dropped just two BIG EAST contests the rest of the way, once at Butler and once at Seton Hall, but the rain out against St. John's cost the Bluejays a chance to claim the top seed in the BIG EAST Tournament. Instead Creighton entered the conference tournament as the number two seed. St. John's claimed the top spot, while Seton Hall (No. 3) and Georgetown (No. 4) also earned the right to play in Omaha.

Down the stretch of the season the Bluejays got a spark as Jack Rogalla returned to the mound to bolster the bullpen and his younger brother Keith emerged as a strong option as a starter. The trio of Lacy, Keith Rogalla and Matt Warren gave Creighton a formidable rotation for the BIG EAST Tournament. Creighton opened the conference tournament with a 7-4 win over Seton Hall, setting up a winner's bracket battle with St. John's. As the Red Storm did on April 18, starter Ryan McCormick handcuffed the Bluejays with a two-hit complete game.

After exploding for 12 runs to eliminate Seton Hall the following day, 12-1 win, the Bluejays looked forward to another chance at St. John's. Down 5-0 entering the top of the seventh, the Creighton bats dropped a quintet of runs on the Red Storm to even the game at 5-5.

St. John's responded with one in the seventh and two more in the eighth, but Creighton had one more gasp. The Bluejays opened the ninth with consecutive singles, forcing the Red Storm to call on McCormick once more. Sophomore Kevin Connolly greeted the St. John's hurler with an RBI single. The Bluejays got one more in the inning, yet the comeback fell one run short.

Following the season Lacy collected Freshman All-American and All-BIG EAST First Team honors, while first baseman Reagan Fowler and second baseman Ryan Fitzgerald also earned All-BIG EAST First and Second Team accolades respectively.
