Murray State Head Coach Kevin Moulder

Moulder collected 16 wins in his first season as head coach of the Racers.

Scouting the Racers (2016: 5-3, 0-0 Ohio Valley) (2015: 16-40, 11-19 Ohio Valley)

Murray State scored seven runs during its opening series before exploding for 84 runs over four games, including 29 against Northern Illinois on Sunday.

The Racers tied a program record with six home runs during their 29-16 win against the Huskies.

Brandon Gutzler leads Murray State with five home runs, five doubles, 23 RBI and is one of three players with more than 15 hits and a .500 batting average.

As a team the Racers hit .363 over their first eight games.

Murray State scored 91 runs in eight games, but also gave up 57. The pitching staff owns a 5.91 ERA.

Bluejay Arms vs. Racer Bats

The weekend series with Murray State will feature a renewal of the question, which is better good hitting or good pitching?

Murray State has scored 91 runs in eight games, 11.4 per game. In five home contests the Racers have put up 84 runs, 16.8 per contest, including 29 against Northern Illinois on Sunday, Feb. 28.

Creighton, meanwhile, has limited Stetson and Fresno State to one run in four of the Bluejays six games. On the season the Bluejays have allowed a total of 18 runs in six contests.

Early Season Bonding

Head coach Ed Servais believes there is more to a successful team than just talent. One key ingredient is bonding as a unit. The Bluejays often try to take time to come together as one group early in the season and 2016 will be no exception.

The Blueiavs will bus from Omaha to Murray, Kentucky on Thursday, March 3 to play a three-game series with Murray State on Friday, March 4.

Following Sunday's contest Creighton will bus to Lawrence, Kansas for a single-game with the Jayhawks on March 8. Then the Bluejays hit the road to Manhattan, Kansas to face Kansas State on Wednesday, March 9 before finally returning home.

The total hours on the bus will be 19 hours.

Leadoff man Daniel Woodrow has extended his reached base streak to 25 consecutive game after getting on in the final 19 of 2015 and the first six this season.

Woodrow also is in the midst of a six-game hitting streak to open the season.

Flipping the Script Against the Hatters

After going just 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position against Fresno State in the opening series, the Bluejays were 11-for-29 (.379) in that category versus Stetson.

Creighton also went from delivering just one two-out RBI against the Bulldogs to nabbing six in the battle with Stetson.

Gerber Saves the Day

David Gerber provided another example of why he is one of the premier closers in the BIG EAST against Stetson last weekend.

On Saturday Gerber came into a bases loaded jam with one out and a 4-1 lead in the ninth. The Illinois native needed just six pitches to induce a game-saving inningending double play for his first save of the season. The following day Gerber tossed a scoreless ninth to preserve a 7-5 win, earning his second save.

The Servais Way Begins in the Pen

Head coach Ed Servais has long been known for focus on defense and the bullpen. The 2016 Bluejays are proving off to a strong start in the pen. A combined 10 arms have seen action for the Bluejays in the opening six games. The group have thrown a combined 25.1 innings, holding the opposition to just four runs, three earned. The resulting 1.07 ERA is

Lopez Named BIG EAST Baseball Player of the Week

Creighton Baseball junior Nicky Lopez was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on Monday, Feb. 29th as Lopez led the Bluejays to a series sweep at Stetson last weekend.

Lopez helped the Bluejays to a 3-0 weekend with a .400 batting average hitting 6-for-15 with two doubles and three RBI. His threerun double gave the Bluejays a 4-1 edge in the series finale with Stetson.

After struggling to find a consistent lefty reliever last season, Creighton is loving the 2016 versions of John Oltman and Sam Norman.

The duo have combined for 5.1 innings of scoreless relief in the first two weekends.

Murray Catches Lightning

With just two career home runs entering the season, senior Brett Murray seems poised to push though numbers to the heavens. In the first game of the season Murray blasted a solo shot to account for the Bluejays lone run of the season opener.

Crawford Enjoyed his Homecoming

Another Bluejay delivering against the Bulldogs last weekend was senior Harrison Crawford. The California native was 3-for-8 with two runs scored and four walks in Fresno last weekend.

David Gerber Named to NCBWA Preseason Stopper of Year Watch List

Creighton junior David Gerber was one of 70 players in the NCAA named to the initial Watch List for the 12th annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.

Last season Gerber closer the year with a team-high nine saves and an impressive 1.69 ERA in 25 appearances. David recorded 30 strikeouts in 32.0 innings, allowing just eight walks and six earned runs.

Bluejays Picked Second in **BIG EAST Preseason Poll**

The Creighton Baseball team was picked to finish second in the 2016 preseason poll, released on Tuesday, Dec. 22.

For the third-straight season, the voting for preseason favorite is split by just one vote, swinging in favor of St. John's, who was the BIG EAST coaches' decision for No. 1 with 34 total points, four first-place votes. Creighton, last year's tournament runner up was picked second with 33 points, with Seton Hall a close third with 26 points. These three top teams have finished in the top three of the standings for the past two years.




