Series History:

Iowa leads Creighton, 5-1-0

The Hawkeyes and Bluejays meet for the first time since 2008 in the season opener on Friday. Iowa leads the series with Creighton, 5-1-0. The Hawkeyes have won the last three meetings and have taken two of three contests in Omaha. Last season Iowa posted a 7-10-1 record.

Creighton leads Missouri-Kansas City, 4-2-1

Creighton holds a 4-2-1 series edge on the Roos, but the matchup has been trending south. UMKC won the last two meetings, including a 2-1 win last season and a 2-0 contest in Morrison Stadium in 2014.

Last season the Roos closed the season with a 14-6-1 mark.

2016 Preview

Setting the Standard

Looking back at the Bluejays' first year under the guidance of Ross Paule, Creighton's 10-10-0 season produced some bright spots as well as areas that need work.

"I'd grade our effort in 2015 as average. From our record (10-10-0) to not making the BIG EAST Tournament," said Paule. "Every year I'm going to look at what we can do to improve. Bottom line we weren't good enough last year. We have to improve on all aspects of the game, and we will."

Paule understands the high standard he demands from his team, but he has a vision of where he wants the Bluejay program.

"With the facility and the resources available here at Creighton, there is no reason we shouldn't be able to take this program where it needs to be. That's at the top," said Paule.

Paule is realistic about the path ahead, but he sees bright spots. The optimism for the upcoming season begins with the continued stellar play of senior **Lauren Sullivan** (who led the Bluejays for the second consecutive season in 2015) as well as the emergence of senior **Ylenia Sachau** as a set piece specialist. In addition, goalkeeper **Erin Scott** collected the second most saves (108) in Bluejay history playing as a true freshman last year.

"We had several good halves, but we did not put together a complete match," said Paule. "We're going to make the BIG EAST Tournament this year! This is the goal, we believe we can do it and we are going to push for it."

While a strong core of Bluejays are back, Paule has added 15 new faces to boost the Creighton roster to 27.

"The key for this team is for as many as possible to come into fall camp fit, not having to worry about catching anyone up in term of fitness," concluded Paule. "The summer is a time to get better individually. I have been very specific with each player as to what is needed and expected for them and our team to be successful."

Defense

Performance on the pitch begins with a strong presence in the net, good communication and a cohesive back line. The backbone for the Bluejays' defensive effort is senior captain **Emily Roll** as well as Sachau and Scott.

"We expect Emily to be a leader," said Paule. "Our upperclassmen have to be the ones ready to lead this team to new heights."

With six shutouts and 108 saves in her first season, Scott will be critical to the Bluejays' performance. Paule was pleased with her play last season, yet sees the potential for her to get even better.

"Playing immediately gave Erin the experience and confidence to continue to improve," concluded Paule. "The next step for her is to be more vocal to help improve the back lines."

Bolstering the defensive core, the Bluejays expect junior **McKynzie Dickman** as well as transfers **Gabriela Braga** (Monroe College) and **Mackenzie Graybill** (NC State) to contribute as well.



Offense

Sullivan will remain the motor for the Bluejays scoring attack. She enters her senior season with 20 career goals, placing her in a tie for seventh in Creighton history. Paule believes Sullivan can surpass the 10 goals she scored in 2015, which would place her in the top three overall.

While Sullivan will be critical to Creighton's success, she will have more than just a bit of help. Junior **Darby Hugunin** returned from a Jones fracture, which sidelined her in 2014, to see action in each contest last year. In addition, sophomore **Kaira Houser**'s output of four goals is expected to rise, while freshmen **Caeley Lordemann** and **Hannah Miller** should provide new firepower for the Bluejays.

"It's important that we put our chances into the back of the net, whether its one each match or 10," said Paule. "We will focus on that from day one. We're a young team, but that is a good thing as they will all be hungry."

"It's exciting, because we have a culture based on being excellent in all that you do. That is going to translate into success on the field," concluded Paule. "This team is a great group of technical hard working players. They are going to be the foundation to build a successful program on, one that begins by playing with passion and purpose."
