Scouting Creighton (0-1-1)

The Bluejays hit the road for the first time this season with a 0-1-1 record after opening the 2023 campaign with a 2-2 draw against Nebraska, before fall to Missouri, 3-1.

Seniors Maddie Radke and Hannah Luke have each delivered a goal for Creighton this season, while the third was a own goal scored by Missouri. Junior Azumi Manriki and seniors Lara Kazandjian and Abigail Santana have all recorded one assist.

Fresh off a second trip to the BIG EAST Tournament Semifinals in 2022, the Bluejays have renewed energy as 15 players return from last season's squad that posted an 8-4-8 record. Creighton returned eight players who started 10 or more matches in 2022, led by senior **Lara Kazandjian**.

Kazandjian, a 2022 All-BIG EAST First Team

selection, was named to the All-BIG EAST Preseason Team after scoring a team-high four goals last fall.

The Creighton attack remains strong as its top-five point scorers return from a season ago. Luke recorded three goals and three assists to tie for the team-lead in points while Santana and senior **Ariana Mondiri** each delivered three goals and two assists in 2022. Manriki also returns after contributing two goals and a team-high four assists last season.

In addition to the experience returning on the offensive side of the ball, the Bluejays return a wealth of experience on the defensive side.

Graduate **Keelan Terrell** brings 52 matches of experience and better than 4,700 minutes in the net for the Bluejays. Senior captains **Gabby Grimaldi** and **Peighton Steffen** will anchor the back line for the Bluejays after logging a combined 3,254 minutes last season.

Creighton also welcomes in 14 newcomers, including transfer **Andrine Westlie** and freshmen **Maia** and **Shani Sirota** (Israel) who are each expected to contribute during their first seasons in Omaha.

Head coach **Ross Paule** is in his ninth year at the helm of the Bluejays.

Scouting (RV) Saint Louis (1-1-0)

Set to play their first home match of the season, Saint Louis brings a 1-1-0 record into Thursday night's contest at Hermann Stadium.

The Billikens opened the 2023 campaign with a narrow 3-2 loss at #13 BYU, before posting a 2-0 shutout victory over Utah State last Sunday.

well as juniors **Emily Gaebe** and **Hannah Sawyer** have each recorded one goal this season, while **Hannah Larson** has dished out two assists.

Goalkeeper **Emily Puricelli** has secured 17 saves this season, while allowing three goals for a 1.50 goals against average. The senior recently became the school's all-time leader in career goalkeeper victories with 49 wins.

The Billikens' return 17 players, including nine starters, from last season's record setting year. Of those 17 returns, Saint Louis returns seven Atlantic 10 All-Conference and three United Soccer Coaches Association All-American honorees.

Saint Louis ended the 2022 season leading the country in winning percentage (.909), goal per game (2.95), assists per game (2.77) and points per game (8.68), while finishing third in shutout percentage (.682) and goals against average (0.46).

Among the returns is defender **Lyndsey Heckel**, who earned First Team All-American honors, and Second Team All-American honoree **Abbie Miller**.

The Billikens were picked as the favorites to win the Atlantic 10 once again this season, after capturing a perfect 10-0 mark in conference play in 2022.

Head Coach **Katie Shields** is in his 11th season at the helm and owns an overall record of 134-57-13 at Saint Louis.

Series History Against The Billikens

Creighton and Saint Louis have met just two times in program history but have not met since 2001. The Billikens hold a 2-0-0 lead in the series, claiming victories in both previous meetings.

Saint Louis picked up a 2-0 win over the Bluejays in first ever meeting in 2000 and a 2-1 double-overtime victory during the 2001 season.

Bluejay History in First Road Match of Season

Creighton hits the road for the first time this season with a contest on Thursday night at Saint Louis. The Bluejays are 14-17-2 all-time in road opening matches, while Creighton is 2-4-1 under head coach **Ross Paule**.

Bluejays Net Fastest Goal in Morrison Stadium History and Fastest Goal since 2001

Head coach Ross Paule has been known for waiting to take an advantage early and that was exactly what the Bluejays did on Aug. 20 against Missouri. The Bluejays took the opening kickoff and raced down the field firing their first shot of the match

just 10 second into the contest.

Although the shot was saved, the Bluejays recovered the loose ball and sent a cross back into the box, where a Missouri player headed the pass into their own goal giving Creighton a 1-0 lead just 22 second into the match.

The 22 second goal was the fastest goal ever recorded in Morrison Stadium history, men's or women's and was also the fastest goal scored by the Bluejays since **Lulu Quigley** converted a penalty kick just 21 seconds in a contest against Western Illinois on Oct. 28, 2001.

It was the third time in the last two seasons that the Bluejays have scored in the first 90 seconds on a match. Last season, Juelle Love scored just 41 seconds in a match against Tulsa (Sept. 4), just three days after Jenny Grissom netted a goal 70 seconds into a match against North Dakota (Sept. 1).

Steffen's Logging Serious Minutes

Since arriving on campus in the fall of 2020 senior **Peighton Steffen** has been a staple in the Bluejays starting lineup. The heart of Creighton's backline, Steffen has played 4,669 minutes in her career, 99.4 percent of the 4,699 possible minutes she could have played.

Dating back to last season, Steffen has played 1,550 consecutive minutes along the Creighton backline. Her 1,550 consecutive minutes played is the longest stretch by a Bluejay player since **Keelan Terrell** played 2,193 consecutive minutes in goal between the 2020 and 2021 seasons.

Near Record Crowd Witnesses Bluejays Season-Opener

Creighton hosted the third largest crowd in school history on Thursday Aug. 17, when Nebraska traveled up I-80 for the 2023 season-opener. The crowd of 1,834 saw the Bluejays deliver a pair of equalizing goals in the second half to earn a 2-2 draw.

Thursday's crowd was the largest crowd to witness a Creighton women's soccer match since 2,023 fans saw the Bluejays overcome a 2-0 deficit to beat Kansas State, 3-2, in the 2019 season-opener.

2023 Opponents in Bold

In total, seven players made their Creighton debut against Nebraska. The seven newcomers are the most newcomers to appear in a season-opening games since seven Bluejays made their first appearance against Kansas State in the 2019 season-opener.

Freshmen **Maia** and **Shani Sirota** as well as sophomore **Andrine Westlie** earned their first Bluejay start, while **Savanna Solomon**, **Tejia Murray-Powell**, **Clara Kulick** and **Tilly Thomas** all made their Bluejay debuts against the Huskers. Sophomore transfer Millie Thistleton also made her Bluejays debut against Missouri on Aug. 20.

Bluejays' Post Season-Opening Draw

For the fourth time in program history, Creighton posted a draw to open the season, scoring a pair of second-half goals in the Bluejays' 2-2 tie against Nebraska. It is the second straight season the Bluejays have opened the season with a tie, which includes a 0-0 draw against Montana last season.

The Bluejays also open the season with a draw during the 2009 (T, 0-0 (2ot) vs. Iowa State) and the 2010 (T, 0-0 (2ot) vs. South Dakota State) seasons.

The Aug. 20th match against Nebraska was Creighton's first tie in a game with four or more total goals since a 2-2 draw vs. #10 Georgetown in 2019.

Season-Opener History

With a 2-2 draw against Nebraska on Aug. 17, Creighton moved to 17-14-4 in season openers all-time and 21-9-5 is home openers.

Under Paule, Creighton is 4-3-2 in season openers, which includes a 4-0-1 mark in contests at home to start a season and a 6-2-1 record in home openers.

Thursday marked the 18th time in program history that the Bluejays opened the season at home. Creighton is now 11-4-3 in those contests.

Hannah Luke Delivers Latest Game-Tying Goal Since 2017

Down to the final eight minutes of play in the season-opener against Nebraska, senior Hannah Luke delivered an equalizing goal in the 83rd minute (82:48) of play to earn the Bluejays a 2-2 draw.

Luke's goal at 82:48 was the latest game-tying goal scored by a Bluejays since Jaylin Bosak scored in the 90th minute (89:24) against South Dakota State on Sept. 3, 2017.

Impact of No Overtime

One of the major changes prior to the 202 season was the elimination of overtime from the regular season. Overtime will continue to only come into play in the postseason with some additional changes. First, there is no golden goal. Teams will now play two 10-minute periods before heading to a shootout if the score remains tied after the overtime periods.

Since joining the BIG EAST in 2013, Creighton had played 36 overtime matches with the Bluejays going 8-14-14 in those contests.

In the first four years in the BIG EAST, Creighton went 5-4-4 in matches that went extra time. The five seasons prior to change had not fared quite as well, as the Bluejays had gone 3-10-9 in overtime matches.

In total, Creighton has played 128 overtime matches with the Bluejays holding a 35-42-51 mark in those contests.

Production Returns

Creighton returns eight players who started 10 or more matches from last fall's team that finished 8-4-8 and 4-3-3 in the BIG EAST Conference.

All told, CU returns 73.6 percent of its starts, 72 percent of its minutes, 65.4 percent of its goals, 77.3 percent of its assists, 68.9 percent of its points, and 93.0 percent of its saves off of last year's squad.

Scoring First Yields Success

Creighton finished 8-0-2 during the 2022 season when scoring first, but 0-4-4 when its opponent scores first.

Additionally, the Bluejays were a perfect 6-0-0 when leading at the half, but 0-3-3 when trailing after 45 minutes and 2-1-5 when the score was tied at halftime.

Overall, Creighton is 46-10-9 when leading at the half, but 10-54-7 when trailing after 45 minutes and 0-0-5 when tied at half under head coach Ross Paule.

Creighton's last come-from-behind victory and last victory when trailing at the half came during the 2020 season against DePaul (April 4), when **Aida Kardovic** and **Lea Høiness** each netted goals in the second half for a 2-1 win.

International Flavor

Creighton finds players from all over the globe to come to Omaha, Neb. to play soccer and this year's roster features a more robust team with players from 10 different countries.

Creighton head coach **Ross Paule** has gathered a group of 16 players from nine different international countries, while the remaining 13 players hail from the United States.

Creighton is 0-1-1 in home matches this season, including a 2-2 draw against Nebraska in the season-opener on Aug. 17. Creighton is now 111-57-26 all-time at Morrison Stadium (opened in 2003), which includes a 12-5-4 mark in home-openers.

Creighton Picked Fifth In BIG EAST Preseason Poll

The Bluejays were picked to finish fifth in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll, the league announced on Aug. 10.

Creighton earned 67 points in the preseason coaches' poll to place fifth, two points behind fourth place finisher, Butler. The Bluejays went 4-3-3 during BIG EAST play last season to tie for fourth place before bowing out of the postseason in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Championship. The squad returns eight starters and a total of 15 returners from a season ago and welcomes 15 newcomers for the 2023 campaign.

Defending BIG EAST regular-season and tournament champion Georgetown claimed the top spot with 100 points, including the maximum 10 first-place votes. Xavier tallied one first-place vote and a total of 89 points to place second. St. John's totaled 79 points for third, followed by Butler with 69 points for fourth. Connecticut (63), Providence (47), Marquette (34), Villanova (33), DePaul (16) and Seton Hall (14) rounded out the bottom half of the poll.

The top six teams in the final league standings will qualify for the 2022 BIG EAST Championship Presented by JEEP. The first-round matchups will be hosted by the higher seed on Oct. 30 (3 vs. 6 and

4 vs. 5), while the semifinals on Nov. 3 (1 vs. winner of 4/5 and 2 vs. winner of 3/6) and final match on Nov. 6 will be played in Boyds, Md.

Kazandjian Tabled To Preseason All-BIG EAST Team

Senior midfielder **Lara Kazandjian** earned individual recognition as the BIG EAST Preseason honors and poll was released on Thursday, Aug. 10.

Kazandjian, a Kirkland, Quebec, Canada native, made an immediate impact in her first season with the Bluejays in 2022. The senior was voted to the All-BIG EAST First Team last fall after leading the Bluejays with nine points on a team-high four goals and one assist. She logged 1,186 minutes in 17 matches on the pitch. Kazandjian is one of eight players returning to the squad this season after starting at least 10 matches during the 2022 season.

Season Outlook

Entering his ninth year as the Bluejay head coach, **Ross Paule** and his experienced squad have their sights set on a return trip to the BIG EAST Tournament and their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2010.

Creighton ended last season in its second BIG EAST Championship semifinals after closing the year with an 8-4-8 overall record, including a tie in the first round of the BIG EAST Championships that resulted in a 6-5 penalty kick shootout victory over Butler.

The Bluejays bring back a wealth of experience with 12 returning players starting

at least four matches last season.

One of the driving forces for the Bluejays in 2023 will be goalkeeper **Keelan Terrell**. The Kansas native returns for her fifth season in net for the Bluejays after posting a 0.99 goals against average in 17 matches last season.

The addition of **Caroline Blum** and **Maddie Merrick** as well as the return of **Kailey Hall** adds depth in the net as all three goalkeepers will battle for playing time.

Senior **Peighton Steffen** and graduate student **Gabby Grimaldi** will lead the line of defense in front Terrell once again this season.

The duo logged over 3,200 minutes combined last fall, while posting seven shutouts. Steffen started all 20 matches, playing a team-high 1,812 minutes for the third consecutive season. Grimaldi saw action in 19 matches, tallying one assist.

Graduate student **Hitomi Yamaue** is expected to return to the back line this season after having her 2022 season cut short due to a knee injury, while senior **Maddie Radke** will be called upon to play a more significant role this season after dishing out three assists last fall.

Offensively, the Bluejays have a large hole to fill as three-time All-BIG EAST First Team hon-

oree, Aida Kardovic, graduated in the spring of 2023.

Although, All-East Region honoree Aida Kardovic has departed, the Creighton attack remains strong as the Bluejays welcome back the top-five point scorers from a season ago, including All-BIG EAST selection **Lara Kazandjian**. She closed 2022 with four goals and an assist, while senior **Hannah Luke** delivered three goals and three assists in 20 matches.

Seniors **Abigail Santana** and **Ariana Mondiri**, as well as junior **Azumi Manriki** are all expected to be key contributors for the Bluejays once again this season. Last fall Mondiri and Santana each delivered three goals and two assists, while Manriki dished out a team-high four assists and added two goals.

Creighton welcomes in 14 newcomers for the 2023 campaign, which includes three transfers and 11 freshmen.

Senior **Stella Downing** comes to Creighton after playing two seasons at Ole Miss. As a Rebel, Downing tallied three assists while appearing in 41 matches. Prior to joining Ole Miss, Downing dished out two assists in 12 matches at Memphis.

Freshmen **Shani Sirota** and **Savanna Solomon** are also expected to make an immediate impact for the Bluejays this season.

Creighton's 2023 schedule will test the Bluejays from the first day of the regular season as Creighton opens the year with a match against in-state rival Nebraska on Aug. 17. In total, Creighton will host nine regular-season matches inside Morrison Stadium, which includes matchups against Minnesota and perennial BIG EAST powerhouse Georgetown.

The Bluejays will also be battle tested on the road, traveling to face defending Atlantic 10 Conference champion Saint Louis before conference road trips to Connecticut, Villanova, DePaul and Butler.

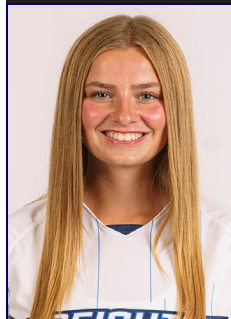

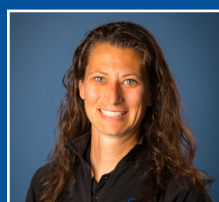
