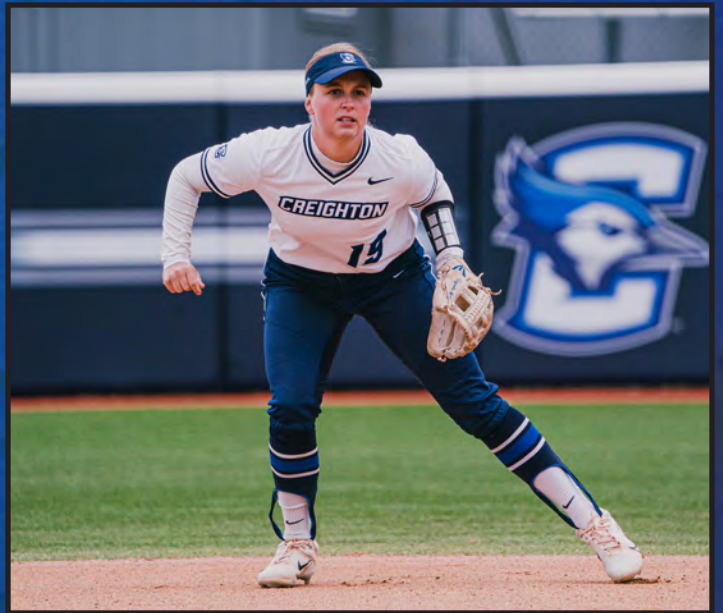
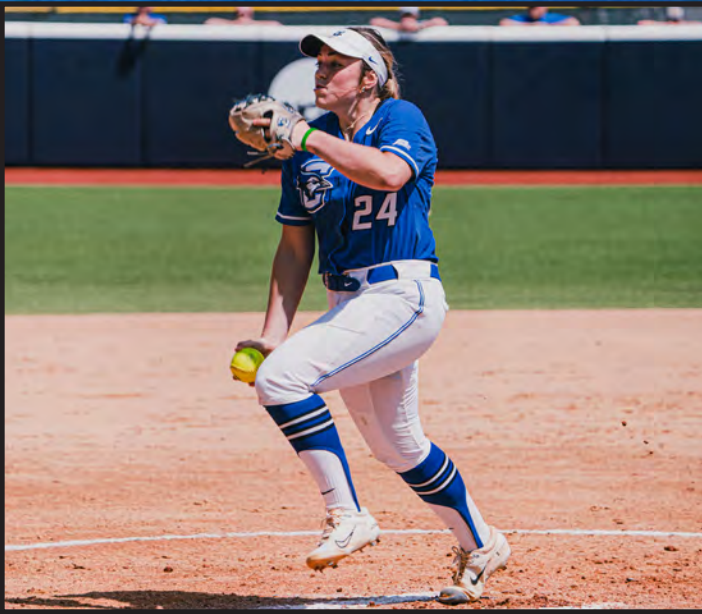
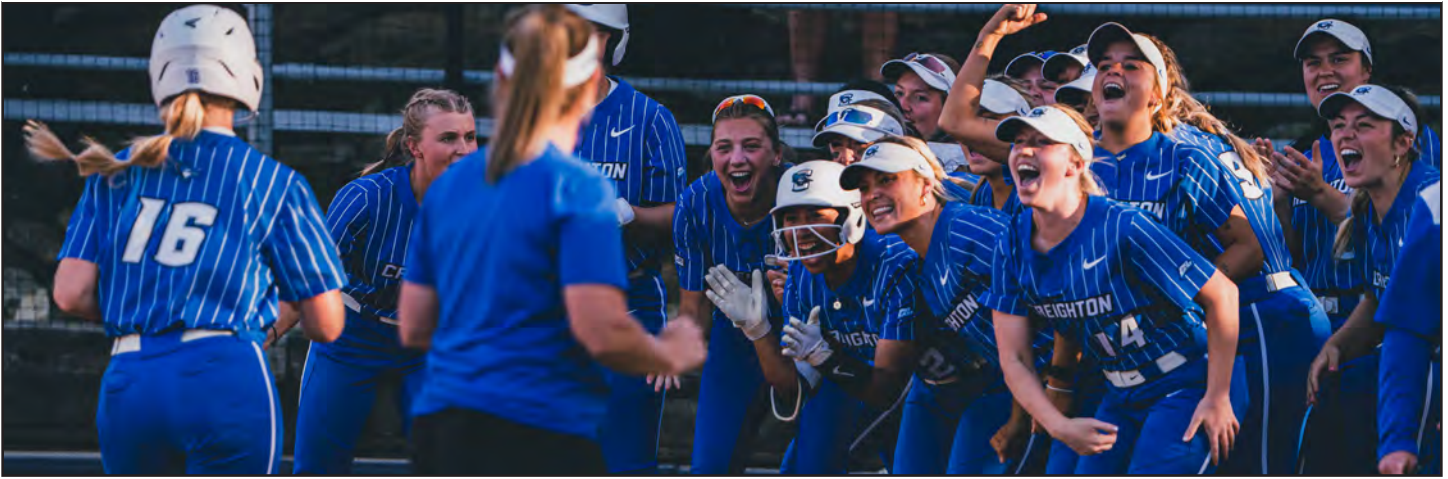

Season Preview

The 2024 Creighton Softball team enters the new year seeking a return to the BIG EAST Championships for just the third time since joining the league in 2014, and an NCAA Regional berth for the first time since 2010.

Despite some early season momentum last year, Creighton posted a 22-31 overall record in head coach Krista Wood's first season with the Bluejays, finishing tied for eighth in the final BIG EAST Conference standings.

With nine returning letterwinners who started more than 15 games last season, Wood's has the key pieces back to make a long postseason run.

In addition, Creighton returns 15 letterwinners, led by unanimous All-BIG EAST First Team selection, **Cayla Nielsen**, while 10 newcomers will fight for playing time all around the diamond.

Outfield

Creighton's only returning All-BIG EAST selection, Nielsen led the Bluejays in hits (62), slugging percentage (.650) and on-base percentage (.486). Additionally, the Blair, Neb., native started 49 games pacing Creighton in runs scored (43) and stolen bases (6), while ranking second on the team in doubles (11), walks (24) and RBI (33). She also showed a little power throughout last season, ranking third on the team with nine home runs.

Joining Nielsen in the outfield is senior **Emma Rosonke**, sophomore **Ella Dalton** and junior **Sydra Seville**. All three saw significant playing time in the outfield last season and will be back pushing for the starting spot again this season.

Rosonke led the Bluejays with four outfield assists while starting 50 games in right field last spring. The Omaha native ranked third on the team with 32 RBI, while posting a .283 batting average with 17 extra-base hits.

Dalton made huge strides in her game during her first season with the Bluejays. Dalton ended

the year with a .278 batting average and a .417 slugging percentage, while racking up three doubles, a team-high two triples and one home run.

Seville also made a big contribution in the outfield for the Bluejays last season. The Illinois native appeared in 43 games, making 35 starts while posting a .229 batting average.

Returning letterwinner **Mikayla Chairez** will push for a starting spot this season after appearing in 34 contests, including seven starts a year ago.

Chairez will be challenged by returner **Elliot Smith**, as well as incoming freshman **Lynn Davis** and South Dakota State transfer **Kaelan Schultz**.

Schultz, a four-time First Team All-State honoree, returns to her home state of Nebraska after redshirting a year at SDSU. Schultz brings big bat to the Bluejays lineup, as she broke the Nebraska high school state record with 65 career home runs at Hastings Senior High.

An Omaha native, Davis guided Millard North High School to a pair of fifth place finishes at the NSAA Class A State Championships, while earning *Omaha World-Herald* and *Lincoln Journal Star* Class A First Team honors after recording a .408 batting average as a senior.

Infield

Creighton will be forced to replace three-time All-BIG EAST performer Kailey Wilson at , but with the return of three position players, the Bluejays will have a wealth of experience to guide the infield.

Senior **Madeline Vejvoda** will once again lead the Bluejays after starting all 53 games at second base last season. The La Vista native recorded a team-high 70 defensive assists while ranking third with 100 putouts.

Fellow senior **Alyssa Gappa** will also return to the hot corner for the Bluejays this season. Last spring, Gappa appeared in all 53 games, posting a .265 batting average with a team-high 12 doubles and 10 home runs. The Omaha native also led the team for the second consecutive season with nine hit-by-pitches.

Sophomore **Ensley Frame** will anchor the Creighton infield up the middle, returning for her second season with the Bluejays. Last season, Frame started 46 games at shortstop, tallying 21 hits with two doubles, 10 RBI and 17 runs scored.

Returner **Erika Perez**, as well as incoming freshmen **Ashten Pierson** and **Kenzie Nakasawa** will each fight for playing time this season.

Pierson, the 2023 Kansas Class 4A Player of the Year, will look to make an immediate impact in her first season with the Bluejays. As a senior, Pierson guided the Red Raiders to a Kansas Class 4A State Championship and earned All-State honors after posting a .551 batting average as a senior.

Catcher/Designated Player

Sophomore **Lily West** made an immediate impact in her first year with the Bluejays behind the plate. The Choctaw, Okla., native started all 53 games while ranking second on the team with a .335 batting average and 58 hits.

Senior **Elly Beeson** as well as freshman **Sydney Potter** will all fight for the starting job this season.

Potter guided Southeast Polk High School to three straight Iowa Class 5A State tournaments while earning All-Iowa *Des Moines Register* Softball Player of the Year honors as a senior when she hit .470 with 16 home runs and 55 RBI.

Pitching

Three Bluejays return to the pitching staff this season after posting a 4.34 ERA in 53 games during the 2023 season.

Sophomore Natalia Puchino logged a team-high 151 innings with a 3.89 ERA while recording 113 strikeouts, becoming the fifth Bluejay in program history to record 100 strikeouts in their freshman season.

Junior **Alexis Wiggins** also returns to the circle for the Bluejays after logging 47.2 innings and a 3.52 ERA before suffering a season-ending injury last spring.

Senior **Jena Lawrence** contributed 54 innings during her junior campaign last season. The Albia, Iowa native started just two games, but appeared in 19 contests, tallying a 4.80 ERA and 33 strikeouts.

Wichita State transfer **Kenzie Schopfer** and true freshmen **Brooklyn Patchen** and **Brooke Shifflett** are expected to make an immediate impact in the circle during their first seasons with the Bluejay program.

Schopfer joins the Creighton pitching staff after spending two seasons at Wichita State, where she helped the Shockers to a 78-30 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances.

Patchen led Anthony Wayne High School to three OHSAA Division I State Tournament semifinals, while guiding the Generals to a state championship after compiling a 0.89 ERA and 219 strikeouts as a junior.

Rasmussen Fitness & Sports Center

The Rasmussen Fitness & Sports Center, a 50,000-square foot building offering a multipurpose fieldhouse with synthetic turf for athletic team practices and intramural sports, was officially opened on Oct. 23, 2012. In addition to the indoor practice area, the Rasmussen Center offers a suspended two lane running track and a fitness level furnished with cardio, circuit training and free-weight equipment for all Creighton students, faculty and staff.

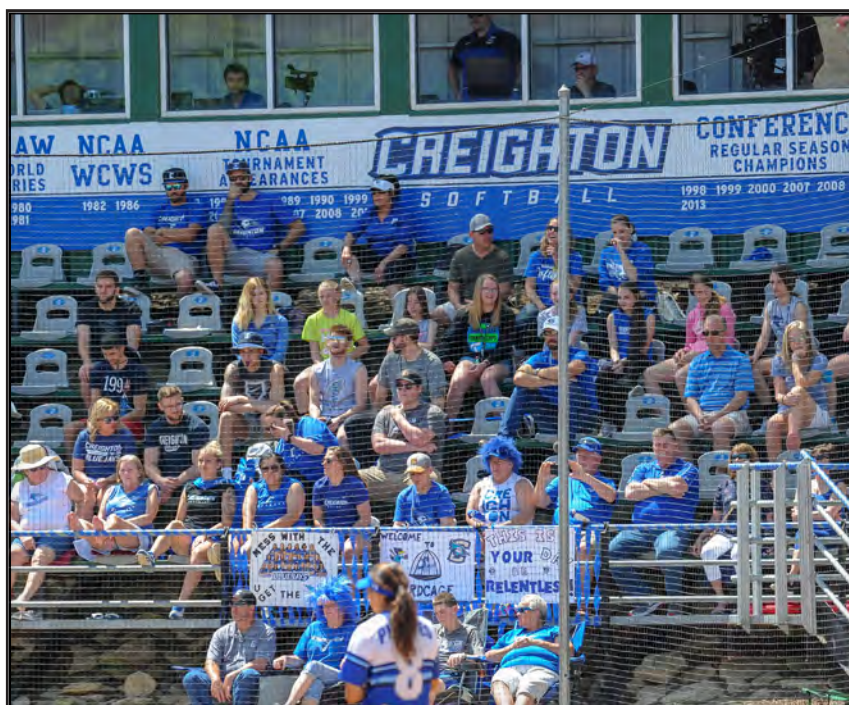
Named for former McCormick Endowed Athletic Director Bruce Rasmussen, the facility was made possible by generous gifts from Ruth and Bill Scott as well as several other donors. The Scotts have been long time supporters and friends of Creighton. In 1995 the Scotts established a scholarship for international students who enrolled in the School of Medicine. The Nebraska natives have deep roots in the Omaha community and have donated millions of dollars to more than 100 different organizations.

Rasmussen was with Creighton for 41 years, the last 27 years as athletic director. During his tenure, Creighton's athletic teams rose to national prominence both on and off the field. With Rasmussen in the role of athletic director, Creighton won 43 regular-season and 43 conference tournament titles, which helped lead to 90 postseason appearances. Creighton was the only school in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to make 15 straight men's basketball postseasons.

Creighton's reputation as one of the nation's top academic institutions is reflected in the success Bluejay student-athletes have had in the classroom during Rasmussen's service as athletic director. Creighton's baseball, men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball, men's and women's cross country, women's soccer and men's and women's tennis teams all received national awards for their academic success. Bluejay student athletes consistently own collective GPAs of 3.25 or above. Rasmussen was inducted into the Omaha Sports Hall of Fame in 2008. A member of the College World Series of Omaha, Inc., Executive Committee, Rasmussen played a vital role in seeing that Creighton and the city of Omaha remain as hosts of the College World Series. Rasmussen also was a member of the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Selection Committee. The Rasmussen Center serves as the primary practice facility for Creighton softball during the winter months.



Creighton Sports Complex



The Creighton Sports Complex, which includes the Kitty Gaughan Pavilion, is home to Bluejay softball. The sports complex opened in 1988 and was renovated in 2000, while the Kitty Gaughan Pavilion was completed and dedicated in 2001.

In the fall of 2022, the Kitty Gaughan Pavilion got a major face lift with a fresh coat of paint. In addition to the fresh paint, a brand new padded wall was added to the outfield fence. Additional padding was added to the surrounding fence as well as the dugouts, while portions of the outfields existing AstroTurf® was also replaced.

In 2011, work crews removed the old artificial turf from the softball field as the venue received numerous upgrades. The old turf, which was installed in 1999, was replaced with state-of-the-art, softball specific surface. AstroTurf® GameDay Grass™ 3D is the new surface at the Creighton Sports Complex and is designed to play more like real grass. The surface also comes with a drainage system.

In addition to the new playing field, padding was added to the outfield wall and the center field fence was raised for an improved batter's eye. The facility now features a new scoreboard as well, located beyond the right field fence. In 2006, the softball field added a section of chairback seats behind homeplate and an enclosed press box.

The Kitty Gaughan Pavilion provides several amenities not just for the baseball and softball programs, but for the entire athletic department. The Pavilion contains offices, locker rooms and indoor batting cages for both programs. It also contains a training room, an umpire locker room, a kitchenette, concession area, public restrooms, furnished lounge area with televisions, an indoor viewing area and viewing deck.

In 2000 Jackie Gaughan generously supported the construction of CU's baseball and softball indoor complex and he requested that the building be named in honor of his mother, Kitty. The Kitty Gaughan Pavilion was formally dedicated on Oct. 27, 2001.

The Krista Wood era in Creighton softball got off to a promising start during her first season at the helm of the program in 2023. Wood led the Bluejays to 22 victories, the second-most by a Bluejay softball head coach in their rookie coaching campaign in program history.

Named just the third head coach in Bluejay softball history on June 6, 2022, Wood led Creighton to a 22-31 record in her first season on the Hilltop.

Junior outfielder Cayla Nielsen earned unanimous First Team All-BIG EAST and NFCA All-Great Lakes Region First Team honors while leading the Bluejays with a .395 batting average. Fifth-year senior Kailey Wilson also became the 17th Bluejay in program history to earn all-conference honors at least three times in her career, claiming Second Team All-BIG EAST acclaim.

As a team, the Bluejays improved drastically in multiple offensive and defensive categories. CU ranked in the top-50 in the NCAA with 76 doubles, the second most in a single season in program history, while increasing its batting average by 13-percentage points. Defensively, the Bluejays dropped their ERA by over a half a run a game while striking out 51 more batters. Creighton also had success off the field as 13 Bluejays earned NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete recognition.

Wood enters her second season as head coach at Creighton with an impressive past, both on and off the field.

Wood spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at South Dakota State, where she led the Jackrabbits to a 238-164 record and earned Summit League Coach of the Year accolades in 2018, 2021 and 2022. SDSU swept the Summit League regular-season and tournament titles in both 2021 and 2022, picking up NCAA Tournament wins over Stanford (2021) and Villanova (2022) along the way.

South Dakota State finished the 2022 season with a 41-13 record, including an 18-2 league mark. The third seed in the Orlando Regional, Wood's club rallied with three runs in the seventh and another in the ninth inning to eliminate BIG EAST champion Villanova from the postseason. The Jacks produced a school-record 76 home runs and had a pair of pitchers named First Team All-Summit League. SDSU finished 12-0 at home, one of three teams nationally to finish unbeaten at home in 2022.

SDSU won the 2021 Summit League regular season and tournament titles and advanced to its first NCAA regional appearance at the Division I level in 2021, finishing 43-8. Wood's 2021 squad tied the program's single-season record for wins, including a victory over Stanford in its NCAA Tournament opener. Wood and her staff were one of 10 programs in the nation to be recognized by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association as a 2021 Division I Regional Coaching Staff of the Year.

Wood coached 14 NFCA All-Midwest Region selections and 34 All-Summit League selections in her time at SDSU. The Jackrabbits

A native of Missouri Valley, Iowa, Wood spent two seasons as an assistant coach at St. Cloud State University after a stellar career at Omaha from 2000-2003. She helped the Mavericks to the NCAA Division II national championship in 2001 as a sophomore and still holds Maverick career records in wins (106), appearances (147), games started (124), complete games (110) and innings pitched (858.1). She also owns or shares single-season school records in wins (32 in 2002), ERA (0.76 in 2001), saves (5 in 2003) and shutouts (15 in 2002) and was named to the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2020.

In the 2001 national championship game, Wood authored a two-hit shutout with five strikeouts in a 4-0 win over Lewis University. She also ranks second in career shutouts at UNO with 43, and earned numerous honors as a player at UNO, earning First Team All-NCC honors three times, while also collecting three All-NCC Academic Team awards. She earned NFCA All-Region First Team honors in 2002 and was a Second Team All-Region selection in 2001. Wood also earned North Central Conference Freshman of the Year in 2000.

Wood also brings coaching experience at the high school level, serving as the pitching coach at Omaha Gross High School in the fall of 2003 and at state-qualifying Omaha Westside High School in 2004.

Wood earned a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education K-12 with an endorsement in coaching while graduating magna cum laude from Omaha in 2004. She received a master's degree in sport management in 2006 from St. Cloud State.

Krista and her husband Alex have two sons, Braxton and Myles.

dominated the Summit League awards in 2021 and 2022, with 16 all-conference selections, as she mentored both the Player of the Year and Pitcher of the Year each season, as well as the 2021 Freshman of the Year and 2022 Defensive Player of the Year. Wood also coached the 2016 Freshman of the Year and 2018 Player of the Year while leading SDSU.

The Jackrabbits won 20 or more games six times under Wood and reached the Summit League Championships all seven seasons it was held during her tenure.

SDSU won 37 games in both 2018 and 2019 seasons, reaching the National Invitational Softball Championship following each campaign. Wood was named the Summit League's Coach of the Year in 2018 while guiding her team to a program-record .673 winning percentage, breaking the 35-win mark for the second time in history.

Throughout her tenure at SDSU, Wood's teams were at their best against BIG EAST competition. The Jackrabbits were 20-5 overall in those games, including a 17-1 mark in her final six seasons that concluded with a streak of 11 straight victories.

Wood owns a 530-349 career record, which also includes eight seasons at Wayne State College in Wayne, Neb., from 2007-14.

Wood put together a 270-154 mark at Division II Wayne State, turning the Wildcat program into a winner after inheriting a 10-win squad when she was hired before the 2007 season. She brought WSC to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments between 2009-11, including a 2010 NCAA Central Region crown. The Wildcats won a school-record 43 games during that season and claimed the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference tournament championship. She was inducted into Wayne State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2019.

Ryan Wieligman enters his second year as an assistant coach at Creighton. He works closely with the Bluejay hitters and is the program's recruiting coordinator. He also assists in scouting and data collecting of future opponents.

During his first season with the Bluejays, Wieligman helped junior outfielder Cayla Nielsen earn unanimous First Team All-BIG EAST and NFCA All-Great Lakes Region First Team honors. Wieligman played a key role in the offense improvement that saw Nielsen bump her batting average up 99 points (from .296 to .395) from her sophomore to junior season. Overall, Wieligman's efforts helped the Bluejays offense raise its batting average from .278 to .291, while recording the second-most doubles in a single-season in program history with 77.

Wieligman, a native of Stillwater, Okla., joined the Bluejay staff and heads to Omaha after spending the 2022 season as a volunteer assistant coach at Texas State under head coach Ricci Woodard. While with the Bobcats, Wieligman helped garner a 38-19 record that included a 17-game win streak and a runner-up finish at the Sun Belt Conference Championships. His work on the field assisted in the development of four All-Sun Belt Conference selections, including Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year Ciara Trahan.

"Thank you to Coach Wood and Athletic Director Marcus Blossom for the great opportunity to be a part of Creighton Athletics and Bluejay softball," said Wieligman. "Creighton holds a strong athletic and academic reputation that I am excited to join and help continue to grow. I am excited

and thankful to continue working in the program alongside Coach Wood."

Wieligman joined the Texas State coaching staff after spending the 2021 year as part of the UT Tyler softball staff that finished the season 33-7, including a 27-3 mark in the Lone Star Conference. Wieligman served as an assistant coach of the Patriots' staff and was a member of the 2021 Division II South Central Regional Coaching Staff of the Year following UT Tyler's success. UT Tyler rose to as high as No. 2 in the NFCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll and remained in the top-10 in every poll the Patriots were eligible for at the Division II level since the beginning of the 2020 season.

Prior to his stop at Tyler, Wieligman was a member of the 2019 Henderson State (Ark.) University baseball team. He earned his bachelor's degree in Sport Management in 2020 after transferring from Cowley County (Kan.) Community College, where he helped the Tigers to a NJCAA College World Series berth.

KJ (Kjirstyn) Murphy is in her first season as an assistant coach at Creighton after joining the Bluejay staff in June. She coaches the Bluejay defense, helps with scouting and camps, while also handling day-to-day operation duties such as team meals and travel.

"I am grateful that Coach Wood has allowed me the opportunity to coach alongside her and Coach Wieligman," said Murphy. "I couldn't be more excited to join Creighton Softball and the culture that Creighton University has created. This program has so much talent and I am ready to grow with all of them."

Murphy comes to Creighton after spending the 2023 season as a graduate assistant coach at The University of Texas at Arlington under the direction of head coach Kara Dill, after playing five seasons for the Mavericks. In her one season as a graduate assistant, Murphy served as the director of operations and was in charge of scheduling flights, hotels and buses for away games

while serving as the point of contact for future recruits and potential student-athletes.

"We are excited to add KJ to our Creighton family," Wood said. "Her knowledge and experience as a player will help her continue to develop our defense. She has great energy and will have a positive impact on the lives of our student-athletes."

A native of Baytown, Texas, Murphy capped off her illustrious five-year playing career at UTA as an NFCA All-Region and All-Sun Belt First Team honoree, while guiding the Mavericks to 117 wins. She finished her career ranked tied for ninth with 16 career home runs and just outside the top-10 with 27 career doubles.

Murphy posted the best offensive number of her career as a senior in 2021, recording a .405 batting average, the fifth-best single season mark in UTA softball program history, while pacing the Mavericks in hits (62), doubles (13), home runs (6), RBI (31) and walks (21).

In the classroom, Murphy became just the sixth UTA softball player to earned CSC Academic All-District First Team honors in program history while earning her bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice in 2021. Murphy also earned her master's degree in criminology and criminal justice from UTA in May of 2023.

Yori was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in 1992, along with sister and Bluejay basketball standout, Connie Yori.

Jody Schwartz

1988 First Team NFCA All-American



Schwartz led the Bluejays to the first of what would be three straight NCAA Regional appearances in 1988. That season Schwartz hit .340, with 10 doubles, four home runs and 36 RBI and recorded a .989 fielding percentage. She also posted a 10-5 record in the circle, with a 1.14 earned run average and 12 complete games in 17 starts. She finished her career as the school's career leader with 113 RBI (which still ranks seventh). She was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in 2012.

Jean Tierney

1981 First Team All-American
1982 Second Team Converse All-American
1983 First Team CSC Academic All-American



Tierney batted .298 with 15 RBI, nine stolen bases and only eight strikeouts in over 200 plate appearances in earning First Team All-America honors as a sophomore in 1981. Tierney, who finished her career as the Creighton career runs scored leader, helped Creighton to two AIAW Women's College World Series berths and the inaugural NCAA WCWS in Omaha in 1982. A two-sport athlete (basketball), Tierney became the first female student-athlete in school history to be inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in 1990.

Kelly Brookhart

1991 Second Team NFCA All-American



Brookhart led the team in six batting and nine pitching categories in earning Second Team All-America honors in 1991. Brookhart was the winning pitcher in Creighton's historic 1-0, 31-inning victory over Utah on May 11. The longest game in NCAA history, Brookhart pitched all 31 innings to pick up the win, and set a school record with 263.1 innings pitched that season. A 2003 inductee into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame, Brookhart still holds the career record for games played and is second in innings pitched.

Angie Rajtora

1984 Second Team All-American



Rajtora is one of the most versatile players in school history, starting at first base as a freshman, shortstop as a sophomore and catcher her final two seasons, including her All America campaign as a senior in 1984. She led the team in average (.336), runs (19), at bats (128), hits (43), triples (4), walks (12) and RBI (16), while logging a

.996 fielding percentage behind the plate as a senior.

Christy Lunceford

1997 First Team CSC Academic All-American



Lunceford set the Bluejay single-season record with 76 hits in 1997. She remains the Bluejays' all-time leader in hits (245), while ranking second in batting average (.379) and seventh in RBIs (110). A three-time First Team All-MVC outfielder, she still owns the CU record and concluded her career as the Valley's all-time leader with 51 doubles. A two-time First Team All-Midwest Region honoree, she is one of only two players in Creighton history to hit better than .400 in two seasons, including a career-best .419 in 1996.

Heidi Geier

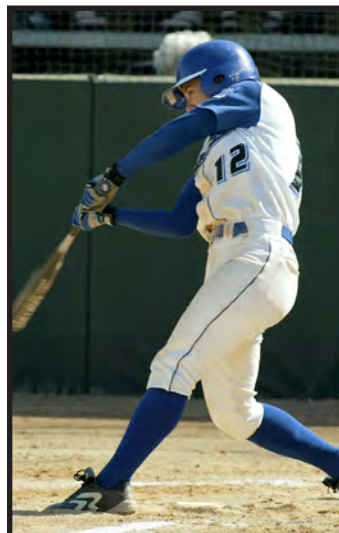

Creighton's all-time stolen base leader with 83 steals, Geier finished her career with a .358 batting average and ended her career ranked second on the career charts with 243 hits and 129 runs scored. A three-time First Team All-MVC pick, Geier is one of seven Bluejay players with 200 career hits and 100 runs. Geier hit .403 in 1999 and she was the first player in school history with two 70-hit seasons. She is the only Bluejay with two seasons of at least 24 stolen bases. She was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in 2006.

Stacey Rybar

2004 Third Team Easton All-American



Rybar earned Easton All-America Third Team honors in leading the highest-scoring offense and most successful postseason run in school history. Along with a then school-record 13 home runs, she led the team in batting (.374), runs (49), doubles (14) and triples (4). She was named the MVC Player of the Year and First Team All-MVC for the third straight season. She concluded her career as the MVC and school leader with 37 home runs, and owned school records with 121 RBI and 132 runs scored, starting all 221 games in her career.

Tammy Nielsen

2004 Second Team Easton All-American
2005 Third Team Easton All-American



Nielsen ended her three-year Bluejay career as one of the greatest pitchers in school and conference history. The right-hander earned Easton All-America honors in her final two seasons at Creighton. In just three seasons with the Jays, the rise-ball specialist set a school and MVC record with 914 strikeouts, becoming the only pitcher in league with two 300-strikeout seasons. She concluded her career ranked 25th in NCAA Division I history with 8.9 strikeouts per seven innings pitched. Her 76 career victories also set a school record, as she was the first player in Bluejay history to record three 20-win seasons. She also set school single-season records for wins, starts, complete games and strikeouts.

Her 2004 season was possibly the best in school and league history, as she hurled five no-hitters, ranked fifth in the NCAA with a 0.67 ERA and was in the NCAA top-20 with 28 wins and 9.0 K's per seven innings. She was named the 2004 MVC Pitcher of the Year and set single-season school marks with 28 wins and 334 strikeouts. The three-time MVC First Team pitcher was named MVC Pitcher of the Week seven times in her career. She earned NFCA All-Midwest Region Second Team honors three times and was tabbed to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team twice. The only three-time MVC Tournament MVP, she recorded every out for Creighton in the tournament from 2003-05, going 10-0 with a 0.39 ERA and 82 strikeouts in 72 innings at the tournament. She was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in 2015.

Melanie Dorsey

2005 First Team Easton All-American



Dorsey was named a First Team Easton All-American after leading the MVC with 68 singles, 24 stolen bases and a .402 batting average. She became the first Bluejay since 1999 to hit .400 in a season and was the second player in school history to notch two 70-hit seasons. She was named First Team All-MVC and to the MVC All-Tournament Team for her standout season. She finished her career with 54 stolen bases and a .328 average, ranking in the Creighton top five. Of her 198 career hits, 140 came in her final two seasons.

Christine Fukumoto

2005 First Team CSC Academic All-American



Fukumoto was named CSC First Team Academic All-American in her final year with the Bluejays. The catcher hit .348 to end her career fifth in school history with a .326 career average. She went a perfect 9-for-9 in stolen base opportunities and led the league with 17 sacrifice hits. She was named Second Team All-MVC and was tabbed to the MVC All-Tournament Team as she was the only Bluejay to collect a hit in every game at the tournament. Her 57 hits and 12 doubles ranked second on the team.

Bluejay All-Americans

Lauren Cisneros

2006 Third Team Easton All-American



Cisneros was honored on the Easton All-American Third Team after concluding a stellar career with her best season. She started all 219 games of her career (208 at second base), including 50 as a senior when she led the team with a .365 average, 31 runs, 50 hits, 13 home runs and 36 RBI. A two-time First Team All-MVC performer, she tied the school single-season (13) and career (37) home run records and became the first player in school history to hit at least 10 home runs in a season three times. She ended her career ranked fifth in RBI (107) and sixth in runs (113).

Jamie Reiss

2007 Third Team CSC Academic All-American



Reiss concluded her career as a four-year starter at third base with her best season, leading the team with a .364 average, 67 hits, 35 runs and four triples. She was named to the MVC All-Tournament Team, First Team All-MVC, First Team MVC Scholar-Athlete, First Team Academic All-District and a Third Team Academic All-American with a 3.82 grade point average. She was one of 10 national finalists for the Senior CLASS Award. The Omaha native set a school record and led the NCAA with 28 sacrifice bunts during her junior season in 2006.

Renae Sinkler

2010 Third Team NFCA All-American



Sinkler enjoyed the greatest offensive season in school history as a senior, garnering her second straight MVC Player of the Year honor and earning NFCA Third Team All-America recognition. She set single-season school records for runs (59), RBI (58), total bases (147), slugging percentage (.880), on-base percentage (.514) and hit an MVC-record 24 home runs. The first baseman ranked fourth in the NCAA in home runs per game, fifth in total home runs and sixth in slugging percentage. Her 50 career home runs rank second all-time at Creighton as do her career counts of 146 RBIs and 391 total bases. She was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame during the Fall of 2022.

Tara Oltman

Oltman was the first student-athlete in school history to earn First Team All-MVC honors all four years of her career, and the only Bluejay softball player to be named an All-American after three seasons of her career. Oltman and assistant coach Nicole Newman are the only three-time MVC Pitcher of the Year in league history.

In 2010 she was on the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Watch List, was named a Second Team CSC Academic All-American for the third consecutive season and earned all-region honors for the fourth straight season. In 2009, she earned CU's first NFCA All-America honor since 1991 and was named to the Easton

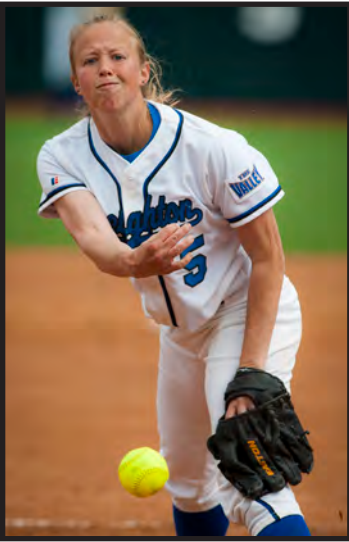
All-America Second Team for the third time.

As a sophomore, her seven saves ranked second in the NCAA and she ranked 11th in the nation with a 0.96 ERA. In 2009 she finished the season ranked fourth in the NCAA with a 0.88 ERA, 10th in wins (29), 11th in shutouts (12) and 22nd in strikeouts (283), while becoming the winningest pitcher in school and MVC history. Highlights in her junior season included a shutout win at No. 13 Arizona and a no-hitter against 24th-ranked Southern Illinois.

In her senior season, Oltman eclipsed her own school and league record with 32 wins, which ranked 10th in the NCAA, while her 12 shutouts also ranked 10th in the nation. A 13-time MVC Pitcher of the Week during her four years, she concluded her career with school and league records in wins (118), strikeouts (1,086), innings (1,064), appearances (187), starts (143) and complete games (128), while her 44 shutouts set a school record. The 2010 MVC Tournament MVP finished her career ranked in the NCAA career top-30 in appearances (T-13th), wins (T-18th), complete games (T-20th), innings (25th) and saves (T-26th). She was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame during the spring of 2017 and the Missouri Valley Conference Hall of Fame in 2021.

Becca Changstrom

2013 Third Team CSC Academic All-American



Changstrom finished her impressive career in the BIG EAST after three seasons in the Missouri Valley Conference. She earned a spot on the CSC Academic All-America Division I Softball Third Team just days after claiming 2013 Missouri Valley Conference Pitcher of the Year honors. She earned selection to National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-Region Second Teams in her final two seasons. She won the pitching triple crown in Valley play in 2013 with 13 wins, 133 strikeouts and a 1.34 ERA. She ranks third all-time with 860 career K's.

Sam Crowley

2018 First Team CSC Academic All-American



Crowley became Creighton softball's first Academic All-American First Team selection since Christine Fukumoto in 2005, and fifth overall. She also claimed a spot on the NFCA All-Great Lakes Region Third Team and the All-BIG EAST First Team after pacing the Bluejays with a .633 slugging percentage and ranking third in the BIG EAST with a .400 batting average. The outfielder owned 17 sacrifice hits to lead Division I with 0.41 sacrifice hits per game. She also scored 29 times, drove in 33 runs and hit a Bluejay-best seven home runs while helping Creighton finish the 2018 season with a 28-15 record, including a 12-3 mark during BIG EAST play for a second place finish before taking runner-up at the BIG EAST Championship in Rosemont, Illinois.

Mary Higgins

2021 NFCA Hall of Fame Inductee



1982-87, and was one of the first members of the NFCA, which was known then as the National Softball Coaches Association.

Higgins, the first Division I chair of the NCAA Softball Committee, started women's athletics while still a student at Creighton in 1973, and later served as both softball coach and women's athletic director, before moving to the academic side of the school during a 39-year career. She was the first woman inducted into the Creighton Athletic Hall of Fame in 1987, having coached the softball team to a 564-298 record and two Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) World Series and two NCAA Women's College World Series over 17 years at the helm. Higgins was also the tournament director for the NCAA Women's College World Series from

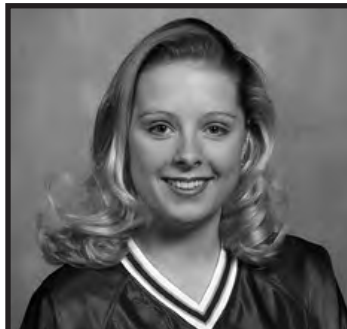

Series History

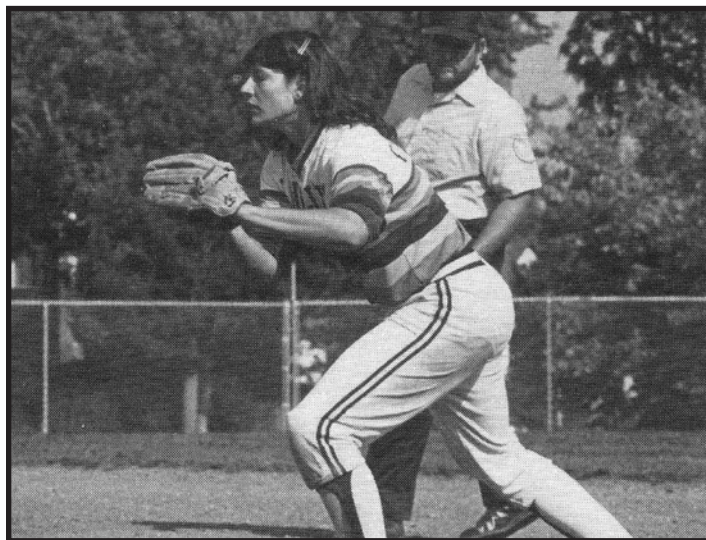

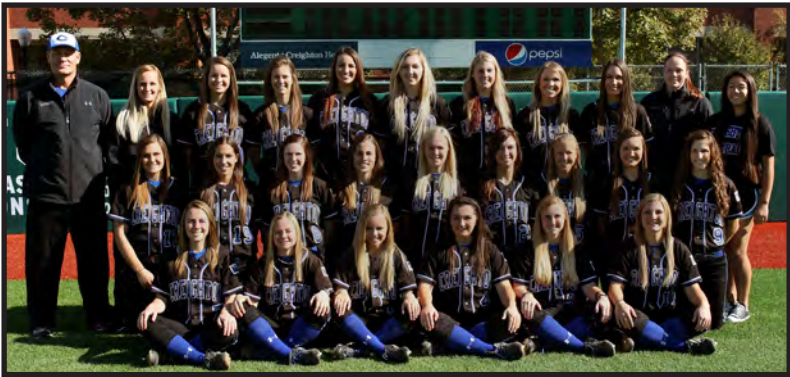

McCormick Endowed Athletic Director Marcus Blossom

Marcus Blossom is in his third year as McCormick Endowed Athletic Director at Creighton.

Creighton has enjoyed historic levels of success in Blossom's first two years on the job, as Bluejay teams have made 11 postseason appearances.

Creighton men's soccer featured MAC Hermann Trophy Award winner Duncan McGuire and advanced to the College Cup (2022). Creighton's men's basketball (2023) and women's basketball (2022) teams both reached the Elite Eight. Creighton's Volleyball team won its eighth and ninth consecutive regular-season BIG EAST titles, earning a national seed and hosting NCAA Tournament action in both seasons.

The accomplishments didn't end there. Women's golfer Katherine Lemke became CU's first BIG EAST individual champion and postseason qualifier (2022 and 2023), and Tommy Ward represented the Creighton Men's Track program in the NCAA Regionals (2023).

On the coaching side rowing's Dan Chipps (2022) and women's golf's Debbie Conry (2022), in addition to men's and women's tennis' Tom Lilly (2023) all were named Conference Coach of the Year for the first time after more than 20 years on the job.

The work performed by Bluejay student-athletes in the classroom also featured excellence across the board. The men's cross country program owned the nation's best GPA in 2021-22. CU had four programs recognized by the BIG EAST with 2021-22 Team Academic Excellence Awards, then three more teams earned the accolade in 2022-23. CU student-athletes owned a 3.48 GPA in the spring of 2023.

As athletic director at Holy Cross, Blossom led the development of the athletics department's first strategic plan, with a focus on creating a high-performance culture, achieving and sustaining competitive excellence, and increasing ticket sales, external support and community engagement, while also enhancing facilities.

Under his leadership, academic success within the Holy Cross athletics program was among the very best in the nation, ranking first for graduation success rate, with the school receiving more than a dozen Division I Academic Progress Rate public recognition awards from the NCAA. Several teams at Holy Cross posted multiyear APR scores in the top 10% of all squads in their respective sports.

Prior to his time at Holy Cross, Blossom spent five years at Boston College as senior associate athletics director for business and administration. While there, he was a member of the executive team and assisted with all aspects of strategic planning and vision execution for the department of athletics.

Blossom has a deep background with Jesuit higher education, and he is no stranger to the BIG EAST, having spent two years with Providence College as associate athletic director for business operations. Earlier in his career, he also served as assistant director of championships for the NCAA, managing the complex process of championship host-city selection, among other duties.

Blossom, who is from Chicago and has strong Midwestern ties, earned his Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration with a concentration in finance at Northeastern University, a Master's Degree in Sport Management from West Virginia University and an MBA from the University of Rhode Island. While earning his undergraduate degree at Northeastern University, Blossom was a three-time GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-District and three-time all-conference selection in men's basketball.

Blossom and his wife, Karli, have two daughters, Maya and Mora.



President Rev. Daniel S. Hendrickson, S.J., Ph.D.

The Rev. Daniel S. Hendrickson, SJ, PhD, is the 25th president of Creighton University. A former student, faculty member, and trustee of Creighton, Fr. Hendrickson is guided by a deep passion for the Creighton mission to form leaders that will go on to build a more just world.

Fr. Hendrickson first encountered Creighton as a student in the Jesuit Humanities Program in the 1996 before returning to teach at the University from 2000 to 2003. He was elected to the Creighton Board of Trustees in 2013, elected president of Creighton in December 2014, and began his tenure July 1, 2015.

Prior to serving as Creighton University president, he held positions at Jordan University College in Morogoro, Tanzania; Fordham University in New York; and Marquette University in 2012.

During his presidency, the University has grown its enrollment, welcoming record-breaking classes of more than 1,000 first-year students each year. Additionally, an increase in student support efforts has helped Creighton achieve a 99% outcome rate for graduates.

The University also has achieved greater national recognition in academics, athletics, and scholarship, including a 31 percent increase in endowed chair positions with 12 being created since 2015. In 2021, Creighton became home to the only Catholic medical school campus west of Omaha, with a Phoenix location ultimately educating approximately 1,000 health sciences students.

Additionally, with Fr. Hendrickson's leadership, Creighton launched its most ambitious fundraising campaign, Forward Blue, in 2021 in support of scholarships, campus improvements, and mission-driven services and programs. As of 2023, the campaign has raised more than \$600 million, including nearly \$200 million in scholarship dollars.

Outside of Creighton, Fr. Hendrickson serves on the boards of Boston College and Xavier University as well as serving as the current chair of the BIG EAST Conference Board of Directors. He is also a trustee of ILAC/Centro de Educación para la Salud Integral (CESI) in the Dominican Republic; and Jesuit Worldwide Learning (JWL).

Growing up in Fremont, Nebraska, Fr. Hendrickson graduated from Mount Michael Benedictine High School in Elkhorn. His identical twin, the Rev. D. Scott Hendrickson, S.J., D.Phil., is an associate professor of modern languages at Loyola University Chicago, while his older brother, Ryan C. Hendrickson, Ph.D., is dean of the Graduate School and vice provost for sponsored research at Eastern Illinois University.

Fr. Hendrickson holds a BA from Marquette University; an MA in philosophical resources from Fordham University; a Master of Divinity degree from the Jesuit School of Theology at Santa Clara University; and MA and PhD degrees from Columbia University.

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Academic and Athletic Success

- Creighton's student-athletes combined for a 3.48 GPA last spring. The student-athletes also own a 3.49 cumulative GPA.
- Fifty Creighton student-athletes have earned a combined 62 College Sports Communicators Academic All-American honors all-time. Volleyball's Kendra Wait, Women's Golf's Katherine Lemke and Men's Cross Country/Track's Boston Small were each honored during the 2022-23 school year.
- Creighton had 196 student-athletes make the Dean's List at least one time last year, including 117 student-athletes who earned the honor both semesters.
- Fifty-seven student-athletes (20 percent) earned perfect 4.0 GPAs during the spring 2023 semester, including Saren Croker, Jena Lawrence, Kate Mason, Cayla Nielsen and Kailey Wilson from the softball program.
- Thirteen teams had team GPAs of 3.30 or better last spring and six (women's basketball, men's cross country, women's cross country, women's golf, women's soccer and women's tennis) had GPA's of 3.50 or better last spring.
- Three Creighton teams were recognized with 2022-23 Team Academic Excellence Awards for compiling the highest collective grade-point averages in each BIG EAST sport.
- Saren Croker, Cayla Nielsen and Madeline Vejvoda each earned a spot on the College Sports Communicators Academic All-District Team.
- Creighton had 13 Bluejays honored as Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athletes by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, including Elly Beeson, Izzy Berning, Saren Croker, Ella Dalton, Alyssa Gappa, Jena Lawrence, Kate Mason, Jordyn Meyer, Cayla Nielsen, Emma Rosonke, Sydra Seville, Madeline Vejvoda and Kailey Wilson.

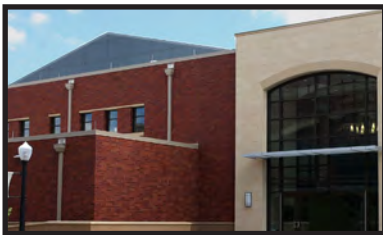

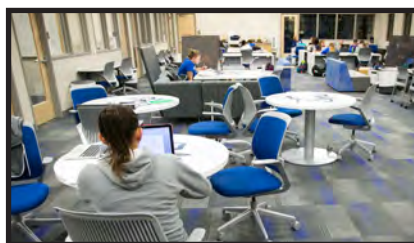

Athletic Performance

Creighton University student-athletes benefit from year-round strength and conditioning training programs in The Championship Center. The 6,000 square foot state-of-the-art Athletic Performance Center is equipped with 12 Power Lift half-racks that each have inlaid lifting platforms and the EliteForm system. Additionally, the Athletic Performance Center features Uesaka Collegiate Series Bumper Plates, Plae Flooring, Iron Grip dumbbells, and a nutrition and hydration station to provide Creighton student-athletes with the optimal training and recovery environment.

The athletic performance program at Creighton University is designed to increase performance and the overall athlete health and ability. The program combines Olympic lifts, strength training exercises, plyometrics, speed and agility development, flexibility, and cardiovascular regimes. The programs are specifically tailored to each athlete, the sport they participate in and to their individual experience and ability. The goal of the program is to reduce the chance of injury and to help all athletes reach their full potential.

To help maximize athletic performance, each Creighton student-athlete works with the strength and conditioning staff, the sports medicine staff, a certified nutritionist and a sports psychologist, giving Creighton student-athletes all the resources they need to succeed at the highest level.

Athletic Training

The Creighton University Athletic Training staff works in cooperation with and under the supervision of team physicians to provide the best possible care for student-athletes. It has a staff of six full-time athletic trainers, and two part-time athletic trainers. Athletic training students also gain clinical experience as they help serve the sports medicine needs of Creighton student-athletes.

The mission of Creighton University athletic training is to serve as the initial allied healthcare provider for Creighton University student-athletes and to provide access to other healthcare professionals as needed. Services include prevention, assessment, management and rehabilitation of athletic-related injuries and illnesses.

Creighton athletic training is committed to the highest standards of care consistent with the National Athletic Trainers Association Code of Professional Practice and the credentialing statutes of the state of Nebraska.

The BIG EAST

Creighton University officially became a member of the BIG EAST Conference at 12:01 a.m. on July 1, 2013. The 2023-24 season will be Creighton's 11th in the league.

Creighton, along with fellow newcomers Butler and Xavier, joined a BIG EAST that retained DePaul, Georgetown, Marquette, Seton Hall, Providence, Villanova and St. John's. The partnership was announced on March 20, 2013, in New York. The University of Connecticut rejoined the league in the summer of 2020.

The 2023-24 academic year will be the 45th in the history of the BIG EAST, a league synonymous with men's basketball that has evolved into a well-rounded league that competes nationally at the highest level in sports across the board. BIG EAST basketball squads have captured 15 titles in the last 24 years, including a UConn title in men's basketball in 2022-23 and a Villanova title in men's basketball in 2017-18.

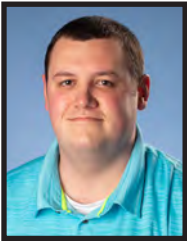
Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 43 national championships in eight different sports and 145 student-athletes have won individual national titles through 2022-23. Since the league's 2013 alignment, the BIG EAST has produced 11 individual national champions.

All 11 universities reside within a top-70 media market, including nine schools in a top-36 market.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from the original seven-school alliance.
