2023-24: Senior at Creighton

- Received BIG EAST's Sportsmanship Award, Creighton's first honoree since Mitch Ballock in 2021.
- In league play only, ranked second in assist/turnover ratio, eighth in three-pointers per game, eighth in assists per game and 28th in scoring.
- Creighton was 17-5 when he scored in double-figures and 16-3 when he had one turnover or less.
- Scored 10 or more points in 11 straight games from Jan. 13 - Feb. 20 after averaging 8.1 points in CU's first 16 games.
- Made a three-pointer in each of his final 18 games (Jan. 13-Present).
- Posted back-to-back 20+ point outings on Feb. 2 and Feb. 7.
- One of 20 players named to the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Preseason Watch List.
- No. 76 on CBS Sports Preseason Top 100 And 1 player list.
- Made 5-of-7 three-pointers against Florida A&M (Nov. 7).
- Connected on 4-of-5 shots and scored 10 points in win vs. Loyola Chicago (Nov. 22).
- Made his first five shots and finished with 17 points and five rebounds in win at Oklahoma State (Nov. 30).
- Scored 13 points in win at Nebraska (Dec. 3).
- Had 12 points in win vs. No. 23 Providence, including game-clinching three-pointer with 54.2 seconds left to put CU up 67-58 (Jan. 6).

- Owned 11 points and had four rebounds without a turnover in win vs. St. John's (Jan. 13).
- Led CU with 14 points at No. 1 Connecticut (Jan. 17).
- Had 11 points and eight assists with no turnovers in career-high 49 minutes in road win at Seton Hall (Jan. 20), including game-tying basket with three seconds left in regulation of eventual triple-overtime win.
- Scored season-high 26 points vs. Butler (Feb. 2), making 9-of-15 shots.
- Made 6-of-7 three-pointers and scored 20 points in overtime game at Providence (Feb. 7), as he passed 250 career three-pointers in the process.
- Had 12 points and season-high nine assists in win at Xavier (Feb. 10).
- Recorded 12 points, eight assists and five rebounds at Butler (Feb. 17).
- Scored 20 points and added a season-high seven rebounds in win vs. No. 1 Connecticut (Feb. 20).
- Dished eight assists in road win at Villanova (March 1).
- Had 16 points, six assists and five rebounds vs. Providence in BIG EAST Tourney debut (March 14).
- Scored team-high 21 points in double-overtime win vs. Oregon to seal Sweet 16 bid (March 23).

Summer 2023: Bahamas Tour

- Averaged 8.0 points and 5.0 assists while starting all three games.
- Owned eight points and dished seven assists vs. Raw Talent Elite.

2022-23: Junior at Utah State

- Named First Team All-Mountain West Conference and was on the Mountain West's All-Tournament Team.
- Tabbed the USBWA District VII Player of the Year as well as All-District VII.
- Named NABC Second-Team All-District 17.
- Averaged 16.2 points, 4.5 assists, 3.3 rebounds and 1.2 steals while shooting 45.8 percent (167-of-365) from the field, making 43.4 percent (111-of-256) from deep as well as 87.8 percent (122-of-139) at the line.
- Finished sixth in the country in three-point percentage (.434), ninth with 111 trifectas made, 15th in three-pointers made per game (3.17), 26th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.68) and 29th in free throw percentage (.878).
- Led the Mountain West Conference in three-pointers made per game, free throw percentage and three-point percentage.
- Per Synergy, ranked in the 99th percentile in points per possession on shots after dribbling (1.33) and in the 99th percentile in points per possession on spot up opportunities (1.35).
- Appeared in 35 games, which is tied for third on the USU single-season list, while his 567 points rank 24th-most in team history.
- Scored a career-best 30 points against Oral Roberts (Nov. 22), making 8-of-9 shots from behind the arc.
- Knocked down a jumper from the right wing with four seconds remaining in overtime to lift Utah State to a thrilling 91-89 victory over San Diego on Nov. 17.
- Ashworth made eight three-pointers against both Oral Roberts (Nov. 22) and Colorado State (Feb. 4) to tie for the third-most treys in a game in school history.
- Ranked eighth in the Mountain West with 16.2 points per game.
- Scored in double figures 30 times, with seven 20+ point outings.
- Had a 14-game stretch scoring in double figures from Nov. 11 - Jan. 3.
- Led the Aggies with 158 assists to rank ninth on the single-season record list, including two games with a career-high nine helpers.
- Finished fifth in the MW with 4.5 assists per game.
- Ranked sixth on the USU single-season record in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.68), which was the second-best in the MW.
- Set a Utah State single-season record for three-pointers attempted (256) and was second on the single-season record list in 3-pointers made (111).
- Ranked second on the single-game record list with 17 trifectas attempted at Colorado State (Feb. 4), while tying for third with eight made three-pointers in the same game.
- Was 11th in the Mountain West Conference in steals per game (1.2).
- Ended the campaign in 10th place on the USU single-season record list with 1,163 minutes played.
- Named the MW Player of the Week on March 5 after leading the Aggies to close out the regular season on a five-game winning streak, averaging 23.0 points, 7.5 assists, 3.5 steals and 3.0 rebounds per game.
- Ashworth knocked down seven three-pointers vs. Utah Tech (Dec. 1).
- Made five or more three-point field goals eight times.



2021-22: Sophomore at Utah State

- Appeared in all but one of Utah State's 34 games during the year, starting in 15 contests.
- Scored in double figures in 14 games and was one of only two Aggies to score 20 or more points in multiple games.
- Scored a then-career-high 27 points against Weber State on Dec. 15, knocking down seven three-pointers.
- Totaled 287 points on the year, averaging 8.7 points per game.
- Shot 40.4 percent (88-of-218) from the floor, 39.2 percent (62-of-158) from behind the 3-point line and 86.0 percent (49-of-57) at the free throw line.
- Made five or more three-point field goals in four different games.
- Finished second on the team with 119 assists, averaging 3.6 per game to rank fourth in the Mountain West.
- Recorded five or more assists in eight games during the year.
- Finished third on the team with 27 steals.
- Named Academic All-Mountain West.

2020-21: Freshman at Utah State

- Appeared in all 29 games for the Aggies, starting in both games at Boise State (Feb. 17 and Feb. 19).
- Scored in double figures in eight games, turning in a season-high 17 points against San Diego State (Jan. 16).
- Totaled 177 points during the season, averaging 6.1 points per game.
- Shot 35.7 percent (51-of-143) overall and 36.5 percent (31-of-85) from behind the arc, as well as 89.8 percent (44-of-49) at the free throw line.
- Finished fourth on the team with 76 assists, logging a season-high seven dimes against the College of Idaho (Dec. 8).
- Totaled 55 rebounds, pulling down a season-high five boards against Colorado State (Jan. 19).
- Earned Academic All-Mountain West and MW Scholar-Athlete honors.
- Made his Aggie debut in the 2020-21 season opener against VCU at the Bad Boy Mowers Crossover Classic in Sioux Falls, S.D., playing 20 minutes, scoring five points and adding four rebounds.
- Prior to enrolling at Utah State, he served as a missionary for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Indianapolis, Ind.

Lone Peak High School

- Ashworth led Lone Peak High School to the Utah 6A state title during his senior year, averaging 16.4 points, 7.4 assists, 4.1 rebounds and 3.1 steals per game.
- Ashworth scored 29 points after halftime during the 2018 GEICO High School Championships, in an 87-82 loss against a Montverde team led by RJ Barrett. Ashworth added 10 assists to record a double-double.
- During his final campaign at Lone Peak he was named to the GEICO National All-Tournament Team, the Utah Valley Boys Basketball Player of the Year, Utah 6A MVP and First Team All-State.
- Finished second in the state in assists per game.
- Led Lone Peak to a runner-up finish at state as a junior after averaging 13.9 points, 6.9 assists, 5.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game.

- Third player ever to be named a three-time BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year (2022, 2023, 2024), joining Patrick Ewing (4x) and Alonzo Mourning (3x).
- A two-time finalist for Naismith Defensive Player of the Year in 2023 and 2024.
- Second Team All-BIG EAST selection.
- Named an Honorable Mention All-American by *Associated Press* and *247Sports*.
- Finished second nationally in blocks per game and seventh in the country in field goal percentage.
- Top 10 in the BIG EAST in scoring, overall rebounding, offensive rebounding, defensive rebounding, field goal percentage, blocked shots, double-doubles & minutes per game.
- Extended streak of never fouling out in his career (134 games) and never had four fouls in any game in 2023-24.

- Scored 11 points in team's 16-0 run to open second half vs. North Dakota State (Nov. 11).
- Swatted 200th career shot in opener vs. Florida A&M (Nov. 7).
- Scored 29 points vs. Loyola Chicago on Nov. 22, making 4-of-8 trifectas.
- Had 16 points and 12 rebounds in win at Oklahoma State (Nov. 30).

- Had 13 points, 12 rebounds and three blocks in win at Nebraska (Dec. 3).
- Made 7-of-7 shots and had 15 points in 17 minutes vs. Central Michigan (Dec. 9).
- Had 22 points, eight rebounds and five blocks at UNLV (Dec. 13).
- Helped top No. 23 Providence with 22 points and 12 rebounds (Jan. 6).
- Dominated in triple-overtime win at Seton Hall (Jan. 20), finishing with 28 points, nine rebounds and seven blocks in career-high 54 minutes. Also surpassed 200 career dunks and 250 career blocks in that game.
- Grabbed eight or more rebounds in nine straight games (Jan. 6-Feb. 2), matching CU's longest streak in 20 years.
- Had 22 points and 10 rebounds in win vs. DePaul (Jan. 27).
- Kalkbrenner dished a career-high seven assists at Providence (Feb. 7), leading CU for first time in that category.
- Scored 28 points on 12-of-14 shooting in win at Xavier (Feb. 10), adding seven rebounds and four blocked shots.

- Recorded 15 points, five rebounds and four blocks in win vs. No. 1 Connecticut (Feb. 20).
- Owned 12 points, 10 rebounds and career-high eight blocks at St. John's (Feb. 25).
- Made 10-of-10 shots and moved into Top 10 on Creighton's career scoring list in win vs. Seton Hall (Feb. 28), finishing with 23 points.
- Fourth player in BIG EAST Tournament history with 19+ points, 12+ rebounds and five blocks in a game when he did it vs. Providence (March 14).
- Led CU with 23 points and added eight rebounds and three blocks in NCAA Tournament opener vs. Akron (March 21).
- Had 19 points, 14 rebounds, five blocks and two steals in NCAA Tournament win vs. Oregon (March 23).
- His 75 dunks in 2023-24 were the most by any Creighton player in one season under Greg McDermott.
- Preseason All-BIG EAST First Team, the only Creighton player to ever earn that honor twice.
- Ranks fifth in NCAA history in career field goal percentage among those to make a minimum of 500 field goals.
- Owns the CHI Health Center Omaha career records for field goal percentage (.721), offensive rebounds (157) and blocked shots (133).
- Has played in more NCAA Tourney games (11) and wins (8) than any player in program history and one of two men (along with Kyle Korver) to play in four NCAA Tournaments.
- Led BIG EAST and ranked 18th in the country with 2.12 blocks per game.
- Blocked a shot in 25 straight games from Nov. 14 to March 1 and scored 10 or more points in each of the final 21 contests.
- Surpassed 1,000 career points on Feb. 25 at Villanova in his 91st career game.
- Set the single-season CHI Health Center Omaha record for field goal percentage (.742).
- Preseason First Team All-BIG EAST selection and one of 50 candidates on the Preseason Watch Lists for the Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy.
- Shot 66.1 percent from the field (84-127) in 14 games against top-25 opponents, averaging 15.2 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.3 blocks per game.
- Made 8-of-9 shots and scored 19 points vs. Butler (Dec. 22) in first game back after missing previous three games with an illness.
- Made 22 straight field goal attempts from Nov. 10-17.
- Made 10-of-11 shots and scored 24 points vs. North Dakota, adding seven rebounds (Nov. 10).
- Followed that with 10-for-10 shooting, including five dunks and scored 22 points vs. Holy Cross (Nov. 14).
- Had 21 points, seven rebounds and two blocks while throwing down go-ahead dunk with 1:02 left in win vs. No. 9 Arkansas (Nov. 22).
- Made 9-of-10 shots and finished with 20 points and 13 rebounds at No. 2 Texas (Dec. 1).
- Owned 17 points, eight rebounds and tied season-high with six blocks vs. Seton Hall (Jan. 3).
- Had 21 points, seven rebounds and four blocks in win vs. No. 19 Providence (Jan. 14).
- Registered 17 points, eight rebounds and five blocks in win vs. No. 13 Xavier (Jan. 28).
- Scored 21 points in BIG EAST Tournament win vs. Villanova (March 9).
- Was a perfect 7-for-7 from the field, finishing with 18 points and three steals vs. No. 15 Xavier in BIG EAST Tournament semifinals (March 10).
- Scored career-high 31 points in NCAA Tourney opener vs. NC State (March 17), making 11-of-14 shots and 8-of-9 free throws while also rejecting three shots. The 31 points were the most in CU history in an NCAA Tournament game, breaking a mark held by Doug McDermott.
- Scored 22 points on 9-of-12 shooting in Sweet 16 win vs. Princeton (March 24).
- Had 63 dunks in 2022-23.

Summer 2023: Bahamas Tour

- Averaged 11.0 points, 5.7 rebounds and 3.3 blocks in 18.0 minutes per game.
- Had 10 points, 10 rebounds and five blocks vs. BC Kaunas Zalgiris.

2022-23: Junior at Creighton

- Led Creighton with 15.9 points per game and 2.1 blocks per game while starting all 34 appearances.
- Named First Team All-District by the USBWA and NABC and also was recognized as *Field of 68's* National Defensive Player of the Year.
- The First Team All-BIG EAST performer was one of five finalists for Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award (National Center of the Year), one of four finalists for Naismith Defensive Player of the Year, and also was one of 25 finalists for Lefty Driesell Award as Defensive Player of the Year.
- Ranked third nationally in field goal percentage with the 23rd-best single-season mark in NCAA history.

2021-22: Sophomore at Creighton

- Averaged 13.1 points, 7.7 rebounds and 2.6 blocked shots per game while starting the team's first 34 contests.
- Honorable Mention All-BIG EAST choice, BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and named to All-BIG EAST Tournament Team.
- Led the BIG EAST in field goal percentage and offensive rebounds per game, second in blocked shots per game and sixth in rebounds per game.
- On a national basis, ranked fourth in both field goal percentage and offensive rebounds per game, 12th in total blocks, 17th in blocked shots per game and 71st in total rebounds.
- His 134 offensive rebounds were the most by a Bluejay in more than 35 years.
- Also ranked among national leaders with CU-best 69 dunks, including six slams at Georgetown (Feb. 12).
- Established CHI Health Center Omaha records for blocked shots (38) and offensive rebounds (58) in a season.
- Had a blocked shot in 26 straight games (Nov. 16, 2021-Feb. 26, 2022), CU's longest streak since Benoit Benjamin did it in 28 games in a row in 1984-85.
- Notched 100th career block against Butler (Feb. 8) in his 53rd career game, becoming the third-fastest at CU to that milestone.
- Reached double-figures in points in seven straight games from Nov. 11-30 and his final 12 contests (Feb. 12-March 17).
