Scouting Creighton (2-2-0)

The Bluejays are off to a 2-2-0 start this season with wins over Iowa State (2-1, Aug. 18) and Western Michigan (3-0, Aug. 29), but are looking to rebound from a loss at in-state rival Nebraska earlier this week.

Senior **Azumi Manriki** leads the team with six points on a trio of goals, while fellow classmate **Ariana Mondiri** follows closely behind with a pair of goals.

Sophomore **Tilly Thomas** has added a goal of her own, while senior **Marissa LeVine** and junior **Kelis Brown** each netted their first career goals this past week.

Junior **Alyssa Zalac** has spent all 360 minutes in net for the Bluejays this season, recording 15 saves but allowing eight total goals. Last week Zalac earned a spot on the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll after collecting her first career shutout against Western Michigan.

The Bluejays bring back 15 letterwinners, including five returning starters who boast a wealth of experience from a season ago. Fifth-year seniors **Lara Kazandjian** and **Stella Downing** are expected to make significant impacts in the Bluejays offense this season, while seniors **Maddie Radke** and **Alyssa Judkins** anchor the Bluejays back line defensively.

Head coach **Jimmy Walker** is in his first season at the helm of the Bluejays and owns a 178-97-26 career record.

Scouting #19 Saint Louis (2-1-2)

Ranked #19 nationally, Saint Louis is 2-1-2 this season with the lone loss coming to then-No. 12 Penn State (2-1 on Sept. 1). The Billikens, however, own wins on the road at Missouri (2-0, Aug. 25) and Missouri State (4-0, Aug. 29) while earning draws against Kansas City (0-0, Aug. 15) and No. 4 BYU (1-1, Aug. 22).

Six different Billikens have found the back of the net this season, with **Emily Gaebe** leading the way with three goals on a team-high 20 shots, while **Lyndsey Heckel** ranks second on the team with three points on a goal and an assist.

Graduate **Emily Puricelli**, the reigning A-10 Goalkeeper of the Year, had played 423 of the 432 minutes in goal this season, posting a pair of shutouts and a 0.89 goals against average. The St. Louis native is the school's all-time leader in career goalkeeper victories (69), shutouts (42) and goalkeeper minutes (8,095), while ranking second in goals against average (0.64) and saves (290).

The Billikens were picked as the favorites to win the Atlantic 10 once again this season, after posting an 19-3-2 overall record while capturing their fifth A-10 regular season crown in the last six years a season ago.

Head coach **Katie Shields** is in her 12th season at the helm and owns a 153-59-16 overall record at Saint Louis.

Series History Against The Billikens

Creighton and Saint Louis have met just three times in program history, with the Billikens holding a 3-0-0 lead in the series.

Saint Louis picked up a 2-0 win over the Bluejays in first ever meeting in 2000 and a 2-1 double-overtime victory during the 2001 season. The two teams met last season in Saint Louis with the Billikens claiming a 4-1 win in the Bluejays first road match of the year.

Head coach **Jimmy Walker** is 0-2-0 all-time against Saint Louis as a head coach with both meetings being played while serving as the head coach at Duquesne.

Socctoberfest Success

Friday's match against Saint Louis marks Creighton Women's Soccer 10th Annual Socctoberfest event, although it is the 12th Creighton Socctoberfest event.

The Bluejays are an impressive 6-1-2 in Socctoberfest matches dating back to 2012, with wins over New Mexico State, Omaha, South Dakota Iowa State and Colorado College. Creighton has outscored the opposition 19-6 in those matches.

The Bluejays first Socctoberfest victory came on Sept. 5, 2014, when Creighton defeated New Mexico State, 6-0. The Bluejays battled Minnesota to a 0-0 scoreless draw last season during Socctoberfest at Morrison Stadium.

The Bluejay women's squad did not play during the 2013 or 2021 Socctoberfest due to schedule issues.

Bluejays All-Time vs. Top 25 Competition

Facing off against #19 Saint Louis on Friday, Creighton will be seeking its first win over a ranked opponent since defeating #12 Wisconsin, 1-0, back on Sept. 3, 1994.

Including setbacks to #17 Georgetown (1-0) and #20 Xavier (1-0) last season, the Bluejays have faced a ranked opposition 26 times and hold a 1-21-4 overall record. Head coach Jimmy Walker is 0-5-2 all-time against ranked opponents at the Division I level, with all seven matches taking place while at Bowling Green State.

Largest Crowds in Bluejay History

With Creighton men's and women's soccer hosting its annual Socctoberfest match on Friday night, the Bluejays are expecting a large crowd to fill the bleacher against nationally ranked Saint Louis.

Three of the top-11 largest crowds have been during Socctoberfest matches. The 2016 Socctoberfest match against South Dakota was the largest attended Socctoberfest match and was seen by the sixth largest crowd in school history. In addition, seven of the top-11 largest crowds have come since the Bluejays made the move to the BIG EAST in 2013, including opening last season with the third largest crowd in program history (1,834, vs. Nebraska).

The largest crowd to witness a Creighton women's soccer game was on Sept. 16, 2017, when Creighton claimed a 3-1 victory over Omaha in front of 2,308 fans.

During the 2023 season, Creighton ranked second in the BIG EAST and 69th nationally in average home attendance with an average of 719 fans per home match.

Home Sweet Home

Creighton opened the home portion of their schedule with a 3-0 shutout last Thursday against Western Michigan and now own a 114-61-27 (.631) all-time at Morrison Stadium.

Including this year's win over the Broncos, the Bluejays are now 22-9-5 all-time in home-openers, which includes an 13-5-4 mark during home-openers at Morrison Stadium.

In addition to Creighton owning a 114-61-27 overall record at home, the Bluejays also hold a 52-36-12 mark at Morrison Stadium since joining the BIG EAST in 2013 and a 17-29-5 record during home league matches.

Azumi Scoring at a Fast Pace

Senior **Azumi Manriki** has been nothing short of fantastic through the first four matches of the season. The Hiroshima, Japan native paces the Bluejays with three goals this season, scoring in each of the Jays first three matches.

Manriki became the first Bluejay since **Toch Ihemelu** in 2006 to score in each of the first three matches of a season.

Scoring First Yields Success

Through the first four matches of the season, Creighton is 1-1-0 when scoring first, but also 1-1-0 when the opponent scores first. Additionally, the Bluejays are 1-1-0 when leading at the break and 1-1-0 when trailing at halftime.

Last season Creighton finished the season with 2-1-2 record with scoring first, but 2-8-1 when the opponent scores first.

Despite starting 1-1-0 this season, Creighton has had incredible success when netting the first goal of the match since joining the BIG EAST in 2013.

Since the start of the 2013 season, the Bluejays own a 62-12-12 record when finding the back of the net first, but a 19-77-8 mark when the opponent scores first and a 0-0-7 in scoreless draws.

Bringing the Physicality

Over the course of the last few years there is one portion of the game that Creighton is not shy to bring, and that is the physicality.

Through the first four matches this season, Creighton has racked up 78 fouls and a total of 10 yellow cards. The Bluejays 19.50 fouls per game currently leads the country for fouls per contest, while the 10 yellows are tied for the fifth most in the nation.

In 2023, the Bluejays were called for 11.28 fouls pre match, ranking 33rd in the nation. Creighton was also only booked for a total of 12 yellow cards all of last season.

During the Bluejays' 2-1 win over Iowa State on Aug. 18, Creighton was called for 27 fouls over the course of the match. The Bluejays 27 fouls were its most in a single match since being called for 30 fouls during a match against Illinois State on Nov. 9, 2003.

Scoring Two Works Almost Everytime

It would stand to reason that scoring goals increases a team's chances of winning. For the Bluejays, that is most certainly the case.

Since the program began in 1989, Creighton owns a 274-23-12 all-time record when scoring two or more goals in a match, including a 2-1-0 record this season. On the flip side, the Bluejays are 46-248-52 when being held to fewer than two goals.

Additionally, the Bluejays are 67-8-3 when scoring two or more goals, but 14-81-24 when netting fewer than two goals since joining the BIG EAST in 2013.

A'ZOOM'I Gets Bluejays Off To Quick Start

Senior **Azumi Manriki** kicked off the 2024 season with a bang, netting the first goal of the season just four minutes into the match against Minnesota on Thursday night.

The Hiroshima, Japan native gave the Bluejays a 1-0 lead in the fifth minute of play, blasting home a laser from 25-yards out off a failed clear by the Golden Gophers back line.

Manriki's fifth minute goal was the Bluejays first goal in the first half of a season-opener since **Taryn Jakubowski** converted a penalty kick in the 45th minute against Kansas State in the 2019 lid-lifter.

In addition, Manriki's goal on Thursday night was the fastest goal scored by a Bluejay to open a season since **Kristina Schoeck** scored 1:31 into a contest against Oklahoma on Aug. 31, 1996.

Bluejay History in First Road Match of Season

Creighton hit the road for the first time this season on Thursday, traveling to Minnesota to take on the Golden Gophers. Despite a fast start and a strong first half, the Bluejays suffered a 2-1 loss in the season opener.

The Bluejays have not had the greatest success in its first road match of the season, falling to a 14-19-2 mark all-time in road openers.

With the loss on Thursday, Creighton has not won its road opener since posting a 2-1 win at Kansas City in 2019 and has not won a season opener on the road since downing South Dakota State, 3-2, in 2014.

Season-Opener History

Despite a strong showing in the season-opener against Minnesota on Aug. 15, Creighton dropped a 2-1 decision to the Golden Gophers, moving to 17-15-4 all-time in lid-lifters.

Additionally, Creighton is 5-5-2 in season-openers since joining the BIG EAST in 2013.

The Bluejays, however, have outscored foes by an average of 1.50 (54 Goals) to 1.36 (49 Goals) goals per game in the Jays' 36 season-openers.

Head coach **Jimmy Walker** is 8-8-1 all-time in season-openers, including a 3-5-1 mark at the Division I level.

earned 44 points in the preseason coaches' poll to place seventh overall. The Jays' went just 2-7-1 during BIG EAST play last season, but with five returning starters boasting a wealth of experience and 15 total returning letterwinners, first-year head coach **Jimmy Walker** has the tools to lead the Bluejay back to the postseason.

Defending BIG EAST regular-season and tournament champion Georgetown claimed the top spot with 100 points, including the maximum 10 first-place votes. UConn tallied one first-place vote and a total of 91 points to place second, while Xavier beating out Butler (70) by two points for third with 72 points. Providence (66) and St. John's (57) closed out the top six, while Seton Hall (43), Marquette (22), Villanova (22) and DePaul (19) rounded out the bottom half of the poll.

The top six teams in the final league standings will qualify for the 2024 BIG EAST Championship Presented by JEEP. The first-round matchups will be hosted by the higher seed on Nov. 3 (3 vs. 6 and 4 vs. 5), while the semifinals on Nov. 7 (1 vs. winner of 4/5 and 2 vs. winner of 3/6) and final match on Nov. 10 will be played in Boyds, Md.

Manriki Tabled To Preseason All-BIG EAST Team

Senior midfielder **Azumi Manriki** earned individual recognition as the BIG EAST Preseason honors and poll were released on Thursday, Aug. 13.

Manriki, a Hiroshima, Japan native, was a Second Team All-BIG EAST selection last fall after pacing the Bluejays and ranking sixth in the BIG EAST with 46 total shots. She contributed two goals and dished out an assist while logging 1,570 minutes of action over 18 contests. Manriki is one of just five players returning to the squad this season after starting at least nine matches during the 2023 season.

"It's a really exciting opportunity that I'm looking forward to diving into," said Walker. "I've really enjoyed getting to know the administration from Creighton. Marcus has been great to work with. I really enjoyed our interactions, and I love the vision he has for Creighton Athletics."

Walker owns a 178-97-26 record in his 17 seasons as a head coach, which included stops at Tiffin (1997-2002), Duquesne (2003-06), Findlay (2018-19) and Bowling Green State (2020-23). He is a seven-time Conference Coach of the Year, a three-time Regional Coach of the Year, and in 2000 while at Tiffin was the runner-up for the BRINE National Coach of the Year award.

He also served for two seasons as the recruiting coordinator and top assistant for the men's soccer program at Penn State (2007-08), and was the Executive Director of Coaching at Pacesetter Soccer Club from 2011-18. Pacesetter were partners with Aston Villa Football Club of the EPL.

The native of Birmingham, England, has won 15 conference regular-season or tournament titles in addition to making eight national tournament appearances. His teams are also a regular on the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award list, including a 3.74 GPA in 2022-23 while at BGSU.

His teams have advanced to a postseason tournament and earned national or regional rankings at each college program he's coached at. Walker's team won the BG Athletics Services to the Community Award in 2023, as well as a proclamation from the Mayor of Bowling Green for service to the community.



Walker's 2020 Bowling Green State team shared the NCAA lead in shutout percentage (.750) and closed the regular-season ranked No. 29 in the RPI. His 2021 club won the MAC regular-season and tournament titles, were ranked No. 4 in the final Midwest Region poll, and was the first in program history to receive Top 25 votes.



His final team at Findlay in 2019 became the first in program history to make the NCAA Tournament. The Oilers were ranked in the Top 25 nationally, and Walker was named the Great Midwest Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.

His tenure at Duquesne was highlighted by a 10-6-1 record in 2005 and the program's first Atlantic 10 Tournament appearance. The 10 victories and .618 win percentage were a school-record at the time.

His first head coaching job came at Tiffin, where his team won five American Midwest Conference titles and went 45-2-1 in league play during his tenure. The Dragons reached the program's first Sweet 16, and was the top-ranked team in the Region at one point. Walker was named AMC Coach of the Year in 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2002.

"When the Creighton job came open, with the soccer tradition, the facilities, the resources and one of the best conferences in the country, it's a really good opportunity for me and my family to take in the next step in my coaching journey," noted Walker. "I can't wait to get to work with the players, and I'm looking forward to the challenge ahead."

Walker earned a pair of degrees from Tiffin University, picking up his Bachelor's degree in Sports Management & Business in 1997 and later earning his Master's degree in Business Administration in 2000. He also has his UEFA B License and earned his United Soccer Coaches Premier Coaching Diploma in 2013.

Following his collegiate career, Walker played professionally with the Kalamazoo Kingdom (1996-97) and Cleveland Whitecaps (1998). He was a two-time NAIA All-American at Tiffin and earned three All-Great Lakes Region, District 22 and Mid-Ohio Conference honors over his four year career. He helped lead the Dragons to two MOC Championships and was named MOC Player of the Year in 1994. Walker was inducted into the Tiffin University Hall of Fame in 2006.

Walker played with the Academy team at Aston Villa in the English Premier League prior to coming to the United States. His father, James, played and coached professionally in England for over 25 years. His father played for Derby County, which captured two EPL championship crowns, and also coached in the English Premier League with Aston Villa for 15 years where he was the Director of Sports Science for the club.

Walker is married to the former Kerri Destatte. They have two daughters, Emma and Anna.

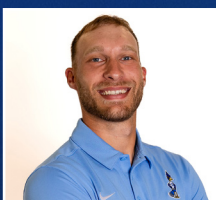
