Creighton (5-4) plays its final game before BIG EAST action starts this Saturday, Dec. 13th, when it hosts Kansas State (6-4).

Saturday's game will be played in Omaha, Neb., on First National Bank Court inside CHI Health Center Omaha (17,352) and tip off at 2 p.m.

Creighton will honor senior guard **Nik Graves** prior to the game in recognition of his 1,000th career point.

## Scouting Creighton

Creighton is 5-4 on the young season, but 4-0 at home. The Bluejays own victories over South Dakota, Maryland Eastern Shore, North Dakota, Oregon and Nicholls. Three of the four losses have come against teams who are currently ranked.

Five of the top six scorers are newcomers, led by **Josh Dix** (11.7 ppg.), **Blake Harper** (9.8 ppg., 5.8 rpg.) and **Nik Graves** (9.7 ppg., 3.6 apg.)

Creighton's most productive returner, **Jackson McAndrew** (6.8 ppg., 4.5 rpg.), as well as key subs **Hudson Greer** (8.0 ppg., 4.3 rpg.) and **Josh Townley-Thomas** (6.0 ppg.), have combined to play just nine games due to injuries.

Creighton is averaging 74.4 points per game and shooting 44.7 percent from the field, 31.9 percent from three-point range and 72.2 percent at the line.

Scouting Kansas State

Kansas State is 6-4 this season, snapping a four-game losing streak on Monday after making 19 three-pointers in a 108-49 victory over Mississippi Valley State.
Memphis transfer <b>PJ Haggerty</b> (24.0 ppg., 5.1 apg., 4.7 rpg.) leads the nation in scoring and is shooting 50.9 percent from the floor and 41.7 percent from three-point range.
Also in double-figures are <b>David Castillo</b> (12.9 ppg.), <b>Nate Johnson</b> (12.4 ppg., 5.6 rpg.), <b>Abdi Bashir Jr.</b> (12.3 ppg.) and <b>Khamari McGriff</b> (10.1 ppg., 80.4 FG%).
The Wildcats average 86.7 points per game and allow 77.2 points per contest. K-State shoots 49.0 percent from the floor, 40.2 percent from deep and 69.9 percent at the line and is +3.4 rebounds per game.
Kansas State is 6-1 when scoring 84 points or more. When being held under 83 points, the Wildcats are 0-3 with three double-digits losses.
<b>The Series With Kansas State</b>
Creighton and Kansas State have split 16 all-time meetings, with the home team going 11-4. Creighton is 7-3 against the Wildcats in Omaha.
The teams met in the First Round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament in Charlotte, N.C, a game won by K-State 69-59.
Incredibly, the programs have not met in the regular-season since 1987, and Creighton has not defeated the Wildcats since a 79-76 overtime decision on Jan. 13, 1976.
<b>Greg McDermott</b> is 1-8 against Kansas State, but 0-1 as Creighton's head coach. He has never coached against <b>Jerome Tang</b> .
<b>The Creighton Coaches</b>
<b>Greg McDermott</b> (Northern Iowa, 1988) owns a 355-175 record in his 16th season with the Bluejays. He owns a career mark of 635-370 in his 32nd season, and is 504-306 in 25 Division I campaigns.
McDermott led Creighton to its first BIG EAST regular-season title in 2019-20, taking a Bluejay team that was picked seventh in the league's pre-season poll and ending the year ranked seventh nationally. The Cascade, Iowa native has coached Creighton to a share of its first regular-season BIG EAST title in 2019-20, its first Sweet 16 since 1974 in 2020-21, and first Elite Eight since 1941 in 2022-23.
McDermott has previously been a head coach at Iowa State (2006-10), Northern Iowa (2001-06), North Dakota State (2000-01) and Wayne State (1994-2000).
He is assisted by <b>Alan Huss</b> , <b>Derek Kellogg</b> , <b>Trey Zeigler</b> , <b>Mitch Ballock</b> and <b>Mike Nesbitt</b> .

With A Win...

- Creighton would improve to 5-0 this season at home.
- Creighton would defeat Kansas State for the first time since 1976, improving to 9-8 all-time against the Wildcats.
- Creighton would improve to 24-2 in its last 26 games played immediately following a loss of 20+ points.

Creighton / Kansas State Connections

Though Creighton and Kansas State haven't played a ton in th last 40 years, the programs certainly have some things in common.
<b>Dana Altman</b> was head coach at Kansas State from 1990-94, where he went 68-54 with the Wildcats. He left that job to take over at Creighton, where he went 327-176 and took the Bluejays to seven NCAA Tournaments in 16 seasons from 1994-2010. Altman was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in 2018.
<b>Marcus Foster</b> began his career averaging 14.1 points per game over 62 games at Kansas State from 2013-15 before finishing up at Creighton from 2016-18. One of just two Bluejays to be a two-time First Team All-BIG EAST pick, Foster scored 1,292 points (19.8 ppg.) in two seasons on The Hilltop.
<b>Arthur Kaluma</b> played two seasons at Creighton from 2021-23, contributing 758 points (11.1 ppg.) and 388 rebounds (5.7 rpg.) for a pair of NCAA Tournament teams. He then transferred to Kansas State, where he averaged 14.4 points and 7.0 rebounds per game for the Wildcats. He finished his college career last season at Texas.
The lone meeting between Creighton and Kansas State since 1987 was a 2018 NCAA Tournament game in Charlotte. While the game was a rather non-descript 69-59 Wildcat win in the 8/9 game, what's notable is what happened two hours later. That's when UMBC upset top-seeded Virginia to earn itself a Second Round match-up with K-State.
<b>Balanced Effort</b>
Creighton still has not had a player produce a 20-point game this season, its longest drought to start a season since it didn't happen in the first 12 games in 2003-04.

### McChesney Perserveres

**Liam McChesney** capped Creighton's 96-76 win with a tip-dunk in the final 30 seconds.

It was McChesney's first field goal in a game since scoring at Arch Madness on March 2, 2023 when he played for Illinois State, a span of 1,007 days.

### Hudson Strong

**Hudson Greer** made 7-of-8 shots and scored 16 points in the Nov. 24 game vs. Baylor, an impressive showing for the true freshman who had his redshirt lifted just a few days earlier.

Greer became the first Bluejay freshman with 16 points or more in one of his first two games since **Khyri Thomas** scored 18 points in his collegiate debut vs. Texas Southern on Nov. 14, 2015.

### If At First You Don't Succeed

Creighton scored 29 second-chance points in its season-opening win over South Dakota, 12 more than any other game last season. The last time CU had scored 29 or more second-chance points was the 2023-24 season-opener against Florida A&M.

This year's Creighton team is averaging 12.00 second chance points per game.

Since 2003-04, Creighton's highest second-chance points average has been 11.31 points per game in 2011-12, and its top average since joining the BIG EAST was 10.43 second chance points per game in 2013-14.

CU currently ranks 117th nationally in offensive rebound percentage (.333). Per [KenPom.com](https://kenpom.com), the last time Creighton's finished in the top 100 was way back in 1998-99 when it was 34th at .397. CU has been 278th, 274th, 280th, 165th, 258th and 295th nationally the previous six seasons.

### Deep Thoughts

**Greg McDermott** talked in the off-season about how this year's squad figured to be the deepest team he's ever had at Creighton, and the early results have proven him right.

Creighton's bench has outscored foes 242-205 this season. That +37 figure would be CU's best year-end mark since 2018-19.

Creighton's bench has accounted for 36.12 percent of CU's scoring, and 26.89 points per game. That's the most bench points per game since the 2014-15 club averaged 27.21 points per game. CU's

best figure in the last 20 seasons came in 2007-08, when the Jays averaged 36.91 bench points per game and actually outscored the starting line-up (34.61 ppg.).

Creighton entered this season with 48 straight wins when scoring 17 or more bench points, but are just 4-4 this year when scoring 18 points or more off the bench.

## Postseason Success

Creighton has won at least one NCAA Tournament game in 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025. That makes CU one of four teams in the country to have a win in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments, joining Baylor, Gonzaga and Houston.

Nebraska, on the other hand, has never won an NCAA Tournament contest in men's basketball.

This is the first time that Creighton Basketball has won an NCAA Tournament game in five straight years. The only other CU program in any sport to win an NCAA Tournament game in five straight seasons is Creighton Volleyball (2015-19).

Even though a certain NCAA bid was wiped away in 2020 by COVID-19, Creighton has still appeared in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments (2021-25).

The only previous time that Creighton has appeared in five straight NCAA Tournaments was from 1999-2003.

Creighton is one of 13 teams to have appeared in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments (2021-25). That list consists of Alabama, Baylor, Connecticut, Creighton, Gonzaga, Houston, Kansas, Illinois, Michigan State, Purdue, San Diego State, Tennessee and Texas.

## Ain't Too Proud To Brag

Creighton has won 20 or more games in each of the past 10 seasons, tied for the nation's fourth-longest active streak. Kansas leads the way with 36, followed by Gonzaga (28) and Belmont (15). The others with 10 (like Creighton) include Oregon and Houston.

Creighton has won 22 games or more in six straight seasons. Only Gonzaga (28) and Houston (8) have longer streaks.

Creighton is one of two schools to have men's and women's basketball programs to both own 22 wins or more each of the previous four seasons, a list that includes Creighton and UConn.

Creighton is one of two teams in the nation with 25 or more wins in both men's basketball and women's basketball each of the previous two seasons. That list consists of Creighton and Gonzaga.

#### Coaching Consistency Is Key

Between women's basketball coach **Jim Flanery** (456) and men's basketball coach **Greg McDermott** (355), Creighton is the nation's only school with a pair of active head coaches with at least 350 victories at their current school.

Flanery (hired in 2002) and McDermott (2010) also make Creighton one of three schools to have the same men's and women's basketball head coaches each of the last 15 seasons, joining Boise State (**Leon Rice** and **Gordy Presnell**) and Northern Iowa (**Ben Jacobsen** and **Tanya Warren**).

Jacobsen played on teams McDermott assisted at North Dakota from 1989-93 and later replaced McDermott as head coach at UNI In 2006, while Warren was a former Creighton player and assistant and is one of two women in program history to have her number retired.

#### Stability is Key

One reason for Creighton's extended run of success has been the continuity within its coaching staff. The Bluejays have had just two head coaches in the last 32 years, **Dana Altman** (1994-2010) and **Greg McDermott** (2010-Present).

Not counting 2019-20, when there was no postseason, Creighton has made the postseason each of the 12 most recent times in which it has made at least 50 percent of its field goal attempts to open the year.

Ten of those postseason trips were NCAA Tournament berths. The last time that didn't hold true was 1991-92, when CU shot 51.0 percent in the opener but finished just 9-19.

Creighton has shot 50 percent or better in 10 of its last 14 season-openers, including 50 percent (37-for-74) on Wednesday vs. South Dakota.

### Preseason All-BIG EAST Votes Revealed

The Creighton men's basketball team was picked to finish third in the BIG EAST Conference in the annual survey of league coaches, which was unveiled as part of 2025 BIG EAST Media Day on October 21.

It marks the fourth straight year the Bluejays have been tabbed for a top-three finish and the third time CU has been picked exactly third in the BIG EAST poll, having also happened in 2013-14 as well as 2016-17.

Defending league champion St. John's garnered 7-of-11 first place votes and was chosen atop the poll with 97 points, just ahead of Connecticut. The Huskies collected four first place votes and 94 points. Creighton was third with 80 points, just ahead of Providence (64) and Marquette (60). The second half of the league poll consists of Georgetown (57), Villanova (50), Xavier (33), DePaul (29), Butler (26) and Seton Hall (15).

Creighton finished 25-11 overall and 15-5 in BIG EAST play last season and returns starters **Jackson McAndrew** (7.8 ppg., 4.4 rpg.) and **Jasen Green** (4.9 ppg., 3.2 rpg.) along with a talented crop of newcomers.

Three of those newcomers join McAndrew with Preseason All-BIG EAST accolades, giving CU four honorees for the first time since its 2022-23 team that eventually finished the season in the Elite Eight. **Owen Freeman** was voted a Preseason All-BIG EAST First Team selection and **Josh Dix** was a Preseason All-BIG EAST Second Team choice. McAndrew and **Nik Graves** were both Preseason All-BIG EAST Third Team honorees.

Freeman is the eighth different Bluejay to earn Preseason All-BIG EAST First Team recognition, and first to do it prior to playing a game with the Bluejays. It also means CU has had a First Team pick each of the last four seasons, as **Trey Alexander** was chosen prior to 2023-24 and **Ryan Kalkbrenner** was honored each of the previous three campaigns.

Creighton has matched or exceeded its pre-season projection in all but one season since joining the BIG EAST in 2013-14, the best showing in the league in that time. The Bluejays are seeking a 10th straight finish in the top four of the league standings.

### NBA Jays

There are five former Creighton players in the NBA this season.

Former Creighton All-American **Doug McDermott** is with the Sacramento Kings as he begins his 12th year in the NBA. He was a Lottery pick in 2014 by the Denver Nuggets.

**Baylor Scheierman** is in his second year with the Boston Celtics after being a First Round pick in 2024.

**Trey Alexander**, who was named 2024-25 G-League Rookie of the Year in the Denver Nuggets organization, is now on a two-way contract with the New Orleans Pelicans.

There is palpable buzz around **Ryan Kalkbrenner**, a Second Round pick of the Charlotte Hornets, in his rookie campaign.

Lastly, former Creighton point guard **Ryan Nembhard** is on a two-way contract with the Dallas Mavericks. Nembhard played two years at Creighton before finishing his career at Gonzaga.

These men give Creighton at least one NBA player for the 42nd time in the last 43 seasons.

Other famous Bluejays to play in the NBA in the past include **Paul Silas**, **Kyle Korver**, **Benoit Benjamin** and **Anthony Tolliver**.

### Who's Back?

With Creighton returning only seven of the 15 men who appeared in a game last season -- including its top three scorers -- much of the production is gone.

### McChesney On The Mend

**Liam McChesney** is a rare seventh-year junior who saw his first regular-season action in 979 days on Nov. 5 against South Dakota. He played just over four minutes, collecting a rebound and a blocked shot but missing both field goal attempts.

McChesney began his career in 2019-20 when he redshirted at Utah State. He played in three games at Utah State in 2020-21 before suffering a season-ending broken ankle.

The Prince Rupert, Canada native then transferred to Illinois State, where he played in 60 games and made 27 starts for the Redbirds in two seasons from 2021-23.

McChesney transferred to High Point to play for then-Panther head coach **Alan Huss** (now Creighton's associate head coach and head coach in waiting), but was sidelined after a preseason medical evaluation revealed an issue with one of his heart valves, which led to heart surgery that has caused him to miss the past two seasons as his weight dropped 208 to 172 pounds.

McChesney transferred to Creighton this summer and continues his comeback.

### Preseason Top 25

The Creighton men's basketball team was ranked 23rd in the *Associated Press* Preseason Top 25 poll, the fourth straight season the Bluejays have been ranked among the nation's best in the preseason.

This year's announcement marks the eighth time in program history the writers have voted CU to the Top 25 in the preseason, joining 2006-07 (No. 19), 2012-13 (No. 16) and 2016-17 (No. 22), 2020-21 (No. 11), 2022-23 (No. 9), 2023-24 (No. 8) and 2024-25 (No. 15). All seven of those teams would end up in the NCAA Tournament, with three of the four most recent squads making the Sweet 16.

Creighton's best ranking in program history is seventh, done five times (Jan. 16, 2017, March 10, 2020, March 18, 2020, Jan. 7, 2021 and Nov. 28, 2022).

Including this year's preseason ranking, Creighton has now been ranked 148 times in program history, with 120 of those under the direction of **Greg McDermott**. Creighton is 180-78 all-time as a ranked team, including a 146-66 mark under McDermott. Creighton has now been ranked at least one week in 12 of McDermott's 16 seasons on The Hilltop after doing it just five different seasons in program history before his 2010 arrival.

Creighton has been one of 11 schools ranked in the Top 25 of the Preseason AP poll each of the last four years, joining Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, Duke, Gonzaga, Houston, Kansas, Kentucky, North Carolina and Tennessee.

Creighton was one of three BIG EAST Conference schools in the poll, joining No. 4 Connecticut and No. 5 St. John's.

Among Creighton's non-conference opponents in the poll are preseason No. 21 Gonzaga and pre-season No. 16 Iowa State.

Creighton was also ranked 23rd in the preseason *USA Today* Coaches poll.

Let's Go On A Run

Creighton unleashed a 23-0 run on Iowa State during its exhibition meeting, turning an early 8-4 deficit into a 27-8 lead over a span of just under seven minutes (6:57).

Dating back to the start of the 2021-22 season, it was Creighton's largest run in any game, including exhibitions. Below is that list.

Triple Trouble

During Creighton's current streak of 1,065 straight games with a three-pointer, the Jays have drained 8,588 trifectas, an average of 8.06 treys per game.

Only five times in the streak has Creighton made just one three-pointer, but on 327 occasions the Bluejays have made 10 or more trifectas, including three games of 20 or more.

Since the start of the 2019-20 season, the Bluejays are 107-29 when making eight or more three-pointers, compared to a 38-36 mark when making seven treys or fewer.

Greg McDermott has 355 victories at Creighton, passing his predecessor Dana Altman (327) for the most in program history in CU's Nov. 13, 2024 win vs. Houston Christian.

McDermott broke a different record on Jan. 21, 2025 at DePaul when he coached his 504th game on the Bluejay sideline, breaking the mark of 503 held by Altman.

McDermott's .670 winning percentage is Creighton's best since Arthur A. Schabinger's .714 win rate from 90 years ago.

### CHI Health Center Omaha Success

Creighton has played 375 regular and postseason contests at CHI Health Center Omaha all-time in the now 23-year-old facility.

The Bluejays own a 311-64 (.829) record all-time at the facility.

Creighton's Nov. 25, 2017 win over SIU Edwardsville was the program's 200th at the facility, coming in its 242nd home game. CU's 100th win came on Nov. 17, 2010, a 63-58 win over Louisiana.

Creighton has outscored its opponents 29,500-24,609 in games at CHI Health Center Omaha, an average margin of 13.04 points per game. Creighton has not trailed 94 different times, including once this year (Maryland Eastern Shore).

Incredibly, Creighton hasn't trailed in its home opener in 10 of the past 25 seasons (2000-01, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05, 2005-06, 2009-10, 2011-12, 2014-15, 2016-17 and 2019-20).

Creighton is also 34-37 all-time in the 71 games at the arena in which it's fallen behind by double-figures at any point, 8-12 when down by 10+ points at halftime in the facility, and 42-30 when trailing at halftime at CHI Health Center Omaha.

Creighton is 214-46 (.823) at CHI Health Center Omaha under **Greg McDermott** and hasn't trailed in 67 of those games. In that same span, CU owns a 111-10 home record (.917) vs. non-conference teams.

Factor in a 17-0 home mark at the Omaha Civic Auditorium in 2002-03 and two wins at the Civic in the 2010 CIT, and the Bluejays are 329-64 (.837) at home since the start of the 2002-03 campaign.

### Home Run

Under **Greg McDermott** Creighton is averaging 80.80 points per home game (21,007 points in 260 home games), a figure that climbs to 84.32 points in non-conference home games (10,203 points in 121 home games).

Creighton is 158-7 all-time at CHI Health Center Omaha when scoring 80 or points.

### Perfect 10

**Greg McDermott** has guided his team to the NCAA Tournament 10 times at Creighton. That put him in the company of some of the greatest coaches in CU Athletics history, and most among basketball coaches.

McDermott is one of three head coaches in Creighton history to lead 10 or more NCAA Tournament teams.

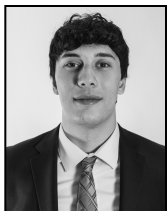
