**Jensen, Maly and Mogensen
 Recognized with BIG EAST Honors**

As No. 23 Creighton Women's Basketball prepares to travel to Connecticut for the BIG EAST Tournament, the trio of Lauren Jensen, Morgan Maly and Molly Mogensen were rewarded for an excellent 2024-25 season with post season honors, announced on Thursday, March 6. The duo of Jensen and Maly earned their third consecutive All-BIG EAST First Team honor, while Mogensen earned both All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention as well as the Co-Sportsmanship Award.

A semifinalist for the Ann Meyers Shooting Guard of the Year award, Jensen enters the BIG EAST Tournament with 2,011 career points, including 1,988 over three seasons as a Bluejay. This season she leads Creighton with 517 points, is second on the team with 113 assists and has also grabbed 114 rebounds. A proficient markswoman, she has connected on 45.5% of her field goals (200-of-440), including 67 treys. Jensen was the Emerald Coast Classic MVP, collected one BIG EAST Player of the Week nod and four Honor Roll selections. Jensen has lead Creighton in scoring in 11 games in 2024-25, also leading the Bluejays in assists in 17 contests.

Maly heads to the BIG EAST Tournament with 507 this season to move within three points of third in Creighton history at 2,008 points. Morgan set the Bluejay record for made three pointers in her career, currently at 325 and climbing. A two-time BIG EAST Player of the Week this season, Maly is averaging 17.5 ppg and leads the team with 172 rebounds, 5.9 rpg. Morgan has led Creighton in scoring 14 games this season, also leading the Bluejays in rebounding in 13 games and in blocked shots 12 times.

Mogensen is earning her first BIG EAST postseason honors this season. She enters the BIG EAST Tournament with 277 points this season and a team-high 114 assists. Molly crossed the 1,000 career point threshold in late February, heading to Connecticut with 1,020 career points, 481 assists and 564 rebounds. She led the Bluejays in scoring in six games, while she has been the Bluejays' assist leader in 13 contests. Mogensen's contributions off the court earned her the Co-Sportsmanship honor. One of the connectors for Creighton, Molly is an integral contributor to the teams success by displaying a calm presence on the court as well as connecting with each teammate off the court. Mogensen spent extensive time performing community service as she worked Creighton's Abilities Basketball Camp, assisting with developmentally challenged youths, spent considerable time with the Boys and Girls Club and was a consistent contributor to Abide (local Omaha group for underprivileged youths in Omaha).

- Illinois went 19-15 last season, reaching the Finals of the WBIT Tournament. The Fighting Illini defeated Villanova in the championship.
- Head coach Shauna Green is in her third season at the helm for the Illini. She enters the game against Creighton with a record of 62-34 at Illinois and an overall record of 189-84.

Scouting Illinois (21-9)

Claiming the No. 8-seed thanks to a 21-9 record on the season, the Fighting Illini look to rebound after an early exit to No. 10-seed Nebraska in the Big Ten Tournament. Illinois was bounced from the tournament after a 74-70 loss, despite strong performances from Genesis Bryant, Kendall Bostic and Adalia McKenzie.

Bryant, who averaged 15.1 points per game throughout the season, eclipsed her average rate of 15.1 points per game with 20 against Nebraska. Bostic, who has led the Fighting Illini all season in points with 15.9 per game, recorded 19 points against the Cornhuskers.

McKenzie, who rounded out the leading scorers with 16 points against the No. 10 seed, recorded a season-high 10 assists and claimed her first double-double of the season in points and assists.

Heading into their matchup with the Bluejays, the Fighting Illini are led by Head Coach Shauna Green in her third year with the program. This year's tournament appearance marks Green's second appearance as head of the program, and 10th appearance in program history.



Scouting #23 Creighton (26-6)

Heading into their fourth straight NCAA tournament appearance, the Bluejays are seeded at No. 9-seed for the second consecutive year. Fresh off a second-place performance in the BIG EAST Tournament, Creighton has won 52 games over the past two seasons, entering the game on Saturday with a 26-6 mark.

After defeating Georgetown and Seton Hall to reach the final of the conference tournament, Creighton fell for the third time this season by No. 3 Connecticut.

The Bluejays fell by a margin of 70-50 in the championship game, though seniors Lauren Jensen and Morgan Maly led the charge to challenge the Huskies. Jensen led the team with 13 points and seven rebounds, while Maly recorded 12 points and two steals. The pair average 17.8 and 17.3 points per game this season, respectively.

At the helm for the Bluejays heading into the matchup with No. 8-seed Illinois is Head Coach Jim Flanery, who has led the Bluejays to eight NCAA Tournament bids over his 23 years at Creighton.

Bluejays Have Faced Shauna Green Once Before

During the 2016-17 season, Creighton and head coach Jim Flanery bested Shauna Green in the Junkanoo Jam in the Bimini Islands, Bahama. That season the Bluejays defeated Dayton during Green's first season at the helm for the Flyers.

Flanery and Green Have More Shared History

Both Jim Flanery and Shauna Green each served as an assistant coach at Loras College at the onset of their coaching career. Flanery was an assistant from 1990-92 under head coach Connie Yori. Green's career began as an assistant at Loras from 2002-05, then went on to become the head coach from 2005-07.

Jensen and Maly Earn All-BIG EAST Tournament Team

Bluejay leaders Lauren Jensen and Morgan Maly were rewarded for their strong performance at the BIG EAST Tournament with a spot on the 2025 All-Tournament Team. Creighton's pair were joined by three Connecticut players (Paige Bueckers (MOP), Azzi Fudd and Sarah Strong) as well as Georgetown's Kelsey Ransom.

Creighton One of Just Six Schools with Four Consecutive Years of Both MBB and WBB Reaching NCAA Tournament

The list of schools to have their Men's and Women's Basketball Teams in last four NCAA Tournaments is just six (Baylor, Creighton, Iowa State, Tennessee, Texas, UConn). Two of the six are BIG EAST members, while two are in the Austin regional.

Decisive Regular Season Finale Historic Bluejay Benchmarks

Creighton's victory over Villanova served not only as a decisive regular season wrap-up, but a milestone for Bluejay seniors Morgan Maly and Lauren Jensen.

With 23 points on the night, Maly surpassed her 2000th career point in a Bluejay uniform, reaching 2,008 points by the end of the game. Fellow senior Jensen, who closed the night with 17 points, also passed 2,000 career points (Jensen scored 23 points during her lone season at Iowa). Jensen has 2,011 points in her career and 1,988 as a Bluejay.

Bluejays Close Out Undefeated Season at D.J. Sokol Arena

For just the first time in program history Creighton went undefeated at D.J. Sokol Arena at 11-0 this season. Creighton's lone home loss came to #6 Connecticut at the men's arena, the CHI Health Center. The last time the Bluejays went undefeated at home came during the 2007-2008. Overall the Bluejays have won 18 consecutive games at D.J. Sokol Arena, with the last loss coming on January 3, 2024 against #12 Connecticut. Over the last two seasons Creighton is 23-2 in games at D.J. Sokol Arena.

Maly Sets Bluejays' Three-Point Record

With two treys against Providence on Saturday, February 2 Morgan Maly passed Bluejay great Kathy Halligan (1988-92) at 309 three-point field goals made. She enters the game against Seton Hall with 330 treys.

Maly lead NCAA With At Least One Made Three-Pointer in 52 consecutive games

Senior Morgan Maly has a streak of 52 games with at least one three pointer, dating back to Dec. 30, 2023 when she went 0-for-5 against St. John's. In her 147 games Morgan has hit at least one three-ball in 139 games.

Maly's streak of 52 games is the active high in the NCAA and the 14th highest in NCAA history (per Elias Research). The record holder is Caitlin Clark with 96 consecutive games. Morgan passed former men's basketball player Baylor Scheierman's record of 48 games.



Mogensen Tops 1,000, Becomes Third Bluejay with at Least 1,000 Points, 500 Rebounds and 400 assists

With 11 points in Creighton's 83-74 win at DePaul on Feb. 23, senior Molly Mogensen became the 34th player in Creighton history with at least 1,000 points. She also became just the third player in school history with at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists. She joined 2014 BIG EAST Player of the Year Marissa Janning (2012-17) and Sydney Lamberty (2014-18). Janning closed her career with 1,934 points, 618 rebounds and 507 assists. Sydney finished her career with 1,286 points, 653 rebounds and 497 assists.

Road Warriors

Since dropping the first two road games of the season, Creighton rattled off 11 straight road victories before falling at #5 Connecticut on Feb. 27. It isn't just the 2024-25 season either. Since the start of the 2022-23 season Creighton is tied for the most road wins in the NCAA.

Bluejays have 52 Wins Over the Last Two Years

During the last two seasons the Bluejays have an impressive record of 52-12. Of the 12 losses, nine have come to ranked opponents. Creighton has fallen five times to Connecticut, twice to UCLA, and once to Georgetown, Green Bay, #10 Kansas State, #19 Marquette and South Dakota State.

Flan Earns 450th Win

Head coach Jim Flanery earned his 450th win at DePaul on Feb. 23. Over the last four seasons Flanery has a 95-29 record and is 451-272 in his 23 seasons at the helm.

Flanery's resume stacks up with some of the best in the NCAA. The victory over St. John's on December 28 pushed Flanery's win total past the combined win total of all other WBB head coaches in Creighton history.

Bluejays 16-2 Mark Matches Best Since Joining BIG EAST

The win over Villanova (70-55) on March 2 closed out the regular season and gave Creighton a 16-2 mark in conference play. The only other time the Bluejays delivered a 16-2 BIG EAST record was when Creighton shared the regular season title with DePaul in 2016-17.

Creighton also went 16-2 to win the MVC in 2001-02 season. Twice in Bluejay history, the Bluejays lost just once in conference play, going 13-1 in 1991-92 to win the WAC and 11-1 during the 1990-91 season to win the WAC.

The Bluejays started BIG EAST play with a new record for the best start in conference play in program history at 8-0. The Bluejays opened conference play 7-0 during 2021-22, a season that ended in a run to the Elite Eight.

If you consider the three BIG EAST wins to close out the 2023-24 season, Creighton is one away from a program mark for consecutive conference wins. The Bluejays won their final 11 WAC games during the 1991-92 season and their first MVC contest in 1992-93 for 12 consecutive conference wins. Creighton also won 11 straight MVC games stretched from the final two games in 1992-93 and the first nine in 1993-94. And 11 consecutive BIG EAST games with the final eight during the 2016-17 season as well as the first three in 2017-18.



Flanery Notches One More Team

During his 23 seasons leading the Bluejays, Flanery has defeated 81 unique opponents, expanding his list to include Tulsa and Green Bay this season. Flanery has defeated Wichita State and Northern Iowa 24 times, the most victories against another team.

Creighton's Three-Point Streak Keeps Going Strong

The Bluejays have hit at least one three-pointer in 548 consecutive games. During Flanery's 727 games at the helm, just once were the Bluejays held without a three-pointer. Creighton went 0-for-6 from beyond the arc against Southern Illinois on Feb. 14, 2008.

Flanery Celebrates Birthday, His 13th 20-Win Season

Turning 60 years old on February 8, Creighton head coach Jim Flanery clinched his 13th career 20-win season. Flan already had more 20-win seasons than all other Creighton WBB coaches combined, more than doubling Bruce Rasmussen's five.

Senior Morgan Maly posted her fourth double-double of the season with 23 points and 10 rebounds in the Bluejays' 70-55 win over Villanova on March 2. It was Maly's 11th career double-double and second of the season against Villanova.

Late Rally Propels Bluejays Over Red Storm

Trailing St. John's for most of the game, #23 Creighton delivered a knockout blow in the fourth quarter to continue its winning ways. The Bluejays outscored St. John's 19-11 in the final frame, taking the lead midway through the period for the first times since the opening minute of the second quarter.

Heathcock Dishes the Rock In Limited Time

Despite playing just five minutes, freshman Allison Heathcock made the most of her time against St. John's by dishing out a career-high three assists. Heathcock entered the game with four career helpers, but earned an assist on three of four possessions to keep the Bluejays in striking distance.

Bluejay Ties Lead to Longevity and Prosperity

Creighton is one of three schools, along with Boise State and St. Bonaventure) that currently has a WBB and MBB coach in their 15th year or longer and have won 339+ games at their current school.

Jim Flanery is in his 23rd Season and has 452 wins at Creighton Greg McDermott is in his 15th Season with 340 wins at Creighton

But Northern Iowa will join this list soon as MBB coach Ben Jacobsen is over 340 and women's coach Tanya Warren is at 336 wins. Jacobsen played for and later replaced McDermott, while Warren played at Creighton and was a Creighton assistant to Flanery.

Maly and Mogensen Top 100th Win as a Bluejay

Already the record holder for games played at Creighton with 149, Morgan Maly has collected 107 wins for the Bluejays. That number is the Creighton record for victories, with Molly Mogensen in second place at 103 wins.

Maly Claims Second BIG EAST Player of the Week Honor

Bluejay senior Morgan Maly claimed her second BIG EAST Player of the Week honor of the season, announced on Monday, February 10. She also collected the award on January 13. Maly guided Creighton to a 2-0 record last week with consecutive double-doubles in victories over Seton Hall (72-56 on February 5) and at Villanova (70-57 on February 8). Morgan delivered 16 points, 10 rebounds and four assists in the win over the Pirates, while posted 23 points and 10 rebounds against the Wildcats. For the week Maly averaged 19.5 ppg, 10.0 rpg and 2.5 apg during the week, notching her second and third double-doubles of the season. During her career it was Morgan's ninth and 10th double-double. She closed the two-game stretch shooting 15-of-33 (45.5%), including 4-of-12 (33.3%) from long range.

Bluejay senior Molly Mogensen has been on a tear for some time, but her performance this week earned the Minnesota native her first BIG EAST Player of the Week honor on Monday, February 3.

During Creighton's wins at Georgetown (84-70 on January 29) and over Providence (79-66 on February 2), Mogensen led the team in scoring, rebounding and assists averaging 19.5 ppg, 7.5 rpg and 6.0 apg. She closed the two-game stretch shooting 16-of-22 (72.7%) from the field and 5-7 (71.4%) from beyond the arc. Against the Hoyas she delivered 22 points, seven rebounds and seven assists, including 14 second half points. On Sunday versus the Friars she closed the game with 17 points, eight rebounds and five assists.

Creighton dished out 20 assists in the Bluejays' 73-44 win over Seton Hall in the BIG EAST Semifinals on March 9. It was the 29th consecutive time the Bluejays have come away with a victory when boasting 20 or more assists in a game. The last time the Bluejays fell short when dishing 20 assists in a game was on January 4, 2023 against Providence.

Bluejays Move to 95-6 in Games Shooting 50% or Higher

Creighton has topped the 50 percent mark in eight games this season (vs. Wichita State, vs. Syracuse, at Xavier, at Northern Iowa, at St. John's, vs. DePaul, at Georgetown and vs. Seton Hall (BET-2)). The eight wins moved the Bluejays to 95-6 in games under head coach Jim Flanery when Creighton shot 50.0 percent from the field. The last time the Bluejays dropped a game over 50% was to South Dakota on December 16, 2021, a string of 31 consecutive games.

In 19 games this season at least one Bluejay has scored 20 points or more, with Creighton going 18-1 in those contests. Six times a pair of Bluejays have hit the mark, helping Creighton to a 6-0 mark. Women's College All-Star Game Watch List

Creighton's Lauren Jensen and Morgan Maly were named to the Women's College All-Star Game Midseason Watch List on Tuesday, February 4. The 2025 Women's College All-Star Game, presented by Herbalife, will feature the top senior standouts who are on the precipice of hearing their names called in the WNBA Draft.

A total of 51 schools from 15 different conferences are represented on the Watch List, but Creighton is one of just 13 schools with at least two players on the list. The BIG EAST saw six players representing four schools on Midseason Watch List. The Women's College All-Star Game will provide the country's brightest college stars one final opportunity to represent their programs and be recognized against the backdrop of the sport's championship weekend.

Mogensen Approached Rare Air with Near Triple-Double

Battling Seton Hall on January 11, senior Molly Mogensen's performance could have been overlooked due to Morgan Maly's late game heroics. Mogensen, however, had arguably the best game of her season if not her career with 18 points, eight rebounds and six assists. She went 8-for-14 from the field (.571) and also grabbed one steal.



Maly Drops 28 on Golden Eagles in Nearly Flawless Effort

Senior Morgan Maly went 10-for-11 from the field, including 8-for-9 from beyond the arc to power Creighton to a 71-68 win over Marquette on Jan. 8. Along the way she set a career-high for made three-pointers in a single-game and moved into a tie for third in program history for one contest. The last time a Bluejay connected on eight treys was Jaylyn Agnew when she scored a program record 43 points against Georgetown on March 1, 2020.

Maly Earns BIG EAST Player of the Week

After leading Creighton women's basketball to a 2-0 week with a combined 51 points, senior Morgan Maly collected the BIG EAST Player of the Week on Monday, January 13.

Maly guided Creighton to a 71-68 win over Marquette on January 8 with a dominant 28 points on 10-of-11 from the field. She connected on 8-of-9 from long range against the Golden Eagles. Three days later in New Jersey the script was largely the same as Maly delivered 23 points in the Bluejays' 72-64 road win at Seton Hall. Against the Pirates Maly shined in the biggest moment. Creighton led 64-62 with 2:29 remaining in the game, but Maly refused to allow her squad to fall. She connected on consecutive three pointers and closed the game with a pair from the charity stripe to ensure the Bluejays' win.

For the week Maly went 18-for-27 (.667) from the field, 12-for-17 (.706) from beyond the arc and led the Bluejays with 13 rebounds. This is Morgan's first BIG EAST Player of the Week nod, despite being a two-time BIG EAST First Team selection as well as the 2022 BIG EAST Sixth Woman of the Year.

Bluejays Set A Classroom Record with 3.81 Team GPA in Fall 2024

Creighton is not only delivering another impressive season on the court, the Bluejays are getting things done in the classroom as well. During the Fall 2024 Semester, the Creighton Women's Basketball team posted its best GPA in History at 3.81.

Creighton Put Friars on LOCKDOWN in Third Quarter

Trailing 26-23 at halftime in Providence, Creighton turned the game around in a hurry as the Bluejays outscored Providence 23-2 in the frame. Creighton held the Friars to just 1-of-14 from the field (7.1%) during the third.

Flanery Trusting His Squad to Handle Business

Four times this season travel has forced the Bluejays to not be able to shoot at a visiting arena before warming up. The first example came at Xavier as Creighton played in an 11 am contest (Kids Day), the same thing happened at Green Bay and at St. John's, then again at Providence. The Bluejays are 4-0 in those games.

Early Work By Maly Leads to Double-Double

Senior Morgan Maly was dominant in the first half of Creighton's 68-64 win over Butler on January 1. Maly torched Butler for 15 points and seven rebounds in the first half, finishing the game with 17 points and 10 rebounds for her eighth career double-double.

Highs and Lows of Quarter Life

Women's basketball moved to a four-quarter game prior to the 2015-16 season. Since the start of that season the Bluejays have scored at least 30 points in a frame in 11 contests, while holding the opposition to four points or less eight times.

After Creighton pushed its lead out to 19 at 34-15 in the second quarter the Bluejays held a 39-34 edge with 4:52 left in the third quarter. Townsend and Horan stopped the Bulldogs' charge with five consecutive points on a trey by Townsend, followed by a Horan steal and layup to put Creight back up by double digits.

Townsend Looks Forward to the Storm

Junior Kennedy Townsend has faced the St. John's Red Storm five times in her career. In those contests topped double figures twice and delivered nine points the first game against St. John's. In her career she has five games in double figures, twice coming against the Red Storm.



Lockett and Townsend Shine Against the Bruins

Junior Kiani Lockett and Kennedy Townsend were a pair of bright spots against #1 UCLA on December 20. Senior Lauren Jensen delivered 17 points and 10 assists for her second career double-double to help Creighton defeat Northern Iowa 75-71 on December 7. Her 10 assists marked the first time since February 18, 2022 that a Bluejay dished out double-digit assists in a single game. In that game Tatum Rembao delivered 10 assists in a 107-59 win at St. John's.

Mogensen and Heathcock Shine at Green Bay

Senior Molly Mogensen scored 18 points in the first half, shooting 8-of-11 from the field to build a 37-22 lead at the break. Mogensen went on to grab a team-high seven rebounds in the 74-52 win at Green Bay. Freshman Allison Heathcock also delivered a career-best eight points, knocking down a pair of treys.

Bluejays Post Victory Despite 20 Turnover Game

While dishing out 22 assists in their win at Northern Iowa (75-71), Creighton also committed 20 turnovers. It marked the first time since March 19, 2021 the Bluejays had 20 turnovers or more. In that game Creighton defeated Bowling Green in the opening round of the WNIT, 72-65.

Five Bluejays Reach Double Figures in Win Over Wichita State

The quintet of Maly (15), Molly Mogensen (15), Lauren Jensen (13), Kiani Lockett (10) and Brooke Littrell (10) reached double figures in Creighton's 91-63 win over Wichita State on November 26. The last time the Bluejays had five in double figures came in a win over Xavier on February 27, 2024.

Lauren Jensen Named USBWA National Team of the Week and BIG EAST Player of the Week

For the week of Monday, November 18 through Sunday, Nov. 24, the five Ann Meyers Drysdale national women's honorees of the week are **Creighton guard Lauren Jensen**, Notre Dame guard Hannah Hidalgo, Northern Iowa guard Maya McDermott, Virginia Tech forward Rose Micheaux, and Connecticut guard Sarah Strong.

This marks the first National Player of the Week honor in Creighton women's basketball history. Jensen, helped the Bluejays (2-2), a preseason pick for second in the BIG EAST, upset then-No. 21 Nebraska (5-1) at home in Omaha, scoring 31 points – her second 30-point game of the season. On Monday she was named BIG EAST Player of the Week.

Lauren scored 19 of her 31 in the second half, including six straight from the free throw line to secure the win in the final 90 seconds. Playing all 40 minutes, the Minnesota native was 10-for-19 from the field, hitting 4-of-9 from beyond the arc. She also dished out three assists and tied a career-high with two blocks. Lauren leads Creighton with 95 points over four games (23.8 ppg), topping 30 points in each of the Bluejays two home contests.

The difference in Creighton's win over #21 Nebraska and one pivotal factor for the Bluejays' success this season will be the play of seniors Mallory Brake and Molly Mogensen. Against the Huskers the tandem of Brake and Mogensen combined for 23 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists and four steals.

Takeoff History

The Bluejays are 22-29 in season openers after falling at South Dakota State. Creighton is 13-37 in road opening contests. Under head coach Jim Flanery Creighton is 10-13 in the first game of the season. In the first home game of the season the Bluejays improved to 17-6 under Flanery and 36-15 overall.

Jensen Coming Out Strong

Lauren Jensen opened each of the last three seasons with strong performance. She dropped 30 on #23 South Dakota State in 2022-23, then delivered 23 points in each of the last two seasons. She was 10-for-20 against the Jackrabbits in 2022-23. Against North Dakota State last year, Jensen went 10-for-15. Then this season versus SDSU she was 9-for-21.

Maly Prefers Second Game

While Jensen has feasted in the opener, Morgan Maly enjoys the second game.

Maly notched two of her seven career double-doubles in the second game of 2022-23 and again in the second game of 2023-24.

This season against Drake, Maly dropped 20 points on the Bulldogs.

Last season she delivered 30 points and 10 rebounds, while two years ago she closed the 74-51 win on Nov. 10 over South Dakota with 21 points and 10 rebounds.

Jensen Named to Naismith Watch List

Creighton senior Lauren Jensen 2024-25 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Women's College Player of the Year Preseason Watch List presented by AXIA Time, announced on Monday, Oct. 28 by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the women's basketball coaches association.

Jensen led the team with a 17.4 scoring average (558 points), to go with 98 assists and 27 steals. She earned All-BIG EAST First Team honors following each of the last two season and has surpassed the 1,000 career point mark at Creighton in less than three years. Last season she played a team-high 1,114 minutes, going 208-of-469 (44.3%) from the field with a team best 74 three-pointers (74-of-202). She also led the team in free-throw percentage at 90.7, hitting 68-of-75.

Jensen is the first Bluejay to be recognized with a spot on the Naismith Trophy Women's College Player of the Year Preseason Watch List. Joining Jensen from the BIG EAST Conference on the Watch List are Paige Bueckers and Azzi Fudd of Connecticut.

Senior Morgan Maly earned a spot on the 2025 Katrina McClain Award Watch List, designed to honor the top power forward in NCAA Division I women's college basketball.

Announced on Thursday, Oct. 31 by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the women's basketball coaches association, the Katrina McClain Watch List was named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its eighth year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. 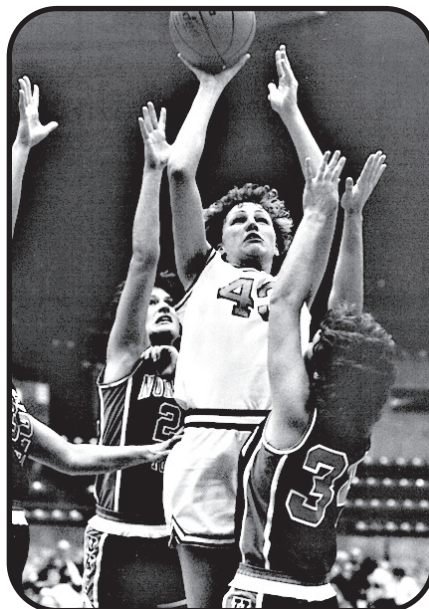

Women's Basketball Inks
Nationally Recognized Recruiting Class

In the midst of a program best three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament, Creighton Women's Basketball Head Coach Jim Flanery and the Bluejay staff have reloaded with one of the top recruiting classes for the 2025-26 season. Creighton officially announced the signing of Avery Cooper (Sterling, Ill.), Neleigh Gessert (Omaha, Neb.), Norah Gessert (Omaha, Neb.), Kendall McGee (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) and Ava Zediker (Des Moines, Iowa). The five additions were recognized by ESPNW as a Top-13 early recruiting class.

"We were looking for a talented class to be foundational for the program moving forward," said Flanery. "The five players that have chosen to come to Creighton are competitive and have already gotten to know each other. We love their versatility and this group has the ability to be our best yet."

Overall this class of 2025-26 marks the first time Creighton has brought in three players (Neleigh Gessert, Norah Gessert and Ava Zediker) ranked in the ESPNW Top-100, surpassing 2015 when the Bluejays brought in Audrey Faber (No. 72) and Jaylyn Agnew (No. 100). Zediker is the top rated recruit to become a Bluejay at No. 69.

"Our staff does a tremendous job building relationships at all levels, be it the student-athletes, families as well as high school and club coaches," added Flanery. "Our recent success as well as the resources we have including our facilities help open doors, but our staff deserves the bulk of the credit."

Ranked as the No. 2 power forward in Illinois by Prep Girls Hoops, Cooper will join Creighton from Lake Zurich HS. Standing 6'2", Cooper averages just under 10 points per game (9.8 ppg) as well as 7.5 rebounds per contest. She is a four-year starter, a two-time All-State selection by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association, a two-time All-Area pick by the Daily Herald and earned All-Area First Team from the Chicago Tribune. An all-around athlete, Cooper is also the Illinois Class 3A top hurdler in 100 and 300 meters.

"I chose Creighton because of their successful basketball program and awesome coaching staff!," said Cooper. "Also, the high academics is a perfect opportunity for me to succeed off the court!"

Neleigh Gessert is a 6'1" wing from Millard West HS. One of three Bluejay recruits ranked in the ESPNW Top-100, Neleigh is slated as No. 82. More than impressive she is averaging 18.6 ppg, 6.1 rpg and 2.4 assists per game. Gessert and her twin sister (Norah) helped lead Millard West to its first State Championship last season with a 27-1 record. The duo also helped their AAU team (ETG) claim a National Championship on the adidas 3SSB circuit. Neleigh was named the Millard West Female Athlete of the Year in 2024, earning All-Nebraska recognition from the Omaha World-Herald and Super State First Team from the Lincoln Journal Star. She surpassed 1,000 career points during the 2023-24 season and set the Millard West record with 54 blocks as a sophomore.

Neleigh said she chose Creighton because she felt a close personal connection to the staff, loved the world class facilities and it allowed her to remain close to home.

Equally talented twin Norah Gessert is also coming to Creighton from Millard West. Ranked No. 91 in the ESPNW Top-100, Norah was another critical member of the Millard West State Championship team last season as well as the National Championship earned by ETG. Norah averaged nearly 11 points (10.7 ppg), five rebounds (5.3 rpg), two steals (2.0 spg) and better than four assists (4.4 apg) per contest in 2023-24. An All-Nebraska First Team selection by the Omaha World-Herald, Norah is the No. 2 ranked player in Nebraska by Prep Girls Hoops.

"I fell in love with Creighton from the very beginning, the first step on campus I knew it would be home," said Norah Gessert. "Ever since I was a kid, Creighton has been nothing less than a dream school for me, and I can't wait to be a Bluejay!"

Standing 5'10" from Benilde St. Margaret's HS, McGee continues a long line of recruits to join the Bluejays from Minnesota. She is the No. 3 prospect from the 10,000 Lakes (Prep Girls Hoops), where she averaged 20.0 ppg, 5.7 rpg, 2.9 apg and 2.6 steals per game as a sophomore. McGee surpassed the 1,000-point mark during the 2022-23 season, earning 3A All-State Honors. Off the court McGee is a National Honor Society Member and has a 4.04 GPA.

"I choose Creighton because I instantly felt welcomed and at home by the staff and future teammates," said McGee. "In addition, Creighton is a school that is going to help me achieve big things on the court and in the classroom as well."

The top ranked prospect to commit to Creighton, Zediker joins the Bluejays from Dowling Catholic HS in Des Moines, Iowa. Ranked No. 69 in the ESPNW Top-100, Zediker surpasses another Bluejay that came from Dowling Catholic, Audrey Faber, who was ranked No. 72 in 2015 when she committed to Creighton. Selected to compete in the 2022 WNBA All-Star Challenge, Zediker was the 5A Player of the Year in 2023-24. A three-time All-State selection, Zediker also is a three-time Central Iowa Metro League selection and has guided her team to three consecutive state tournament. The 5'11" point guard is averaging 19 points, five rebounds and four assists per game with a shooting percentage better than 40.0% from long range.

When asked why she chose Creighton, Zediker said "Creighton women's basketball is one of the top programs in the country. Along with strong academics, culture, a great coaching staff, style of play, and staying close to home, Creighton checked off all my boxes. I cannot wait to be a Bluejay!!"

Jim Flanery begins his 23rd year as Creighton's head coach in 2024-25 after taking the Bluejays to their third consecutive, and seventh overall, NCAA Tournament last season. Flanery is Creighton's all-time victory leader, entering the season with a record of 427-268 (.614).

Flanery has guided Creighton to seven of the 10 NCAA Tournament appearances in women's basketball history, reaching the Big Dance in 2012, 2013, 2017, 2018, 2022, 2023 and again in 2024. The 2021-22 campaign was historic for the Bluejays as Creighton reached the Elite Eight with victories over Colorado, at No. 8 Iowa and over No. 10 Iowa State. Creighton also reached the NCAA Second Round in 2013, 2017, 2018 and 2024 as well as claiming the program's first BIG EAST regular-season title in 2017.

Under Flanery, the Bluejays have reached 20 wins or more 12 times and have been to the postseason 18 times, including a stretch of 11 consecutive years from 2008-2018. Flanery also led Creighton to a pair of appearances in the WNIT Final Four (2003 & 2004), capturing the 2004 WNIT Championship. Flanery has four conference titles, capturing the BIG EAST regular-season crown in 2017, Missouri Valley Conference regular-season championships in 2003 and 2013, and the 2012 MVC Tournament Championship.

Prior to Flanery's tenure, Creighton teams made 200 three-pointers in a single season twice. Including 2023-24, the Bluejays have eclipsed 200 treys in a season during 18 of his 22 campaigns at the helm, including a single-season record with 334 trifectas in 2021-22.

Flanery's scheduling philosophy has always been to improve, you must face tough opposition. During Flanery's 22 seasons, Creighton has played 59 ranked opponents, including five during the 2023-24 season. The dividends of his approach was never more apparent than during the Bluejays' NCAA Tournament run in 2021-22. Creighton went into Carver-Hawkeye Arena as the No. 10 seed, upsetting Colorado and taking down No. 8 Iowa in front of over 14,000 fans in black and gold.

Flanery's motion offense is built on forcing defenses to defend for long possessions. One of the driving forces in Creighton's success in 2021-22 was the ability to share the basketball. The Bluejays led the nation in assists (668), assists per game (20.2) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.59). The Bluejays also shot the ball tremendously well, closing the season fifth in three-pointers made (334) and third in three-pointers per game (10.1)

Flanery's engaging personality and exciting coaching style have made the Bluejays increasingly visible in the community. The Bluejays moved into D.J. Sokol Arena inside the Wayne and Eileen Ryan Athletic Center prior to the 2009-10 season and have posted an impressive 145-51 record in the venue.

Under Flanery, the Bluejays have compiled a 218-78 record at home. Fans have responded to the success, setting single-game and average attendance records. The top two home crowds and eight of the top-10 crowds in school history have come during Flanery's reign. Fans set a home attendance record in 2002-03 with 1,861 fans per game.

Garnering athletic and academic notoriety is the standard set during the Flanery era. The Bluejays have been in the WBCA Academic Top-25 eight times, including a No. 4 ranking in 2010-11, a No. 5 ranking in the 2009-10, a No. 9 in 2017-18 and No. 14 in 2018-19. Three players have earned College Sports Communicators Academic All-America honors, highlighted by Morgan Maly claiming the recognition in 2023-24. Overall 18 players earned All-MVC First Team Scholar-Athletes under Flanery. The Bluejays' success on the court was on display during the 2023-24 season as Creighton appeared in the final 16 and 18 of 20 Associated Press polls.

During Flanery's tenure Bluejay players have continued to earn individual accolades including All-American honors (Marissa Janning in 2014 and Jaylyn Agnew in 2020), All-Region (Janning in 2014), a Freshman All-American nod (Janning in 2013), two Preseason All-American honors (Angie Janis in 2005-06 and Christy Neneman in 2003-04), three conference Player of the Year awards (Neneman in 2003, Janning in 2014 and Agnew in 2020), three conference Freshman of the Year honors (Agnew in 2017, Janning in 2013 & Carli Tritz in 2011), a conference Newcomer of the Year (Megan Neuvirth in 2007), three Defensive Player of the Year honors (Laura Spanheimer in 2003 and 2004 as well as Neuvirth in 2009), 24 First Team All-Conference (MVC & BIG EAST) selections and in 2020 Agnew became the first Bluejay selected in the WNBA Draft.

In addition, Spanheimer became the first player in MVC history to be named to the all-defensive team four times. Spanheimer also twice earned WNIT All-Tournament recognition. Neneman was tabbed the 2004 WNIT Most Valuable Player.

Flanery became the Bluejays head coach on July 19, 2002. He is the sixth head coach in women's hoops history at Creighton, and just the third since 1980. He succeeded mentor, Connie Yori, who he had been on staff with since his graduate assistant days at Creighton in the late 1980s.

Following graduation, Flanery joined former McCormick Endowed Director of Athletics Bruce Rasmussen's Bluejay coaching staff as a graduate assistant for the 1987-88 season. He remained on the Creighton women's basketball staff through the 1989-90 season, before joining Yori at Loras College (Iowa) for two seasons prior to the 1990-91 season.

When Yori was tabbed as the head coach at Creighton prior to the 1992-93 season, Flanery once again joined forces to continue the winning tradition set by Rasmussen. As Yori's top assistant, Flanery and the Bluejays notched a 170-115 record in a 10-year span. The Bluejays made two appearances in the NCAA Tournament and earned one trip to the WNIT.

A 1987 Creighton graduate with a BA in philosophy, Flanery was a member of the Bluejay men's basketball team from 1985-87 and was also a member of the Creighton men's golf team. Flanery and his wife Emily have two children, Jackson and Brynn. Flanery is originally from Guthrie Center, Iowa.
