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Season Outlook

After leading Creighton to 28 wins and a return to the Elite Eight in his first season as head coach, **Brian Rosen** is confident his second Bluejay team has the pieces in place to maintain its spot among the nation's top programs.

The Bluejays graduated four seniors, including All-Americans Ava Martin, Kiara Reinhardt and Annalea Maeder, but have reloaded with seven newcomers while also getting back **Ava TeStrake** from injury.

Martin slammed 529 kills in 2025 to cap a brilliant career that saw her earn BIG EAST Player of the Year, BIG EAST Tournament MVP and four First Team All-BIG EAST accolades before being the No. 2 pick in the Major League Volleyball Draft. Her absence on the pin leaves the Jays with a significant hole to fill.

Abbey Hayes has the most experience on the outside among the CU's returners, as the rising sophomore earned a nod on the BIG EAST's All-Freshman Team a year ago playing across from Martin.

Trinity Shadd-Ceres showed a glimpse of her talent in the spring on both the Taraflex® and on the track, as the Wisconsin transfer also earned First Team All-American honors in the Long Jump following CU's spring volleyball season. She played in the Final Four last fall for the Badgers.

The Jays also look for contributions from two freshmen. **Mila Vlahović** arrives after a decorated career in Belgium and Serbia. **Bailey Boeve** was captain of

Iowa's All-State Elite Team but enters the fall recovering from a knee injury suffered in high school.

Jaya Johnson earned All-BIG EAST honors on the right side last season and figures to have an expanded role in 2026. She leads all active Bluejays with 474 career kills.

Fellow right side hitter **Ashlyn Paymal** made great strides in her freshman year and has shown she's more than capable.

TeStrake is a former Top 40 recruit who missed last season with an injury and will compete on both pins this fall.

The Jays will miss Second Team All-American Reinhardt in the middle but are blessed with depth at that spot.

Eloise Brandewie's first year in Omaha saw the Ohio State transfer post 24 starts and rank among the league leaders in blocks per set.

Nora Wurtz pushed Brandewie for court time last year but made her biggest impact as a serving specialist. Wurtz set CU single-season records for aces and aces per set, continually sending opponents out-of-system with her pulverizing serves.

Ayden Ames was a force at the net with CU in the spring, then won a gold medal with USA Volleyball's U21 Team at the Pan American Games. The former Gatorade National Player of the Year as a prep figures to be among the league's best players at any position after starting the past two years at powerhouse Texas.

Freshman **Cambel Drapeau** also hopes to find a spot in the lineup at what might be CU's deepest position.

Three women are in the mix to direct what has traditionally been a potent Bluejay offense. Senior **Ivy Leuck** and freshman **Rayna Christianson** shared that role for Creighton in the spring, but incoming fifth-year **Katie Dalton** was a Second Team All-Big 12 pick at Kansas last fall when she shared setting duties for a Jayhawk team that reached the Sweet 16.

The CU defense boasts two women with extensive libero experience with seniors **Sydney Breissing** and **Saige Damrow**. Incoming freshman **Peyton Carlson** showed no fear in the back row during the spring and provides healthy competition to keep the CU defense among the nation's best.

Brian Rosen enters his second year as Creighton head coach, and fifth overall in the Bluejay program.

Rosen led Creighton to a 28-6 record in his first season as head coach of the Bluejays,

leading CU to the Elite Eight, and setting a BIG EAST record for victories by a head coach in his/her first season in the league.

Rosen became the second coach in the history of Creighton Athletics to win his first three NCAA Tournament games/matches, joining former men's soccer coach Elmar Bolowich. He also joined Bolowich across all CU sports as the only head rookie coaches to make it to the Sweet 16 (or beyond) in an NCAA Tournament with 32 teams or more.

Additionally, Rosen became the BIG EAST's first volleyball head coach to go unbeaten in league play in their first season as head coach at a school since Pitt's Cindy Alvear in 1993. He became the first volleyball head coach to win a BIG EAST regular-season title in their first season as head coach at a school since Louisville's Anne Kordes in 2011.

Rosen was the first volleyball head coach to win 20+ matches in their first year as a head coach at a BIG EAST school since Ryan Theis at Marquette in 2014 and the first male head coach to win a BIG EAST Tournament title since Marquette's Bond Shymansky in 2013.

Lastly, Rosen became the first volleyball head coach to win a BIG EAST Tournament title in their first season as head coach at a school since Georgetown's Li Liu in 1999.

Before being named Creighton head coach on April 6, 2025, Rosen spent three seasons as an assistant coach at CU from 2022-24, and was named 2024 AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year. He served as assistant coach in 2022 and 2023 before being promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2024 campaign.

During his tenure he has been the program's recruiting coordinator, worked closely with middle blockers, organized daily practices and assisted in the scouting of upcoming opponents.

Creighton is a combined 116-19 in four seasons with Rosen on the bench, picking up 13 Top 25 wins and sweeping the BIG EAST regular-season and tournament titles each year. The 116 victories trails only Nebraska and Pittsburgh in that time, and the .859 winning percentage ranks fourth-best nationally behind only Nebraska, Pittsburgh and Texas.

The Bluejays have reached the Sweet 16 each of the past three seasons, including back-to-back Elite Eight appearances in 2024 and 2025.

Creighton is 60-3 inside D.J. Sokol Arena since Rosen's arrival, in addition to being 75-3 at all sites against BIG EAST competition. The BIG EAST recognized Creighton with Coaching Staff of the Year honors in both 2023 and 2024.

Before coming to Creighton, Rosen served as the head coach at Division II Nova Southeastern in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., where he compiled a 45-17 overall record. He led the Sharks to a 20-11 record in 2019, including a six-match win streak to end the year and clinch NSU's first 20-win campaign since 2008.

After the 2020 campaign was cancelled prematurely due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Rosen's 2021 squad won its first 13 matches and finished 25-6 while reaching the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2009. NSU set program records for consecutive wins (19), home wins (16), Sunshine State Conference wins (16) and SSC winning percentage (.828). The Sharks were also one of two teams to defeat eventual national champion, Tampa.

All three of his Nova Southeastern squads won AVCA Team Academic Awards, and his student-athletes combined to win five All-America, five All-Region and four All-SSC awards.

Rosen took over the NSU program after spending two years at Davidson College as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator. In addition to coaching for the Wildcats, Rosen also served as the Carolina Juniors Club Director and National Team coach from 2009-18.

Immediately before joining the Wildcats, Rosen served as the head coach at Providence (N.C.) High School, producing an undefeated regular-season to win conference and tournament titles, garnering 2016 Conference and *South Charlotte Weekly* Coach of the Year honors.



Rosen also spent seven years (2009-16) as the girl's head volleyball coach at Charlotte Country Day School. During his tenure, he coached the program to an overall record of 169-66, earning two state championship and conference titles in 2013 and 2014. After those two stellar seasons, he was named the *Charlotte Observer* Coach of the Year. In 2012 and 2013, he was named the *South Charlotte News & South Charlotte Weekly* Coach of the Year.

Rosen has been recognized in 2023 by *Volleyball Magazine* as a "College Coaching Hotshot" in addition to being honored with the AVCA Thirty Under 30 award in 2013, when he was one of just two high school coaches mentioned.

Rosen earned his bachelor's degree in Sport and Entertainment Management, graduating cum laude from the University of South Carolina in 2008, and picked up his Master's in Leadership from Nova Southeastern in 2024.

He lives in Omaha with his wife Angelica, and daughters Bryce (13) and Brady (5).

Angie Oxley Behrens returns for her 24th season at Creighton, and third as associate head coach. Behrens is the longest-tenured assistant coach in Creighton's Volleyball history and a key factor in the program's run of 12 consecutive regular-season BIG EAST titles and 14 straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.

In 2019, Behrens was recognized as AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year and was also part of the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year after helping the Bluejays to a sixth straight league title.

Behrens works closely with CU's outside hitters while assisting with scouting and recruiting. Behrens also helps to organize Creighton's volleyball camps.

The Bluejays enter 2026 having been ranked for 141 of the past 147 Top 25 weekly polls, and have been ranked at some point during each of the past 14 seasons. The last 23 years have seen the Creighton team compile its top 18 single-season kill totals all-time, as well as the top 13 individual single-season marks.

Behrens has trained 12 outside hitters to a combined 30 all-conference honors. That group includes 2024 Olympian Taryn Kloth, 2018 BIG EAST Player of the Year and four-time All-American Jaali Winters, 2022 BIG EAST Player of the Year Norah Sis and 2025 BIG EAST Player of the Year Ava Martin. All have spent time with USA Volleyball since becoming Bluejays and are still playing professionally.

Behrens has helped Creighton go 530-198 in her 23 seasons on the bench, including NCAA Tournament wins in 2010, 2012, 2013, 2015 (2), 2016 (3), 2017, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2023 (2), 2024 (3) and 2025 (3). CU's 372 victories since the start of the 2012 rank fourth-most in the nation.

A four-year starter at Nebraska, Behrens won three Big 12 titles, was named 1997 Big 12 Freshman of the Year and was chosen as the University's female student-athlete of the year in 2001 after leading the Cornhuskers to a 34-0 mark and a national title in the fall of 2000 as a senior. She closed her career as NU's all-time digs leader with 1,086.

In the classroom, Behrens was a Chancellor's Scholar and four-time Highest Honors Distinction Medal honoree. She also was a four-year academic All-Big 12 selection, a recipient of an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship and one of 10 finalists for the 2001 NCAA Woman of the Year. She was also a member of the Mortar Board Honor Society, Pi Lambda Theta Honor Society, Golden Key, 2000 Homecoming Royalty Court and the Dean's List.

Behrens and her husband Matt reside in Lincoln with their kids, Logan (16) and Hattie (13).

Izzy Ashburn enters her second season at Creighton in 2026 after helping the Bluejays reach the Elite Eight during her initial year in the program.

Ashburn's first campaign on The Hilltop saw her train and develop Annalea Maeder into one of the nation's best setters. Maeder, an Honorable Mention All-Pac 12 performer at California in 2023 before missing most of 2024 due to injury, transferred to Creighton and made an immediate impact. She was named Third Team All-American, BIG EAST Setter of the Year, All-BIG EAST and landed seven BIG EAST Setter of the Week

accolades in 2025.

Creighton went 28-6 in 2025, as the Jays were 14th nationally in hitting percentage (.288), 16th in kills per set (14.01) and 27th in assists per set (12.98).

Ashburn came to Creighton after serving as an assistant coach with the Indy Ignite in the Pro Volleyball Federation in 2025. Indy led the PVF in kill percentage (.367) and assists per set (13.25), and she helped coach setter Sydney Hilley to single-season league-records with 1,277 assists and 11.30 assists per set. Hilley was recognized as Setter of the Year following the campaign.

Ashburn was an assistant coach for Indy during its debut season in the PVF in the spring of 2025, helping the Ignite reach the championship match. Indy earned the No. 4 seed after posting 13 regular-season wins, where it then knocked off the top-seeded and defending champion Omaha Supernovas.

A setter for the University of Wisconsin from 2019-23, Ashburn owns Badger career records for aces (187), matches played (151) and sets played (527). She was a two-time co-captain and led the Badgers in assists each of her final two seasons. Ashburn notched 19 career double-doubles, including a team-leading 13 as a fifth-year senior.

Wisconsin thrived during her time, going a combined 132-19 and winning four Big Ten titles. The Badgers reached the Final Four in 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2023, earning the program's first national title in 2021 with a 3-2 win over Nebraska that saw Ashburn serve a match-leading four aces.

Following her collegiate career, Ashburn played one season overseas in Poland for Energa MKS Kalisz.

The Dayton, Minn., native was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten choice. She graduated in May of 2022 with a degree in Mathematics before continuing her education in grad school and studying Business Analytics.

Adam Kessenich is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Creighton. He coaches the defensive specialists, coordinates CU's serving and helps with scouting, recruiting and camps. Kessenich also helps handle operations duties such as team meals and travel.

Creighton has swept BIG EAST regular-season and tournament titles in all three years with Kessenich, going a combined 89-14. After a Sweet 16 trip in his first season on staff, the Bluejays have been to the Elite Eight each of the last two seasons.

Kessenich has helped CU shatter school records for aces each of the past two seasons, as the Jays ranked third nationally with 251 aces in 2025. Middle blocker Nora Wurtz was fifth in the nation with 0.60 aces per set in 2025. Creighton's 653 aces since his arrival rank fifth nationally and lead all power conference schools.

Before moving to Omaha, Kessenich spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Northeastern, where he was involved in player development, match scouting and recruiting for the Huskies. NU reached the CAA Tournament final during the 2020 season.

Prior to his time at Northeastern, Kessenich spent the 2018 and 2019 seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Minnesota. The Gophers went 54-10 during those two seasons, winning the Big Ten title in 2018 and reaching the Final Four in 2019.

Kessenich previously served as head coach of the Milwaukee Sting Volleyball Club Boys 17 Gold team in 2017 and was an assistant with the Boy's 16 Gold team in 2016. During that span, Kessenich also coached at Shorewood High School, where he was the girl's varsity assistant coach in 2017 and the boy's junior varsity assistant coach in 2016.

He was a four-time letterwinner as a standout player for St. Ambrose University in Davenport, Iowa. A three-year captain, Kessenich was named the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2015 and 2016 and ended his career as the University's all-time leader with 1,238 career digs.

Kessenich graduated from St. Ambrose in 2016 and received bachelor of science degrees in both mechanical and industrial engineering.

He married Stephanie Maresh in 2025.

Creighton Volleyball Timeline

Sept. 2, 1994: In the program's first match since 1980, the Bluejays recorded a 3-0 win against UT-Chattanooga at the Tulane Invitational in New Orleans. Set scores were 18-16, 15-8, 15-3. Creighton ended its first season back with an overall record of 5-20 and tied for ninth in the Missouri Valley Conference at 3-17.

Sept. 10, 1994: Melissa Weisensee has the first triple-double in the history of the program with 40 assists, 19 digs and 10 kills during a four-set loss to Illinois State.

Nov. 2, 1996: Michelle Prorock records a school-record 32 kills in a four-set win over Evansville.

Nov. 10, 1996: JoDe Cieloha finishes with 22 kills, 15 digs and 12 total blocks (two solo) in a five-set match at Western Illinois for her second career triple-double performance.

Nov. 9, 1997: Melissa Weisensee registers her second career triple-double, and the fourth in Creighton annals, as she finishes with 65 assists, 22 digs and 12 kills in a five-set loss at Evansville.

Nov. 20, 1997: After its third-place finish in the MVC's regular season standings, first-year head coach Howard Wallace leads Creighton to its first appearance at the MVC Tournament. The Bluejays prove they belong, topping Indiana State in three sets.

Oct. 16, 1998: Kailey Reyes joins Creighton's triple-double club with her first of four career triple-doubles. The first four triple-doubles had come during Bluejay losses. Reyes ended the night with 62 assists, 21 digs and 10 kills in the five-set win vs. Indiana State.

Nov. 16, 1999: Melissa Walsh is named to the Missouri Valley Conference's First Team, becoming the first Creighton volleyball player to have earned the honor.

Sept. 2, 2000: The Bluejays finish a perfect season-opening weekend by defeating Iowa State, Idaho and UNCG to win the Iowa State Heritage Classic. It marks the first time in program history that the Bluejays win a tournament. Melissa Walsh was named the tournament's MVP and was joined on the all-tourney team by Kailey Reyes.

Nov. 24, 2000: Melissa Walsh and Kailey Reyes become the first Bluejay duo to earn First Team All-MVC accolades in the same year.

Oct. 6, 2001: Melissa Walsh becomes CU's all-time leader when she pounds her 1,376th career kill vs. Southern Illinois and leads the Bluejays to a 6-1 MVC start.

Oct. 12, 2001: Molly Moran breaks Melissa Weisensee's school record when she records her 126th career service ace in a win over Bradley. CU opens MVC play 7-1.

Nov. 10, 2001: Kailey Reyes sets Creighton's all-time assists record when she records her 4,019th career assist at Bradley.

Nov. 16, 2001: Kailey Reyes sets her second school record in a week when she sets the career digs mark with 1,224.

(Feb. 3, 2003: Kirsten Bernthal Booth is hired to become the third coach in modern Creighton volleyball history. Booth replaces Howard Wallace, who resigned after six seasons on Dec. 10, 2002.

Sept. 19, 2003: Creighton moves into the Omaha Civic Auditorium to play its first season of matches there. A then-record crowd of 806 fans sees Creighton open MVC play with a five-set victory over Southern Illinois.

Nov. 15, 2003: Leah Ratzlaff's first kill of set two is her 436th of the season, passing Melissa Walsh for most in a single season in school history.

Sept. 4, 2004: Freshman Carolyn Decker serves a then-record eight aces as Creighton downs host New Mexico to win the Comcast Lobo Invitational, the program's third tournament title ever.

Oct. 23, 2004: Creighton tops eventual MVC regular-season and tourney champ Wichita State in five sets, snapping the Shockers' 13-match win streak.

Oct. 28, 2005: Korie Lebeda surpasses 1,000 career assists in her 23rd career match, fastest in program history to that milestone. Lebeda would finish the year with 13.34 assists per set, an MVC record.

Nov. 18, 2005: Creighton stuns host Northern Iowa at West Gymnasium, beating the Panthers for the first time in 25 meetings.

Nov. 19, 2005: A second set kill by Leah Ratzlaff lets her pass Melissa Walsh for most kills in program history. Ratzlaff would finish with 1,622 kills, 26 more than Walsh, in her standout career.

Sept. 10, 2006: Creighton beats eventual NCAA Tournament teams Saint Louis and Middle Tennessee to win the Blue Raider Bash in Murfreesboro, Tenn.

Sept. 24, 2006: A crowd of 12,112, at the time the NCAA's second-largest regular-season volleyball-only crowd ever, is on hand as Creighton faces No. 1 Nebraska. Creighton wins set one 30-27 and leads set two 23-22 before eventually losing in four sets.

Oct. 13, 2006: Creighton survives a Wichita State match point to rally and stun the Shockers, 17-15 in set five of a road match against the two-time defending league champs.

Nov. 24, 2006: Korie Lebeda sets the single-season record for assists in a season on the same day the Jays beat Illinois State in the MVC Tournament.

Nov. 28, 2006: Emily Greisch is named a CoSIDA Third Team Academic All-American. The nursing major owned a 4.0 GPA and is the program's first All-American of any kind.

Aug. 26, 2007: Creighton sweeps Stephen F. Austin as Kirsten Bernthal Booth wins her 69th match on the Bluejay sidelines, most in Creighton history.

Sept. 2, 2007: The largest volleyball-only regular-season crowd in NCAA history (13,081) is on hand as Creighton hosts Cal Poly.

Sept. 21, 2007: Creighton becomes the first visiting Valley school to win at UNI's new McLeod Center with a 3-2 come-from-behind win. UNI had been 278-0 all-time (at all home venues) when winning the first two sets of a match.

Oct. 16, 2007: Ground is broken for Ryan Athletic Center and D.J. Sokol Arena, future home of Creighton volleyball.

Nov. 22, 2007: Allie Oelke becomes Creighton's first player ever named MVC Freshman of the Year.

Nov. 23, 2007: Korie Lebeda becomes Creighton's career assist leader, passing Kailey Reyes.

Dec. 12, 2007: Kelly Goc becomes the program's first player named AVCA All-American Honorable Mention.

Oct. 31, 2008: Kirsten Bernthal Booth becomes Creighton's first volleyball coach to post 100 wins with a 3-1 win at Drake.

Nov. 21, 2008: Creighton clinches second place in the MVC with a convincing 3-0 sweep over UNI. The win was the Jays first ever at home over the Panthers in 15 tries.

Nov. 27, 2008: Jessica Houts is one of three Bluejays named First Team All-MVC and also takes home MVC Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

Dec. 17, 2008: Jessica Houts is named AVCA All-American Honorable Mention, just the volleyball program's second All-American.

April 8, 2009: Melissa (Walsh) Albers becomes Creighton's first volleyball player to join the Athletics Hall of Fame.



Kirsten Bernthal Booth was hired in 2003 and won 502 matches and 12 league titles in her 22 years at CU.

Aug. 28, 2009: Creighton sweeps Texas Tech in the first regular-season match at D.J. Sokol Arena inside the Wayne and Eileen Ryan Athletic Center. In the same match, Jessica Houts sets the Creighton career record for total blocks.

Oct. 2, 2009: Creighton knocks off No. 25 Wichita State, the program's first win over a ranked team in 36 tries.

Aug. 31, 2010: Creighton hosts Nebraska on campus for the first time since 1980 in front of the first D.J. Sokol Arena sellout (2,514).

Nov. 26, 2010: Creighton beats Wichita State in the MVC Tournament to reach the finals for the first time.

Nov. 28, 2010: Creighton earns an at-large bid to its first NCAA Tournament.

Dec. 3, 2010: CU makes a splash in its NCAA Tournament debut, beating No. 16 Iowa State in five sets.

Sept. 17, 2011: Two CU players own triple-doubles in the same match for the first time, as Megan Bober (11k-25a-12d) and Michelle Sicner (11k-22a-17d) do it vs. UAB.

Nov. 19, 2011: Megan Bober sets an MVC record with her ninth triple-double of the fall (11k-36a-14d) at Drake.

Sept. 8, 2012: Creighton sets a school-record with 21 blocks in a win vs. Tulsa, then defeats the host school to win the Northern Colorado Classic.

Oct. 5, 2012: Creighton snaps UNI's 59-match MVC win streak with a 3-1 win over the Panthers to move into first place.

Nov. 5, 2012: Creighton breaks into the top-25 for the first time in the history of the AVCA poll.

Nov. 16, 2012: Creighton clinches its first outright MVC title with a 3-2 win at Wichita State. The Jays lost the first two sets in the match and survived a WSU match point in the win.

Nov. 22, 2012: Kirsten Bernthal Booth is named MVC Coach of the Year, while Megan Bober was named MVC Player of the Year and Kelli Browning MVC Defensive Player of the Year.

Nov. 24, 2012: Creighton wins its first MVC Tournament title with a 3-0 win over rival Wichita State. Megan Bober is MVP.

Dec. 12, 2012: Megan Bober and Kelli Browning are named AVCA All-American Honorable Mention.

Dec. 13, 2012: Megan Bober is named CoSIDA Second Team Academic All-American.

July 1, 2013: Creighton joins the BIG EAST Conference.

Aug. 12, 2013: Creighton is ranked in the preseason AVCA poll for the first time, coming in at No. 25.

Aug. 30, 2013: Creighton opens the season with a win over No. 13 BYU, the highest-ranked team CU had ever beaten.

Oct. 15, 2013: Michelle Sicner is named AVCA National Player of the Week after triple-doubles in wins against both DePaul and Marquette.

Oct. 18, 2013: Kirsten Bernthal Booth wins her 200th match at Creighton, a 3-2 victory over Xavier.

Dec. 6, 2013: At-large qualifier Creighton advances to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four years with a 3-1 win over Arkansas in Lawrence, Kan.

Oct. 3, 2014: Kate Elman surpasses Janeen Piller for Creighton's career digs record, finishing the day with 1,406.

Nov. 15, 2014: Creighton wins a five-set match at St. John's to clinch the program's first BIG EAST regular-season title.

Nov. 29, 2014: The Bluejays win Creighton's first BIG EAST Tournament title in any sport with a 3-1 win vs. Seton Hall, as Lauren Smith earns MVP honors.

Dec. 17, 2014: Kelli Browning becomes Creighton Volleyball's first three-time All-American when she earns Third Team All-America accolades.

Sept. 5, 2015: Creighton sweeps No. 10 Kentucky, the first top-10 team it has ever beaten.

Nov. 13, 2015: Creighton wins a second straight BIG EAST regular-season title with a 3-0 sweep of Xavier.

Nov. 28, 2015: Jess Bird is named MVP as Creighton wins its second straight BIG EAST Tournament title with a 3-0 win over Villanova.

Sept. 24, 2017: Kirsten Bernthal Booth wins her 300th match at Creighton, a 3-1 victory over Villanova.

Nov. 12, 2017: Creighton clinches a fourth straight BIG EAST regular-season title with a five-set win at Butler.

Nov. 22, 2017: Brittany Witt is named BIG EAST Libero of the Year while joining Lydia Dimke, Marysa Wilkinson and Jaali Winters as First Team All-BIG EAST selections.

Head Coach History / BIG EAST Leaders

Head Coach History

Ben Guiliano helped lay the groundwork for Creighton volleyball as the man in charge when Creighton reinstated volleyball prior to the 1994 season. Guiliano guided the Bluejays from 1994-96 and posted a 25-58 record in that time.

Howard Wallace took over prior to the 1997 season and led the Bluejays to four Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances in his six years on the job. In 1997, Wallace was named the MVC's Co-Coach of the Year after guiding the Bluejays to a third-place finish in league play. He owned a 68-94 record in six seasons on the Bluejay bench.

Kirsten Bernthal Booth led Creighton to unprecedented heights from 2003-24, going 502-192 to become the program's all-time leader in winning percentage and wins. Booth guided CU to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances, 12 regular-season league titles and 11 conference tournament crowns, was a six-time Conference Coach of the Year (2012, 2015, 2016, 2019, 2023, 2024) and a five-time AVCA Regional Coach of the Year (2015, 2016, 2018, 2023, 2024). Booth was a three-time National Coach of the Year honoree, guided CU to four trips to the Sweet 16 and two treks to the Elite Eight, while leading CU to 17 NCAA Tournament wins overall.

Brian Rosen was promoted to head coach on April 6, 2025 after three seasons as an assistant coach with the program. He led the Bluejays to a 28-6 record in his first year as head coach in 2025, including a 16-0 BIG EAST mark and a BIG EAST Tournament title. Rosen's 28 wins were the most by a rookie coach in league history and he also became the only volleyball coach to lead a team to the Elite Eight in his first year as a head coach in the BIG EAST.

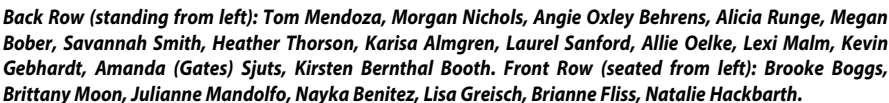

2010 NCAA Tournament



Creighton's breakthrough season saw the Bluejays make their first NCAA Tournament, upset No. 16 Iowa State, and coach Kirsten Bernthal Booth claim National Coach of the Year honors from CVU.com. Creighton finished third in the MVC, the nation's No. 6-ranked league, and then broke down another barrier by reaching its first conference tournament final. The Jays earned an at-large bid, beating No. 16 Iowa State in five sets, before falling at No. 12 Minnesota to end the year. Sophomore setter Megan Bober was named First Team All-MVC and All-American Honorable Mention as part of a balanced squad that ranked second nationally in digs per set (18.94).

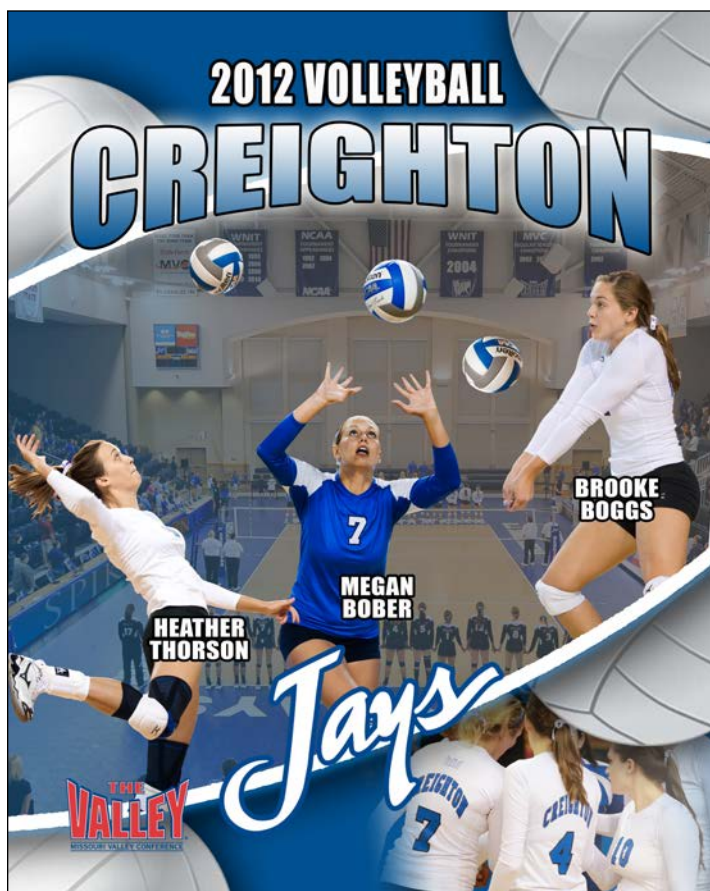

Missouri Valley Conference Regular-Season Champions Missouri Valley Conference Tournament Champions 29-4 Overall, 17-1 MVC (1st)

One of the best seasons by any women's team in Creighton history saw the Bluejays close their 19-year run in the MVC by winning the program's first Valley regular-season and Tournament titles. CU won early-season tournaments at South Florida and Northern Colorado before clinching the outright league crown with a memorable 3-2 comeback win at rival Wichita State. The Jays swept the Shockers eight days later for the Valley Tourney title, and defeated Marquette to open NCAA Tournament play before falling at Minnesota. Megan Bober was named MVC Player of the Year and Tournament MVP, while Kelli Browning was tabbed MVC Defensive Player of the Year. Both women were named AVCA All-American Honorable Mention and were joined on the All-MVC First Team by Melanie Jereb. Kirsten Bernthal Booth was named MVC Coach of the Year and CaptainU National Coach of the Year. Creighton spent four weeks in the AVCA Top 25 for the first time, reaching as high as No. 21, before finishing No. 24.

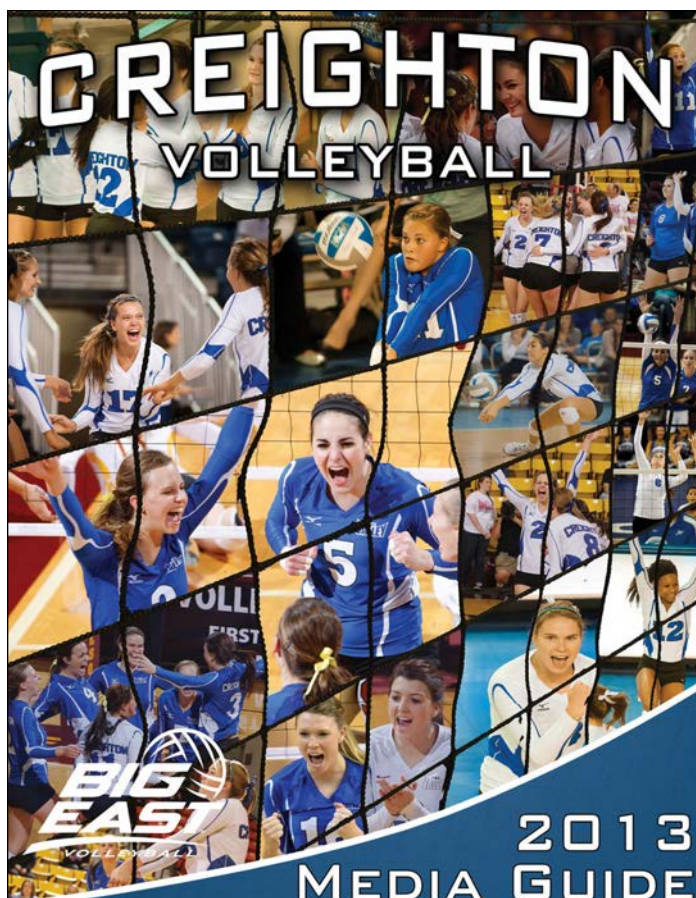
Creighton's first year in the BIG EAST Conference saw the Bluejays reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four years. Creighton went 9-3 against a grueling non-conference schedule and moved into the AVCA Top 25 for the first six weeks. The Bluejays opened the year with a win over No. 13 BYU, and later earned impressive wins over Kansas and Wichita State before opening league play. Creighton swept eventual BIG EAST regular-season and tournament champ Marquette in mid-October, and earned the No. 2 seed for the league tourney in Omaha before falling in four to the Golden Eagles in the title match. Creighton topped Arkansas in the NCAA Tournament before being eliminated in four close sets at Kansas. Kelli Browning and Leah McNary were named First Team All-BIG EAST, while Michelle Sicner was a Second Team all-conference pick. Both Browning and Sicner went on to earn AVCA All-American Honorable Mention accolades. The Bluejays led the nation with 3.06 blocks per set.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 25-9 Overall, 16-2 BIG EAST (1st)

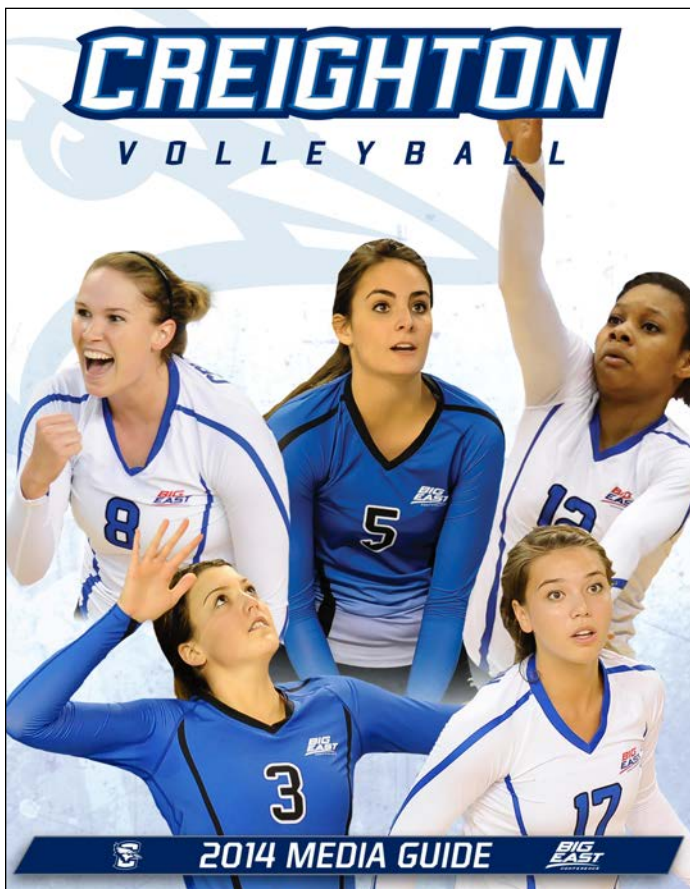
Creighton won the BIG EAST regular-season and Tournament titles while returning to the NCAA Tournament. CU went 7-6 in non-conference play against a schedule stacked with five ranked teams while winning its first Bluejay Invitational. The Bluejays went 16-2 in league play, losing twice to Seton Hall, before beating the Pirates for the school's first BIG EAST Tournament crown in any sport. Creighton fell to Oregon State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in four sets in Topeka, Kan. Individually, Kelli Browning was named a Third Team All-American, the third straight season she was honored by the AVCA. She finished her career as Creighton's all-time leader in block assists and hitting percentage, and joined Leah McNary in the 1,000-kill club. Jess Bird joined Browning as a First Team All-BIG EAST pick, while Lauren Smith was a Second Team All-BIG EAST honoree and BIG EAST Tournament MVP. Kate Elman became Creighton's all-time leader in digs but broke her wrist mid-season and was replaced capably by Melanie Jereb.

Creighton won its second consecutive BIG EAST regular-season and tournament titles to earn its fifth NCAA Tournament bid in six seasons, then advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. Creighton played five top-11 teams in non-conference play, including a 3-0 sweep over No. 10 Kentucky. A five-set comeback victory over Kansas State ignited a 12-match win streak, and CU won the BIG EAST by three games with a 17-1 mark. The Bluejays then defended their home court with victories over Marquette and Villanova to win the BIG EAST Tournament. Creighton earned the No. 16 national seed, but were sent to Chapel Hill, N.C., for postseason play. CU defeated Coastal Carolina and No. 23 North Carolina to clinch a Sweet 16 appearance, where it won the first set from No. 2 USC before falling in four. The most victorious senior class in program history was led by all-time digs leader Kate Elman, while Jess Bird was named BIG EAST Tourney MVP. Jaali Winters spearheaded the nation's No. 11 recruiting class and was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and Third Team All-American while setting a CU record for kills in a season. Lauren Smith was First Team All-BIG EAST and Honorable Mention All-American. Kirsten Bernthal Booth was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year and AVCA East Region Coach of the Year.

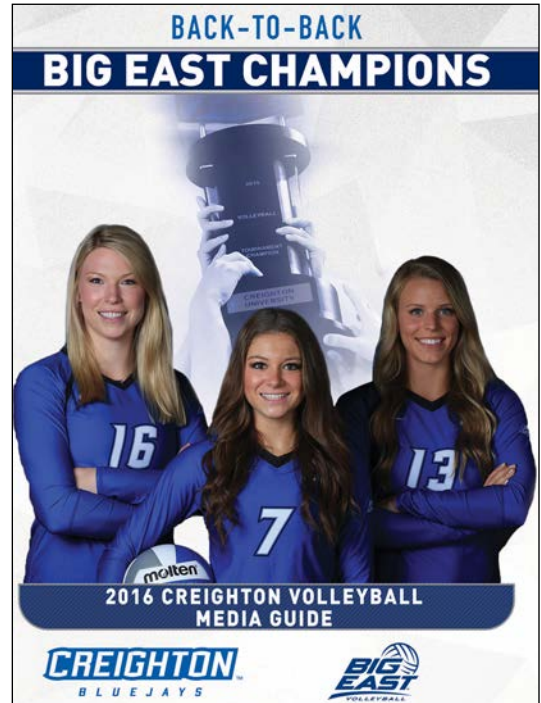

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 29-7 Overall, 18-0 BIG EAST (1st)

Creighton won its third consecutive BIG EAST regular-season and tournament titles to earn its sixth NCAA Tournament bid in seven seasons, then advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time thanks to consecutive five-set victories over Northern Iowa, No. 4 Kansas and No. 17 Michigan. The Bluejays became the first team in BIG EAST history to go 18-0 in league play, dropping just five sets, then swept both matches in the league tournament. Purdue transfer Lydia Dimke made an immediate impact at setter and was named BIG EAST Player of the Year and Third Team All-American by the AVCA, while outside hitter Jaali Winters was named MVP of the BIG EAST Championship. Dimke and Winters were joined by outside hitter Taryn Kloth on the All-BIG EAST First Team, while middle hitters Lauren Smith and Marysa Wilkinson were Second Team All-BIG EAST. Freshman libero Brittany Witt topped the team in digs, while classmate Megan Ballenger led the league in aces. Kirsten Bernthal Booth headed the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year and was named VolleyballMag.com National Coach of the Year. Creighton was ranked a program-high 18th in the AVCA preseason poll, and had an RPI on Selection Sunday of 17. The Bluejays finished the season ninth in the final AVCA poll and 12th in the year-end RPI.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 29-5 Overall, 18-0 BIG EAST (1st)

Creighton won its fifth consecutive BIG EAST regular-season and tournament titles to earn its eighth NCAA Tournament bid in nine seasons. The Bluejays were once again the No. 9 national seed and hosted NCAA Tournament matches, defeating South Dakota before falling to Washington in the Second Round. CU opened the season with a 3-2 win over No. 5 Kentucky and claimed the SMU DoubleTree Classic as well as the Bluejay Invitational. The Bluejays won the first two sets against defending national champion Nebraska in front of 14,022 fans at CHI Health Center Omaha, the largest volleyball-only regular-season crowd in NCAA history. Jaali Winters was named BIG EAST Player of the Year and MVP of the BIG EAST Championship en route to Third Team All-America honors from the AVCA. Winters and Taryn Kloth were voted CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and along with setter Madelyn Cole, were each named First Team All-BIG EAST. Creighton's unbeaten run through the BIG EAST included three wins over nationally-ranked Marquette.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Champions 25-6 Overall, 17-1 BIG EAST (1st)

Picked second in the preseason BIG EAST poll, Creighton still won its sixth straight regular-season league title thanks to a pair of victories over top-10 Marquette. Keeley Davis was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Year after earning Freshman of the Week honors on 10 occasions and Brittany Witt took home Third Team All-America and BIG EAST Libero of the Year accolades for a second time while becoming CU's all-time digs leader. BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 12-4 Overall, 7-1 BIG EAST (1st)

Creighton won the BIG EAST regular-season and tournament titles while advancing to the NCAA Tournament in a most unusual season. The global COVID-19 pandemic pushed an abbreviated season into the spring, with limited crowds and face coverings required during the regular-season. Creighton went 3-1 in non-conference play before opening BIG EAST play by splitting two matches with No. 25 Marquette. The Bluejays won their final six league matches to finish atop the Midwest Division, then defeated UConn and Marquette for their sixth BIG EAST Tournament title in seven seasons. The entire NCAA Tournament was held in Omaha, but CU fell in five sets to Ohio Valley Conference champ Morehead State in the First Round. Jaela Zimmerman earned East Region Player of the Year honors from the AVCA and joined on the All-Conference Team alongside Keeley Davis and Naomi Hickman. Hickman was named Most Outstanding Player of the BIG EAST Tournament, with Annika Welty and All-Freshman Team honoree Kiara Reinhardt also being named All-Tourney.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Co-Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 31-4 Overall, 16-2 BIG EAST (T-1st)

A school-record 31 victories, including five tournament titles, highlighted Creighton's 2021 campaign. Unranked to start the season, Creighton swept its first three matches of the season before turning heads nationally with a 3-0 sweep in Lexington of defending national champion and third-ranked Kentucky. The Bluejays went 12-1 in non-conference play prior to a 16-2 run through BIG EAST play to share part of their eighth straight regular-season title. CU then swept both DePaul and host Marquette to win a seventh league tournament title in eight years. The No. 14 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, CU swept Ole Miss before falling to Kansas in the Second Round. Norah Sis was named *VolleyballMag.com* National Freshman of the Year, BIG EAST Freshman of the Year, BIG EAST Tournament MVP and Third Team All-American after leading CU in kills. Also named First Team All-BIG EAST and All-American were Abby Bottomley, Kendra Wait and Jaela Zimmerman. Bottomley finished her career seventh in NCAA history with 2,711 digs and became the first player in program history to be named a First Team CoSIDA Academic All-American.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Co-Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 27-5 Overall, 17-1 BIG EAST (T-1st)

Creighton won its ninth straight regular-season BIG EAST title and defeated No. 14 Marquette in the BIG EAST Tournament title match after yet another dominant season. The Bluejays hosted 15,797 fans for its match against Nebraska, the largest regular-season volleyball-only crowd in NCAA history, on Sept. 7. CU also won regular-season tournaments hosted by Wyoming and Omaha and earned a national seed for the postseason. Norah Sis was named BIG EAST Player of the Year and repeated as BIG EAST Tournament MVP en route to earning Honorable Mention All-America accolades. Ava Martin gave Creighton its second straight BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and was joined on the All-BIG EAST Team by Sis, Kendra Wait and Kiana Schmitt. Wait was named AVCA Honorable Mention All-American for a second straight fall, but missed CU's NCAA Tournament loss due to injury. Creighton won its first 17 league matches, including nine straight sweeps.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Co-Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 29-5 Overall, 16-2 BIG EAST (T-1st)

Creighton won all four non-conference tournaments, as well as the BIG EAST Tournament, during another banner season. CU swept No. 16 Purdue on the road in its second match of the fall and closed non-conference play with a 3-2 win at No. 9 Minnesota. The Bluejays started league play 3-2 before reeling off 13 straight victories, including a sweep of No. 25 Marquette, to share the league title with the Golden Eagles despite overcoming injuries to key contributors Norah Sis, Ellie Bolton and Sydney Breissinger. Creighton posted its first undefeated home season in program history (13-0), finishing off its D.J. Sokol Arena slate with NCAA Tournament sweeps over Colgate and Minnesota to secure its first Sweet 16 trip since 2016. Kendra Wait was named BIG EAST Player of the Year and BIG EAST Setter of the Year while also earning First Team Academic All-America honors by College Sports Communicators. Middle blocker Kiana Schmitt had a breakthrough season and was named MVP of the BIG EAST Tournament and a Third Team Academic All-American. Kirsten Bernthal Booth was named AVCA East Region Coach of the Year and she and her staff shared BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year accolades. CU finished the year 12th in the RPI and 15th in the year-end AVCA poll.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 32-3 Overall, 18-0 BIG EAST (1st)

Creighton set a school-record with 32 wins while moving into the top-five of the AVCA rankings for the first time. CU swept South Dakota and Ole Miss at home in the NCAA Tournament to finish 19-0 at D.J. Sokol Arena and reach the Sweet 16, where it then knocked off two-time defending national champion Texas to earn an Elite Eight date with eventual national champ Penn State. Kendra Wait repeated as BIG EAST Player of the Year and BIG EAST Setter of the Year, while becoming the first athlete in CU history to be named both First Team All-American and First Team Academic All-American in the same season. Norah Sis picked up her third AVCA All-America accolade and Ava Martin her second, while transfers Maddy Bilinovic and Elise Goetzinger were also recognized as Honorable Mention All-Americans. The Jays went 20-0 against BIG EAST foes, dropping just three sets. All three of CU's losses came against eventual Final Four teams, and each were on the road and in five sets. In her final season on The Hilltop, Kirsten Bernthal Booth was named AVCA West Region Coach of the Year and led the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year, which also included 2024 AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year Brian Rosen.

BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Champions BIG EAST Tournament Champions 28-6 Overall, 16-0 BIG EAST (1st)

Months after Brian Rosen replaced Kirsten Bernthal Booth as coach, Creighton once again reached the Elite Eight, went undefeated in BIG EAST play and swept its way to a BIG EAST Tournament title. CU opened the fall with top-five battles against No. 2 Penn State and No. 5 Texas before picking up its first win over No. 14 Kansas. Creighton returned to CHI Health Center Omaha in a 3-2 loss against top-ranked Nebraska in front of the largest NCAA indoor volleyball-only regular-season crowd in history of 17,675. Creighton dominated the BIG EAST, going 16-0 while dropping just four sets in league play. The Bluejays then beat Marquette and Xavier in Milwaukee to win its 11th league tournament title in the past 12 years. CU overcame a 2-1 deficit to win its NCAA Tourney opener vs. Northern Colorado, then topped Northern Iowa and No. 8 Arizona State in four sets to return to the Elite Eight. A trip to the program's first Final Four was thwarted with a loss at No. 2 Kentucky to snap a 21-match win streak. Kiara Reinhardt and BIG EAST Player of the Year Ava Martin were named AVCA Second Team All-Americans as well as College Sports Communicators Academic All-Americans, and BIG EAST Setter of the Year Annalea Maeder was named a Third Team All-American in her lone year at CU.

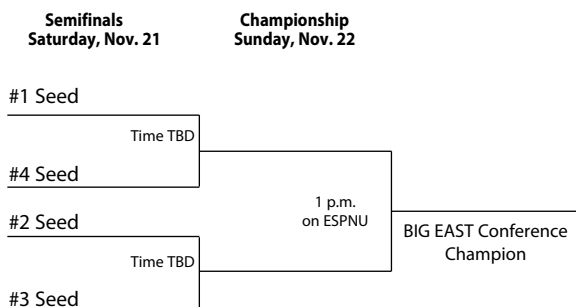

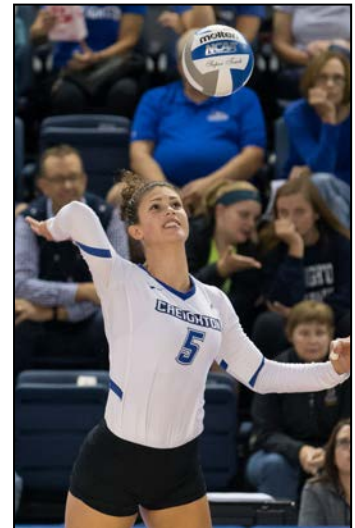

Thanks to the generous donations of Wayne and the late Eileen Ryan and family, Dave and Peggy Sokol, and many others, D.J. Sokol Arena inside the Wayne and Eileen Ryan Athletic Center was dedicated on Aug. 28, 2009.

The 75,000-square-foot facility houses a gymnasium holding 2,500 fans, as well as coaches' offices and locker rooms for volleyball, women's basketball, men's soccer, women's soccer and visiting teams and officials. It also houses areas for ticketing, athletic training, meeting rooms, media work rooms and hospitality functions. In addition, the arena is used for other campus and community events, including assemblies, coaching camps and clinics, concerts, speakers and high school graduations.

The Ryans and their family are longtime supporters of Creighton University. Wayne Ryan, BS'49, MS'51, chairman and CEO of Streck Laboratories, Inc., began his career teaching at Creighton before pursuing his passion for research that led to the founding of his company. Wayne Ryan was also a Jaybacker and his daughter, Connie, serves on Creighton's Board of Trustees.

Dave and Peggy Sokol honored their son, D.J., who died in 1999 following a battle with Hodgkin's disease, by naming the gymnasium the D.J. Sokol Arena. Sokol is a former chairman and CEO of MidAmerican Energy Holdings Company, a global leader in the production, supply and distribution of energy from diversified fuel sources, and formerly served on Creighton University's Board of Trustees.

"Visionary donors like the Ryans and Sokols make our dreams of an even stronger athletics program, championed by intensely loyal fans, more of a reality," said Creighton's former McCormick Endowed Athletic Director Bruce Rasmussen. "This Bluejay spirit is a unifying characteristic that enhances the institution's visibility and reputation."

Inside the Ryan Center, the Jensen Family Lounge features a theater-style viewing area for television, movies and game film, as well as a study area, kitchenette and gaming area. TV's throughout the lounge give the student-athletes multiple viewing options. The lounge is also easily converted into a media room for the post-game press conferences for both volleyball and women's basketball.



Creighton is a combined 46-1 inside D.J. Sokol Arena the past three seasons.

Home Venue History

For the 18th straight season, Creighton will play its home volleyball matches on campus at D.J. Sokol Arena in the Wayne and Eileen Ryan Athletic Center. In November, the facility will host a conference tournament for the eighth time (2009, 2013, 2015, 2018, 2020, 2022, 2024 and 2026). Creighton has also hosted the First and Second Round of the NCAA Volleyball Tournament there seven times (2017, 2018, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025).

Creighton is 209-34 (.860) inside D.J. Sokol Arena since its 2009 opening. The Bluejays have been near-unbeatable during regular-season conference matches at Sokol, going 140-8 (.946). That mark climbs to 109-3 (.973) since joining the BIG EAST.

CU has hosted 39 straight crowds of 2,000 fans or more at D.J. Sokol Arena (and 76 overall), including a facility-record 2,665 vs. Ole Miss on Dec. 6, 2024.

More than 182,000 bricks, 654 tons of steel and 30 miles of electrical wire were used during construction, which employed up to 115 workers at one time.

The height of the roof ridge is 78'-10" above the arena floor, with a ceiling fan measuring 20 feet in diameter spinning high above the playing surface.

In addition to a large locker room and team lounge at D.J. Sokol Arena, Creighton's volleyball program also benefits from coaching offices and athletic training rooms in the Ryan Athletic Center. The Ryan Athletic Center houses the offices for most of Creighton's support staff, including ticketing, athletic communications, marketing, compliance and athletic development.

A new Taraflex® surface was introduced on September 12, 2025, giving Creighton one of the most unique floor designs in the country.

Omaha, Neb., is located just west of the convergence of Interstates 29 and 80 on the west bank of the Missouri River. To get to D.J. Sokol Arena, follow the directions below:

Going West on I-80

Traveling west on Interstate 80 from Des Moines as you approach the state line, take Interstate 29 North. Go 1.5 miles before getting in the left lane and exit left onto Interstate 480 West, crossing into Nebraska. Take the 14th Street exit (exit 3). Stay straight to go onto Cass Street. Turn right onto Florence Boulevard. Facility will be on your right.

From I-29 North

Traveling north on Interstate 29, take I-80 West at the convergence of the two interstates in Council Bluffs, Iowa. Follow the above directions from I-80 West.

Going East on I-80

Traveling east on Interstate 80 from Lincoln, take Interstate 480 North to downtown Omaha. Continue on I-480 North to I-480 East, taking the Capitol/Civic Auditorium exit. At the stoplight, turn left (north) on 19th Street. D.J. Sokol Arena will be on your right in about half a mile.

From Eppley Airfield

When leaving the terminal, turn left (south) on Abbott Drive and follow toward downtown Omaha. Abbott Drive will turn into Cuming Street. Take Cuming Street to 17th Street and turn left (south) one block. The facility will be one block away to your right (west)

D.J. Sokol Arena Court Info

Creighton Volleyball introduced its unique new Taraflex® court on Sept. 12, 2025 during its nationally-televised match against fourth-ranked Louisville.

The court was designed by GLGR out of Portland, Ore., in working with Specialty Floors out of Parkville, Mo., representatives of Taraflex Sports.

The court features a royal blue outline with a feather pattern similar to what is on the Creighton men's basketball court that was unveiled in 2024 at CHI Health Center Omaha. More than 6/10ths of a mile of stencils were used to create the blue feather border that features more than a dozen "Easter eggs" hidden throughout.

The words Creighton and Bluejays flank the end lines in white lettering. The East sideline features the words D.J. Sokol Arena on one side of the court and a BIG EAST Conference logo on the other, both shaded in light blue. The Northeast side of the court, where the team runs in and out when returning to or from the locker room, features the words "Fly Together", while Creighton's popular C-Bird logo adorns the Northwest and Southeast corners of the court.

The West sideline features 15 smaller Bluejay bird outlines, spread across the sideline. Inside those logo decals are years to designate NCAA Tournament appearances, with different colors used to highlight the program's trips to the first weekend, Sweet 16 and Elite Eight.

The middle of the court features a gray outline of a Bluejay bird head. The hue of the two-tone court helps put the focus on the action and will make the players in uniform stand out, in addition to making it easier for officials to discern in/out calls along the sidelines. The matte finish on the court adds to the sharpness.

The perimeter of the court features no less than 14 hidden messages within the design, ranging from Heritage logos to honor Creighton's history, a map of the state of Nebraska, the year Creighton University was founded (1878), the year the Volleyball program was restarted (1994), and donor acknowledgements.

The court is a FIVB-certified playing surface and is up to the same high standards that it used in international competitions such as the Olympics. The design process for one of the most unique and complex designed courts in the world began eight months earlier, with the full painting process taking a little over a month in application and curing.

The court replaces a Taraflex® surface that had been used since a Sept. 21, 2018 match against DePaul. The Bluejays went 92-7 inside D.J. Sokol Arena on the old floor and are 14-1 all-time inside D.J. Sokol Arena on the new floor design.

Creighton's 12-match home court winning streak entering 2026 ranks as the nation's seventh-longest active streak.

Ruth Scott Training Center



Creighton dedicated the Ruth Scott Training Center on February 4, 2019.

Creighton University dedicated the Ruth Scott Training Center on February 4, 2019 in a ceremony that included Bill and Ruth Scott, Fr. Daniel S. Hendrickson, SJ, Bruce Rasmussen, Jim Flanery, Kirsten Bernthal Booth, and Megan Ballenger as speakers.

The \$5 million training facility was the latest addition to the east campus athletic corridor. Fewer student-athletes miss practice because of gym and classroom schedules, and all Bluejay student-athletes benefit. Designed primarily for volleyball and women's basketball, this facility acknowledges the hardworking, talented coaches and student-athletes Creighton hopes to retain.

Aligning with Creighton Athletics' mission of recruiting, retaining, developing and graduating outstanding student-athletes, this facility is a vital developmental resource for both programs. It provides an alternative 16,109 square-foot space to ensure both programs have ample court time to develop individually and as a team. As the volleyball program's success continues to expand its season by more than a month, having a designated practice gym alleviates scheduling challenges, as well as providing ideal practice times for both programs as their competition seasons overlap.

The Ruth Scott Training Center provides space for two full-sized basketball and volleyball courts, six basketball hoops, two automated volleyball nets that lower from the ceiling, state-of-the-art audio and visual equipment to film and review practices, a hydration station and additional storage space.

In recent years, both the Creighton women's basketball and volleyball programs have achieved incredible success on the national stage. In 2025, the volleyball program captured its 12th consecutive BIG EAST Conference regular-season title. The Bluejays finished the season playing in their 14th consecutive NCAA Tournament and third Elite Eight.

The women's basketball program has made the postseason in 20 of the past 25 seasons, highlighted by a run to the Elite Eight in the 2022 NCAA Tournament after picking up wins over No. 8 Iowa and No. 10 Iowa State before falling to eventual national champion South Carolina.

In addition, the space provides more opportunity for the Creighton community to host additional special events at D.J. Sokol Arena during normal practice times. This facility also sends a strong national message showing Creighton Athletics' dedication to women's athletics, student-athletes and coaches. Construction on the training center was completed in January 2019, with the facility dedicated on February 4, 2019.

The facility was made possible thanks to many generous donors, especially lead donors Ruth and Bill Scott, whose generosity has transformed the entire east campus athletics corridor.

Fly Together

Fly Together is a nearly \$300 million investment in Creighton athletics and recreation through new and upgraded facilities across 17th Street from the rising Builder's District and Kiewit Corporation's headquarters that will benefit all students, student-athletes and Omaha itself.

The Heider Family Foundation's \$100 million investment in Fly Together is the largest gift in Creighton University's history. It breaks the record for Creighton's previous largest gift, also made by the Heider family. Announced in September of 2025, the project will be entirely donor funded.

Fly Together will attract more prospective students, driving admissions and Nebraska brain gain. More than 80% of Creighton students come from out of state. Nearly half of all undergraduates stay in Nebraska after graduating.

Fly Together merges the campus with the \$650 million Builder's District, a 10-block urban village, giving the University a new front porch to Omaha. This union activates North Downtown like never before.

In an evolving era for intercollegiate athletics, Fly Together enhances our facilities for Creighton's 300 student-athletes. It will also offer new, top-tier spaces for student fitness, intramurals and club sports.

Fly Together will add, renovate or repurpose approximately 700,000 square feet of Creighton's campus.

Projects with construction underway include a team facility for baseball and softball and a sports performance center that will serve all student-athletes.

Additionally, a new softball competition field and a new baseball practice field opened in 2025-26. The two ballfields were funded by a combination of public and private support. The State of Nebraska's Shovel-Ready Fund granted \$30 million to support the CL and Rachel Werner Center for Health Sciences Education and the baseball and softball complex. The College World Series of Omaha, Inc., contributed an additional \$2 million toward the baseball practice field.

Baseball & Softball Fields/Team Facility

The home of Creighton softball, Creighton Softball Stadium was completed in fall 2025.

The practice site for Creighton baseball, completed in June, is the principal location for teams preparing to compete in the Men's College World Series. Both fields are also available for intramurals, club sports and community events.

Serving Creighton's baseball and softball teams. The team facility — which will include batting cages, training rooms, team lounges, staff offices and more — will also be available to visiting MCWS teams, Creighton intramurals and various community partners. Construction is underway and is expected to be completed by fall 2027.

The Bill

The crown jewel of Creighton's emerging Athletic Village, the state-of-the-art facility named after philanthropist Bill Scott, "The Bill" will serve all Creighton student-athletes, with approximately 10,000 square feet of strength and conditioning space, as well as areas for nutrition, sports medicine, academic advising and sports psychology services. Construction is underway, and is expected to be completed by 2027.

President Rev. Daniel S. Hendrickson, SJ, PhD

The Rev. Daniel S. Hendrickson, SJ, PhD, is the 25th president of Creighton University and has led the nearly 150-year-old Jesuit, Catholic institution – with campuses in Omaha, Phoenix, and the Dominican Republic – since 2015. As a former student, faculty member, and trustee of Creighton, Fr. Hendrickson possesses deep understanding and passion for the University's mission to form leaders who are motivated to build a more just world.

Joining the Society of Jesus in 1994, Fr. Hendrickson first encountered Creighton in 1996 as a student in the Jesuit Humanities Program. He returned as an adjunct instructor of philosophy from 2000 to 2003, including teaching for the Institute for Latin American Concern (ILAC) program in the Dominican Republic during the fall semester of 2002, and joining the Board of Trustees in 2013.

Continuing his commitment to global service and education, Fr. Hendrickson was a visiting instructor in the Department of Philosophy at Jordan University College in Tanzania from 2006 to 2007 before serving as an adjunct professor in the Department of Philosophy at Fordham University in 2008. He would return to his alma mater, Marquette University, in 2012, holding various faculty and administrative positions until joining Creighton in 2015 as its 25th president.

Father Hendrickson's priorities for Creighton include bolstering the role of interdisciplinary higher education between the sciences and humanities; advancing a pedagogy of engaged learning and global experiences; and broadening the reach of Creighton's health sciences programs.

During his presidency, the University has experienced record-breaking enrollments; an expansion of academic program offerings; and national recognition for its first-year student experiences, undergraduate teaching, undergraduate research, and focus on innovation. Additionally, Fr. Hendrickson's vision for meaningful student support has resulted in a 98% outcomes rate for graduates; a 92% first-to-second year retention rate; and a graduation rate close to 20 percentage points higher than the national averages for public and private institutions.

Father Hendrickson has overseen significant expansion and enhancements to the University's physical footprint. In Omaha, this includes a projected \$1 billion in public-private and philanthropic investments by the early 2030s; additionally, in Phoenix, this includes the establishment of a health sciences campus in 2021 currently serving a near-capacity 1,000 students. Today, Creighton is one of the nation's largest Catholic health professions educators and among the top 15 largest medical schools in the United States.

Moreover, under Fr. Hendrickson's leadership, Creighton has significantly strengthened its donor support. As of 2026, the University has seen a 38% increase in endowed chairs during his tenure with 14 new positions being created since 2015. With student success as a priority, Creighton's Forward Blue campaign, which launched in 2021, has raised over \$263 million in scholarship dollars, resulting in the establishment of 520 new scholarships — an increase of 150% compared to the decade prior to the campaign.

Outside of Creighton, Fr. Hendrickson serves on the boards of Boston College, Xavier University, the BIG EAST Conference Board of Directors, the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities, and the Greater Phoenix Economic Council. He is also a trustee of ILAC/Centro de Educación para la Salud Integral in the Dominican Republic and Jesuit Worldwide Learning, based in Geneva, Switzerland. His international experiences in 70 countries on nearly every continent have nurtured his belief in the importance of global immersion as key to a well-rounded education.

Father Hendrickson grew up in Fremont, Nebraska, graduating from Mount Michael Benedictine High School. He comes from a family of educators, including his identical twin, the Rev. D. Scott Hendrickson, SJ, DPhil, and his older brother, Ryan Hendrickson, PhD, who is president of the University of St. Francis, in Illinois.

Father Hendrickson holds a BA from Marquette University; an MA in philosophical resources from Fordham University; a MDiv degree from Santa Clara University; and MA and PhD degrees from Columbia University. He is the author of *Jesuit Higher Education in a Secular Age: A Response to Charles Taylor and the Crisis of Fullness*, published in 2022.





McCormick Endowed Athletic Director Marcus Blossom

As the landscape of college athletics continues its dramatic shift, the need for innovative approaches, steadfast leadership and vision for future modeling has never been more critical.

Since his arrival as the McCormick Endowed Athletic Director on September 27, 2021, Marcus Blossom has worked tirelessly to position Creighton athletics for sustained competitive success while remaining in front of a rapidly changing environment.

During his first five years on campus, student-athletes have excelled in the classroom and on the field of play, while fundraising numbers and donors have increased substantially. Additionally, Blossom introduced the first strategic plan for athletics, a roadmap that will help Creighton athletics continue to advance forward and maintain its current momentum. He has navigated the evolving iterations of NIL and revenue sharing and has provided the necessary guidance, education and opportunities for Creighton student-athletes, while keeping the athletic department ahead of the curve.

Paramount to the mission of the University, Creighton athletes achieved an overall Graduation Success Rate of 997 with 12 teams recording perfect scores. In Spring 2026, the department boasted a cumulative 3.47 grade point average, with 86 percent of all student-athletes owning a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or better. An impressive 19 percent of CU's student-athletes earned a perfect 4.00 GPA in the Spring 2026 semester.

Over the last five years Creighton programs have made 21 NCAA postseason appearances and finished runners-up for the DI-AAA Directors' Cup trophy in 2023, recording the school's second-best overall Directors' Cup finish the same year.

Since Blossom's arrival, Creighton and UCLA are the nation's only schools to reach the Elite Eight in men's soccer, women's volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball. Creighton, UCLA and Kentucky are also the nation's only schools to reach the Sweet 16 at least once in men's soccer, women's volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball in those five years.

Creighton has experienced enormous success in both men's and women's basketball in Blossom's tenure. The men's basketball team has finished inside the top five ultra-competitive BIG EAST each the last 10 seasons, reaching the NCAA Tournament seven times with an Elite Eight run in 2023 and Sweet Sixteen trips in 2021, 2023 and 2024. Creighton finished sixth in the nation in attendance (17,366) and posted a record number of season ticketholders in 2024-25, while 2025-26 marked the program's 14th-straight non-COVID campaign in the top 10 in average home attendance.

Women's basketball is thriving and reached four consecutive NCAA tournaments for the first time in program history from 2022-25, including an Elite Eight run in 2022. Attendance increased 68 percent from the 2022-23 season to the 2024-25 season.

Creighton has experienced competitive success across the board. Women's volleyball has won 12 consecutive BIG EAST regular season and six straight BIG EAST Tournament titles, reaching the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 2023 and Elite Eight in 2024 and 2025. In September of 2025, the squad played in front of an NCAA Volleyball-only record indoor crowd of 17,675 in its matchup with in-state rival Nebraska.

During Blossom's first five seasons as Creighton AD, the Bluejay men's and women's basketball and women's volleyball teams have recorded 16 more victories (373) than any other five-year period in school history.

Men's soccer won the 2022 BIG EAST Tournament and would ride that momentum with a trip to the College Cup. Additionally, men's soccer finished second in the nation in average attendance in 2023.

More than just academic and competitive success, Creighton had a record number of donors (6,320) and fundraising revenues for the 2026 fiscal year, totaling a 16 percent year-over-year increase.

Creighton set a record for non-capital gift revenues in FY24 and exceeded just under \$2 million in FY26. Corporate sponsorship sales revenues have increased by over 64 percent in the last five years, while school licensing revenues set record levels in 2024 and then exceeded those by 6 percent in FY26. Creighton set an overall fundraising revenues record in FY26.

The Creighton men's basketball program experienced a \$5 million increase in annual revenue from 2022 to 2025. As part of creating a better spectator experience at CHI Health Center Omaha, the courtside seating options and experience were transformed, leading to more than \$1.5 million in additional revenue.

Blossom has helped address the future of both the baseball and softball programs. The department is currently in the construction phase of a new and impressive competition and developmental complex for the two programs. This project is part of the recently announced Fly Together project, a \$300 million athletics and campus recreation initiative headlined by a new state-of-the-art sports performance center for student-athletes. Fly Together was made possible by a \$100 million lead gift from Cindy and Scott Heider, trustees of the Heider Family Foundation. The Heider gift is the largest in the history of Creighton University.

In lock step with the University, Blossom is a member of the President's cabinet and regularly collaborates with campus leaders to accomplish shared goals and strategic objectives. He has made eight head coaching hires during his tenure, has rebuilt his executive staff making critical hires in development, external relations and compliance, and serves as an Executive Committee member for the Men's College World Series.

Blossom arrived at Creighton from College of the Holy Cross where he was the Director of Athletics for over two years. During Blossom's time in Worcester, he led the development of the athletic department's first strategic plan, a five-year roadmap to elevate the program by creating a high-performance culture, achieving and sustaining competitive excellence, increasing external support and community engagement and enhancing facilities.

The strategic plan was supported by fundraising efforts to grow annual fund revenues by at least 50%, increase scholarship dollars for Olympic sports and transform the outdoor athletics complex. Blossom and his team made significant progress on several priorities in his time at Holy Cross, including: (1) revitalizing the game experience with improved game presentation and video board technology, (2) significant improvements to the sports performance area by adding additional strength coaches and athletic trainers and (3) strengthening campus – athletics relationships grounded in mutual understanding, appreciation, respect and shared goals.

Holy Cross athletic teams experienced success and his time was marked by several new coaching hires as well. The football team won consecutive Patriot League championships in 2020 and 2021.

Academically, Holy Cross continued to rank amongst the nation's elite under Blossom's leadership. The Crusaders most recently ranked



first in the nation with an overall Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 99 percent. Additionally, 15 Holy Cross teams received Division I Academic Progress Rate public recognition awards from the NCAA. These teams posted multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. Holy Cross finished seventh in the nation among all Division I athletic programs in the number of teams honored. For the 2020-21 academic year, Holy Cross student-athletes posted a cumulative grade point average of 3.30, with 540 student-athletes achieving a 3.0 or higher.

Prior to Holy Cross, Blossom spent five years at Boston College finishing his tenure as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Business and Administration. Blossom was a member of the executive team and assisted with all aspects of strategic planning and vision execution for the department of athletics.

At BC, Blossom was the department's senior financial and human resources officer responsible for all fiscal activities including budget planning, formulation, management, and resource allocation. He also directly supervised the broadcast services team (ACC Network), interactive media, technology, football equipment operations and campus recreation while being an integral part of all external contract negotiations and ticket

sales strategies. Known for effectively collaborating with other campus units, Blossom was also the department's liaison to residential life, concessions, dining services, event management, risk management and the university bookstore.

In addition, he was the program administrator for men's basketball, softball, women's rowing and men's and women's sailing. Also active in the ACC, Blossom was the chair of the ACC Women's Rowing Committee and a member of the ACC Finance Committee and contributor to ACC Bowl Financials Subcommittee.

Prior to Boston College, Blossom was a senior administrator at Providence College. While at Providence, Blossom was responsible for the overall fiscal management of the athletics department's operating budget including, but not limited to, budgeting and planning, financial reporting, forecasting, purchasing, travel, and internal controls/business policies and procedures. He was also the sport administrator for men's soccer and member of the men's basketball vision team at PC. He joined the Friars in 2012 after spending two years at Brown University where he was the Associate Athletic Director, Finance while also having oversight of marketing and promotions, communications, and ticket operations.

He also worked with the NCAA as an Assistant Director of Championships (2008-10) and Central Michigan as the Athletics Business Manager (2006-08) before being promoted to Assistant Athletic Director, Business Operations (2008).

Blossom earned his bachelor's degree in business administration with a concentration in finance at Northeastern University, a master's degree in sport management from West Virginia University and an MBA from the University of Rhode Island. While earning his undergraduate degree at Northeastern University, Blossom was a three-time GTE Academic All-District pick and three-time all-conference selection in men's basketball.

Blossom and his wife, Karli, have two daughters: Maya (13) and Mora (10).

- Creighton's student-athletes combined for a 3.47 GPA last spring. The student-athletes also own a 3.47 cumulative GPA.
- Fifty-five Creighton student-athletes have earned a combined 69 College Sports Communicators Academic All-American honors all-time. Volleyball's Ava Martin and Kiara Reinhardt, were each honored during the 2025-26 school year.
- Thirteen members of the Creighton Volleyball program earned a 3.5 GPA or better at least once in 2025-26, with six women doing it both semesters.
- Creighton had 210 student-athletes make the Dean's List at least one time last year, including 119 student-athletes who earned the honor both semesters.
- Fifty-four student-athletes (19 percent) earned perfect 4.0 GPAs during the spring 2026 semester, including Sydney Breissinger, Sky McCune and Jaya Johnson from the volleyball program.
- Creighton Volleyball earned its 11th straight AVCA Team Academic Award in 2025-26.
- Every program had a team GPA of 2.95 or better last spring and eight squads (women's basketball, women's golf, men's tennis, women's tennis, men's cross country, women's cross country, women's soccer and rowing) had GPA's of 3.50 or better last spring.
- Two Creighton teams were recognized with 2025-26 Team Academic Excellence Awards for compiling the highest collective grade-point averages in each BIG EAST sport.

Sokol Gymnasium, among many other features.

BIG EAST Conference

Creighton University officially became a member of the BIG EAST Conference at 12:01 a.m. on July 1, 2013. The 2026-27 season will be Creighton's 14th in the league.

Creighton, along with fellow newcomers Butler and Xavier, joined a BIG EAST that retained DePaul, Georgetown, Marquette, Seton Hall, Providence, Villanova and St. John's. The partnership was announced on March 20, 2013, in New York. The University of Connecticut rejoined the league in the summer of 2020.

The 2026-27 academic year will be the 48th in the history of the BIG EAST, a league synonymous with men's basketball that has evolved into a well-rounded league that competes nationally at the highest level in sports across the board. BIG EAST basketball squads have captured 17 titles in the last 27 years, including a title three of the last four years by UConn.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 45 national championships in eight different sports and 146 student-athletes have won individual national titles through 2025-26. Since the league's 2013 alignment, the BIG EAST has produced 12 individual national champions.

All 11 universities reside within a top-70 media market, including nine schools in a top-36 market.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from the original seven-school alliance.

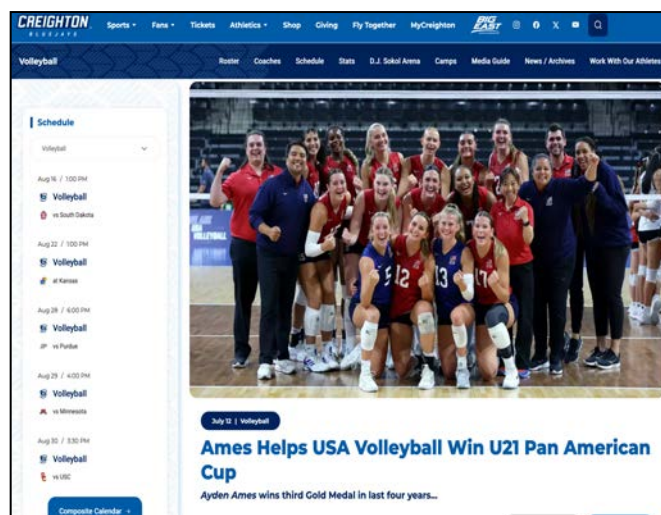

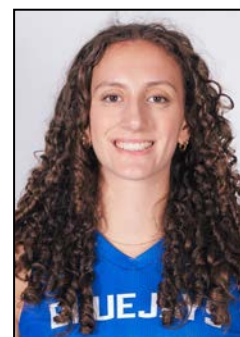
