What's At Stake? -- The Cru enters the home stretch of the season as the only unbeaten team remaining in the ASC. UMHB controls its own destiny in the hunt for an ninth ASC championship and a tenth berth in the NCAA Division III National Championships. The Cru essentially has a two-game lead on second-place McMurry University and Louisiana College by virtue of wins over those two programs earlier this season. The Cru has four ASC games remaining on the schedule. McMurry University and Louisiana College still play each other later this regular season. UMHB is also searching for a second straight unbeaten regular season and the third perfect season in the 14-year history of the program.

Last Meeting -- UMHB edged the Tigers 34-28 in overtime last season in Marshall. The Cru let a 28-17 second-half lead slip away, but held ETBU scoreless on the first possession of overtime. Quincy Daniels then ended the game with an 11-yard touchdown run. Daniels ran for 110 yards and two touchdowns. ETBU rolled up 449 yards of total offense in the game and scored 14 fourth-quarter points to tie the game and send it to the extra session. In the polls -- The Cru held on to its #4 ranking in the country in this week's D3football.com Top 25 Poll. UMHB also remained at #4 in the country for the third straight week in this week's AFCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. The Cru was picked to win the ASC in the league's annual preseason coaches' poll.

The Tigers are not ranked in any of the major national polls this week. ETBU was picked to finish sixth in the ASC in the conference's preseason coaches' poll.

UMHB vs EAST TEXAS BAPTIST GAME NOTES PG. 2

Last Time Out -- The Cru is coming off a 52-12 victory over Southern Oregon last Saturday in Belton. UMHB exploded for 28 points in the second quarter and posted its highest point total of the season in the victory. LiDarral Bailey threw for 279 yards and three touchdowns and ran for 85 yards and a score. Damian Davis caught six passes for 158 yards, including a 90-yard touchdown, the second-longest pass play in the history of Cru football. UMHB rolled up 512 yards of total offense in the return to the "I" formation, but did turn the ball over four times. The Cru defense was solid, holding Southern Oregon to 47 rushing yards, 258 yards of total offense and forcing five turnovers. Bailey threw two touchdown passes to Ervin Johnson and Darius Wilson added 68 rushing yards and a pair of scores for the Cru. Ty Dooley topped the UMHB defense with 10 total tackles and the Cru also posted three sacks. You can read more about last Saturday's game elsewhere in this release.

East Texas Baptist is coming off a 34-21 victory over Mississippi College last Saturday in Marshall. The Tigers jumped out to a 34-0 lead and then held off a late Mississippi College rally for the victory. Sed Harris threw a TD pass to open the scoring and ETBU added a 27-yard interception return. Brett Peddicord would kick a pair of field goals as Seth Hubbard came off the bench to throw two touchdown passes in helping the Tigers build their lead. Tommy Reyer threw two touchdown passes and Steven Knight ran for a score, all in the final 11:43 of the game to account for the Choctaw scoring. Jair Stover had a big day running the football for ETBU, rolling up 158 yards on 25 carries. Hubbard was 12-27 passing off the bench for 199 yards and a pair of scores. Al Lewis caught six passes for 80 yards and a TD. The Tigers rolled up 502 yards of total offense in the victory, with 234 of those coming on the ground. The Tiger defense held the Choctaws to just one yard rushing on 20 carries, but allowed Reyer to throw for 336 yards. ETBU forced three turnovers while giving the ball away just once. Collin Bieschke topped ETBU with nine tackles and nine different players had at least a half tackle for loss in the game for the Tigers.

The UMHB-East Texas Baptist Series -- UMHB leads the all-time series with ETBU 10-1. The Cru is 4-1 against the Tigers all-time in Belton and posted a 52-10 victory over ETBU in the last meeting between the two teams at Tiger Field in 2009. The Cru rolled up 484 yards of total offense and held the Tigers to just 207 yards of offense in that victory. ETBU's only win in the series came in a 28-21 overtime victory over UMHB in the 2003 meeting in Belton. That loss cost the Cru an outright ASC title, forcing a three-way tie between UMHB, ETBU and Hardin-Simmons. That loss also cost UMHB a postseason berth, the last time the Cru failed to advance to the NCAA Division III National Championships.

The Head Coaches -- The Cru is under the direction of head coach Pete Fredenburg. Fredenburg (Southwest Texas State, 1970) is in his 14th season as the only head coach in the history of the UMHB football program. He has led The Cru to a 127-32 overall record and eight ASC championships. Fredenburg led The Cru to the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl in 2004 and to the national semifinals in both 2007 and 2008. UMHB has qualified for the NCAA Division III National Championships nine times. Fredenburg is 10-1 as a head coach against East Texas Baptist and is 95-15 all-time in American Southwest Conference games in his career at UMHB. The Cru is 16-9 in the NCAA Division III National Championships under Fredenburg. He is a five-time ASC Coach of the Year and is a five-time AFCA Region III Coach of the Year. Fredenburg spent 13 years as an assistant coach at Baylor University, one season as an assistant at Louisiana State University and served as defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech University for three seasons prior to joining UMHB.

Mark Sartain is in his fifth season as the head coach of the Tigers. Sartain, a 1982 graduate of Austin College, has guided the Tigers to an overall 21-26 record in his five seasons in Marshall. He is 0-4 all-time as a head coach against UMHB. Sartain joined ETBU after a four-year stint as head coach at Trinity Valley Community College, where he posted a 17-23 record. Sartain also spent four years as offensive coordinator at TVCC before becoming head coach. He has made high school coaching stops at Athens High School, Cross Roads High School, Eustace High School and White Oak High School. Sartain was an All-Conference nose tackle during his playing days at Austin College and he was a member of the Kangaroos 1981 NAIA Division II National Championship team.

The Cru on the radio -- All UMHB football games will be broadcast on KTEM radio (1400 AM) this season. The broadcast will start 30 minutes before game time. Award-winning broadcaster Scott Garner will handle play-by-play duties with former UMHB offensive coordinator George Haffner back for a fifth season on color commentary. UMHB vs EAST TEXAS BAPTIST GAME NOTES PG. 3

When UMHB has the ball -- The Cru offense returned to its old form with a return to the "I" formation in the victory over Southern Oregon. The Cru is averaging 35.5 points, 269.3 yards rushing, 179.2 yards passing and 448.5 yards of total offense per game on the year. The Cru is converting 42 per cent of the time on third downs and is 2-6 on fourth down this season. UMHB has turned the ball over 16 times on the year (10 INT, 6 fumbles) and the Cru is averaging 79.8 yards per game in penalties. QB LiDarral Bailey had another big game and leads the Cru offense with 1,065 passing yards and six TD's on 83-129 passing. He also has 399 yards and six touchdowns on the ground. RB Darius Wilson leads the Cru in rushing with 748 yards and eight touchdowns on 124 carries. FB Elijah Hudson has 213 rushing yards and two scores and is also second on the team with 10 receptions for 114 yards. WR Damian Davis and Ervin Johnson is the leading target in the passing game with 33 receptions for 481 yards and his first TD of the season coming on a 90-yard grab against Southern Oregon last Saturday. The Cru will spread the ball around on offense, playing three quarterbacks, using 14 different players to carry the ball and 11 different players have caught at least one pass on the year. UMHB is averaging 21.1 yards per kickoff return on the year and averages 13.9 yards per punt return. The Cru also has a punt return and a blocked punt return for a score on the season. PK Chad Peevey has been up-and-down this year, connecting on 6-10 field goals and 27-28 extra points. He hit a season-long 47-yard field goal against SOU but has had one field goal try blocked and another tipped on the year.

The East Texas Baptist defense has been up and down on the season. Opponents are averaging 33.1 points, 111.7 yards rushing, 280.6 yards passing and 392.3 yards of total offense per game. Teams are converting 43 per cent of the time on third down, 62 per cent of the time on fourth downs and the Tigers have forced 14 turnovers (9 INT, 5 fumbles). ETBU has 14 sacks as a team. S Solahudeen Muhammad leads the team with 48 tackles and he also is tied for the team lead with two interceptions. DB Collin Bieschke is right behind Muhammad with 47 stops and LB Randy Rasmussen has 46 tackles. DL Matt Tarver leads the team with 10.5 tackles for loss and 5.5 sacks on the season. DeWayne Hamilton and Addison McGee are tied with Muhammad for the team lead with two picks and Alex Cloudy has a team-high nine pass break-ups. The Tigers have two interception returns, a blocked punt return and a fumble return for touchdowns on the season. Fifteen different players are in double figures in tackles for ETBU and the Tigers also have 15 players with at least a half tackle for loss on the season. Opponents are averaging just 20.3 yards per kickoff return and 4.9 yards per punt return. Brett Peddicord is averaging 36.9 yards per punt and has put seven of his 25 kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard line. He has not had a punt blocked on the season.

When East Texas Baptist has the ball -- The Tiger offense has been led by starting quarterback Sed Harris, but Harris left last Saturday's game early. On the season, ETBU is averaging 30.4 points, 192.9 yards rushing, 234.3 passing yards and 427.1 yards of total offense per game. The Tigers are converting 44 per cent of the time on third downs and are just 5-14 on fourth down conversions this year. ETBU has turned the ball over 15 times (8 INT, 7 fumbles) but have given up just six sacks on the season. Harris has thrown for 1,155 yards and 7 TD's and he is second on the team in rushing at 568 yards with three scores. QB Seth Hubbard has thrown for 485 yards and four scores as a replacement for Harris. RB Jair Stover is also a major weapon, leading the Tigers with 687 yards and six touchdowns on 138 totes. WR Al Lewis leads the team with 30 catches for 469 yards and four scores. Kwame Spikes has 28 grabs for 337 yards. The Tigers have been spreading it around on offense, 11 different players have carried the ball, two different players have thrown passes and 15 different players have caught at least one pass on the year. The Tigers are averaging 6.6 yards per punt return and 22.6 yards per kickoff return this season. PK Brett Peddicord has been solid hitting 10-14 field goals and 25-25 extra points. He has a long kick of 38 yards, but has also had three field goals blocked this season.

The Cru defense posted another solid effort in the victory over Southern Oregon, holding the Raiders to just 258 yards of total offense and forcing five turnovers in the game. On the season, opponents are averaging 16.3 points, 89.3 yards rushing, 235.2 yards passing and 324.5 yards of total offense per game. Teams are converting just 27 per cent of the time on third downs but have converted 8 of 16 fourth down tries this year. The Cru has forced 19 turnovers on the year (13 INT, 6 fumbles) and the UMHB defense has posted 18 sacks. LB Ty Dooley leads the Cru in tackles with 68 and he also has 4.0 tackles for loss. LB Javicz Jones is right behind Dooley with 65 total tackles and he leads the team with 8.0 TFL and 4.5 sacks. Jones is also tied with Cody Jones for the team lead with two interceptions. DE Silvio Diaz has 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks on the year. FS Rocky Vaclavick leads the team with four pass break-ups. Sixteen players are in double figures in tackles for the Cru and 20 players have at least a half-tackle for loss on the year. UMHB has two fumble returns for touchdowns, an interception return for a touchdown and a blocked punt return for a score on the season. A total of 14 players are in double figures in tackles for UMHB and 17 players have at least a half tackle for loss on the season. The Cru has blocked just one kick on the season. P Chad Peevey has quietly been consistent for UMHB. Peevey is averaging 37.7 yards per punt and has put nine of his 27 kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Peevey also has one kick of 50 or more yards with a long boot of 50 yards on the season. Teams are averaging 15.8 yards per kickoff return and 14.0 yards per punt return against the Cru kick coverage units on the season.

UMHB vs EAST TEXAS BAPTIST GAME NOTES PG. 4

Bailey's Big Day-- QB LiDarral Bailey (Jr., Bremond) had a huge game against Southern Oregon, leading the Cru in rushing and passing. Bailey threw for 279 yards and a career-high three scores and he added 85 more yards and a touchdown on the ground. It was his second 200-yard passing day of the season and only the 12th in the 14-year history of Cru football. Bailey is only the fourth player to have two, 200-yard passing games in a single season for UMHB, joining Orlando Garza, Cody Fredenburg and Josh Saenz. Saenz was the last to do it, posting a pair of 200-yard passing games in 2008. Fredenburg set the school record with three 200-yard games during the 2003 season. The Cru has never had a 300-yard passing performance. For the season, Bailey is 83-129 through the air for 1,065 yards and six TD's. He has 399 rushing yards and six more scores on the ground. Bailey had a 200-yard passing day against Hardin-Simmons earlier this year taken away by a mis-marked spot, dropping him to 189 passing yards.

Bailey's big day also helped him climb several UMHB career record lists. He became the first player in Cru football history to go over 3,000 yards in career passing and 2,000 yards in career rushing. Bailey now has 3,273 passing yards in his career and trails only Josh Welch (4,914 yards) and Fredenburg (5,032 yards) on that list. He broke a tie with Andy Padron to move into sole possession of third place with 26 career touchdown passes. Bailey also moved past Kevin Mitchell and into fifth-place on the Cru career rushing list with 2,206 yards. He needs 731 more yards to tie Freddie Rollins for third-place at 2,937 yards in career rushing.

Long-Distance Davis -- WR Damian Davis (Sr., Mart) had another huge day against Southern Oregon, hauling in six passes for 158 yards and a 90-yard TD. The 90-yard pass is the second-longest pass play in UMHB history, trailing on the 91-yard TD toss from Bailey to Davis against Louisiana College last season. On the year, Davis leads the team with 33 catches for 481 yards.

He also continues to march up the UMHB career receiving lists. Davis moved into third place on the career receiving yardage list with 1,286 yards, passing Pi'Dadro Davis' 1,281 yards. Austin Schrader is second all-time with 1,624 yards. Davis has 71 career catches and is fourth all-time, just three grabs behind Ervin Johnson's still-active third-place total of 74 receptions. The 100-yard receiving day was the fifth of Davis' UMHB career, leaving him one behind second-place Pi'Dadro Davis' total of six and just two off the school mark of seven 100-yard receiving games held by P.J. Williams. Davis also moved into a tie for sixth place on the Cru career TD receptions chart with Brian Scott at 10 touchdown grabs.

Johnson Climbs the Charts -- WR Ervin Johnson (Sr., Valley Mills) caught three passes for 65 yards and a pair of scores against SOU. He now has 74 career catches and needs just one more to become only the third player in school history to catch 75 career passes, joining Schrader and Williams. Johnson has 922 receiving yards in his career and is 78 yards away from becoming only the sixth player in Cru history to go over 1,000 career receiving yards. The two TD catches give Johnson 13 in his career and move him ahead of Patrick Oliver and into fourth place with 13 career TD receptions.

Jones Hits the Top Five -- LB Javicz Jones (Sr., Katy) recorded six tackles against Southern Oregon to push his career total to 256 and move him into fifth place all-time for the Cru. Jones needs just two more to tie Derrick Williams fourth-place total of 258 stops. Jones is 16 tackles away from tying Josh Kubiak for third-place all-time for the Cru with 272 tackles.

Bonus Myles -- KR Geoff Myles (Jr., San Antonio) continues to be a weapon in the return game for the Cru. Myles returned one kickoff for 58 yards and added 60 yards on five punt returns. He became just the second player in Cru history to go over 1,000 career punt return yards, moving his total to 1,055 yards. P.J. Williams holds the school record with 1,247 yards in career punt returns. Myles is also one punt return for a touchdown away from tying Williams' school record of four TD returns. He has an additional 651 yards in kickoff returns in his career, ranking fourth on UMHB's all-time list in that category.

Dooley's Double Digits -- MLB Ty Dooley (So., Sunray) led UMHB with 10 total tackles against Southern Oregon. It was the fifth time Dooley has reached double figures in tackles through the first six games of the season for UMHB. On the season, he leads the Cru with 68 tackles and needs just 47 more tackles to move past Ben Beckworth and into tenth place on the Cru career tackle chart.

Peevey Kicks It Up A Notch -- P/K Chad Peevey (So., Bryan) had his best kicking day of the season against SOU. Peevey hit all seven extra point attempts and also booted a career-long 47-yard field goal. He accounted for ten total points and also punted four times for a 32.0-yard average and averaged 52.0 yards per kickoff as he continues to handle all of the kicking duties for the Cru this season.

UMHB vs EAST TEXAS BAPTIST GAME NOTES PG. 5

The History of 6-0 -- The Cru's 6-0 start to the season is the ninth in school history. That means UMHB has been at least 6-0 in nine of the 14 seasons of Cru football. UMHB also accomplished that feat in the following seasons: 2010, 2008, 2007, 2004, 2003, 2002, 2001 and 2000. UMHB has only put together two perfect regular seasons in school history, going 10-0 in the 2002 and 2010 campaigns. The Cru lost in the 11th game in 2002, falling to Trinity University 48-38 in the first round of the NCAA Division III National Championships. UMHB finally fell in game #13 last season, dropping a 19-9 decision to Wesley College in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division III National Championships. In those other 6-0 starts, UMHB has lost the ninth game of the season twice (2000 and 2003), has lost the eighth game of the season twice (2001 and 2007) and lost the seventh game of the season twice (2004 and 2008).

Streaks Alive! -- The Cru brings several active winning streaks into Saturday's game against ETBU. UMHB has won 20 consecutive regular season games, 24 consecutive regular season home games and 15 straight ASC contests. In addition to the 15 ASC wins in a row, UMHB is 48-2 in its last 50 league contests. The Cru fell to ETBU 28-21 in overtime during the 2003 regular season, since that game, UMHB has gone 59-3 in conference play, posting a winning percentage of 95.2%. The Cru has also won seven in a row over the Tigers since that 2003 defeat.

Back-to-Back Home Games -- For the second time this season, UMHB will play back-to-back home games. The Cru also played host to Wisconsin-La Crosse and McMurry University in the first two games of the season. It marks the tenth time in school history for UMHB to play back-to-back regular season home games. The Cru has gone 2-0 in four of the previous occasions. In fact, it has happened the last four times UMHB has hosted back-to-back regular season games.

The Big 5-0 -- The Cru totaled 52 points in the win over Southern Oregon last Saturday, marking the 40th time in the 14-year history of UMHB football that the team has scored 50 or more points. The Cru is 40-0 in those games and with 40, 50-point games through 159 games, UMHB has reached a half-century in scoring in just over a quarter of the games it has played. By the way, the Cru has only given up 50 or more points in a game twice. UMHB is 0-2 in those games.

LAST YEAR'S MEETING

UMHB 34, EAST TEXAS BAPTIST 28 OT

Oct. 23, 2010 • Marshall, TX • 2,900

The Cru saw a double-digit second-half lead slip away, but UMHB answered in overtime and posted a 34-28 victory over East Texas Baptist University. The win moves the Cru to 7-0 for the sixth time in the 13-year history of the UMHB football program.

The Cru fell behind early and trailed 14-0 after ETBU recovered a fumble in the end zone and Sed Harris hit Malcolm Wiltz with an 11-yard touchdown toss. UMHB finally put points on the board when Quincy Daniels scored on an eight-yard run with 1:59 left in the first half. LiDarral Bailey hit Damian Davis with a 10-yard TD pass and Geoff Myles returned a punt 47 yards for a score to give the Cru a 21-14 lead. After a field goal, Bailey found Ervin Johnson with a nine-yard TD strike to give UMHB a 28-17 edge. Kwame Spikes tossed a 71-yard reverse pass to Al Lewis for a TD and the two-point conversion cut the lead to 28-25. Brett Peddicord hit a 28-yard field goal with 48 seconds left to tie the game. UMHB drove to the 27, where Alan Munoz missed a 44-yard field goal as time expired. A Brenson Bristow sack on the first play of overtime knocked the Tigers back and Peddicord missed a 49-yard field goal try after two incomplete passes. Daniels then closed the game out with an 11-yard TD run in overtime.

Daniels ran for 110 yards and a pair of touchdowns and he passed Jarvis Thrasher for second place on the Cru career rushing list. Bailey ran for 78 yards and threw for a career-high 175 yards and two scores. Davis caught five passes for 110 yards and a score and Ty Dooley and Javicz Jones led the Cru defense with 12 tackles apiece. UMHB was held to just 203 rushing yards and 378 yards of total offense. The Tigers rolled up 449 yards of total offense with 293 of those coming through the air. The win was the Cru's 10th over ETBU, giving UMHB double digit wins over every current American Southwest Conference program.
