COACH CARROLL

Clif Carroll became just the fourth head coach in UMHB men's basketball history when he joined the Cru in May of 2020. He went on to lead the program to a 16-4 overall record and an ASC West Division title in his first season on campus. Carroll joined UMHB after a very successful five-year run as Head Coach at Sul Ross State University. He guided the Lobos to an American Southwest Conference Championship, three ASC West Division titles and a 78-55 record during his tenure in Alpine. Sul Ross is 51-28 in ASC play in that time. Carroll is a four-time ASC West Division Coach of the Year and also won D3hoops.com South Region Coach of the Year honors following Sul Ross' ASC Championship season in 2017-18. He is the winningest coach in Lobo men's basketball history after surpassing Doug Davalos' total. In addition to the on-court success, Carroll's Lobo teams have consistently posted a team GPA over 3.00 and have compiled more than 1,300 hours of community service. He also coached the Sul Ross women's basketball program for most of the 2016-17 season and directed the Lady Lobos to the only ASC Tournament berth in program history.



Carroll also spent two seasons as Head Coach at McMurry University. He has been an assistant coach at Lamar University, Collin County Community College and South Plains College. Lamar won a Southland Conference Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament during Carroll's time on staff. Collin County won 77 games in his three-year stint and South Plains won the NJCAA National Championship during his time in Levelland. Carroll started his coaching career as a student assistant for the legendary Bobby Knight at Texas Tech University. The Red Raiders advanced to two NCAA Tournaments and the NIT Final Four during Carroll's time as a student assistant.

Carroll graduated from Texas Tech University in May of 2006 with a degree in exercise and sport science. He earned a Master's Degree from Sul Ross State in Health and Human Performance in July of 2015. Carroll has also served as a lecturer in Sul Ross State's Physical Education Department. He is a native of Meadow, Texas. Carroll and his wife, Beth, have two sons, Waylon and Willie.

COACH ORR

ASSISTANT COACH THOMAS ORR



Thomas Orr returned to UMHB as men's basketball assistant coach in May of 2020. Orr rejoined his alma mater after spending 2019 as an assistant coach at the University of the Ozarks, a fellow American Southwest Conference member. Orr also spent two years as an assistant coach at Texas Lutheran University and helped lead the Bulldogs to a pair of Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships during his tenure. He started his collegiate coaching career as a student assistant at UMHB in 2013-14 and has also coached on the high school level at Buffalo High School and in the Longview ISD.

Orr was a two-year letter winner for the Cru men's basketball team and was UMHB's leading scorer when the team advanced to the NCAA Division III National Championship Game his senior season. He had 24 points and 11 rebounds in the title game. Orr was a D3hoops.com All-South Region selection and ASC All-Conference and All-West Division pick that year. He graduated from UMHB with a degree in interdisciplinary studies in 2014 and earned a Master's Degree in sport management from Franklin-Pierce University in 2016. Orr is a native of Hutto, Texas.

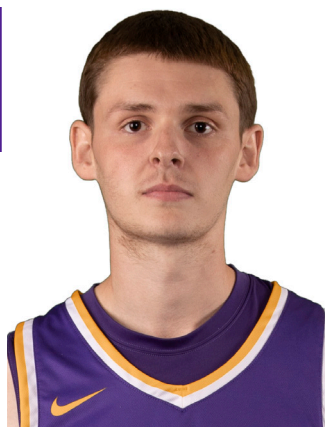

DR. RANDY O'REAR, UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Randy O'Rear became the 22nd president of the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor when he assumed the office on June 1, 2009. O'Rear was named President and CEO of the university in a unanimous decision by the school's Board of Trustees in September 2008.

Dr. O'Rear is the first president of UMHB who is also an alumnus of the university. He graduated from UMHB with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1988 and earned an MBA from UMHB in 1997. O'Rear earned a doctoral degree in Higher Education from Baylor University in 2004.

O'Rear has served at UMHB since 1988, most recently as executive vice president and chief operating officer. For more than 18 years, O'Rear has been actively involved in fundraising for the university. Under his leadership, gifts and grants dramatically increased, numerous endowed scholarships were established and major capital projects were completed, including the construction of the Parker Academic Center, the Mayborn Campus Center, the Meyer Christian Studies Center and the Crusader Stadium Complex.

O'Rear has also strong ties to the UMHB athletic department. He was also a two-year letterman for the UMHB baseball program as a right-handed pitcher. O'Rear held the school record for wins in a season for five years before that mark was broken in 1992. He also spent one year as a student assistant coach and two years as a full-time assistant coach for the Cru baseball team.

Originally from Waco, O'Rear is a graduate of Robinson High School. He and his wife, Julie, have three children, Ryan, Taylor and Reed. Taylor and her husband, John, a former UMHB soccer standout, have two sons. Reed is married to former UMHB basketball player Jesslyn Poole. The O'Rears live in Belton and are members of First Baptist Church, Belton.

MICKEY KERR, VICE PRESIDENT FOR ATHLETICS



Dr. Mickey Kerr took over as Vice President for Athletics at his alma mater on June 1, 2021. Kerr is serving in a new role but is certainly no stranger to UMHB Athletics. Kerr has been a student-athlete, assistant coach, head coach and Faculty Athletic Representative for the Cru during his tenure at UMHB.

Kerr returned to the athletic department after spending the previous 19 years teaching in the school's Mayborn College of Health Sciences' School of Exercise and Sport Science. Kerr has been an athlete, coach and faculty athletic representative for UMHB in addition to his tenure as a professor. Kerr was a four-year letter winner for the UMHB baseball team before graduating in 1980 with a degree in Business Administration. He was head coach of the Cru baseball program from 1981-83 and won the Big State Conference Championship in 1983. He returned to the program in 1994 as an assistant coach before taking over again as head coach from 1997-2001. Kerr won 130 games in his two stints as head coach before moving into academics full-time following the 2001 season. He helped start UMHB's Sport Management program and also currently serves as Associate Dean and Director of UMHB's M.S. in Sport Administration program. Kerr has also served as the Cru's Faculty Athletic Representative since 2018. He earned a Master's Degree in Business Education from West Texas State University in 1989 and a Doctorate in Sport Management from the United States Sports Academy in 2002. He also served as head baseball coach at College of the Southwest from 1985-86 and has coached on the high school level at Belton, Caldwell and Copperas Cove.

Kerr and his wife, Dee, have four children and three granddaughters. Two of the couple's children, Courtney and Mickey, played soccer at UMHB.

The University of Mary Hardin-Baylor was chartered by the Republic of Texas in 1845, making UMHB the oldest institution of higher learning offering continuous education in the state.
