Mark Morefield became the ninth head coach in UMHB women’s basketball history in April of 2015. He joined the Cru after a long and successful stint as a Division I men’s basketball assistant coach. Morefield guided the Cru women to a 15-11 record and a berth in the ASC Championship Tournament in his first season at the helm. He followed with an 18-9 campaign and another ASC Tournament berth. The Cru women finished 23-5 in 2017-18 to set a new school Division III era record for wins in a season. Morefield led UMHB to new heights in 2018-19, as the Cru finished 27-4, won the ASC West Division title and advanced to the NCAA Division III National Championships for the first time in program history. UMHB would go on to advance to the Sectional round after recording the first two NCAA postseason wins in program history and finished the season ranked 16th in the country in two national polls. The Cru would go on to win its first ASC Tournament Championship in 2019-20 and the Cru once again advanced to the Sectional Round of the NCAA Division III National Championships. UMHB would add a second consecutive ASC title with a victory over #2-ranked East Texas Baptist in the 2020-21 ASC title game. Morefield is 122-41 in six seasons in Belton and the Cru women also earned top two seeds in the ASC Tournament in five consecutive seasons for the first time in program history under his direction. UMHB is also 4-1 all-time in NCAA postseason play with Morefield as head coach.



Morefield spent eight seasons as an assistant coach on Scott Drew’s staff at Baylor University. The Bears advanced to two NCAA Tournaments during his tenure, including an appearance in the Elite Eight in 2010. Morefield also coached three future NBA players at Baylor, with two of those going in the first round of the NBA draft. He was twice named one of Rivals.com’s Top 25 recruiters and helped recruit six Top 20 national recruiting classes over a ten-year span. With the Bears, Morefield served as the team’s recruiting coordinator, oversaw the offense, supervised individual workouts and scouting. Morefield moved to Baylor after spending five years as an assistant coach at Valparaiso University under Homer and Scott Drew. The Crusaders posted four 20-win seasons in that time and made three NCAA Tournaments appearances. He spent four years as a student assistant at Valparaiso and the Crusaders recorded at least 20 wins in each of those seasons, made three NCAA Tournament appearances and advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2008. Morefield has one year of professional experience as an assistant coach with the Texas Legends of the NBDL and was also a draft consultant for the NBA’s New Orleans Hornets in 2012. He has coached a pair of professional teams in international competition in the off-season and has also coached two Athletes in Action teams on international tours.

Morefield spent the 2014-15 season as the boys’ basketball coach at Vanguard College Preparatory School in Waco. He led the Vikings to a 26-5 record and the TAPPS Sweet 16. He also served as girls’ basketball coach at Texas Christian Academy in Waco for one year and also works with a developmental basketball program in Waco. Morefield is a 1998 graduate of Valparaiso University. He is married to Danika, the daughter of Baylor Women’s Basketball Associate Head Coach Bill Brock. The couple has two sons, Harrison and Ryan.

Kendra Foreman returned to her alma mater as assistant coach on July 1, 2021. Foreman returned to UMHB after spending the previous two seasons as a graduate assistant at the University of Dallas. The Crusaders won four of their last six games during an abbreviated schedule in 2020-21 with Foreman on staff and earned a berth in the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Tournament. She was also part of the SCAC Coaching Staff of the Year in 2020-21. Foreman spent one year as a volunteer assistant coach at UMHB and helped lead the Cru to the first NCAA Division III National Championships berth in program history in 2018-19.

Foreman graduated from UMHB in 2017 with a degree in sport management. She was a two-year letter winner for the Cru women's basketball team and won American Southwest Conference West Division Defensive Player of the Year honors as a senior in 2016-17. She was also First Team ASC All-West Division and earned a spot on the ASC Championship Tournament All-Tournament Team that season. Foreman was Second Team ASC All-West Division as a junior and she played for two ASC Tournament qualifiers during her career at UMHB. She also played two seasons of basketball at McLennan Community College in Waco before transferring to UMHB. Foreman is a native of Arlington. She and her husband, Willie, live in Jarrell.

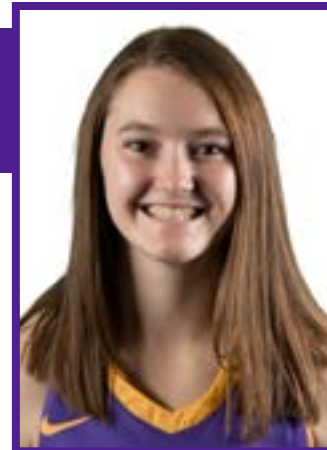

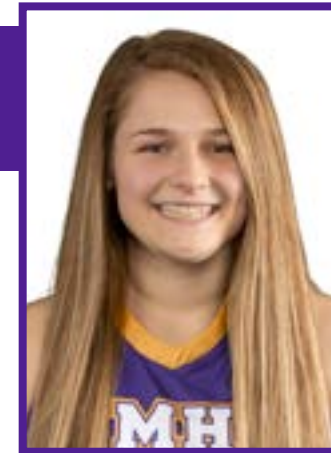

DR. RANDY O'REAR, UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Randy O'Rear became the 22nd president of the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor when he assumed the office on June 1, 2009. O'Rear was named President and CEO of the university in a unanimous decision by the school's Board of Trustees in September 2008.

Dr. O'Rear is the first of president of UMHB who is also an alumnus of the university. He graduated from UMHB with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1988 and earned an MBA from UMHB in 1997. O'Rear earned a doctoral degree in Higher Education from Baylor University in 2004.

O'Rear has served at UMHB since 1988, most recently as executive vice president and chief operating officer. For more than 18 years, O'Rear has been actively involved in fundraising for the university. Under his leadership, gifts and grants dramatically increased, numerous endowed scholarships were established and major capital projects were completed, including the construction of the Parker Academic Center, the Mayborn Campus Center, the Meyer Christian Studies Center and the Crusader Stadium Complex.

O'Rear has also strong ties to the UMHB athletic department. He was also a two-year letterman for the UMHB baseball program as a right-handed pitcher. O'Rear held the school record for wins in a season for five years before that mark was broken in 1992. He also spent one year as a student assistant coach and two years as a full-time assistant coach for the Cru baseball team.

Originally from Waco, O'Rear is a graduate of Robinson High School. He and his wife, Julie, have three children, Ryan, Taylor and Reed. Taylor and her husband, John, a former UMHB soccer standout, have two sons. Reed is married to former UMHB basketball player Jesslyn Poole. The O'Rears live in Belton and are members of First Baptist Church, Belton.

MICKEY KERR, VICE PRESIDENT FOR ATHLETICS



Dr. Mickey Kerr took over as Vice President for Athletics at his alma mater on June 1, 2021. Kerr is serving in a new role but is certainly no stranger to UMHB Athletics. Kerr has been a student-athlete, assistant coach, head coach and Faculty Athletic Representative for the Cru during his tenure at UMHB.

Kerr returned to the athletic department after spending the previous 19 years teaching in the school's Mayborn College of Health Sciences' School of Exercise and Sport Science. Kerr has been an athlete, coach and faculty athletic representative for UMHB in addition to his tenure as a professor. Kerr was a four-year letter winner for the UMHB baseball team before graduating in 1980 with a degree in Business Administration. He was head coach of the Cru baseball program from 1981-83 and won the Big State Conference Championship in 1983. He returned to the program in 1994 as an assistant coach before taking over again as head coach from 1997-2001. Kerr won 130 games in his two stints as head coach before moving into academics full-time following the 2001 season. He helped start UMHB's Sport Management program and also currently serves as Associate Dean and Director of UMHB's M.S. in Sport Administration program. Kerr has also served as the Cru's Faculty Athletic Representative since 2018. He earned a Master's Degree in Business Education from West Texas State University in 1989 and a Doctorate in Sport Management from the United States Sports Academy in 2002. He also served as head baseball coach at College of the Southwest from 1985-86 and has coached on the high school level at Belton, Caldwell and Copperas Cove.

Kerr and his wife, Dee, have four children and three granddaughters. Two of the couple's children, Courtney and Mickey, played soccer at UMHB.
