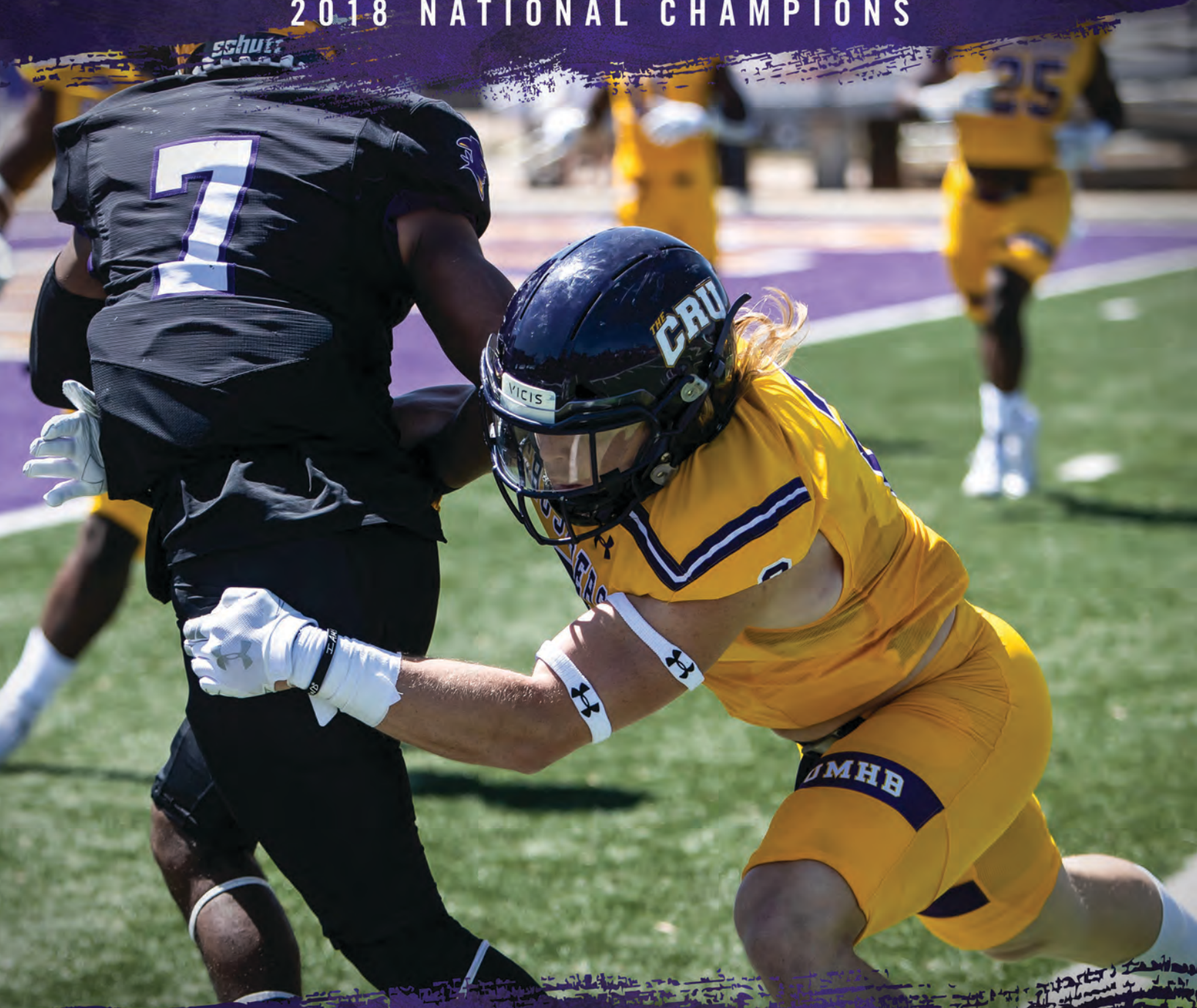

COVERING THE CRU

The UMHB Office of Sports Information generates all official information concerning the Cru football team. All media inquiries should be directed through the UMHB Office of Sports Information. No player or coach interviews will be granted without prior arrangement through the sports information director. Media guides, game programs, statistics, game notes, flip cards and a pregame meal will be available to working media in the press box on game days. Only credential media will be allowed access to press box seating. Seats will be reserved for media requesting credentials with priority given to outlets regularly covering UMHB and its opponents.

Game statistics will be provided to working media and coaching staffs at halftime and the end of the game. Complete stat packages, including play-by-play will be available approximately 15 minutes after the end of the game. There are phone lines available at Crusader Stadium, but prior arrangement should be made by media needing use of those phone lines. Visiting radio is encouraged to call the UMHB Office of Sports Information two weeks ahead of time to make arrangements. A member of the sports information staff will escort members of the media to the interview room for interviews following the game. UMHB coaches and requested players are available in the interview room following the 10-minute cooling off period. Visiting players and coaches will also be available for interviews with the visiting SID typically handling those requests. Special requests for postgame interviews should be addressed to the UMHB sports information staff ahead of time.

During the week, UMHB players and coaches are available for interviews via zoom on Wednesdays. Special interview requests, including phone interviews, must be arranged through the sports information director.

THE CRU ON THE RADIO

All UMHB football games during the 2021 season will be broadcast on Fox Sports Radio at 93.9 FM and 1330 AM. The broadcasts will also be available through the "Tune-In" app for your mobile device.

Ward Whites is in his second season as play-by-play voice of The Cru. Whites is currently an on-air personality with Fox Sports Central Texas and does play-by-play for Temple High School football. Ward replaces former UMHB Sports Information Director Jon Wallin who voiced The Cru for seven seasons.

Whites is joined in the booth by former UMHB offensive coordinator George Haffner. Haffner spent seven years as the Cru's offensive coordinator before retiring in 2006. UMHB set every major school offensive record during Haffner's tenure. Coach Haffner also spent 31 years in Division I, including stops at Georgia, Pittsburgh, Florida State, Iowa State, LSU and Texas A&M. He coached Herschel Walker during Walker's Heisman Trophy season at Georgia.

HEAD COACH PETE FREDENBURG

Pete Fredenburg is entering his 24th season as the only head coach in the history of the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor football program. Much more than just the head coach of a national champion, Fredenburg is also the architect of the most successful football program in the American Southwest Conference and a true national power. Hired in July of 1997, one year before the Cru opened play, Fredenburg was responsible for recruiting a staff and team, ordering uniforms and equipment and designing the field house. Once that foundation was put in place, Fredenburg quickly began building a winner on the field. UMHB qualified for the NCAA postseason in just its fourth season of play and the Cru won its first ASC Championship the following year. That hard work would culminate in the program's first NCAA Division III National Championship with a 24-16 win over Mount Union in Stagg Bowl XLVI.



The Cru is 216-39 overall under Fredenburg's direction. He currently ranks among the active leaders in NCAA Division III head coaching victories. UMHB has not lost more than two regular season games since 1999 and the Cru has eight undefeated regular seasons. UMHB has posted a 174-11 regular season record since the 2000 season kicked off and has an all-time record of 146-16 in ASC play during Fredenburg's tenure. He was named American Football Coaches Association Division III National Coach of the Year following the 2016 season. Fredenburg won Liberty Mutual Division III National Coach of the Year and American Football Monthly Magazine Division III National Coach of the Year honors after the 2013 campaign.

Coach Fredenburg has taken the Cru to one national championship, one national runner-up finish, 16 American Southwest Conference Championships and 16 NCAA Division III National Championship berths. In 23 seasons in Belton, he has coached four Gagliardi Trophy finalists or semifinalists, a Rimington Trophy winner, a Gilburg Award winner, three Elite 90 Award winners, 23 AFCA All-Americans, 149 All-Region selections, 429 ASC All-Conference players and 257 ASC Academic All-Conference honorees. UMHB has also produced three ASC Offensive Players of the Year, five ASC Special Teams Players of the Year, three ASC Freshmen of the Year, 11 ASC Offensive Linemen of the Year, ten ASC Defensive Linemen of the Year and 16 ASC Defensive Players of the Year. UMHB has also become a fixture in the Top 10 in both the AFCA and D3football.com Top 25 Polls during Fredenburg's tenure. In addition to 2018's consensus #1 final rankings, the Cru has finished the year ranked #2 in the country five times in program history.

Fredenburg earned his tenth AFCA Region III Coach of the Year honor following the 2018 season. Only three other coaches have won more in the history of that award. Fredenburg is also a 10-time ASC Coach of the Year, winning that award more than any other ASC coach. His accomplishments were recognized with his enshrinement in the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in April of 2018 and Fredenburg is also a member of the Southwest Texas State Athletics Hall of Honor.



HEAD COACH PETE FREDENBURG

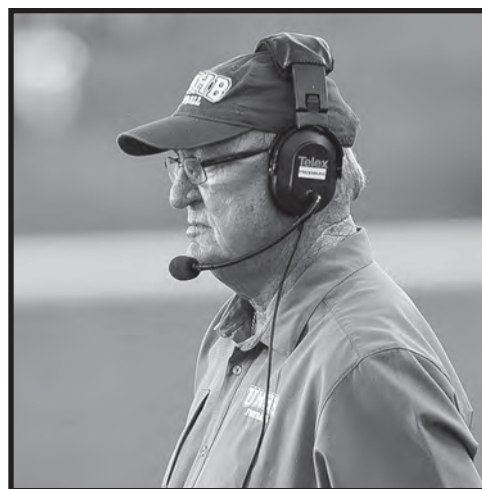
Fredenburg is a Central Texas native who grew up in Clifton. From 1980-1993, Fredenburg was an assistant coach under the legendary Grant Teaff at Baylor University. During his time at Baylor, Coach Fredenburg coached in the Cotton Bowl, Liberty Bowl, Copper Bowl, John Hancock Bowl and two Bluebonnet Bowls. In 1990, Coach Fredenburg was named Southwest Conference Defensive Coach of the Year and he was also considered one of the top recruiters in the Southwest Conference during his tenure with the Bears.

After leaving Baylor University, Coach Fredenburg spent one season at Louisiana State University before becoming the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech University. He spent three seasons at Louisiana Tech before moving to UMHB to start building the Cru football program. In his collegiate coaching career, Coach Fredenburg has coached more than 30 players who went on to play professionally.

Coach Fredenburg started his coaching career at New Braunfels Canyon High School and he also served as an assistant coach at New Braunfels High School. His first head coaching job came at Giddings High School, where he spent three seasons before leaving to join Baylor University.

Fredenburg is a 1970 graduate of Southwest Texas State University. He was a three-year letterman for the Bobcats football team as a defensive back and is a member of the Southwest Texas State University Athletics Hall of Honor.

Fredenburg's wife, Karen, is a retired professor in the Physical Education department at Baylor University and the couple recently celebrated its 50th anniversary. The Fredenburgs have three children, Kori, Denver and Cody, and nine grandchildren. Kori and Denver are both graduates of Baylor, where Denver played baseball and served as a team captain. Kori has two children, Kaison and Cooper. Denver and his wife, Jill, have two daughters, Chloe and Lucy, and two sons, Pete and Hank. Cody is a graduate of UMHB. He was a four-year starter for The Cru at quarterback and was a Gagliardi Trophy finalist in 2003. Cody was the starting quarterback for the first UMHB football team to advance to the postseason and also quarterbacked the Cru to its first ASC Championship in 2002. Cody also served as UMHB's offensive coordinator before entering private business. Cody and his wife, Lindsay, have two sons, Abbott and Gus, and a daughter, Annie James.

CRU ASSISTANT COACHES

LARRY HARMON - DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR



Larry Harmon is in his 20th season as UMHB's defensive coordinator after spending three years coaching the Cru secondary. During his tenure as defensive coordinator, the UMHB defense has ranked among the nation's best in total defense, scoring defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense. The Cru has also broken every major school defensive record since Coach Harmon joined the UMHB coaching staff. Under his direction, the Cru defense has produced 15 AFCA All-Americans and 15 ASC Defensive Players of the Year. Last year, The Cru led the ASC in most major defensive categories and topped the league in rushing defense and sacks. UMHB also led the nation in rushing defense in 2006. In addition to his defensive coordinator duties, Coach Harmon also works with UMHB's kick return and kick coverage teams. He was named

Division III Coordinator of the Year by Footballscoop.com following the 2017 campaign.

Coach Harmon spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State prior to joining UMHB. He helped guide the Bearcats to the NCAA Division II national championship in 1998. Harmon also spent one season as an assistant coach at South Dakota State before moving to Northwest Missouri.

Harmon is a 1995 graduate of South Dakota State University. He was a four-year letterman as a strong safety for the Jackrabbits. Larry is pictured with his wife, Sandi, and the couple's two children, Brett and Christopher.

STEPHEN LEE - OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR



Stephen Lee is in his sixth season as offensive coordinator for the Cru after joining the staff in the spring of 2016. The team set new school records in every passing category in his first year on the staff in 2016 and scored 800 points in a season for the first time in program history in 2018. Lee came to UMHB after spending the previous five seasons at West Texas A&M University. Lee served as the Buffaloes offensive coordinator for the last four of those seasons. WTAMU also set an NCAA Division II record for passing yardage in a season under his direction and earned a pair of postseason berths during his time on staff.

Coach Lee is a 1993 graduate of Angelo State University and was a four-year letterman for the Rams as a quarterback and fullback. He earned a Master's from Western New Mexico. Lee has also made coaching stops at Howard Payne University, Western New Mexico University and Brenham High School. Lee and his wife, Molly, have four children, Jarrett, Jordan, Jacy and Katie. Jarrett played quarterback at LSU and later signed with the San Diego Chargers. Lee is pictured with Molly.

JACK JOHNSON - SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR/LBS



Jack Johnson is in his seventh season as a full-time assistant after returning to his alma mater in the summer of 2015 and will coordinate UMHB's special teams and work with linebackers again this year. Under his leadership, UMHB the country in kickoff return average in 2017 and UMHB topped the nation in punt return average in 2018. Johnson returned to the UMHB sidelines after spending the previous nine seasons as defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Bridgewater (VA) College. He helped guide the Eagles to a 59-31 record and Bridgewater led the ODAC in total defense, scoring defense, rush defense and pass defense during the 2014 season.

Coach Johnson was a four-year letterman and starter for the Cru as a defensive end and was a member of the inaugural UMHB team in 1998. Johnson also spent four years as a student and graduate assistant coach with The Cru. He graduated from UMHB with a degree in exercise and sport science and then earned his Master's degree in education from UMHB in May of 2005. Jack and his wife, Shelby, were married in December of 2020.

CRU ASSISTANT COACHES

MARK CAREY - DEFENSIVE LINE



Mark Carey is in his fifth season as a full-time assistant after returning to his alma mater in the summer of 2017 and works with the Cru defensive line. He returned to UMHB after spending the previous five seasons as co-defensive coordinator at Texas Lutheran University. Carey helped guide the Bulldogs to three straight SCAC Championships and his defenses were also nationally ranked in multiple categories each season. He also spent two years as defensive line coach at TLU before he was promoted to coordinator.

Coach Carey was a two-year letterman for the Cru as a tight end and later spent six years as an assistant coach at UMHB. The Cru won five ASC titles and advanced to the Stagg Bowl in 2004 with Carey on staff. He graduated from UMHB in 2006 and also earned his Master's Degree from UMHB. Carey is pictured with his wife, Jessica, and the couple's three children, Theresa, Maria and Sterling. Jessica is also a UMHB graduate and played volleyball.

STEVEN THRASH - WIDE RECEIVERS



Steven Thrash is in his fifth season as a full-time assistant with the Cru after joining the UMHB coaching staff in the summer of 2017 and will work with the wide receivers again this year. He also spent several years as head coach of the Cru junior varsity program. Thrash came to UMHB after spending the previous four seasons as an assistant coach at Abilene Christian University. He has also coached at Texas A&M-Kingsville and Northeastern Oklahoma Junior College in his career.

Coach Thrash was a four-year letterman as a wide receiver at Texas Lutheran University. He was a three-year starter, an All-ASC selection and finished his career as the Bulldogs Division III era leader in career receptions. Thrash graduated from TLU with a degree in kinesiology in 2010 and also earned his Master's of Education from Pittsburg State University in 2014. Thrash is pictured with his wife, Chantel, and the couple's two daughters, Tatum and Tinsley, and son Brayden. Chantel Thrash is also a graduate of TLU.

BILL BLEIL - OFFENSIVE LINE



Bill Bleil is in his second season as an assistant coach at UMHB and will work with the Cru offensive line. Bleil joined UMHB after two-year stint at Lamar University. He coached the first conference Offensive Lineman of the Year in program history and helped the Cardinals to a top-ten rushing offense in his first season. Bleil also spent five years as head coach at Western Carolina University and won Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors in that time. He has 27 years of Division I coaching experience and has also made stops at Iowa State, Pittsburgh, Missouri Southern, Rhode Island, Akron, Northern Illinois, South Dakota, University of the Pacific and Northwestern College.

Bleil is a 1981 graduate of Northwestern College and earned a Master's Degree from New Mexico Highlands the following year. Bleil and his wife, Laurel, have two sons and two grandchildren. The couple's sons, Kevin and Tim are both assistant football coaches at Stephen F. Austin University.

NICK BRACE - DEFENSIVE TACKLES/HEAD JV COACH



Nick Brace is in his first season as a full-time assistant coach at UMHB and will work with the Cru defensive tackles. He will also serve as head coach of the Cru junior varsity program. Brace spent four seasons as a graduate assistant and part-time assistant coach at UMHB and was on staff for the 2018 National Championship team. He has also helped coach the Cru to four ASC titles during his tenure. Brace has also made collegiate coaching stop at the University of Albany, Methodist University, St. John Fisher College, the University of Buffalo and Mansfield University.

Brace is a 2012 graduate of St. John Fisher College and earned a Master's Degree from UMHB in business administration in 2018. He was a four-year football letterman at St. John Fisher as a linebacker.

CRU ASSISTANT COACHES



GAVIN BURFORD LINEBACKERS

Gavin Burford is in his second season as an assistant coach for the Cru. He will primarily work with the linebackers this season. Burford is a 2018 graduate of Abilene Christian and is working on his Master's in sports administration at UMHB. He played two years of football at both Abilene Christian and West Florida University. He was an All-Region selection as a linebacker at West Florida and set a school record for single-game tackles.



MASON CHAPA RUNNING BACKS

Mason Chapa is in his first season as a graduate assistant coach for the Cru. He will work primarily with running backs and assist in strength and conditioning. Chapa played defensive tackle for UMHB and spent three seasons as a Student Assistant Coach. He graduated from UMHB in May of 2021 with a degree in History. Chapa is currently working toward a master's degree in sport administration.



COLT GARRETT QUARTERBACKS

Colt Garrett is in his first season as an assistant coach for the Cru. He will work primarily with quarterbacks. Garrett played quarterback at Texas Tech University from 2016-2019 and at Angelo State University from 2019-2020. He was an All-Big XII Academic Team member from 2016-2018 and earned all-LSC honors in 2019 and 2020. Garrett graduated from Texas Tech University in 2019 with a degree in kinesiology. He also earned his MBA from Angelo State University in 2020.



JASE HAMMACK RUNNING BACKS

Jase Hammack is in his second season as an assistant coach for the Cru after leading UMHB to the 2018 National Championship. Hammack was a two-year starter and two-time All-ASC selection at quarterback. The Academic All-ASC selection also played at Abilene Christian and McMurry. He will graduate from UMHB in December of 2020 with a degree in general studies and begin working on a Master's Degree. Hammack is a native of Andrews.



JOEY LONGORIA DEFENSIVE LINE

Joey Longoria is in his second season as an assistant coach for the Cru. Longoria was an All-American and Gagliardi Trophy Semifinalist as a defensive tackle for UMHB and also earned Academic All-District honors. Longoria was a two-time ASC Defensive Lineman of the Year, two-time All-ASC honoree and three-time Academic All-Conference selection during his playing career. Longoria graduated from UMHB with a degree in computer science and is currently working toward a graduate degree in information systems.



STONE PAUL SAFETIES

Stone Paul is in his first season as a graduate assistant for the Cru. He will work primarily with safeties. Paul was an outside linebacker at Hendrix College from 2015-2019 and went on to coach that position for the 2020-2021 season. He graduated from Hendrix College in 2019 with a degree in history.



DAN REINFRANK RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Dan Reinfrank is in his first season with UMHB. Reinfrank serves as graduate assistant for recruiting and community service. He played collegiate football at UW-River Falls and spent three years as an offensive assistant there. Reinfrank earned the Senior Merit academic award while at UWRF. He graduated from UW-River Falls in 2020 with a degree in business administration management.



CHANCE RIEKEN OFFENSIVE LINE

It took a little while to knock off the rust from a 14-month layoff, but the Cru finally got it rolling in a 41-0 victory over Belhaven University in the long-delayed season opener in Jackson. UMHB has now won the last eight meetings against the Blazers.

Tommy Bowden opened the scoring with a highlight reel quality 37-yard touchdown run and Glenn Thornton fell on a Belhaven fumble in the end zone to give the Cru a 14-0 lead after the first quarter. Bowden hit Kadarius Daniels with a 24-yard TD pass and was credited with a 15-yard TD strike to Daniels off a forward pitch to K.J. Miller and a lateral to Daniels to make it 27-0 Cru at halftime. Bowden added a 42-yard touchdown scamper and Kyle King tacked on a 35-yard touchdown pass to Brenton Martin to close out the scoring. Belhaven only crossed midfield one time on the day and that came on the final drive of the opening half.

Bowden ran for 87 yards and two touchdowns and added 104 passing yards and two scores in his first collegiate start. Daniels had two touchdowns in his first game since 2018 after sitting out last season with an injury. K.J. Miller caught six passes for 29 yards and added 84 return yards. Mikkah Hackett topped the defense with 10 total tackles and Khevon Shepard added 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

UMHB finished with just 269 total yards split evenly between the run game and passing attack. The Cru was limited to just 24:09 in time of possession, turned the ball over three times and committed 11 penalties for 78 yards on the day. UMHB held Belhaven to just five first downs and 71 yards of total offense in a suffocating performance.

The Cru dominated the final three quarters and rolled to a 65-20 victory over Louisiana College in the regular season finale at Crusader Stadium. UMHB clinches the out right ASC East Division title and a berth in the ASC Championship Game with the win.

Louisiana College scored on the opening drive, but the Cru answered with Kyle King's 15-yard TD run on its opening possession. K.J. Miller gave UMHB a 13-7 lead with a 52-yard punt return for a TD, but the Wildcats had an answer of their own. Jacob Mueller intercepted an LC pass and returned it eight yards for a score, King added a two-yard run and hit Gary Ruckman with a 33-yard scoring strike as the Cru opened up a 34-13 lead. The Wildcats added a TD before Brandon Cunningham hit a 33-yard field goal on the final play of the first half. King threw touchdown passes of 84 yards to Kadarius Daniels, 50 yards to Romello Cook and 16 yards to Melek Hamilton and Tommy Bowden scored on a 12-yard run as UMHB dominated the final 30 minutes.

King accounted for six total touchdowns and 309 total yards for the Cru and Cook caught four passes for 93 yards and a score. Mueller added 10 total tackles and a fumble recovery to his touchdown. Kenneth Cormier ran for 60 yards on seven carries.

UMHB finished with 539 yards of total offense with 298 of those coming through the air. The Cru defense held the Wildcats to 80 passing yards while forcing three turnovers and recording four sacks in the contest.

2020-21 ASC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

UMHB 23, HARDIN-SIMMONS IS

MAR. 27, 2021 · ABILENE, TX · 3,309

The Cru dominated the first half on both sides of the ball and came up with three huge defensive plays in the second half as UMHB beat Hardin-Simmons 23-15 in the first true conference championship game in American Southwest Conference history on a warm March afternoon in Abilene.

The Cru advanced to the game as the ASC East Division champion and the Cowboys won the ASC West Division to set up the title tilt to wrap up the COVID shortened spring season. HSU earned the right to host the game by virtue of the West Division winning a preseason coin flip.

UMHB set the tone early with Titus Dunk blocking a Hardin-Simmons punt on the game's opening possession. The Cru drove 53 yards in five plays and Kyle King scored on a three-yard quarterback keeper to put UMHB up 7-0 6:39 into the game. The Cowboys could not get untracked against the Cru defense on the ensuing possession and another long UMHB drive led to Brandon Cunningham's 22-yard field goal early in the second quarter for a 10-0 lead. Cunningham would tack on another 25-yard field goal to give the Cru a 13-0 halftime lead as the HSU offense failed to cross midfield after the opening drive of the first half.

HSU came up with a defensive stop to open the second half and Marc Reed hit Gatlin Martin with a two-yard touchdown pass to cut the lead to 13-7 less than five minutes into the third quarter. UMHB put together another nice drive, but could only muster a 37-yard Cunningham field goal to make it a 16-7 game midway through the third period. Jacob Mueller's fourth-down sack gave the ball back to the Cru and Brenton Martin found Gary Ruckman with a seven-yard scoring strike one minute into the fourth quarter to put UMHB on top 23-7. Hardin-Simmons appeared to have an answer on a long pass from Kyle Jones to Rae Millsap, but Jayden Smith punched the ball out of Millsap's arms at the Cru two-yard line and the ball rolled out of the end zone for a huge turnover and momentum shift. The Cowboys would pull to within 23-15 on a Myles Featherston touchdown run and two-point conversion with 7:52 left to play. UMHB's defense responded with another big play as Drake Johnson intercepted Jones to give the Cru a chance to put the game away. Cunningham would have a short field goal try blocked, but UMHB forced four straight incompletions to end the HSU comeback bid.

Kenneth Cormier, Jr. ran for 143 yards on 27 carries in his first start at running back for the Cru. King added 56 rushing yards and a touchdown and threw for 148 more yards. Kadarius Daniels had three catches for 61 yards and Mueller had a huge day defensively with 12 total tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss and his timely sack.

Jones threw for 254 yards for Hardin-Simmons and Millsap caught four passes for 122 yards. Kolby Youngblood led the Cowboy run game with 74 yards on 14 carries and Caleb Bell and Terrell Franklin led the HSU defense with seven tackles apiece.

UMHB controlled the ball for 33:26 of the game clock and ran for 231 yards on 49 attempts. The Cru finished with 386 yards of total offense on the day. UMHB limited Hardin-Simmons to 94 rushing yards and 350 yards of total offense. The Cru also forced two turnovers, recorded two sacks and blocked a punt. The victory gave UMHB its 16th ASC Championship.

UMHB ADMINISTRATION



DR. RANDY O'REAR, UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Randy O'Rear became the 22nd president of the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor when he assumed the office on June 1, 2009. O'Rear was named President and CEO of the university in a unanimous decision by the school's Board of Trustees in September 2008.

Dr. O'Rear is the first president of UMHB who is also an alumnus of the university. He graduated from UMHB with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1988 and earned an MBA from UMHB in 1997. O'Rear earned a doctoral degree in Higher Education from Baylor University in 2004.

O'Rear has served at UMHB since 1988, most recently as executive vice president and chief operating officer. For more than 18 years, O'Rear has been actively involved in fundraising for the university. Under his leadership, gifts and grants dramatically increased, numerous endowed scholarships were established and major capital projects were completed, including the construction of the Parker Academic Center, the Mayborn Campus Center, the Meyer Christian Studies Center and the Crusader Stadium Complex.

O'Rear has also strong ties to the UMHB athletic department. He was also a two-year letterman for the UMHB baseball program as a right-handed pitcher. O'Rear held the school record for wins in a season for five years before that mark was broken in 1992. He also spent one year as a student assistant coach and two years as a full-time assistant coach for the Cru baseball team.

Originally from Waco, O'Rear is a graduate of Robinson High School. He and his wife, Julie, have three children, Ryan, Taylor and Reed. Taylor and her husband, John, a former UMHB soccer standout, have three children. Reed is married to former UMHB basketball player Jesslyn Poole. The O'Rears live in Belton and are members of First Baptist Church, Belton.



DR. MICKEY KERR, VICE PRESIDENT FOR ATHLETICS

Dr. Mickey Kerr took over as Vice President for Athletics at his alma mater on June 1, 2021. Kerr is serving in a new role but is certainly no stranger to UMHB Athletics. Kerr has been a student-athlete, assistant coach, head coach and Faculty Athletic Representative for the Cru during his tenure at UMHB.

Kerr returned to the athletic department after spending the previous 19 years teaching in the school's Mayborn College of Health Sciences' School of Exercise and Sport Science. Kerr has been an athlete, coach and faculty athletic representative for UMHB in addition to his tenure as a professor. Kerr was a four-year letter winner for the UMHB baseball team before graduating in 1980 with a degree in Business Administration. He was head coach of the Cru baseball program from 1981-83 and won the Big State Conference Championship in 1983. He returned to the program in 1994 as an assistant coach before taking over again as head coach from 1997-2001. Kerr won 130 games in his two stints as head coach before moving into academics full-time following the 2001 season. He helped start UMHB's Sport Management program and also served as Associate Dean and Director of UMHB's M.S. in Sport Administration program. Kerr has also served as the Cru's Faculty Athletic Representative from 2018-2021. He earned a Master's Degree in Business Education from West Texas State University in 1989 and a Doctorate in Sport Management from the United States Sports Academy in 2002. He also served as head baseball coach at College of the Southwest from 1985-86 and has coached on the high school level at Belton, Caldwell and Copperas Cove.

Kerr and his wife, Dee, have four children and three granddaughters. Two of the couple's children, Courtney and Mickey, played soccer at UMHB.

CRUSADER STADIUM



Crusader Stadium became the home of UMHB football with the kickoff of the 2013 season. The home opener against 5th ranked Wesley College became the first on-campus game in the history of Cru Football and a school-record crowd of 9,384 people packed into the stadium to see UMHB top the Wolverines 35-7. It is also the largest home crowd to ever watch an American Southwest Conference football team play. Zach Anderson scored on a 41-yard run just 1:17 into the game for the first touchdown in stadium history and he accounted for 299 total yards and three touchdowns overall in the victory. The UMHB defense limited Wesley to -31 yards rushing and 105 yards of total offense in the game while recording four sacks. The win was also the first victory for the Cru over a top five ranked team in stadium history and the game featured a fly-over and post-game fireworks, as well.

The press box features a state-of-the-art control room to handle audio, video board, replay, scoreboard and all game-day communications and coordination. There is a separate print media booth with seating for up to 14 writers. Three separate broadcast booths can accommodate radio or television broadcasts and home and visiting coaches also have their own booths with two-tiered seating to provide outstanding views of the field. The Presidential suite offers prime seating and stadium views, along with space to serve, entertain and feed special guests of the UMHB administration. There are also two other suites available for game-day use by the administration, donors or game-day sponsors.



The varsity locker room features 80 individual wooden lockers with individual ventilation systems to help dry shoulder pads. There is also an auxiliary locker room for use by the Crusader junior varsity, a plush visitor's locker room and coaches locker rooms and training rooms to go with each team locker room. Each locker room also contains separate shower and rest room facilities and is fully wired for cable television and video. A large multi-purpose room is located adjacent to the varsity locker room and can be used for team meetings, video sessions, media interviews or even smaller banquets. The visitor and auxiliary locker rooms are also used for the numerous high school regular season or postseason games hosted at Crusader Stadium. The service level of the stadium also includes an equipment storage and issue room to serve the Cru on game-day and functions along with the Cru's practice facility at Cummins and Andersen Field Houses.

Crusader Stadium hosted ten UMHB football games in its inaugural season as the Cru played a school-record ten home games. The facility has also played host to an ESPN broadcast crew for the NCAA Division III National Semifinals in 2013, 2016, 2017 and 2018. The UMHB football team has posted a 59-3 home record in seven seasons in the new facility with the only losses coming in NCAA playoff games. The Cru played in front of 41,563 in the first season in the stadium to set another school record with an average home attendance of 4,156 fans per game. Crusader Stadium has also played host to multiple high school playoff games, high school band competitions and UMHB's Spring 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 Commencements. The adjacent Bawcom Student Union is located on the visitor's side of the field and provides multiple facilities to enhance the Cru game-day experience. Crusader Stadium was designed by the renowned architecture firm, Populous.
