



HEAD FOOTBALL COACH



LARRY HARMON

HEAD COACH

Larry Harmon was promoted to Head Football Coach in January 2022 after spending the previous 20 seasons as the Cru's defensive coordinator. During his tenure as defensive coordinator, UMHB's defense ranked among the nation's best in total defense, scoring defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense. Under his direction, the Cru defense produced 17 ASC Defensive Players of the Year and four national defensive players of the year. UMHB also led the nation in rushing defense in 2006. In addition to his defensive coordinator duties, Coach Harmon also worked with UMHB's kick return and kick coverage teams. He opened his career at UMHB in 1999, spending three years as UMHB's secondary coach.

Coach Harmon spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State prior to joining UMHB. He helped guide the Bearcats to the NCAA Division II national championship in 1998. Coach Harmon also spent one season as an assistant coach at South Dakota State before moving to Northwest Missouri.

Coach Harmon is a 1995 graduate of South Dakota State University. He was a four-year letterman as a strong safety for the Jackrabbits football team. Larry and his wife, Sandi, have two children, Brett and Christopher.



FOOTBALL COORDINATORS

ANDY PADRON
OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QUARTERBACKS

Padron returned to UMHB in February 2022. He spent the last three seasons as offensive coordinator at DeSoto High School, where he guided the Eagle offense to two state quarterfinal finishes. Padron also spent two seasons at Bowling Green State University as co-offensive coordinator. Padron started his collegiate coaching career with ASC football affiliate Texas Lutheran University in 2010. He spent one year as the Bulldogs' quarterbacks coach before serving as the program's offensive coordinator for four years. Padron helped lead a winless Bulldog team to a national ranking, first NCAA postseason appearance and three conference championships (SCAC).

Padron is a 2007 graduate of UMHB where he played four years of quarterback under Pete Fredenburg. He was a part of the 2004 UMHB football team that made program history with the school's first national championship appearance. Padron helped UMHB to four ASC championships as his senior class held a record of 41-8. He and his wife, Sarah, have two daughters, Carrington and Landrey.

JACK JOHNSON
DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/LINEBACKERS

Jack Johnson was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2022 after spending the last seven seasons as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator.

Johnson spent nine years as defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Bridgewater (VA) College, where he helped the Eagles to a 59-31 overall record. He also spent four years as a student assistant and graduate assistant coach at UMHB, helping the Cru to a 41-6 record, three ASC championships and the program's first Stagg Bowl appearance.

Johnson was a member of the inaugural UMHB football team in 1998 and a four-year letterman at defensive end. He graduated from UMHB with a degree in Exercise and Sport Science in 2003 and earned a master's degree in Education from UMHB in December of 2005. He and his wife, Shelby, have one daughter, Jensyn.

MARK CAREY
SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR/DEFENSIVE LINE

Mark Carey was promoted to special teams coordinator in 2022. He also coaches the defensive line.

Carey spent five seasons as co-defensive coordinator at Texas Lutheran University, where he helped the Bulldogs to three consecutive SCAC championships and the program's first NCAA postseason appearance. His defenses were nationally ranked in multiple categories in each of those seasons. He also spent six years as an assistant coach at UMHB and helped lead the Cru to five ASC championships and the Cru's first Stagg Bowl appearance. He was a two-year letterman for UMHB as a tight end and also played two years of football at Louisiana College.

Carey graduated from UMHB in 2006 and also earned his master's degree at UMHB. Carey and his wife Jessica, a former Cru volleyball player, have three children, Theresa, Maria and Sterling.



NICK BRACE

DEFENSIVE TACKLES/HEAD JV COACH

Nick Brace was promoted to full-time assistant coach in July of 2021, coaching defensive tackles. He returned to UMHB after spending the fall of 2020 as a defensive assistant coach at the University of Albany. Brace also spent 2017-19 as a graduate and part-time assistant coach for the Cru. He has been a part of four ASC championship teams and two national championship squads during his tenure on the UMHB coaching staff. Brace has also made collegiate coaching stops at Methodist University, St. John Fisher College, the University of Buffalo and Mansfield University.

Brace is a 2012 graduate of St. John Fisher College and he was a four-year letterman for the Cardinals as a linebacker. He earned his undergraduate degree in corporate finance and completed his master's of business administration at UMHB in 2018.



MATT CANNATA

OFFENSIVE LINE

Matt Cannata joined UMHB as offensive line coach in February 2022. He came to UMHB after a three-year stint at UNC-Charlotte, where he guided the 49ers to their first-ever bowl game appearance in 2019. Cannata also served as offensive graduate assistant at Austin Peay in 2018, where he coached offensive line and tight ends.

Cannata spent two years at Texas Lutheran University, where he served as offensive line coach/run game coordinator and recruiting coordinator. He is a 2013 graduate of Texas Lutheran University, where he started 38 games at center for the Bulldogs. He was also a two-time academic all-ASC selection.



JEREMY HARNESS


WIDE RECEIVERS

Jeremy Harness joined UMHB in March 2022 after spending the 2021 season at UNC-Charlotte, where he coached defensive backs and special teams. Prior to that, Harness spent three seasons with Southeastern Oklahoma State University.

Harness was a four-year letterman at Murray State University, where he holds the school record for receptions in a game (19) and ranks third in receptions and 100+ yard games and fifth in receiving yards. Harness also spent two seasons as a student assistant with the Racers.

Harness spent two seasons at Central Hardin High School before moving to the collegiate coaching ranks. He holds a degree in Health and Physical Education from Murray State University and a master's degree in Athletic Administration from Southeastern Oklahoma State.

NATHANIEL JONES SECONDARY

Nathaniel Jones joined the Cru as secondary coach in July 2022.

Jones comes to UMHB after a season as special teams coordinator and cornerbacks coach at Loras College. Jones also has collegiate coaching stops at University of St. Francis (2015-16, 2005-06), University of Texas at San Antonio (2011-13), Midwestern State University (2008-11) and Northwestern State University (2006). Jones's high school career includes head coaching stops at St. Augustine High School (New Orleans) and Edna Karr High School (New Orleans) and assistant coaching jobs at Reagan High School (Houston) and Clark High School (New Orleans) and worked in scouting and football development at the National Football League in London.

Jones played collegiate football at University of Louisiana-Monroe from 1995-1999 where he earned a degree in general studies.



RANDY SMITH KICKERS/ACADEMICS

Randy Smith is in his fourth season with the Cru. He works primarily with the kickers and helps with academics. Smith is a 26-year veteran of the United States Army as a Special Operations Officer. He has served eight combat tours in Afghanistan, Iraq and Africa. Smith currently serves as the Texas State Guard Special Troops Battalion Commander for 2nd Battalion, 6th Brigade headquartered in Austin. Smith has also coached collegiately at Louisiana Tech and Southern Mississippi. He kicked collegiately at Auburn University and Southern Arkansas University, where he set school records for most consecutive PATs and longest field goal. Smith also signed professional contracts with the Dallas Cowboys, Philadelphia Eagles and San Diego Chargers. Smith is married to Valerie, who is also an Auburn University alum.



KAREN GOFF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS COORDINATOR

Karen Goff has been with the UMHB football program since the program's inception in 1997. She was the first person hired by inaugural head coach Pete Fredenburg and is typically the first person people see when they enter Andersen Field House. She is responsible for all internal football operations, team travel, meals and team business. Goff also serves as the assistant to the head coach. She joined UMHB after spending four years as the assistant to the head football coach at Baylor University.

Goff graduated from UMHB in the fall of 2011 with a degree in education. Her husband, Alex, is also a graduate of UMHB. The couple has four children and nine grandchildren.

MASON CHAPA DEFENSIVE LINE

Mason is in his second season as a graduate assistant coach for the Cru. Chapa played defensive tackle for UMHB and spent three seasons as a student assistant coach. CHRIS CHILDRESS SAFETIES

Trevor is in his first year with the Cru and will work with the running backs and A-backs. Trevor was an all-conference center at Texas Lutheran University and earned four academic all-conference awards. He received a degree in sociology from TLU and is working toward a master's in sport administration at UMHB.



CHARLIE HUSCHKA RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Charlie is in his first year as recruiting coordinator at UMHB. He was a wide receiver at UW-River Falls, where he graduated magna cum laude with a degree in elementary education. Stephen earned his Bachelor of Behavioral Science degree in Athletic Training at Hardin-Simmons University in May 2015, where he was an athletic training student for four years.



2018 NCAA DIII CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON



UMHB set a goal for the 2018 season to play in the first NCAA Division III Football National Championship Game played in the state of Texas. UMHB opened the season with a program-record 91 points at Albright College. Markeith Miller ran for six touchdowns in that game, setting a new program record for rushing scores in a contest. The Cru followed that with a 68-7 win at Sul Ross State and a 47-14 win at Texas Lutheran. UMHB opened the home slate with a 77-7 victory over Southwestern and went on a defensive surge, blanking the next three opponents in Hardin-Simmons, Howard Payne and Belhaven. The Cru earned a pair of 80-7 wins over McMurry and Louisiana College before closing the regular season with a 50-15 win at East Texas Baptist. UMHB faced Hardin-Simmons in the first round of the NCAA Postseason, beating the Cowboys 27-6. The Cru earned a 75-9 win over Berry College before facing Saint John's in the quarterfinals. UMHB escaped with a 21-18 win over the Johnnies before outscoring UW-Whitewater 31-14 in the semi-finals. The Cru travelled to Shenandoah, Texas for the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl and overcame its first deficit of the season to earn a 24-16 win over the University of Mount Union. UMHB led 14-13 at the half before outscoring the Purple Raiders 10-3 in the final two quarters. Quarterback Jase Hammack threw for 147 yards and two touchdowns while T.J. Josey totaled five receptions for 78 yards and a score. Josey earned Most Outstanding Player honors after the contest as the Cru went undefeated at 15-0 on the year.

2021 NCAA DIII CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON



UMHB opened the 2021 season with an 84-6 win over Simpson College, setting a new program record for rushing touchdowns in a game with 10 running scores. The Cru followed that with a 34-14 win over East Texas Baptist at home before earning its first road win in a 54-3 win over Southwestern. UMHB faced its first true challenge of the season against Hardin-Simmons, trailing 28-7 at the half. The Cru responded, outscoring the Cowboys 27-0 in the second half of action to secure the win. UMHB held HSU to just 11 total yards of offense in the third quarter and thwarted a late offensive surge with a Jayden Smith interception in the end zone, sealing the win for the Cru. UMHB blanked Austin College in its next contest and went on to outscore ASC opponents 286-34 in the remaining regular-season games. The NCAA Playoffs opened against Trinity University at Crusader Stadium. The Tigers took an early lead with a first-quarter field goal before UMHB knocked kicks through in the second and third quarters for a 6-3 lead. Aphonso Thomas scored the first touchdown of the contest with 2:05 remaining to seal the 13-3 UMHB win. The Cru held Birmingham-Southern to just one touchdown in the NCAA Second Round before beating Linfield University 49-24 in the Quarterfinals. King threw for 346 yards and six touchdowns against the Wildcats while K.J. Miller matched his previous record for receptions in a game with 12. The Cru went back on the road for the semifinals, travelling to UW-Whitewater. UMHB opened that game with a 17-0 lead and held the Warhawk offense to just one score, sealing the program's spot in the NCAA Division III National Championship. UMHB travelled to Canton, Ohio for the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl and faced reigning national champion North Central. King threw for a program record 463 yards in the contest as UMHB outscored the Cardinals 57-24 for the program's second national title. Mikkah Hackett led the Cru with two interceptions, two sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in the contest. He also had 10 total tackles, earning Most Outstanding Player.

DR. RANDY O'REAR UMHB PRESIDENT

Randy O'Rear became the 22nd president of the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor on June 1, 2009. He is the first president of UMHB to also be an alumnus. O'Rear graduated from UMHB with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1988, earned an MBA from UMHB in 1997, and earned a doctor of education degree from Baylor University in 2004.

O'Rear has served at UMHB since 1988 when he was hired as the assistant baseball coach. Over the years, he served in many capacities, including executive vice president and chief operating officer.

O'Rear has strong ties to the UMHB athletic department. He came to the university as a student-athlete from Bee County College, where he was a pitcher and third baseman and was selected to play in the Texas Junior College All-Star Game in 1984. At UMHB, he was a pitcher, third baseman, and first baseman. He was a First-Team All-Conference selection his junior year as a third baseman. In his senior year, he was a First-Team All-Conference and First-Team All-District selection as a pitcher when he went 9-3, setting the school record for wins in a season. The record stood for five years before that mark was broken in 1992. O'Rear was also selected as the overall UMHB Senior Athlete of the Year in 1987.

O'Rear's wife, Julie, also has strong ties to UMHB athletics. She played volleyball at UMHB, was a member of the inaugural softball team and was selected as the First-Team All-Conference shortstop in 1989.

DR. MICKEY KERR VICE PRESIDENT FOR ATHLETICS


Dr. Mickey Kerr took over as Vice President for Athletics at his alma mater on June 1, 2021. Kerr has also been a student-athlete, assistant coach, head coach and Faculty Athletic Representative for the Cru during his tenure at UMHB.

Kerr returned to the athletic department after spending the previous 19 years teaching in the Mayborn College of Health Sciences' School of Exercise and Sport Science. Kerr was a four-year letter winner for the UMHB baseball team before graduating in 1980 with a degree in Business Administration. He was head coach of the Cru baseball program from 1981-83 and won the Big State Conference Championship in 1983. He returned to the program in 1994 as an assistant coach before taking over again as head coach from 1997-2001. Kerr won 130 games in his two stints as head coach before moving into academics full-time following the 2001 season. He helped start UMHB's Sport Management program and also served as Associate Dean and Director of UMHB's M.S. in Sport Administration program. Kerr has also served as the Cru's Faculty Athletic Representative from 2018-2021. He earned a Master's Degree in Business Education from West Texas State University in 1989 and a Doctorate in Sport Management from the United States Sports Academy in 2002. He also served as head baseball coach at College of the Southwest from 1985-86 and has coached on the high school level at Belton, Caldwell and Copperas Cove.

Kerr and his wife, Dee, have four children and three granddaughters. Two of the couple's children, Courtney and Mickey, played soccer at UMHB.

CRUSADER STADIUM



STADIUM OPENING

Crusader Stadium opened in a 35-7 win over fifth-ranked Wesley College on September 21, 2013. The game was the first on-campus game in the history of Cru Football with a school-record crowd of 9,384. It is also the largest home crowd to ever watch an American Southwest Conference football team play at home. The game also featured a fly-over and post-game fireworks.

Crusader Stadium hosted ten UMHB football games in its inaugural season. The Cru played in front of 41,563 fans that year. Crusader Stadium was designed by the renowned architecture firm, Populous.

LOCKER ROOMS

The varsity locker room features 80 individual wooden lockers with individual ventilation systems to help dry shoulder pads. There is also an auxiliary locker room for use by the Crusader junior varsity, a plush visitor locker room and coaches locker rooms and training rooms to go with each team locker room. Each locker room is fully wired for cable television and video. A large multi-purpose room is located adjacent to the varsity locker room and can be used for team meetings, video sessions, media interviews or even smaller banquets. The visitor and auxiliary locker rooms are also used for the numerous high school regular season or postseason games hosted at Crusader Stadium. The service level of the stadium also includes an equipment storage and issue room to serve the Cru on gameday and functions along with the Cru's practice facility at Cummins and Andersen Field Houses.



PRESS BOX

The press box features a state-of-the-art control room to handle audio, video board, replay, scoreboard and all gameday communications. There is a separate print media booth with seating for up to 14 writers. Three separate broadcast booths can accommodate radio or television broadcasts and home and visiting coaches also have their own booths with two-tiered seating to provide outstanding views of the field. The Presidential suite offers prime seating and stadium views, along with space to serve, entertain and feed special guests of the UMHB administration. Two other suites are available for use by the administration, donors or sponsors.

2022 UMHB FOOTBALL SEASON GUIDE

FREDENBURG FIELD

UMHB announced the naming of the field at Crusader Stadium to Fredenburg Field after longtime head football coach Pete Fredenburg in June 2022.

Fredenburg started the UMHB football program in 1998, guiding the Crusaders to a 3-7 record that season. UMHB earned the program's first winning record at 9-1 in 2000 and made its first NCAA postseason appearance in 2001. The Crusaders won their first of 17 American Southwest Conference (ASC) titles in 2002 before making an appearance in the NCAA Division III Football National Championship in 2004, just seven seasons into existence.

The Cru amassed a 231-39 record during Fredenburg's 24-year tenure with undefeated ASC records in 13 of those seasons. They advanced to the NCAA postseason 17 times with 47 playoff wins, more than all other American Southwest Conference programs combined. UMHB has been to at least the quarterfinal round of the playoffs in 12 seasons, with national titles in 2018 and 2021. Coach Fredenburg boasted a 51-3 record inside Crusader Stadium with six undefeated at-home seasons.


Coach Fredenburg was named 2021 D3football.com Coach of the Year after guiding the Cru to its second national title with a 57-24 win over North Central College in Stagg Bowl XLVIII. Fredenburg also earned national Coach of the Year honors from American Football Monthly (2013), Liberty Mutual (2013) and the American Football Coaches Association (2016). He is a 10-time ASC Coach of the Year and 10-time AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year.




COST & FINANCIAL AID


