Oh captain, my captain

Five seniors have been elected by their teammates as the captains of the 2015 Chadron State College football team.

They include cornerback Conor Casey of Rapid City and linebacker Dylan Furrier of Tucson, Ariz., who also were among the Eagles' captains last fall.

Two teammates at Natrona County High School in Casper also will serve as CSC captains this fall. They are safety Cole Montgomery and wide receiver Kyle Vinich. Also elected was Danny O'Boyle of Gering, who is a receiver and also returns punts.

The Show-Me State hasn't shown many wins

Before the last three victories over Missouri S&T, football teams from Missouri have not been kind to Chadron State College in its history. The Eagles are now 3-8 against teams from the Show-Me State.

CSC lost to Missouri Western once and has suffered seven defeats at the hands of perennial power, Northwest Missouri. The Bearcats' two most recent victories over the Eagles came in the NCAA D-II Playoffs in 2006 and 2007.

D-II vs. FCS

The Eagles have played eight games against FCS (formerly NCAA IAA) opponents since 1997, winning two of them. Until the Eagles suffered a 33-6 setback to Montana State, they had never lost any of them by more than two touchdowns.

Chadron State's victories include the rousing 35-24 upset of the Bobcats in 2006, one week after Montana State defeated the University of Colorado. CSC also bombarded Northern Colorado 31-0 the following year.

CSC to begin 24th season in the RMAC

Although the CSC football program has been around for more than a century, the Eagles have only played in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference for 23 years. During that time, they've become one of the top teams in the nation and have been the standard in the RMAC.

Chadron State joined the RMAC in 1991 and since then the Eagles have compiled a record of 158-43 in the conference for a winning percentage of over 78 percent.

The Cowboy State produces some talent

Two graduates of Kelly Walsh High School who are redshirt freshmen at Chadron State College have been tabbed as probable starters when the Eagles open their football season on Thursday, Sept. 3 at Missouri Science and Technology at Rolla.

They are Kirk Durtsche at safety and Jake Geil at center.

Defensive coordinator Jeff Larson said Durtsche has probably had the best fall camp of any player in the secondary.

Geil also has received high marks from Jay Long, the Eagles' head coach who also tutors the offensive linemen.

Durtsche is 5-11, 200 pounds and Geil is 6-5. 285.

CSC offensive coordinator Chris Stein said another young player from Wyoming also has performed extra well during preseason drills. He is inside receiver Colton Wright of Burns.

Wright's emergence means he is fully recovered from the torn ACL that he suffered early in his senior year at Burns in the fall of 2012. His accolades prior to that included winning the Class 2A high hurdles at the Wyoming State High School Meet as a junior.

Other Wyoming natives who figure prominently in the Chadron State picture include seniors Kyle Vinich at wide receiver and Cole Montgomery at safety. Both are Natrona County High graduates and are returning starters. Vinich led the CSC receivers last season with 63 receptions for 899 yards and nine touchdowns and Montgomery was the team's fifth leading tackler with 62 and the interception leader with four.

In addition, both of CSC's starting outside linebackers are from the Cowboy State. Clay Cundall, is a senior is from Greybull and Collin Eisenman is a sophomore from Sheridan.

Eagles hope to repeat successful Missouri trip

After having a successful trip to Missouri for its season opener last week, the Chadron State College football team is hoping for a similar experience this week, when it meets another Missouri opponent.

The Eagles will play the Missouri State Bears at 2 p.m. Saturday in Springfield, located about 120 miles southwest of Rolla, where the Eagles defeated Missouri Science and Technology 40-27 last Thursday night.

CSC head coach Jay Long said the Eagles will take the same route and eat in the same places most of the way. He hopes his team will play as well.

He noted that the Bears will be a major challenge. They are a Football Championship Subdivision team, which means they can offer 63 full scholarships, more than double what NCAA Division II schools such as Chadron State provide.

"It's going to be a big test for us to play Missouri State," Long said. "It will have a big time atmosphere. Their stadium seats 20,000, they've got a new head coach and it's their first home game. We're excited about the chance to play them and see what we can do."

The Bears finished at 4-8 last year, but beat both the Universities of North Dakota (38-0) and South Dakota (31-12). Four of their losses were by 10 or fewer points.

At the end of the season, Terry Allen, the head coach since 2006, was fired and Dave Steckel, the associate head coach for the Missouri Tigers and a member of that staff for 14 years, was hired as the replacement.

While last year's starting quarterback and leading receiver have departed, the Bears return their two leading rushers and numerous other starters from a year ago. Calan Crowder, a 6-foot-1, 205-pound sophomore, led the running backs with 153 carries for 762 yards, and Phoenix Johnson, a 5-9, 188-pound junior, carried 143 yards for 575 yards.

JAY LONG

Head Coach/Offensive Line
Fourth Year

No doubt about it, Jay Long has turned heads in just four years as Chadron State's head football coach.

Under Long's guidance, the Eagles have averaged more than eight wins a season and that includes a trip to the 2012 playoffs when CSC went 9-3 overall, 8-1 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and hosted West Texas A&M in the first round of the playoffs in 2012.

The Eagles ended the season as the 18th ranked team in the nation by both the American Football Coaches Association and D2Football.com.

In 2013, the Eagles went 8-3 and finished second in the RMAC and in 2014, CSC wound up third in the RMAC with another 8-3 mark.

In three years, Long, who also serves as the offensive line coach, has coached five all-conference linemen, four All-Americans, a Harlon Hill national finalist, and mentored All-American and NFL player, Garrett Gilkey.

Long is the 25th head football coach at CSC and the third who also played for the Eagles. Orin Weymouth and Ruffus Trapp also played and coached for Chadron State but a former football player hasn't coached for the school since 1937.

Long spent three seasons as the head coach at Black Hills State in Spearfish, S.D., where he has guided the Yellowjackets to a 15-15 record before coming to Chadron State in 2012.

Prior to being the head coach at Black Hills State, he was an assistant coach at the school from 2003-09. During that time he served as the offensive coordinator, offensive line coach, recruiting coordinator and the strength and conditioning coach. The Yellowjackets won two conference titles and appeared in the NAIA playoffs two times while Long coached the offensive line.

Long, who graduated from Chadron State College in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in science, was a two-time Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference selection at center and also earned Farm Team All-American honors. He also wrestled at heavyweight and qualified for the national tournament for the Eagles.

Long and his wife, Kresi, have three children, Carson, Kaelee and Alivia.
