Standing in the Hall of Fame

Marvin Jackson, who starred for Chadron State College from 1999 to 2004 in the defensive backfield, was enshrined over the summer in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Hall of Fame. The Cheyenne, Wyoming, native was in attendance as he was honored in an induction ceremony on July 14 at the league's annual Hall of Fame and Awards Ceremony, in front of friends and family.

The former Eagle cornerback and kickoff return all-star, who holds not only the CSC record but also the conference record for career interceptions, was the first Chadron State athlete to earn first-team RMAC all-conference honors four consecutive years, received all-West Region honors three times and was a consensus All-American as a junior and senior in 2002 and '03.

He also was placed on the Nebraska NCAA Division II all-star team four times by the Omaha World-Herald and was selected that team's defensive captain twice. Jackson was voted the RMAC's Defensive Player of the Year in 2002.

In addition, Jackson averaged 29 yards on 35 kickoff returns and carried two of them 93 and 83 yards for scores. He also averaged 11.4 yards on 25 punt returns.

During his career, the Eagles were 34-8 overall and 28-4 in the RMAC and won or shared two conference championships.

Marvin's brother, Jonath, was complimentary of the Hall of Famer in a video interview produced by the league staff. He praised his younger sibling's drive, winning attitude, and character in the short presentation.

Marvin, speaking to the crowd of over 200 assembled at the Colorado Springs Marriott, was grateful for the competition and success he experienced at Chadron State. He also had some words of wisdom for his supporters who gathered to honor his collegiate career: "I'm so happy you all are here. 'There's a lot more to life than sports,' is what I'll say. Try hard at everything. Thank you."

End of an Era

An era of nearly 90 years comes to a close following this season, as Elliott Field and Don Beebe Stadium, including the Con Marshall Pressbox, will all be demolished to make way for a new football facility with the same titles.

The renovation and construction at Beebe Stadium is timely. In 2014, engineers alerted CSC officials that the structural integrity of the central stands were failing. In addition to safety issues, other challenges for the stadium include poor drainage, deteriorating field conditions and inadequate amenities for spectators and game personnel.

The new football complex will include a concourse and two-story pavilion that will house game officials, coaches, media and fans, a central grandstand, and a new field turf surface.

As far as is known, the Chadron State College football field has always been at the same location - along 12th Street at the base of C Hill. College history says that in 1921 "the new athletic field, including a quarter mile track, was completed." (continued)

The field, which is named for Robert I. Elliott, the college's second president and an ardent football fan, is one of the relatively few that runs east and west.

Temporary bleachers were used prior to 1929, when the Chadron Memorial Stadium Association was formed. Two former standout football players, Orin Weymouth and LaVerne McKelvey, were chosen to head the drive. The Chadron Chronicle reported that the immediate goal was to raise between \$4,000 and \$5,000. The new stadium had a seating capacity of approximately 1,500, but many of the crowds were much larger than that and fans stood along the sidelines or sat on banks along the south side of the field.

Although a small pressbox was eventually added at the top of the stadium, there wasn't much change in the stadium until a fundraising drive was launched in 1995 that more than doubled the seating capacity for Eagles fans and added two sets of bleachers for the visitors' fans on the north side of the field. The expansion also included doubling the size of the pressbox. The pressbox is named in honor of Con Marshall, the longtime sports and news information director at the school.

During homecoming 2000, the rejuvenated facilities were dedicated and named in honor of former CSC standout Don Beebe, who was an NFL wide receiver for nine years and was on the roster of six teams that played in the Super Bowl.

The stadium's demolition will begin the Monday following the Eagles' final home game in mid-November. CSC is expected to open the stadium at the beginning of the 2018 season, provided the remaining funding can be secured.

Ain't My First Rodeo

Experience abounds on the 2017 Chadron State football roster. Listed on the squad are 24 players who are credited with at least one start. In addition, 16 out of 22 current starters are deemed "returning starters", meaning they have sustained the top place on the depth chart at one or more positions.

The last time CSC returned 16 starters on offense and defense was 2013, when the team went 8-3 and 7-2 in the RMAC. That year, the Eagles saw narrow losses to No. 4 West Texas A&M and No. 5 CSU-Pueblo.

All-time great running back Glen Clinton went for over 1,500 yards rushing and over 400 yards receiving that season, finishing seventh in voting for the Harlon Hill Trophy, which is the Division II equivalent of the Heisman.

Comeback Kid

Matt Vinson showed incredible poise last Saturday against Fort Lewis, throwing two touchdowns and connecting on 72.7 percent of his passes (8-11) en route to a 25-19 comeback win. The Eagles were facing a 0-16 deficit in the second quarter when Dalton Holst got the Eagles on the board with a 57-yard touchdown pass to Tevon Wright. In the second half Vinson entered the game in relief of Holst and threw for two more touchdowns including a 75-yard bomb to Stevann Brown. This was the largest comeback for the Eagles since October 22, 2016, when Vinson led the Eagles back from a 17-point deficit to defeat South Dakota Mines, throwing for five touchdowns.

Last Time They Met

The Eagles faced a CMU offense that operated like a well-oiled machine losing 33-47 on the road.

Colorado Mesa combined for 4 touchdowns offense as well as 4 field goals, while also getting another touchdown contributed by the defense. The Eagles will have their work cut out for them but will be motivated to end a two-game skid against the Mavs.

Quick hits

■ With 2,099 career rushing yards, Derek Jackson can crack the Chadron State all-time top 10 in career total rushing yards with 125 more yards on the ground in the fall of 2017.

■ For his career, Jackson has averaged 63.6 yards per game, which ranks 10th best in CSC program history. The players ranking fifth through ninth in career average are so close that Jackson can leap as high as fifth on the all-time charts with an incredible season of 1,371 yards in 11 games. Ahead of him are Willy Long (1980-82), Corey Campbell (1992-95), Anthony Simmons (1997-99), Austin Forster (1999-2003), and David McCartney (1990-93).

■ With 14.0 career sacks, Collin Eisenman can reach fifth on the all-time sacks list with just 5.5 more sacks this season. He currently sits just outside the top 10 with 14.0 sacks. Eisenman needs just four tackles for loss to make the top ten in that category as well.

■ Senior safety Ryan Wood is 39 tackles away from the top-10 on the career lists, and 68 tackles away from catching former Eagle linebacker and current coaching assistant Dylan Furrier for the sixth spot.

■ Junior punter Zack Kozlik earned the RMAC's Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance last week against Fort Lewis, in which he booted seven punts for 315 yards, for a 45.0 yard per punt average. That yard per punt average is good for 10th in the nation, and is tops among all RMAC punters who meet NCAA criteria

■ CSC is 34-12 all-time on Friends and Family Weekend, with an impressive 18-4 record since 1995. The event, set aside for the first home football weekend of the season, was known first as "Parents' Day" from 1971 to 1990, then "Family Day" from 1991 to 2016. This will be the third time in six years the Eagles will be playing Colorado Mesa on the occasion.

JAY LONG

Head Coach/Offensive Line
Sixth Year

2017 - Jay Long has been a rock solid presence in his five years as Chadron State's head football coach.

The CSC alum is responsible for steadying the program with a focus on tradition, culture, and community, in the midst of Chadron State football's greatest adversity.

Long's first year coaching the Eagles, they ended the season as the 18th ranked team in the nation by both the American Football Coaches Association and D2Football.com.

In 2013, the Eagles went 8-3 and finished second in the RMAC, with the No. 1 third-down conversion percentage in the nation. In 2014, CSC wound up third in the RMAC with another 8-3 mark.

In 2016, the Eagles were the top passing defense in the RMAC, allowing only 179.5 yards per game through the air.

In five years, Long, who also serves as the offensive line coach, has coached six all-conference linemen, four All-Americans, a Harlon Hill national finalist, and mentored All-American and NFL player Garrett Gilkey. His offensive lines have been top 3 in the RMAC in sacks allowed for five consecutive years.

Long is the 25th head football coach at CSC and the third who also played for the Eagles. Orin Weymouth and Ruffus Trapp also played and coached for Chadron State; however, a former football player hasn't coached for the school since 1937.

Long spent three seasons as the head coach at Black Hills State in Spearfish, S.D., where he guided the Yellowjackets to a 15-15 record before coming to Chadron State in 2012. His overall career record, including his time at BHSU, is 39-38.

Prior to being the head coach at Black Hills State, he was an assistant coach at the school from 2003-09. During that time, he served as the offensive coordinator, offensive line coach, recruiting coordinator and the strength and conditioning coach. The Yellowjackets won two conference titles and appeared in the NAIA playoffs two times while Long coached the offensive line.

Long, who graduated from Chadron State College in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in science, was a two-time Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference selection at center and also earned Farm Team All-American honors. He also wrestled at heavyweight and qualified for the national tournament for the Eagles.

Long and his wife, Kresi, have three children, Carson, Kaelee and Alivia.
