Eagles open season with care and enthusiasm -by Con Marshall

CHADRON, Neb. – After many weeks of deliberation and consultation, the Chadron State College football team is opened its six-game season last Saturday against Colorado Mesa in Grand Junction.

With the Covid-19 Pandemic wiping out spring sports at all levels worldwide beginning in March and then interrupting or delaying even professional sports well into the summer, no one could predict what would happen this fall. But at least 50 Chadron State players spent much of the summer in Chadron, lifting weights and working out on their own several times a week with hopes they'd get to play this fall.

Those hopes ebbed and flowed with the NCAA and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference presidents' council also involved in trying to decide what was best for the health of the populace, the athletes and the athletic programs.

With the support of Chadron State President Randy Rhine, Athletic Director Joel Smith "carried the ball," so to speak, for the Eagles, connecting with colleagues on numerous conference calls and Zoom sessions, exchanging idea and letting contacts know the CSC football team planned to play if the opportunity was available

Now, when the football season would normally be at the half-way point, a shortened schedule is beginning. The Eagles, along with their first three opponents, plus Western Colorado University, are the five RMAC teams planning to play this fall.

Many precautions are being taken. Masks are worn by everyone during CSC practices. The players and coaches are screened (temperatures taken) every day and are tested with a probe going up their nostrils weekly. Everyone who boards the busses to Grand Junction on Thursday will have been cleared by health agencies.

About 120 players are on the roster. They include a dozen returning starters, 26 more lettermen, 15 who were redshirt freshmen last fall but didn't play, 10 transfers and nearly 40 freshmen.

The offense features Dalton Holst, the Eagles' starting quarterback the past three years. He ranks with the best in Division II after throwing for 8,000 yards and 69 touchdowns, including 33 last year to set the school record.

Entering his ninth season as the Eagles' head coach, Long believes this year's offensive line will be a force. They are tackles

Justin Calderon and Juan Estrada-Sanchez, guards Austin Rapp and Jake Norris and center Michael DeCamillis. All started at least part-time a year ago, when the Eagles averaged 458 yards in total offense and 37 points a game, both second best in the conference.

The skill positions include a pair of hard-nosed veterans. Inside receiver Cole Thurness has caught 111 passes for 1,528 yards and 15 touchdowns the past two years while being voted the team's MVP both times. Tight end Colt Foster, the Hemingford native who missed the entire 2018 season because of a knee injury, was not quite back at full speed last year, but has played extra well this fall, Long said.



Tevon Wright, who caught 74 passes for 1,146 yards and a CSC all-time high 16 touchdowns last fall, graduated. Junior Chad Mikelson and numerous promising youngsters, including Wright's brother, Jahani, along with Jalon'e Rice, Montel Gladney and Ethan Fray, will try to take up the slack.

Running back is another position with interesting possibilities. Elijah Myles, who ran for 1,077 yards and 12 TDs as a sophomore last season, didn't return this semester because of the virus uncertainty, but

plans to continue his career at CSC when conditions improve.

Myles' replacements range from Jalen Starks, a 6-foot, 245-pound transfer from UCLA, where he once rumbled 50 yards with a pass reception, to Jeydon Cox, a 5-8, 160 freshman from Jackson Hole, Wyo., where he rushed for more than 2,000 yards as both a junior and a senior.

Other tailback candidates are Justin Cauley and Chris Busby. Cauley, a sophomore, is the leading incumbent at the position, but received only 19 carries in 2019. Busby, a freshman who spent last season earning his athletic eligibility, romped for 1,937 yards and 28 touchdowns in 2018 while leading Scottsbluff to the Class B state championship game after winning the Class B state meet 100 meters that spring.

Long said he likes the position's potential.

The Eagles also will be a mix of mix of veterans and newcomers on defense.

Coordinator Craig Jersild says his unit will have more size up front, is solid at linebacker and is talented, although somewhat inexperienced, in the secondary.

"We got pushed around in the line last year," Jersild said. "That shouldn't happen this fall."

The line leaders include senior Brandon Hopkins, who is 6-4, 300 after adding 20 pounds. Others up front will include sophomores Kail Juelfs, 5-10, 240, and Kobe Whipple, 6-1, 294, and redshirt freshman Trevon Smith, 6-1, 320.

The linebackers will feature senior Travis Wilson, the RMAC leader in tackles last season with 124. He'll be joined by rising standout Noah Kerchel, who took part in 74 tackles, including 13 behind the line of scrimmage last fall, and Jeremiah Makahununiu, a transfer from St. Cloud State in Minnesota. Special teams play-maker Bryant Wilson of Alliance and Joey Geil, who is among the players Jersild says "gets better every day," will provide depth.

Ju'Wan Murphy and Bobby Peele, both highly regarded transfers, are expected to hold down the cornerback slots while Brenden Brehmer, Cole Condon and Jeremiah Gutierrez are the likely leaders at safety.

After being sidelined early last fall, Brehmer has recovered from a knee injury while Condon returned an interception 88 yards for a touchdown and Gutierrez had 41 unassisted tackles and broke up 12 passes a year ago. Rangy Ethan Zimmerman will supply depth.

This week, the Eagles turn their attention to South Dakota School of Mines, their opponent Saturday evening. For the second consecutive week, they will try to outscheme a first-year head coach.

He is Charlie Flohr, a native of Gillette, Wyo., and a 2002 graduate of Dakota State at Madison, S.D. He had spent the past 14 years, six of which he was offensive coordinator, at perennial power Northwest Missouri State, which played in seven NCAA Division II national championship games during that time.

The Eagles also will be at home on Saturday, Oct. 24 for a 2 o'clock game against Black Hills State. The last three games on the schedule will be on the road. They will meet the Hardrockers in Rapid City on Oct. 31, play at Nebraska-Kearney on Nov. 7 and at Black Hills State in Spearfish on Nov. 14.

The BHSU program underwent a coaching change in the offseason as well. Their new head coach is Josh Breske, who played five years for CSC coach Long at Black Hills and later coached under him at both BHSU and CSC.

Long said it's always difficult to play a team with a new coaching staff, but noted CSC's new offensive coordinator Micah Smith has installed some wrinkles, too.

Norris named to Allstate AFCA Good Works Team

Chadron State College senior football student-athlete Jake Norris, of Fort Morgan, Colorado, was named to the 2020 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® in a release September 23 from the American Football Coaches Association.

Twenty-two college football players are commended annually by the AFCA for their performance off the field and in their communities. Of those chosen, 11 are from the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision, and the remaining 11 come from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, Divisions II, III, and NAIA. Additionally, one honorary head coach is selected.

Norris was nominated by the CSC sports information office, and endorsed by CSC Vice President of Human Resources Anne Demersseman, for his work in the community of Chadron.

He created the Eagle Effort Award to acknowledge Chadron Primary School students who show academic improvement and demonstrate a "helping hand" attitude with their peers. In his award program, teachers vote for a student to be recognized at each home football game during the first media timeout.

Norris also created a volunteerism opportunity for his teammates at the CPS that includes tutoring, assisting in physical education, and supporting students seeking advice in the classroom.

He volunteers annually during The Big Event campus community service campaign, and he frequently volunteers for snow removal

Head Football Coach Jay Long enters his ninth season leading Chadron State's football program back to prominence.

The CSC alum is responsible for steadying the program with a focus on tradition, culture, and community, in the midst of Chadron State football's greatest adversity. Now with the foundation laid, Long and the Eagles look to build on the success of the past while ushering in a new era of program history.

From its inception, Long was one of the college's foremost leaders in the rebirth of Elliott Field at Don Beebe Stadium, as a part of the CSC Sports Complex project. It was the first comprehensive renovation of the

stadium since it was built in 1929. The newly renovated facility opened just in time for the start of the fall 2018 football season.

During Long's coaching tenure the Chadron State program has seen eight All-America selections, 10 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, numerous All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and All-Region awards, one Harlon Hill Trophy Finalist, and the first NFL draft pick, that CSC has produced since 1989.

Another hallmark of his tenure is the offensive line play. With Long mentoring the men in the trenches, his teams have finished in the top three in the RMAC each season since 2013 for fewest sacks allowed, leading the league three times. They have led the conference in rushing offense twice. Under coach Long, CSC has 12 All-RMAC offensive linemen including six First Teamers, and in 2013, the Cleveland Browns selected offensive guard Garrett Gilkey with their seventh pick in the NFL draft.

Long, who graduated from Chadron State College in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in science, was a two-time Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference selection at center and also earned Farm Team All-American honors. He also wrestled at heavyweight and qualified for the national tournament for the Eagles.

Long and his wife, Kresi, have three children, Carson, Kaelee and Alivia.



MICAH SMITH Offensive Coordinator / QB
 Alma Mater: Chadron State (2008)

Micah Smith was brought in at the start of 2020 to coordinate the Eagles offensive attack, after stringing together 11 consecutive years of coaching at NCAA Divisions I, II and III, and NAIA programs.

At his last stop, Mayville State in North Dakota, he increased the team's scoring output by nearly 25 percent in his only season there, then received the title

of interim head coach at Mayville for several weeks.

Smith is the youngest of three children of longtime CSC head football coach Brad Smith, the winningest coach in Chadron State history. He and his wife, Jadrienne have one daughter, Joslyn.



CRAIG JERSILD Defensive Coordinator / DB
 Alma Mater: Colorado State (1992)

Craig Jersild enters his 10th season as a full-time assistant coach at Chadron State, with 14 total years at CSC including part-time and grad school work.

Jersild coaches defensive backs and coordinates special teams while also managing recruiting.

In 2016 the Eagles had the top passing defense in the RMAC, allowing 179.5 yards per game through the

air. His special teams units annually lead the conference in multiple categories.

Jersild was head coach at Hutchinson C.C. (Kan.) from 2003-06 and has a national title as defensive coordinator at Butler County C.C. (Kan.).



BRYAR DESANTI Assistant Coach / WR
 Alma Mater: Black Hills State (2014)

Bryar DeSanti was promoted to assistant coach in 2019 after three years in the Chadron State program.

DeSanti joined the CSC football program in 2016 as a coaching assistant in charge of the running back position. He switched to tight ends in 2018, and will take over the receiving corps duties in 2019.

Prior to Chadron State, he coached at Lead-Deadwood High School for one season, working with running backs, linebackers, and special teams.

DeSanti was a running back at Black Hills State University from 2010 to 2013, when he ran for more than 1,500 yards and recorded more than 500 receiving yards. He led the Yellow Jackets in rushing yards in both his sophomore and junior seasons.



CLINT SASSE Assistant Coach / LB
 Alma Mater: Chadron State (2014)

Former Chadron State College linebacker and graduate coaching assistant Clint Sasse joined the CSC coaching staff as a full-time assistant in April 2019.

Sasse coordinates special teams for the Eagles and has linebacker coaching responsibilities as well.

In 2017-18, Sasse was head football coach for two seasons at Lee Williams High in Kingman, Arizona, where he was head coach for two years and defensive coordinator for one.

As a linebacker for the Eagles from 2009 to 2013, Sasse accumulated 119 total tackles and five tackles-for-loss for 16 yards, adding two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

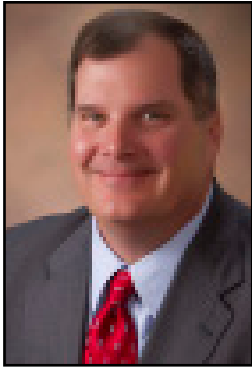

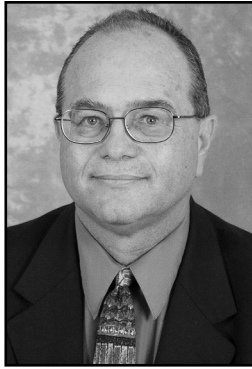

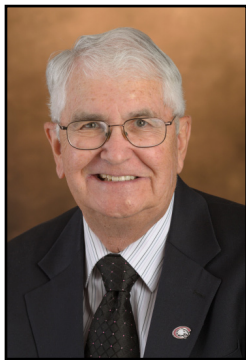

CON MARSHALL - INFORMATION DIRECTOR
Marshall, a longtime employee of Chadron State College, has his name in the CSC Athletics Hall of Fame, the Nebraska State High School Hall of Fame, the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Hall of Fame, on the Don Beebe Stadium press box, and on numerous distinguished service awards for his work disseminating information about the college and its activities for over 50 years.

Over the years he has produced volumes of news stories and photographs, in addition to frequently serving as a resource for anyone looking for information about Chadron State, its athletic programs and the history of the surrounding region.

In 1986, Marshall authored and compiled "The History of Chadron State College," a 232-page publication to commemorate the college's 75th anniversary. He followed that with a book to mark the college's centennial in 2011, "Chadron State College: A Century of Service."

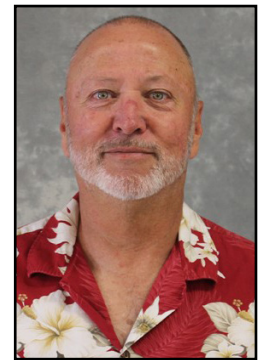
DON WATT - ATHLETIC TRAINER

Watt, now in his 34th year at CSC, gives the CSC student-athletes excellent care, puts in many hours and manages a staff of up to a dozen student trainers.

Recently, Watt was a recipient of the RMAC's 2019 Wayne Barger Athletic Trainer of the Year Award, a 2018 National Athletic Trainers Association Athletic Service Award, and was also named the 2016-17 George Sullivan Nebraska Trainer of the Year.

Watt began his career as a CSC student in the late 70s, and had stops at Jenks High in Oklahoma and the University of Arkansas-Monticello, before taking the opportunity to return to CSC in 1994.

In recognition of his longstanding and meritorious service, Watt was inducted into the Chadron State College Athletics Hall of Fame in fall of 2015.

Additionally, Norris will be on a ballot to select a team captain, which is selected by voters nationwide in an online poll.

"I'm extremely proud of Jake for being selected to the Good Works Team," said CSC Head Football Coach Jay Long, who is also Norris's offensive line coach. "Of all the players I've coached, Jake is probably one of the top three people, in terms of character, I've ever had the pleasure of working with."

The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was established in 1992 by the College Football Association to recognize extra efforts by players and student support staff off the field. AFCA became the governing body of the award in 1997 and continues to honor

players who go the extra mile for those in need. Allstate became the presenting sponsor starting with the 2008 season.

Quick hits

- Although most career records are probably still out of reach for quarterback Dalton Holst in only six games this fall, he could easily jump to No. 2 in career passing touchdowns with just four more this season. He needs 1,075 passing yards in five remaining games to reach No. 2 in that list.

- With 124 career pass receptions, Cole Thurness needs just six more in five remaining games to pass Danny Woodhead and Duane Smith to crack the all-time top 10 at Chadron State. Twenty-two more receptions would jump him to sixth all-time ahead of Jackson Dickerson, Bill Ryan, and Isaac Stockton.

- All five of CSC's returning offensive linemen have seen significant action for the Eagles, compiling a collective 60 career starts, for an average of more than one full season each.

- The CSC defensive line recorded 25 tackles last week against Colorado Mesa, which was more than any game last season. The most stops by the defensive front in 2019 was 19 on Sept. 21 at Fort Lewis.

- The last time CSC held an opponent scoreless until halftime was at New Mexico Highlands on Nov. 2, 2019. The shutout held through three quarters before a seven-play, 75-yard scoring drive by the Cowboys beginning with 11:14 to play.

Eagle Rock

South Dakota School of Mines is the first known collegiate football opponent in the Chadron State program's storied history. The series dates back to 1912, which is the second year CSC opened its doors as the Nebraska State Normal School. Evidently this fact is disputed by the Hardrockers' program which claims wins over "Chadron State" in 1905, 1906, and 1908. CSC claims a 24-7 win in 1912 which doesn't appear in Mines records, and likewise, South Dakota Mines lists a 59-0 victory in its records which doesn't appear on Chadron State's. So, while the exact series record may be a topic for further research and debate, the two ledgers began to merge into one following World War I, when Mines rolled to a 50-0 rout on October 18, 1919. For the record, Chadron State's official numbers are 50 wins, 18 losses, and no ties.

It isn't in dispute that the two schools played each other twice in 1920, and again in 1922, and haven't scheduled each other twice in a single season since then. That is, until 2020, when the pair will play one game in Chadron and another in Rapid City, separated by only two weeks.

Despite only 100 miles between the schools, it doesn't appear from their schedules throughout the years that they were ever aligned in the same conference until South Dakota Mines joined the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference in 2016. Still, they met on the gridiron every season between 1966 and 1995, often as the season opener.

Chadron State is currently riding its greatest win streak in the series, with victories in the last 12 contests. The current streak could be considered skewed by the fact that the first six games in the early 90s were played as CSC became a full NCAA Division II member while Mines remained in the NAIA. The suddenly lopsided scores in those games indicate that the reclassification produced some advantage for the Eagles.

The Eagle Rock Trophy dates back to 1980, when it was first awarded to the winner of the game. After 1995, the award fell out of rotation and was somehow unavailable when the rivalry renewed four years ago. This season, the trophy is at stake twice, with the winner of the October 31 game receiving the better end of the deal.

Coming Home?

October 17 was designated the Eagles' Homecoming game not long after the RMAC slate of games was cancelled, and the original date of September 26 became unavailable.

However this year's festivities have taken on a subtler look and feel. The Homecoming coronation, parade, pep rallies, the lighting of "C" Hill, and all of the alumni functions have all been scuttled in favor of a few socially distant student activities and the home football game this weekend. The game is the 52nd game designated as Homecoming. CSC's record in those games is 35-15-1, with the Eagles winning 17 of their last 20.

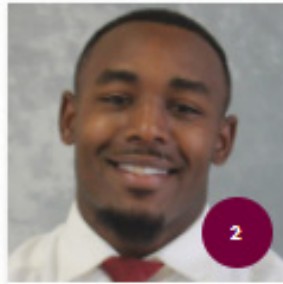
