# Chadron State wins RMAC Sportsmanship Cup

Chadron State College won its first-ever Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Sportsmanship Cup, Commissioner Joel R. Smith announced in early June.

The voting process for the RMAC Sportsmanship Cup is an on-line system that ranks four game environment factors: players, fans, staff, and coaches. Each category received one ranking from excellent to poor. Each school's head coach and a Student Athlete Advisory Committee member from each school voted per sport on all 21 RMAC sponsored sports.

"I'm tremendously proud of everyone involved in this special award," CSC athletic director Brad Smith said. "We strive to create an entertaining and respectful game atmosphere and it wouldn't be possible without the wonderful student-athletes, coaches, fans and athletic staff all working well together to represent Chadron State and the RMAC."

Chadron State received an overall score of 4.037, nip-

ping Colorado Christian's second-place score of 4.021.

Also ranking in the top five were Nebraska-Kearney (3.901), Colorado Mines (3.882) and Regis (3.819).

The Eagles accumulated the highest ranking average in three of the four categories: Players (4.04), Staff (4.09), and Coaches (4.20).

# Smith inducted into RMAC Hall of Fame

Chadron State College's Brad Smith was elected to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Hall of Fame in 2010-11.

Smith, the school's current athletic director and former football coach, joins five other individuals – Gary Garner and Jim Krob of Fort Hays State, Amy Miller Brammer of Mesa State, Sarah Parkey Meyer of Adams State and Al Rozman of Western State – and seven teams from Adams State in the 2011 class.

"I was truly blessed by great players and surrounded by great coaches during my time as the head coach at Chadron State," Smith said this week. "It's an honor to be in the RMAC and I'm privileged to be elected into its Hall of Fame."

Smith's coaching career has gar-

nered him several awards. He was named the RMAC's All-Time Football Coach at the conference's centennial celebration in the summer of 2009 after having a career record of 133-56-1 at Chadron State from 1987 to 2004. He is the school's all-time winningest football coach and each of his final 11 teams won at least seven games. Smith's all-time winning percentage of .704 ranked seventh in Division II among coaches whose teams had played at least 150 games when he stepped down from that position at the end of the 2004 season.

He was the RMAC Coach of the Year in 1996 and 2001 and he shared it in 1999. He coached five conference championship teams and led the Eagles to the playoffs four times.

Smith will join two of his former players, Joe Planansky and Kevin Homer, in the RMAC Hall of Fame. They were inducted in 2005 and 2007, respectively.

As an administrator, Smith was influential in helping guide Chadron State from the NAIA ranks to NCAA Division II and the RMAC, a move that fully took effect in 1990. He also was heavily involved in the expansion of the stadium and press box at Elliott Field in the 1990s and helped start the Don Beebe Classic, Chadron State's annual golf tournament that is held each May as a fundraiser for the CSC athletic program.

# Eagles were balanced in 2010; finished 8-3 overall

The Chadron State football team didn't start the 2010 season how they would've liked, but they certainly finished strong by winning their final five games to claim an 8-3 record.

"During the final five games, we proved what we could do," said head coach Bill O'Boyle. "But all three of the games we lost were winnable. We had our opportunities in them, but we didn't always capitalize."

The 2010 season marked the 15th time in the last 22 years the Eagles won at least eight games and it was the 55th winning season in CSC football history.

The Eagles outscored their opponents by 29.9 to 17 points a game and out-gained them by 407.3 to 239.8 yards.

The first loss was to Pittsburg State of Kansas 14-3 in the second game of the season. O'Boyle said the offense, which had eight new starters from the previous season, "couldn't run or pass in that game."

The 256 total net yards was a season low and it was the first time the Eagles failed to score a touchdown since midway in the 2002 season and just the second time since 1995.

The next setback was 33-30 in triple overtime at Colorado State-Pueblo, which finished with a 9-2 record. The Eagles had a second and goal at the Thunder-Wolves' one yard line in the third overtime, but didn't score what would have been the winning touchdown.

CSC's third loss came the next week when Nebraska-Kearney took a 28-0 lead into the fourth quarter before the Eagles rallied for 21 points. The final score was 35-21 after the Lopers returned an interception 38 yards for a touchdown with 1:09 remaining.

The Eagles' big win was the 38-31 decision over Colorado Mines in the home finale on Nov. 6, when Glen Clinton's 88-yard kickoff return with 63 seconds left provided the winning touchdown. Mines then edged Kearney 55-53 in triple overtime to tie the Lopers for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference championship and received a bid to advance to the Division II playoffs.

O'Boyle, whose teams have won 54 games and lost 17 during his six years as head coach, noted that the

defense played "lights out" all season. Although the unit had five new starters, including all three linebackers, at the beginning of the season, it held the opponents to 100 or fewer yards rushing in eight of the 11 games and led the RMAC in both passing and rushing defense as well as total defense, first downs and third-down conversions.

The Eagles also ranked fifth nationally in total defense with their 239.8-yard average and second in yielding third-down conversions—22 of 144 opportunities for just 22.9 percent. The total defense average is CSC's second lowest since 1982, topped only by the 234.9-yard average in 2002.

Todd Auer, who has been the CSC defensive coordinator 17 seasons now, said he was pleased how defense played. His only complaint was lack of turnovers. The Eagles intercepted 13 passes and claimed eight fumbles.

Middle linebacker James Belville led the Eagles in tackles with 80, including a team-high seven sacks. Outside linebacker Kelen Kahrs with 61 tackles, safety Kevin Berg with 58 and outside linebacker Kevin Lindholm with 57 followed. Kahrs was credited with a team-best 12.5 tackles for losses. Berg led in interceptions with four and broke up seven more passes.

The offense was well-balanced. The Eagles rushed for 2,205 yards and passed for 2,275. The rushing total was up 580 yards from the previous season. Clinton, a redshirt freshman, gained 1,020 yards and transfer Dominic Morris ran for 803.

Clinton also caught 24 passes for 179 yards and Morris grabbed 20 for 220 yards and two TDs. Both scored eight touchdowns.

The Eagles completed 63.3 percent of their passes. Redshirt freshman Jonn McLain completed 170 of 271 attempts (62.7 percent) for 1,894 yards and 16 TDs.

Unfortunately, the Chadron State men's basketball team didn't have the type of season it hoped it would have in 2010-11 after just missing out on the RMAC playoffs a season before.

Things started out rosy for the Eagles when they put together a nice four-game winning streak in late November and December. CSC trumped Montana State University-Billings, conference foes Mesa State and Western State, and South Dakota School of Mines all in convincing fashion. All the victories were by double digits and the Eagles scored at least 73 points in each game.

Following that stretch, though, they ran into a couple snags. In their final two RMAC weekends in December, CSC posted a 1-3 record and the three losses were by a combined 43 points.

The bad luck continued into the New Year when it was learned two of the team members, including the starting point guard, were academically ineligible. Without those players, the Eagles struggled offensively and only won one game the remainder of the season.

Although the record wasn't great, there were a couple of bright spots, particularly the play of juniors Kevin McClelland and Moala Tautuaa. McClelland led the Eagles in points (14.9), assists (2.3) and steals (1.1).

# Youthful wrestling team took promising steps

Some veteran savvy, combined with talented youngsters, helped the Chadron State College wrestling team have a successful season.

That was especially evident at the end of the year when four CSC grapplers qualified for the NCAA Division II National Championships in Kearney in mid-March.

Seniors Sam Udell, Trent Zempel and Jimmy Savala, along with true freshman Jordan Debus all had good showings, but Savala was the only one to earn All-American status after finishing seventh at 141 pounds.

Savala, a senior from Clovis, Calif., is the 43rd wrestling All-American in school history.

The three seniors were excellent team leaders both on and off the mat. Savala, who set the school's record for most takedowns in a career with 308, led the way with a 26-8 record and a staggering 105 takedowns.

Udell, a heavyweight from Colorado Springs, Colo., tied for the team lead with six pins and added a 23-13 record. He was named the Eagles' most improved wrestler.

Zempel, a 174-pounder from Conrad, Mont., joined the Eagles in the fall with just one year of eligibility

# Eagles reach 20-win plateau fourth straight year

The Chadron State softball team is starting to make a habit of having 20-win seasons. The Eagles claimed their fourth-straight 20-win campaign with a 21-26 record in 2011 and a big reason for it was their offense.

The Eagles, who had a 17-21 record in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and just missed qualifying for the playoffs, hit a whopping .319 as a team and racked up 68 home runs, among the top 10 in all of Division II in 2011.

A big reason for the Eagles' success was the play of its two veterans from Kearney, Katie Bolin and Jamie Mazankowski.

Bolin, a senior outfielder, had one of the greatest offensive seasons in history at Chadron State after setting records for most home runs (17), RBIs (51), runs scored (46) and slugging percentage (.772). Bolin, who is also the career home run leader at CSC, finished the season ranked in the top 10 in nearly every RMAC category.

Mazankowski, a senior shortstop and honorable mention All-American, started more games than any other CSC player in history (190). She led all RMAC shortstops with a .409 average and 10 home runs. She also set two school records for highest seasonal average and most hits (63).

Mazankowski is also an accomplished scholar-athlete. She was placed on the RMAC's All-Academic First Team and the District 7 First Team, as selected by sports information directors throughout the country.

Lewis, a senior pitcher and designated player from Delta, British Columbia, finished with a .336 batting average and 10 home runs. She also had a 7-9 record in the circle. In addition, one of her pitching victories was a 5-inning no-hitter against the University of Nebraska-Kearney.

Jay, a junior catcher from Victoria, British Columbia, only committed one error, despite playing all 47 games for Chadron State and 44 of those were behind the plate. She was second on the team with a .362 batting average and 11 of her 24 runs batted in came with two outs. She also laid down seven sacrifice bunts and stole a team-high six bases.

Kate Pinder was the Eagles' top pitcher. She posted a 10-12 record and had a 4.85 earned run average.

# CSC men, women combined to have great track season

The Chadron State College track and field teams had much to be proud of during both the indoor and outdoor seasons. Both ranked among the Eagles' all-time bests from nearly every perspective.

Both the men's and the women's squads included several individuals who finished high in both conference and national competitions. In addition, numerous young athletes continued to develop and several veterans produced "feel-good" stories after overcoming injuries and having exceptional seasons.

The surge boosted the CSC women from seventh place with 28 points at the RMAC Indoor Meet in 2010 to third place with 96 points in 2011 and from sixth place with 48.5 points to second with 133 this year. Coach Ryan Baily received the Women's Coach of the Year Award following both conference meets.

Among the other highlights from the 2011 campaigns were:

- The women set five school records indoors and six outdoors and tied another outdoors.

- The men set six school records indoors and five outdoors.

- The Eagles had seven qualifications for NCAA Division II National Indoor Championships and 10 for the National Outdoor Championships, just one shy of the school's highest total ever.

- The team earned five All-American laurels at the indoor meet and four outdoors.

Baily, who was in his second year as the Eagles' head coach, was elated with the season.

"The thing that made me the happiest was the commitment that the athletes made to the team and to the sport," he said.

Individually, several athletes had tremendous seasons. A few of them included:

- Brad Gamble, who used his senior year at CSC and set both school and national records while winning the heptathlon at the NCAA Division II National Meet, then won the decathlon at the RMAC Outdoor Meet and finished second at the National Meet while setting the school record.

- Karl McFarlane, who also won double All-

## Rodeo team was competitive again in 2010-11

More than 30 team members strong, the Chadron State College rodeo team was competitive again in the rugged Central Rocky Mountain Region in 2010-11.

Coached by the capable Dustin Luper for the third year, CSC entries placed among the top six at all 10 of the regional rodeos and numerous others reached the finals at the rodeos. The women's team finished fourth in the regional standings with 1,455 points and the men were ninth with 1,890.

Two team members qualified for the College National Finals Rodeo in June. Kelsey Scott was second in breakaway roping in the region for the season and Miles Spickelmier was third in steer wrestling. While neither of them was among the 12 finalists in their events at the national rodeo, both performed admirably.

Spickelmier wound up 13th in the steer wrestling standings. He tied for third and fourth in the first go-round in 4.2 seconds and shared sixth and seventh in the third go-round in 4.8 seconds. He completed his

second run in 5.2 seconds, but broke the barrier.

Scott also had some misfortune at nationals. She missed her first calf, then had times of 3.8 and 3.2 seconds on her next two runs.

Five other team members placed in the top 10 in their events for the season. Kaylee Gallino tied for fifth in barrel racing and was 10th in breakaway roping, Tyrel Bonnet was eighth in steer wrestling, Collin Chytka was eighth in bareback riding, Justin Ellis was 10th in bull riding and Russell Hipke was 10th in steer wrestling. Gallino wound up fourth in the all-around cowgirl standings.

Besides being one of the top two breakaway ropers in the region, Scott served as the Central Rocky Mountain's student director for the year and will hold that position again this coming season.

At the end of the season, Gunner, a bay gelding belonging to CSC cowboy Jake Kraupie, was selected as the outstanding horse ridden by a cowboy in the region.

In addition, Jeremy Slaughter, the starting center for the CSC football team in 2004, received a special honor that season, when he was among the handful of players named to the American Football Coaches Association's Good Works Team for his involvement primarily in Christian, youth-related activities. Another special honor went to Judd Hoos and Adam Hofmaier. Each received the Unsung Hero award from the College Football Chronicle. Hoos won it in 1996 and Hofmaier claimed the award in 1997.

## Chadron State College's National Champions

A summary of the national championship accomplishments follow:

**Wrestling**—Bob Lynch was the NAIA 158-pound national champion in 1971-72, concluding his season with a perfect 30-0 record.

**Wrestling**—Brent Hunter was the NCAA II 165-pound national champion in 2006-07, concluding his season with a 35-7 record.

**Wrestling**—Josh Majerus was the NCAA II 197-pound national champion in 2007-08, concluding his season with a 37-3 record.

**Wrestling**—Brett Hunter won the NCAA II 174-pound national championship in 2008-09, concluding his season with a 35-8 record.

**Track and Field**—Tracy Heiman was the NCAA Division II indoor high jump champion in 1994 by clearing 6-9 3/4.

**Football**—David Jones was both the NAIA and NCAA Division II rushing champion with 1,570 yards in 1990.

**Football**—David McCartney was the NCAA Division II scoring champion in 1992 with 154 points on 25 touchdowns and two two-point conversions.

**Football**—Danny Woodhead led NCAA Division II rushing (1,840 yards), all-purpose yards (2,087) and scoring (162 points on 27 TDs) in 2004.

**Football**—Danny Woodhead led NCAA Division II in rushing (2,756), all-purpose yards (3,158) and scoring (228 points on 38 TDs) in 2006. Each of the figures also led all of college football in 2006.

**Football**—Danny Woodhead concluded his career as college football's all-time leading rusher with 7,962 yards. (He ranks second in all-purpose yards with 9,479, just 32 yards from the leader, Brian Westbrook, and second in scoring with 654 points, just two fewer than the leader, Germaine Race. Both Woodhead and Race scored an all-time best 109 touchdowns.)

**Rodeo**—Don Meter was the national collegiate calf roping champion in 1955.

**Rodeo**—Jean Fuchs was the national collegiate breakaway roping champion in 1978.

**Rodeo**—Kathy Kennedy was the national collegiate breakaway roping champion in 1979.
