

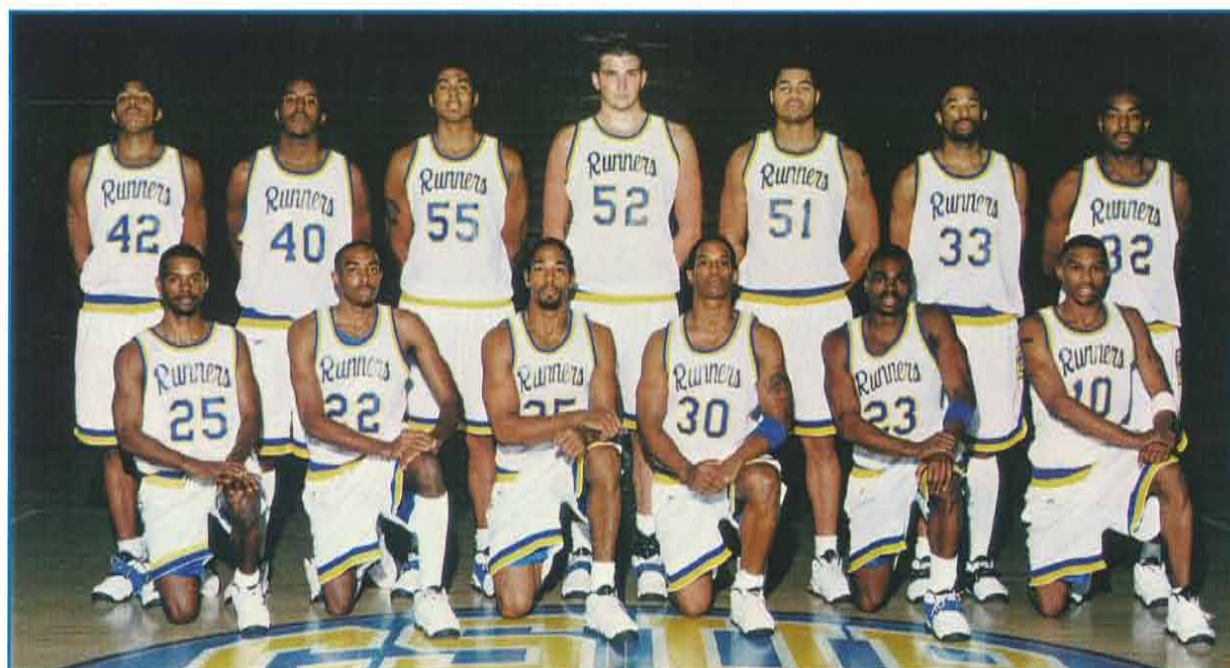

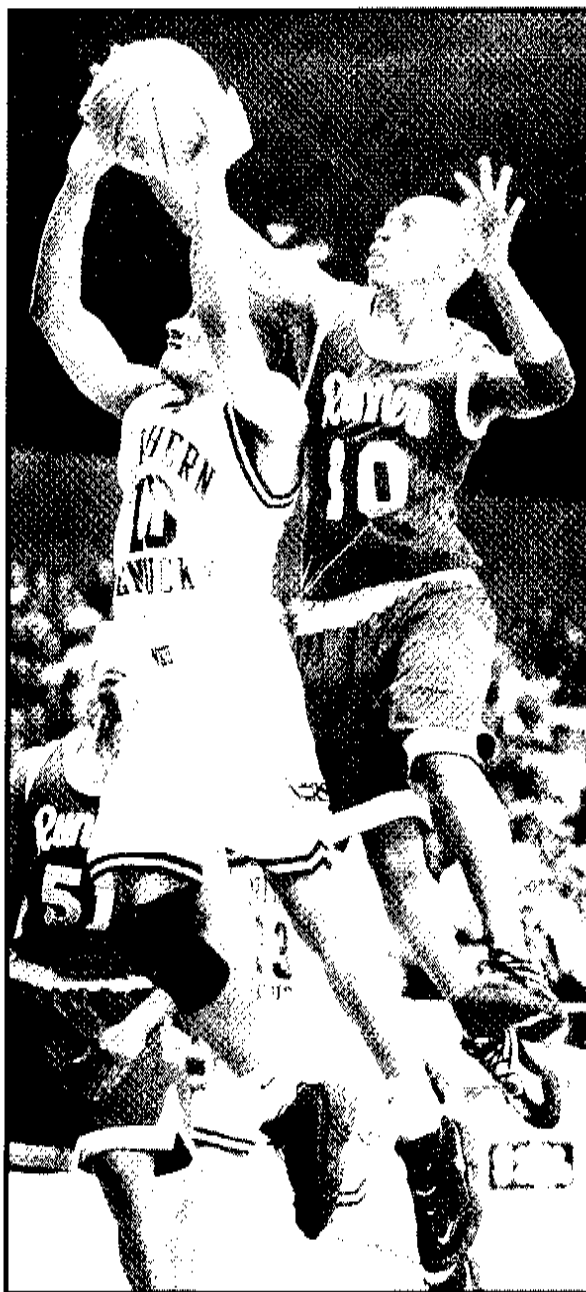

It may seem like only yesterday that Kebu Stewart was dominating the paint, Jon Gaines was nailing three pointers and the Cal State Bakersfield basketball team was celebrating its third NCAA Division II national championship in the last five years. That was nearly seven full months ago. Wednesday, October 15, a new crop of CSUB hopefuls begin their journey to follow first-year head coach **Henry Clark** back on the road to title contention.

No, Michael J. Fox will not be suiting up for the 'Runners in 1997-98, but their will be a "Back to the Future" feel to this season's squad. Although Clark has added several highly regarded post players to the roster, longtime Roadrunner fans remember that, traditionally, CSUB found success with big, strong, athletic perimeter players and blue collar post players. With **Kebu Stewart** and **Michael Jackson** playing inside the past two seasons, that focus changed for obvious reasons.

Now that they are gone, the focus will again shift outside. CSUB returns four players who started a total of 43 games at the one, two and three spots in 1996-97, including the starting backcourt from the 1997 NCAA Division II Championship Tournament. Those two guards are seniors **Charles Woolfolk (Bakersfield, Calif.)** and **Marlon Johnson (Little Rock, Ark.)**. Woolfolk averaged 5.6 ppg overall and 7.5 ppg as a starter in the final 13 games of the

season and was CSUB's leading assist man (3.4 apg) over that span. Johnson, whose leaping intimidation of Northern Kentucky guard Andy Listermann on the final play of the NCAA title game forced an airball which sealed the win for CSUB, also didn't become a starter until late in the season. Johnson averaged 5.5 ppg and 3.3 rpg overall and 8.4 ppg/3.9 rpg as a starter. He also shot 43% from three-point range as a starter (9-for-21), establishing himself as a perimeter threat for the first time at CSUB.

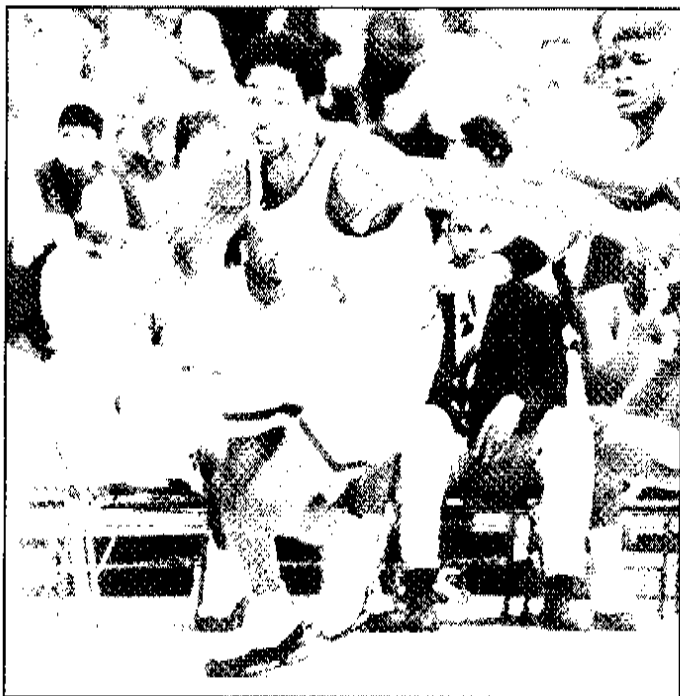
Senior swingman **Marco Brown (Clarksville, Tenn.)** started 16 of his first 19 games as a Roadrunner before becoming CSUB's first player off the bench during the 'Runners national championship run. He was one of CSUB's steadiest players, averaging 8.8 ppg and 4.7 rpg as a starter (his season totals were 6.6 ppg and 3.5 rpg). Also returning is senior swingman **Reggie Cotton (Pasadena, Calif.)** who started 12 games in CSUB's crowded 1995-96 backcourt before redshirting last season. If he plays to that level again in 1997-98, he could emerge as one of the region's top players. Sophomore swingman **Shamar Griffin (Pasadena, Calif.)** is another strong, athletic perimeter player who should benefit from last season's experience.

CSUB's top newcomer in 1997-98 is expected to be senior guard **Marcus Moss (Pine Bluff, Ark.)**. Moss was pencilled in as the point guard at the Univ. of Cincinnati before he transferred to CSUB on the eve of opening night last season when it was determined that he would have only one year of Div. I eligibility. As the transfer rules worked out, he may get to play only one year at CSUB as well. Last year, he arguably would have been CSUB's best player not named Kebu Stewart and he should be the floor leader as well in 1997-98.

CSUB's other top newcomer will be 1995 juco All-American **Reggie Malone (Oakland, Calif.)**, a transfer from Diablo Valley JC. Malone is a very athletic player who is comfortable both posting up and facing the basket. He should challenge for the starting spot at power forward, though he could see time at small forward as well.

Wendell Cooper (Suison, Calif.) played two seasons of juco ball at Solano CC (1995 and 97). He averaged 10 points and eight assists per game while earning All-Bay Valley Conference honors in 1997. The last perimeter player signed was junior **Rahim Wright (Pasadena, Calif.)** the MVP at Pasadena CC in 1997. Both Wright and Cooper are strong, physically gifted players who will contribute with equal effectiveness on both ends of the floor for the 'Runners.

Though guard play may be a major emphasis for the 'Runners this season, post play will be anything but a weakness. Four new players will give the 'Runners a serious

interior presence. The player who may make the most immediate impact is 6-8, 240 **Toshiro Germany** from Mt. San Jacinto JC. Germany was one of California's top juco players in 1997, averaging 18.2 ppg and 12.4 rpg at Mt. SJ. The latter number placed him third among all California JC rebounders. Another big man who should make his presence known immediately is Ventura College transfer **George Crawford**.

Crawford helped lead Ventura to a 34-2 record and a California State JC title in 1996. Though his stats—7.3 ppg, 6.2 rpg, 2.7 apg—are not eye-popping, coach Clark believes they are a product of the unselfish nature of Crawford's game... a trait which should help him fit nicely into the CSUB fold.

CSUB's two other post players both offer tantalizing potential—and possible early dividends—to the CSUB program. Freshman **Dock Ellis III** (yes, he is the son of the former major league pitcher) comes to Bakersfield by way of Arlington, Texas. Ellis carries more than just 240 pounds on his 6-8 frame: he carries a world of potential. He was a first team all-district selection as a prep junior at Arlington-Martin HS. He added offensive MVP and City Player of the Year honors to his résumé as a senior last season. Coach Clark likens his potential to that of former Roadrunner standout Kenny Warren in that he feels Ellis will contribute early in his career but could blossom into a truly exceptional player as he learns the game at this level. Another mix of size and intriguing potential is 6-10, 235 pound junior **Scott Bishop**. Predominantly a football player in high school, Bishop began to develop as a basketball player at Idaho's Blue Mountain CC. He averaged 9.7 ppg, 7.1 rpg and 2.4 bpg as a juco sophomore and Clark feels he has yet to reach his full potential.

Expect these pieces to blend into another successful season at CSUB under first-year head coach **Henry Clark**. Clark has been CSUB's lead assistant for eight of the past 10 seasons. CSUB compiled a 211-60 record with Clark on the bench and serving as the team's primary recruiter. An interesting side note on Clark: CSUB won back-to-back

NCAA Championship in 1993-94, Clark left for two seasons (CSUB bowed in the first round and the quarterfinals) then Clark returned and CSUB won its third title in five years.

Of course, success at CSUB is measured on a different scale than at most schools. CSUB is the winningest NCAA Division II basketball program this decade in terms of wins (215) percentage (.837), NCAA titles (3), NCAA Final Four appearances (6) and NCAA Elite Eight Appearances (7). Note that no other team has appeared in more than three Elite Eights, two Final Fours or won more than one title in the 1990's. CSUB also is looking to continue its run of 10 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, the longest current streak in Division II (Virginia Union's run of 13 in a row was stopped in 1997).

27 YEARS OF CSUB BASKETBALL: The 1997-98 season will mark the 27th anniversary of Roadrunner basketball at CSUB. Since the program's inception in 1971-72, the Roadrunners have posted an all-time mark of 532-223 (.705).

ONE OF THE WINNINGEST DIVISION II PROGRAMS: With the record of 532-223, the Roadrunners now rank number two for all-time winning percentage by an NCAA Division II school. Cal State Bakersfield is also the only Div. II school founded after 1970 to record over 411 victories to date (532 and counting).

CSUB-THE TEAM OF THE DECADE: With a record of 215-42 during the 1990s, CSUB has racked up the best record in Div. II basketball during this decade.

In fact, CSUB is the decade's winningest program not only in terms of wins and winning percentage, but also in terms of NCAA titles won (3), NCAA Elite Eights reached (7) and NCAA Final Four appearances (6). Not only does CSUB lead in those categories, but no Div. II team will be able to surpass those numbers in the 1990's.

16 CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS: With 29-4 mark in 1997, CSUB extended its streak of consecutive winning seasons to 16. The last time CSUB did not post a winning record was in 1981, when Pat Wennihan's club went 7-19 in his final season at CSUB. The Roadrunners have only had two other losing seasons in the program's history. Those years were 1978, when CSUB went 11-15, and 1974, when the Roadrunners finished 11-14.

BACK-TO-BACK IN THE CCAA: By winning the CCAA title outright in 1997, CSUB became just the second team since 1968 (and just the seventh all-time) to win back-to-back out-right CCAA championships.

KINGS OF THE CCAA: In CSUB's 25 years of CCAA play (it spent 1972 as an independent), it has won 10 conference titles, finished second three times and finished third six times. In short, CSUB has placed in the top three 19 times in 25 years.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE: The Roadrunners begin their ninth season in the friendly confines of the 3,880 seat CSUB Activities Center. CSUB posted its second undefeated home season in the Activities Center by going 18-0 in 1997. The Roadrunners have posted an all-time record of 136-13 (.913) in the arena since it opened late in the 1989 season.

Out of the 13 losses at home, 10 of them have been by five or less points. The 13 losses have been by an average of 5.5 points.

WORKING OVERTIME: Though CSUB has been a dominant team overall, one area where it has been very average is overtime. Despite CSUB's strong all-time record, the Roadrunners have a 13-11 record in overtime (7-7 in single OT, 4-5 in double OT and 2-0 in triple OT). CSUB is 4-3 in OT at the Activities Center.

THREE-POINT SHOOTING: Since the three-point field goal was adopted by the NCAA in 1986-87, CSUB has converted at least one three-pointer in 328 out of 341 games. GCU held CSUB without a trey in the 'Runners' 57-55 win on Jan. 25, 1997, breaking a streak of 52 consecutive games with a three pointer for CSUB.

CSUB's best three-point shooting percentage came in 1986-87, when the Roadrunners made 116-of-257 (.451). The most three-pointers made in a season is 200, done in 1995-96.

Dr. Tomás A. Arciniega **CSUB President**

As the third president of California State College, Bakersfield, 59-year-old Dr. Tomas A. Arciniega is widely recognized as an authority on issues of educational policy and administration.

Appointed in the summer of 1983, Dr. Arciniega succeeded Dr. Jacob P. Frankel, who retired after nine years as president. He is the first Hispanic president in the CSU system. Previously, Arciniega was the vice president for academic affairs at California State University, Fresno, a post he held for three years.

Arciniega's first appointment in the CSU system was as the dean of the College of Education at San Diego State University. Before coming to California, he was associate graduate dean and chair of educational administration at the University of Texas, El Paso. He also taught educational administration and served as acting department chairman.

A member of numerous boards of directors, Arciniega has written and spoken extensively in professional circles about higher education reform, the schooling of minorities, the preparation of teachers, bilingualism, and financial issues.

Selected as one of 70 Distinguished Teacher Educators by the Association of Teacher Educators, Arciniega earned his bachelor's degree from New Mexico State University and his master's and doctorate, both in educational administration, from the University of New Mexico. He also did postgraduate work at the Institute for Educational Management at Harvard University.

Dr. and Mrs. Arciniega, the former M. Concha Ochotorena, are parents of four daughters: Wendy, Lisa, Judy and Laura.



Rudy Carvajal **Athletic Director**

A man committed to the cause of CSUB athletics, Rudy Carvajal has been the athletic director of the Roadrunner program since the fall of 1972.

As athletic director, Carvajal is responsible for providing leadership, guidance and direction to the program of intercollegiate athletics at CSUB.

During his tenure, the Roadrunner program has flourished as one of the nation's most successful at any level, producing 23 national championship teams and a myriad of individual national champions and All-Americans. Other accomplishments under his charge, such as the construction of the 3,880-seat CSUB Activities Center, have helped Carvajal distinguish himself as a leader on the Roadrunner campus.

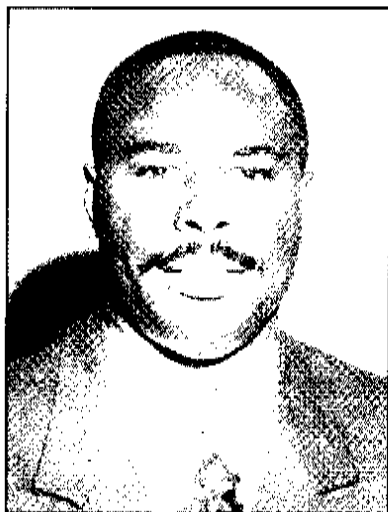
Carvajal has also been instrumental in the development of support for athletics through the CSUB Foundation, a non-profit group that annually provides a majority of CSUB's working budget, including all scholarship monies.

The consummate coach, Carvajal was the freshman football coach at Cal-Berkeley in 1964-65 before moving on to the University of California at Santa Barbara.

The call of Cal was too strong, however, and he returned as an assistant varsity football coach and an assistant to the athletic director in 1967, until he came to Bakersfield and was employed by the college in 1972.

During his second tenure at Cal, Carvajal secured his master's degree in administration, a continuation of his undergraduate studies in physical education.

Carvajal and his wife Anne have three daughters: Carol Lyn, Laurie and Connie.



HENRY CLARK

Head Coach

After contributing as a major part of the success of the Cal State Bakersfield basketball program for nine years, Henry Clark takes the reins of the Roadrunner program for the 1997-98 season. The Roadrunners have enjoyed their greatest success with Clark on the bench as an assistant and will look to continue that winning tradition as he becomes a head coach for the first time.

Clark served as Cal State Bakersfield lead assistant coach from 1988-1994 and again this past season. After he helped guide the team to back-to-back NCAA Division II National Championships in 1993 and 1994, Clark put his coaching career on hold to become the director of disabled student services at CSUB for two years. The 'Runners spent both of those seasons out of the national championship limelight and many would argue that it was no accident that CSUB's return to the winner's circle coincided with

Clark's return to the bench.

In Clark's eight years as head coach Pat Douglass' assistant at CSUB, the Roadrunners racked up a combined record of 211-60. The 'Runners advanced to the NCAA Division II West Regionals all eight seasons, including six trips to the Elite Eight and three national championships.

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Clark has been involved in every level of coaching during the past 15 years. His collegiate experience includes two seasons as Douglass' assistant at Montana State-Billings before the two made the move to Bakersfield for the 1987-88 season.

Prior to his coaching stint in Billings (where he also served one season as the school's head track and field and cross country coach), Clark served as a basketball and track and field coach in Othello, Wash. Clark's professional experience also includes a background in recreational youth counseling and supervision in both Cleveland and Billings.

Clark earned his bachelor's degree from MSUB in special education and a master's in that same field from MSUB in 1987.

Nishimori works closely with team physicians, coaches, administrators and parents to guarantee that each student-athlete receives the highest quality health care possible.

Nishimori also directs CSUB's athletic training internship program for students interested in pursuing a career as an NATA certified athletic trainer. Completion of the program enables students to become candidates to take the NATA certification examination and become certified athletic trainers.

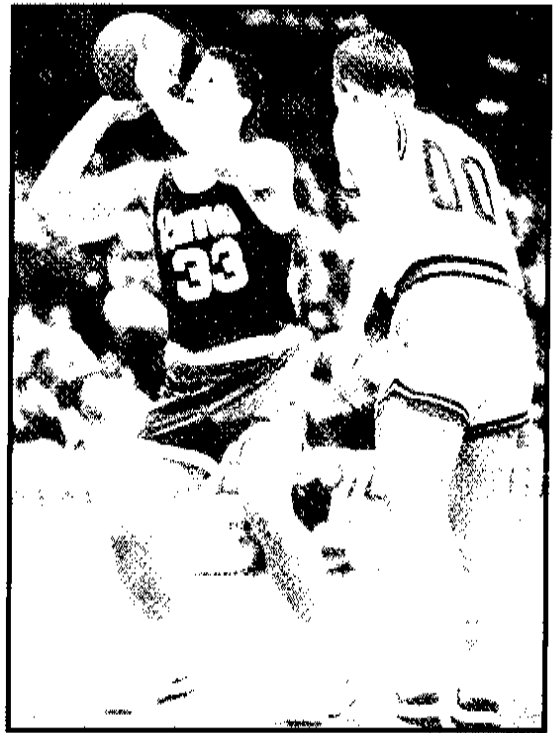

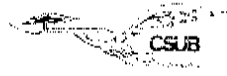

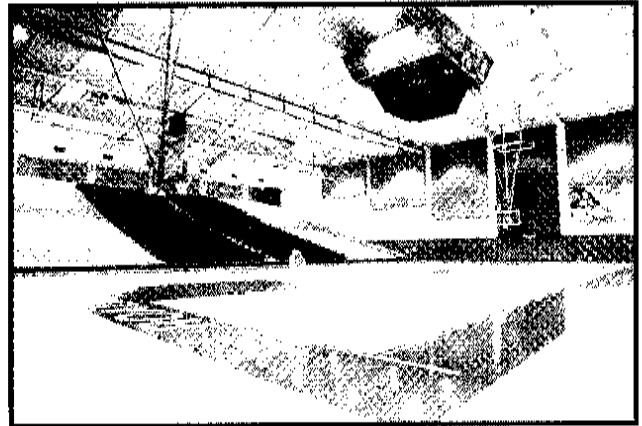

John B. Antonino Sports Center

Merely a dream of the CSUB wrestling program for years, ground was broken on June 13, 1984, for the Roadrunners' first real wrestling facility. The enviable facility was completed during the summer of 1985 and was named the John B. Antonino Sports Center in appreciation of Mr. Antonino's commitment and generosity to the facility.

Standing as a separate 40' x 120' structure near the John S. Hillman Aquatic Center, the complex contains an 80' practice area, a large conference/team room, coaches' offices, and locker and shower facilities.

Mats to cover the practice area were obtained during the summer of 1984 through the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee. The Backstrand mats bear the festive Olympic colors and, besides being used for collegiate competition, the mats are of such a design that they can be utilized for freestyle and Greco-Roman training.

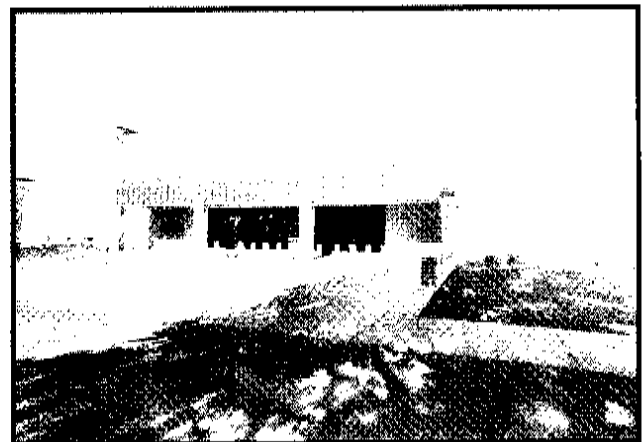


CSUB Activities Center

Previously the only school in the 20-member CSU system without an on-campus playing facility, Cal State University Bakersfield saw the completion of the CSUB Activities Center in late winter 1989.

The 44,000 square foot facility reached the 5,080,000 dollar mark and seats 3,764. Primarily funded by the state of California in the 1987-88 fiscal year budget, separate improvements financed by the Cal State Bakersfield Foundation include 700 improved chair-back seats and air conditioning. A 2,000-square-foot, \$100,000 reception room was financed by long-time Roadrunner Club member and University supporter, Jimmie Icardo.

The gymnasium also houses athletic administrative offices, locker and shower facilities, and men's and women's equipment issue rooms. Some of the additional amenities include a concession area in the lobby, a state-of-the-art sound system which is housed in a combination scoreboard speaker cluster suspended above center court and digitized message boards situated on diagonally opposite ends of center court.



Physical Education Building

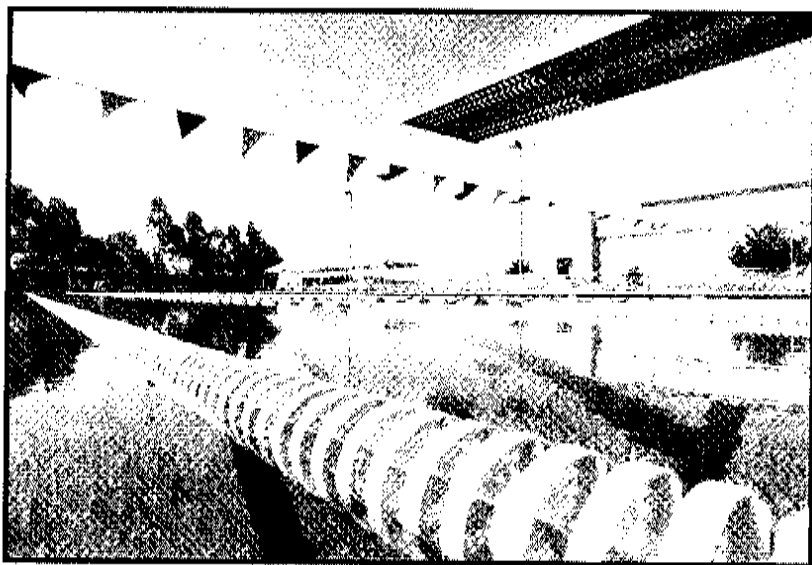
Built in 1973, CSUB's physical education building is a practice gymnasium with seating limited to approximately 600. It contains one full-length basketball court, two half-court basketball courts, three standard volleyball courts and six standard badminton courts.

Extending on the east side of the gym is an office complex with 11 offices that separate the men's and women's locker rooms and restrooms. On the south end of the facility is a 40' x 50' wired-for-sound, mirrored weight room, complete with free weights, exercise bikes, circuit-training weight systems, incline benches, etc.

The facility also houses a training room, complete with training tables, computers, ultrasound muscle stimulators, X-ray screen, a hydrocolator, an ice machine, two whirlpool tubs, a stairmaster, a slider and two stationary bikes.

John S. Hillman Memorial Aquatic Center

The beautiful John S. Hillman Memorial Aquatic Center, located on the Cal State University, Bakersfield campus is the practice and competition facility of the eight-time NCAA Division II National Championship men's swimming team and the eight-year old women's swimming program.



It was completed in April of 1983 and contains an eight-lane, 50-meter competition pool with a 10-lane short course, and a separate six-lane 3-foot deep training pool. There are one- and three-meter diving boards, and the pool is heated year-round.

The complex also boasts an electronic scoreboard and a Colorado timing system which computerizes results. When swimmers touch the pool pads their times are displayed on the scoreboard, then are relayed through cables to a computer located in the office. The computer then seeds the athletes and sets up heats based on the finish times. In addition, bleachers and canopies are available for spectators.

An office, a mechanical room for filtering and treatment, restrooms, and a dry-land training facility complete the center.

Sally Ann Silva Tennis Courts

The Sally Ann Silva tennis courts are a collection of six hard-surface, lighted courts in a double-stack format situated in the westernmost section of campus.



CSUB Soccer Field

The CSUB soccer field is considered the finest playing surface among NCAA Division II institutions in the West. The field, which covers the maximum 120 yards-by-80 yards, has been host to the highest attended soccer matches in the Far West Region, drawing as many as 1,000 fans to its events.

CSUB Track Facility

For track, CSUB has a nine-lane 400m synthetic surface course accessorized by a high jump structure, pole vault pit, steeplechase trough and grass infield.

CSUB Softball Diamond

Originally built as a baseball diamond, the CSUB softball diamond saw its inaugural season during the 1984-85 school year. The facility, which measures 220 feet down the foul lines and 235 feet to the center field fence, also includes covered dugouts, its own sound system and electronic scoreboard, and four portable bleachers.

When California State University, Bakersfield opened for classes in September 1970, it was the realization of a decades-old dream. It is especially fitting that CSUB, the 19th member institution of The California State University, was created out of the Donahoe Higher Education Act of 1960.

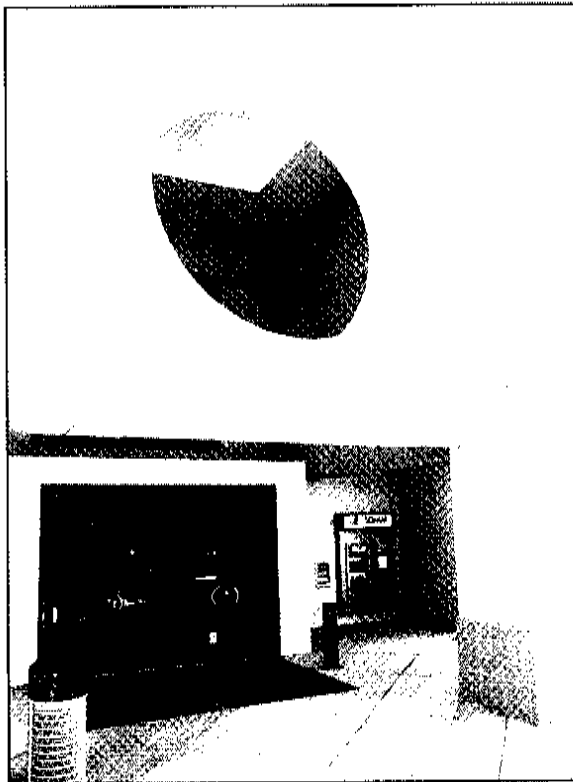
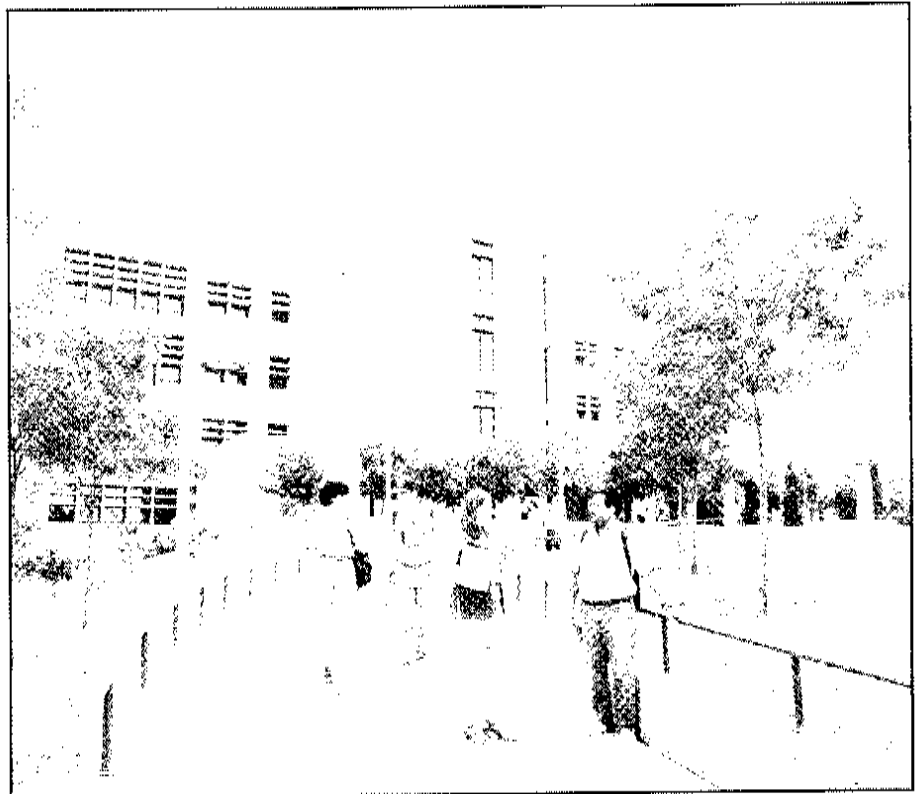
A staunch advocate and friend of public education, Dorothy Donahoe represented the residents of Bakersfield and Kern County in the California Assembly for many years. During that same period, community leaders from Bakersfield and throughout Kern County sought to bring higher education to the area.

That community-wide grassroots effort bore fruit in 1970. Since then, the university has become a major intellectual and cultural center for the burgeoning southern San Joaquin Valley. The university's growth has kept pace with the community, as Bakersfield has become one of the fastest growing metropolitan areas in the state.

Thus, its role as the only four-year institution within a 100-mile radius becomes even more significant as it extends higher education opportunities to this increasingly important economic and social center.

Student achievement

Our students have demonstrated a remark-



able record of academic achievement and outstanding scholarship. We have long been proud that student and faculty interaction is lively and vigorous, because we remain a relatively small community of scholars.

One of the benefits is that students get an opportunity which they would not get at a larger institution to conduct research and to present and publish their research. Such opportunities bring the level of their scholarship, research and writing to a new level of maturity that most undergraduate students at other institutions do not enjoy.

Faculty scholarship

Our faculty have posted a notable record of scholarship, research and publication. It is worth noting that the faculty of the School of Business and Public Administration ranks with Harvard, MIT and Berkeley in

volume of publishing. Furthermore, our faculty accomplish this feat without sacrificing classroom time and instructional quality.

Technology in the classroom

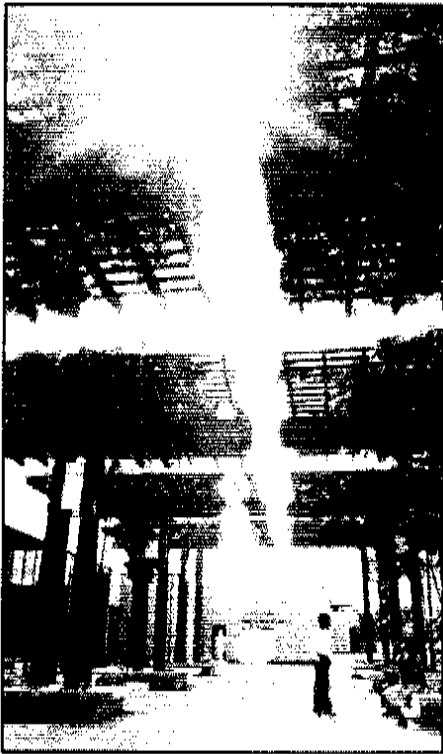
Rapidly developing technology, especially computer and telecommunications technology, will have dramatic impact upon how we teach and how students learn. The Walter W. Stiern Library is a focal point of our progress toward applying technology in higher education.

The university is looking at new paradigms for teaching and learning. The new technology will change fundamentally how we teach. It will change the role of the teacher, the responsibilities of the student, the resources available to students and the environment in which the learning process takes place.

The university recognizes that change of such dramatic and fundamental nature must be handled with sensitivity and care, since both students and teachers are accustomed to more traditional ways of learning.

Centers and institutes

CSUB is home to several centers and in



stitutes. They include the Applied Research Center; Archaeological Information Center; California Well Sample Repository; Center for Archaeological Research; Center for Biomedical Research; Center for Environmental Studies and the Facility for Animal Care and Treatment; Center for Economic Education and Research; Computer Software Development and Computing Center; Kegley Institute of Ethics; Business Research and Education Center; Direct Marketing Institute; Small Business Institute; Public Administration Institute; and the Center for Living and Learning.

Fine arts programs

From the beginning, the university has enjoyed a rich and varied fine arts program, from music to theater to the visual arts — Theatrefest, the Bakersfield Chamber Orchestra, Musica da Camera, the University Singers, ballet and opera and the Armand Hammer art exhibit which brought more visitors to the campus than any other event in our history. The Chamber Singers recently performed at Carnegie Hall.

Finally, the university has become the premier venue for jazz in the community, with Jazz Coffeehouse, Jazz Jam and the annual Jazz Festival.

Athletics

Our Roadrunner athletes continue to rank among the nation's winningest NCAA programs at any level. The athletics program has been a source of continuing pride — for the university and for the community. Since the department's inception, the CSUB athletic program has won 23 national team titles — including a third men's basketball championship in 1997 — a rate no other four-year university in the nation has ever matched.

Athletics play an integral role in higher education. The discipline, values and teamwork required in competitive sports make our athletes better students. Roadrunner student-athletes also go on to play a significant role within the greater Bakersfield community. In the last 10 years alone, more than 170 CSUB student-athletes have gone on to become teachers and/or coaches in the greater Bakersfield area alone.

Community involvement

Through the efforts of the Applied Research Center, we have participated in developing and evaluating Project 2000, a remarkable program that has demonstrated that students are capable of living up to our highest expectations. Project 2000 shows that even so-called average students can achieve success in college, that given an opportunity, dedicated teachers and parents, a quality curriculum and high expectations they will meet the challenge.

We are proud to be the venue for the world-renowned Bakersfield Business Conference. Through the tireless efforts of Bakersfield attorney George Martin, the conference has grown over the years and attracts a distinguished roster of speakers, including Lee Iacocca, Jack Kemp, Colin Powell, Norman Schwartzkopf, Margaret Thatcher and Presidents Carter, Ford, Reagan, and Bush.

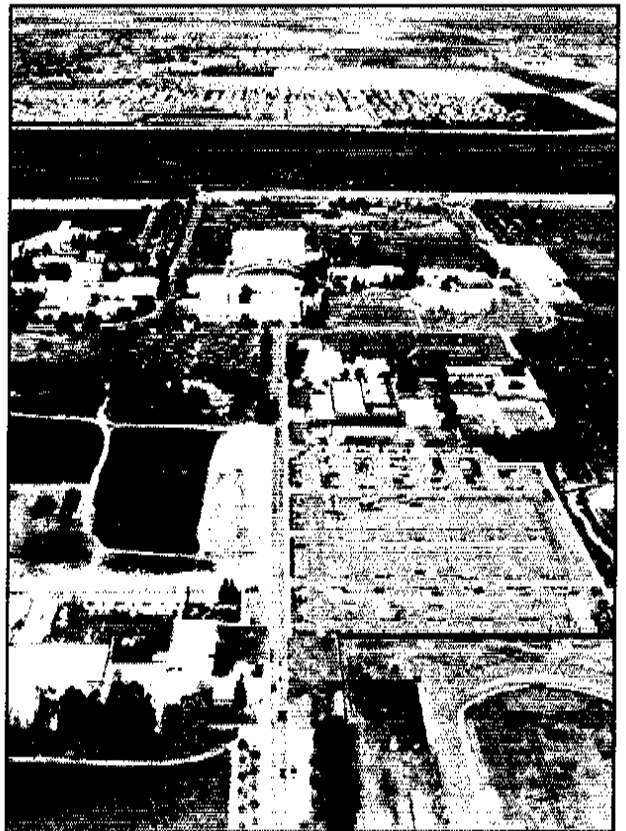
Looking ahead
