Rod Barnes became the eighth head men's basketball coach at CSU Bakersfield on Mar. 30, 2011, and enters his 13th season at the helm of the Roadrunners in fall of 2023.

In his tenure at CSUB, Barnes has led the Runners to postseason play four times including three appearances over a four-year span. A vocal advocate for academic success, Barnes has enjoyed watching 43 different Runners earn their bachelor's degrees from CSUB while three men have earned master's degrees.

Barnes' vision for the Runner program came to fruition in 2015-16 as he led CSUB to its best NCAA Division I record at 24-9 (11-3 WAC) while also guiding the Runners to a WAC Tournament championship and their first NCAA Tournament appearance.

During the 2016-17 season, Barnes built on the success of the 2016 NCAA Tournament bid, leading his team to a WAC regular-season championship, another first for the program. After falling in the WAC Tournament final, the Runners made the best of their National Invitational Tournament (NIT) run, winning three road games and becoming the first eight-seed to advance to Madison Square Garden for the NIT semifinals. CSUB also set a new Division I program record with 25 wins that year.

During the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, Barnes posted a 49-19 record and was named 'Don Haskins Coach of the Year' in the Western Athletic Conference each year. He was also named 'Hugh Durham Mid Major Coach of the Year' in 2017 by CollegeInsider.com.

The 2018-19 season saw Barnes' program return to the postseason for the third time in the last four years. The Runners accepted an invitation to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) and again proved to be a force on the road. CSUB won back-to-back games away from home before falling in the CIT quarterfinals.

CSUB transitioned from the Western Athletic Conference to the Big West Conference in Summer of 2020. During the program's tenure in the WAC - seven seasons, all under Barnes - the Runners earned two conference titles, one NABC All-Region honoree, 22 All-WAC nods, and seven Academic All-WAC honorees.

The Big West promised increased parity across a deep league and Barnes' squad outperformed its predicted 2020-21 finish in the new conference. The Runners posted a 15-10 record in the COVID-abbreviated season while battling to earn the fifth seed at the Big West Championship, just two games behind second-seeded UC Irvine. CSUB's first Big West season also featured a First Team All-Conference honoree for guard Taze Moore. In three seasons in the Big West, three Runners have earned Honorable Mention All-Conference nods and four have taken away Academic All-Big West honorees.

Barnes has led Bakersfield to several program milestones starting with his first season in 2011 when the Runners made their first NCAA Division I postseason appearance, earning a spot in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament after posting a 16-15 record. Barnes also won his 200th game as a Division I head coach Feb. 22, 2012, when the Roadrunners defeated New Jersey Tech on the road in double overtime. Barnes was named "Independent Coach of the Year" by CollegeSportsMadness.com in 2012.

With a 182-193 record in 12 complete seasons at CSUB, Barnes has a 368-382 career record as of the end of the 2022-23 season. He became the second-most winning coach in Bakersfield's history on Feb. 13, 2020, with a home win over Chicago State, trailing only Pat Douglass' 257 victories.

Barnes came to Bakersfield off a stint at Georgia State (2007-11) where he added 44 wins to his coaching resume and helped rebuild a basketball program amidst academic, administrative, and conference turmoil.

Prior to Georgia State, Barnes led his alma mater Ole Miss to the Sweet 16 in the 2001 NCAA Tournament. The same year, he was named SEC Coach of the Year and Naismith national coach of the year. Barnes posted a win percentage of .564 (141-109) in eight years in the SEC while producing three 20-win seasons.

Barnes had a stellar career as a player at Ole Miss, averaging 19.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 4.0 assists as a senior. He became in the first player in the history of the program to collect 500 points, 100 rebounds, and 100 assists in a single season. Barnes is the only person in the storied history of the Southeastern Conference to be named both All-SEC as a player and SEC Coach of the Year. He was inducted as a member of the Ole Miss Hall of Fame in the Fall of 2012.

He is a 1988 graduate of Mississippi with a degree in business management. Barnes is married to his wife Bridgett and has three sons, Brandon, Bray, and stepson Corey. Bray (2016-19) and Brandon (2013-14) both competed for Barnes at CSUB during their collegiate careers. The Barnes family now features three CSUB alumni: Bridgett, Brandon, and Bray.

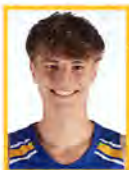

MODESTAS KANCLERIS

Modestas Kancleris enters his second year with the Roadrunners, Kancleris is a transfer from Creighton University where he played from 2020-2022. The Lithuanian sat out his freshman year with a torn ACL, and then returned the next year, playing 33 minutes over 14 games with the Blue Jays, who fell to eventual National Champion Kansas in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Prior to college ball, he was named to the 2019 adidas Next Generation Tournament All-Star Team after averaging 13 points and eight rebounds with the club team. Kancleris gained exposure at the Jordan Brand Classic, NBA Basketball Without Borders, adidas Eurocamp, and NBAPA Top 100 Camp. In year two with Bakersfield, he leads the team in rebounds (71), rebounds per game (5.5), shooting percentage (min. 50 field goal attempts, .548). The big man had his best game of the year versus South Dakota on Dec. 19, scoring 17 points, bringing down 7 rebounds, 3 steals, 2 blocks, and dishing out 3 assists.

HOME COURT THE ICARDO CENTER



HISTORY OF THE ICARDO CENTER

California State University, Bakersfield saw the completion of the Jimmie and Marjorie Icardo Center in 1989. Originally named the CSUB Activities Center, the building was dedicated in honor of the longtime Roadrunner boosters who donated more than \$2.5 million to support Roadrunner Athletics.

The 44,000 square-foot facility originally seated 3,800 fans. Originally funded by the State of California in the 1987-88 fiscal budget, separate improvements financed by the CSU Bakersfield Foundation included 700 improved chair-back seats and air conditioning. A 2,000 square-foot, \$100,000 reception room was financed by the Icardo Family.

The Roadrunners moved into city-owned Centennial Garden (now Mechanics Bank Arena) for the 1998-99 season and played exclusively at the downtown facility for the next decade, including their first seasons as an NCAA Division I program. Starting in the 2011-12 season, CSUB played selected games at both the Icardo Center and the arena before moving back on campus exclusively starting in the 2014-15 season.

Due to the move back onto campus, the Icardo Center received a notable facelift in the fall of 2011 with the installation of the nation's first blue floor. The playing surface is the first of its kind in volleyball and created quite a buzz when installed with ESPN, CBS, and NBC and other college sports networks writing stories about this new potentially-trend-setting playing surface.

As part of the continued renovations, additional amenities include a concession area in the lobby, a state-of-the-art south system, dual scoreboards at either end of the playing surface, and a high-definition video board.

In Summer of 2014, the facility underwent construction again, which included a new ceiling and walls color scheme matched to compliment the newly redesigned floor. New blue seats were added in the Summer of 2015 featuring contoured bench seating on the north end of the facility. Similar seating was added to the south end along with additional chair-back seating on both sides in the Summer of 2016, changing the venue capacity to 3,497.

Renovations have continued on the Icardo Center as it is becoming a top-tier athletic facility. The Summer of 2018 saw the men's and women's locker rooms get a complete overhaul to further improve the student-athlete experience.

The old main court was also ripped out and replaced by the same state-of-the-art playing surface used as the primary home court of the NBA's Minnesota Timberwolves and in the practice facilities of the Orlando Magic and Cleveland Cavaliers. The new, still-blue court was made possible by the generosity of Kern Schools Federal Credit Union and is now known as the "Kern Schools Court". This past summer, lighted Roadrunner and "Icardo Center" signs were added to the outside of the building.

The CSU Bakersfield men's basketball team boasts an impressive all-time record of 268-64 (.809) in the Icardo Center. CSUB is 72-36 (.673) at home since Jan. 1, 2015 and the Runners are 4-1 at home this season.

CSUB ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Lynnette Zelezny was appointed to serve as the fifth president of CSU Bakersfield, effective July 1, 2018. She is the first woman to serve in that role. President Zelezny is a strong supporter of Roadrunner Athletics, believing that academics and athletics must rise together at CSUB. She is proud of the program's competitive success - seven conference championships since 2014 - as well as its academic success reflected by eleven consecutive terms of an overall Grade Point Average of 3.0 and increases in Graduation Success Rates and Academic Progress Rates.

LYNNETTE ZELEZNY

Dr. Thomas D. Wallace, Vice President for Student Affairs at California State University, Bakersfield, began his appointment February 15, 2012. He has held administrative and faculty positions at the University of Mississippi and the University of Nebraska, Omaha. Student enrollment has increased almost every year Wallace has served as the chief student affairs officer. He has initiated a number of programs and activities to foster harmony, respect and acceptance among students and campus communities.
