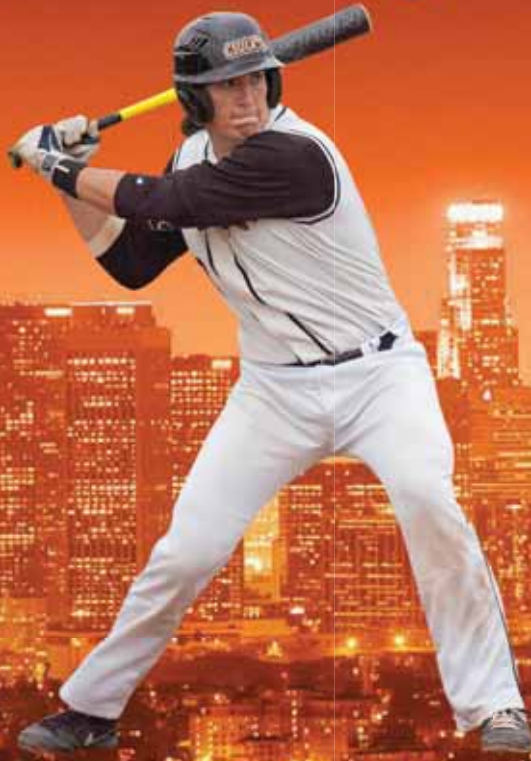

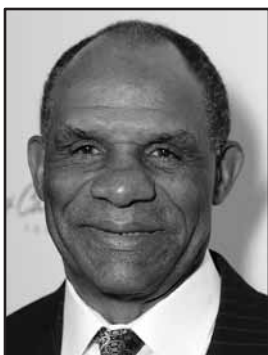

After guiding the Golden Eagles to a successful 2015 season, Vince Beringhele returns for his ninth season as the Cal State L.A. head baseball coach. He led the Golden Eagles to a winning season for the sixth time in the past eight years with a dramatic improvement in 2015.

The Golden Eagles won 12 more games in 2015 than they did in 2014 and were one of the most improved teams in the NCAA Division II. Cal State L.A. finished with a 28-20 overall record and a 23-17 mark in the California Collegiate Athletic Association last season.

The team's earned run average dropped from 5.84 in 2014 to 3.87 last season and the team's batting average rose from .262 to .298. The Golden Eagles scored 59 more runs than in 2014 and allowed 90 fewer runs. The 3.87 earned run average was the lowest for Cal State L.A. in more than 25 years.

In his first eight years at Cal State L.A., Beringhele has led the Golden Eagles to a 211-189 overall record and a 167-137 mark in conference play. Cal State L.A. has had 40 players earn All-Conference honors, 24 players make All-West Region teams and six players earn All-America recognition. Cal State L.A. has had an All-West Region player in each of Beringhele's eight seasons with the program, including a first-team selection in six of those years.

Beringhele led the Golden Eagles to a historic season in 2013 when they won their first-ever CCAA Championship Tournament title and earned a trip to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time since 2007. The Golden Eagles posted a 35-22 overall record that included a sparkling 28-12 mark in CCAA play.

Cal State L.A. finished second in the CCAA during the regular season, just one game out first place. The 35 wins were the most for the program since 2007 and the third-highest total since 1977. The 28-12 conference record was the best for the program since 2007 and the second-best since 1977.

Beringhele directed the Golden Eagles to a dominating run through the CCAA Championship Tournament that enabled Cal State L.A. to punch its ticket to the NCAA playoffs. Cal State L.A. went 4-1 in the double-elimination tournament. After splitting its first two games against Chico State and Sonoma State, the Golden Eagles beat Cal State Monterey Bay, 14-3 and Sonoma State twice by scores of 15-3 and 7-1 to win the championship. In the five tournament games, Cal State L.A. outscored its opponents, 49-12.

The Golden Eagles advanced to the NCAA playoffs as the No. 5 seed in the West Region and dropped its two playoff games to conclude the season.

Cal State L.A. earned seven All-Conference selections, the most for the program since 2009, including five first-team picks, which were the most since 1998. James Wharton was named the CCAA Player of the Year, giving the Golden Eagles their second straight Player of the Year award and a major conference award for a third straight year.

Beringhele led the Golden Eagles to its second straight winning season in 2012 and to the brink of a spot in the four-team CCAA Championship Tournament. Cal State L.A. finished with a 26-22 overall record and a 21-17 mark in conference play.

Beringhele led a team that featured All-American Daniel Duran, who set a new program record by hitting .451 on the season. Duran was named the CCAA and NCAA Division II West Region Player of the Year. Duran became the Golden Eagles' first CCAA Player of the Year since 1998 and the first West Region Player of the Year since 2007.

Cal State L.A. wound up with a 27-23 overall record and was 21-19 in conference play in 2011. The Golden Eagles finished just one game out of a spot in the CCAA Championship Tournament and were ranked in the national top-25 polls during the regular season.

Gabriel Asakura was also named the CCAA Co-Pitcher of the Year, becoming the first Golden Eagle to claim that award since Jeff Verplancke in 1998, and earned All-America honors.

Cal State L.A. was 32-17 overall in 2009 and posted a 22-11 record in conference play. The Golden Eagles earned the No. 3 seed in the CCAA tournament. Cal State L.A. lost to Sonoma State in the opening round, beat Cal State Dominguez Hills in an elimination game and then lost to Sonoma State later in the day, 10-9, to exit the tournament. The win over Cal State Dominguez Hills was the first victory in a CCAA Tournament game for Cal State L.A.

The Golden Eagles, who were ranked fourth in the NCAA Division II West Region entering the final week of regular-season play, surprisingly slipped out of the top four following the CCAA tourney.

Beringhele, who was a successful assistant coach at two NCAA Division I programs and also a former assistant at Cal State L.A., led the Golden Eagles to a 29-22 record in 2008 in his first year with the program with a young and inexperienced squad. The Golden Eagles had only five players returning from their 2007 team and had lost 19 seniors. Beringhele led Cal State L.A. to a 23-12 record in the CCAA and the Golden Eagles missed qualifying for the four-team championship tournament by just one-half game.

Before coming to Cal State L.A. in 2007, Beringhele spent four years at Loyola Marymount as an assistant to head coach Frank Cruz. He was promoted to the associate head coach position prior to the 2006 season. The Lions captured the West Coast Conference title in 2005. During his time at Loyola Marymount, Beringhele coached third base and worked closely with the Lions' offense. Chris Pettit, one of the players Beringhele worked closely with, was the organizational Player of the Year with the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim in 2007.

Beringhele joined Loyola Marymount in 2004 after 15 years with UCLA. Serving as the hitting instructor and recruiting coordinator, Beringhele worked with Garrett Atkins, Troy Glaus, Chase Utley, Eric Byrnes, Eric Valent, Ben Francisco, Michael Moore, Chris Pritchett, Joel Wolfe and Paul Ellis, all of whom were drafted in the first five rounds of the Major League Baseball draft. During his time at UCLA, Beringhele was credited with bringing the top high school talent in California to the program. UCLA's class in 1997 was regarded as the best in the nation by Collegiate Baseball and the 2003 recruiting class earned a top-five ranking from Baseball America.

Beringhele helped guide the Bruins to the College World Series in 1997 after they battled back to win five games in a row at the regional to advance to the Series. The Bruins also advanced to a Super Regional in 2000.

He began his college coaching career as an assistant coach for two years at Cal State L.A. in 1988-89. He got his introduction to coaching as an assistant for Cruz at University High School before going to Cal State L.A.

Beringhele also worked with Cruz in the summer of 2004 during the selection process for the gold-medal winning USA Baseball National Team.

Before beginning his college coaching career, Beringhele played in the Los Angeles Dodgers' minor league system for three years in Lethbridge, Vero Beach and Bakersfield. In 1983, he batted .338 at Lethbridge and tied for the league lead in hits (94) with teammate and former Dodger Jeff Hamilton. In 1984, he batted .256 for the Vero Beach Dodgers and collected 100 walks in 100 games. He completed his playing career in 1985, playing for both Vero Beach and Bakersfield.

Beringhele earned his bachelor of arts in sociology from UCLA. He and his wife, Trudy, have one daughter, Betina.

## CHRIS HERNANDEZ - 4<sup>RD</sup> SEASON - ASSISTANT COACH



A former pitcher in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization, Chris Hernandez returns for a fourth season with the Cal State L.A. baseball staff as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator.

He helped lead a pitching staff that turned in a historic performance in 2015 when the Golden Eagles won 12 more games than they did in 2014 and were one of the most improved teams in the NCAA Division II. Cal State L.A. finished with a 28-20 overall record and a 23-17 mark in the California Collegiate Athletic Association.

The team's earned run average dropped from 5.84 in 2014 to 3.87 in 2015 and allowed 90 fewer runs than it did in 2014. The 3.87 earned run average was the lowest for Cal State L.A. in more than 25 years.

Hernandez was a big part of a historic season for the Golden Eagles in 2013 when Cal State L.A. captured its first-ever CCAA championship tournament title and qualified for the NCAA playoffs for the first time since 2007. Hernandez helped the Golden Eagles compile a 35-22 overall record that included a 28-12 mark in conference.

Hernandez guided the pitching staff to a team earned run average of 4.46, which was the lowest for the program since the 2007 season. The team earned run average in conference was 3.97.

Hernandez helped pull together an injury-plagued pitching staff in 2014 that saw 16 players see time on the mound for the Golden Eagles.

Hernandez came to Cal State L.A. from Riverside City College, where he was the pitching coach for two years. He helped guide teams to consecutive playoff appearances and led pitching staffs that ranked near the top of the state for earned run average, strikeouts, opponent batting average, home runs allowed and walks allowed. During his time at RCC, Hernandez helped develop one All-Conference pitcher and had three pitchers drafted.

Hernandez was drafted in the 22nd round by the Pirates in 2003. He enjoyed a six-year career with the Pirates and reached the Triple-A level. He was part of two championship teams in the Pirates' organization and was named to two All-Star teams. He finished his career with a 23-15 record with 56 saves and a 3.22 ERA while appearing in 230 games.

In 2007, he played in the Arizona Fall League with the Phoenix Desert Dogs and was on a championship team. He was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in 13 appearances.

Hernandez also played in the Venezuelan Winter League for five seasons.

He played collegiately at the University of South Carolina for two seasons under head coach Ray Tanner and helped the team reach the College World Series both years. During his junior season, South Carolina won the South Eastern Conference Championship and made a trip to the College World Series, finishing second in the nation. During his senior season, South Carolina made another trip to the College World Series and finished sixth in the nation.

While at South Carolina, Hernandez compiled a 6-6 record with two saves in 38 appearances and had a 3.51 ERA. He earned the Tom Price Award for hard work and dedication and was named to the Dean's List. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in experimental psychology.

Hernandez also played for two seasons at RCC under head coach Dennis Rogers and was on two state championship teams. He earned All-Orange Empire Conference honors both years and compiled a 14-5 record with three saves and a 3.00 ERA.

Hernandez graduated from Redlands High School, where he was a two-time All-Citrus Belt League selection. He and his wife, Robin, have two children, 12-year-old Angelina and 4-year-old Bobby.

## JOE GORDON - 6<sup>TH</sup> SEASON - ASSISTANT COACH



Joe Gordon returns for his sixth season with the Cal State L.A. baseball program in 2016 as the infield and hitting coach.

He helped the Golden Eagles to a successful 2015 season. Cal State LA won 12 more games in 2015 than it did in 2014 and was one of the most improved teams in the NCAA Division II. Cal State L.A. finished with a 28-20 overall record and a 23-17 mark in the California Collegiate Athletic Association last season.

The team's batting average rose from .262 to .298 and the Golden Eagles scored 59 more runs than in 2014.

The highlight of his tenure so far came in 2013 when Gordon helped the Golden Eagles capture their first-ever CCAA Championship Tournament title and reach the NCAA playoffs for the first time since 2007. Cal State L.A. posted an overall record of 35-22 and had a 28-12 mark in conference play.

This included the team leading the conference in most offensive categories including, runs scored (393), RBI's (351), hits (601), home runs (33), doubles (130), slugging (.434) and 2nd in batting average (.305).

In 2012, Gordon also helped the Golden Eagles to a 26-22 overall record and a 21-17 mark in CCAA play. In his first year with the program, the Golden Eagles were 27-23 overall and 21-19 mark in conference play.

Gordon was the head coach at Simi Valley from 1998-2003 and coached several players who went on to professional careers, including Jered Weaver of the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim and Bryan Anderson of the Oakland A's.

He was an All-State and All-CIF player at Simi Valley High School. Gordon also played at Cal Lutheran University and helped the team reach the Division III World Series. Prior to that, he also played at UCLA when Cal State L.A. Head Coach Vince Beringhele was on the coaching staff. He also played three years of professional baseball in the Prairie and Northern Leagues.

Gordon earned his Bachelor's degree in Mathematics Education from George Fox University and his Master's in Curriculum and Instruction from Cal Lutheran.

He currently resides in Moorpark with his wife Julie, daughter Pressley (8) and sons, Gunner (3) and Bront (eight months).

## DALE LEGASPI - 2<sup>ND</sup> SEASON - ASSISTANT COACH



Dale Legaspi returns for his third season with the Cal State LA staff, working with outfielders, handling development of the offensive short game and assisting in recruiting.

In his time with the Golden Eagles, Legaspi has overseen an outfield that has included two All-Conference and All-Region players.

Most recently, he served as the hitting coach for the Duluth (Minn.) Huskies of the Northwoods Collegiate League. The team finished second in the North Division and led the league in hitting, posting a .281 team average. The previous summer, he was the hitting coach for the 2014 Southern California Collegiate Baseball League champion Palm Springs Power. He ran an offense that compiled a team batting average of .319 and amassed 109 doubles, breaking the franchise record. The Power finished with a record of 41-8.

His previous coaching experience includes stints at John Burroughs High School in Burbank, St. Joseph-Notre Dame in Alameda and Crespi Carmelite in Encino, where he worked with numerous players who went on to play NCAA Division I and professional baseball.

Legaspi played collegiately at USC from 2002-2005 under longtime head coach and current UC Irvine head coach Mike Gillespie. The Trojans reached the Super Regionals twice during his collegiate career. Additionally, he was a 2003 All-Star with the Duluth Huskies of the Northwoods Collegiate League.

He graduated from USC's Annenberg School for Communication in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in Public Relations and is currently working on his M.A. He resides in Burbank.

## SCOTT MASIK - 1<sup>ST</sup> SEASON - ASSISTANT COACH



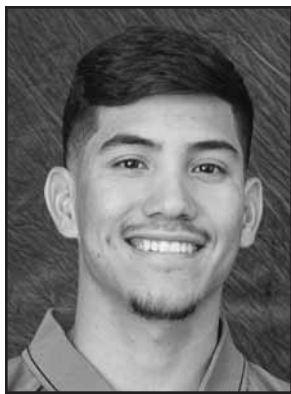
A key member of Cal State LA's 2013 conference championship team, Scott Masik joins the Golden Eagle coaching staff. He will work with outfielders and assist in the development of the hitters.

Masik earned first-team All-California Collegiate Athletic Association honors as an outfielder in 2013 and helped the Golden Eagles win their first-ever CCAA championship tournament title. Cal State LA earned its first trip to the NCAA playoffs since 2007.

Masik hit .325 for the Golden Eagles and had an on-base percentage of .393. He was second on the team with 56 runs scored and led the team in stolen bases. He also played outstanding defense and was on the ABCA/Rawlings West Region "Gold Glove" team. In addition to earning first-team All-CCAA honors, Masik also earned All-West Region honorable mention from the NCBWA.

Masik was drafted in the 21st round by the Oakland A's and played in the A's organization for two years before his playing career was ended by injuries.

He is currently completing his bachelor's degree in communications and will graduate in June.

**2015:** Was one of the team's most dependable pitchers in his second season with the Golden Eagles. Made 13 appearances, including six starts. Finished with a 1-5 record and a 3.44 earned run average that was the second-lowest among the Golden Eagle starters. Allowed three or fewer earned runs in five of his six starts. Reeder Field in the Billie Jean King Sports Complex is home of Cal State L.A. baseball. It is named for Jim Reeder, who served as Golden Eagles head coach from 1958-71, and compiled a 397-272-6 (.593) record during that span. He held the record for wins by a CSULA mentor until John Herbold recorded 455 wins from 1984-2004. With seating for approximately 600 fans directly on field level, Reeder Field offers Cal State L.A. baseball fans a chance to be close to the action.



In the spring of 2000, a new baseball scoreboard was erected just beyond the left field fence at Reeder Field, thanks in part to the generous support of Cal State L.A.'s Associated Students Incorporated (ASI).

In January 2001, Reeder Field underwent extensive renovation with the complete lazer-leveling of the field. In addition to new sod being placed in both the infield and outfield, a new irrigation system was installed to allow for better drainage during rainy periods early in the season.

In the winter of 2010, a new artificial turf infield was installed at Reeder Field. The turf extends to both dugouts and has given the ballpark the nicest playing surface in the conference. It also gives the baseball field the ability to maintain a safe playing surface during inclement weather.

The ballpark has several nuances which make it unique among collegiate fields. The short 310-foot distance down the left field line at Reeder Field quickly darts out to 350, very similar to the "Pesky Pole" setup found in right field at Fenway Park in Boston.

If left field is L.A.'s version of Fenway Park, than right field must be considered our own version of Oriole Park at Camden Yards.

Just like the Baltimore Orioles home ballpark, the right field porch at Reeder Field is an inviting target to left-handed hitters. The line is a standard 331 feet, but the shortest distance to right field is 325, just inside the line. It's in the right-center power alley where eyeballs of lefty sluggers get larger. The distance to that alley is a mouth-watering 337 feet while "deep" right-center is a mere 362 feet. However, like Camden Yards, you have to get the ball up. A 30-foot high wall protects the adjacent parking lot and campus buildings from would-be home run balls at Reeder Field. Worth noting, the wall at Camden Yards is only 25-feet tall.

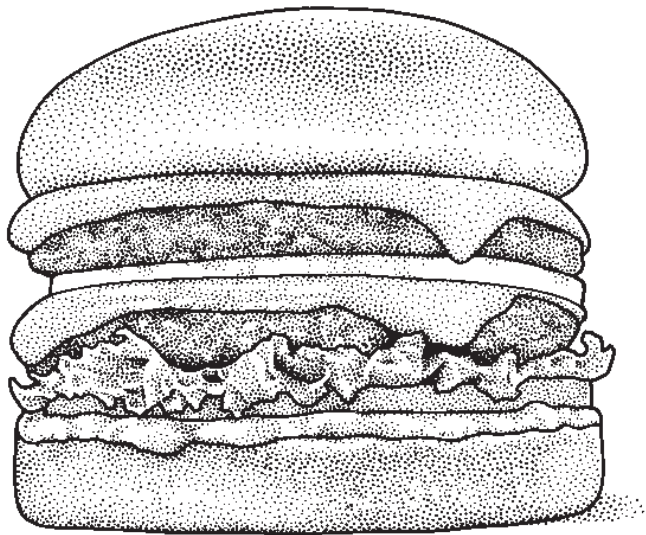

**Cal State LA boasts a rich athletic history with seven national team championships, 10 national team runner-up finishes and 75 conference championships. This tradition of excellence continued in 2014-15 as evidenced by the following:**

- More than 40% of our student-athletes earned year-long GPAs of 3.0 or higher.
- Golden Eagle student-athletes earned 5 All-America awards, 3 Academic All-America awards, 23 All-Region awards and 36 All-CCAA awards.
- Three Golden Eagle teams – men’s soccer, women’s soccer, women’s tennis – all finished ranked in the national top-20.
- Gregory Veals (men’s track and field), Iona Lofrano (volleyball), Heather Williams (women’s soccer), Amalia Arvidsson (women’s soccer) and Mike Beigarten (men’s soccer) earned All-America awards.
- Dane Nielsen (men’s soccer), Shane Panther (men’s soccer) and Heather Williams (women’s soccer) earned Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors. Those three plus Jesus Cuevas (baseball) earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors.
- Gregory Veals (men’s track and field) was named the CCAA Athlete of the Year in his sport for a third straight year.
- Heather Williams (women’s soccer) was named the CCAA Offensive Player of the Year.
- Joanna Espinoza (women’s soccer) was named the CCAA Newcomer of the Year in her sport.
- Kelsey Molnar (volleyball) was named the CCAA Freshman of the Year.
- Nozomi Matsuoka (women’s tennis) won the ITA West Region Player to Watch award.
- Jeff Rothschild (women’s tennis) was named the ITA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.
- The Golden Eagles claimed 2 individual CCAA championships: Gregory Veals (men’s track and field) won conference titles in the 100 and 200 meters.
- Cal State LA’s men’s soccer team won its second NCAA Division II West Region title in the past four years and was ranked No. 6 in the nation.
- Cal State LA’s women’s soccer team won the CCAA regular-season and tournament championships and was ranked No. 5 in the nation at the end of the regular season.
- Cal State LA’s women’s tennis team finished the season ranked 17th in the nation, its fourth straight top-25 ranking, and finished fourth in the PacWest Conference in its first year as an affiliate member.
- Cal State LA’s women’s volleyball team recorded its 18th consecutive winning season and had its best finish in the CCAA since 2009.
- Cal State LA’s baseball team posted a 12-game improvement and finished fourth in the CCAA.
