Dieter Horton
Head Coach

A talented leader with extensive community college and NCAA Division I experience, Dieter Horton returns for his second season as the men’s basketball head coach at Cal State LA. A tireless recruiter and strong defensive mind, Horton sees a bright future ahead for the Golden Eagle program.

Horton led the Golden Eagles to a 10-16 overall record and an 8-14 mark in California Collegiate Athletic Association in his first year at Cal State LA. The Golden Eagles were outstanding on defense and were known throughout the conference for their hard work and hustle. Cal State LA ranked 14th in the country in scoring defense after allowing opponents just 62.9 points per game. The Golden Eagles were also among the national leaders in field-goal percentage defense and allowed opponents to shoot just

41.7 percent from the floor.

The signature win of Horton’s first season was a 58-56 win over Cal Poly Pomona in the Eagles Nest on Jan. 17. It was the first win over the Broncos in Los Angeles since 2010. The Golden Eagles also recorded a sweep of conference foe Cal State Dominguez Hills and posted an impressive win over San Francisco State in front of an excited Homecoming crowd on Feb. 27.

Horton also led the Golden Eagles to a big road win over defending CCAA Tournament champion Cal State Stanislaus. Horton came to Cal State LA in 2014 with an outstanding resume of success. He reached the post season in each of his 14 years as a community college head coach and spent four seasons as an assistant coach at USC.

Horton has coached a pair of players currently in the National Basketball Association: Dewayne Dedmon, while at Antelope Valley College and USC, and Nikola Vucevic, the 16th overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft, while at USC. Both players are currently with the Orlando Magic.

A firm believer in helping his players mature, learn accountability and graduate, Horton was on the men’s basketball staff at USC from 2010-14. He was an assistant coach for his first three seasons with the Trojans and served as a special assistant to the head coach in his final year. In that capacity, he greatly aided the transition to the new leadership of Andy Enfield.

During his tenure at USC, he was the lead recruiter for the 2013, 2014 and 2015 classes and was instrumental in the men’s basketball program recording its highest graduation rate in 15 years. The recruiting class in 2013 was ranked No. 21 in the nation. Horton also helped USC reach the NCAA Tournament in 2011 with the conference’s No. 1-ranked defense.

Horton enjoyed tremendous success as a head coach on the community college level. He came to USC from Antelope Valley College, where he compiled a 94-46 record and led his team to the 2007 state championship final. The Marauders went 31-7 that season and set a school record for wins. The state championship game appearance was the first in the program’s history. While at Antelope Valley, seven of his former players received NCAA Division I scholarships.

Horton was also the head coach at Fullerton College for 10 seasons and posted a 198-124 record. The highlight of his tenure came in 2006 when Fullerton went 37-0 and won the state championship. The 37 wins were a single-season record in California community college history and the Hornets were only the fourth team to record a perfect record. Horton joined Jerry Tarkanian, Bill Mulligan and Vance Walberg in that exclusive club. Horton eventually ran that streak to a record 50 straight victories, eclipsing the old mark of 42 set by Bill Bertka in 1962.

Horton was named the conference Coach of the Year three times and was the 2006 State Coach of the Year. Thirty-five of his Fullerton players signed with NCAA Division I programs and another 18 signed with NCAA Division II and NAIA programs.

In 2011, he was recognized by Basketball Times Magazine as one of the best future NCAA Division I Head Coaches in America.

Horton graduated from Cal State Fullerton in 1994 with a degree in physical education and spent two years as the student manager for the Titans’ basketball team and another as the program’s administrative assistant. He received his Master’s in Education from Azusa Pacific.

Before that, he was an assistant coach at Villa Park and Fullerton high schools. He played basketball for three seasons at Fullerton High.

Horton is married and his wife’s name is Chelsie. He has a son, Charles, who is 11, and a 2-year-old daughter, Ellie.

Tony Miller
Assistant Coach

A talented coach with exceptional NCAA Division I playing and coaching experience, Tony Miller returns for his second season with the Cal State LA program as an assistant coach.

Miller helped the Golden Eagles through a transitional season in his first year with the program. Cal State LA was ranked 14th in the country in scoring defense and finished with a 10-16 overall record and an 8-14 mark in conference play.

He came to Cal State LA from USC, where he spent four seasons following a 12-year international playing career. Miller was an assistant coach at USC beginning with the 2009-10 season when he was hired as the team's strength and conditioning coach. He was promoted following that season and spent the next three years as an assistant coach on the staff of former USC head coach Kevin O'Neill.

Miller was also an assistant coach at St. John Bosco and helped the program to a Division 2 state championship, which was the first state title in the school's history.

Before he joined the coaching ranks, Miller was an accomplished player. He enjoyed a 12-year playing career in Europe, playing for teams in Holland, Belgium, Lithuania and the United Kingdom. Miller was a Dutch League All-Star in 1998 and 2000 and helped lead Den Helder to the 1998 Dutch League title. He averaged 14.2 points, 9.6 assists and 3.6 steals per game while making 49.6 percent of his shots in the '98 championship season.

Miller had a sensational four-year college career at Marquette and was inducted into the Marquette Athletics Hall of Fame in 2011. He set a Marquette single-season freshman record with 221 assists in his first year with the program and was a team captain his final three seasons. As a junior, he led Marquette into the Sweet 16 with a coast-to-coast drive against Kentucky's full-court press. He scored 10.8 points and added 7.5 assists as a senior and led Marquette to a second-place finish in the 1995 NIT. He ranks eighth all-time in NCAA history with 956 career assists. He is the Marquette career leader in assists and still holds the single-game record with 17 against Memphis.

He was a football and basketball star at St. Joseph High in Ohio and was a high school football teammate of Desmond Howard and Elvis Grback. Miller was an all-conference quarterback as a junior and led St. Joseph's to the 1990 state championships. As a senior, he led the school to the Ohio Division I state title in basketball.



Alex Schilter
Assistant Coach

A talented coach with NCAA Division I experience, Alex Schilter returns for his second season with the Cal State LA men's basketball program as an assistant coach.

In Schilter's first year with the program, he helped the Golden Eagles through a transitional season. Cal State LA finished with a 10-16 overall record and an 8-14 mark in conference play. The Golden Eagles were ranked 14th in the nation in scoring defense after allowing opponents to score just 62.9 points per game.

Schilter came to Cal State LA from Loyola Marymount, where he was the Director of Basketball Operations for two seasons. He also served as an assistant coach for summer recruiting in the summer of 2013 for the Lions.

In his most recent role, Schilter was primarily responsible for scheduling, managing Loyola Marymount's recruiting database and correspondence, overseeing the scouting and video programs and camps, and other administrative duties.

He was initially hired by Loyola Marymount midway through the 2012-13 season. He completed his Master's degree in educational studies from Loyola Marymount in August, 2014.

Schilter earned his bachelor's degree in sports management with a business administration area of specialization from Washington State in 2012. He was the student manager for the Cougars from 2010 until his graduation and was the associate video coordinator.

He was also a coach and camp instructor in the summer for Washington State. After his graduation, he also worked at the Joe Callero Basketball Camp at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and at the Montana Griz Cage Camp.

He is a native of University Place, WA and graduated from Bellarmine Prep in Tacoma, WA.

Schilter and his wife, Haley, were married in August, 2015, and reside in Pasadena.



Ivan Barahona
Assistant Coach

A talented coach with championship experience, Ivan Barahona returns for his second season with the Golden Eagle men's basketball program as an assistant coach. He helped Cal State LA through a transitional 2014-15 season and the Golden Eagles finished the season ranked 14th in the nation in scoring defense.

Cal State LA was 10-16 overall and 8-14 in conference play last season.

He came to Cal State LA from Pacific Hills High School, where he spent 14 years, including the last nine as the varsity head coach. He led Pacific Hills to four CIF titles in five playoff appearances, highlighted by the CIF State Championship in the 2012-13 campaign.

While at Pacific Hills, Barahona posted a 203-80 record (.717 winning percentage) and coached eight players who went on to NCAA Division I schools. During his tenure at Pacific Hills, he was named the CIF Coach of the Year three times (2008, 2012, 2013) and was the Cal Hi Sports Division V State Coach of the Year in 2009.

Barahona is also the head coach of the El Salvador Senior National Team. While taking over as head coach, he has guided El Salvador to a second-place finish in the Central American Olympic Games and a second-place finish in the COCABA Final Four Tournament. Under this guidance, El Salvador has climbed to the top ranking in the Central America FIBA.

Barahona graduated from California Lutheran University in 2000 with a degree in Kinesiology. He played high school basketball at Pacific Hills High School, where he led the Bruins to two CIF championships and was named first-team All-CIF twice. He played two years of collegiate basketball at Cal Lutheran.

He is married to his wife, Olga, and they have a son, Ivan, who is 11 and a daughter, Eva, who is nine.

Had season highs with 15 points and eight rebounds in his Cal State L.A. debut at California Baptist (11-19-14). Also had 12 points and six rebounds in a win at Cal State Stanislaus (1-31-15) and 12 points and five rebounds against Humboldt State (2-6-15). Reached double figures in scoring six times.

At Saddleback College: Earned second-team All-Orange Empire Conference honors after averaging nearly 10 points and six rebounds per game as a sophomore. Appeared in 29 games with 24 starts. Shot 52.9 percent from the field.

At University of Buffalo: Appeared in 10 games at the Division I program.

At Deer Valley High School: Earned Most Valuable Player and first-team All-Bay Valley Athletic League honors after averaging 17.7 points, 15.7 rebounds and three blocks per game as a senior. Had 50 double-doubles in 64 career games.

Personal: Son of Andre McPhail and Annette Taylor. Majoring in liberal studies. Enjoys writing, volunteering and blogging. Lists scoring 55 points in the first game of his freshman year on varsity in high school as his most exciting experience in sports.

2014-15: Had a third productive season for the Golden Eagles and was once again one of the best players on the team. Was second on the team in scoring with 8.7 points per game and led the team in minutes played with 806. Started all 26 games for the Golden Eagles and played hard through injuries for much of the season. Played in every game for Cal State L.A. for the third straight season and averaged a career-best 31 minutes per game. Had a season-high 17 points in a win over San Francisco State (2-27-15). Also had 16 points in a win at Cal State Monterey Bay (1-9-15). Reached double figures in scoring 11 times. Was named the team's Most Improved Player.

2013-14: Had a second strong season for the Golden Eagles and was one of the top contributors on the team. Played in all 27 games for a second straight season and started 10 times. Averaged 5.8 points, 2.6 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game. Was one of the team's top defenders once again. Was fourth on the team in scoring and fourth in 3-pointers made with 16. Led the team in free-throw percentage (77.3 percent). Poured in a career-high 24 points to lead the Golden Eagles to a win at Cal State Dominguez Hills (12-22-13). Also had a career-high eight assists in that game. Reached double figures in scoring five times. Had a late steal and made two tiebreaking free throws in the final seconds of a 59-57 win over Sonoma State (1-4-14).

2012-13: Had an outstanding first season with the Golden Eagles and was one of the best freshmen in the California Collegiate Athletic Association. Started all 27 games and averaged nearly 29 minutes per game. Was third on the team in scoring, second in steals, second in assists and second in free-throw percentage. Led the team in 3-pointers made with 33. Averaged 9.1 points, 4.2 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.4 steals per game. Made 72.3 percent of his free throws. Was one of the team's top defenders. Scored a season-high 20 points in a win over Cal State Monterey Bay (1-5-13). Also had 19 points in season-opening win over La Sierra. Had 16 points in a road win at UC San Diego (11-30-12). Had a season-high nine rebounds to go along with 15 points in a win over Cal State Stanislaus (1-19-13).

At Long Beach Poly High School: Helped team reach CIF 1AA championship game for a second straight season as a senior and averaged 6.8 points, 2.7 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game. Was part of a CIF Championship team as a junior and was named the team's Defensive Player of the Year. Received first-team All-Moore League honors and also earned the Willie McGinest Scholar-Athlete Award.

Personal: Son of Crystal Barker. Majoring in business administration-finance. Enjoys bowling, video games and music. Lists winning a CIF championship during his junior year as his most exciting experience in sports.

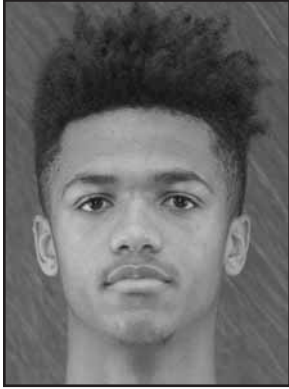

Cal State L.A. boasts a rich athletic history with seven national team championships, 10 national team runner-up finishes and 75 conference championships. This tradition of excellence continued in 2014-15 as evidenced by the following:

- Heather Williams (women’s soccer) was named the CCAA Offensive Player of the Year.
- Joanna Espinoza (women’s soccer) was named the CCAA Newcomer of the Year in her sport.
- Kelsey Molnar (volleyball) was named the CCAA Freshman of the Year.
- Nozomi Matsuoka (women’s tennis) won the ITA West Region Player to Watch award.
- Jeff Rothschild (women’s tennis) was named the ITA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.
- The Golden Eagles claimed 2 individual CCAA championships: Gregory Veals (men’s track and field) won conference titles in the 100 and 200 meters.
- Cal State L.A.’s men’s soccer team won its second NCAA Division II West Region title in the past four years and was ranked No. 6 in the nation.
- Cal State L.A.’s women’s soccer team won the CCAA regular-season and tournament championships and was ranked No. 5 in the nation at the end of the regular season.
- Cal State L.A.’s women’s tennis team finished the season ranked 17th in the nation, its fourth straight top-25 ranking, and finished fourth in the PacWest Conference in its first year as an affiliate member.
- Cal State L.A.’s women’s volleyball team recorded its 18th consecutive winning season and had its best finish in the CCAA since 2009.
- Cal State L.A.’s baseball team posted a 12-game improvement and finished fourth in the CCAA.
