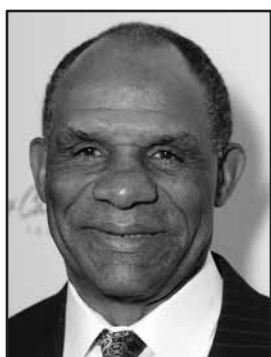

After leading the Golden Eagles to a fourth straight national ranking in the top-25 in 2014-15, Sandy Kriezel returns for her sixth season as the women's tennis head coach at Cal State L.A. Kriezel led the Golden Eagles to a national ranking of 17 at the end of the season after the Golden Eagles once again battled against one of the toughest schedules in the nation.

When it comes to talking, teaching and promoting tennis, it's hard to imagine a more enthusiastic proponent of the sport than Kriezel. She is active locally and nationally promoting the sport and her background includes many notable achievements. She is a member of two tennis Hall of Fames, is the regional director of the ITA summer circuit and has served on a number of ITA and NCAA committees throughout her coaching career.

Kriezel guided the Golden Eagles to a fourth-place finish in the PacWest Conference in Cal State L.A.'s first season as an affiliate member in 2014-15. The No. 17 national ranking marked a four-spot climb from the season before and was the program's best since 2012. Cal State L.A. was also ranked No. 4 in the West Region.

Cal State L.A. has achieved national rankings in the top-25 for four straight seasons, something that hasn't happened for the program since 1993-96.

Kriezel led the Golden Eagles to a 10-10 overall record against a rugged schedule. Cal State L.A. played 13 of its 20 matches against NCAA Division II teams ranked 26th in the nation or higher, two more against NCAA Division I programs and another against a top-ranked NCAA Division III program.

The Golden Eagles won a pair of major ITA awards as No. 1 player Nozomi Matsuoka was named the ITA West Region Player to Watch and Jeff Rothschild was named the ITA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year for a second time.

Kriezel led the Golden Eagles to a 7-10 overall record and a national ranking of 21 in 2013-14. Nine of the 10 losses for the Golden Eagles came against NCAA Division II teams that were nationally-ranked, including four teams in the top-10. She directed a program that earned another major award as No. 1 player Leora Hemmerich was named the ITA West Region Senior Player of the Year.

Kriezel guided the Golden Eagles to a 9-9 overall record in 2012-13 against – once again - one of the toughest schedules in the nation.

The Golden Eagles were ranked 22nd in the nation at the end of the season, giving the program back-to-back national top-25 finishes for the first time since 1996. All nine losses came against teams that were nationally ranked, including four to teams in the top-10 of the NCAA Division II and six in the top-20.

Kriezel led a program that won three major awards, including a pair of significant ITA honors. For the second straight year, a Cal State L.A. player (Hemmerich) earned the West Region Arthur Ashe Award for leadership and sportsmanship, while Rothschild was named the ITA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

In addition, Christie Lau earned Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors for a second straight year.

The 2012-13 campaign was a successful follow-up to a highly-successful 2011-12 season when Cal State L.A. finished with a national ranking of 15. Kriezel guided the Golden Eagles to a 13-5 overall record and a No. 4 ranking in the NCAA Division II West Region.

Kriezel led the Golden Eagles to their best end-of-the-year ranking since 1995 and their first national finish in the top-25 since 1996. The Golden Eagles had an impressive 9-1 record against NCAA Division II West Region competition and all five of their losses came against nationally-ranked competition.

Kriezel was named the West Region Coach of the Year by the ITA for the second time in her career.

The season was highlighted by Lau's All-American recognition. Lau finished the season ranked 18th in the nation in singles. The doubles team of Lau and Larn McShane was 11th in the nation, just one spot away from earning All-America honors. Lau also earned Academic All-America honors and received West Region honors for the Arthur Ashe Award for leadership and sportsmanship.

In her first year with the program, Kriezel led the Golden Eagles to an 8-13 record, which equaled the win total from the previous year.

Kriezel has an overall record of 170-164 over 17 seasons as a head coach, including a 47-47 record in five seasons at Cal State L.A.

Kriezel came to Cal State L.A. from Cal Poly Pomona, where she spent 15 years, 12 of them as the head coach of the men's and women's tennis teams. Her tenure ended when Cal Poly Pomona dropped both tennis programs following the 2010 season.

Kriezel had a 123-117 record in 12 seasons at Cal Poly Pomona, including a 64-43 mark in conference matches. She led the Broncos to the 2003 California Collegiate Athletic Association championship and was named the ITA West Region Coach of the Year. The Broncos were ranked 18th in the nation in 2002 and 2003 and Kriezel was named the CCAA Coach of the Year both seasons.

She had her most successful season in 2003 when she led the Broncos to the CCAA Championship in dominating fashion. Cal Poly Pomona went undefeated in eight regular-season matches and breezed through three matches at the conference tournament.

Cal Poly Pomona qualified for the NCAA playoffs five straight years under Kriezel from 2002-2006.

Kriezel came to Cal Poly Pomona in 1996 and was an assistant coach for Dr. Ann Lebedeff from 1996-98. The Broncos won championships in women's tennis in two of her three seasons as an assistant coach. She was named the head coach at Cal Poly Pomona on Oct. 1, 1998.

Before coming to Cal Poly Pomona, she was an assistant coach at Pomona-Pitzer in 1995.

As a player, Kriezel enjoyed great success. She played for two years at Chaffey College, where she was the team captain in 1973-74 and played No. 1 singles and doubles. She went on to Chico State, where she was the Northern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference's No. 1 singles player and part of the No. 1 doubles team. She was inducted into the Chico State Hall of Fame in 1998 and the Chaffey College Hall of Fame in 2001.

A former all-conference player at Mt. San Antonio College, Aron Hayes joins the Cal State LA women's tennis program as an assistant coach.

Hayes has been a teaching professional at iTennis for the past two years and is a High Performance coordinator. He works with top junior players and elite players looking to make an impact on the Women's Tennis Association.

He is United States Professional Tennis Registry certified.

Hayes earned first-team All-Conference honors both years he played at Mt. SAC and earned first-team All-Conference honors in doubles after one season. He was a South Coast Conference doubles finalist.

He was also the No. 1 singles player for three years at San Gabriel High School.

Billie Jean King is one of the most famous athletes and social icons in American history. She has long been a champion for social change and equality. King created new inroads for men and women in sports and beyond during her legendary career and she continues to make her mark today.

COACHING STAFF

Born in Long Beach, she first played tennis at the age of 11 in the public parks of southern California. King won her first of a record 20 Wimbledon titles when she captured the 1961 Wimbledon Ladies' Doubles Championship with Karen Hantze in 1961. Shortly after capturing her first Wimbledon championship, she went to Cal State L.A. and played for Coach Joan Johnson's team from 1961 to 1964.

GOLDEN EAGLE PLAYER BIOS

King won 39 Grand Slam singles, doubles and mixed doubles titles during her career. On September 20, 1973, she empowered women and educated men when she defeated Bobby Riggs in one of the greatest moments in sports history – the Battle of the Sexes. This match is remembered for its effect on society and its contribution to the women's movement.

SEASON AND CAREER RECORDS



King is the only woman to win U.S. Open singles titles on all four surfaces which it has been played (grass, clay, carpet and hard) and she is one of only eight women to hold a singles titles in each of the Grand Slam events.

King was named one of the '100 Most Important Americans of the 20th Century' by Life Magazine and, in 2009, President Obama awarded her with the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor.

In 2006, her accomplishments both on and off the court were recognized when the home of the U. S. Open was renamed the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center. In 2007, she co-founded GreenSlam, an organization dedicated to improving the greening of sports. In 2008, King released her first book in more than 20 years. Titled Pressure is a Privilege, the book shares a collection of life lessons she has used throughout her life and career.

CSLA ALUMNA BILLIE JEAN KING



King continues her life mission to help the underserved, most notably through her efforts to provide programming and funding for those infected, affected or at risk of HIV/AIDS through her work with the Elton John AIDS Foundation (EJAF). A member of the organization's Board of Trustees, King has helped the organization raise more than \$225 million in support of worthy programs in 55 countries around the world.

Since founding the Women's Sports Foundation in 1974, Billie Jean has led the organization in its mission to advance the lives of girls and women through sports and physical activity. Since its inception, the Foundation has awarded more than \$50 million in educational and cash grants to advance participation, research and leadership in sports and physical activity for girls and women.

In 2010, King was appointed to the President's Council on Fitness, Sports and Nutrition. She is active in promoting many of the organization's programs, including an association with First Lady Michelle Obama's "Let's Move" initiative.

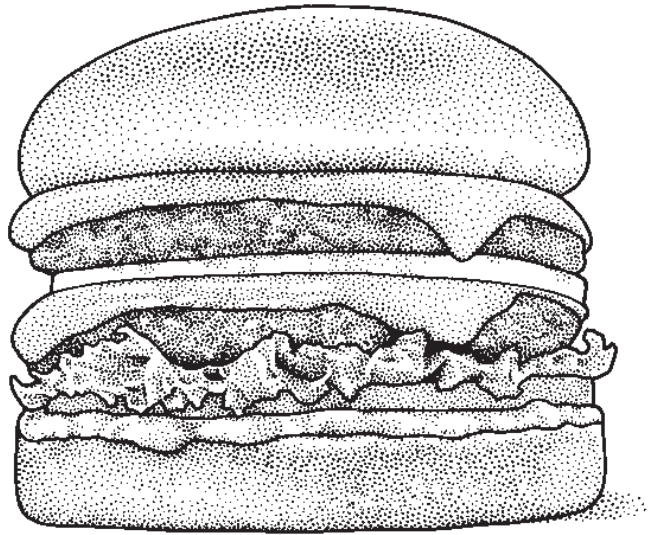

Also in 2010, the trustees of the California State University, in recognition of King's commitment to intercollegiate athletics, voted to name all the athletic facilities at Cal State L.A. in her honor. The announcement was made at the 2010 Billie Jean King and Friends Event by Cal State L.A. President James M. Rosser and Herbert L. Carter, the chair of the California State University Board of Trustees. King received an honorary doctorate from Cal State L.A. at the university's 50th Commencement ceremony in 1997.

King's commitment to intercollegiate athletics was also recognized in 2009 when the late NCAA President Myles Brand presented King with the Gerald R. Ford Award at the opening business session of the NCAA Convention in Washington, D.C. King became the seventh recipient of the award, which honors individuals who have provided significant leadership as an advocate for higher education and intercollegiate athletics on a continuous basis. In honor of King, the NCAA donated an honorarium of \$25,000, which King generously directed to Cal State L.A. for support of its student-athletes. Cal State L.A. President Dr. James M. Rosser and Director of Athletics Dr. Dan Bridges were both on hand for the awards presentation.

Cal State LA boasts a rich athletic history with seven national team championships, 10 national team runner-up finishes and 75 conference championships. This tradition of excellence continued in 2014-15 as evidenced by the following:

- More than 40% of our student-athletes earned year-long GPAs of 3.0 or higher.
- Golden Eagle student-athletes earned 5 All-America awards, 3 Academic All-America awards, 23 All-Region awards and 36 All-CCAA awards.
- Three Golden Eagle teams – men’s soccer, women’s soccer, women’s tennis – all finished ranked in the national top-20.
- Gregory Veals (men’s track and field), Iona Lofrano (volleyball), Heather Williams (women’s soccer), Amalia Arvidsson (women’s soccer) and Mike Beigarten (men’s soccer) earned All-America awards.

- Joanna Espinoza (women’s soccer) was named the CCAA Newcomer of the Year in her sport.
- Kelsey Molnar (volleyball) was named the CCAA Freshman of the Year.
- Nozomi Matsuoka (women’s tennis) won the ITA West Region Player to Watch award.
- Jeff Rothschild (women’s tennis) was named the ITA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.
- The Golden Eagles claimed 2 individual CCAA championships: Gregory Veals (men’s track and field) won conference titles in the 100 and 200 meters.
- Cal State LA’s men’s soccer team won its second NCAA Division II West Region title in the past four years and was ranked No. 6 in the nation.
- Cal State LA’s women’s soccer team won the CCAA regular-season and tournament championships and was ranked No. 5 in the nation at the end of the regular season.
