**Chris Chamides**  
Head Coach

After leading the Golden Eagles to a fifth straight appearance in the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2015, Chris Chamides returns for his 14th season as the head coach of the men's soccer program at Cal State LA. Chamides guided a team riddled with injuries to its eighth NCAA trip in the past 10 years and its ninth California Collegiate Athletic Association Championship Tournament bid in 10 seasons.

Chamides and the Golden Eagles continued their string of postseason success, advancing to the semi-finals of the West Regional for the eighth straight time. He also directed Cal State LA into a national top-10 ranking for a ninth straight season.

Chamides has turned around a program that had seven straight losing seasons before he arrived in 2003 and transformed it into one of the top programs in the nation. He has led the Golden Eagles to a 156-73-38 overall record in his first 13 years and became the program's all-time wins leader in 2011. In the past 10 years, Cal State LA is 131-47-33. He has guided the Golden Eagles into the NCAA West Region championship match five times during that span, including championships in 2011 and 2014. Chamides also led the team to No. 1 national rankings during the 2009 and 2010 seasons.

Chamides, who has vast experience in both Major League Soccer (MLS) and NCAA soccer, has earned six Coach of the Year awards in his 13 years at Cal State LA and he was named the CCAA Coach of the Year in both men's and women's soccer in 2009.

Cal State LA has collected 60 All-CCAA, 36 All-West Region and 11 All-America awards during Chamides' tenure. That total includes three CCAA Player of the Year awards, two CCAA Freshman of the Year awards and two CCAA Newcomer of the Year awards. Cal State L.A. has also earned the first four CoSIDA Academic All-America awards in the program's history in the past four years, including two in 2014.

Over the past five seasons, the Golden Eagles are 67-17-21 overall and an incredible 47-9-14 in

conference play with five CCAA Championship Tournament and NCAA Division II playoff appearances.

Chamides came to Cal State LA after achieving great success with a pair of Major League Soccer organizations. He served as the Senior Director of Soccer for the San Jose Earthquakes from 2000-02. While in the role, Chamides was directly involved in all soccer-related facets, including roster development. He helped build a San Jose squad that won the 2001 MLS Cup one year after having the league's worst record. The roster included high-profile players such as Landon Donovan, Jeff Agoos, Dwayne DeRosier and Jimmy Conrad.

Chamides also served as an assistant coach for Chivas USA for four seasons. In 2006, he worked under MLS Coach of the Year and former U.S. National Team Head Coach Bob Bradley and he also worked for three years with former Chivas USA Head Coach Preki. In his time with Chivas USA, the roster included Claudio Suarez, Ramon Ramirez, Paco Palencia, Jonathan Bornstein, Sacha Kljestan, Jesse Marsch, Ante Razov and Brad Guzan. Chivas USA reached the MLS playoffs in each of the four seasons, their only playoff appearances in team history.

At Cal State LA, Chamides led the Golden Eagles to a 12-5-3 overall record in 2015 and trips to the NCAA and CCAA tournaments despite injuries that wiped out nearly the entire starting defensive corps. Despite that, Cal State LA finished 14th in the nation in goals against average and allowed more than one goal in a game only twice in 20 contests.

In 2014, Chamides crafted a defense that led the NCAA Division II in goals against average and save percentage and helped the Golden Eagles finish the season with a national ranking of 6, which was the best for the program since 1992.

Chamides directed a championship team that advanced past UC San Diego, Azusa Pacific and Seattle Pacific in the NCAA playoffs to win the West Region title and finished the season ranked No. 6 in the country. A dramatic 1-0 win in overtime at top-seed Seattle Pacific gave the Golden Eagles their most recent NCAA West Region Championship and a spot in the NCAA Quarterfinals.

Cal State LA finished the 2014 season with a 15-4-2 overall record and set new program records for goals against average (0.415), fewest goals allowed in a season (9) and most shutouts (13).

The 2013 season included the sixth conference title in the program's history and the second in a three-year span. The Golden Eagles put together a 15-match unbeaten streak that began after their lone regular-season defeat and continued with CCAA tournament victories over Sonoma State and UC San Diego.

Cal State LA earned the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II West Region and hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA playoffs. The Golden Eagles were 14-2-5 overall and 10-1-5 in conference play. The Golden Eagles had the best regular-season record in the 12-team CCAA for the fourth time in five years and finished the year with a national ranking of 13.

Chamides led the Golden Eagles to an 11-4-5 overall record in 2012 that included another riveting NCAA playoff run. After guiding Cal State LA to a conference-best 10-2-3 record and a second straight CCAA South Division title, the Golden Eagles earned the No. 6 seed in the West Region and played a pair of hard-fought playoff contests that were both ultimately determined by penalty kicks.

Chamides was named the CCAA Men's Soccer Coach of the Year for a third time in 2011 after guiding the Golden Eagles to one of the best seasons in the program's history. Cal State LA compiled a 15-2-6 overall record and finished the season ranked No. 8 in the nation by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. Chamides guided the Golden Eagles to their first national top-10 finish in 30 years.

Cal State LA captured its first conference tournament title and secured the fifth CCAA championship in the program's history. Chamides then directed the Golden Eagles past Chico State in the opening round of the NCAA playoffs before an exciting 3-2 win over host Seattle Pacific in the West Region Championship match. That win sent the Golden Eagles to their first NCAA Quarterfinal appearance since 1981.

Chamides led the Golden Eagles to a 9-7-1 overall record in 2010. Cal State LA was ranked No. 1 in the nation for two weeks early in the season before a rash of injuries slowed the team down.

It was a solid follow-up to a historic season in 2009 when Chamides led the Golden Eagles to an 18-4-1 overall record and to the CCAA South Division championship. Cal State LA earned its first-ever No. 1 national ranking during the season and earned the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II West Region. The Golden Eagles were ranked No. 7 in the nation in the last regular-season poll and the 18 wins were the second-most in the program's history. Chamides earned his second CCAA Coach of the Year award in men's soccer in the process. Cal State LA hosted the NCAA Division II West Regional and beat Cal State San Bernardino in the first round to advance to the NCAA West Region championship match.

The Golden Eagles recorded a 13-5-4 overall record in 2008 and were ranked 14th in the nation in the final NSCAA poll. Cal State LA was ranked as high as No. 4 in the nation during the regular season. The Golden Eagles ousted Sonoma State on penalty kicks in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament to advance to the West Region championship match.

In 2007, Cal State LA posted an 11-6-4 record and recorded a second straight winning season for the first time since 1993-94.

Chamides was named the 2006 NSCAA West Region Coach of the Year after guiding the Golden Eagles to 13-8-2 overall record and their first winning season since 1996. He led Cal State LA to its first NCAA playoff berth since 1994 and its first NCAA postseason victory since 1992, a 2-1 win over No. 2 seed Seattle Pacific.

In 2005, he guided the Golden Eagles to a 9-9 overall record and Cal State LA had both the CCAA Player of the Year and CCAA Freshman of the Year. In 2004, Chamides earned CCAA Coach of the Year honors for the first time when he led the Golden Eagles to a 9-9-1 overall record and the program's first .500 record since 1996.

Chamides took over the program in 2003 and guided the team to a 7-8-4 record, which marked a significant improvement from 2002 when the Golden Eagles were 5-13.

Chamides was also the head coach of Cal State LA's women's soccer program from 2003-12 and, as with the men, is the program's all-time leader in wins with a 103-69-25 mark in 10 seasons. He turned around a program that had not produced a winning record before his arrival and built the Golden Eagles into one of the top programs in the nation. The Golden Eagles were a sensational 52-17-12 over his last four years and finished the season ranked in the national top-15 three times. He led the Golden Eagles to winning records in eight of his last nine seasons with a 99-55-25 mark over that stretch.

Cal State LA's women's program collected 43 All-CCAA, 21 All-West Region, four All-America, three CCAA Player of the Year and one West Region Player of the Year awards during his tenure. The Golden Eagles also had two players earn CoSIDA Academic All-District honors after his arrival.

Prior to his years in Major League Soccer, Chamides was the head men's and women's soccer coach at Flagler College in St. Augustine, Fla. from 1997-99. The Flagler women's team improved from 2-15 before his arrival to 12-7 in 1998. The men's squad was ranked as high as 17th in the country and four Flagler players earned All-America honors during his tenure. During that time span, Chamides was also a coach in the Florida Olympic Development Program and was hired as the head coach of the USL's expansion Jacksonville Jade in 1999.

In 1995, Chamides got his first collegiate coaching job when he was hired as an assistant for the University of Massachusetts' women's soccer program. During his two years in Amherst, Massachusetts was ranked as high as No. 6 in the country, won two Atlantic-10 Conference titles, made two consecutive "Sweet 16" appearances in the NCAA Division I Tournament and compiled a 30-9-3 record.

His first head coaching job came in 1993 when he worked with both the junior varsity and varsity boys soccer teams at his alma mater, Xavier High School in Brooklyn, N.Y. That same year, he was also tabbed by then-Virginia head coach, former USA National Team coach and current Los Angeles Galaxy head coach Bruce Arena to serve as a staff coach at the University of Virginia's summer soccer camps. In 1994, he also revived the S.C. Gjoa U-16 boys club team in Brooklyn, leading the squad to the State Cup.

Chamides played in college for NCAA Division I Lafayette College from 1988-92. He was a team captain as a senior. Lafayette posted a winning record in each of his four seasons and had an overall mark of 43-32-5.

He owns an "A" license from the U.S. Soccer Federation and has an Advanced National Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. Chamides earned a Masters of Science degree in Sports Management from the University of Massachusetts.

Chamides and his wife, Nancy, were married during the summer of 2005 and have celebrated the birth of two sons, Ryan and Andrew.

**Michael Jacobson**  
*Assistant Coach*

A talented and valuable coach with extensive experience in the California Collegiate Athletic Association, Michael Jacobson returns for an 11th season with the Cal State LA men's soccer program.

In Jacobson's first 10 seasons, the Golden Eagles have posted an overall record of 123-52-31 record, including a 118-39-31 mark over the past nine years. He helped the Golden Eagles to a 12-5-3 record in 2015 that included a fifth straight trip to the NCAA playoffs.

The Golden Eagles achieved a 15-4-2 overall record in 2014 that was highlighted by the program's second NCAA Division II West Region championship in four years. The Golden Eagles led the nation in goals against average and save percentage while setting several new program records for defense and earning an end-of-the-season ranking of No. 6 that was its best since 1992.

Jacobson helped the Golden Eagles to a 14-2-5 record in an outstanding 2013 season that featured a second CCAA title in three years and a national end-of-the-year ranking of 13. The Golden Eagles had the best record in the CCAA for a third straight year.

He was also an assistant coach for the women's program for six years before the programs were split in the spring of 2013. During that time, the Golden Eagle women had an overall record of 72-32-19.

Jacobson helped both programs enjoy great success in 2011. Cal State LA's men won the NCAA West Region championship for the first time since 1992 and claimed their first CCAA Championship Tournament title. The Golden Eagles finished with a 15-2-6 overall record and were ranked eighth in the nation.

The women's team reached the NCAA playoffs for a third straight year and advanced to the regional championship game for the second time in five years. Cal State LA hosted the first two weekends of NCAA play for the first time and finished with a 13-4-4 overall record and a national ranking of 12.

Jacobson helped the Golden Eagle women to a second straight CCAA South Division championship in 2010, while the men's team recorded its fifth consecutive winning season and achieved a national No. 1 regular-season ranking for a second straight year.

Both programs hosted NCAA Division II West Region playoffs in 2009. Cal State LA's men's team was 18-4-1 overall and reached the West Region championship match for a second straight season. The Golden Eagles earned their first-ever No. 1 national ranking and the 18 wins were the second-most in the program's history.

The women's team won its first CCAA Championship and set new program records for wins (17) and goals scored (53) while also achieving their highest national ranking (No. 6) during the season.

Jacobson also helped the Golden Eagle men's team reach the NCAA West Region championship game in 2008 and conclude the season with a national ranking of 14.

Jacobson returned to Cal State LA in 2007 after a short stint away and immediately helped both teams reach post-season play. Cal State LA's women's team qualified for the NCAA playoffs for the first time and ended the season with a 13-6-4 record and a final national ranking of 15. The men's team also reached the CCAA Championship Tournament and finished the season with an 11-6-4 record.

Jacobson came to Cal State LA after successful runs as a Director of Coaching for South Bay Soccer Club, which has connected with the L.A. Galaxy and is now known as the L.A. Galaxy South Bay. He was the head coach for various age group teams between the ages of 9-19. With the emphasis on development at the youth level, Jacobson oversaw coaches and players. He also helped guide numerous players to compete in college soccer as well as gave opportunities for placement on Olympic Development teams and participation on age-level U.S. National teams. He has coached numerous players who are currently playing at the professional level who came out of the South Bay Soccer Club.

Jacobson was introduced to the CCAA in 2001-02 when he was the assistant men's soccer coach at Cal State Dominguez Hills. Jacobson helped the Toros reach the NCAA Division II championship match.

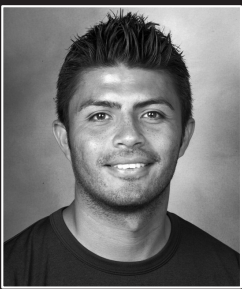
Jacobson was the assistant men's and women's coach in his first stint at Cal State LA in 2002-03 and created the planning, development and administration of all phases with both programs. He also provided training and fitness regimes that included weight training and a spring season running program.

Jacobson was the assistant men's coach at Division I Bucknell University in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania in 2000-01 and helped the Bisons beat then-No. 8 ranked South Carolina, the first victory for any team from Bucknell over a nationally-ranked Top 10 opponent. Jacobson started his coaching career at Plattsburg State University in 1998.

He holds an "A" license from the United States Soccer Federation and received his USSF National Goal Keeping license in January of 2010.

Jacobson enjoyed a successful playing career collegiately at Syracuse University, where he was a four-year starter. He graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education at Syracuse in 1998 and completed his Master's degree from Cal State Dominguez Hills in 2008. He was an alternate member of the U.S. Maccabbi team and then played professionally for two years in Albany for the Allycats and the Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in South Carolina.

Jacobson and his wife, Nicole, reside in Redondo Beach with their son, Jack, and daughter, Rachel.



**Fabian Sandoval**  
*Assistant Coach*

A former player and coach at Cal State Bakersfield and now a valued assistant coach at Cal State LA, Fabian Sandoval returns for his seventh season with the men's soccer program. He has helped the Golden Eagles enjoy great success during his tenure.

Sandoval helped the Golden Eagles achieve a 12-5-3 record in 2015 that was highlighted by a fifth consecutive NCAA playoff appearance.

In 2014, he helped the Golden Eagles to their second NCAA Division II West Region championship in the four seasons and to a national ranking of 6. The Golden Eagles led the nation in goals against average and save percentage while setting several new program records for defense. Cal State LA had an overall record of 15-4-2 and its end-of-the-season ranking was its best since 1992.

Sandoval also helped the Golden Eagles to great success in 2013 when Cal State LA won its second California Collegiate Athletic Association championship in three seasons and also posted the conference's best record for a third straight year.

Cal State LA finished with a 14-2-5 record and hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Division II West Region playoffs. The Golden Eagles achieved a national end-of-the-season ranking of 13.

It was a successful follow-up to the 2012 season when Sandoval helped Cal State L.A. finish with the best record in the CCAA and advance to the second round of the NCAA playoffs. The Golden Eagles posted an 11-4-5 overall record and finished the season ranked 23rd in the country.

In his first six years with the men's program, Cal State L.A. has compiled an overall record of 76-24-22.

Sandoval was also an assistant coach for the women's program for three years before the programs were split in the spring of 2013. During that time, the Golden Eagle women had an overall record of 35-14-10, including NCAA playoff appearances in 2010 and 2011.

Sandoval helped Cal State L.A. to a tremendous year in 2011, when the men's team won NCAA West Region and CCAA championships and the women reached the West Region championship match while hosting two weekends of NCAA play for the first time ever. Cal State L.A.'s men's team finished with a 15-2-6 overall record and was ranked eighth in the nation, while the women were 13-4-4 overall and ranked 12th in the nation.

In his first year with the programs in 2010, Sandoval helped the women record a 15-4-1 overall record and capture a second straight CCAA South Division title while helping the men post a 9-7-1 overall record.

Sandoval was a player at Cal State Bakersfield from 1999-2002 when the Roadrunners were members of the CCAA. He also coached at Cal State Bakersfield in 2007-08 after the Roadrunners had made the move to NCAA Division I.

He is currently the Director of Coaching for F.C. Golden State and is responsible for managing all aspects of the U11-14 boys teams. He was also an assistant coach for the Pali Blues F.C. of the USL W-League and helped the team to a 15-0-2 record and a Western Conference championship in 2012. The Blues also won the regular season championship and were a league finalist.

In 2011, Sandoval was the head coach of the Santa Clarita Blue Heat of the USL W-League and guided the team to an 8-1-5 record and the Western Conference championship. The Blue Heat made the playoffs for the first time in team history and Sandoval was a Coach of the Year finalist.

He also was the head coach of the boys' varsity team at Granada Hills Charter High School.

Previously, he was the head boys' soccer coach at East Bakersfield and Ridgeview high schools.

Sandoval also played professionally from 2003-2006 with the Bakersfield Brigade, San Diego Gauchos and Miami F.C. and played alongside "Romario," the FIFA World Player of the Year in 1994 and World Cup champion.

Sandoval earned his bachelor's degree in Spanish from Cal State Bakersfield.



**Steve Merriwether**  
*Assistant Coach*

A former Golden Eagle player and now a trusted member of the coaching staff, Steve Merriwether returns for his fourth season with the men's soccer program at Cal State LA. He helped the Golden Eagles reach the NCAA playoffs for a fifth straight season in 2015 and a record an overall record of 12-5-3.

In 2014, Merriwether helped the Golden Eagles to a record-breaking season that saw Cal State LA feature one of the top defenses and goalkeeper in the nation. The Golden Eagles led the nation in goals against average and save percentage and goalkeeper Mike Beigarten earned first-team All-America honors. Cal State LA had an overall record of 15-4-2 and won its second NCAA Division II West Region title in the past four years. The Golden Eagles finished the season ranked No. 6 in the nation, which was their best end-of-the-season ranking since 1992.

In Merriwether's first three years with the program, Cal State LA has a 41-11-10 record with the West Region title in 2014 and a California Collegiate Athletic Association championship in 2013.

Before coaching at Cal State LA, Merriwether was an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams at L.A. Harbor College from 2008-11. He assisted with goalkeeper training, recruitment, the management of student-athletes' eligibility and off-season training. He helped the men's program reach the JC State playoffs each year and helped the women's program to its first winning record in 2010.

He also has high-school coaching experience as an assistant coach at Palos Verdes High School and a head coach at Peninsula High School.

Merriwether is also currently a coach for the Sand and Surf Soccer Club, where he is the Goalkeeping Director. He has experience as a head coach for ages 8-17.

Merriwether earned his bachelor's degree in communications at Cal State LA. He also has earned his USSF National A Coaching License in 2014 and his NSCAA Level 1 GK Coaching License in 2009.

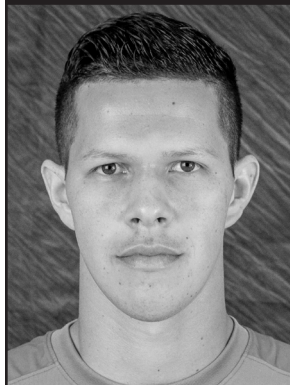

**Cal State L.A. boasts a rich athletic history with seven national team championships, 10 national team runner-up finishes and 75 conference championships. This tradition of excellence continued in 2015-16 as evidenced by the following:**

- Nearly 40% of our student-athletes earned year-long GPAs of 3.0 or higher.
- Golden Eagle student-athletes earned 5 All-America awards, 1 Academic All-America awards, 26 All-Region awards and 43 All-CCAA awards.
- Khallifah Rosser won an NCAA Division II national championship in the 400 hurdles, the first national title earned for the Golden Eagles since 2012.
- Iona Lofrano (volleyball), JamieAnn Bero (volleyball), Khallifah Rosser (men’s track and field) and Megan Thompson (women’s track and field) earned All-America awards.
- Iona Lofrano (volleyball) earned Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, becoming the second volleyball player at Cal State LA to earn that honor. Lofrano, Herbert Biste (men’s soccer) and Lucas Rio Torto (men’s soccer) earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors.
- Khallifah Rosser (men’s track and field) was named the West Region and CCAA Track Athlete of the Year.
- Megan Thompson was named the CCAA Track Athlete of the Meet at the CCAA Championships.
- J’Liyah Miles was named the CCAA Freshman Track Athlete of the Meet at the CCAA Championships.
- The Golden Eagles claimed 6 individual CCAA championships: Khallifah Rosser won a conference title in the 400-meter hurdles and joined Fabian Griffith, Matthew Sherrills and Johnathan Hill to win the 4x100 relay. Megan Thompson won conference championships in the 100 and 200, Gonzalo Ceja won the conference title in the men’s steeplechase and J’Liyah Miles won the conference title in the women’s long jump.
- Cal State LA’s men’s soccer team reached the NCAA playoffs for the fifth straight year and for the eighth time in the past 10 years.
- Cal State LA’s men’s soccer, women’s soccer, volleyball, men’s basketball and women’s basketball teams reached CCAA Championship tournaments in their respective sports.
- Cal State LA’s women’s tennis team finished the season ranked 23rd in the nation, its fifth straight top-25 ranking, and finished fourth in the PacWest Conference in its second year as an affiliate member.
- Cal State LA’s women’s volleyball team recorded its 19th consecutive winning season and had its most wins since 2009.
- Cal State LA’s men’s basketball team became only the second No. 8 seed to upset a No. 1 seed in the CCAA Championship Tournament. It was the second conference tournament win in the program’s history.
- Cal State LA’s women’s basketball team reached the conference tournament for the fourth time in the past five years and scored its points in a game since 1998 with a 98-92 win over Cal State Dominguez Hills during the regular season.
