Isabelle Harvey
Head Coach

After guiding a young Golden Eagle team to its third straight appearance in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship tournament in 2015, Isabelle Harvey returns for her fourth season as the head coach of Cal State L.A.'s women's soccer program.

She directed a squad that had several freshmen playing key roles and had the Golden Eagles playing as well as anyone in the conference down the stretch. After a slow start, Cal State LA went 7-1-2 over its final 10 regular-season games to jump to third place in the CCAA. The big run enabled the Golden Eagles to host a first-round tournament game.

In her first three years back at Cal State LA, Harvey has led the Golden Eagles to a 33-15-10 overall record and a 24-8-7 conference mark. Cal State LA has collected 19 All-CCAA, eight All-West Region and two All-America awards in that span. That includes one CCAA Player of the Year award and one Newcomer of the Year award. Cal State LA also earned the first CoSIDA Academic All-America award in the program's history in 2014 under Harvey's direction.

Cal State LA rallied impressively in 2015 and finished the season with a 7-7-4 overall record and a 7-3-2 mark in conference play. The Golden Eagles featured a stout defense that surrendered only 14 goals in 18 games and posted seven shutouts.

It was an impressive follow-up to a historic 2014 season when Harvey was named the NCAA Division II West Region Coach of the Year and claimed CCAA Coach of the Year honors as well after leading the Golden Eagles to one of the best seasons in the program's history. Cal State LA was 16-2-3 overall in 2014 and earned a national ranking of No. 5 at the end of the regular season.

Harvey became the first coach in the program's history to earn regional Coach of the Year honors.

The Golden Eagles, who were picked to finish fourth in the CCAA in a preseason poll of conference coaches, had a dominant conference run, going 9-0-2 while winning the regular-season title and then posting wins over Sonoma State (3-0) and Chico State (3-1) to claim the CCAA Tournament championship as well. The conference championship was the first for the program since 2009.

Cal State LA was the No. 2 seed in the NCAA West Region and hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA playoffs. The Golden Eagles set new program marks for most shutouts (13), fewest goals allowed (10), consecutive wins (8) and longest unbeaten streak (14). In addition, the No. 5 national ranking was the best in the program's history.

Under Harvey's direction, the Golden Eagles also had their first Academic All-American and their first-ever first-team All-America selection.

Harvey guided the Golden Eagles through some early-season injury trouble and ultimately to a 10-6-3 overall record in 2013. After beginning conference play with a 0-3-1 record, the Golden Eagles surged to an 8-2-2 mark over the next 12 games to earn a spot in the four-team conference championship tournament. The Golden Eagles jumped out to a 2-0 lead over tourney host and top-seed Cal State Stanislaus before falling, 3-2, in overtime, in a semi-final contest.

That was the Golden Eagles' final game of the season even though they were ranked fifth in the final NCAA Division II West Region poll. Six teams from the West Region qualified for the NCAA Championships, but the Golden Eagles fell out when two teams from outside the top six earned their conferences' automatic berths.

The Golden Eagles' late-season surge was highlighted by a thrilling double-overtime 1-0 win at UC San Diego on the final day of the regular season that got Cal State L.A. into the conference tournament.

It's been a successful return to Cal State LA for Harvey, who spent four seasons with the Golden Eagles as an assistant coach and interim head coach for both the men's and women's programs, before becoming the head women's soccer coach at Cal Poly Pomona. She led the Broncos to an outstanding 2012 season that resulted in Cal Poly Pomona's first NCAA playoff appearance since 2001.

She directed the Broncos to a 10-6-3 overall record and an 8-4-3 mark in conference play in her final season at Cal Poly Pomona. The season was highlighted by a team-record 11-match unbeaten streak that helped the Broncos overcome a 1-4-1 start. During their 8-0-3 run, the Broncos outscored their opponents, 25-6.

Harvey had a 59-55-17 record at Cal Poly Pomona in her seven seasons leading the program. During her tenure, Harvey's players earned 24 All-CCAA awards, two CCAA Freshman of the Year awards, a conference Newcomer of the Year award, four NSCAA All-West Region awards and two CoSIDA Academic All-District awards.

Harvey began her college coaching career at Cal State LA, where she was an assistant coach in 2001 before becoming the interim head coach for both programs in 2002. She was the top assistant coach for both programs in the 2003 and 2004 seasons before being hired as an assistant women's coach at USC, where she was a star player for four seasons.

Harvey helped guide USC to a 13-6-4 overall record and into the NCAA playoffs in 2005.

She was then hired at Cal Poly Pomona in 2006 and spent the next seven years leading the Broncos.

Harvey also had an exceptional playing career and was honored by Quebec as its "Athlete of the Century." She was presented with the Centennial Medal as one of the five leading figures to influence the development of soccer in the region with Harvey being recognized as a player.

In 2015, as part of the 1998 Canadian National Team, Harvey was inducted into the Canadian Soccer Hall of Fame and she was also honored with a Women of Influence award in Estrie Region.

Harvey started all three games for the Canadian National Team at the 1999 World Cup and registered two assists. She currently ranks 13th in Canadian history with 44 international caps. She also played for Ajax Fram, a semi-pro team, which won national championships from 2001-04.

Harvey was the Pac-10 Player of the Year at USC in 1998 and still holds school career records for goals, assists, game-winning goals and points. She is the only player in the program's history to earn All-America honors all four seasons at USC. Harvey was the team MVP three times and a team captain during her final three years with the Trojans.

Harvey was inducted into the USC Hall of Fame in 2015.

She achieved her "B" coaching license through the U.S. Soccer Federation in 2012. Harvey also earned a graduate degree in coaching and administration from Concordia University in Irvine in 2012 and recorded a grade point average of 4.0.

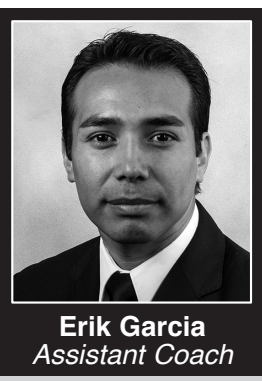

Erik Garcia
Assistant Coach

A talented assistant coach with valuable head coaching experience, Erik Garcia returns for his fourth season with the Cal State LA women's soccer program.

Garcia has been instrumental in helping the Golden Eagles to great success during his tenure. He helped Cal State LA overcome a 0-5-2 start in 2015 and ultimately reach the California Collegiate Athletic Association Championship Tournament. The Golden Eagles wound up with a 7-7-4 overall record and a third-place finish in the CCAA.

Garcia helped the Golden Eagles to one of the best seasons in the program's history in 2014. Cal State LA went undefeated in conference regular-season matches (9-0-2) and then recorded wins over Sonoma State and Chico State to win the conference tournament title as well. Cal State LA finished the regular season ranked No. 5 in the nation.

The Golden Eagles were 16-2-3 overall and earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA West Region and hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA playoffs. The Golden Eagles set new program marks for most shutouts (13), fewest goals allowed (10), consecutive wins (8) and longest unbeaten streak (14). In addition, the No. 5 national ranking was the best in the program's history.

In his first three years with the program, Garcia has helped the Golden Eagles to a 33-15-10 record and three appearances in the CCAA Championship Tournament.

Garcia joined the program in 2013 and helped the Golden Eagles achieve a 10-6-3 record with an 8-5-3 mark in conference play. Cal State LA closed the regular season with an 8-2-2 record over its final 12 games and earned a spot in the four-game conference tournament. The Golden Eagles were ranked fifth in the final NCAA Division II West Region poll, but missed out on the six-team regional after two teams ranked outside of the top six earned automatic qualifying bids.

Garcia came to Cal State LA after serving as Cal Poly Pomona's interim men's soccer head coach in 2012.

Prior to that, he was the associate head coach of both the men's and women's programs at Kansas Wesleyan in 2011.

He helped Kansas Wesleyan's men's team to a national ranking as high as No. 8 and a school record for wins in a season with 17, while the women's team also won a conference title.

Prior to his one year in Kansas, Garcia was an assistant coach for four seasons at two schools for longtime coach Lance Thompson.

Garcia was at Cal Poly Pomona with Thompson for the 2009 and 2010 seasons and the Broncos enjoyed great success, winning 20 games over the two years and just missing qualifying for the CCAA Championship Tournament.

He was also with Thompson for two outstanding years at Notre Dame de Namur and helped the Argonauts to a 24-12-4 record. He was the associate head coach in 2008 when the Argonauts won a Pacific-West Conference title. Notre Dame de Namur was 14-3-3 that season and qualified for the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time. The Argonauts recorded 12 shutouts and had a goals against average of 0.62.

Garcia began his coaching career in 2006 as an assistant coach for the men's and women's programs at Holy Names. Both teams won Cal-Pac Conference championships. The men made their third consecutive regional playoff appearance, while the women made their first-ever trip to the postseason.

Garcia led L.A. Villa FC of the Women's Premier Soccer League to a 6-3-2 record and a third-place finish in the Coastal Standings in 2016 in his first year with the club, coaching a team that included former Cal State LA players Liz Franco and Stacey Rodwell. It was the first winning record for the franchise in three years.

Garcia also served as an assistant coach for the LA Misioneros FC, a Player Development League team based in Los Angeles and was the head coach for the Misioneros' reserves in 2013. In 2014, Garcia was named the Misioneros' associate head coach, and, during the season, became the head coach. He guided the team to a 7-2-5 overall record and into the playoffs for the first time in the team's history.

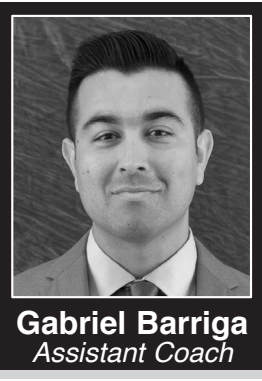
He also served as an assistant coach for the Orange County Blues USL-Pro team in 2014.

Garcia played for two seasons at Holy Names and helped lead the team to its first-ever NAIA postseason berth as a junior. The team was ranked fifth in the nation and captured conference and regional championships. The Hawks advanced to the regional playoffs in both his junior and seniors seasons.

He also played at Los Angeles City College, where the team made its first-ever playoff appearance.

Garcia earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from Holy Names in 2006.

Garcia was born in Los Angeles and grew up in Honduras. He has a son, Derik Ki.



Gabriel Barriga
Assistant Coach

A talented goalkeeper coach, Gabriel Barriga returns for his second season with the Cal State LA women's soccer program.

Barriga worked with the Golden Eagle goalkeepers for the first time in 2015 and helped Cal State LA record a 0.72 goals against average with a save percentage of .848. The Golden Eagles were 8-2-2 over their final 12 games to finish the season with a 7-7-4 overall mark.

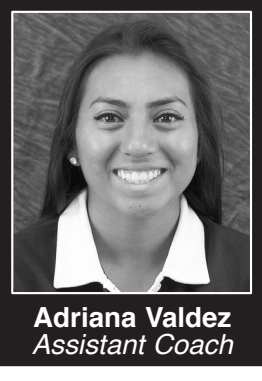
Barriga has vast coaching experience at several levels. He is also currently the Los Angeles Football Club's Major League Soccer Academy Goalkeeper Coach and he is the Director of Goalkeepers for the FC Long Beach youth club.

He was the goalkeeper trainer for the L.A. Villa of the Women's Premier Soccer League and helped the team to a third-place finish in its conference and he also was the goalkeeper trainer for the Golden State Force of the Professional Development League. That team finished third in the conference and reached the playoffs.

He also was the goalkeeper trainer and reserve team manager for PSA Elite that advanced to the fourth round of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Tournament and was the last amateur team standing in 2015.

Previously, Barriga was the goalkeeper trainer for Cal Poly Pomona's women's team in 2012, for Rio Hondo College's men's soccer program from 2005-08 and Bell Gardens High School varsity boys team. Rio Hondo advanced to the Final Four of the CCCAA State Championships in 2005 and Bell Gardens was a CIF Division 1 semi-finalist in 2006.

Barriga earned his bachelor's degree in

Valdez began her collegiate coaching career last year and helped Cal State LA go 8-2-2 over its final 12 games and finish with a 7-7-4 overall record.

Valdez was recently named the new women's varsity soccer head coach at Fullerton Union High School, where she had been an assistant coach since 2013. She has also been a youth soccer coach for the Fullerton Rangers since 2010. She also has experience officiating, which she has done at the youth level since 2008.

Valdez competed in semi-pro soccer for two seasons with the L.A. Vikings and played alongside top national player Maribel Dominguez.

Valdez graduated from Cal State LA in 2015 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise Science. She played for the Golden Eagles for two seasons in 2012 and 2013 after playing for two years at Cal State Bakersfield.

She competed in soccer, cross country and track and field at Fullerton High School.

Valdez currently resides in Anaheim with her family.

Scored her first career goal with a beautiful strike from 25 yards out to open the scoring in a 3-1 win over Chico State in the championship match. Appeared in 20 games and started 18 times. Was fourth on the team in minutes played with 1,579.

2013: Got her career off to a promising start and saw significant playing time as a true freshman. Appeared in nine games and made one start. Played a total of 286 minutes. Made her Cal State LA debut against Saint Martin's on Sept. 8. Got her first start for the Golden Eagles on Sept. 15 against UC San Diego and played a season-high 74 minutes.

Cal State L.A. boasts a rich athletic history with seven national team championships, 10 national team runner-up finishes and 75 conference championships. This tradition of excellence continued in 2015-16 as evidenced by the following:

- Nearly 40% of our student-athletes earned year-long GPAs of 3.0 or higher.
- Golden Eagle student-athletes earned 5 All-America awards, 1 Academic All-America awards, 26 All-Region awards and 43 All-CCAA awards.
- Khallifah Rosser won an NCAA Division II national championship in the 400 hurdles, the first national title earned for the Golden Eagles since 2012.
- Iona Lofrano (volleyball), JamieAnn Bero (volleyball), Khallifah Rosser (men's track and field) and Megan Thompson (women's track and field) earned All-America awards.
- Iona Lofrano (volleyball) earned Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, becoming the second volleyball player at Cal State LA to earn that honor. Lofrano, Herbert Biste (men's soccer) and Lucas Rio Torto (men's soccer) earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors.
- Khallifah Rosser (men's track and field) was named the West Region and CCAA Track Athlete of the Year.
- Megan Thompson was named the CCAA Track Athlete of the Meet at the CCAA Championships.
- J'Liyah Miles was named the CCAA Freshman Track Athlete of the Meet at the CCAA Championships.
- The Golden Eagles claimed 6 individual CCAA championships: Khallifah Rosser won a conference title in the 400-meter hurdles and joined Fabian Griffith, Matthew Sherrills and Johnathan Hill to win the 4x100 relay. Megan Thompson won conference championships in the 100 and 200, Gonzalo Ceja won the conference title in the men's steeplechase and J'Liyah Miles won the conference title in the women's long jump.
- Cal State LA's men's soccer team reached the NCAA playoffs for the fifth straight year and for the eighth time in the past 10 years.
- Cal State LA's men's soccer, women's soccer, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball teams reached CCAA Championship tournaments in their respective sports.
- Cal State LA's women's tennis team finished the season ranked 23rd in the nation, its fifth straight top-25 ranking, and finished fourth in the PacWest Conference in its second year as an affiliate member.
- Cal State LA's women's volleyball team recorded its 19th consecutive winning season and had its most wins since 2009.
- Cal State LA's men's basketball team became only the second No. 8 seed to upset a No. 1 seed in the CCAA Championship Tournament. It was the second conference tournament win in the program's history.
- Cal State LA's women's basketball team reached the conference tournament for the fourth time in the past five years and scored its points in a game since 1998 with a 98-92 win over Cal State Dominguez Hills during the regular season.
