# FLORIDA GATORS 1-1 (0-1 SEC)

#### THE MATCHUP

#### FI ORIDA

- Colorado State clashes with a team from the SEC for the second week in a row, traveling to Gainesville to face Florida one week after defeating Arkansas 34-27 at Canvas Stadium in Fort Collins (Sept. 8). It will be the first meeting between the Rams and Gators.
- The Rams turned the game around after Arkansas scored touchdowns on its first two possessions of the second half to extend a 13-9 halftime lead to 27-9 with 7:28 to play in the third quarter. The Razorbacks also led the Rams in total yards, 393-164. From that point on, CSU outgained Arkansas 265-44, including 195-16 in the fourth quarter.
- CSU scored its first touchdown of the game on its 11th possession with a 4-yard pass from QB K.J. Carta-Samuels to WR Preston Williams, capping a 7-play, 70-yard drive.
- Senior kicker Wyatt Bryan became CSU's all-time leading scorer during the game, passing RB Steve Bartalo (294 points; 1983-86). He now has 300 career points after going 4-4 on field goal attempts—including a career-best 55-yarder to open the scoring—and 2-2 on PATs, to contribute 14 points in CSU's historic seven-point win
- Colorado State ranks 10th in FBS in passing offense, averaging 369.0 yards per game through the air.
- Graduate transfer QB K.J. Carta-Samuels ranks 5th in FBS in passing yards per game (367.3) and 4th in completions per game (28.0). In the second half of Saturday's win over Arkansas, Carta-Samuels completed 22-27 for 291 yards and two touchdowns to finish the game 32-47-389, 2/1.
- Junior WR Preston Williams ranks 4th in FBS in receptions per game (9.0) and 6th in receiving yards per game (130.3), and has four touchdown receptions in three games.
- Williams caught 12 passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns in CSU's win over Arkansas. He has eclipsed 150 yards in two of his first three games as a Ram (188 vs. Hawai'i, 8/25/18).
- Sophomore punter Ryan Stonehouse ranks 2nd in FBS in gross punting average (49.9), and had the two
  longest punts of his career in Saturday's night's win, of 70 and 68 yards.
- Colorado State's three opponents thus far in 2018 have a combined record of 6-1: Hawai'i 3-0, Colorado 2-0, Arkansas 1-1.

RB: #24 Izzy Matthews, 6-0, 210, SR (Enterprise HS) On the 2018 Doak Walker Award watch list... Currently 5th in CSU history in career rush TDs (27)... Scored the game-winning TD with 8 seconds left vs. Arkansas on Sept. 8.

FB: #46 Adam Prentice, 6-0, 236, RS JR (Clovis HS) Highest-graded FB in the FBS in 2017 according to PFF College... Wuerffel Trophy watch list, Allstate Good Works Team nominee.

Became first CSU coach to win seven regular-season games in first season as head coach ('15) and first to lead CSU to a bowl game in each of his first three seasons. Came to CSU following 14 seasons at Georgia, including eight as offensive coordinator.

#### **CSU-FLORIDA - MATCHUP NOTES**

- This will be the first meeting between CSU and Florida.
- This will be CSU's second consecutive game against an SEC opponent, and third consecutive game against a power five conference team.
- · This is the first time CSU has played two SEC teams in the same season, let alone in consecutive weeks.
- The last time CSU traveled to the state of Florida was Sept. 21, 1974 when the Rams took a 14-7 win against Florida State in Tallahassee. CSU also played at Florida State in 1972, losing to the Seminoles 37-0.

#### **SCOUTING THE GATORS**

- Florida is 1-1 this year after defeating Charleston Southern on Sept. 1 and losing to SEC foe Kentucky at home on Sept. 8.
- The Gators are already 1-0 against a CSU this season, beating Charleston Southern 53-6 in their season opener.
- Quarterback Feleipe Franks is the team leader on offense and paces the squad in both passing yards (451) and rushing yards (78).
- Florida went 4-7 last season with a 3-5 record in SEC play.
- · Dan Mullen is in his first season as Florida's head coach. He spent the last nine seasons (2009-2017) as the head coach of Mississippi State and was able to lead them to seven bowl appearences during that time. Also served as the offensive coordinator for the Gators from 2005-2008
- The Gators have 10 returning starters on the offensive side of the ball and nine on defense.

#### THE RAMS VS. THE SEC

- · Colorado State is 3-12 all-time against current members of the Southeastern Conference.
- · CSU defeated Arkansas last week, earning a come-from-behind victory in Fort Collins, 34-27.
- The Rams defeated Missouri in the 1997 Holiday Bowl, 35-24. when the Tigers were a member of the Big 12.
- · CSU picked up a road win over LSU in Death Valley in 1992.
- · The Rams' last two road matchups against SEC programs were each at Alabama, including last season. CSU lost to the top-ranked team in the nation, 41-23.

#### RAMS IN ROAD OPENERS

- · Under head coach Mike Bobo, the Rams are 1-2 in their first road game of the season. CSU won at UTSA in its first true road game in 2015,
- · Since 2000, the Rams are 6-12 in road openers.
- · This is the fourth year in a row that the Rams have played their first true road contest on Sept. 15 or later.

#### **BOBO VS. FLORIDA**

- · Mike Bobo faced Florida 18 times while at Georgia -- four times as a player and 14 times while on the Bulldogs' staff.
- Georgia was 1-3 while Bobo was a quarterback from 1994-97. Bobo, alongside offensive stars Robert Edwards and Hines Ward, led Georgia to a 37-17 win over the Gators in 1997, snapping seven-game losing skid to Florida.
- · Bobo has only been in "The Swamp" in Gainesville one time -- Georgia played at Florida in 1994 when Bobo was a freshman. The two teams played once in Athens, Ga. (1995), while the rest of the meetings took place in Jacksonville.

Senior quarterback K.J. Carta-Samuels and junior wide receiver Preston Williams have been standouts over the first three games of the season for the Rams. The duo have been particularly productive in the second halves of games.

#### **BRYAN NOW CSU'S ALL-TIME SCORING LEADER**

Senior kicker Wyatt Bryan has scored more points wearing a CSU uniform than any other player in the 126-year history of the school's football pro-

Bryan now has 300 career points. He broke the record in the second quarter of CSU's Sept. 8 contest versus Arkansas on a 44-yard field goal with 32 seconds remaining in the first half. Bryan passed legendary running back Steve Bartalo (294), who had held the record for more than 30 years.



#### RAMS SECOND TO TWO

The Rams were the second team in the nation to play two games this season. New Mexico State opened its season on Aug. 25 against Wyoming and then traveled to play Minnesota five days later on Aug. 30. CSU and New Mexico State both played two games before all but 97 teams in the FBS had played one.

CSU played twice in August for the second time in program history (2002) and is now 8-4 all-time in the month.

#### **NEW RAMS HAVE STELLAR DEBUT**

Several players made their debut for CSU against Hawai'i in the season opener on Aug. 25. A pair of offensive transfers made a strong first impres-

Senior quarterback K.J. Carta-Samuels, a graduate transfer from Washington, completed 34-of-50 passes for a school record 537 yards and five touchdowns against the Rainbow Warriors. His five touchdowns are tied for the second-most in a single-game in CSU history. Carta-Samuels threw for 422 yards in the second half, which would be the sixth-most in a game in program history on its own.

Wide receiver Preston Williams, a junior that transferred from Tennessee during the 2016 season, had nine receptions for 188 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Williams had 127 yards in the second half, including a 69-yard reception down the left sideline where he showed off his speed, agility and strength all in one sitting.

WR Preston Williams has been stellar in his first three games as a Ram, totaling 391 receiving yards.

Two Rams seniors, **RB Izzy Matthews** and **WR Olabisi Johnson**, have had significant roles during all three of Bobo's seasons. Matthews totaled 1,937 yards in his first three seasons (2015-17), including four 100-yard games, and is fourth in program history with 27 rushing TDs. Johnson owns the program's top single-game receiving effort with 265 yards in the 2016 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl against Idaho.

- All-conference offensive linemen Jake Bennett, Zack Golditch, Trae Moxley and Fred Zerblis.

#### **GOING FOR 500 (AND 600)**

CSU posted 653 yards in its season opener against Hawai'i on Aug. 25. It was the most yards that a Rams team has had under fourth-year head coach Mike Bobo and the fifth-most in a single game in program history. It also further illustrated a trend that Bobo has set since taking charge of the program in 2015.

CSU eclipsed 500 yards of total offense seven times in 2017, and reached 600-plus yards a school-record four times. Under Coach Bobo, the Rams have exceeded 500 yards of total offense 17 times (4 in 2015, 5 in 2016, 7 in 2017, 1 in 2018).



#### PRENTICE THE NATION'S HIGH-**EST-GRADED FULLBACK**

Redshirt sophomore Adam Prentice was the highest-graded fullback in the FBS in 2017. according to Pro Football Focus. He rated at an 82.5 for the season -- the highest rating of any returning Ram.

Prentice is also known for his off-the-field efforts. He is on the 2018 Wuerffel Trophy watch list and is a nominee for the 2018 Allstate Good Works Team.



#### WR II?

The Colorado State football team has groomed several incredible talents at the wide receiver position over the last five years. Rashard Higgins, a fifth-round draft selection of the Cleveland Browns in 2016, set multiple program records during his three seasons at CSU. Higgins was a Biletnikoff Award finalist and consensus All-American in 2014 following a season where he totaled 1,750 yards receiving and 17 touchdowns. Michael Gallup earned the same national accolades last season, producing 1,413 yards on a school-record 100 catches. Gallup was a third-round draft choice by the Cowboys this year, and is competing to be a starter in year one.

Since 2014, seven different Rams receivers have posted at least one 100yard receiving outing -- Higgins, Gallup, Joe Hansley, Charles Lovett, Elroy Masters, Jr., Olabisi Johnson and Preston Williams (plus tight end Cameron Butler).

A few prominent current Rams are looking like they will continue the tradition of stellar wide receiver play in Fort Collins, under the tutelage of head coach Mike Bobo and wide receivers coach Alvis Whitted, himself a nine-year NFL veteran. Johnson and Williams were included among Lance Zierlein's (NFL.com) top-10 wide recevers to watch going into this season.

#### **NEW STAFF ADDITIONS FOR 2018**

The Rams added six new full-time assistant coaches into the fold before spring ball started, including three new coordinators. The defense will be led by defensive coordinator John Jancek, who brings 10 years of experience as a defensive coordinator at the FBS level, most recently a threeyear stint at Tennessee. Four other new assistant coaches join Jancek on that side of the ball, including special teams coordinator and linebackers coach Chase Gibson. Dave Johnson was also added to the staff to be the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. The six new full-time assistant coaches boast over 100 years of combined experience on Division I coaching staffs.

# BOBO'S RAMS IN MW PLAY

#### **GOING BOWLING**

For the 17th time in school history and fifth year in a row, the Rams went bowling in 2017, facing Marshall in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl. It marked the first time CSU qualified for a bowl game in five consecutive seasons since 1999-2003. All-time, CSU has played in 17 bowl games, including 16 since 1990.

The Rams finished with a 7-6 record for the third consecutive year, and have now posted winning records in five straight seasons.

#### CSU SETS TOP ATTENDANCE MARKS

Colorado State set single-season records for total home attendance (192,369) and per game average (32,062) last season, its first in its new on-campus football stadium.

CSU saw its total attendance increase 16.2 percent from 2016 - the eighth-highest per-game attendance increase in the FBS for 2017.

Other attendance facts:

- Second year in a row with an increase in attendance -- the seventh-highest two-year per-game attendance increase among all FBS schools (7,145; 28.7%)
  - 149,500/24,917 in 2015
  - 165,598/27,600 in 2016
  - 192,369/32,062 in 2017
- One of only two MW schools (San Diego State) to experience an attendance increase in each of the past two seasons.
  - Colorado State: 10.8% from 2015-16; 16.2% from 2016-17
  - San Diego State: 22.6% from 2015-16; 5.5% from 2016-17
- Second-highest average attendance increase in MW behind Fresno State (5,139)

# THIS WEEK IN CSU HISTORY -- STEVE BARTALO AND THE RAMS' DEFENSE COMBINE FOR A 10-3 WIN OVER HEAVILY-FAVORED HAWAII IN 1984 HOME OPENER

The 1984 season had promise with All-American Keli McGregor as the team's senior tight end and Steve Bartalo as the bruising fullback on Coach Leon Fuller's powerful offense. Going into the second week of the season, Fuller decided to replace his 5th-year senior quarterback, Tom Thenell, for sophomore quarterback Kelly Stouffer. Stouffer, making his first college start, would do it in front of a cold crowd of 25,754 at Hughes Stadium for the home opener against Hawaii.

Although Stouffer would go on to a legendary career for CSU, the story of the day did not rest on him, but rather on the tough play of the Rams defense and on sophomore fullback Bartalo. The defense knew it would be a tough day, especially since Hawaii was not only chosen as the favorites to win the WAC, but because their wide receiver, Walter Murray, who had blazing speed and quarterback, Raphel Cherry, were considered to the best one-two-punch in the conference.

The CSU defense held Murray to only 59 receiving yards while Cherry could only muster 165 yards passing and a negative 18 yards on the ground. Rams cornerbacks Hardy Griffin and Tyrone Pope shut Murray down, only allowing him four receptions on the day. Linebackers Dale Carr and Keith Pitts were the keys to the Rainbows' only gaining a total of 202 yards of offense, 37 of those yards on the ground. Pitts' sack of Cherry on a fourth and one play was one of the keys to the Rams successful defensive day.

Coach Leon Fuller, who was in his third season at the helm said, "I can't say enough about the play of our defense. I am very proud of the whole unit." Fuller, who had been a defensive coordinator at Texas just prior to taking the CSU head coaching job and played in two bowl games for Alabama as a defensive back for Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant, knew good defense when he saw it in action.

On the offensive side of the ball it was the Steve Bartalo Show. Bartalo would not only rush for 170 yards on 36 carries and the game's lone touchdown, but the former quarterback from Colorado Springs who walked on in 1982 also had a 36-yard pass to Brad Kendrick. Bartalo would move up to sixth all-time on the career rushing list with 1,387 and two years later finished with 4,813 career yards as the top rusher in school history where he remains today. He also completed his fifth straight 100-yard rushing game against the Rainbows, breaking the school's record set by Lawrence McCutcheon more than a decade earlier.

Although the 1984 season would end up as a big disappointment, both Bartalo and Stouffer would solidify themselves as the next generation of performers in the CSU offense. Both would be stars of the 1986 season that would see victories over Colorado and Wyoming in dramatic fashion and both went on to careers in the NFL.



#### **#ALLTIMERAMS - FAN VOTE**



#### **CANVAS STADIUM**

Canvas Stadium is the new name for Colorado State University's 41,000-capacity multipurpose stadium that opened on the school's Fort Collins campus in 2017. The newly re-branded Canvas Credit Union received naming rights to the facility through a \$37.7 million partnership agreement announced in April 2018. The agreement, which stands as one of the largest collegiate athletic venue naming agreements in history, was part of an ambitious re-branding initiative being undertaken by the previously branded Public Service Credit Union, under the direction of company President and CEO Todd Marksberry.

Canvas Credit Union is a not-for-profit, state-chartered, member-owned financial cooperative that has been in business since 1938. Today, the credit union has more than \$2.3 billion in assets and more than 238,000 members – and a mission to help individuals and families make better decisions and grow stronger financially. Learfield's Rams Sports Properties and their Campus+ business brokered the agreement as part of its ongoing support for Colorado State University athletics.

The \$220 million, 727,000-square-foot stadium proved immensely popular and attractive to fans in its inaugural season of 2017, and drew rave reviews from local and national media, as well national television networks that broadcast Colorado State's games to large audiences. The Rams set an alltime attendance record with a total of 192,369 fans and a per-game average of 32,062, representing a 16-percent attendance increase from 2016 eighth-highest in all of college football. Season ticket sales also reached an all-time high of 15,477, a 40-percent increase from the 2016 total of 11,054.

The return of CSU football games to campus from Hughes Stadium in 2017 brought the pageantry and celebration of Rams game days back to the heart of the university for the first time in 50 years, providing countless new engagement opportunities for the entire university. The stadium's design embraces Colorado's natural beauty, topography and visual connections to the Rocky Mountains from campus and ensures functionality for both gameday and non-game day usage.



The agreement with Canvas Credit Union combined with \$20 million given in 2016 to name Sonny Lubick Field brings the total naming rights revenues at Colorado State to \$57 million for the stadium. This compares favorably with the recently announced \$69 million United Airlines Memorial Coliseum at University of Southern California and the \$41 million Alaska Airlines Field at Husky Stadium at the University of Washington. The Colorado State agreement with Canvas Credit Union is for 15 years and includes annual escalator clauses for inflation, as well as a signing bonus, in recognition of the visibility and success of the stadium.

# COLORADO STATE FOOTBALL MEDIA COVERAGE GUIDELINES

• We appreciate your coverage of Colorado State Athletics, and look forward to working with you to accommodate you and your organization within the framework of the following media policy. The policies are jointly established by Head Coach Mike Bobo and the Athletics Communications office. Please take a few minutes to read through and familiarize yourself with these guidelines. Failure to comply with these policies could result in revocation of credentials or limitations on access. Please feel free to contact Associate A.D. for Communications Paul Kirk at (970) 988-3482 or via email at paul.kirk@colostate.edu with any questions.

Interview access to players and coaches throughout the calendar year is as follows:

#### **GENERAL POLICIES**

- All interviews with any member of the football program, including Mike Bobo, the coaching and football staffs, and student-athletes, must be coordinated through the Athletics Communications office.
- True freshmen and other student-athletes in their first year in the program are not eligible to be included on the regular interview list.
   Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, mem-
- Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the Communications office at least 48 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program, provided the requested individual is not a true-freshman player. Requests approved by Coach Bobo will be facilitated by the Athletics Communications staff.
- Members of the media are strictly prohibited from directly contacting any coach, staff member or student-athlete by any means, including by text message, e-mail, phone (cell, office or home) or social media, without first approaching the Athletics Communications office.
- For all practices, no live reporting of practice details is permissible, nor live streaming of any method. Upon conclusion of practice, questions based on observations made during practice may be asked of Coach Bobo, and reported on as answered.
- Designated student-athletes from the interview list will be made available on specified days during the spring and preseason practice periods, and on Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the regular season.
- Assistant coaches will be made available to media one time each during spring practice on a schedule provided Athletics Communications.
- Head Coach Mike Bobo will be available following most practices.
   Exceptions include night practices and certain practice days during spring and preseason.
- All interviews take place in the interview room of the stadium, located
  at field level, one level down from the media entrance on the west side
  of the stadium. Media are not permitted to enter the football offices, or
  the training room, locker room, weight room or meeting rooms unless
  arrangements have been made through the Communications office.
- Media may not photograph or report on individuals or groups participating in workouts outside of organized team sessions within campus practice or competition locations.

 Coordinators will be made available on Media Day. No other assistant coach access is available during preseason camp.

#### REGULAR-SEASON GAME WEEKS

- On Mondays, Head Coach Mike Bobo will conduct a weekly press
  conference in the stadium interview room. Bobo will begin speaking at
  12 p.m. and the press conference will end at approximately 12:30-35.
   The press conference is livestreamed at CSURams.com/live, and the
  archive will be available on YouTube and on CSURams.com. Audio from
  the press conference also is made available to media.
- Following practice on Tuesday and Wednesday, student-athletes on the interview list will be made available, with either offensive or defensive players being available Tuesday and those from the other side of the ball on Wednesday, Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the Communications office at least 48 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program, provided the requested individual is not a true-freshman player. Approved requests will be granted, but those interviews need to take place on Tuesday following practice.
- On Wednesday, Bobo will be available following practice.
- Following Wednesday availability, there is no further media availability with members of the program until the end of the game on Saturday, with the exception of contractual obligations with broadcast partners.

#### GAMEDAY

- Every member of the program must report to the locker room following the game before conducting interviews. Other than network TV and radio obligations, CSU does not allow on-field interviews in the minutes following the game's conclusion.
- Postgame press conferences take place in the home and visiting team interview rooms, located just off the elevator from the press box at field level. From the field, enter the southwest tunnel and proceed right and down the hall to reach the interview rooms on your left.
   Head Coach Mike Bobo and requested players will be available to
- Head Coach Mike Bobo and requested players will be available to the media in the interview room after a reasonable cooling-off period. Coach Bobo will conduct his postgame press followed by requested players from the interview list being made available in the interview room. Assistant coaches and true freshmen players are not available.
- The visiting team press conference and media availability will take

place in the visiting team interview room adjacent to the home team interview room, down the hall from the visitors' locker room.

#### RECRUITING PERIOD

 Access to Head Coach Mike Bobo will be less regular during this time, from the end of the regular season through the second signing day, the first Wednesday in February, due to recruiting responsibilities. Assistant coaches are not available during this period.

#### ALL OTHER TIMES

- Head Coach Mike Bobo is available either in-person or by phone, by appointment through Assoc. A.D. for Communications Paul Kirk (paul kirk@colostate.edu).
- Assistant coaches do not have regular availability throughout the year. Requests for their participation in interviews must be made through Assoc. A.D. for Communications Paul Kirk, and will be granted only by approval of the head coach.
- Phone calls (cell, office or home) to any coach, staff member, or student-athlete are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through the Athletics Communications office.
- Media should contact the Athletics Communications office, rather than
  the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal
  contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses, or
  contact information for family members and friends where such interviews will enhance a feature story.

#### INJURIES

- At all times throughout the calendar year, including spring practice, Head Coach Mike Bobo will serve as the sole source for injury information. All questions related to injuries should be directed to Bobo, and not to any other member of the program, including athletic trainers, doctors, the injured student-athlete, or his teammates.
- · If Coach Bobo is unavailable, please contact Paul Kirk

#### PRACTICE GUIDELINES

- Most Colorado State football practices are open to media for the first few periods unless otherwise noted.
- Videography, provided it is not live-streamed, is allowed during the media viewing period, but no sound may be recorded.
- No live reporting of practice details is permissible, nor live streaming of any method. Upon conclusion of practice, questions based on observations made during the media viewing period may be asked of Coach Bobo, and reported on as answered by the coach.
- During the spring, most regular practices (excluding scrimmages) are open to the media during the media viewing period as specific by Athletics Communications.
- All media should remain on the sidelines, standing a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Also for safety reasons, media are asked to stand rather than sit or kneel, and should either hold personal bags or set them behind a barrier, so they are not a potential injury source for players or the media.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY GUIDELINES

- Cameras are restricted from shooting/filming any 11-on-11 period, as well as selected other periods (Athletics Communications staff will notify).
   Photography must be tight, "iso" shots that do not reveal alignments or strategy.
- No sound may be captured during the shooting of practice video.
- Photographers are allowed to shoot individual drills and group activity as directed by the Athletics Communications staff. No photography is allowed of players receiving treatment from medical staff, or of injured players, whether participating in individual workouts or observing practice.
- Photographers and videographers are not allowed to bring tripods onto the practice field.
- Photographers and videographers should remain on the sidelines, or behind the end lines. They are not permitted in any drill or in close proximity to any team or position-group huddles at any time.
   Photographers should stand a safe distance from the boundary to
- Photograpners should stand a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Also for safety reasons, photographers are asked to stand rather than sit or kneel, and should either hold personal bags and/or camera equipment, or set them behind a barrier, so they are not a potential injury source for players or the media.
- All posed photo shoots must take place at times arranged prior to the beginning of practice, working through the Athletics Communications office. Posed photo shoots are not permitted during any practice.

#### TELEPHONE INTERVIEWS

- Head Coach Mike Bobo is available for phone interviews as time permits. Media should call to make an appointment through Paul Kirk (paul.kirk@colostate.edu).
- Phone calls (cell, office or home) to any coach or student-athlete are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through the athletic Communications office.
- Media should contact the Athletics Communications office, rather than the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses.

#### CSURAMS.COM/SOCIAL MEDIA

• The official Web site of Colorado State athletics, CSURams.com, features the latest news, information, statistics and rosters for all of the Rams' 16 athletic programs. Rams fans worldwide can also listen to the live play-by-play coverage offered by the Colorado State Sports Network through the website or the Tuneln app, and can watch livestreamed video of most home events. Fans can click on www. CSURams.com,then click on the schedule pages to access the radio

broadcast for live radio coverage of football, volleyball and men's and women's basketball. For video, click the "Fans" tab at the top, and scan the menu under Multimedia, or directly access the URL CSURAms.com/watch. News also will be disseminated via the Colorado State football program's official twitter account, @CSUFootball, as well as the general athletics account, @CSUAthletics, and Assoc. A.D. for Communications Paul Kirk (@PaulKirk\_CSU).

#### MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Credentials must be requested through Paul Kirk in writing at least seven days in advance of an event. Approved requests will be mailed or can be picked up in the Communications office, or at the game. Season credential applications will be made available in mid-July, and the online single-game credential request link can be found at http://www.csurams.com/sb\_output.aspx?form=20.

#### PHOTOGRAPHER CREDENTIALS

 Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers. Passes must be displayed at all times. All photographers must remain outside the 25-yard lines on both sides of the field, or behind each end zone in a kneeling position.

#### GAME-DAY SERVICES

- A pregame meal is served 90 minutes prior to kickoff in the press box. Colorado State provides reliable WiFi in the press box, photographers' workroom and interview rooms, and access to live statistics through StatBroadcast. We have greatly reduced the amount of information distributed on paper at our home games in favor of full digital offerings of game notes, statistics, postgame audio and postgame notes. All credentialed media will receive an email the day before a game with all pertinent coverage and team information directly or via links embedded in the email.
- Colorado State's stadium offers complimentary wireless Internet access in the press box, interview room and photo workroom. Ethernet lines also are available in the photo workroom, located just inside the southwest tunnel at field level, near the visiting team locker room. Check the seat-assignment label on press row for wireless access information.

#### PARKING

- Media parking on game days is generally available in the Lake Street Garage (Lot 570), located near the intersection of Prospect Road and Center Avenue in the south area of campus. Denver TV stations have space allotted for one vehicle per station in front of the connection panels on the west side of the stadium. Please contact the Athletics Communications office to request a game day parking pass.
- Parking in all campus parking lots requires a permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays. A limited number of single-day passes are available through the Communications office, and pay-to-park stalls are located on the north side of the stadium, on Pitkin Street, in front of the Ram Zone store and ticket office. Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management Web site: http://pts.colostate.edu, and many lots offer a payment klosk to purchase a daily pass.
- The CSU Athletics Communications office will provide complimentary annual passes to the Moby/McGraw Center lot and Lot 240 near the stadium for select media organizations and members of the press who consistently cover the Rams. Those passes are not replaceable and should be treated like cash.

#### STADIUM DIRECTIONS/WILL CALL

- Colorado State's on-campus stadium is located between Pitkin and Lake Streets, just west of Shields Street in Fort Collins. The mailing address is 751 W. Pitkin Street. From I-25, media should take the Prospect Road exit, turn left, and proceed west toward the mountains. To access Lot 570 with a game day parking permit, please turn right onto Center Ave., from westbound Prospect Road. The entrance to the garage will be on your right. The stadium's media entrance, and Media Will-Call, is located on the west side of the stadium through the door marked "Media & Staff Entry," and press box access is via elevator just inside that entrance.
- Ticket will call is located at the main stadium ticket windows on Pitkin Street, at the Northwest corner of the stadium.
