NOTING THE RAMS

- The Rams enter year two under head coach **Jay Norvell** who was named the program's 24th head coach on Dec. 6, 2021. Norvell led his Wolf Pack team onto Sonny Lubick Field in the season finale on Nov. 27 and returned to Fort Collins nine days later as the Rams new head coach.
- Over his five years in Reno, (2017-21) he compiled four-straight seven-plus win seasons and led the Wolf Pack to four bowl games. Colorado State last won seven games in a season in 2017. Norvell is the fourth Colorado State head coach in the last 10 seasons, dating back to Jim McElwain's final season in 2014.
- Colorado State last won a conference championship 21 seasons ago this year. That 2002 team won the third title in four seasons under coach Sonny Lubick, a four-year run that included a combined record of 35-15. However, since then, the program has not been able to replicate that level of sustained success.

- The roster has undergone a radical transformation in just one full season under Norvell and his coaching staff. Of the 112 players currently on the roster, just 19 have been at Colorado State since 2021 or earlier. Of those 19, just 12 were scholarship signees. **MORE ON PAGE 12**
- This season marks the 10th consecutive season Colorado State will play at least two P5 opponents in the non-conference schedule, and future schedules have the Rams setup to continue that streak through at least 2028. The Rams are one of seven MW teams this season to do so and hold the longest active streak of seasons with two-plus P5 opponents (next: six seasons).
- Since 2006, when the NCAA moved to a 12-game regular season, Colorado State has never had a bye week as early as they do in 2023: Week 2. The span of 11 consecutive games is also a first since that 2006 schedule change.

NOTING THE GAME

- The Rams host at a Pac-12 opponent for the first time since the opening game of Canvas Stadium, a 58-27 defeat of Oregon State, on August 26, 2017. That was also the last time the Rams defeated a Pac-12 opponent and hosted a Pac-12 foe. All-time, the Rams are 2-1 vs. P5 opponents at Canvas Stadium (Arkansas, 2018; Vanderbilt, 2021).
- Defensively, the two teams will look very similar as both CSU defensive coordinator Freddie Banks and WSU head coach Jake Dickert are from the Scottie Hazelton coaching tree. Banks played for Hazelton at North Dakota State while Dickert coached under him at Wyoming.
- Colorado State is 61-62-1 (.494) all-time in season openers. That includes a 23-17-1 (.568) mark when the Rams have opened at home. Since 1995, the Rams are 6-2 in season-opening home games but are on a five-game slide in season openers overall, having last won the opening game of the season in 2017 in the aforementioned Oregon State game.

Media INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS: To request credentials, submit a request at CSURams.com/FootballCredentials. All requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working press only. Requests made on game day will not be approved. Credentials are issued to the individual

MEDIA/SCOUTS WILL CALL AND PARKING: Due to ease of pick up outside Canvas Stadium, credentials will **NOT** be mailed this season. Credential pick up is available at the northwest corner of Canvas Stadium at a ticket office window and begins two hours prior to kick off.

Parking passes will also be delivered digitally to media and scouts to the phone number listed on the credential application. Parking passes will be sending during game week.

MEDIA/STAFF ELEVATOR: An elevator is available for use throughout the game to allow media to travel between the field level, first floor, and sixth floor press box. However, this elevator is also used by food and beverage staff. The elevator may also be held for coaches of either team in the final minutes of each half, and media members are encouraged to use the stairwell if they are physically able to do so.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCE: After a cooling off period and conversation with the team, head coach Jay Norvell and select players will be available to the media. Post-game video is available by request.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Credentials for photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. Credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless they are employed by a reputable publication or the Communications office of the participating schools. Credentials are issued to photographers for the purpose of media coverage only, and images of the game may not be used for commercial purposes without the expressed, written permission of Colorado State Athletics.

SIDELINE AREAS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive without proper equipment will not be granted sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area. This includes during pre-game activities.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS: Colorado State's locker room is closed at all times.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rule, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their visit (official or unofficial) to campus, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. Contact includes in-person conversations, phone calls, text messages, e-mails, etc. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Each Monday during the season, with the exception of the bye week, head coach Jay Norvell holds his weekly press conference beginning at 11:30 a.m. Video will be available of the full availability courtesy of Colorado State Athletics.

PRACTICES: During the regular season, practices are open for stretch and individual periods - roughly the first 30 minutes - on Tuesday and Wednesday practices. Practices begin at approximately 8:30 a.m. each day. Team periods are closed. Media members should submit interview requests for student-athletes a day prior to the interview. Please let Kyle Neaves or Jeff Schmidt know in advance if you plan to attend.

PULLMAN — The dream was for a quick turnaround. The reality is becoming clear -- Colorado State's football program is just in the early stages of a total rebuild.

But three games into the season, the offense is still looking to score points in the first half and for the third year in a row, the Rams have now allowed an opponent 21 first-quarter points.

Washington State did it Saturday, then took a 28-0 lead into halftime on the way to a 31-7 victory.

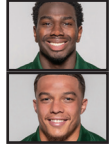

Head Coach JAY NORVELL

3-9 OVERALL // SECOND YEAR

36-35 Overall/7th Year

Jay Norvell enters his second season at the helm of the Colorado State program and was named the 24th head coach in program history.

Norvell, who led the Nevada Wolf Pack to four bowl games in five seasons (2017-21) as head coach prior to coming to Fort Collins, has an offensive coaching acumen which is unquestioned after he built a conference title contender at Nevada over his five seasons. Former Wolf Pack quarterback Carson Strong was a two-time MW Offensive Player of the Year as Nevada led the MW in passing offense in 2021 at 365.8 yards per game. The Wolf Pack posted four consecutive winning seasons under Norvell including a pair of bowl wins in 2018 (Arizona) and 2020 (Famous Idaho Potato).

Norvell's first season in Fort Collins may not have seen growth in the win-loss column from the team he inherited, but the cultural progress under Norvell's direction was undeniable.

The Rams posted a 3-9 record in his first season, a campaign which opened against CFP semifinalist Michigan and was filled with seven teams which advanced to the postseason. Starting three different quarterbacks during the season (all of whom were redshirt or true freshmen), the Rams showed signs of improvement on offense as the season progressed, averaging 247.3 yards of total offense the first half, improving to 324.1 the second half.

The same trend showed on defense, with the Rams going from 400.8 yards allowed to 309.1. Seven players were named All-Mountain West, including first-team selections for wideout Tory Horton and safety Jack Howell. Quarterback Clay Millen and defensive tackle Grady Kelly were named freshmen All-America by Pro Football Network.

After a difficult non-conference slate and a plethora of expected contributors opting to enter the transfer portal, the Rams became closer despite the departures and put the first victory of Norvell's Colorado State tenure on the board in dramatic fashion, winning on a walk-off field goal in the conference opener at Nevada. The conference season concluded with two more wins over Hawaii and a shut-out on Senior Day over New Mexico.

At times during the 2022 campaign, Norvell and his coaching staff were working with as few as 59 scholarship players on

the roster and even fewer available to play due to injury. Regardless, the Rams produced one of the league's toughest defenses in Mountain West play, holding opponents to an average of just 19.9 points. In the eight-game league schedule, Norvell's Rams, held together mostly by grit and hope, were non-competitive just once (at Boise State) and managed to keep their average margin of defeat to fewer than six points overall. Removing the Boise State game (49-10), the Rams were outscored by their opponents by less than one point on average.

Using his time at Nevada as the blueprint, Norvell set out to build the Colorado State program through recruiting ahead of the 2023 season. That blueprint resulted in the highest-rated recruiting classes in program history based on 247Sports' Composite rankings and the second-highest in the Mountain West by the same metric.

Off the field and the recruiting trail, Norvell's impact in the Fort Collins and Colorado State community was equally as significant. From the day Norvell stepped foot on campus, he was engaged with anyone interested in Colorado State University and Colorado State Athletics. From speaking engagements to organizing a run for charity, Norvell has re-ignited a spark in the community around his program.

Perhaps his biggest and most notable introduction has been that of the Grit Run - a 5K fun-run around campus with all proceeds going to benefit research around cystic fibrosis, a disease which impacts his wife, Kim, on a daily basis. In it's first year, the Norvell's raised over \$20,000 to directly benefit the CF Foundation. The total was nearly doubled in year two with over \$40,000 going to research causes.

At Nevada, the Wolfpack enjoyed an immense turnaround under Norvell's leadership, and it paid off in the postseason honors as well. Including Strong's consecutive offensive player of the year awards, 16 Nevada student-athletes earned All-MW honors in 2021 led by first-team wide receiver Romeo Doubs, who finished the regular season ranked No. 12 nationally in receiving yards.

Strong concluded his 2021 campaign ranked top-10 nationally in completions per game (3rd; 30.4), passing yards (4th; 4,175), passing yards per game (5th; 347.9), passing touchdowns (6th;

36), completion percentage (8th; 69.9) and total offense (8th; 330.6).

In May 2021, Norvell was named the 2020-21 College Coach of the Year by the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches. He is the first Black head coach in program history, and the first sitting head coach to be hired since Earle Bruce in 1989.

Norvell's resume and experiences reaches to all corners of college and professional football. He has spent time in the Big 10, Big 12, Pac-12, and NFL with the Indianapolis Colts and Oakland Raiders - a period that included an AFC Championship and appearance in Super Bowl XXXVII in 2002 under head coach Bill Callahan. During his time as an assistant, Norvell coached in every BCS bowl game during the BCS Era including the 2009 BCS National Championship with Oklahoma. Overall, he has been to 22 bowl games as both a player and a coach.

An All-Big 10 defensive back during his playing career at Iowa under legendary Hawkeyes coach Hayden Fry, Norvell got his first opportunity in coaching under Fry on the offensive side of the football. That move proved fruitful for the young graduate assistant in 1986.

Over stops at Oklahoma, Texas, and Arizona State, Norvell mixed his Air Raid-style offensive scheme with principles of under-center schemes employed in the NFL to put together a highly effective offensive machine. While coaching wide receivers at Oklahoma (2008-14), a period which also including serving as co-offensive coordinator (2011-14), Norvell mentored Oklahoma greats in Kenny Stills, Sterling Shephard and Ryan Broyles, who left Oklahoma as the NCAA's all-time leader in receptions.

A 1986 graduate of Iowa, Norvell was an All-Big Ten defensive back and recorded a league-high seven interceptions in 1985 as he helped the Hawkeyes put together a 10-2 record, a conference championship and a spot in the Rose Bowl. He was a member of the Chicago Bears in 1987 before he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater.

Norvell, who hails from Madison, Wis., has a wife, Kim, and son, Jaden. He is the author of a book, "Complete Wide Receiver," which was published in 2012.

Home Openers Through the Years By John Hirn, CSU Historian

Rams Football is back for its 131st season on the gridiron. After months of practice, tweaking of players and conditioning, the Rams face the Washington State Cougars at Canvas Stadium for the 2023 season and home opener. The opening game of a season can set the pace for the rest of the year, especially when the season opens in Fort Collins before the player's fellow students and many fans.

Here is a look back at some of the great and not-so-great home openers for the Aggies and Rams.

The first triumphant home opener in school history occurred on October 5, 1912, which also coincided with the first game played at Colorado Field. After months of grooming the first football field in Colorado history to be built with grass turf, the Aggies and their second-year head coach, Harry Hughes hosted the University of Denver Ministers (Pioneers today). The Aggies had not scored even one point on their home field since October 16, 1909. That was also the last time the Aggies had won a football game.

Not only had a new football field energized the Aggies team, but Harry Hughes was in the midst of transforming Colorado Aggies football into what would soon become the powerhouse of football in the state for the next 20 years. The game of football had made a transformation from its rugby roots to the game we know today. Rule changes in 1912 allowed for four downs to make a first down within 10 yards. The scoring also changed where a touchdown was now worth 6 points and an extra point kick was one point. A field goal now being worth three points. All of these rules may be normal to fans of the 21st century, but these changes were extremely new to football teams of 1912. The Aggies fought a tough game, and CAC beat DU for the first time since 1905 by a score of 14-13.

Fast forward to September 18, 1948, when the Rams opened the season against Colorado College in the first night game at Colorado Field. The Aggies took care of the Tigers easily winning 25-6 and setting the pace for what was later called the "Cinderella Rams" team that went on to the first Raisin Bowl. Second-year head coach Bob Davis had a bevy of talent with CSU legends like Dale Dodrill, Jack Christiansen, Bob Hainlen, Eddie Hanna and Fum McGraw.

Not all home openers are wins or are they memorable. On September 28, 1968, CSU opened Hughes Stadium by losing to North Texas State 12-7. Not only would they finish the season 2-8, the Rams had to wait until a year later to win their first game at the new stadium by the foothills. The 1981 home opener was not just a 14-30 loss to San Diego State, it started the worst season in school history when the Rams went 0-12 on the season.

As time has marched onward, several great home openers have set the pace for legendary football seasons. In 1990, a lopsided win over Montana State led to the first bowl game since 1949. Not only did the 1990 Rams go 8-4 on the regular season, they never lost a game at Hughes Stadium. The 1994 Rams kicked off arguably the finest season in school history with a 41-16 win over the Utah State Aggies. That season, Sonny Lubick's second year as head coach, saw the Rams win their first WAC Championship.

The 2000 season, which began on neutral ground in Denver against in-state rival CU, kicked off at Hughes Stadium a week later with an easy 41-7 win over East Tennessee State. The win over CU in Denver may have propelled the Rams to an amazing 10-2 record and conference championship, CSU again didn't lose a game at home.

In recent years the most memorable home openers have also ended in exciting victories. Most memorable was on August 26, 2017, when CSU opened its new on-campus football stadium, later named Canvas Stadium. The Rams came out to win and beat Oregon State in a lopsided 58-27 drubbing of the Pac 12 team. With 37,583 fans in the new stadium, CSU christened their new football palace in style.

In what can be described as the strangest home opener in school history, the Rams played their first home game of the 2020 season before a crowd of zero fans. The COVID-19 Pandemic prevented CSU fans from attending the Border War, the longest continuous rivalry west of the Mississippi. In the November 5th opener, the Rams beat their rivals from Laramie 34-24 to re-capture the Bronze Boot. It would end up being the only home game played at Canvas Stadium.

As Coach Jay Norvell kicks off his second year with the Rams on September 2nd, another season of Rams football begins and another chapter in CSU football history will be written.

THE ROSTER REBUILD CONTINUES.

To say the 2023 roster is not the same as the roster Norvell and Co. inherited just one full season ago would be an understatement. In his first class, Norvell brought in **52** new players for the 2022 team including **23** via the portal or junior college route. In 2023, the first *true* recruiting class for Norvell, the numbers are even more staggering.

Since taking over the reins of the program, nowhere has the roster transition been more drastic than on the offensive line. There is just **one** scholarship offensive lineman on the 2023 roster who was on the team when Jay Norvell took over: Brian Crespo-Jaquez. In fact, Crespo-Jaquez is the *only* offensive scholarship holdover inherited by Norvell on the 2023 team. To build the offensive front, Norvell and line coach Bill Best brought in 11 new offensive lineman in the most recent signing class including eight via the portal or junior college.

THE COMMITMENT CONTINUUM

On the topic of good reads, another of Norvell's implementations since arriving at Colorado State has been pulled from the author Jeff Janssen: the Commitment Continuum. The simple guide includes six ranges of commitment to the organization's goals: Resistant, Reluctant, Existent, Compliant, Committed, and Compelled.

Each week during summer conditioning, Colorado State's positional leaders - not the coaches - sort each member of their position group into one of those six categories for everyone in the program to see. Entering the 2023 season, every member of the roster was placed at Compliant or higher with the majority in the Committed and Compelled categories.

The newest additions to the NFL ranks this season include Dequan Jackson, a four-time captain at CSU who is competing for a spot as an undrafted free agent in his hometown and Barry Wesley, who spent the 2022 season in the XFL before earning a camp spot in Atlanta.

In 2022, **Ryan Stonehouse** - the NCAA career record holder for punt average (47.8) - beat out 13-year veteran punter Brett Kern in camp to take over the starting punting duties for the Tennessee Titans. All he did as a rookie is do what he always has done: break records. Stonehouse broke Sammy Baugh's 80-plus year old record with a single-season mark of 53.1 yards per kick. He earned All-Pro recognition along the way.

20 SEASONS SINCE THE 2002 MW CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

Colorado State owns three Mountain West championships (1999, 2000, 2002) including three of the first four ever crowned since the league's creation in 1999. However, since that last title in 2002, success has been sporadic for the program. THE NEW RAM WALK

Under Norvell, Colorado State hosts **two** Ram Walks. One is the standard walk for the public to see the team enter Canvas Stadium prior to the game. The other is a more private affair.

On the night before every game, home and away, when the team goes to the stadium for walk-through, former CSU lettermen are invited back to walk the field, arms locked together, with the current players. Only current players and former players are allowed to participate, meaning Norvell and every staff member is prohibited from being involved.

At the end of the 100-yard walk, two alumni are selected to speak privately to the team about their experiences in the Green and Gold. Current players are encouraged to spend the first 50 yards thinking about the next day's game and the final 50 yards thinking about how they will honor the former players.

TRADITIONS AT CSU

Colorado State has a number of long-standing traditions around its football program. Some are celebrated each game, some only at home, and some only on Homecoming.

» HOMECOMING FLAG

Since 2014, each Homecoming game, one Colorado State player is selected to run out of the tunnel with an Aggie A flag from 1925. The flag was stolen by CU fans during the 1925 Homecoming game and returned for the playing of the 100th Homecoming game in 2014.

Then-head coach Jim McElwain started the tradition which has been carried on ever since.

» COMATOSE

Since 1920, military members from the institution have fired the deafening 75 mm cannon "Comatose," an intimidating exclamation point to opponents which just allowed a Rams touchdown, field goal or PAT. Fired today by CSU's Army ROTC, it is **the oldest continuous tradition** associated with CSU Athletics.

At Canvas Stadium, the cannon is located at field level in the southeast corner. The cannon was completely refurbished in Denver in the summer of 2018.



» LARRY LASASSO SPIRIT AWARD

A 1934 graduate of Colorado Agricultural College and former cheerleader for the Aggies, Larry LaSasso returned home from WWII to become the greatest cheerleader in CSU history. Director of Athletics, Harry Hughes, asked LaSasso to help bring some spirit back to Colorado A&M.

Beginning in 1946, LaSasso helped lead Aggie cheers and donned his old cheerleading sweater. He added onto his ensemble by wearing a kilt honoring his Scottish heritage, a beret and white gloves.

Fans around CSU came to recognize the "Aggie Cheerleader" and found his warm personality and love of CSU intoxicating. LaSasso continued to wear his sweater and kilt to homecoming games until 2002; he passed away August 1, 2004 at the age of 92.

In 1983, the Larry LaSasso Spirit Award was created to recognize individuals who have demonstrated exceptional and enduring spirit, enthusiasm, and support for Colorado State Athletics. The winner is presented annually during homecoming weekend.

» TRAVELING TROPHIES

Colorado State football enjoys fierce rivalries with three front-range schools. The Rams and their foes battle for a trio of traveling trophies: The Centennial Cup (Colorado), the Bronze Boot (Wyoming) and the Ram-Falcon Trophy (Air Force).

The Bronze Boot is far and away the most important trophy associated with CSU Football and was created in 1968 from an actual leather boot worn by Cpt. Dan Romero during the Vietnam War.

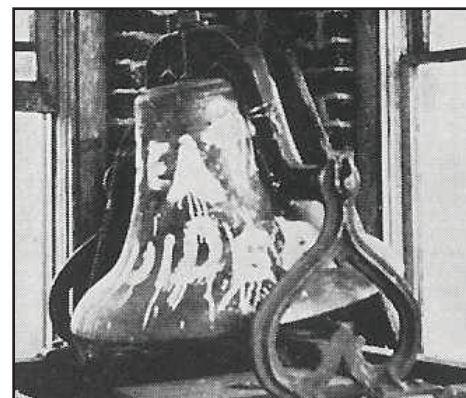


» OLD MAIN BELL

The story of Colorado State's Old Main Bell, which rings before each home football game and housed in the Iris and Michael Smith Alumni Center and Canvas Stadium, is a long and twisting one.

The bell originally rang throughout the campus of Colorado Agricultural College around 1910 before being stolen in 1919 and hidden away in secrecy, it's location known only to a select few. The bell emerged in February 2016 and delivered by an unknown individual on the driveway of Kristi Bohlender, the Executive Director of CSU's Alumni Association.

» THE AGGIE A

The prominent white "A" displayed on the foothills overlooking the old Hughes Stadium site is the second-oldest ongoing tradition associated with Colorado State University.

At a special assembly on Dec. 4, 1923, the students of State Agricultural College agreed it was time to erect an emblem to support the University.

The college declared Dec. 12 a special holiday, and students worked from that morning until mid-afternoon to form the "A."

The following September, students lengthened and widened the "A" to its present size of 450 feet from top to bottom, and 210 feet across at the bottom.

Today, the "A" is an official landmark. Early each fall, freshman football players join forces with several other campus organizations to give the "A" a fresh coat of white paint.





Notes and TIDBITS

PUTTING THE FRESH IN FRESHMEN

It was no secret last season that Colorado State was in the midst of significant roster rebuild in Jay Norvell's first season, and no place was that more evident than in the starting lineup.

The Rams started multiple freshmen in each game in 2022, peaking at six against San Jose State, including five on offense (four true freshmen), and Air Force,

WALKING ON TO A STARTING ROLE

Colorado State started walk-on redshirt freshman **Giles Pooler** against Utah State as **Clay Millen** recovered from an injury.

Pooler was likely the lone walk-on in the country to start for his team at quarterback that week and the first walk-on to start at quarterback for the Rams since **MJ McPeck** did so in 2012.

Not to be outdone, walk-on true freshman **Keegan Hamilton** started at center against Boise State and San Jose State. He was one of three walk-ons to start that game for the games (Dane Olson, Ayden Hector)

INTERCEPTION STREAK

Colorado State recorded an interception in **six consecutive games in 2022** - including three-straight from DB Jack Howell. It was the longest such streak for the program since the 2009 season when the Rams tallied at least one pick in **six consecutive games** to open the season. They are the longest pair of streaks since at least 2000.

BUILDING A LINE

As far as streaks go, Jay Norvell is aiming to snap one as the Rams' head coach as he builds his roster for the program's future.

Colorado State last had an offensive lineman honored on the league's All-Conference First or Second teams in 2017 - five seasons ago. The Rams had a stellar run of honorees in that group with at least one from 2013 to 2017 for a total of eight first or second team all-conference lineman.

THE FRONT FIVE

Sticking with the offensive line, consistency within that group was a significant challenge due to injuries throughout 2022. Colorado State started a different combination of the starting five up front in each of the first six games before settling in with the same five for games five, six, and seven. The Rams were back to their old tricks though in Game 8 when Miki-Han missed the game due to injury.

OVERCOMING A DEFICIT

Against Hawaii in 2022, the Rams did something that few teams in program history have done before them - they overcame a double-digit halftime deficit.

Trailing 13-3 at halftime, CSU rallied for a 17-13 victory. While it may not seem like much, since 1965, the Rams have trailed by double digits **186 times** and overcame them only **12 times**.

The game also snapped a **19-game streak** of failing to overcome a 4th quarter deficit. The program lost the final two such games under former HC Mike Bobo, all 12 such games under former HC Steve Addazio, and the first five this season under Jay Norvell.

CANVAS STADIUM

Canvas Stadium is the new name for Colorado State University's 36,500-capacity multipurpose stadium that opened on the school's Fort Collins campus in 2017. Canvas Credit Union received naming rights to the facility through a \$37.7 million partnership agreement announced in April 2018. The agreement, which stands as one of the largest collegiate athletic venue naming agreements in history, was part of an ambitious re-branding initiative being undertaken by the previously branded Public Service Credit Union, under the direction of company President and CEO Todd Marksberry.

The \$220 million, 727,000-square-foot stadium proved immensely popular and attractive to fans in its inaugural season of 2017, and drew rave reviews from local and national media, as well national television networks that broadcast Colorado State's games to large audiences. The Rams set an all-time attendance record with a total of 192,369 fans and a per-game average of 32,062, representing a 16-percent attendance increase from 2016—eighth-highest in all of college football. Season ticket sales also reached an all-time high of 15,477, a 40-percent increase from the 2016 total of 11,054.

The return of CSU football games to campus from Hughes Stadium in 2017 brought the pageantry and celebration of Rams game days back to the heart of the university for the first time in 50 years, providing countless new engagement opportunities for the entire university. The stadium's design embraces Colorado's natural beauty, topography and visual connections to the Rocky Mountains from campus and ensures functionality for both game-day and non-game day usage.

The agreement with Canvas Credit Union combined with \$20 million given in 2016 to name Sonny Lubick Field brings the total naming rights revenues at Colorado State to \$57 million for the stadium. This compares favorably with the recently announced \$69 million United Airlines Memorial Coliseum at University of Southern California and the \$41 million Alaska Airlines Field at Husky Stadium at the University of Washington. The Colorado State agreement with Canvas Credit Union is for 15 years and includes annual escalator clauses for inflation, as well as a signing bonus, in recognition of the visibility and success of the stadium.

2023 RULE CHANGES

Each offseason, college football's rules and regulations are reviewed. The below are three changes that will be in place for the 2023 season.

Stopping & Starting the Clock - 1st Downs

When Team A (the offense) gains a first down, the clock will no longer be stopped to award a first down except with less than two minutes remaining in the 2nd and 4th quarters.

Consecutive Charged Timeouts

Consecutive charged team timeouts will no longer be allowed by the same team in any individual dead ball period. Each team is entitled to three charged team timeouts during each half, with no more than one charged team timeout available per team, per individual dead ball period.

Extension of Periods

A period shall be extended for an untimed down in the 2nd or 4th quarter only if a penalty is accepted for a live-ball foul, if there are offsetting fouls, or an inadvertent whistle. The 1st and 3rd quarters will not be extended, and any penalty enforcement will be carried over to the following quarter.
