Requests for student-athletes for the post-practice interviews during the week must be submitted no later than 12 p.m. on Mondays to the Nevada Communications office.

Post-practice interviews take place in the lobby of the Cashell Fieldhouse.

CREDENTIALS

All requests for media access at Mackay Stadium, and seating in the Mackay Stadium press box, must be made by 5 p.m. two days before gameday. Please submit to Aaron Juarez (aaronjuarez@unr. edu). Those receiving accommodation will be notified later that evening.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

In general, no coaches or student-athletes are available to media on the field or en route to the locker room, with the exception of the live, originating television broadcast if pre-arranged. Nevada's locker room is closed to the media.

Interview requests should be submitted to Aaron Juarez of the Nevada Communications office no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Assistant coaches are not available after games. Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream postgame press conferences following home games via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

Postgame press conferences for home contests will take place in Petersen Academic Center, with head coach Jeff Choate and selected players. Postgame pressers for road contests will be subject to the current protocols of the game location. Please submit interview requests to Aaron Juarez via text (208-982-0040) no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter.

MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone lines available during the game and after the conclusion of each game.

PARKING

Media parking permits for gameday are available via the Nevada Communications Office are generally for levels five and six of the West Stadium Parking Complex. Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.

CLEAR BAG POLICY

The University of Nevada, in an effort to provide a safer environment for the public and to expedite entry into the athletic venues, has implemented a new policy limiting the size and type of bag allowed for all events.

Approved Bags:

- Clear plastic, vinyl, or PVC tote bags that do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
- One-gallon clear plastic storage bags
- Small Clutch Purses 4.5" X 6.5" or smaller

Exceptions: An exception will be made for medically necessary items and diaper bags after proper inspection. These bags will be tagged to inform venue security that the bag has been cleared by the gate inspection member and to limit any disturbance to the patron once inside the stadium. Accredited media may bring bags for working purposes into the facility but must enter at the press box elevator or gate 2 on the west side of the stadium and make bags available for search.





HEAD COACH JEFF CHOATE



Jeff Choate was named the 28th head coach of the Nevada football program Dec. 4, 2023.

Choate comes to Nevada from Texas, where he serving as the Longhorns' codefensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach. Under Choate's tutelage, the Longhorn defense topped the Big XII in rushing defense (82.4 ypg, third in the country), scoring defense (18.9 points per game, 15th in the country), third-down conversion percentage defense (26.6 percent, second in the country), and total defense (336.7 yards per game), while ranking in the national top 10 in red-zone defense (73.8 percent, seventh), as the Longhorns racked up a 12-2 record, Big XII title, and a spot in the College Football Playoff.

Prior to his time in Austin, Choate served four seasons (2016-19) as head coach at Montana State. There, he led the Bobcats to a combined 19-9 record over his final two seasons, making consecutive appearances in the FCS playoffs with a run to the semifinals in 2019.

Since starting as a graduate assistant at Utah State in 2002, Choate's stops have included champion-ship and top-10 programs as Boise State (2006-11), Montana State (2016-20), and Texas. The Longhorns will face No. 2 Washington, where Choate spent two seasons (2014-15) as an assistant under Chris Petersen, in the 2024 Sugar Bowl on New Year's Day, and his resume includes two Fiesta Bowl titles (Boise State, 2007 and 2010).

At Texas, Choate helped guide Jaylan Ford to one of the finest years for a linebacker in program history in 2022. Ford earned All-American honors and All-Big 12 Conference accolades after totaling a career-high 119 tackles (61 solo), 10 tackles for loss, two sacks, three forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and four interceptions. The 119 tackles were the most for a Longhorn since 2014 and his four interceptions tied the single-season record for a Texas linebacker, last accomplished by Derrick Johnson in 2002 and 2003.

Over his four seasons at the Montana State helm, the Bobcats improved dramatically in many statistical categories. By his final season (2019), Montana State ranked in the FCS top 25 in rushing offense (8th/258.1 ypg), turnover margin (13th/+0.87 tpg), rushing defense (18th/121.2 ypg), scoring defense (23rd/22.1 ppg), and total offense (25th/426.5 ypg), along with sacks allowed (7th/0.93 spg), sacks (20th/2.73 spg), tackles for loss allowed (11th/4.67 tpg) and net punting (14th/39.17 ypp). Two Bobcats earned second-team FCS All-America honors, including OL Mitch Brott and DL Bryce Sterk. Along with those two, a total of 13 Montana State players received All-Big Sky Conference recognition, including first-team linebackers Troy Andersen and Josh Hill and third-team linebacker Amandre Williams. Montana State finished the season 11-4, winning six of its last seven games with the only loss coming to No. 1 North Dakota State in the playoff semifinals. The 11 wins are the second-highest single-season total in program history and included a fourth-straight win over Montana for the first time since 1977.

In 2016 and 2017, Choate began the building process at Montana State. The Bobcats had back-to-back Big Sky Freshman of the Year honorees those seasons with Andersen, playing both quarterback and linebacker, garnering it in 2017, and QB Chris Murray doing so in 2016, along with Freshman All-America recognition. One of Andersen's fellow linebackers, Mac Bignell was tabbed first-team all-conference in 2017. The Bobcats led the Big Sky and ranked seventh nationally in rushing offense at 249.5 yards per game that year, all while facing a program-record seven nationally ranked opponents. The rushing attack was also strong the year before, as they ranked 17th in the nation at 212.0 yards per game behind a line anchored by first-team all-conference OG J.P. Flynn.

From 2006-2011, Choate was an assistant at Boise State in several roles. He served as special teams coordinator all six years and also spent time coaching running backs (2006-08), linebackers (2009) and nickel backs (2010-11). During that time, the Broncos posted a 73-6 overall record, winning four Western Athletic Conference Championships and two Fiesta Bowl Championships and finishing ranked in the top 11 five times (2006, '08-11), including two in the top five (2006, 2009).

Among his protégés was Kyle Brotzman, the highest-scoring kicker in school and conference history (439 points) and Boise State's career leader in punting (44.6 ypp). He also coached Kyle Wilson, who led the country in punt return touchdowns (3) and ranked 12th in punt return average (14.2 ypr) in 2008. Coaching nickelbacks, Choate tutored All-WAC first team selection Winston Venable in 2010. The Broncos ranked second nationally in scoring defense (12.8 ppg) and total defense (254.7 ypg) that season.

Working with the linebackers in 2009, the Broncos were 14th nationally in total defense (300.2 ypg) and scoring defense (17.1 ppg). The team led the WAC in six defensive statistical categories that year, including passing efficiency defense, total defense, scoring defense, pass defense, tackles for loss and sacks. The team completed its season 14-0 with its second Fiesta Bowl win by defeating TCU.

As running backs coach, he was instrumental in the development of lan Johnson, who at the time set a WAC record with 58 rushing touchdowns, which is still the second-best mark following 59 by Colin Kaepernick. Johnson amassed 4,183 yards in a Bronco uniform, second all-time in school history. He led the nation in rushing touchdowns (25) and scoring (152 points) in 2006. That year, the Broncos finished 13-0 including a win over Oklahoma in the Fiesta Bowl.

Choate earned his bachelor's degree from Montana Western in 1993, where he played linebacker. He and his wife, Janet, have one son, Jory, and a daughter, Jacy.

SERIES HISTORY

Colorado State leads the all-time series with the Wolf Pack by a 14-5 margin, and has won the past two meetings.

Overall, Nevada is 5-6 against the Rams since 2006, after Colorado State won the first eight all-time meetings.

ABOUT COLORADO STATE

Colorado State has won three-straight heading into Saturday's matchup, starting 3-0 in Mountain West play after an Oct. 5 non-conference loss to Oregon State.

Former Wolf Pack head coach Jay Norvell (2017-21 at Nevada) is in his third season at the Colorado State helm, and is 13-19 overall with the Rams. Norvell is 2-0 against the Wolf Pack.

THE LAUNCH

The Launch of Nevada Football began Dec. 4, 2023, when Jeff Choate was named the 28th head coach in program history.

Choate brings a championship resume to Reno which boasts deep postseason runs (FCS semifinal with Montana State in 2019, College Football Playoff semifinal with Texas in 2023), top-10 programs, and Fiesta Bowl victories in 2006 and 2011.

His first head-coaching tenure came at Montana State from 2016-20, over which he guided the Bobcats to a 19-9 record over his final two seasons, culminating with an 11-4 record and a run to the FCS semifinals in 2019.

Most recently, Choate spent the past three seasons (2021-23) at Texas, serving as the Longhorns' co-defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach. Under Choate's tutelage, the Longhorn defense topped the Big XII in rushing defense

(82.4 ypg, third in the country), scoring defense (18.9 points per game, 15th in the country), third-down conversion percentage defense (26.6 percent, second in the country), and total defense (336.7 yards per game), while ranking in the national top 10 in red-zone defense (73.8 percent, seventh), as the Longhorns racked up a 12-2 record, Big XII title, and a spot in the College Football Playoff.

THE STAFF TO FUEL THE LAUNCH

Head coach Jeff Choate wasted little time tapping his vast network to fill out the Wolf Pack's new coaching staff. Heading into 2024, the Wolf Pack boasts a coaching staff brimming with the championship mentality and pedigree that will fuel the program's Launch.

Three members of Choate's Nevada staff followed the Wolf Pack boss from Texas. Associate Head Coach/Interior Defensive Line Payam Saadat spent 2023 as Special Assistant to Head Coach Steve Sarkisian, Passing Game Coordinator/Secondary coach Joey Thomas, a former Montana State All-American and seven-year NFL veteran, was a senior defensive analyst for the Longhorns, and Defensive Ends coach Nico Johnson, a three-time national champion at Alabama, was a Longhorns graduate assistant from 2022-23.

Offensive coordinator Matt Lubick, recognized among the nation's most prolific coordinators and top recruiters begins his first season at Nevada in 2024. Defensive coordinator Kane Ioane, a four-time All-American at Montana State and the architect of Boise State's 2023 Mountain West Champion defense, reunites in Reno with Choate, under whom he served as Montana State's defensive coordinator and safeties coach in 2019.

Running backs coach Mike Lynch, most recently of Syracuse, served with Choate on the staffs at Utah State (2002-04) and Eastern Illinois (2005). Run Game Coordinator and Offensive Line coach Brian Armstrong spent Choate's entire Montana State tenure (2016-19) on the Bobcat staff, while Wide Receivers and Quarterbacks coach David Gilbertson and Special Teams coordinator and linebackers coach Parker Henry were each on the 2012 Washington State team for which Choate served as linebackers coach.

James Price, familiar with the Mountain West as a standout wide receiver at Wyoming from 2015-18, and now Nevada's interim wide receivers coach, was Montana State's Director of Player Personnel in 2023.

Finally, Wolf Pack legend Virgil Green remains on staff, overseeing his old position, tight ends. Green, a 10-year NFL veteran and Super Bowl 50 Champion, was part of Nevada's 2010 WAC Champion squad, and made 72 receptions for 939 yards and 11 touchdowns over his Wolf Pack career (2008-10).

SPECIAL CONNECTION FOR LUBICK

While Saturday's Nevada-Colorado State matchup will not be in Fort Collins, it will mark a special connection for Wolf Pack offensive coordinator Matt Lubick. Lubick is the son of legendary Colorado State head coach Sonny Lubick, who went 108-74 and won the Rams six conference titles (three WAC, three Mountain West) from 1993-2007.

The younger Lubick spent four years on his father's Colorado State staff, coaching wide receivers from 2001-04. He helped the Rams to the 2002 Mountain West title and three bowl games. Lubick coached David Anderson, who ended his career as the most prolific receiver in Colorado State history. In 2003, Anderson set the then-school record with 1,293 receiving yards, and he ranked 12th nationally in receiving yards per game (99.5).

COATS JR. CONTINUES CAREER SEASON

Cornerback Michael Coats Jr.'s career season has been getting even better with each game. Coats Jr. recorded his fourth interception of the season Saturday at Hawai'i, and is tied for fifth in the nation. His 12 pass breakups continue to lead the country, heading into Week 10.

Coats' coverage has been one of the highlights of the Nevada secondary's improved performance in 2024. Through nine games, Nevada's defense has already broken up 36 passes, surpassing last season's total of 32. Along with Coats' national-best 12, the Pack secondary is reinforced by six from Kitan Crawford and three apiece from Keyshawn Cobb and KK Meier.

PURDY, BIANCO ADD TO QB DEPTH

With Brendon Lewis (undisclosed) ruled out ahead of last Saturday's game at Hawai'i, quarterbacks Chubba Purdy and AJ Bianco got plenty of run leading the Wolf Pack.

The quarterbacks combined to go 26-for-39 for 286 yards, and each threw a touchdown pass. The production was split nearly down the middle, as Purdy threw for 155 yards and a touchdown, with one late interception, while Bianco threw for 131 yards along with his score. Purdy added a team-high 41 yards on the ground.

Overall, Nevada's three quarterbacks (with one completion and attempt from wide receiver Jaden Smith) have combined to complete 67.23 percent of their passes, a Mountain West-leading figure.

BELLON WITH A CAREER DAY

Wide receiver Marcus Bellon clicked well with Purdy and Bianco in Hawai'i, resulting in career bests in receptions (six), receiving yards (111) and touchdown catches (two). On the second play of the second half, Bellon hauled in a 63-yard touchdown catch from Purdy to get the Wolf Pack on the board, then caught a 10-yard strike from Bianco for the second score.

On the year, Bellon leads the Wolf Pack with four touchdown grabs, while ranking second on the team in receiving yards (371) and catches (27).

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST IN THE RED ZONE

Nevada's red-zone performance on offense has been a significant turnaround in 2024. On offense, the Wolf Pack has converted 27 of 28 red-zone trips into points, the 96.4 percent rate ranking sixth in the country and leading the Mountain West. Of Nevada's 28 trips, 24(!) have resulted in touchdowns, an 85.7-percent rate. That rate has, so far, well out-distanced the Pack's 2023 rate in which it only scored 16 touchdowns on 35 red-zone trips (45.7 percent).





CASHING IN ON THE MONEY DOWN

Another key category in which Nevada is among the nation's best is on third-down conversions. On the "money down," Nevada's 52.5 success rate ranks fourth in the country and leads the Mountain West. The Wolf Pack's success on third down has been key in extending drives, and holding onto the ball, contributing well to Nevada's average time of possession of 32:04, which leads the Mountain West and ranks 18th in the country.

LEWIS AMONG THE MOUNTAIN WEST'S TOP QBs

Quarterback Brendon Lewis continues to rank among the top Mountain West quarterbacks after yet another gutsy effort Saturday against Fresno State

One of the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the conference, Lewis once again accounted for at least one touchdown with both his arm and legs Saturday, running for a score just before halftime and throwing for 158 yards and a touchdown.

On the year, Lewis has had a hand in just over half of the Wolf Pack's 29 touchdowns (10 passing, five rushing), while completing a Mountain West-best 67.2 percent of his passes for 1,290 yards with 551 rushing yards.

Among Mountain West quarterbacks, Lewis leads in rushing yards and completion percentage, ranks third in overall total offense (1,645 yards) and fourth in total offense per game (230.13 ypg).

PICK YOUR POISON

Nevada's run game isn't just limited to one player--the Pack has three players with at least 200 rushing yards on the season, with that trio of Savion Red (656), quarterback Brendon Lewis (551) and Patrick Garwo III (246) combining for 1,453 yards. The three have also combined for all 18 of Nevada's rushing touchdowns in 2024.

Red (fifth) and Lewis (seventh) each rank in the Mountain West top-seven in rushing yardage, while Nevada is one of just two teams (along with New Mexico) with two ball carriers in the conference's top 10.

NO LETUP IN THE SCHEDULE

Nevada's 2024 schedule has set up as one of the nation's toughest. Notably, the Wolf Pack has the rare distinction of playing three 2023 FBS conference champions in 2024, with the first two coming back-to-back to start the campaign:

Aug. 24 - vs. SMU (2023 American champion) - L, 29-24

Aug. 31 - at Troy (2023 Sun Belt champion) - W, 28-26

Nov. 9 - at Boise State (2023 Mountain West champion)

LONGHORN CONNECTION

Head coach Jeff Choate isn't the only pickup Nevada made from national runner-up Texas during the offseason. Along with associate head coach Payam Saadat, passing game coordinator/secondary coach Joey Thomas, and defensive ends coach Nico Johnson, Choate has recruited some key players who aim to make a "Texas"-sized impact for the Wolf Pack.

Running back Savion Red and Ky Woods feature on the offensive side of things. Red's impact has been immediate, as he played in 21 games over his first two seasons (2022-23) at Texas, beginning his Longhorn career at wide receiver before moving to running back ahead of 2023, and making appearances as a Wildcat quarterback. Red saw action in the Big 12 Championship Game win over Oklahoma State and in

the CFP semifinal (Sugar Bowl) against Washington, and finished the season with 131 rushing yards and a score on 30 carries.

On defense, fifth-year safety Kitan Crawford and defensive lineman Kristopher Ross add experience from Austin. Crawford was named Honorable Mention Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Year in 2023, and appeared in 46 games over his career at Texas. With the Longhorns, he racked up 61 tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss, an interception, and two pass breakups.

FIRST MOUNTAIN WEST WEEKLY HONOR OF 2024

Nevada offensive lineman Tyson Ruffins was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Week after Week 0. Ruffins was part of a Wolf Pack offensive line which worked in front of a running game which produced three ballcarriers who finished with at least 30 yards, led by quarterback Brendon Lewis' 77.

Behind the Pack line, Lewis had one of his top games in a Nevada uniform, throwing for two touchdowns (matching his season output from 2023) and 132 yards without an interception. Against the SMU rush, the Nevada line only gave up one sack in the contest, along with just five tackles-for-loss, one of which came because of a fumbled exchange.

RENO, Nev. (AP) — Preston Stone connected on a 35-yard touchdown pass to RJ Maryland with 1:18 left in the fourth quarter and Southern Methodist avoided an upset to open the season, defeating Nevada 29-24 on Saturday night.

A near four-touchdown favorite, SMU needed a fourth-quarter comeback to survive the first game of its inaugural season as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Down 24-13, the SMU comeback started with 10 minutes left and the Mustangs pinned at their own 10-yard line. On third down and short, Stone connected on a 49-yard pass to Maryland. SMU finished the drive with a Brashard Smith 4-yard touchdown run and a two-point conversion to pull within 24-21.

On Nevada's next possession, SMU defensive lineman Anthony Booker Jr. tackled Nevada quarterback Brendon Lewis in the end zone for a safety to pull the Mustangs within a point with eight minutes left in the game.

SMU began its winning drive on its own 17-yard line with 3:31 left.

The nine play, 83-yard drive ended with Maryland's winning catch. SMU's 6-foot-4 junior tight end and son of former Dallas Cowboys defensive tackle Russell Maryland finished the game with eight receptions for 162 yards.

Stone completed 17 of 30 passes for 254 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

Penalties plagued the Mustangs and forced them to play from behind into the fourth quarter. The Mustangs had 11 penalties for 125 yards, including one unsportsmanlike penalty for spitting that led to an ejection for cornerback Brandon Crossley in the third quarter.

The penalty opened the door for the Wolf Pack to continue a 15-play drive and take a 24-13 lead with 3:23 left in the third.

Lewis led the Wolf Pack in its near upset, completing 14 passes on 26 attempts for 132 yards. He also led the Wolf Pack with 77 rushing yards and found success throughout the game on quarterback draw plays.

Max Brosmer finished 16 of 26 for 191 yards and a touchdown as the Gophers (2-1) averaged 6.66 yards per play and finished with a 386-172 advantage in total vards.

Under pressure much of the game thanks to an overmatched offensive line, Nevada's dual-threat quarterback Brendon Lewis was 15 of 23 for 114 yards with three interceptions and ran 10 times for minus-1 yards. He was sacked

The Wolf Pack (1-3) had eight infractions for 89 yards, including a defensive pass interference inside the 10 and an unsportsmanlike conduct that gave Minnesota a first down when deep inside its own territory. In last week's 20-17 loss to Georgia Southern, Nevada committed 14 penalties for 134 yards.

Following that, Red had a 31-yard run for Nevada, Michael Wortham and Noah Cronquist connected on a 42-yard pass for EWU, and Red wrapped up the scoring with a 3-yard run.

Lewis completed 16 of 22 passes for 193 yards. In addition to Red's 117 yards, Lewis ran for 65, Garwo 63 and Caleb Ramseur 56 among Nevada's total of 320 yards on the ground.

Kekoa Visperas was 15-of-22 passing for 116 yards for the Eagles (1-3). Three quarterbacks combined to go 21 of 30 for 178 yards.



SAN JOSE, Calif. (AP) -- Wide receiver Nick Nash threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to Jabari Bates with 50 seconds to play to help San Jose State beat Nevada 35-31 Saturday night.

Emmett Brown threw two touchdown passes, including a 24-yarder to Nash, before he was replaced by backup Walker Eget. Brown finished 12-of-28 passing for 170 yards and Eget completed 10 of 13 for 141 yards — including a 51-yard pass to Sebastian Macaluso to the 16 that set up the winning TD.

Eget, from the shotgun, threw a lateral pass to Nash on the right side, who threw it back to Bates in the front-left corner of the end zone to cap the scoring.

San Jose State's Floyd Chalk, who scored on a 1-yard run in the first quarter, ran for a 5-yard touchdown late in the third to make it 28-all. Nevada (2-4, 0-1 Mountain West) answered with a 13-play, 67-yard drive that took more than 7 minutes off the clock before it stalled at the 8 and the Wolf Pack settled for a 25-yard field goal by Matthew Killam with about 10 minutes to play.

Brendon Lewis passed for 213 yards and two touchdowns and added 90 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 13 carries for Nevada. Jaden Smith caught both scoring passes from Lewis, and finished the game with six receptions for 89 yards.

Eget came in and the Spartans went three-and-out before the San Jose State defense forced a punt. Brown threw back-to-back incomplete passes to make it third-and-10 before he was once again replaced by Eget, who hit Macaluso for a 14-yard gain for a fresh set of downs and three plays later his deep pass down the middle to Macaluso set up Nash's winning TD pass to Bates.

RENO (AP) -- Savion Red ran for four touchdowns Saturday night, Kitan Crawford returned an interception 57 yards for a touchdown and quarterback Brendon Lewis ran for a 67-yard TD as part of a wild fourth quarter and Nevada held on to beat Oregon State 42-37.

Lewis was 5-of-12 passing for 51 yards but added 151 yards rushing on nine carries and Red finished with 23 carries for 137 yards. Red scored on runs of 33 and 5 yards in the first half and his 7-yard TD run with about 6 minutes left in the third quarter trimmed Nevada's deficit to 24-21.

Michael Coats Jr. intercepted a pass from Gevani McCoy before Red scored on a 6-yard run with 13:37 to go in the fourth quarter to give the Wolfpack a four-point lead. Crawfowd's pick-6 made it 35-24 less than 3 minutes later. Anthony Hankerson ran it in from the 1 and, after the 2-point conversion failed, Oregon State trailed by five with 6:59 to play.

On first-and-15 from the Beavers 33, Lewis pulled the handoff on a jet sweep and raced up the middle for a touchdown that made it 42-30 with 4 minutes remaining but Oregon State again respond-

ed, this time with a 3-yard touchdown pass from McCoy to Trent Walker that capped the scoring with 1:57 left.

Nevada (3-4) went three-and-out on its ensuing possession and the Beavers moved well beyond midfield before Coats picked off pass from McCoy in the end zone as time expired to seal it.

Hankerson finished with 28 carries for 154 yards rushing and three touchdowns for Oregon State (4-2). McCoy was 27-of-42 passing for 348 yards and a touchdown but threw four interceptions.

Keene completed 13 of 20 passes for 190 yards with one interception for Fresno State. Gilliam carried 20 times for 66 yards and caught two passes for 74.
