Emergency Action Plan: Canvas Stadium

In Case of an Emergency:

- 1. Provide immediate care of injured or ill individual, remove patient from the scene for further evaluation if needed
- 2. Activate Emergency Medical System (EMS)
 - a. Call 911
 - b. Provide the following information:
 - Your name
 - Address: Canvas Stadium: 751 W. Pitkin Street, Fort Collins, CO 80521
 - Your telephone number
 - Number of individuals injured; condition; first aid and treatment administered; other information as requested by dispatcher
 - c. *Be the last to hang up*
 - d. Retrieve emergency equipment.
 - e. Direct EMS to scene (if not on site)
 - Open appropriate gates with assistance of security personnel
 - Designate individual(s) to meet EMS and direct to scene
 - Scene control: limit scene to first aid providers and move teammates, coaches, and bystanders away from the area

Venue Directions: Canvas Stadium is located at the intersection of Pitkin and Meridian (see aerial map).

- 1. Stadium field access: From Shields, drive east on Pitkin Street and proceed to the gate at the northeast corner of the field.
- 2. From the south: Drive north on Whitcomb and Meridian until you reach Pitkin and proceed to the gate at the northeast corner of the field.
- 3. Practice field access: From Shields, drive east on Pitkin Street and proceed to the parking lot on the northwest side of the stadium. Drive straight through parking lot to gate opening on northeast side of practice field.

Emergency Communication:

- Certified Athletic Trainer or Team Physician carries cellular telephone
- Additional fixed telephone line in Stadium Athletic Training Facility (970) 491-6127
- Ambulance/EMS services response via 911
- Ambulance/EMS services will be readily available during football games and stationed at the field level in the northeast corner of the stadium.

Emergency Equipment:

- Football Practice field: orange emergency kit (includes AED, helmet and facemask removal tools, digital thermometer, rapid cooling tarp, vital signs equipment), splint kit, spine board, crutches, oxygen, and first aid/biohazard supplies.
- Football Game sideline: orange emergency kit (includes AED, helmet and facemask removal tools, digital thermometer, rapid cooling tarp, vital signs equipment), splint kit, first aid kit, and crutches. EMS team with spine board, additional AED and oxygen will be accessible in the northeast corner of the field.
- Soccer Game sideline: orange emergency kit (includes AED, digital thermometer, rapid cooling tarp, and vital signs equipment), splint kit, first aid kit, oxygen, and crutches.

- Conditioning session: orange emergency kit (including AED, digital thermometer, rapid cooling tarp, and vital signs equipment) and oxygen tank
- Additional equipment is accessible from the Canvas Stadium athletic training facility.

Emergency Personnel: Certified Athletic Trainer(s) (ATC) on site for all practices and all home football and soccer competitions. A Team Physician will also be available on the sidelines for the duration of the football competition. Additional athletic training staff will be available as needed. The Team Physician or Certified Athletic Trainer is responsible for leading emergency care team and responsible for summoning additional emergency medical services (EMS) as needed. Ambulance services will be on site for home football competitions and summoned only by team physician or ATC.

Emergency Transportation (Football Game):

- Med-bed gator with spine board located at the northeast corner of the stadium on field level during the game (EMS crew is in charge of any on-field transport via the med-bed gator).
- Ambulance: located at the Northeast corner of the stadium.
