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MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

WEEK 9 ACTION

Eight Mountain West teams are in action in Week 9, starting with Boise State visiting Nevada on CBSSN on Friday. New Mexico hosts Utah State on the Mountain West Network and Altitude on Saturday, followed by San Diego State at Fresno State on FS1 and Colorado State at Wyoming for the Border War on CBSSN.

BOWL ELIGIBILITY

UNLV is bowl eligible for the third straight season. ... Hawai'i downed Colorado State in Week 8 to become bowl eligible for the first time since 2021. ... With a win over Nevada on Friday, Boise State (5-2) would become bowl eligible for the 28th consecutive season. ... Either Fresno State (5-2) or San Diego State (5-1) will become bowl eligible in Week 9 when they square off. The Bulldogs are looking for their fifth straight bowl bid, while the Aztecs are seeking their first bowl berth since 2022.

MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Five MW players earned spots on *The Associated Press* Midseason All-America football teams, including a pair of first-team selections. Hawai'i senior kicker **Kansei Matsuzawa** and San Diego State senior defensive back **Chris Johnson** earned first-team nods. San José State sophomore wide receiver **Danny Scudero**, Colorado State sophomore linebacker **Owen Long** and UNLV senior defensive back **Aamaris Brown** were named to the second team. The MW's two first-team selections are as many as the other non-autonomous conferences combined, while the Conference's five total selections surpassed the combined total of its peer leagues.

MW SCORING IN BUNCHES

Mountain West teams have combined to average 31.8 points per game in conference play this season, the highest average of any FBS conference.

AZTECS' STIFLING DEFENSE

San Diego State is fifth in the FBS in scoring defense at 12.2 points allowed per game and is ninth nationally in total defense with 259.7 yards allowed per game. The Aztecs have held three opponents to three points or fewer this season, with a pair of shutouts. ... No opposing receiver has recorded 100 or more yards in any of San Diego State's last 23 games, dating back to October 2023. That's the longest such streak in MW history and the longest by any FBS team since Kentucky (28 straight) from 2017 to 2019.

UNLV'S MAGIC NUMBER

UNLV has scored at least 20 points in each of its last 29 regular-season games (excluding MW championship games), marking the second-longest active such streak in the FBS, behind only Memphis (43 straight). The Rebels are 24-5 over that stretch.

NOT HURTING THEMSELVES

San Diego State is one of five FBS teams this season yet to allow points off turnovers.

KINNARD'S RECORD NIGHT

Colorado State's **Javion Kinnard's** 91-yard punt return touchdown against Hawai'i in Week 8 tied for the longest punt return TD in MW history, matching fellow Ram **Robert Ruiz** (Nov. 26, 2016, at San Diego State). Kinnard's return was also a MW freshman record for longest punt return.

ALL-AROUND PRODUCTIVE DAY

Utah State's **Anthony Garcia** became the third player in conference history to have a game with 100-plus receiving yards, 10-plus rushing yards and a completed pass in a Week 8 win over San José State, joining Boise State's **Thomas Sperbeck** (2015) and Wyoming's **Jovon Bouknight** (once in both 2004 and 2005). No FBS player other than Garcia has had such a game over the last nine seasons.

CENTURY-MARK RUSHING STREAKS

The two longest active streaks for games with at least 100 rushing yards by an FBS team are both by Mountain West teams. Air Force has done so in 92 consecutive games and Boise State is on a 45-game run.

SZARKA ON A ROLL

Air Force sophomore **Liam Szarka** has rushed for 100 or more yards in five straight games, the longest active streak in the FBS. It's also the longest 100-yard rush streak by any quarterback in Mountain West history.

RILEY'S EFFICIENT OUTING

Boise State running back **Dylan Riley** rushed for 201 yards on 15 carries against UNLV in Week 8, becoming the fourth player in MW history to rush for at least 200 yards on 15 or fewer carries. San Diego State's **Rashaad Penny** did it twice and New Mexico's **Devon Dampier** and **Teriyon Gipson** did it once each.

INTERCEPTIONS GALORE

Since the beginning of 2022, UNLV's defense has an FBS-best 59 interceptions. Notre Dame is next with 58, followed by Texas with 57 and Michigan with 55. Fresno State and San José State are among a four-way tie for fifth with 53 each.

PLASCENCIA MATCHES MW MARK

San Diego State kicker **Gabe Plascencia** is 10-for-10 on field goals this season and has hit 22 straight dating back to last season, which is the longest active streak in the FBS, the longest streak in program history and tied for the longest streak in MW history with Air Force's **Luke Strebel**, who hit 22 straight from 2015-16.

THE TOKYO TOE

Hawai'i kicker **Kansei Matsuzawa** is currently 20-for-20 on field-goal attempts this year, setting program and MW records for consecutive made field goals to start a season. He has hit 21 in a row dating back to last season, a program record for consecutive makes and one back of the MW mark held by Plascencia and Strebel. He is tied for the second-longest active streak in the FBS.

HOME (BLUE) FIELD ADVANTAGE

Over the last 26 seasons, Boise State is 145-15 (.906) at home. The 15 losses are tied with Oklahoma for the fewest over that time among teams that have been in the FBS every season since 2000. The Broncos have won 16 straight games at Albertsons Stadium, tied with Alabama for the longest active streak in the FBS.

MW AGAINST THE A4 AT HOME

MW teams went 3-1 against A4 opponents at home this season. Hawai'i earned the MW's first A4 win of the 2025 season with its 23-20 win over Stanford in Week 0. UNLV made it 2-0 with a 30-23 win over UCLA in Week 2. San Diego State picked up a third MW home win over an A4 when it throttled California 34-0 in Week 4.

MW AGAINST THE A4, PART II

New Mexico outscored UCLA, 21-0, in the fourth quarter of its 35-10 win in Week 3. The 21 points were the most scored by a Mountain West team in the fourth quarter of a win against an ACC/Big Ten/Big 12/SEC opponent since BYU scored 21 at Virginia in a 38-35 overtime win on Sept. 2, 2000. ... San Diego State's 34-0 victory over Cal in Week 4 was the second-largest shutout win ever by a MW team against an autonomous conference school. The only larger such win was BYU's 59-0 win versus UCLA in 2008.

MW AGAINST THE A4, PART III

MW teams have played 16 autonomous conference opponents in 2025, including three of the four CFP semifinalists from last season (Nevada at Penn State on Aug. 30, San José State at Texas on Sept. 6 and Boise State at Notre Dame on Oct. 4). ... Since 2018, the MW has the best winning percentage over Autonomous 5 teams (30.0) among its peer conferences. MW teams have collected 45 wins over such teams in that span, also the most among its peer conferences (the American is second with 39).

CONSISTENT RECEIVING CORPS

Both Hawai'i and Utah State have had at least one player with five or more receptions in 24 consecutive games, dating back to November 2023. That's the longest active streak in the FBS.

FBS LEADERS

Wyoming shares the FBS lead with four blocked kicks, including two by **Aneesh Vyas**, who shares the individual lead. ... Air Force leads the nation with 20.29 passing yards per completion. ... Hawai'i's **Kansei Matsuzawa**, San Diego State's **Gabe Plascencia** and Utah State's **Tanner Rinker** are among 11 kickers still perfect on field goals this season with Matsuzawa leading the FBS with 20 field goals made, 2.5 field goals made per game and 83 total points scored. ... San José State's **Danny Scudero** leads the FBS with 124.3 receiving yards per game and 870 total receiving yards. ... Colorado State's **Owen Long** leads in tackles (93) and tackles per game (13.3) and Nevada's **Dylan Labarbera** leads in tackles for loss per game with 2.14. ... San Diego State (20-for-20) is one of five FBS programs still perfect in the red zone and one of five without a fumble lost.

MOUNTAIN WEST AVAILABILITY REPORTING

The Mountain West has added player availability reporting for the 2025 season for all regular-season Conference games and the MW Championship Game. The policy standardizes the submission of student-athlete availability information for football contests to protect student-athlete privacy, reduce outside pressure on student-athletes for inside information, ensure transparency, and promote competitive integrity. This policy also addresses public confidence in fair play and the integrity risks associated with sports wagering. Availability reports will be posted publicly at TheMW.com/reports.

MOUNTAIN WEST CREATES LEADERS

Several notable leaders in the sport of football have Mountain West roots.

Rich Clark, Executive Director of the College Football Playoff

- Prior to joining the CFP, Clark spent 38 years in the Air Force, retiring with the rank of Lieutenant General after serving as the Superintendent for the Academy.

Craig Bohl, Executive Director of the AFCA

- Spent 10 years (2014-23) as head coach at Wyoming.

Three current NFL head coaches

- **Kellen Moore** (Boise State/New Orleans Saints), **Kevin O'Connell** (San Diego State/Minnesota Vikings) and **Shane Steichen** (UNLV/Indianapolis Colts) all played in the Mountain West. The MW's three NFL head coaches are the third-most among FBS conferences, behind the Big Ten and SEC.
- **Kevin O'Connell** (Minnesota Vikings) was the 2024 NFL Coach of the Year.

Josh Allen, Buffalo Bills quarterback

- The 2024 NFL MVP played at Wyoming from 2015-17.

MOUNTAIN WEST POINTS OF PRIDE

Now in its 27th season, the Mountain West has been a thought leader in college athletics. It is a league of firsts:

- First conference to play on ESPN Thursday night football.
- The first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.).
- First conference to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system.
- First conference to have a female play in a FBS game.
- First conference to push for a college football playoff beginning in 2009 and then advocated for an expansion of the CFP Playoff field since 2011.
- First conference to propose better access and revenue for the non-automatic-qualifying FBS leagues.
- The first non-automatic-qualifying conference to participate in a BCS bowl game (Utah defeated Pitt in Fiesta Bowl).
- The first non-automatic-qualifying conference to participate in a CFP New Year's bowl game (Boise State defeated Arizona).
- First non-autonomous conference to earn an automatic bid into the 12-team CFP field in 2024 (Boise State earned the No. 3 seed and a bye into the quarterfinals).
- First to broadcast a live football game on Twitter, ahead of even the NFL. Also, the first to stream a live college football bowl game on Facebook.
- First league to allow student-athletes in Joint Council and Board of Director meetings.
- The MW was the first conference to host an eSports event alongside an intercollegiate athletic event.
- First conference with an exclusively Spanish-language television broadcast in FBS football history.
