Thunderbirds Set Sights on Rams in Road FBS Battle

CEDAR CITY, Utah - Southern Utah will hit the road this weekend to take on its lone FBS opponent of the season at Colorado State. The game is scheduled for 5:00 p.m. MT at Canvas Stadium in Fort Collins, Colorado. Fans can watch the game on CBS Sports Network, and live stats are available on the schedule page at suutbirds.com.

The Game

The Thunderbirds are off to a 1-1 start, having pushed No. 2 Montana to the wire in the opener before rallying past rival Weber State 47-42 in the Beehive Bowl.

Coach DeLane Fitzgerald's group now hits the road for its only FBS matchup of the season, traveling to Fort Collins to take on Colorado State. Southern Utah won its last FBS matchup two years ago at UTEP in a 27-24 overtime triumph.

Colorado State enters at 1-0 after a 35-13 win over Wyoming in its opener, behind a strong debut from quarterback Hauss Hejny, who threw for 214 yards and five touchdowns without an interception. The Rams' defense was equally sharp, forcing four turnovers and holding Wyoming under 300 total yards.

Key T-Birds to Watch

Through two games this season, Will Burns has been the engine of the Thunderbirds' offense. The redshirt junior quarterback has accounted for 664 yards of total offense, completing 34 of 52 passes for 397 yards and four touchdowns while adding 267 yards and two scores on 28 carries, including a season-long 75-yard scamper in the win over Weber State. Burns has spread the ball around all season, with Joshua Acord emerging as his top target, the tight end has hauled in 11 passes for 128 yards and three touchdowns, including the 58-yard strike that tied Southern Utah with No. 2 Montana in the opener. Floyd Chalk has also been a weapon out of the backfield, rushing for 183 yards and three touchdowns on 24 carries in the Beehive Bowl alone, part of an SUU rushing attack that has found room to run behind a strong two-game start.

Defensively, Parker Vance has set the tone for the Thunderbirds, racking up 13 tackles, two interceptions, and three pass breakups through the first two weeks, including a game-sealing pick to close out the win over Weber State. Christian Sampson has been right there with him, totaling 11 tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble that set up a Thunderbirds touchdown. Mason Stromstad and Myles Amey have each added pressure in the front seven, combining for 11 tackles, 3 tackles for loss and a sack between them, while the defense as a whole has limited both Montana and Weber State to manageable stretches of offense, helping the Thunderbirds head into their showdown at Colorado State sitting at 1-1 on the season.

Rating the Rams

Hauss Hejny led the Rams offensively in the season opener, putting together an impressive performance against Wyoming. The redshirt freshman quarterback accounted for 253 yards of total offense, completing 23 of 33 passes for 214 yards and five touchdowns without an interception while adding 39 yards on the ground on seven carries. Hejny spread the ball around all afternoon, connecting with Reginald Vick Jr. on three touchdown passes and finding nine different receivers as Colorado State piled up 396 yards of total offense in the win.

Defensively, Jaseim Mitchell and Oumar Diomande paced the Rams with 11 tackles apiece, with Diomande also hauling in an interception. TreShawn Moore added nine tackles, including 1.5 for loss and a sack, while CJ Blocker and Jaylen King each chipped in interceptions of their own as part of a three-pick day for the Colorado State secondary. As a unit, the Rams limited Wyoming to just 273 yards of total offense and forced four turnovers, setting up a lopsided edge in points off turnovers in the 35-13 victory.

Around the Big Sky: Get to know the Teams

Founded in 1963, the Big Sky Conference has built a rich football tradition and has long been regarded as one of the premier conferences in the FCS. The league has produced numerous national championship contenders, All-Americans and NFL players, while its members have consistently been among the nation's strongest programs at the FCS level. Southern Utah returns to the Big Sky in 2026 after a one-year absence, rejoining a conference where the Thunderbirds have a long history of success, including the program's 2011 Big Sky football championship.

The 2026 Big Sky football lineup features 12 programs: Eastern Washington, Idaho, Idaho State, Montana, Montana State, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State, UC Davis, Utah Tech and Southern Utah. From traditional powers Montana and Montana State to longtime rivals and emerging programs, the conference provides a challenging slate from top to bottom.

Preseason Polls

The Big Sky Conference enters the 2026 season with one of the deepest and most competitive football fields in the FCS, and Southern Utah is right in the middle of the preseason championship conversation. Defending FCS National Champion Montana State was selected as the preseason favorite by both the league's coaches and media, followed by Montana and UC Davis. Northern Arizona and Idaho State also earned top-five spots in the coaches poll, setting the stage for a conference race that should be competitive from the opening week through the final Saturday.

Southern Utah enters its return to the Big Sky ranked sixth by the league's coaches and seventh by the media, putting the Thunderbirds firmly in the group of teams expected to compete near the top of the conference. SUU received 82 points in the coaches poll and 273 points from the media, placing the Thunderbirds ahead of Idaho, Eastern Washington, Weber State, Northern Colorado, Cal Poly, Portland State and Utah Tech in the coaches' voting. The ranking reflects the expectations surrounding a Thunderbirds program coming off back-to-back winning seasons and returning to a conference it knows well.

The middle of the conference is where the competitiveness really stands out. Just 18 points separated Southern Utah from eighth-place Eastern Washington in the coaches poll, while only 27 points separated sixth-place Idaho from eighth-place Eastern Washington in the media poll. With several programs clustered closely together, there is little margin for error, and a single win or loss could dramatically change the conference standings throughout the season.

At the top, Montana State enters 2026 as the clear team to beat after going a perfect 8-0 in Big Sky play and winning the FCS National Championship last season. Montana and UC Davis provide additional championship-caliber challenges, while programs such as Northern Arizona, Idaho State and Idaho give the Thunderbirds a difficult road throughout the schedule. For Southern Utah, the return to the Big Sky comes with high expectations and an opportunity to immediately establish itself among the league's top programs.

Top Returners

The Thunderbirds return a strong group of experienced players heading into their return to the Big Sky. Will Burns returns at quarterback after ranking second on the team in both passing and rushing, while Ran Sawyer brings versatility as a runner, receiver and dangerous kick returner. Up front, All-Conference lineman Sirri Kandiyeli and Krush Sowers provide valuable experience following SUU's standout rushing season, while Devin Downing is poised for an increased role at receiver.

Defensively, Parker Andrus gives SUU size and athleticism along the interior defensive line, while Tim Christian, Lincoln Tuioti-Mariner and Jakobi Spence give the Thunderbirds an experienced group in the secondary. All three have shown the ability to make plays and will look to build on their experience and return to full strength in 2026.

Last Time Out: Southern Utah vs Weber State

Thunderbirds Win Wild Beehive Bowl Battle Over Weber State

CEDAR CITY, Utah - The Thunderbirds opened Eccles Coliseum with a rivalry matchup on Saturday. Southern Utah took down the Weber State Wildcats 47-42 to improve to 1-1 on the season. Although both teams are in the Big Sky Conference, the Beehive Bowl was scheduled as a non-conference game before the T-Birds rejoined the Big Sky.

The Thunderbirds and Wildcats traded punches throughout a high-scoring Beehive Bowl, with Southern Utah ultimately coming out on top. SUU struck first on an 11-yard touchdown run from junior quarterback Will Burns, and after Weber State built a 29-20 halftime lead, the Thunderbirds came out firing in the second half. Running back Floyd Chalk opened the half with a 39-yard touchdown run, while Burns connected with tight end Joshua Acord and wide receiver Devin Downing for touchdowns to give SUU a 41-36 lead heading into the fourth quarter.



After Weber State regained the lead early in the fourth, the Thunderbirds answered with a 75-yard, nine-play drive that took 4:40 off the clock and ended with Chalk's 22-yard touchdown run. SUU's defense then held off the Wildcats' final push to secure the 47-42 victory.

1st Quarter:

The Wildcats started with the ball, but Southern Utah's defense forced a punt after a short drive. The Thunderbirds capitalized on the possession, marching down the field and scoring on a seven-yard scamper by quarterback Will Burns. After the teams traded punts, Weber State drove 95 yards in 14 plays to even the score at 7-7.

2nd Quarter:

Southern Utah had the ball to begin the second quarter but quickly had to punt. The punt was blocked and scooped up for a Weber State touchdown, giving the Wildcats a 15-7 lead after a successful fake extra point. The T-Birds answered immediately with a 75-yard touchdown run up the middle. The T-Birds were unsuccessful on the two-point attempt, however, making the score 13-15. Weber State took its next drive 75 yards in 11 plays to extend the lead to 22-13. Southern Utah came back with a 75-yard drive of its own, scoring on a 4-yard rush by Floyd Chalk. Weber State ran a two-minute drill to perfection, scoring on a 16-yard pass with just 20 seconds remaining in the half.

3rd Quarter:

Southern Utah had the ball to open the half and promptly took it down the field, scoring on a 39-yard run by Chalk. The ensuing drive by Weber State ended when Christian Sampson forced a fumble that Tim Christian recovered at the WSU 40-yard line. The T-Birds scored on a 16-yard touchdown pass from Will Burns to Joshua Acord. The Wildcats promptly took the lead back on a five-play, 75-yard drive. The Thunderbirds finished their next drive with a beautiful 16-yard pass from Burns to Devin Downing, who grabbed his first touchdown reception of the season and made the score 41-36. With just over a minute to play in the third, the Wildcats attempted a fake punt deep in their own territory, but the defense was up to the task, stopping the runner short and giving the T-Birds back the ball with a short field.

4th Quarter:

The Wildcats intercepted one of the first plays from scrimmage and returned it deep into the Thunderbirds' territory, scoring on a 24-yard pass the next play. The two-point conversion attempt was unsuccessful, leaving the score at 42-41 in favor of the Wildcats. Southern Utah took the lead back on a 22-yard rush up the middle by Chalk. The two-point conversion attempt was batted down at the line of scrimmage, making the score 47-42. Weber State got the ball back with just under two minutes to play. Parker Vance secured his second interception of the season to seal the game for the Thunderbirds.

Offensive Leaders

The Thunderbirds were led offensively by Floyd Chalk, who turned in a dominant performance on the ground with 183 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 24 carries. Chalk averaged 7.6 yards per carry and broke off a long of 39 yards. Will Burns also provided a major spark in the rushing attack, finishing with 148 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries, including a 75-yard run. Burns added 146 yards and two touchdowns through the air, completing 10 of 18 passes.

Through the air, Joshua Acord led the Thunderbirds with five receptions for 42 yards and a touchdown, while running back Camury Reid added two catches for 25 yards and 30 rushing yards. David Spjut hauled in a 44-yard reception, the longest completion of the game, while Devin Downing added a 16-yard touchdown reception.

Defensive Leaders

Defensively, the Thunderbirds were led by a trio of players who finished with six tackles apiece. Mason Stromstad recorded six tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss, while Parker Vance added six solo tackles, an interception and three pass breakups. Christian Sampson also totaled six tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss, while forcing a fumble.

Myles Amey added four tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack, while also forcing a fumble. Jayden Wells contributed three tackles and a team-best two tackles for loss. Aiden Hall recorded two tackles, including a five-yard sack, while Seni Tuiaki posted five tackles, one tackle for loss, and a quarterback hurry.

Head Coach Delane Fitzgerald

18 Seasons as Head Coach
111-71 Overall, 0-1 BSC
5th Season @ Southern Utah

Coach DeLane Fitzgerald is entering his fifth season at the helm of the Southern Utah football program, leading the Thunderbirds back to the Big Sky Conference in 2026.

In 2025, Fitzgerald guided Southern Utah to a 7-5 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the program's final season in the United Athletic Conference. The Thunderbirds earned ranked victories over No. 13 Abilene Christian and No. 22 Austin Peay while producing the nation's leading FCS rusher for the second consecutive season. Southern Utah also featured finalists for both the Walter Payton Award, presented annually to the nation's top offensive player, and the Buck Buchanan Award, given to the nation's top defensive player. The successful season capped the Thunderbirds' tenure in the UAC before the program's return to the Big Sky Conference.

The 2024 season was another milestone campaign for Fitzgerald and the Thunderbirds. Southern Utah finished 7-5 overall, highlighted by a historic 27-24 victory at UTEP, marking the program's first win over an FBS opponent in more than a decade. Fitzgerald also recorded the 100th victory of his head coaching career during the season, becoming the first head coach in Southern Utah history to reach the milestone.

Fitzgerald brought about a significant turnaround in 2023, leading the Thunderbirds to their first winning season since 2017. Southern Utah finished 6-5 overall and 4-2 in the inaugural season of the United Athletic Conference.

In his first season in Cedar City in 2022, Fitzgerald guided the Thunderbirds to a 5-6 overall record and a 2-3 mark in Western Athletic Conference play while laying the foundation for the program's future success. His first victory at SUU made him the first coach in College Football to earn a win at every level.

Fitzgerald arrived at Southern Utah in December 2021 after more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience, including 13 seasons as a head coach with a reputation for rebuilding programs and establishing winning cultures. He came to Cedar City after an eight-year run as the head coach at Frostburg State University.

During his tenure at Frostburg State, Fitzgerald transformed the Bobcats into one of the nation's premier Division III and Division II programs. After inheriting a team that had endured eight consecutive losing seasons and won just 18 games over the previous eight years, he posted a 4-6 record in his first season before leading Frostburg to winning seasons every year thereafter, including four campaigns with at least 10 victories.

Fitzgerald guided Frostburg State to New Jersey Athletic Conference championships in 2016 and 2018 while leading the Bobcats to NCAA Division III Playoff appearances in 2017 and 2018. The program also captured a Division III bowl victory in 2016. Following the 2018 season, Fitzgerald successfully led Frostburg's transition to NCAA Division II competition, culminating in a Mountain East Conference championship and a 10-1 record in 2021.

In 2023, Fitzgerald was inducted into the Frostburg State Hall of Fame. He remains the winningest coach in program history, holding both the school records for career victories and winning percentage. During his tenure, he was named conference Coach of the Year three times, coached eight All-Americans, and won the final three Regents Cup rivalry games.

Before his success at Frostburg State, Fitzgerald spent five seasons as the head coach at Southern Virginia University. After inheriting a program that went 3-8 in his first year, he improved the Knights each season, culminating in an 8-2 record and the No. 1 ranking in the USCAA Coaches Poll in 2013.

Prior to becoming Southern Virginia's head coach in 2009, Fitzgerald served three seasons as the school's offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. Before arriving at Southern Virginia, he spent one season as offensive coordinator at Bethel College in Tennessee and two seasons as special teams coordinator at UT Martin.

A native of Virginia, Fitzgerald played at Potomac State College before transferring to James Madison University, where he finished his collegiate career as a fullback. After helping the Dukes capture the Atlantic 10 Conference championship in 1999, he began his coaching career at Bridgton Academy in Maine in 2000 before returning to James Madison as a defensive assistant in 2002.

Fitzgerald holds a master's degree in education from Bethel College, a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from James Madison University, and an associate degree in physical education from Potomac State College.

Passing Game Coordinator Shay McClure 5th Season at Southern Utah

The Southern Utah University football program and Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald announced the addition of Shay McClure as the team's linebackers coach and Special Teams Coordinator in June of 2022. McClure was elevated to Defensive Coordinator during the 2025 season, taking over leadership of the Thunderbird defense.

In 2025, McClure helped guide Southern Utah to a 7-5 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the program's final season in the United Athletic Conference. After taking over as defensive coordinator midseason, McClure helped lead the Thunderbirds to ranked victories over No. 13 Abilene Christian and No. 22 Austin Peay. The Thunderbirds also featured a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, presented annually to the nation's top defensive player.

The 2024 season saw McClure help Southern Utah post a 7-5 record and earn a historic 27-24 victory at UTEP, marking the program's first win over an FBS opponent in more than a decade. In 2023, two of McClure's linebackers earned postseason accolades as the Thunderbirds finished 6-5 overall and 4-2 in UAC play. His first season at SUU in 2022 saw the Thunderbirds finish 5-6, while punter Jake Gerardi earned First Team All-WAC honors and later became an All-American.

McClure brings more than 25 years of college coaching experience to Southern Utah. Prior to joining the Thunderbirds, he served as defensive coordinator at Southwest Minnesota State and previously held defensive coordinator and head coaching positions at Dixie State, Humboldt State, Southern Oregon and Occidental College. As head coach at Dixie State from 2016-18, McClure led the Trailblazers to an 18-15 record and their first two winning seasons as a four-year program.

McClure began his coaching career at Southern Oregon, where he also played collegiately. He holds a bachelor's degree in physical education and a master's degree in interdisciplinary studies from Southern Oregon University.

Running Game Coordinator John Kelling 5th Season at Southern Utah



John Kelling joined the Southern Utah football staff in January 2022 and has played a key role in the program's growth under Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald. Over his first four seasons, Kelling helped guide the Thunderbirds to a 25-21 overall record and a 16-6 mark in United Athletic Conference play. In 2024, Kelling helped lead the T-Birds to a 7-5 (6-2) season, finishing tied for second in the UAC.

Ahead of the 2025 season, Kelling shifted his coaching focus to the linebacker corps, bringing a wealth of experience to the position. He helped the Thunderbirds post another 7-5 season and a 6-2 record in the UAC, earning ranked victories over No. 13 Abilene Christian and No. 22 Austin Peay in the program's final season in the conference.

Prior to arriving in Cedar City, Kelling served as the head coach at Lock Haven University beginning in January 2020. Before his time at LHU, he was the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Frostburg State University, where he worked alongside Coach Fitzgerald. The pair originally connected in Maryland after Kelling spent two seasons coaching at the University of Mary in North Dakota in multiple roles.

Kelling's coaching résumé includes an eight-year stint (2004–2011) at the University of North Dakota, where he began by mentoring defensive backs before being promoted to co-defensive coordinator in 2006. During that tenure, he coached against Southern Utah several times.

He began his coaching career at his alma mater, Minnesota State Mankato (1991–1995), and also spent time at Augustana College in South Dakota.

As a player, Kelling earned national recognition as Football Gazette's Division II National Defensive Player of the Year in 1991. He holds a bachelor's degree from MSU Mankato and a master's degree in recreation and sports science from Ohio University.



Passing Game Coordinator Will Brunson

5th Season at Southern Utah

Brunson joined Southern Utah's coaching staff in January 2022, arriving from Frostburg State, where he had experience as both a player and coach. He played quarterback for the Bobcats in 2019, throwing for 2,067 yards and 18 touchdowns while adding three rushing scores. Before that, he spent three seasons at the University at Albany (NCAA Division I), where he threw for 2,334 yards and 10 touchdowns. Following his playing career, Brunson began coaching under current SUU Head Coach DeLane Fitzgerald, working with the offensive line at Frostburg.

In his first season at Southern Utah in 2022, Brunson helped the Thunderbirds to a 5-6 overall record and a 2-3 mark in Western Athletic Conference play.

In 2023, he coached the tight ends and played a key role in Southern Utah's 6-5 campaign, which included a 4-2 finish in United Athletic Conference play and a tie for second place in the standings.

Ahead of the 2024 season, Brunson was promoted to Passing Game Coordinator and Co-Offensive Coordinator. That fall, he helped lead the Thunderbirds to a 7-5 overall record and a 6-2 mark in UAC play, highlighted by a historic 27-24 victory at UTEP, Southern Utah's first win over an FBS opponent in more than a decade.

In 2025, Brunson continued to play a key role in the Thunderbirds' offensive success, helping Southern Utah post a 7-5 overall record and a 6-2 mark in its final season in the UAC. The Thunderbirds earned ranked victories over No. 13 Abilene Christian and No. 22 Austin Peay while producing the nation's leading FCS rusher for the second consecutive season. Southern Utah also featured finalists for both the Walter Payton Award and Buck Buchanan Award.

Running Game Coordinator Ron Hudson

1st Season at Southern Utah



Ron Hudson begins his first season at Southern Utah as offensive line coach, bringing more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience. He served as head coach at New Mexico Highlands and previously coached the offensive line at Georgia Southern, where his units powered one of the nation's top rushing attacks and a 10-win season with a bowl victory.

Hudson has coached at multiple Division I programs, including Penn State, Nevada, Louisiana, and New Mexico, developing NFL talent and consistently producing dominant run games. His offensive lines have earned all-conference honors and helped teams rank among the nation's best in rushing offense and protection.

A Columbus, Ohio native, Hudson began his coaching career in 1991 and has built a reputation for developing physical, disciplined offensive lines throughout his career.
