OPENING DRIVE

- UTSA and Colorado State will meet for the fourth time on Saturday in front of a national television audience on ESPN.
- The Rams lead the series, 2-1, including a 33-31 win in the only previous matchup at the Alamodome on Sept. 26, 2015.
- The Roadrunners held on for a 17-16 victory in the last meeting on Sept. 20, 2025, in Fort Collins.
- UTSA Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics Lisa Campos is a Colorado State graduate.
- The Roadrunners are 4-7 all time and 2-0 under head coach Jeff Traylor in games that start at 11 a.m. local time.
- UTSA is 55-27 (.671) since 2020 under head coach Jeff Traylor, the most wins among current American Conference teams and tied for the 11th most among FBS programs as well as the second most among teams from the state of Texas during that timeframe.
- The Roadrunners are 34-5 (.872) at the Alamodome in the Jeff Traylor era, tied for the most home victories among both current American Conference members and state of Texas teams, and tied for the ninth most home wins among FBS programs dating back to 2020.
- UTSA is 18-8 following a loss under Jeff Traylor.
- The Roadrunners held No. 1 Texas to a season-low 172 passing yards last Saturday night.
- UTSA linebacker Brandon Tucker Jr. has registered double digit tackles in back-to-back games with 11 versus No. 1 Texas and 13 in the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State on Sept. 12.

SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA will close out the nonconference slate against Colorado State on Saturday, Sept. 26. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. at the Alamodome and the game will be televised nationally on ESPNU. The Roadrunners (2-1) and Rams (2-1) will meet for the fourth time with CSU owning a 2-1 edge in the all-time series. Both teams are coming off setbacks to nationally ranked teams with UTSA falling on the road to No. 1 Texas, 30-6, and CSU dropping a 41-23 home decision to then No. 11-ranked BYU. The Roadrunners are 18-8 following a loss under seventh-year head coach Jeff Traylor. Saturday will mark UTSA's annual Hispanic Heritage Game and it is presented by H-E-B.

TUNING IN

Saturday's game will be televised nationally on ESPNU and it will be available via the ESPN app. Mike Corey (play-by-play) and Craig Haubert (analyst) will call the action. UTSA Sports Media Network will air the game live in the San Antonio area on Sports Radio AM 760 The Ticket, online at ticket760.com and via the free iHeartRadio app. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Ed Suarez (reporter) have the call. There will be a two-hour pregame show hosted by Pat Evans and a 45-minute postgame show.

HOME SWEET DOME

UTSA has been tough to beat at the Alamodome during the Jeff Traylor era, boasting a 34-5 (.872) record at the facility dating back to the 2020 season. The 34 home wins are tied for the most among both current American Conference members and teams from the state of Texas. The Roadrunners are deadlocked with seven other teams for the ninth most home victories in the FBS during that span and their .872 winning percentage is tops among that group. The Roadrunners have been victorious in 22 of their last 25 home contests and are 60-32 (.652) all-time in the Alamodome.

EARLY KICKS

With Saturday's kickoff versus Colorado State scheduled for 11 a.m. at the Alamodome, UTSA will be competing in a game that begins at noon or earlier local time for the first time this season. The Roadrunners are 4-7 all time in games that start at 11 a.m. local time and 7-11 in contests that start at noon or earlier. Over the last two seasons, UTSA played four games that began at noon or earlier. The Roadrunners downed Charlotte, 28-7, on the road on Nov. 15, 2025, in a game that kicked off at noon Eastern time. In 2024, UTSA defeated No. 25 Memphis 44-36 on Nov. 2 in a home contest that began at 11 a.m., dropped a 29-24 heartbreaker to No. 22 Army on Nov. 30 in a game that kicked off at noon ET in West Point, New York, and then beat Coastal Carolina 44-15 in the 2024 Myrtle Beach Bowl with an 11 a.m. ET start time in Conway, South Carolina.

PACKING THE DOME

UTSA fans have packed the Alamodome over the past half decade, as six of the program's 10 largest home crowds have been recorded during that span. The 2026 home schedule got underway with a crowd of 33,403 taking in UTSA's 45-16 victory over UTRGV on Sept. 5. The Roadrunners drew 45,778 fans for the 2025 home opener against Texas State, marking the third-largest attendance for a UTSA game at the Alamodome. In fact, the top four and six of the top 10 Alamodome crowds have come in home openers. Since the return from COVID-19 protocols for the 2021 season, 868,101 fans have filed into the Alamodome to watch the Roadrunners, an average of 26,306 per contest. In the 2024 season opener against Kennesaw State, the program eclipsed the two-million fan mark, and now 2,294,354 spectators have watched the Roadrunners at the Alamodome, an average of 24,939 over 92 home contests. UTSA set NCAA modern startup program records in its first season by drawing 56,743 fans to the inaugural game against Northeastern State on Sept. 3, 2011, and by averaging 35,521 fans for six home contests.

LAST TIME OUT

Brandon Tucker Jr. posted a game-high 11 tackles, but No. 1 Texas used a balanced offense and stingy defense to beat UTSA, 30-6, on Sept. 19 in front of 103,753 fans at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. The Roadrunners' first setback of the season dropped their record to 2-1, while the Longhorns improved to 3-0 after pulling away in a contest controlled by the defenses. Tucker had a sack, 1.5 tackles for loss and a quarterback hurry to pace a UTSA defense that held the top-ranked Longhorns to a season-low 172 passing yards. Eze Osondu added eight stops, James Walley Jr. pitched in with seven including a TFL and Owen Pewee logged six tackles, a hurry and a forced fumble. The Roadrunners limited Texas quarterback Arch Manning to 164 yards on 17 completions and held running back Hollywood Smothers to 54 rushing yards. Michael Petro drilled field goals of 34 and 43 yards to provide the scoring for UTSA.

WIN NO. 100

UTSA notched win No. 100 for the program with the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State on Sept. 12. Now in their 16th season of football, the Roadrunners own an all-time record of 100-88 (.532) with more than half (55) of the wins coming under the direction of seventh-year head coach Jeff Traylor, the winningest and longest-tenured head coach in program history.

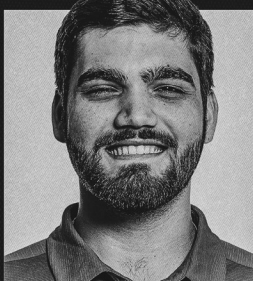
SWEET SIXTEEN

The Roadrunners is in its 16th season of football this year. UTSA started its program from scratch and, following a practice year in 2010, played its first season as an FCS Independent in 2011 before joining the Western Athletic Conference for the 2012 campaign. UTSA moved into Conference USA in 2013 and became a full-fledged FBS member starting with the 2014 season. The Roadrunners set NCAA modern startup program records in 2011 by drawing 56,743 fans to their inaugural game against Northeastern State and by averaging 35,521 fans for their six home contests that season. UTSA made its first postseason appearance at the 2016 New Mexico Bowl in its sixth season of play. The Roadrunners made history in 2021 by capturing their first conference championship with a 49-42 decision against WKU and capping a 12-2 ledger with their third bowl game. They repeated as league champions with a 48-27 win over North Texas in 2022 and made their third straight and fourth overall bowl appearance, ending the year with an 11-3 mark. In 2023, the Roadrunners notched their first bowl victory with a 35-17 decision over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl to cap a 9-4 ledger that include a 7-1 mark in their debut in the American. The 2024 campaign saw UTSA win four of its last five games, starting with a 44-36 victory over No. 25 Memphis for the program's first-ever top-25 win and ending with a second straight bowl victory, a 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl, to finish at 7-6 overall. The Roadrunners capped a seven-win season in 2025 with a 57-20 rout of FIU in the First Responder Bowl, and they now have registered at least six wins in 10 of the 15 seasons in program history and reached the seven-win plateau eight times, including in each of the first six years of the Jeff Traylor era.

UTSA IN FOURTH SEASON IN AMERICAN CONFERENCE

UTSA is in its fourth season as a member of the American Conference and seventh year under the direction of head coach Jeff Traylor. The Roadrunners welcome back 49 members of last year's team that capped a second straight seven-win campaign with a 57-20 victory over FIU in the First Responder Bowl, their third consecutive bowl win. UTSA lists 10 returning starters with six on offense, two on defense and a pair of specialists.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

UTSA's 12-game regular season schedule features four non-conference games and eight American Conference contests. The Roadrunners kicked off the campaign on Sept. 5 with a 45-16 home triumph over UTRGV, which played its inaugural season of football in 2025 as a member of the Southland Conference. UTSA played back-to-back road games at Texas State and Texas and will close out the non-league slate at home against Colorado State on Sept. 26. The Roadrunners have home conference games scheduled against South Florida (Oct. 8), Navy (Oct. 17), North Texas (Nov. 14) and Tulsa (Nov. 27 or 28), while they will travel to Rice (Oct. 3), Tulane (Oct. 24), Florida Atlantic (Nov. 5) and UAB (Nov. 21). The American Conference Championship Game will be played Dec. 5.

STAYING IN STATE

The Roadrunners will be staying close to home for the majority of the 2026 schedule. UTSA is slated to play its first seven games in the state of Texas, not leaving the Lone Star State until the Oct. 24 contest at Tulane in New Orleans, Louisiana. The Roadrunners have two more home games after that, giving them nine total regular season matchups inside their home state. In addition to the game in New Orleans, UTSA also will visit the states of Alabama (UAB) and Florida (Florida Atlantic) this fall.

THE TRAYLOR ERA

Seventh-year head coach Jeff Traylor has taken UTSA to new heights during his time in San Antonio. The Roadrunners are 55-27 (.671) under his direction, the most wins since 2020 among current American Conference teams and tied for both the 11th most among FBS programs and second most among teams from the state of Texas. Traylor also has helped turn the Alamodome into one of the toughest places for visiting teams to play, as the Roadrunners are 34-5 (.872) at the Alamodome since 2020. UTSA's 34 home victories during that span are tied for the ninth most among FBS programs and they are tied for the most among both current American Conference members and state of Texas teams. Since Traylor took over the program, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned six straight bowl berths with three consecutive bowl wins and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. A 2025 inductee into both the Texas High School Coaches Association Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame, he has coached 10 All-Americans, three national award finalists, 97 all-conference selections and a trio of NFL Draft picks at UTSA.

SCOUTING COLORADO STATE

The Rams fell to 2-1 on the year after dropping a 41-23 decision to No. 11 BYU at home last Saturday night. Colorado State opened the campaign with victories over Wyoming (35-13) and Southern Utah (58-24). The Rams are averaging 38.7 points and 458.7 yards per game while allowing 26.0 points and 424.7 yards per contest. Quarterback Hauss Hejny has completed 47 of 73 passes for 619 yards and 10 touchdowns against one interception and he has also rushed for 128 yards and a score. Mel Brown is the top rusher with 256 yards and a pair of TDs, while the top pass catcher is Reginald Vick Jr. with 14 receptions for 175 yards and four touchdowns. Defensively, TreShawn Moore paces the Rams with 25 total tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss, while CJ Blocker has three interceptions. Head coach Jim Mora is in his first season at the helm, and he owns a 75-54 career record as a collegiate head coach and a 31-33 mark as an NFL head coach of the Falcons (2004-06) and Seahawks (2009).

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday will mark the fourth meeting on the gridiron between UTSA and Colorado State. The Rams lead the series, 2-1, with a 33-31 victory on Sept. 26, 2015, in San Antonio and a 23-14 decision the following September in Fort Collins. The Roadrunners held on for a 17-16 road triumph in the last meeting on Sept. 20, 2025. The three previous meetings have been decided by a combined 12 points.

though, as Jackson Brousseau spearheaded a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a TD pass to Rocky Beers with 29 seconds remaining. Initially, CSU tied the score with a successful extra-point attempt by Isaiah Hankins. However, UTSA was called for offsides on the try and the Rams decided to accept the penalty and go for a potential game-winning two-point conversion. Another Rams quarterback, Tahj Bullock, entered the game and rolled to his right, but his pass sailed incomplete out of bounds due to tight coverage from the Roadrunners. The ensuing onside kick went out of bounds and UTSA ran out the clock to claim victory in the series for the first time in three meetings.

WHO'S COUNTING?

Now in their 16th season of play, the Roadrunners will play the 189th game in program history on Saturday when they face Colorado State. UTSA is 100-88 (.532) all-time and 60-32 (.652) in home games. By comparison, Colorado State first played a football game in 1893 and owns an all-time record of 552-632-33.

CAMPOS CONNECTIONS TO CSU

UTSA Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics Lisa Campos earned both her bachelor's (1999) and master's (2001) degrees from Colorado State. She is a native of Las Animas, Colorado.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

UTSA is no stranger to close contests in the Jeff Traylor era, as 43 of the 82 have been one-score ballgames in the fourth quarter. The Roadrunners own a 27-16 record (.628) in those games. Dating back to the 2021 campaign, UTSA has seen 30 of the last 61 contests decided in the fourth quarter or later. Since 2020, the Roadrunners are 21-13 (.618) in games decided by eight points or less.

HIGH-SCORING ROADRUNNERS

UTSA has emerged as one of the top scoring offenses in the FBS annually under head coach Jeff Traylor. UTSA has scored 20-plus points in 23 of the last 26 games and in 65 of the last 74 contests dating back to the 2020 campaign. The Roadrunners have reached the 40-point plateau in 11 of their last 22 games, including in the 2026 season opener and five times in 2025, headlined by a school-record 61 points in the victory versus Rice on Oct. 11 and capped with a 57-point explosion in the First Responder Bowl victory over FIU. UTSA has tallied 2,759 points in 82 games under head coach Jeff Traylor, good for an average of 33.6 points per game. Last year, UTSA scored 462 points in 13 games, good for an average of 35.5 points per game to rank third in the American Conference and 14th in the FBS. Both marks stand third on the program's all-time list. In fact, the top five season point totals all have come during the Jeff Traylor era.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

The Jeff Traylor era has produced the most productive offenses in UTSA history. The Roadrunners have registered the top five and six of the top seven single-season yardage totals since Traylor arrived for the 2020 campaign. Additionally, the top six rushing seasons and top five passing campaigns have occurred under Traylor's watch. UTSA also has set program standards for single-game output during his tenure. Nine of the top 10 games for both total yards and passing yards, as well as five of the top nine outings for rushing yards have happened in the Traylor era.

BORN TO PLAY QB

UTSA redshirt senior Owen McCown was born to play quarterback. The lefthander is the son of current Minnesota Vikings quarterbacks coach Josh McCown, who was a third-round draft pick in 2002 and played 18 seasons in the NFL after a collegiate career at SMU and Sam Houston. Two of his uncles also played the position. Luke McCown starred at Louisiana Tech before he was selected in the fourth round of the 2004 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 12-year NFL career. Randy McCown played quarterback at Texas A&M from 1996 to 1999, helping the Aggies to the 1998 Big 12 Conference Championship. Those three McCown brothers all played for UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor when he was an assistant coach at Jacksonville High School in the 1990s. Owen's younger brother, Aiden, also plays the position and is the starter under center at Lamar. The starting QB in each of the past 30 games dating back to the 2023 Frisco Bowl win, Owen has piled up 7,420 passing yards, 63 passing touchdowns, a .660 completion percentage and a 142.9 passing

efficiency rating — all of which stand second on the program's career charts. He started this season with a bang, completing 22 of 27 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns in the 45-16 season-opening victory over UTRGV. He registered an 81-percent completion percentage and 203.7 pass efficiency rating en route to earning American Conference Honorable Mention Player of the Week recognition. He followed that showing with a 214-yard output through the air against Texas State, guiding the Roadrunners to a game-winning drive in the final minutes that included a 6-yard keeper on fourth down in their own territory to keep the possession alive. The Rusk High School product is coming off a junior campaign that saw him complete 277 of 410 passes for 2,995 yards and 30 touchdowns, good for a 67.6 completion percentage and a 149.7 passing efficiency rating. Including his true freshman year at Colorado in 2022, McCown boasts 33 career starts, the most among QBs from a non-power conference. He appears on seven different watch lists this season: Davey O'Brien Award, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award, Maxwell Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year and Shriners Children's 1000.

MR. VERSATILITY

Redshirt sophomore David Amador II is UTSA's Mr. Versatility. Not only is he one of the team's top wide receivers, but he also has rush attempts, punt returns and a pair of passing touchdowns to his name. A member of watch lists for the Paul Hornung Award, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and Shriners Children's 1000, he owns 96 receptions, 976 yards and six touchdowns to go with 62 rushing yards on seven carries (8.9 ypc) in 32 career contests. In fact, he is riding a stretch of at least one reception in 22 consecutive contests. Amador, who has 14 career punt returns for 87 yards with a long of 20, tossed a 44-yard touchdown pass to Mekhi Anderson in the third quarter of UTSA's 31-26 comeback win at Texas State on Sept. 12, making him a perfect 4 for 4 for three TDs through the air as a Roadrunner. He recorded his first career touchdown pass in the 48-26 win over Tulane last October with a 21-yard toss. In that victory against the Green Wave, he logged his third career 100-yard game with 113 yards and two TDs on 10 receptions, and he was named to the honorable mention player of the week lists for the Paul Hornung Award, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and American Conference. A product of perennial power Galena Park North Shore High School, he completed a 4-yard TD pass in the 2025 regular season finale versus Army and a 27-yard pass in the 44-36 win over No. 25 Memphis in 2024.

HENDERSON A HOME RUN THREAT

UTSA running back Will Henderson III picked up where he left off from his 2025 breakout season, logging his fourth career 100-yard rushing game in the 45-16 triumph over UTRGV in the opener on Sept. 5. A speedster from Gilmer, Texas, which is the hometown of UTSA head coach Jeff Traylor, Henderson displayed his home-run threat and big-play ability midway through the second quarter, breaking loose through a big hole for a 75-yard touchdown dash as part of a 101-yard output on only nine carries (11.0 avg.). He piled up 80 yards on 14 attempts in the 31-26 win at Texas State and now has 219 yards and a TD on 33 totes (6.6 avg.). Last fall, he produced 13 plays of 20-plus yards including five that covered at least 40 yards. Overall, he rushed for 866 yards and six touchdowns on 125 carries, good for a school-record average of 6.93 yards per attempt. Despite playing behind 1,000-yard rusher and honorable mention All-American Robert Henry Jr., he still flirted with Sincere McCormick's program standard for freshmen of 983 rushing yards set in 2019. Henderson also caught 19 passes for 132 yards and a pair of TDs last fall, including a 40-yard dash on a shovel pass in the 57-20 rout of FIU in the First Responder Bowl. He turned in three 100-yard games on the ground during his redshirt freshman campaign, headlined by a 185-yard outburst in the 28-7 road triumph over Charlotte that ranks as the sixth-most rushing yards in a game by a Roadrunner. He also topped the century mark with 146 in the 58-24 victory against East Carolina and with 115 in the 61-13 win against Rice. Including his true freshman year, the former high school state champion sprinter has rushed for 1,179 yards and eight scores on 172 totes (6.9 avg.) and caught 29 passes for 179 yards and two TDs during his career.

BIG PLAY AJ

UTSA wide receiver AJ Wilson has shown a knack for delivering big plays during his time with the Roadrunners. A transfer from Houston Christian prior to the 2025 campaign, he opened 2026 by turning in UTSA's first score of the season on a 36-yard touchdown reception in the 45-16 win over UTRGV. He had a career-high nine receptions for 83 yards with a long of 28 yards in the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State and another grab versus No. 1 Texas to give him 12 catches for 133 yards this season. Last year, he logged eight plays of 20-or-more yards including a pair that went for 50-plus. He hauled in a 34-yard touchdown pass for his first score as a Roadrunner against nationally ranked Texas A&M and he later charted UTSA's first 100-yard receiving game of 2025 with 104 yards on five grabs in the 48-20 triumph over UIW, highlighted by a 77-yard receiving TD. A former prep quarterback at Huntsville High School, he made three grabs for 67 yards at Temple with a long of 36 yards before catching passes of 57 and 20 yards, the latter resulting in a touchdown, in the 61-13 victory against Rice. He piled up 87 yards on five receptions including catches of 22 and 43 yards in the 28-7 win at Charlotte and finished the season with 528 yards and four TDs on 31 receptions. He averaged 17.03 yards per catch, which places him fourth on the program's single-season list. He now has 1,1709 yards and 14 scores on 84 receptions for his collegiate career that includes 25 games at HCU.

DJ TOPS CENTURY MARK

UTSA wide receiver DJ Allen Jr. exploded for his first career 100-yard receiving game in the season-opening victory against UTRGV on Sept. 5. The Gladewater, Texas, native needed only three receptions to pile up 116 yards, more than doubling his previous career high of 53 yards versus Rice last October. A transfer from TCU prior to the 2024 campaign, he hauled in a 36-yard pass to set up a field goal late in the first half and then had an 18-yard reception early in the fourth quarter before turning a short pass into a 62-yard dash down the left sideline to paydirt that gave UTSA a 38-6 advantage. After catching five balls for 24 yards in the win at Texas State and a pair versus No. 1 Texas, Allen now has caught 41 passes for 505 yards and five TDs in 21 games as a Roadrunner.

WELCOME BACK, B HIGH

UTSA running back Brandon High Jr. is making the most of his second stint with the Roadrunners. A product of Grand Oaks High School near Houston, he began his career at UTSA in 2023 and broke out in 2024 with 495 rushing yards and a team-high eight touchdowns. He then transferred to California for the 2025 campaign, posting 98 yards and a TD over five appearances for the Golden Bears. High transferred back to UTSA prior to 2026 spring practice and has been part of a potent three-man rotation in the backfield. In the season-opening win against UTRGV, he averaged 5.6 yards per attempt en route to a 45-yard output. He upped that average to 5.9 yards per carry in the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State on Sept. 12, as his 25-yard burst off right tackle to the end zone with 14 seconds remaining put the Roadrunners ahead for good.

AP BREAKS FREE

UTSA running back A'Marion Peterson nearly logged his first career 100-yard game on the ground in the 45-16 season-opening triumph over UTRGV. The Wichita Falls, Texas, native needed only eight carries to amass 96 yards and a score, averaging 12.0 yards per tote. Late in the fourth quarter, he took a handoff up the middle and then showed his patience, bouncing it outside and racing 53 yards to the end zone for his fourth touchdown as a Roadrunner. A transfer from USC prior to the 2025 campaign, he carried 49 times for 177 yards and three TDs in his UTSA debut season after rushing for 79 yards and a score over 12 contests with the Trojans.

EXPERIENCE UP FRONT

UTSA boasts an experienced offensive line with a combined 234 games played and 93 starts, including 79 at the FBS level. Leading the way in appearances is Deandre Marshall, who has 44 games with 10 starts under his belt. Luke Lapeze has played in 40 contests and earned 15 starts, while Darrell Jones

owns 31 games and a team-high 28 starts with 15 and 14, respectively, at UTSA. Ben Rios has made 22 starts in 31 career contests and Jaylen Garth has started 15 of his 29 career games. Jonah Miller has appeared in 15 games and Jarrett Henry has played in 14, while Davion Hurth and Devron Williams have seen the field in 11 and 10 contests, respectively. While the group is experienced, redshirt freshman A'marion Breland has earned the start at left tackle in each of his first three appearances this season.

APPLYING THE PRESSURE

The Roadrunners have developed a reputation for fielding a pressure defense since head coach Jeff Traylor arrived in 2020. Under the direction of defensive coordinator Jess Loepp since the 2021 campaign, UTSA has logged the top three and six of the top nine season totals for sacks, as well as six of the top seven season tallies for tackles for loss. Additionally, the Roadrunners have registered 10 of the top 11 single-game totals for both sacks and TFLs in the Jeff Traylor era.

SACK ATTACK

UTSA has racked up the stops behind the line of scrimmage during the Jeff Traylor era. Since 2020, the Roadrunners have tallied 567 tackles for loss, including 197 sacks. In fact, the Roadrunners have logged a sack in 37 of their last 39 contests dating back to early in the 2023 campaign. Over the past three-plus seasons (42 games), the Roadrunners have recorded 302 TFLs (7.2/game) and 114 sacks (2.7/game).

TURNING THEM OVER

UTSA's defense has a knack for forcing turnovers in the Jeff Traylor era, especially across the past three-plus seasons. Dating back to 2023, the Roadrunners have recorded a takeaway in 33 of their last 39 games. UTSA came up with a pair of interceptions in the 2026 season-opening win over UTRGV, as Ahamad Chapman had a 49-yard return for a TD and Nate Robinson Jr. registered his first pick as a Roadrunner. In the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State on Sept. 12, the Roadrunners tallied three takeaways with interceptions by Zach Morris and Cameron Upshaw Jr. and a fumble recovery by Xavier Walton. That marked the third consecutive contest with two picks dating back to the 2025 First Responder Bowl win over FIU. Last fall, UTSA gained 18 turnovers, 11 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries. The Roadrunners also scored three defensive touchdowns, the 10th most in the FBS, and a safety in 2025. In 2024, UTSA created a takeaway in all 13 contests, coming up with 22 overall with an even split of 11 interceptions and 11 fumble recoveries. Despite not coming up with a takeaway over the first three games in 2023, the Roadrunners ended up with 17 for the year. In 2022, UTSA registered 22 including a program-record 15 interceptions, while the 2021 squad forced 26 turnovers, the second most in school history.

EXPERIENCE IN THE TRENCHES

UTSA features an experienced defensive line position room this season with five players owning at least 30 career appearances. Tai Leonard paces the unit with 42, including 13 starts, as the Galena Park North Shore high School product has piled up 47 total tackles, six tackles for loss and a pair of sacks as a Roadrunner. Jeremiah Bailey logged 38 games and started 24 across four seasons at Eastern Kentucky and now has appeared in 41 games overall, racking up 111 total tackles, 14 TFLs and six sacks. Jameian Buxton boasts 39 games and six starts on the interior, and the New Orleans native has registered 37 stops, including 2.5 TFLs and a sack. Jusiah Sampleton logged 16 starts among 33 career appearances at CSU-Pueblo before transferring to UTSA this year. The Giddings, Texas, native has produced 75 tackles, 12 TFLs and 1.5 sacks as a collegian. Drenon Fite III also joined the Roadrunners in 2026 after making 39 appearances and a pair of starts at Louisiana. The Tatum, Texas, native has 34 tackles, two TFLs and a sack, including five stops and a half-TFL in his first three games at UTSA.

TUCKER PILING UP THE TACKLES

UTSA linebacker Brandon Tucker has been piling up the tackles since setting foot on the gridiron as a collegian. The DeSoto High School product and consensus All-American at East Texas A&M (formerly Texas A&M-Commerce) has racked up 235 stops during his collegiate career, including 68 in 16 contests with the Roadrunners. He joined UTSA prior to the 2025 season and finished last season with 39 stops, including 25 unassisted and three behind the line of scrimmage. This year, he leads UTSA with 29 total tackles and 13 solo stops through the first three games. After turning in five tackles in the season-opening win against UTRGV, he has logged back-to-back contests with double-digit stops. He posted a team-high 13 tackles in the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State, the most in a game by a Roadrunner since Rashad Wisdom made 13 against Western Kentucky on Oct. 9, 2021. That performance earned him honorable mention recognition for American Conference Player of the Week. He then racked up 11 stops, 1.5 TFLs, one sack and a quarterback hurry versus No. 1 Texas, making him the first Roadrunner to have at least 10 tackles in consecutive games since Shad Banks Jr. did so against East Carolina and Army last November.

CHAPMAN ISLAND

UTSA boasts a set of twin brothers in the cornerback room in Ahamad and Asaad Chapman. Natives of San Bernardino, California, the duo starred at Cajon High School before attending JUCOS in their home state. Ahamad joined the Roadrunners prior to the 2025 season and appeared in five contests. He posted 13 tackles, nine solo stops, one interception, one pass breakup, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery. He logged his first career INT, forced a fumble and made one unassisted tackle in the 48-26 home triumph over Tulane. Asaad is in his first year at UTSA after a standout 2025 season at San Bernardino Valley College that saw him register 42 tackles, 33 solo stops, three interceptions with one returned for a touchdown, two fumble recoveries with one returned for a TD, four pass breakups and a pair of block kicks. Asaad earned the start at cornerback in the season opener against UTRGV, making a pair of stops and breaking up a pass. Ahamad had one tackle and a 49-yard interception return in the second quarter that helped break the game open. The twins earned starts in the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State with Asaad logging three tackles and Ahamad adding a pair of stops. The duo played a key role in limited No. 1 Texas to a season-low 172 passing yards on Sept. 19, with Asaad making a pair of stops and breaking up two passes.

PEWEE THE PLAYMAKER

A veteran of the UTSA defense for the past few seasons, redshirt senior Owen Pewee has seen playing time at both money backer and inside linebacker during his career. A product of Cypress Park High School near Houston, he has appeared in 46 career contests and made a dozen starts. Last fall in his first season as the full-time starter at money backer, he posted 31 total tackles, 16 solo stops, four tackles for loss, seven quarterback hurries and one pass breakup in 13 games (10 starts). So far this season, he has totaled 11 tackles, three solo stops and a forced fumble. In his last outing, he logged six stops, one quarterback hurry and a forced fumble versus No. 1 Texas. Pewee has developed a reputation as a playmaker on the defensive side of the ball during his time as a Roadrunner, registering 117 total tackles, 66 unassisted stops, 17 TFLs, three sacks, 11 QB pressures, five PBUs, three interceptions and two forced fumbles.

PUNTER FROM DOWN UNDER PART II

Caile Hogan, a native of Melbourne, Australia, joined the Roadrunners prior to the 2024 season and has made his mark during his time with the program. Following in the footsteps of Lucas Dean, a fellow Aussie who set several school records for punting during his career from 2019 to 2023, Hogan has emerged as a weapon on special teams, earning second-team all-conference accolades after a stellar 2025 campaign. A product of ProKick Australia, like Dean, he averaged 45.7 yards per punt in 2025, a mark that led the American Conference and ranked 16th in the FBS. It also stands second on UTSA's single-season punting average list behind Dean's school record of 45.98 from 2020. Of his 54 punts, 17 sailed at least 50 yards — including season-long 60-yard punts against both Temple and North Texas — and 17 pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line. His average was a dramatic jump from his UTSA debut campaign when he averaged 40.0 yards on 55 punts. In 2024, Hogan had five punts that went 50-plus yards with a long of 63 yards and 16 that ended up inside the 20. He started the 2026 season by averaging 43.3 yards on three punts in the win over UTRGV. He had a long of 58 yards that was one of two inside the 20, and he did not allow a return against the Vaqueros. He followed that showing by averaging 44.0 yards on five punts with one inside the 20 in the 31-26 road triumph over Texas State. He punted eight times versus No. 1 Texas, averaging 38.5 yards with one inside the 20. He is averaging 41.1 yards on 16 punts with four inside the 20 this season and 42.6 yards on 125 punts for his career, good for second in program annals. A total of 37 of his punts have ended up inside the 20, while 23 have been for 50-plus yards.

PETRO DISPLAYS CONSISTENT LEG

Michael Petro has displayed a consistent leg as UTSA's place-kicker since earning the job prior to the 2025 campaign. The Flower Mound Marcus High School product made 17 of 20 field goals with a long of 45 yards and all 56 of his extra-point attempts last season, finishing the year ranked 26th in the FBS in field-goal percentage (.850). He enjoyed a streak of 10 consecutive made field goals during the fall, and he made three field goals in a game twice, at South Florida and in the 58-24 home win over East Carolina, a game that saw him match the program record with seven PATs. His 17 field goals are tied for fifth on UTSA's single-season chart while his 56 PATs rank as the third-most made in a year by a Roadrunner. He scored 107 points in 2025, good for third on the program's single-season list. He has started 2026 by splitting the uprights on four of his first five field-goal attempts and making all 10 of his extra-point tries. In his last outing, Petro was good from 34 and 43 yards at No. 1 Texas, his sixth career contest with at least two field goals made.

TV BIRDS

Saturday's game will air on ESPNU, marking 167 straight televised/streamed appearances for the Roadrunners. The last UTSA game that was not broadcast was the 2012 season finale against Texas State.

BOWIE CHOSEN FOR 40 UNDER 40 LIST

UTSA first-year offensive coordinator Rick Bowie has been chosen for this year's Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40, as the publication recognized 40 of the rising stars in the coaching ranks in the state of Texas. A coaching veteran for more than a decade with stints as an offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at three different schools, Bowie joined the Roadrunners in January. In 2025, he helped guide Western Kentucky to a 9-4 campaign that was capped by a 27-16 victory over Southern Miss in the 2025 New Orleans Bowl. The Hilltoppers averaged more than 400 yards of offense per game, including 272.2 passing yards per contest, which led Conference USA and ranked in the top 20 nationally. This marks the sixth consecutive year a UTSA coach has been honored on the list.

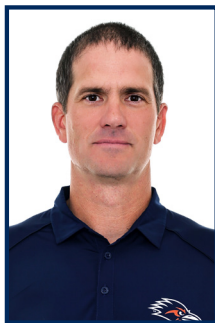

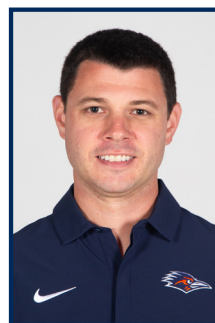

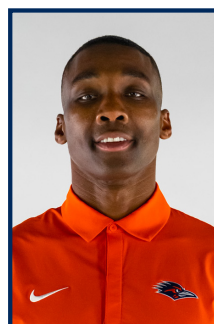

Named UTSA's third head coach on Dec. 9, 2019, Jeff Traylor has had an immediate impact on the program, university and city of San Antonio during his tenure.

Traylor has turned around the UTSA football program by instilling his 210 Triangle of Toughness culture, which has led to positive results on and off the field. The Gilmer, Texas, native took over a team that won a combined seven games in the two seasons prior to his arrival and has led the Roadrunners to a 55-27 record, the most wins and best winning percentage (.671) by a coach in program history.

Traylor also has helped turn UTSA's home facility — the Alamodome — into a true homefield advantage with a 34-5 (.872) home record during his tenure. Additionally, the Roadrunners are 25-1 (.962) against conference opponents at home.

During the Traylor era, UTSA has captured a pair of conference championships, earned six straight bowl berths with three consecutive bowl wins and made a combined 23 appearances in the three major national polls. He has coached 10 All-Americans, three national award finalists, 97 all-conference selections and a trio of NFL Draft picks.

That success is not limited to just the gridiron. The Roadrunners also have received numerous honors for their work in the classroom under Traylor's leadership, including three College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-Americans, a William V. Campbell Trophy finalist, 15 CSC Academic All-District Selections, four conference all-academic team selections and the AFCA Academic Achievement Award.

Traylor led the Roadrunners to a seven-win campaign in 2025 that was capped with a 57-20 victory over FIU in the First Responder Bowl. UTSA also posted a 48-26 win over Tulane, which won the American Conference and advanced to the first round of the College Football Playoff, as well as a 58-24 triumph over East Carolina. In fact, the Roadrunners registered the three highest-scoring games in program history, as they routed Rice, 61-13, for Homecoming.

Six Roadrunners were named All-American Conference in 2025, headlined by first-team honorees Shad Banks Jr. and Robert Henry Jr. Named an honorable mention All-American by Phil Steele, Henry also made the semifinalist list for the Doak Walker Award and became the third Roadrunner to crack the 1,000-yard barrier on the ground, finishing with 1,045 rushing yards. He also earned two (PFF, Senior Bowl) of UTSA's three national player of the week awards along with Owen McCown (Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award). McCown and Banks also reeled in conference player of the week honors during the campaign.

In 2024, Traylor guided UTSA to seven wins and its fifth consecutive bowl appearance, a 44-15 triumph over Coastal Carolina in the Myrtle Beach Bowl. UTSA also went undefeated at the Alamodome for the second time during his tenure with a 6-0 mark.

Eight Roadrunners earned All-American Athletic Conference accolades in 2024, including outside linebacker Jimmori Robinson, a fourth-team All-America selection by Phil Steele who was chosen as Defensive Player of the Year to mark the second straight season a UTSA player has garnered that award. Zah Frazier, a cornerback who set the program record with six interceptions and later was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Bears, joined Robinson on the All-American Conference First Team and was named an All-American by Phil Steele (third team) and CBS Sports (honorable mention). Additionally, UTSA boasted a pair of national player of the week honorees in Robinson (Walter Camp) and McCown (Manning Award) while also collecting a trio of conference player of the week certificates.

In 2023, Traylor led the Roadrunners to a 9-4 record, a 7-1 mark in their debut campaign in the American and the program's first bowl win with a 35-17 victory over Marshall in the Frisco Bowl. UTSA received votes in both the final Associated Press Top 25 and USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll for the third consecutive season.

A total of 16 Roadrunners collected all-conference honors in 2023, led by five first-team honorees in Defensive Player of the Year and Trey Moore, Frank Harris, Joshua Cephus, Kam Alexander and Rashad Wisdom. Moore was named a second-team All-American by the AFCA, while Harris was chosen as a semifinalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award for the third year in a row and to the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2023, his fourth career appearance on that annual list. Harris also was named national player of the week by those two organizations, while the Roadrunners hauled in five conference player of the week awards.

In 2022, Traylor guided UTSA to an 11-3 record, a second straight Conference USA title, a top-25 ranking in all three major polls for the second consecutive season and the third bowl appearance in a row with

the Cure Bowl matchup against Troy. He repeated as Conference USA Coach of the Year and was chosen as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson and Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year, as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award.

Under Traylor's guidance, UTSA collected a school-record 30 league postseason honors, as 27 made the 2022 all-conference teams —including six first-team and five second-team selections — while 16 received honorable mention and three landed on the Conference USA All-Freshman Team. Harris was voted the league's MVP and Kevorian Barnes was tabbed Conference USA Freshman of the Year. Harris

(4) and place-kicker Jared Sackett (5) combined to earn nine player of the week accolades during the season.

Also in 2022, Zakhari Franklin was named an honorable mention All-American by Phil Steele, while Harris was a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

Under Traylor's tutelage, UTSA enjoyed a record-setting campaign in 2021. The Roadrunners won their first 11 games, were nationally ranked as high as No. 15 and captured the program's first league title. UTSA capped the season with its second straight and third overall bowl appearance against San Diego State in the Frisco Bowl.

Traylor was honored as the 2021 Conference USA Coach of the Year, the AFCA FBS Regional Coach of the Year for Region 4 and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, AFCA National Coach of the Year and George Munger College Coach of the Year Award. A member of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards Coach of the Year watch list, he was chosen as the 2021 San Antonio Express-News Sportsman of the Year.

A total of 23 Roadrunners received recognition on the all-conference and Conference USA All-Freshman teams in 2021 with Sincere McCormick earning Offensive Player of the Year accolades for the second straight season.

McCormick garnered All-America accolades from three different organizations in 2021, while Spencer Burford and Clarence Hicks were tabbed honorable mention All-Americans by Phil Steele. McCormick also was an Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award finalist and a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award for the second straight year. Harris landed on semifinalist lists for the Davey O'Brien and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Awards, while Hunter Duplessis was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy for the second year in a row. Harris and McCormick each collected Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award National Player of the Week honors, while Harris also was a Manning Award Quarterback of the Week. Additionally, UTSA collected nine league player of the week awards.

In his first season at the helm, Traylor guided the Roadrunners to a 7-5 overall record, a runner-up finish in Conference USA's West Division with a 5-2 mark and an appearance in the 2020 First Responder Bowl. The Roadrunners received votes in a national poll (AP Top 25) for the first time in program history after a 3-0 start and the seven wins are the most by a first-year UTSA head coach.

Dean, Duplessis and McCormick earned All-America accolades, while McCormick also was a finalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. Additionally, Duplessis (Campbell Trophy, Lou Groza) and McCormick (Doak Walker) were national award semifinalists, while Harris made the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2020. Dean was tabbed Conference USA Special Teams Player of the Year and McCormick was named the league's offensive player of the year, and a total of 23 Roadrunners were recognized by the league's head coaches, including 19 as all-conference and four on the all-freshman team. The Roadrunners collected a program-record 11 CUSA Player of the Week certificates and a trio of national player of the week accolades in McCormick (Earl Campbell Tyler Rose), Dean (Ray Guy Award) and Wisdom (Jim Thorpe Award).

During his time in San Antonio, Traylor has overseen the development of several Roadrunners who have moved on to the professional ranks. In April 2022, UTSA doubled the number of NFL draft picks on one afternoon, as the 49ers selected Spencer Burford in the fourth round and the Seahawks picked Tariq Woolen one round later. Burford earned the starting spot at right guard in year one and Woolen picked off half a dozen passes in his rookie campaign en route to being selected to the Pro Bowl. In 2025, Zah Frazier became the fifth Roadrunner to be selected in the NFL Draft, as the Bears picked Zah Frazier in the fifth round.

UTSA student-athletes have been honored for their work in the classroom under Traylor, as well. In 2023, UTSA was one of 13 schools to receive the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for posting the highest graduation rate among FBS programs in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) report.

Individually, Ahofitu Maka became the third Roadrunner to be named a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy and the second to be selected as a CSC Academic All-American when he landed on the first team in 2022. He also earned spots on the CSC Academic All-District Team for a third time and the Conference USA All-Academic Team for the second straight season. Hunter Duplessis was a two-time Conference USA Football Scholar Athlete of the Year, a 2021 CSC Academic All-American, a two-time Conference USA All-Academic Team selection and a two-time CSC Academic All-District pick. Lucas Dean was a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy in 2023 and he earned 2021 Conference USA All-Academic Team recognition and CSC Academic All-District Team accolades in 2021-23. Kaedric Cobbs, Cory

Godinet, Trey Moore and Tate Sandell also made the 2023 CSC Academic All-District Team, while Jameian Buxton was named academic all-district in 2024. Oscar Cardenas (2024) and Luke Lapeze (2025) each made the Campbell Trophy semifinalist list.

Traylor has more than 30 years of coaching experience including a highly successful 15-year career as head coach at Gilmer High School, where he led teams to three state championships and two state runner-up finishes and won more than 87% of his games, a winning percentage that ranks 10th all-time in Texas high school history.

Prior to coming to the Alamo City, the Gilmer native served as associate head coach and running backs coach for two seasons at Arkansas, where he helped sign the school's first top-20 recruiting class. Prior to that, he served in the same role at SMU for the 2017 season. He began his collegiate coaching career as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at Texas in 2015 before becoming the Longhorns' associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach the following year.

Traylor's impact on the offense was felt immediately in his first season at Arkansas, as his running backs corps racked up 1,721 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2018. The unit was led by Rakeem Boyd, who rushed for more than 100 yards in three different SEC games, including a season-best 113 against Vanderbilt. The Houston Stratford High School product took over the starting tailback role in the fifth game of the season and his most impressive stretch of the season came during a four-game stretch against Alabama, Ole Miss, Tulsa and Vanderbilt, as he topped the century mark three times and totaled 423 yards. His 102 yards against Alabama made him the first Arkansas running back to eclipse 100 yards against the Crimson Tide since Darren McFadden in 2007.

In Traylor's second season coaching the Arkansas running backs, Boyd rushed for 1,133 yards and eight touchdowns on 184 carries (6.2 avg.) to spearhead a ground game that accumulated 1,766 yards. Boyd topped 100 yards in five contests, including a season-best 185 and two scores on just eight attempts against Western Kentucky. He also rushed for 100-plus against Portland State (114), Colorado State (122), Kentucky (134) and Mississippi (114).

Prior to his time at Arkansas, Traylor spent the 2017 season as associate head coach and running backs coach at SMU under Chad Morris. He also served as the Mustangs' interim head coach before joining Morris' staff at Arkansas.

During his one year at SMU, Traylor's running backs piled up 2,223 yards on the ground. Three players rushed for 500-plus yards, with Xavier Jones leading the group at 1,075. The Mustangs topped the 200-yard mark on the ground six times, including a season-best 311 in a win against Arkansas State. SMU ranked in the top 20 nationally in several offensive categories, including 12th in scoring offense and 15th in total offense.

Prior to his time in Dallas, Traylor spent two seasons at Texas. He was the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator in 2015 and then the associate head coach for offense and wide receivers coach in 2016, when

the Longhorns boasted the nation's No. 16-ranked offense that averaged 491.3 yards per game. During his time as the lead recruiter, he helped the Longhorns sign the No. 7-ranked recruiting class in the country in back-to-back years and was named Scout.com's Big 12 Recruiter of the Year. He recruited punter Michael Dickson, who went on to earn multiple All-America honors, win Big 12 Conference Special Teams Player of the Year in 2016 and 2017 as well as the 2017 Ray Guy Award, and currently punts for the Seattle Seahawks.

Traylor built his hometown program into a prep powerhouse during his 15-year tenure leading the Gilmer Buckeyes.

A four-time Texas High School Coach of the Year, he posted a 175-26 record (.871) and led Gilmer to five state championship game appearances, three state titles (2004, '09, '14) and 12 district crowns. The Buckeyes turned in a pair of perfect 16-0 seasons, won 10-or-more games 11 times and registered seven 13-win seasons and three 15-win campaigns during his career.

In 2014, his Class 4A Division II state championship team boasted one of the most prolific offenses in Texas prep history. Gilmer scored 950 points, the second-most at that time in state history, averaging 59.4 points and 536.1 yards over the 16-game season. The Buckeyes topped 60 points nine times, including two 80-point performances. Gilmer also averaged 536.1 total yards per game (8,577 yards) behind a balanced 293.9 passing yards and 242.1 rushing yards per contest. The defense was equally dominant, allowing only 276 points (17.3) with five single-digit efforts and two shutouts, while recording 23 interceptions and forcing 17 fumbles. Gilmer closed out the season with a win over West Orange-Stark and had eight different players earn Class 4A All-State honors from either the AP or Texas Sports Writers Association.

Gilmer's two other state titles under Traylor both came in Class 3A in 2004 (Division II) and 2009 (Division I), before the change in class structure in Texas high school football moved the school into Class 4A. After 15 years on its sidelines, Gilmer renamed Buckeye Stadium to Jeff Traylor Stadium to honor his successful career. Inducted into the East Texas Coaches Association Hall of Honor in 2019, Traylor received numerous honors during his prep coaching career, including being named Coach of the Decade (2000s) by the Tyler Morning Telegraph. He is a 12-time District Coach of the Year, four-time East Texas Coach of the Year and a four-time Ted Jeffries Award winner. He has received the Carl Padilla Coach of the Year, KYKX Coach of the Year and Old Coach Network Coach of the Year awards twice each. He was inducted into both the Texas High School Coaches Association (THSCA) Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in 2025.

Traylor began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Big Sandy High School in 1990-93 before a seven-year stint (1994-2000) at Jacksonville High School where he served as passing coordinator, defensive backs coach, receivers coach and special teams coordinator. There, he helped coach future NFL quarterbacks Josh McCown and Luke McCown and former Texas A&M standout signal-caller Randy McCown.

A 1986 graduate of Gilmer High School, Traylor earned both undergraduate (1990) and graduate (2002) degrees in education from Stephen F. Austin while playing football as a walk-on.

He and his wife, Cari, have three children: Jordan, Jacob and Jaci.

UTSA 45, UTRGV 16 Saturday, Sept. 5 San Antonio, Texas (Alamodome)

SAN ANTONIO — Keyed by big plays on both sides of the ball, UTSA rolled to a 45-16 win over UTRGV in its season opener Saturday afternoon in front of 33,403 fans at the Alamodome.

The Roadrunners racked up 527 yards of offense on the strength of five plays of 30-plus yards on offense and also had one on defense thanks to a 49-yard interception return for a touchdown by Ahamad Chapman in running their record to 11-5 all-time in season openers.

Owen McCown guided the way for a balanced offensive attack, completing 22 of 27 passes for 275 for three touchdowns. DJ Allen Jr. registered his first career 100-yard receiving game with 116 yards on four catches that included 62-yard TD reception in the fourth quarter. AJ Wilson Jr. piled up 42 yards on two grabs, including a 36-yard touchdown that started the scoring for the Roadrunners at the 6:51 mark of the first quarter.

Will Henderson III paced the ground game with 101 yards and a TD on nine carries, charting his fourth career 100-yard game in the process. The third-year running back from Gilmer, Texas, broke loose for a 75-yard touchdown dash midway through the second stanza that helped give UTSA a 28-3 lead.

A'Marion Peterson added 96 yards on only eight totes, reaching paydirt on a 53-yard rush down the left sideline late in the contest to provide a 45-9 cushion for the Roadrunners.

Armed with a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter, Brandon Young Jr. made a one-handed catch in the back of the end zone on a 7-yard pass from McCown. Michael Petro's extra point pushed the home team's advantage to 14-0.

On UTRGV's next possession, Chapman picked off a pass near the right sideline and raced 49 yards to the end zone for his first pick six as a Roadrunner, giving the Roadrunners a three-touchdown lead with 12:40 left on the clock until halftime.

The Vaqueros (1-1), who are in their second season of football as an FCS member of the Southland Conference, got on the board with a 44-yard field goal from Brysen Gardner at the 7:11 mark before Henderson's long TD run stretched the lead to 25.

Petro drilled a 30-yard field goal with 54 seconds left to make it 31-3, but UTRGV answered with a 24-yard field goal as time expired in the half.

Following a scoreless third quarter, Allen's catch-and-run on a pass from McCown increased the lead to 38-6 early in the fourth.

After Gardner split the uprights for the third time from 40 yards, Peterson's touchdown run gave UTSA its largest lead of the afternoon at 45-9.

UTRGV reached the end zone for the first time with four seconds left in the game on a 1-yard rush by Atzel Chavez Jr. Gardner's PAT provided the final 45-16 margin.

Joel Rogers paced the UTSA defense with seven tackles, while James Walley Jr. added six tackles including a sack. Nate Robinson Jr. joined Chapman with an interception, his first as a Roadrunner.

For the Vaqueros, Garrett Rangel threw for 152 yards on 19-of-32 passing. Broderick Taylor rushed for 73 yards on six attempts and Corey Holmes led the receivers with seven grabs for 68 yards. Spencer Rich led all players with 10 tackles.

UTSA 31, Texas State 26 Saturday, Sept. 12 San Marcos, Texas (UFCU Stadium)

SAN MARCOS, Texas— UTSA outscored Texas State, 24-9, in the second half, and used a Brandon High Jr. 25-yard touchdown run in the final seconds to rally for a 31-26 victory — the 100th in program history — in the Battle for I-35 on Saturday afternoon at UFCU Stadium.

Trailing 17-7 at halftime, the Roadrunners registered back-to-back scoring drives to start the second half and knot the score midway through the third quarter. The two teams traded leads before the Bobcats went up 26-24 with fewer than five minutes left to play, giving UTSA enough time to engineer the game-winning drive.

Starting at their own 18-yard line with 4:31 remaining, UTSA converted two fourth downs, the first an 8-yard pass from Owen McCown to David Amador II and the second a 6-yard quarterback keeper up the middle by McCown that pushed the ball out to the 42-yard line with just under two minutes on the clock. McCown then completed three consecutive passes, and Texas State was called for defensive holding, sending the Roadrunners into the brink of field goal range. Following a short rush by Will Henderson III and a completion to AJ Wilson Jr., High had a 3-yard carry before breaking loose off right tackle for his game-winning touchdown.

Texas State (0-2) got the ball back with 14 seconds left but fumbled the ball away on the final play, as Xavier Walton's recovery secured the win for the visitors.

Six years to the day of head coach Jeff Traylor's UTSA debut, which was a 51-48, double-overtime triumph over Texas State on this same field in 2020, the Roadrunners improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2021, when they reeled off 11 victories to start that campaign. UTSA also now leads the series with the Bobcats, 6-2, including a 3-1 mark in San Marcos.

McCown finished 28 of 42 passing for 214 yards and a touchdown. Henderson paced the ground game with 80 yards on 14 rushes, while High added 47 and his TD on eight totes. Wilson led the receivers with nine catches for 83 yards and Mekhi Anderson made five grabs for 83 yards and a score.

Defensively, Brandon Tucker posted a team-high 13 tackles, the most by a Roadrunner since Rashad Wisdom logged 13 against Western Kentucky on Oct. 9, 2021, while Elijah Newell and Darion White pitched in eight and seven, respectively. Zach Morris and Cameron Upshaw Jr. each came up with an interception, giving UTSA two picks in three consecutive games.

UTSA got on the board first on its second possession of the game. Morris intercepted a pass near midfield and set up the Roadrunners for a 48-yard march to the end zone. McCown hit Wilson on a 25-yard pass and then four straight rushes moved the ball to the 1-yard line for a fourth-and-goal situation. After a Texas State timeout, McCown found Brandon Young Jr. all alone in the end zone for a touchdown, his second straight game with a TD reception. Michael Petro's extra point made it 7-0 at the 4:57 mark of the opening quarter.

The Bobcats knotted the score early in the second stanza on a 16-yard rush by Davian Jackson. That was set up by a 65-yard dash from Torrance Burgess, who rushed for 149 yards, on the first play of the drive.

Texas State then took the lead on Brad Jackson's 6-yard quarterback keeper with 7:16 left until halftime.

The Bobcats got the ball back late in the opening half after stopping UTSA on fourth down in Texas State territory. Jacob Bonilla then split the uprights from 51 yards as time expired to give the home team a 17-7 advantage at the intermission.

The Roadrunners came out of the locker room on fire, marching 75 yards on plays to pull to within three points. McCown found DJ Allen Jr. open for a 12-yard completion near midfield to convert a fourth-down attempt and then David Amador II took a lateral and hit a wide-open Anderson for a 44-yard touchdown pass down the right sideline. Petro's PAT made it 17-14.

Upshaw came up with his first interception as a Roadrunner on the ensuing Bobcats possession, giving the ball back to the Roadrunners inside Texas State territory. After a third-down pass attempt into the end zone fell incomplete, Petro drilled a 35-yard field goal at the 7:46 mark of the third quarter to tie things up at 17-all.

Texas State went back in front late in the third as Chris Dawn hauled in a 13-yard pass from Jackson for a touchdown. The extra point was wide left, leaving the score at 23-17.

UTSA took the lead on its next possession, covering 65 yards in seven plays, the last a 2-yard plunge by A'Marion Peterson at the 11:54 mark of the fourth. Petro made the extra point to give the visitors a 24-23 advantage.

The Bobcats answered with a 14-play, 67-yard drive that took 7:18 off the clock and was capped by a 26-yard field goal from Bonilla to retake the lead, 26-24, with 4:36 left to play.

Jackson threw for 192 yards and a TD on 17-of-30 passing, while Dawn had seven receptions for 54 yards.

Texas 30, UTSA 6 Saturday, Sept. 19 Austin, Texas (DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium)

AUSTIN— Brandon Tucker Jr. posted a game-high 11 tackles, but No. 1 Texas used a balanced offense and stingy defense to beat UTSA, 30-6, on Saturday night in front of 103,753 fans at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium.

The Roadrunners' first setback of the season dropped their record to 2-1, while the Longhorns improved to 3-0 after pulling away in a contest controlled by the defenses.

Tucker had a sack, 1.5 tackles for loss and a quarterback hurry to pace a UTSA defense that held the top-ranked Longhorns to a season-low 172 passing yards and 400 yards overall. Eze Osondu added eight stops, James Walley Jr. pitched in with seven including a TFL and Owen Pewee logged six tackles, a hurry and a forced fumble.

The Roadrunners limited Texas quarterback Arch Manning to 164 yards on 17 completions and held running back Hollywood Smothers to 54 rushing yards.

The Longhorns took advantage of a Rasheem Biles interception in UTSA territory on the game's opening possession. Four plays later, Arch Manning hit Cam Coleman over the middle for a 24-yard touchdown pass to put the home team on the board first.

The Roadrunners responded with a scoring drive of their own, marching 59 yards in 13 plays and taking 6:29 off the clock after Michael Petro split the uprights from 34 yards to make it 7-3.

Texas pushed the advantage back out to seven on the next possession, as Gianni Spetic nailed a 52-yard field goal at the 1:26 mark of the opening period.

The lead grew to 17-3 on another touchdown pass from Manning to Coleman, this one for three yards early in the second quarter.

UTSA's defense came up with back-to-back stops, turning over Texas on downs near midfield and later forcing a punt. However, the Roadrunners were unable to cut into the deficit and Spetic tacked on a 34-yard field goal with 14 seconds left in the first half to provide the 20-3 halftime margin.

The Roadrunners forced a three-and-out on Texas' first possession of the second half and then were set up at the Longhorns 35-yard line following a Texas penalty on the punt return. Petro made a 43-yard field goal after the drive stalled to make it 20-6.

Spetic made his third field goal of the night, this one from 23 yards to extend the Texas lead back to 17 with 6:07 left in the third quarter.

The Longhorns padded their lead with a late touchdown on a 1-yard plunge by Derrek Cooper midway through the fourth quarter. That score capped an 8-play, 66-yard drive and led to the 24-point final margin.

Offensively, UTSA was held to 142 yards. Owen McCown completed 14 of 23 passes for 70 yards, Will Henderson III rushed for 38 yards and David Amador II had a team-high four receptions.
