THIS WEEK: For the third straight year, the University of Colorado Buffaloes are heading to the NCAA Tournament. No. 21 Colorado will face off against No. 18 Dartmouth in the first round on May 10 at Newton Campus Lacrosse and Soccer Field on the campus of Boston College at 2 p.m. MT/4 p.m. ET.

The winner will move on to the second round and will take on the host, No. 1 Boston College, on May 12 at 11 a.m. MT/1 p.m. ET.

This is the first meeting between CU and the Big Green.

HOW TO WATCH: Both games at Boston College this weekend will be broadcast live on the ACC Network. A link to the stream, as well as links to the live stats, will be available at CUBuffs.com.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY: This is the third trip for the Buffaloes to the NCAA Tournament in six years. CU is 1-2 all-time in tournament play. In 2017, the Buffs fell in the first round, 13-7, to UMass. Last year, Colorado defeated Jacksonville in the first round (23-18), before falling to Florida, 13-9, in the second round.

- This will be the first meeting between the two programs.

ABOUT THE BIG GREEN

- Dartmouth enters the tournament with an 11-5 record and was 6-1 in the Ivy League.
- DC earned an at-large bid after falling to Penn in the IVY semifinals. Currently the Big Green is ranked 18th in the IWLCA Poll.
- Leading DC offensively is Kierra Sweeney, who has recorded 70 points this season with 57 goals and 13 assists. Her 70 points is 51st in the NCAA and her 57 goals is 24th nationally.
- Kellen D'Alleva is not far off Sweeney's pace with 63 points, but 43 of those points are assists, which ranks 13th in the NCAA.
- The second leading goal scorer for the Big Green is Elizabeth Mastro, who is 88th in the NCAA with 2.50 goals per game. Just behind her is Katie Bourque, who has 38 goals.
- Dartmouth has been very strong on the draw control this year. As a team, the Big Green ranks second in the nation with 17.94 per game.
- Kathryn Giroux leads the team with 8.94 per game, which is fourth in the NCAA, while Claire Marshall is averaging 3.40 per game.
- In goal, Kiera Vrindten has recorded an 8-5 record. She has an 11.86 goals against average this season and owns a .398 save percentage.

ABOUT THE BUFFS

- The Buffs are 10-7 overall and finished second in the Pac-12 Conference with an 8-2 mark.
- They are currently ranked 21st in the IWLCA poll.
- Senior Miranda Stinson leads the Pac-12 in goals (59) and is second in points (74). Nationally, the Pac-12 Attacker of the Year ranks 22nd in goals and 38th in points. Stinson has averaged 1.06 free-position goals per game, the 19th best mark nationally. She is averaging the fifth best NCAA mark in shots per game (8.65), and is eighth in shots on goal per game (6.24).
- Another senior, Samantha Nemirov, is second on the team with 44 goals, which ranks third in the conference. She is tied for Stinson for the team lead in assists with 15. In total, her 59 points is fourth in the conference.
- There are three other Buffs with at least 15 goals this season: Sadie Grozier (32), Charlie Rudy (20) and Sophie Castillo (17).
- Kate Burnside and Stinson lead CU in draw controls (51), while Eliza Cahill is third with 33.
- Julia Lisella has started in 16 games for the Buffs and has a 9-7 record on the year. She has allowed 9.35 goals against, which is 11th in the NCAA, and has a .485 save percentage, which is 20th nationally.
- The Buffs have forced 173 opponent turnovers, which is 24th in the NCAA. Stinson again leads the team with 23 caused turnovers, while Olivia Aschman is second with 19. Macaul Mellor is third with 17.

Pac-12 Preseason Poll

The University of Colorado Buffaloes were picked second overall in the Pac-12 Lacrosse Preseason Coaches Poll, as announced by the league's office on Feb. 5.

The Buffs earned 21 points, which included one first-place vote, to finish behind the preseason favorite: Stanford. The Cardinal recorded five first-place votes and 25 points to finish in front of Colorado.

Southern California placed third in the poll with 17 points and Oregon came in fourth (13 points). California was fifth overall (eight points) and Arizona State was selected sixth (six points).

Colorado won the regular season Pac-12 Championship last year with a 9-1 record, but fell in the tournament championship to Stanford, which was 8-2 in league play.

COLORADO NOTES

About the Buffs

- The Buffs are 10-7 overall and finished second in the Pac-12 Conference with an 8-2 mark. They are currently ranked 21st in the IWLC poll.
- Senior Miranda Stinson leads the Pac-12 in goals (59) and is second in points (74). Nationally, the Pac-12 Attacker of the Year ranks 22nd in goals and 38th in points. Stinson has averaged 1.06 free-position goals per game, the 19th best mark nationally. She is averaging the fifth best NCAA mark in shots per game (8.65), and is eighth in shots on goal per game (6.24).
- Another senior, Samantha Nemirov, is second on the team with 44 goals, which ranks third in the conference. She is tied for Stinson for the team lead in assists with 15. In total, her 59 points is fourth in the conference.
- There are three other Buffs with at least 15 goals this season: Sadie Grozier (32), Charlie Rudy (20) and Sophie Castillo (17). Kate Burnside and Stinson lead CU in draw controls (51), while Eliza Cahill is third with 33.
- Julia Lisella has started in 16 games for the Buffs and has a 9-7 record on the year. She has allowed 9.35 goals against, which is 11th in the NCAA, and has a .485 save percentage, which is 20th nationally.
- The Buffs have forced 173 opponent turnovers, which is 24th in the NCAA. Stinson again leads the team with 23 caused turnovers, while Olivia Aschman is second with 19. Macaul Mellor is third with 17.

RPI Rankings

- The Buffs were 21st in the latest RPI Rankings.
- CU is the second highest ranked Pac-12 school with USC at ninth and Stanford at 24th.
- California was 50th, Arizona State 80th and Oregon 81st.

Miranda-Samantha Punch

- The Buffs have one of the best 1-2 punches in the Pac-12 and the country with Miranda Stinson and Samantha Nemirov.
- Stinson leads the Pac-12, averaging 3.47 goals per game, while Nemirov is third with 2.59 goals per game.
- Nationally, Stinson is 22nd in total goals (59) and Nemirov is 81st (44).

All-Pac-12 Awards

- Miranda Stinson was named the Pac-12 Attacker of the Year on May 2, leading the conference in goals during the regular season.
- In addition, she was selected to the All-Pac-12 First team with teammates Olivia Aschman and Samantha Nemirov.
- A pair of Buffs were also named to the second team: Sadie Grozier and Julia Lisella.

All-Pac-12 All-Tournament Team

- The Buffs finished second at the Pac-12 Tournament for the second straight year.
- With the finish, three Buffs were named to the All-Tournament team: Olivia Aschman, Julia Lisella and Miranda Stinson.

Pac-12 Runner-up

- The Buffs finished second in the Pac-12 regular season standings this year (8-2) behind Southern California (9-1).
- CU was the only league opponent who was able to defeat the Trojans in conference play.
- The Buffs were the runner-up at the Pac-12 Tournament, falling to USC in the championship game, 12-3.

WPLL Draft

- Miranda Stinson was selected 13th overall by the New England Command of the Women's Professional Lacrosse League on April 25.
- She is the third Buff to get drafted into the league since its inception in 2018.

Tewaaraton Award

- Miranda Stinson was named to the Tewaaraton Award's top-25 list on April 25.
- She was named to the initial Tewaaraton Watch in March with teammate Julia Lisella.

School Records

- Miranda Stinson recorded a pair of school records on March 10 against California.
- She scored eight goals in the game, breaking the old school record of seven goals in a game, which had been done four times.
- Six of her eight goals were scored in the first half, which is the record for the most goals scored in a half.
- She scored six goals in a half again just two games later against Arizona State on March 17.

200 Career Points

- CU senior Miranda Stinson became the third Buff in school history to record 200 career points, doing so on April 7 against Arizona State.
- She has scored 166 goals while adding 52 assists for 218 points, which is tied for second in school history.
- The other two Buffs who have reached 200 career points are Darby Kiernan (287, 210g/77a) and Johnna Fusco (218, 172g/46a).

Point Streak

- Samantha Nemirov set the CU point-streak record when she scored a goal and assist against Denver, stretching her streak to 30 games.
- She has scored at least one point in each game this season and scored in all 20 games in 2018.
- Nemirov's streak is up to 37 straight games.

Pac-12 Honors (March 25)

- Miranda Stinson was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week for the third time this season after CU defeated Oregon on March 23.
- She recorded six points with a team-best five goals and one assist against in the Ducks. In addition, she also led the Buffs with eight draw controls and five ground balls. Stinson took 12 shots in the game and nine were on goal (75.0%).

Pac-12 Honors (March 11)

- Miranda Stinson earned her second Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week honor on March 11 after leading the Buffs with 14 points in a pair of wins to open Pac-12 Conference play.
- She started the weekend off with six points, four goals and two assists, in CU's 20-13 upset of No. 15 Stanford on March 8. She also recorded three draw controls, two ground balls and one caused turnover.
- Then two days later on March 10, she broke CU's single-game goals record with eight against California. Six of those came in the first half, which was also a CU record for most goals in a half. Stinson added another three draw controls, one ground ball and one caused turnover. CU won the game 17-11.

COLORADO NOTES

Pac-12 Honors (Feb. 18)

- Miranda Stinson was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week, and Eliza Cahill was named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week for strong performances against Virginia Tech.
- Stinson recorded six points in the win, four goals and two assists, in addition to recording four ground balls, three caused turnovers and three draw controls.
- Cahill led the Buffs with eight draw controls and added three ground balls and one caused turnover. She was key in CU's transition play as the Buffs were 14 of 18 on clears.

Returning All-American

- Julia Lisella is the only returning All-American for the Buffs. She was named to the IWLCA First Team and was tabbed the IWLCA and Inside Lacrosse Goalkeeper of the Year following the 2018 season.

Scheduling Tough

- Colorado head coach Ann Elliott Whidden does not shy away from scheduling tough opponents and this year's non-conference schedule proves that.
- CU started the season off with games against four straight IWLCA top-25 ranked opponents: then-No. 6 Florida, then-No. 14 Virginia Tech, then-No. 6 Stony Brook and then-No. 25 Michigan.
- The Buffs also faced in-state rival Denver, which was ranked 15th.
- Outside of the non-conference schedule, the Buffs faced Stanford and Southern California twice during Pac-12 play.

Five in a Row

- For the first time in program history, the Buffs faced five straight ranked opponents to start the season.
- CU played four non-conference opponents that were all in the top-25 and started Pac-12 Conference play against No. 15 Stanford.
- The Buffs have never played five straight ranked opponents at any point during the regular season.
- CU went 2-3 in those games.

Kittredge Field Advantage

- Kittredge Field has been the home of the Buffs since their inaugural season in 2014.
- In that time, the Buffs have recorded a 34-10 record there (.773).
- They were 5-2 in 2014, 6-2 in 2015 and 6-1 in 2016.
- In 2017, CU recorded a perfect 7-0 record at Kitt. (They played one home game at the Indoor Practice Facility due to a wild fire and won that for a perfect 8-0 record in Boulder.)
- The Buffs were also 7-0 at Kittredge Field in 2018.
- So far in 2019, CU is 3-6 at home.
- Colorado is 37-12 in Boulder, which includes games played at Folsom Field (1-0), Indoor Practice Facility (1-1) and Prentup Field (1-1).

Season Openers

- The Buffs are 4-2 in season openers.

Home Openers

- Colorado is 4-2 in home openers.
- CU won its very first home game (against Regis) on Feb. 22, defeating the Rangers 13-10. The Buffs also defeated Denver in Boulder to start the 2016 season and in 2017, the Buffs knocked off No. 9 Northwestern.
- In 2018, the Buffs defeated San Diego State, 17-12, on Feb. 25, to open the 2018 season at home.
- Florida defeated the Buffs 16-9 in 2019 to open the season at Kittredge.

HEAD COACH ANN ELLIOTT WHIDDEN



Ann Elliott Whidden is in her sixth season as the head coach at Colorado and has compiled a 75-37 record (.670) in that time. She has been recognized twice as the IWLCA West/Midwest Region Coach of the Year (2017 and '18), and was the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year and 2017 MPSF Coach of the Year.

Whidden was hired as CU's first-ever head lacrosse coach on March 26, 2012, just short of two months after the school officially added the program.

In her five years as the leader of the program, the Buffaloes have thrived. Besides an impressive overall record, she has guided the

team to a 34-11 mark in conference play, which included a 9-1 record during the inaugural Pac-12 season in 2018. With that mark, the Buffs became the first-ever regular season Pac-12 Lacrosse Champions.

Under Whidden's guidance, the Buffs have shown improvement each year. In the first four years of competition, the Buffs finished in the top four of the MPSF, which included a second place finish in 2018. Then in 2018, CU won the Pac-12 regular season championship.

Under her leadership, several of players have earned numerous honors in the program's short five-year history, including Julia Lisella who was named the 2018 IWLCA Goalkeeper of the Year. Four of her athletes have combined for six IWLCA All-America honors. Sarah Brown and Lisella were the first two players to earn first team honors (2018); Brown was also a second team honoree in 2017. Darby Kiernan was also a two-time All-American, earning second team honors in 2018 and third team honors in 2017. Paige Soenksen was the fourth Buff to record the prestigious award as a member of the third team in 2017.

Additionally, Whidden's athletes have recorded 13 all-region and 25 all-conference honors, in addition to 12 conference all-tournament selections. In five seasons, CU has earned 34 weekly conference awards.

The Buffs broke into the national rankings in 2017 and have been a mainstay in the polls for the last two seasons. In 2017, the

Buff finished the season with a school record 16 wins. They advanced to the NCAA for the first time in the program's short history and were ranked as high fourth in all three major polls. CU went on to record a 14-6 mark in 2018 and achieved more success. The Buffs advanced to their second straight NCAA Tournament and won their first NCAA Tournament game with a 23-18 victory against Jacksonville.

The Buffs have been a force at home, recording a 28-5 mark in Boulder. They were undefeated at home in 2017 (8-0) and were 8-1 in 2018. CU recorded 19 straight home wins from 2016-18, which is tied for the fifth in NCAA history. Academically, the Buffs have performed well in the classroom. They have received the IWLCA Team Academic Honor Squad award for the last four years (they were not eligible in their first season). Seven of CU's athletes have been named to the IWLCA Academic Honor Roll for 11 overall selections. Numerous athletes have earned spots on the MPSF and Pac-12 Academic teams as well.

In 2018, CU was solid on offense and defense. The Buffs were 26th in scoring offense (14.00) and held their opponents to 9.90 goals per game, which was 17th in the NCAA. In conference play, CU's 14.00 goals per game ranked second. Defensively, CU ranked second in save percentage (.482).

The Buffs won the inaugural regular season Pac-12 Championship with a 9-1 record. Their only loss in league play was in overtime at Southern California 7). CU earned the top-seed in the Pac-12 Tournament, defeating Oregon 16-6 the second round. The Buffs fell in the championship game to Stanford, after defeating the Cardinal twice during the regular season. CU's season continued as the Buffs earned an at-large bid to their second NCAA Tournament. The Buffs defeated Jacksonville 23-18 in the first round, which was CU's first ever tournament win, before Florida defeated the Buffs in the second round, 13-9.

CU was again strong defensively in 2017, as well as offensively. The Buffs finished the campaign ranked third nationally in scoring defense (8.10) and were sixth in scoring margin (+6.35) and turnovers per game (13.95). The 16-4 mark the season gave CU a .800 win percentage, which was tied for the eighth best the NCAA.

The Buffs also recorded their first wins against ranked opponents during the campaign, which included a huge 11-10 overtime win against No. 9 Northwestern on Feb. 12 to open the season. CU went on to defeat three other ranked teams: No. 16 UMass (11-7), No. 14 Denver (14-3) and No. 6 Penn State (16-11).

The 2016 season was another big step in the right direction. CU won a then-school-record 13 games, going 13-5 overall and finishing third in the MPSF with a 7-2 conference mark. The Buffs reached the semifinals of the conference tournament, defeating Oregon 11-3 in the first round. All five losses during the season came to teams ranked in the top 10 nationally and the Buffaloes received votes in both the IWLCA and the Inside Lacrosse top-20 polls several times during the year.

Defense was again an emphasis for the Buffs, who ranked second in the MPSF and seventh nationally in scoring defense (7.00). They also were second in the MPSF and eighth in the nation in scoring margin (+5.61 goals per game). Offensively, CU ranked third in the MPSF and 14th in the country in

scoring (12.61) and the team's .722 winning percentage was the 14th-best in the country.

Despite the excellent season on both ends of the field, CU was left out of the 26-team NCAA Tournament field. The Buffs faced six teams during the year that were selected to the post-season, including James Madison, which they defeated 15-14 in overtime on March 3.

Five Buffs were selected All-MPSF at the end of the season. Marie Moore, Darby Kiernan and Sarah Brown were first-team selections, while Johnna Fusco and Paige Soenksen were named to the second team. Moore and Brown were both second team all-region picks by the IWLCA.

In 2015, Colorado earned a No. 4 seed at the MPSF Tournament and defeated San Diego State 15-6 to advance to the semifinals for a second straight year. The Buffs dominated at home, posting a 6-2 record at Kittredge Field.

Prior to joining Colorado, Whidden was a major force at powerhouse Northwestern. After an astounding collegiate career, she returned to her alma mater as an assistant coach ahead of the 2009 season. Prior to the start of the 2012 season, she became the first to ever be promoted to the associate level. As a player and aide under Kelly Amonte Hiller, who is considered to be one of the nation's top coaches and recruiters, Whidden and Northwestern appeared in the NCAA title game seven times, winning six titles, including three as a player and three as a member of the staff.

After graduating from Northwestern with a bachelor's degree in radio, television and film in 2007, Whidden served as the head coach of the Wildcat Elite Club and the Wildcat Developmental Team for Amonte Sports. She also spent one season as an assistant coach for New Trier High School, helping the Trevians to the 2008 state championship.

She was also actively involved in Amonte Sports since her playing days at Northwestern, serving as a camp counselor as well as heading the development of New Wave lacrosse clinics for the organization and WomensLax.com, coordinating youth and high school clinics across the country. She also utilized her major, doing extensive work in video production for Amonte.

Primarily a defender during her collegiate career, she played in 72 games, including starts in 63 of a possible 64 her sophomore through senior years, all NCAA championship seasons. As a senior and team captain in 2007, she was an Inside Lacrosse third-team All-America selection when she was a key member of a defensive unit that allowed a NCAA-low 6.1 goals per game, with opponents scoring in double figures only twice. She played an important role on Northwestern's 2005, 2006 and 2007 national championship teams, scoring 14 goals, causing 44 turnovers and scooping up 101 ground balls. She earned four varsity letters and was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten team member.

Whidden was a four-year letter-winner in lacrosse at Ohio's Shaker Heights High, where she set a school record with 278 ground balls. She had 115 goals, 50 assists, 114 caused turnovers and 99 draw controls in her prep career. Whidden was a two-time All-America and first-team all-state selection, helping lead the Raiders to two state championships and four consecutive seasons of undefeated conference play. As a senior, she was the team captain and was named the Northeast Ohio Defender of the Year. Whidden also played goalie for the Ohio Flames ice hockey club team, which finished second at nationals in 2002, and lettered one year as a goalie on OSHH's field hockey team.

Ann Elliott Whidden married Nick Whidden in 2017. The couple resides in Boulder.
