**CAPTAINS** 

▶ **Records.** CU has won two straight in the series to cut the Washington lead to **12-7-1** (UW leads 5-3 in Boulder) ... Colorado is now **70-25** against unranked teams in the month of November dating back to 1985 ... CU is **6-0** at home in November dating back to 2019 (and is **6-1** in November under Dorrell).

- ► Senior Day Participants. Twelve players participated in CU's Senior Day ceremony pregame: Graduate Transfer (1)—TE Matt Lynch; Seniors (3)—DL Mustafa Johnson, OG Kary Kutsch, OLB Nate Landman; Juniors (8): OL John Deitchman, TE Nico Magri, S Chris Miller, PK Evan Price, C Colby Pursell, TE C.J. Schmanski, ILB Jonathan Van Diest and OLB Carson Wells.
- ▶ Third Down Feast or Famine. Washington was 14-of-21 on third down (13-of-18 at one point); the Huskies gained 10 or more yards 10 times. On the other, CU had three quarterback sacks and an interception.
- ▶ Another Defensive Battle?. The last three games in the series have yielded **111** points combined: Washington won 27-13 in Seattle in 2018; CU won 20-14 in Boulder in 2019 and 20-17 today.

- ▶ No Turnovers Again. CU did not have a turnover for the sixth game this year (adding to the school record); it has just one in the last four games.
- —95th game dating back to 1946 with none; CU is **62-29-4**.
- —CU forced four turnovers for the first time since the 2020 opener (four against UCLA); CU scored **17** points off the four today.
- —CU under Dorrell now has seven TO-free games in 17.
- —CU has **7** turnovers on the year, that is now the second-fewest in the NCAA, trailing only 6 by Toledo (which had zero today).
- ▶ First Career Start. OLB Devin Grant, who played for the first time last week, made his first career start.
- ▶ Late Cameo. ILB Nate Landman got in for the last three plays—on offense—when CU took three knees to end the game.
- ▶ 22:44. How long the game was tied; the most in a CU game in '21.
- ► Final Season Attendance. For six home games in 2021, CU's attendance was **278,906** an average of **46,484.3** per game. CU finished the year **4-2** at home as the 98th season at Folsom Field came to a close.
- ► Happy Birthday. S Curtis Appleton turned 22 today.

# ILB Robert Barnes (7,2-9 TT, 1 TFL, 1 INT, 1 FF)

► He had his best game as a Buffalo; he bested his tackle count of seven and solo number of six, both against Oregon State.

#### **QB Brendon Lewis (25-14-0, 112, 0 TD, 93.6 rating)**

▶ He has now thrown **108** consecutive passes without an interception; that is the most by a freshman at Colorado (Craig Ochs had the old mark of 104 without one over the course of four games in 2000). It is also the eighth-longest in school annals.

#### ILB Jack Lamb (1,2-3 TT, 1 FR, 1 QBH)

► He was more of a "horse than a lamb" ... His fumble recovery and return for 88 yards and a touchdown was third longest miscellaneous return in school history. The top 10:

### (7,0-7 TT; 3 TFL/2 QBS, 2 3DS/1 4DS, 3 QBH, 2 PBU, 1 FF)

- ► Closed out his CU career at home with a stat in eight categories; his three stops behind the line of scrimmage gives him 38 career TFL, which jumped him into a tie for eighth.
- ► After meeting with the media, he came back out



on to the field and lied down near the goalposts for a few minutes.
