THE SEASON: Colorado is 12-10 overall and 4-7 in the Pac-12 Conference after falling 75-69 at Oregon on Jan. 27. The Buffaloes dropped their fourth-straight on the road and overall have one win in their last five outings. That win was last-second, 58-55, decision at home against Washington State on Jan. 22.

On the Pac-12 leaderboard, Colorado is second in steals (8.2) and offensive rebounds (11.6 orpg), third in turnover margin (+0.5) and rebounding margin (+4.9) and fourth in scoring (72.1 ppg), defensive boards (26.5 drpg) and overall rebounding (38.1 rpg)

Sophomore **KJ Simpson** leads Colorado at 16.9 points and 3.8 assists per game. He also tops the Buffaloes in 3-pointers (33) and free throws made (74). Simpson's numbers have stayed steady during league games, averaging 15.7 points with a team-best 36 assists.

On the Pac-12 charts Simpson is third in scoring, fifth in free throw percentage (.796), seventh in assists, ninth in steals and 10th in assist-to-turnover ratio. He is the only player in the Pac-12 to rank in the Top 10 in all five of those categories.

Simpson has scored in double figures in 19 of his 21 games in 2022-23.

Junior forward **Tristan da Silva** is averaging 15.7 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.4 steals while shooting 52.8 percent from the field. He leads the team in shooting and steals and ranks second in scoring in rebounds. Da Silva has taken over the Buffaloes lead in scoring during conference games at 15.9 points an outing.

Da Silva led Colorado at Oregon with 23 points, hitting 8 of 14 from the field and a perfect 3 of 3 from 3-point range. It was da Silva's eighth career 20-point effort, but first away from the CU Events Center.

Da Silva had 27 points on 11 of 13 shooting against Washington State. He hit his first nine shots of the game, rebounding from an 8 for 21 showing against Washington. By making his last two attempts against Washington, he made 11 straight over two games, tying for the third-most consecutive field goals made by a Colorado player and most since Andre Roberson made 11-straight during the 2012 Pac-12 Tournament.

Da Silva's 11 field goals made tied his career-high, hitting that mark for the third time this season. His 84.6 percentage from the field ties CU's second-best single-game performance with at least 10 field goals made since the 1996-97. Marcus Hall was 11 of 13 against Missouri on Jan. 26, 2008, in Boulder. The top performance is David Harrison's school record 10 for 10 against Baylor on Jan. 31, 2004. His percentage under those same parameters, is the second-best in the Pac-12 this season trailing Utah's Branden Carlson three days earlier against the same Washington State team (11 for 12, .917).

On the Pac-12 charts, da Silva is fifth in 3-point percentage (.397), seventh in scoring and steals, 10th in shooting and 14th in defensive rebounds (3.9 drpg).

Junior **J'Vonne Hadley** leads the Buffaloes in rebounding (6.1 rpg) while ranking second on the team in shooting (.507) and third in steals (24) and scoring at 8.2 points per game.

On the Pac-12 charts, he is seventh in offensive boards (2.5 orgp), 11th in steals (1.2 spg), 13th in shooting and 14th overall rebounds.

Sophomore **Lawson Lovering** leads Colorado in blocks (20) while ranking fourth in rebounding (4.4 rpg). Lovering recorded his first double-double with a career-high 13 points and a team season-high 14 rebounds at USC. He had just eight points and seven rebounds in the previous three games combined. He has made 19 of 31 (.613) from the field in conference play.

Lovering is 11th in the Pac-12 in blocks at 1.0 per game.

Nique Clifford is averaging 6.4 points and 3.6 rebounds while ranking third on the team in assists with 35. Clifford had a career high 17 points hitting 7 of 11 from the field at Oregon. He tied personal-bests with his seven field goals made and with three steals.

Julian Hammond III is averaging 6.6 points and is second on the team in assists with 42. He scored a personal-high 18 points against Washington, leading the Buffaloes in scoring for the first time in his career. Hammond was a perfect 8 of 8 from the free throw line,

both career-highs, and the team's season-best for free throws made without a miss.

The 18-points against Washington was his fourth game scoring in double-figures this season, all coming in the last 10 games. Hammond had a team season-best 16-straight free throws made end with his first attempt against Washington State.

Luke O'Brien is averaging 4.7 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. He leads Colorado in rebounding in Pac-12 play at 5.8 per game, which also ranks 13th on the league leaderboard. He had a career-high 11 in the home win over Oregon.

Javon Ruffin is averaging 5.8 points and is second on the team in 3-point percentage (.365) and third in 3-pointers made (19). He had 11 points and was a career-best 7 of 7 from the free throw line at UCLA. Combined with his 12-point effort at USC, he scored in double-figures for the fourth time and first time in consecutive outings.

ABOUT THE BEAVERS: Oregon State is 8-13 overall and 2-8 in the Pac-12 after a 63-44 setback against Utah on Jan. 26. The Beavers have dropped seven of their last eight games. Oregon State averages 62.9 points per game, ranking next-to-last in the Pac-12. The Beavers are third in the conference in free throw shooting at 74.1 percent. Defensively, OSU allows 66.6 points while opponents shoot 42.1 percent.

Jordan Pope leads Oregon State at 12.3 points and 2.6 assists per game. He also tops the Beavers with 36 3-point field goals. Glenn Taylor Jr. is second on the team in scoring (11.3 ppg) and assists (52). Dzmityry Ryuny averages 5.0 points and leads OSU in rebounding at 4.7 per outing.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the 32nd meeting between Colorado and Oregon State with the Buffaloes holding a 21-10 advantage. Colorado has won three-straight and six of the last seven meetings including a 62-42 decision in Boulder on Jan. 7. Colorado has won 11 of 14 all-time meetings in Boulder. The series is tied at 6-6 in Corvallis where the Buffaloes have won the last three.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado is 2-1 against ranked teams in 2022-23. The Buffaloes had nonconference wins over No. 11 Tennessee, 78-66, on Nov. 13, and No. 24 Texas A&M, 103-75, on Nov. 18. In Pac-12 play, Colorado dropped a 68-54 decision at No. 7/6 UCLA on Jan. 14

Colorado's win over No. 24 Texas A&M gave the Buffaloes two wins over ranked teams away from home for the first time since 2012-13. It marked the first time since 2016-17 that the Buffaloes have won their first two games of a season against ranked opponents.

Colorado's win over the No. 11/11 ranked Vols is its first against a ranked opponent away from Boulder since the Buffaloes beat No. 13/12 Dayton, in Chicago, on Dec. 21, 2019. It's the highest ranked team the Buffaloes have defeated away from Boulder since the 92-88 overtime win over No. 6 Missouri in the quarterfinals of the 1990 Big Eight Tournament in Kansas City.

Colorado's 25 wins over ranked opponents in the Tad Boyle era is by far the best in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 25-43, have accounted for 36 percent of wins over ranked opponents (69) since 1949-50.

DEFENSE SHINES AGAINST OREGON SCHOOLS: Colorado hit some impressive defensive numbers in its home sweep of Oregon the Oregon schools at home, defeating Oregon 68-41 on Jan. 5 and following up with a 62-42 decision over Oregon State on Jan. 7.

BOULDER — The Colorado Buffaloes made sure complacency didn't set in Saturday night. Instead, Tad Boyle's Buffs ratcheted up the defensive pressure for the second game in a row and smothered Oregon State, 62-42, at the CU Events Center.

Colorado's second straight win and seventh in its last eight games improved CU to 11-6 overall and 3-3 in Pac-12 play. The Beavers lost their 17th straight road game and fell to 7-9, 1-4.

Two nights after stifling Oregon in a 68-41 win, the Buffs did the same to the Beavers. The Buffs held OSU to 28 percent shooting in the first half en route to taking a 33-18 lead at intermission and never allowed the Beavers to mount a rally in the second half to wrap up the win. The 83 points combined by CU's last two opponents were the fewest Colorado has yielded in back-to-back conference games since the 1948-49 season.

Tristan da Silva led CU in scoring for the second straight game, finishing with 17 points to go with five rebounds. **J'Vonne Hadley** added nine points, **Nique Clifford** chipped in eight and **KJ Simpson** returned to the lineup to tally six points, seven rebounds and six assists. **Luke O'Brien** led CU in rebounding for the second straight game, finishing with nine boards to go with four points.

Dexter Akanno finished with 10 points for OSU, the only Beaver in double figures. Oregon State's top two scorers, Jordan Pope and Glenn Taylor, finished with a combined nine points on 4-for-20 shooting.

Colorado held OSU to just 34 percent shooting (18-for-53) and had a 38-34 edge on the boards. CU shot just 41 percent (21-for-51) but also collected 15 points off 19 Oregon State turnovers.

"That's testament to our players and what they're capable of," Boyle said. "They really responded to the challenge that we gave them earlier this week and we put back-to-back efforts together. We weren't at our best offensively, but when you can win going away and you're shooting 41 percent, you know you're doing something really good on the other end."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs jumped out to an early lead and never trailed. Colorado built a 9-2 edge five minutes in, thanks in large part to a defense that forced six straight empty OSU possessions to open the game.

Colorado then steadily built its margin. A 7-0 run gave the Buffs a 19-6 edge midway through the half as the Buffs continued to exert defensive pressure on the Beavers. CU held Oregon State to 8-for-23 shooting in the first half, and a 10-0 run that included a Hadley dunk and a Simpson 3-pointer gave Colorado a 20-point cushion, 33-13, with 2:36 to play in the half.

"We're a versatile team," Hadley said. "When we dig down deep, we can be a really good defensive team." Colorado's 10-0 run sparked an OSU timeout and the Beavers responded with five points in the final two minutes of the half.

Still, the Buffs had a comfortable 33-18 edge at intermission and they didn't let up in the second half. CU pushed its lead to as much as 21 early in the period on a Clifford 3-pointer and maintained a comfortable double-digit edge for the rest of the game.

OSU never came closer than 14 in the second half and the Buffs pushed their lead back to 20 down the stretch. Simpson, who missed the Oregon game with an illness, struggled from the floor, shooting just 1-for-8. But he made big contributions in other areas, dishing out six assists and grabbing seven rebounds.

"He was really unselfish tonight," Boyle said. "Six assists is a good number for him. There's gonna be nights we need him to score and there's going to be nights we need him to distribute. It was good to have him back."

One critical element of Saturday's win was that Colorado never allowed the Beavers to mount a serious rally — the second game in a row the Buffs built a big lead and protected it to the end.

"The key is keeping the intensity level up and the focus level up for 40 minutes," Boyle said. "We've done that back-to-back games now."

Colorado's 83 points allowed in those two games is its fewest in back-to-back league outings since allowing 81 in back-to-back Big Seven Conference games during the 1948-49 season:

Jan. 24, 1949 at Iowa State, L 31-40
 Jan. 29, 1949 vs. Kansas State, W 48-41

It was the fewest in back-to-back league home games since allowing 79 in the Mountain States era:

Jan. 11, 1946 vs. Utah, W, 47-40
 Jan. 18, 1946 vs. Utah State W, 59-39

It's the fewest in any back-to-back games since allowing 67 in 2011-12:

Dec. 28, 2011 vs. New Orleans, W 92-34
 Dec. 31, 2011 vs. Utah, W, 73-33

The 41 points against Oregon and 42 points against Oregon State represent the second and third lowest conference opponent totals the Pac-12 era. Colorado also held Oregon to 26.9 percent from the field, the second fewest by a Buffaloes' conference opponent in the Pac-12 era.

SCORING IN BUNCHES: With **Tristan da Silva's** 30-point effort against Oregon, it marks the first time since 2014-15 the Buffaloes have two different players score at least 30 points in a game (along with **KJ Simpson**). Askia Booker had two 30-plus point games (30 vs. Arizona on Jan 15, 2015 and 43 at USC on Jan. 29, 2015) while Josh Scott had the other (32 vs. Washington State on March 7, 2015)

Da Silva and Simpson have combined for eight games of 25-plus points, the most since Derrick White (7) and Xavier Johnson (2) combined for nine in 2016-17.

SCORING IN BUNCHES II: A pair of individual scoring streaks that hadn't been accomplished in over five years has happened twice already this season by two different players.

Tristan da Silva had three straight games of 20-plus points to round out the nonconference schedule. He's the first Buffalo to achieve that since Derrick White in the final three games of the 2016-17 season (two Pac-12 Tournament, one NIT).

In that span, da Silva had two 25-plus point outings which hadn't happened since George King scored 25 in back-to-back games against Mercer and Air Force Nov. 19 & 26, 2017.

KJ Simpson has matched both feats over the course of his last three games with 21 against Southern Utah, a career-high 31 against Stanford and 25 at California.

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD: Colorado has a 36-34 record in games away from Boulder since February 2019; 19-26 on the road and 17-8 at neutral sites. The Buffaloes are 3-8 away from home this season. Colorado was 9-6 away from home in 2021-22; 6-4 in true road games and 3-2 at neutral sites.

Colorado is 12-14 over its last 24 Pac-12 road games (since the beginning of the 2020-21 season). The Buffaloes have won at least one game during eight of its last nine multi-contest Pac-12 road trips.

Colorado's 6-4 record on the road in the Pac-12 last year marked its first winning conference road record since 1963-64, when the Buffaloes were 4-3 in the Big Eight Conference. Colorado also had its first overall winning road record since the 1968-69 Big Eight championship team was 6-5.

LEADERS OF THE PAC: Colorado is tied for the fourth-most wins (89) among Pac-12 teams since February 2019. Colorado was 12-4 over the final two months of the 2018-19 season, culminating in a spot in the NIT Quarterfinals. The Buffaloes were 21-11 in 2019-20, well in line for an NCAA Tournament bid before the season was shut down on March 12 due to the coronavirus pandemic. Colorado was 23-9 in 2020-21, tying for the third best win total in team history and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Buffaloes were 21-12 in 2021-22, logging their fourth-straight 20-win season.

In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is 173-36 at home (.828). The Buffaloes are 486-187 (.722) all-time at the CU EC. The Buffaloes, 12-6 at the CU EC in 2021-22, have won at least 10 games at home each of the last 13 seasons.

GOLD STANDARD: Colorado is 83-6 in the Tad Boyle era when meeting the program's "Gold Standard" of holding an opponent to 40 percent or less from the field and having a plus-8 rebounding edge. The Buffaloes are 3-1 in hitting those two numbers this season after holding Oregon to 26.9 percent from the field and enjoying a plus-18 advantage on the boards (46-28).

Colorado had a rare hiccup against Arizona State while meeting the "Gold Standard" The Buffaloes fell 60-59 to ASU despite holding the Sun Devils to 39.3 percent shooting and enjoying a plus-13 edge on the boards (47-34).

Against Tennessee, Colorado held Tennessee to 25.4 percent shooting while outrebounding the Vols by nine (47-38).

Tennessee's 25.4 percent shooting was the lowest by a CU opponent since Utah shot just 22.6 percent against the Buffaloes on Dec. 31, 2011 – the program's first Pac-12 game.

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Colorado has earned three Pac-12 Player of the Week honors this season. KJ Simpson has won twice (Nov. 14 & Jan. 2) with Tristan da Silva taking the third (Jan. 9). It's the second time the Buffaloes have two different players earn Pac-12 Player of the Week honors in the same season, joining Askia Booker and Andre Roberson in 2012-13.

In his most recent honor, Simpson averaged 28.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 1.5 steals during the Bay Area road split. He shot 48.8 percent from the field (21-43) and 83.3 percent from the free throw line (10-12).

Simpson had a monster game at Stanford, scoring a career-high 31 points, hitting 11 of 23 from the field and 8 of 9 from the free throw line. He's the first Buffalo to have multiple 30-point games in a single season since Derrick White had four in 2016-17. His 31 points were the most by a Buffalo since White had 31 against Arizona in the quarterfinals of the 2017 Pac-12 Tournament.

Against Cal, Simpson had 25 points on 10 of 20 shooting along with five assists and a pair of steals. He scored 16 of his points in the final 2:06 of the game, as the Buffaloes nearly erased a 21-point second half deficit.

Back in November, Simpson averaged 17.7 points, 5.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists in Colorado's first three games. He shot 41 percent from the field (17-42) and 72 percent from the free throw line (13-18).

Simpson recorded his first career double-double with 23 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Tennessee on Nov. 13. Both figures were career highs for Simpson at the time as was his seven field goals made. Coming off the bench, he had 15 points, seven rebounds and hit 7 of 9 free throws in the second half alone.

Simpson also led the Buffaloes in the Grambling State game, on Nov. 11, with 16 points and a season-high four assists. He scored 14 points on 50 percent shooting (5-10), with three assists and two steals in the opener against UC Riverside on Nov. 7.

Da Silva earned his first Pac-12 Player of the Week honor after averaging 23.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.0 assists during the home sweep of the Oregon schools. He shot 66.7 percent from the field (18-27), including 4 of 7 from 3-point range, and 70 percent from the free throw line (7-10).

Da Silva scored a career-high 30 points in the win over Oregon, hitting 11 of 18 from the field, including 3 of 4 from 3-point range. His field goals tied career-highs with 11 field goals as did his seven free throw attempts (5 of 7) and three steals. He had 17 points, on 7 of 10 shooting, five rebounds and a pair of steals against Oregon State.

EARLIEST TWO RANKED OPPONENTS IN 49 YEARS: With Colorado's matchup against No. 24 (AP) Texas A&M, the Buffaloes faced two ranked opponents within the first five games of the season for the first time since Dec. 3&5, 1973. Both of those contests happened in Boulder, with Colorado dropping a 91-76 decision to No. 15 Arizona in the second game of the season on Dec. 3, 1973 and then rebounding two days later with a 73-71 decision over No. 12 Long Beach State.

Colorado entered the Myrtle Beach Invitational coming off a 78-66 win over No. 11 (AP & Coaches) Tennessee in Nashville on Nov. 13.

One more recent season came close to that span. On Nov. 26-27, 1998, Colorado played No. 4 Kentucky (L, 52-64) and No. 10 Xavier (L, 64-74) in San Juan, P.R. in games No. 5 & 6 of that young season.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION VS A&M: Colorado's 103 points scored against Texas A&M set a Myrtle Beach Invitational single-game record. Overall for the Buffaloes, it's the most points, in regulation, since scoring 104 against Longwood on Dec. 19, 2010. CU had 112 points in a double-overtime win over South Dakota State on Dec. 15, 2017.

Colorado's 103 points are its most against a ranked opponent and the 28-point margin of victory is CU's highest against a ranked opponent. It's the largest margin of victory by any Pac-12 school over a ranked SEC opponent since the 1980-81 season.

Colorado's 16 3-point field goals tied for the third most in one game. It's the fourth time the Buffs have hit 16, last done against Arizona in the 2022 Pac-12 semifinals.

Colorado shot 57.6 percent from the field, its best mark since the Buffaloes hit 60.7 percent against Georgetown in the first round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament.

ROAD RARITY: Colorado opened the 2021-22 season at the friendly confines of the CU Events Center with a win over UC Riverside on Nov. 7, but then ventured on a 12-day, 5-game road trip.

The last time the Buffaloes endured a string where five of the first six games in a season were played away from home, was in 1955-56. Coming off its second NCAA Final Four, Colorado played eight of its first nine away from home.

The Buffaloes opened with wins at future conference foes Oregon State and Oregon then returned home for a rematch of the 1955 NCAA Third Place game where the Buffaloes were victorious again with a 60-57 win over Iowa. Colorado then had back-to-back road games at BYU and another at Colorado State before finishing off with three games at the Big Seven Christmas Tournament in Kansas City. The Buffaloes were 4-5 during that nine-game stretch.

Colorado does have a recent string of five-straight away from home. During the 2020-21 COVID-19 scheduling shuffles, the Buffaloes played neutral games in Las Vegas against Washington and Grand Canyon (Dec. 20 & 22) and then briefly returned to Boulder before starting the Pac-12 season at Arizona, USC and UCLA (Dec. 28-Jan. 2) going 3-2 in that span.

PAC-12/SWAC LEGACY SERIES: The Colorado-Grambling State game was part of the Pac-12 Conference/Southwest Athletic Conference Legacy Series, an educational and basketball scheduling partnership between the two leagues.

The 2022 edition features six men's and six women's Pac-12 programs beginning a home-and-home series with SWAC institutions. The series began with the Oregon men hosting Florida A&M on Nov. 7, an 80-45 victory for the Ducks.

Colorado was the first to be a road opponent as the Buffaloes visited Grambling State and marked Tigers have hosted a Power 5 opponent in their history. Grambling will make a return visit to Boulder in 2023-24.

The morning of the game, Colorado will toured the Eddie G. Robinson museum near the Grambling campus. The museum is a landmark dedicated to recognizing the contributions of the school's legendary football coach as a source of education and inspiration.

OPENERS: Colorado improved to 85-35 (.708) in all-time season openers and has won its last seven. The Buffaloes are 11-2 under head coach **Tad Boyle** and 38-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes are 96-24 (.800) all-time in home openers, have won their last 15 and 21 of their last 22. Boyle's teams are 13-0 in home openers.

BUFFS SIGN ELITE TRIO: Cody Williams, Courtney Anderson and Assane Diop have signed National Letters of Intent continue their education and play basketball at Colorado. Williams and Anderson signed on Nov. 9, the first day of the NCAA Early Signing Period. Diop signed on Nov. 15.

Williams, a 6-foot, 8-inch, 180-pound small forward from Gilbert, Ariz., is a five-star recruit, ranked as the No. 21 overall prospect in the nation by 247Sports. Anderson, a 6-5, 180-pound guard from Vallejo, Calif., is ranked as the 31st best shooting guard in the nation by that same service. Diop, a 6-10, 200-pound do-it-all forward is a consensus Top 100 pick and the second-ranked recruit in the state of Colorado.

Heading into his senior year at Perry High School, Williams is the highest ranked, and first five-star, recruit in the Boyle era. He is the Buffaloes' first five-star prospect, and highest rated, since McDonald's All-American David Harrison was listed as the 10th best player in the nation by Rivals in 2001.

Williams, the younger brother of Jalen Williams, the 12th pick of the 2022 NBA Draft by Oklahoma City, is No. 14 in ESPN's Top 100. He played for the Vegas Elite in the EYBL this summer, averaging 15 points and four rebounds on that circuit.

Anderson was a San Francisco Chronicle All-Metro pick and All-Bay Area as a junior at Dublin High School. The All-East Bay Athletic League pick averaged 20.1 points and nearly five rebounds a game, helping the Gaels to an 8-1 league record and a spot in the North Coast Section Open Division tournament.

Anderson is rated as a three-star guard by Rivals and the 18th best player in the state of California by ESPN. He is the son of former NFL tight end, Courtney Sr.

A native of Senegal, Diop has lived in Colorado the last three years, moving to the United States to pursue basketball and educational opportunities. He is currently preparing for his senior season at Accelerated Prep, a private basketball program associated with Accelerated Schools of Denver. Diop is rated No. 56 overall in the ESPN Top100 and 10th best at his position. He is ranked No. 91 in the nation according to 247Sports Composite Rankings and the 12th-best post player in the nation. Diop is in the No. 110 position according to Rivals.

Diop helped Westminster's Belleview Christian to the Colorado Class 1A State Championship as a sophomore in 2020-21. Diop spent his junior season at Denver Prep Academy, playing on The Grind Session, a national-travel basketball circuit, averaging eight points and nearly nine rebounds per game.

At the time of Diop's signing, Colorado had the 15th best class in the nation according to 247Sports and the 19th best on Rivals' list.

PRESEASON AWARDS/POLLS: Junior forward **Tristan da Silva** was named to the 2022-23 men's basketball Preseason All-Pac-12 Conference Second Team, voted on by media members who cover the league on Oct. 24.

In addition, sophomore guard **KJ Simpson** earned honorable mention, receiving at least eight media member votes.

A 6-foot, 9-inch forward from Munich, Germany, da Silva is Colorado's leading returning scorer from a year ago at 9.4 points per game. He ranked second on the team in field goal shooting (.479) and free throw percentage (.797), third in assists (61) and fourth in scoring and rebounding (3.5 rpg). During conference games, da Silva ranked third in 3-point percentage (.477), sixth in free throw percentage (.822) and ninth in overall field goal shooting (.525) on the league leaderboard.

Da Silva was one of five players on the Preseason All-Pac-12 Second Team. There are 10 players on the first team.

Simpson, a 6-2 guard from West Hills, Calif., was an All-Pac-12 Freshman Team selection in 2021-22 after averaging 7.4 points per game and leading the Buffaloes in assists (86) and steals (26). His 86 assists tied for the eighth most in a season by a CU freshman.

The Buffaloes, coming off their fourth-straight 20-win season, were picked to finish sixth in the annual Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll with 207 points. UCLA was the favorite with 386 points and 26 of 33 first place votes. Arizona was second (352) and Oregon was third (336) with those teams recording three first place votes each. USC was fourth (300) and Stanford was fifth (239) along with one first place vote.

Arizona State was picked seventh (193), followed by Washington State (185), Washington (158), Utah (102), California (69) and Oregon State (47).

BOULDER — Colorado produced balanced scoring and the Buffaloes received some solid performances from their newcomers Monday as CU opened the season with an 82-66 win over UC Riverside at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs built a double-digit lead midway through the first half and held a 46-28 edge at intermission. CU then built the lead into the 20s in the second half before allowing the Highlanders to momentarily close the gap to 10 late in the period.

The Buffs finished with four players in double figures, led by J'Vonne Hadley. The junior college transfer just missed a double-double in his CU debut, finishing with 16 points and nine rebounds. Point guard KJ Simpson scored 14, Tristan da Silva scored 12 points and grabbed five rebounds and Jalen Gabbidon, a transfer from Yale, also had 12.

Colorado shot 47 percent from the floor (30-for-64) and held Riverside to 40 percent shooting (29-for-72), including just 4-for-21 from 3-point range. The Buffs also forced 15 turnovers, which they converted into 22 points, but they did lose the rebound battle, 44-43.

"Good win," said Boyle, who picked up career win No. 255 and is now just seven victories away from becoming the program's all-time winningest coach. "First games are never easy. You never quite know what to expect... Some good things we can build on and a lot of things we can learn from."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led early, 10-5, before the Highlanders put together a 10-4 run to take a 15-14 lead with 11:13 to play in the first half.

But the Buffs quickly righted themselves after a timeout, putting together a 14-0 run to take control. Nique Clifford had a 3-pointer early in the surge, da Silva added another triple three possessions later and Gabbidon wrapped it up with a second-chance bucket and free throw to give Colorado a 28-15 edge with 7:46 still to play in the half.

The Buffs then maintained their double-digit edge the rest of the half, building it to as much as 19 (45-26) before heading into intermission with a 46-28 edge.

Colorado finished the first half with 10 assists on 19 baskets while forcing nine UCR turnovers on the defensive end that led to 15 CU points. The Buffs used 10 different players in the first half, with nine breaking into the scoring column.

CU pushed its cushion to 21 early in the second half before UCR made a brief run with an 8-0 surge to pull within 55-42, prompting a Boyle timeout.

The Buffs responded by stopping the Highlanders run and building the lead back into the 20s. UCR managed to cut Colorado's cushion back down to 10 in the final minutes but could never come closer.

The 6-foot-6 Hadley had an excellent night on both ends of the floor, adding a block, a steal and three assists to his 16 points and nine boards. The Buffs were a plus-23 when he was on the floor, and he consistently showed an ability to guard bigger players.

Hadley played high school ball in St. Paul, Minn. (where he was also a stand-out football player), and played AAU ball with former Gonzaga star and current NBA rookie Chet Holmgren. He spent his first year in college at Northeastern before transferring to Indian Hills Community College, where he earned JC All-American honors.

"I've always had that sort of grit to me," Hadley said. "Growing up I've always been kind of counted out. Not a lot of people thought I could play at this level. That's one of the biggest things that I've come to wear every single night. Just proving that I belong here. I can play at this level."

Boyle said Buffs fans will no doubt quickly come to appreciate Hadley's play.

"He makes winning plays," Boyle said. "He plays with unbelievable energy and a lot of heart. Our fans are going to fall in love with J'Vonne because he brings it every day."

GRAMBLING, La. — Colorado found itself in an early hole and it was too much to climb out of as the Buffaloes dropped an 83-74 decision to Grambling State Friday at the Fredrick C. Hobby Center.

Colorado, which never led, fell behind by as much as 19 mid-way through the first half. While the Buffaloes were able to close the gap to single digits at a couple points in the second half, they never got closer than seven.

Colorado turned the ball over 19 times and struggled on the defensive end, allowing Grambling State to shoot 50 percent for the game.

KJ Simpson led Colorado with 16 points, but only hit 5 of 16 from the field. Nique Clifford tied a career-high with 15 points along with six rebounds and three steals.

Shawndarius Cowart had a game-high 19 points and six assists for the Tigers. Cameron Christian had 17 points, hitting 9 of 11 free throws.

"We played like we expected them to roll over and bow down to us," Colorado head coach Tad Boyle said. "I don't know what our guys were thinking in that regard, but we weren't good on either side of the ball tonight. We give up 50 percent field goal percentage defense and then we turn the ball over 19 times. I don't care who you're playing, you're not beating anybody."

Fourteen of those 19 turnovers came from perimeter players. The Tigers enjoyed a 12-point advantage in points off turnovers in the first half alone (14-2).

Grambling State shot exactly 50 percent from the field (26-52) and 41.2 percent from downtown (7-17). Every time the Buffaloes made a mini-run, the Tigers answered.

"Grambling was the more aggressive team, they played like they wanted to win this game more than we did," Boyle said.

CONWAY, S.C. — Colorado rallied late Thursday but could not completely overcome an 11-point second-half deficit as the Buffaloes dropped a 66-63 decision to Massachusetts in the first round of the Myrtle Beach Invitational.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 2-2 with the loss while UMass improved to 2-1. Colorado trailed 58-47 with 7:31 to play after an 11-0 Minutemen run. But the Buffs managed to whittle the deficit down to two in the final minutes and had several chances to tie the game or take the lead.

But CU came up empty each time. Colorado missed a 3-pointer with 13 seconds remaining that would have given the Buffs the lead and two more 3-point tries in the final six seconds that would have tied the game.

Colorado struggled on the offensive end all day. The Buffs finished just 25-for-73 from the floor, including an 11-for-37 second half. CU also allowed UMass to shoot 47 percent from the floor. The Buffs attempted 20 more field goals than the Minutemen but had trouble finishing their opportunities all day.

Tristan da Silva led CU with 17 points on 8-for-15 shooting. Guard **KJ Simpson** finished with 13 points, but shot just 4-for-16 from the floor. Center **Lawson Loving** had a career-best eight points, five rebounds and three assists.

Noah Fernandes led UMass with 22 points while freshmen reserve guard **RJ Luis** had 18.

"UMass is extremely physical and sometimes the whistle doesn't go your way away from home," Boyle said. "You have to figure out a way to finish. We had some really good looks that didn't go in. We have to be tough and UMass was the tougher team."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After a first half that featured eight ties and 12 lead changes, Colorado trailed, 37-34, at the break. The Buffs held a six-point edge early, but the Minutemen came back, hitting 53.3 percent of their shots in the opening 20 minutes to take the lead at intermission.

The key stretch came midway through the second half. UMass used an 11-0 run to turn a 47-47 tie into a 58-47 lead and Colorado never completely closed the deficit again.

CU played better on the defensive end in the second half but the Buffs never found an offensive rhythm. Colorado missed 10 straight field goal tries in a five-minute scoring drought that allowed UMass to build its big lead.

Colorado did manage to whittle away at the lead down the stretch. CU used a 6-0 run to pull within 61-58 with 4:12 left to play, fueled by a da Silva baseline drive and dunk and four free throws.

But CU then missed several opportunities to close the gap over the next two minutes and UMass pushed its lead back to seven, 65-58, with 1:26 left to play.

Colorado had one more rally in the waning minutes. Da Silva drained a long 3-pointer with just 1:17 to play and CU trailed by four, 65-61.

Colorado then cut the deficit to just two with under a minute to play on a da Silva fadeaway, then missed an opportunity to take the lead seconds later when a da Silva 3-pointer drew iron.

Following a Fernandes free throw that pushed the Minutemen's lead back to three, 66-63, Simpson missed two 3-point tries in the final six seconds to hand UMass the win.

"We put ourselves in that situation," da Silva said. "It's all about energy from the get go. That's what it ultimately comes down to."

CU shot just 11-for-37 from the field in the second half and just 4-for-9 from the free throw line.

The Buffs started the game quickly, hitting six of their first eight shots to take a 13-7 lead less than five minutes in. **Julian Hammond III** had a 3-pointer early and Simpson had four points to help Colorado push ahead early.

But the Minutemen responded with a 7-0 run, aided by two Colorado turnovers, and the game became a see-saw affair the rest of the half. The first period featured eight ties and 12 lead changes.

The Buffs didn't help their cause on the offensive end. CU hit just eight of its final 28 field goal tries of the half while the Minutemen warmed up. UMass finished the first half 16-for-30 from the field and Colorado trailed, 37-34, at the break.

CONWAY, S.C. — Tad Boyle's Colorado Buffaloes have developed an interesting pattern this year — lose when favored, then knock off a ranked team in their next outing.

The Buffs completed the pattern for the second time in this young season Friday, bouncing back from an opening loss to UMass in the Myrtle Beach Invitational to dominate No. 24 Texas A&M in a 103-75 win in the consolation bracket.

The Buffaloes used a career-best 30 points from guard **KJ Simpson** to improve to 3-2 while the Aggies dropped to 2-2.

Colorado will next play in the tourney's fifth place game Sunday at 5 p.m. CU's win over the Aggies came just five days after a 78-66 victory over No. 11 Tennessee — which came on the heels of a surprising loss to Grambling State.

True to form, the Buffs were once again a different team Friday than the squad that lost its previous outing. CU jumped on the Aggies early and never let up, building a 54-33 lead at intermission and extending the cushion to as much as 33 in the second half.

Simpson was one of four Buffs in double figures, shooting 11-for-17 from the floor (4-for-8 from 3-point range) to finish with 30 points, seven rebounds, six steals and three assists. Reserve **Ethan Wright** added 15 points — all on 3-pointers — while **Javon Ruffin** had 14 points and **Nique Clifford** chipped in 11.

Colorado finished a blistering 34-for-59 from the field, including 16-for-32 from long range. The Buffs racked up a season-best 22 assists and also had a 35-28 edge on the boards.

Defensively, CU resorted to a rarely used zone and the strategy befuddled the Aggies the entire game. Texas A&M shot 24-for-60 from the floor and just 7-for-20 from beyond the arc.

"We did a great job of sharing the ball," said Boyle, who collected win No. 257 as CU's head coach, four away from tying the all-time program record. "We had 22 assists — that's what happens when you share the ball and make shots. But I told our team I'm tired of bounce-back wins. Now let's build off some wins. That's the next step."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado used a 15-2 run midway through the first half to take control and the Buffs never let the Aggies back in the game.

Wright started the surge with his first two 3-pointers in the run and Simpson had seven points as Colorado turned a 14-12 deficit into a 27-16 lead with 8:24 to play in the half. The Buffs continued to build the lead, extending their edge to as much as 24 just before halftime. CU hit six 3-pointers in the final five minutes of the period, with Ruffin, **Jalen Gabbidon**, Clifford, Simpson and Wright all delivering from long distance.

Wright's third 3-pointer of the half gave Colorado a 24-point lead before the Aggies collected a trey with 25 seconds left in the half to cut the Buffs' lead to 54-33 at the break.

"We were all disappointed after (Thursday)," Simpson said. "We were locked in this morning. We wanted to play with the energy we should have had yesterday."

Colorado shot 18-for-31 from the floor in the first half, including a 10-for-19 effort from long range. The Buffs finished with 14 assists in the first period, with five different Buffs having at least two.

Colorado's defense, meanwhile, held the Aggies to 10-for-28 shooting and the Buffs also had a 19-11 edge on the boards.

"I think our zone defense kept them on their heels," Boyle said.

The Buffs didn't let up in the second half. Colorado pushed its lead to 30 midway through the period and extended the cushion to as much as 33. The Aggies never mounted anything that resembled a serious comeback down the stretch as Colorado maintained pressure on both ends of the court until the final buzzer.

"We wanted to be able to play our game plan and at our pace," Simpson said. "It's good to beat these

BOULDER — Colorado put three players into double figures Sunday and the Buffaloes held off a Yale rally in the final minutes to collect a 65-62 win at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 4-3 while the Bulldogs suffered their first loss of the season, dropping to 6-1.

The Buffs led from the outset and built their margin to as much as 12 late in the first half. But Colorado could never completely put the Bulldogs away as they stayed within range to the end, closing the gap to one in the final seconds before the Buffs finally clinched the win at the free throw line.

Tristan da Silva led CU with 20 points, **J'Vonnie Hadley** added 12 and **KJ Simpson** chipped in 10.

Yale's John Poulakidas led all scorers with 22 points on 6-for-8 shooting from long range.

CU shot just 42 percent from the floor (25-for-59) while the Bulldogs hit 45 percent of their shots. Yale also had a 37-33 edge on the boards, but Colorado hit 11 of 16 free throw attempts while the Bulldogs shot just one free throw the entire game.

"We beat a really, really good program team that's really well coached," Boyle said. "I've got such respect for James Jones and what he's done with that program. We were fortunate to win this game. We snuck out of this one with a win and I think as we hit league play, at least our guys understand that nothing's going to be easy. Our guys showed grit and toughness down the stretch but there are still areas we can improve on."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led by 10 at intermission, 38-28, but the Buffs couldn't administer a knockout punch.

Yale cut CU's cushion down to two, 48-46, with 12:25 to play before the Buffs pushed the margin back to 11 with a 6-0 run. Hadley, returning to the lineup after missing two games with an injury, had four points in the surge.

But the Bulldogs kept coming back. Yale slowly chipped away at the lead and with 1:49 to play, cut the CU margin to 61-58 on a Poulakidas 3-pointer. Less than a minute later, Yale narrowed the deficit to one on a Bez Mbeng drive to the hoop.

Colorado then came up empty on its next possession and Yale had a chance to take the lead.

But the Buffs then came up with a pair of decisive defensive plays. Colorado forced a Yale turnover on the Bulldogs' next trip down the court and **Julian Hammond III** was fouled. Hammond hit two free throws with 10 seconds left to give CU a 63-60 lead.

Yale still had a chance to tie the game on its ensuing possession, but Simpson produced another turnover. Colorado's **Jalen Gabbidon** — who transferred to CU from Yale in the offseason — finally clinched the win with a pair of free throws with five seconds remaining.

"Those were two big plays for us down the stretch," Boyle said. "KJ knocking that ball away and Julian knocking down those free throws."

The Bulldogs produced a layup at the buzzer to finish the scoring.

The Buffs led by 11 midway through the half, 19-8, before the Bulldogs shaved the cushion down to four with four straight 3-pointers.

But following a timeout, Colorado slowly rebuilt its edge to double digits. Da Silva, Simpson and **Ethan Wright** all had buckets at the rim over a three-minute stretch while CU's defense forced five straight empty Yale possessions to give Colorado a 30-20 edge with just under four minutes to play.

Da Silva finished with season highs in points (20) and rebounds (6).

"Coach told me to go out and play my game," da Silva said. "If I'm aggressive, it helps the team. It's something coach and I talked about."

The two teams then traded buckets down the final minutes of the half and CU carried a 38-28 lead into the break.

Da Silva led the Buffs with 11 points and six rebounds in the first 20 minutes in his best half of the season. CU shot 44 percent from the floor and held a 20-10 edge in points in the paint.

BOULDER — Colorado let a 15-point halftime lead melt away in the second half Thursday and the Buffaloes dropped a 60-59 decision to Arizona State at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 4-4 overall and 0-1 in Pac-12 play and have yet to win or lose two games in a row this season. The Sun Devils improved to 7-1, 1-0.

Colorado led 38-23 at the half and still had a double-digit cushion with under eight minutes to play. But the Buffs went cold on the offensive end and committed some critical turnovers to allow ASU to forge its comeback.

CU still had a two-point lead with under a minute to play. But the Buffs committed a turnover on one possession, then missed the front end of a one-and-one free throw with 12 seconds remaining.

That was enough time for Desmond Cambridge to hit the game-winning 3-pointer for ASU with 2.9 seconds on the clock.

The Buffs finished the game with 20 turnovers — 12 in the second half. ASU was more than happy to convert those errors into 22 points, just enough to make up for the Sun Devils' 5-for-26 night from 3-point range.

The Buffs dominated the boards, 37-24, and held ASU to 24-for-61 shooting. But CU shot just 38 percent for the game, including a dismal 29 percent in the second half. Colorado had just six field goals after intermission.

KJ Simpson led Colorado with 13 points on 5-for-16 shooting and **Tristan da Silva** added 10 points and a career-high eight rebounds.

ASU, which was missing two key players because of illness and a suspension, was led by Devan Cambridge's 18 points.

The Buffs also hurt themselves at the free throw line, shooting 9-for-17 from the charity stripe. CU missed the front end of two one-and-one situations in the final three minutes, including one with 12 seconds remaining. Two made free throws would have given Colorado a four-point lead.

Instead, the front-end miss opened the door for ASU's game winner.

"This one stings," Boyle said. "This is easily one of the top five losses in the 13 years I've been at Colorado. We let our fans down. I let them down. The players let them down ... We wilted to their pressure. As a coach that's really hard to deal with. I have to do a better job."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs led by 15 at the half, 38-23. But they couldn't put the Sun Devils away, as ASU narrowed the deficit to 47-37 with 11:43 still to play.

ASU continued its comeback after a timeout, finally cutting Colorado's lead to six, 48-42. The Buffs committed six turnovers in a 5:31 span to help the Sun Devils forge their comeback. After the sixth of those miscues led to an ASU breakout dunk, Boyle called time out.

The timeout briefly stopped the bleeding. CU ended a six-minute scoring drought with a da Silva layup, then added an **Ethan Wright** 3-pointer — and it was ASU's turn to call timeout with Colorado holding a 53-42 edge.

CU then briefly built its margin to 12 before the Sun Devils put together a 13-0 run. Alonzo Gaffney hit a 3-pointer, DJ Home scored inside, Desmond Cambridge hit a 3-pointer and his brother Devan drained another. With 2:34 remaining, the Sun Devils held a 57-56 lead.

But following another timeout, the Buff finally ended a four-minute scoring drought when **Jalen Gabbidon** hit three free throws to help Colorado regain the lead, 59-57.

Colorado did come up with two defensive stops in the final minute but the Buffs also had a key turnover with 29 seconds remaining.

Still, CU had one more chance to put the game away when a da Silva blocked shot and rebound forced ASU to foul Simpson. But Simpson missed the front end of a one-and-one with 12 seconds to play.

Devan Cambridge then drained his game winner with 2.9 ticks left on the clock.

CU had one more chance with the ball, but a Simpson 3-pointer at the buzzer missed its mark and the Sun Devils walked off with the win.

BOULDER — Colorado coach **Tad Boyle** wanted a 40-minute effort from his Buffaloes on Thursday against rival Colorado State. They delivered with one of their best overall games of the season. CU exploded in the second half to bury CSU, 93-65, before an ecstatic CU Events Center crowd of 10,033 that included an appearance from new CU football coach Deion "Coach Prime" Sanders.

The Buffs improved to 5-5 with the win while CSU dropped to 6-4. The first half featured seven lead changes and four ties before the Buffs used a late 10-2 run to take a 38-30 lead at intermission. Colorado then put the game away quickly in the second half, opening with a 15-6 surge and building its lead to as much as 29 in the final minutes.

CU sophomore guard **KJ Simpson** led the Buffs with 27 points — 18 in the second half — including a career-best 5-for-8 effort from long range. **Tristan da Silva** added 15 points. **Nique Clifford** chipped in 13 and **Luke O'Brien** tallied a career-high 10. **J'Vonne Hadley** just missed a double-double, finishing with nine points and nine rebounds.

Isaiah Stevens led CSU with 15 points. Colorado dominated nearly every statistical category. CU shot 57 percent (38-for-67), including a blistering 64 percent in the second half. Colorado held the Rams to just 42 percent shooting and also commanded a 42-23 edge on the boards.

The Buffs finished with a 54-24 lead in points in the paint and produced 20 points off 13 CSU turnovers. CU's dominance on the boards included 13 offensive rebounds, which the Buffs converted into 18 points.

"We showed tonight how good this team can be," said Boyle, who won his 259th game at CU, two away from all-time leader Sox Walseth. "Our defensive intensity and energy level was off the charts."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado broke away from a 28-28 tie with a 10-2 run over the final four minutes of the first half, then put the game away with a 15-6 surge in the opening four minutes of the second half.

Simpson sparked the decisive second-half run with a pair of 3-pointers and two drives to the rim, along with an assist on a da Silva 3-pointer. Simpson's second 3-pointer — coming on an offensive rebound — gave Colorado a 53-46 edge and the Rams never threatened to close the gap again.

"I knew we had a record of coming out slow in the second half so I took it upon myself to lead by example," Simpson said. "I just knew it was a crucial time. I just wanted to set the tone."

While Simpson was outstanding, he had plenty of help. After allowing the Rams to hit six of their first eight 3-point tries of the night, Colorado clamped down. The Rams hit just three of their final 13 tries from long distance and shot just 38 percent from the floor in the second half.

"We finished the first half strong and came out ready to play in the second half," Boyle said. "I wanted our guys to take care of the ball, share the ball and get great shots. We had eight turnovers and 16 assists. That's what you like to see."

CSU called a timeout after Colorado's cushion hit 17 early in the second half, but the break didn't stop the Buffaloes. The CU lead hit 20 four minutes later and the Rams were finished for the night.

The Buffs continued to build their cushion down the stretch. Colorado continued to produce stops on the defensive end and buckets on the offensive end, and CU's lead ballooned to 25 points, 76-51, with 6:38 to play.

Simpson proved to be unstoppable in the second half for Colorado. After scoring nine points in the opening half, he erupted to dominate the offensive end after intermission. His back-to-back 3-pointers helped CU to a 74-51 lead and the Buffs soon pushed their edge to 82-55 with just more than five minutes to play.

The Buffs then coasted to the win down the stretch. Colorado led 10-5 early in the game, only to see the Rams rally. CSU hit five consecutive field goal tries midway through the half to take a 22-18 lead.

But the Buffs put together a 10-0 run to regain the lead. Colorado forced five CSU turnovers in a three-minute span, with Hadley, **Javon Ruffin**, Clifford and Simpson all collecting baskets off the miscues.

CSU rallied to tie the game up again at 28-28 before the Buffs went on their 10-2 run to close the half.

BOULDER — Colorado's **Tristan da Silva** posted 25 points and nine rebounds Thursday night — both career highs — to lead the Buffaloes to an 84-60 win over North Alabama at the CU Events Center.

The victory gave Tad Boyle's Buffs their first back-to-back wins of the season as they improved to 6-5. The Lions had a two-game win streak come to an end to fall to 6-5.

Boyle also collected his 260th victory as Colorado's head coach, leaving him just one behind Sox Walseth's program record 261. Boyle can tie the record Sunday when the Buffs host Northern Colorado, the school where Boyle got his head coaching start.

Three other Buffs joined da Silva in double-figure scoring. **KJ Simpson** finished with 12 points and **Luke O'Brien** and **J'Vonne Hadley** each finished with 11. O'Brien also had six rebounds while Simpson tied his career best with six assists and just one turnover.

KJ Johnson led the Lions with 16. The Buffs held UNA to a season-low 39 percent shooting (21-for-54) and the Lions' 60 points were also a season low.

CU shot 51 percent (31-for-61) and held a commanding edge in rebounding (42-32), 51 points in the paint (46-32) and fast break points (15-2). One of the few downsides for Colorado was the free throw line. CU has struggled at the stripe most of this season and Thursday was no different, as the Buffs hit just 17 of their 27 tries.

"It was a workmanlike effort," Boyle said. "Coming out of finals you never know what you're gonna get from your team emotionally and how sharp they're going to be. Not that you win by 24 and feel like your team could have played better, but that's how I feel about tonight's game."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After a see-saw first six minutes that featured six lead changes, the Buffs used a 6-0 run to turn a one-point deficit into an 18-13 lead and they never trailed again.

The Lions managed to briefly shave Colorado's lead down to two but the Buffs responded with a 12-0 run to take control for good. Da Silva and Hadley both had a pair of buckets in the surge and Colorado led, 30-16, with just more than six minutes to play in the half.

CU's lead never dipped into single digits again the rest of the night. The Buffs also ratcheted up the pressure on the defensive end to spark their decisive run. Colorado forced seven straight empty UNA possessions and the Buffs maintained their double-digit lead down the final minutes of the half to take a 42-28 lead into intermission.

Colorado then kept the lead at a comfortable margin throughout the second half. CU built its cushion to 19 early in the period after a da Silva 3-pointer and Simpson drive gave Colorado a 47-28 lead and the Buffs slowly pushed their lead into the 20s down the stretch.

Da Silva has now scored in double digits five straight games. "Being aggressive doesn't necessarily mean scoring the ball," da Silva said. "But when the opportunity is there, I'll take it."

Boyle was more pleased with da Silva's aggressiveness on the boards. "I'm really proud of his rebounding," Boyle said. "I know he can score, we've been pushing him to be more active on the glass and he did that tonight."

Boyle was also happy with the effort from O'Brien off the bench. His six rebounds tied his season high and he has averaged nearly five boards per game over the last four contests.

"He gave us great energy off the bench," Boyle said. "I was really pleased with him, and then KJ has six assists and one turnover. That's the kind of stuff we need from him."

BOULDER — Tad Boyle stepped into history Wednesday.

Colorado put four players in double figures and the Buffaloes knocked off Southern Utah 86-78 to make Boyle the winningest coach in CU men's basketball history.

The win was No. 262 for Boyle in his 13 years in Boulder, surpassing the 261 of legendary Buffs coach Sox Walseth, whose name graces the court at the CU Events Center.

CU improved to 8-5 with its fourth straight win while the Thunderbirds fell to 8-5.

KJ Simpson led CU with 21 points while **Tristan da Silva** added 20 points and 10 rebounds for his first career double-double. **Nique Clifford** scored 14 and **Julian Hammond III** chipped in 11.

Harrison Butler led SUU with 18.

Boyle was honored with a post-game tribute that featured video clips from former players and coaches and a hardy crowd of 5,100 braved Wednesday's blizzard to stay and cheer.

"This does not happen by accident, and I've got a lot of support, a lot of love," Boyle said. "And the one thing I want you fans to know is we are not done yet. I've never felt more excited about the future of Colorado basketball than I do today."

Boyle also made special mention of four CU staffers who have been with the program since he took the reins in 2010: associate head coach Mike Rohn, director of operations Bill Cartun, assistant to the head coach Marge Marcy and academic coordinator Mindy Sclaro.

"These four people deserve just as much credit as I do, as do our former coaches, every former player and every current player," Boyle said. "It's not about me. It's about them. It's about what we do together as a team."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado had to work for the win. The Buffs led by as much as 12 late in the first half, but had just a four-point cushion at intermission, 38-34.

The Thunderbirds then erased CU's edge after halftime, taking a 44-42 lead less than four minutes in. The two teams then traded the lead several times over the next four minutes, with SUU taking a 57-55 edge with 11 minutes to play.

But the Buffs finally took control for good with a 13-0 run. Da Silva had seven points in the burst, including a 3-pointer, Clifford added four and a **Javon Ruffin** bucket inside with 6:07 to play gave CU a 73-59 edge.

Colorado then kept the Thunderbirds at bay down the stretch. SUU managed to close the gap to single digits in the final minute but the Buffs made seven key free throws to hold on for the win and put Boyle atop CU's record book.

"It was a grind out there," da Silva said. "But we fought and gave ourselves a chance to win in the end."

The Thunderbirds were clearly not intimidated by the Pac-12 Buffs. Colorado trailed by seven early after the SUU buried four 3-pointers in the first seven minutes.

But the Buffs used an 11-0 run to take control. Clifford had five points in the surge, **Jalen Gabbidon** drained a long 3-pointer and a Hammond layup gave Colorado a 20-16 lead with just more than 11 minutes to go in the half.

Colorado then slowly built its lead into double digits with a pair of 8-0 runs. Da Silva had four in the first to help CU to a 30-21 lead before Clifford had four points in the second run to give Colorado a 38-26 cushion with 3:05 to play.

But the Thunderbirds refused to let the game get out of reach. SUU hit two 3-pointers in the final two minutes of the half while Colorado went scoreless and CU took a 38-34 edge into intermission.

STANFORD, Calif. — KJ Simpson scored Colorado's last 11 points of the game Thursday night, including the go-ahead bucket and two free throws in the final 18 seconds, to lift CU to a 73-70 road win over Stanford at Maples Pavilion.

Simpson finished with a career-high 31 points as the Buffs improved to 9-5 overall and 1-2 in Pac-12 play with their fifth straight win. Stanford fell to 5-8, 0-3.

The Buffs trailed by four at the half and by as much as eight early in the second period. They closed the gap to one at multiple junctures after intermission but couldn't get over the hump until Simpson hit two free throws with just more than two minutes remaining to give CU a 69-68 lead.

Stanford then momentarily regained the lead but the Buffs came up with a big defensive stop in the final minute. Simpson then delivered a drive along the baseline to give Colorado a 71-70 lead with 17 seconds left.

CU's **Luke O'Brien** followed with another key defensive stop, Simpson rebounded and was fouled and he calmly hit two free throws with 3 seconds remaining to provide the game's final points.

Joining Simpson in double figures for the Buffs were O'Brien with a career-high 12 and **Lawson Lovering** with a career-high 10. Simpson also led CU in rebounds with seven, O'Brien nabbed six and Lovering grabbed five.

Spencer Jones led Stanford with 25 points.

After a less-than-stellar first half effort, the Buffs kept themselves in the game after intermission with rebounding and defense. The Buffs outrebounded Stanford 23-15 in the final 20 minutes and held Stanford to just 30 percent shooting in the second half after the Cardinal had hit 52 percent of its shots in the opening half.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After leading by nine early, the Buffs trailed by four at intermission and by eight early in the second half.

Colorado then managed to shave the deficit to one at several junctures but could not get over the hump for the first 18 minutes of the half. CU several times had possession and a chance to take the lead but came up short each time and with just under four minutes to play, Stanford had pushed its lead back to 68-64.

But with just more than two minutes remaining, the Buffs finally took the lead. Simpson hit a three-point play with 3:19 remaining to put Colorado within 68-67, then hit two free throws with 2:06 on the clock to give the Buffs a 69-68 lead.

The Cardinal, though, regained the lead 30 seconds later on a pair of Spencer Jones free throws. CU then missed a tough shot from the lane on its next possession, and the Cardinal called timeout with the ball in hand and 55 seconds left on the clock.

But the Buffs forced an errant Stanford shot, Lovering came up with a big defensive board and Simpson delivered on the offensive end again. The sophomore guard drove the baseline for a bucket off the glass and a 71-70 Colorado lead with 17 ticks left on the clock.

CU's defense then came up big again on the defensive end, forcing a miss from the lane and Simpson followed with a rebound. He was immediately fouled and knocked down both free throws to give CU a 73-70 lead with 3.2 seconds remaining.

Stanford then missed a desperation 3-point attempt at the buzzer to give the Buffaloes the win.

Colorado jumped out to a nine-point lead early as the Buffs hit seven of their first eight field goal tries. An O'Brien bucket and free throw at the 12:54 mark gave CU a 17-8 lead and Colorado appeared to be in control.

But CU just as quickly went cold from the field, opening the door for a 17-2 Stanford run. The Cardinal drained four 3-pointers in the surge to take a 25-19 lead with 7:37 left in the half.

The Buffs finally stopped the bleeding and briefly tied the game at 28-28 with a 7-0 run. Simpson had five points in the surge and **Nique Clifford** added a bucket.

But Colorado couldn't come up with any defensive stops over the ensuing four minutes and Stanford rebuilt its edge to four, 37-33. Colorado had four possessions in the final two minutes but couldn't convert and the half ended with the Cardinal holding that 37-33 lead.

BOULDER — No **KJ Simpson** proved to be no problem Thursday for the Colorado Buffaloes.

With their leading scorer out with an illness, the rest of the Buffs stepped up and played one of their best games of the season, dominating Oregon in a 68-41 victory at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 10-6 overall and 2-3 in Pac-12 play. The Ducks fell to 8-7, 2-2 while scoring the fewest points in Dana Altman's 13 years at the Oregon helm.

The Buffs, coming off a disappointing loss at Cal, were a different team Thursday. CU jumped out to an early lead and never trailed. Colorado led by 18 at the half, 37-19, and extended the margin to as much as 27 in the second half as they never let the Ducks mount a comeback.

Tristan da Silva — who totaled just 15 points in CU's two-game road trip last weekend — led three Buffs in double figures with a career-high 30 points, along with seven rebounds. **Julian Hammond III** stepped into the starting lineup in Simpson's absence and tallied a career-high 16 points along with four rebounds and three assists. **Nique Clifford** added 13 points and **Luke O'Brien** had a career-high 11 rebounds.

The Buffs dominated nearly every statistical category. Colorado held a 46-28 edge on the boards and held Oregon to just 27 percent shooting (14-for-52), including a 1-for-14 night from long range. The Buffs shot a respectable 45.5 percent (25-for-55) and had a 14-3 edge in assists.

"You could tell from the get-go on the first couple of possessions that we were locked in defensively," said Boyle, whose Buffs held the Ducks their lowest point total since 2009. "We got some deflections, we were active. It wasn't Oregon's best night, there's no doubt about that. But I like to think we had something to do with that. I told the team today that whichever team rebounds the ball better is going to win the game and we were that team tonight."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado dominated from the outset, jumping out to an early lead and never trailing.

Da Silva hit an early 3-pointer to give CU a 13-6 lead and the Buffs then reeled off a 12-2 surge that included an 8-0 run. Hammond knocked down a 3-pointer and da Silva added another and with 8:45 to play in the half, Colorado led 25-10.

The Buffs didn't let up after a timeout, pushing their edge to 30-11, getting buckets from da Silva and Clifford. Da Silva, who had 15 points in CU's two previous games combined, had 15 of his career-best 30 in the first half Thursday.

"Tristan needs to be aggressive," Boyle said. "He's not a volume shooter, but he's efficient in what he does and he finished tonight. With KJ out, we knew he had to score for us."

The Ducks, who shot just 6-for-25 in the first half, finally scored back-to-back buckets to momentarily slow CU's run. But Colorado answered again and built its lead to 20 before Oregon got a bucket in the final seconds to send the Buffs into intermission with a 37-19 cushion.

The Buffs shot 12-for-28 in the opening half and dominated the boards, collecting a 26-13 rebound edge. O'Brien led the Buffs with six rebounds in the half while Hammond had 13 points in the period.

"We know if we defend and play together, we can play with anyone," Hammond said. "We practiced all week with a lot of focus and intensity on defense. Now we just have to do it every night."

The Buffs continued to build their cushion throughout the second half. A tomahawk dunk from da Silva gave CU a 63-36 lead with just under four minutes to play for the Buffs' big lead of the game and the Ducks were finished for the night.

BOULDER — The Colorado Buffaloes made sure complacency didn't set in Saturday night.

Instead, Tad Boyle's Buffs ratcheted up the defensive pressure for the second game in a row and smothered Oregon State, 62-42, at the CU Events Center.

Colorado's second straight win and seventh in its last eight games improved CU to 11-6 overall and 3-3 in Pac-12 play. The Beavers lost their 17th straight road game and fell to 7-9, 1-4.

Two nights after stifling Oregon in a 68-41 win, the Buffs did the same to the Beavers. The Buffs held OSU to 28 percent shooting in the first half en route to taking a 33-18 lead at intermission and never allowed the Beavers to mount a rally in the second half to wrap up the win. The 83 points combined by CU's last two opponents were the fewest Colorado has yielded in back-to-back conference games since the 1948-49 season.

Tristan da Silva led CU in scoring for the second straight game, finishing with 17 points to go with five rebounds. **J'Vonne Hadley** added nine points, **Nique Clifford** chipped in eight and **KJ Simpson** returned to the lineup to tally six points, seven rebounds and six assists. **Luke O'Brien** led CU in rebounding for the second straight game, finishing with nine boards to go with four points.

Dexter Akanno finished with 10 points for OSU, the only Beaver in double figures. Oregon State's top two scorers, Jordan Pope and Glenn Taylor, finished with a combined nine points on 4-for-20 shooting.

Colorado held OSU to just 34 percent shooting (18-for-53) and had a 38-34 edge on the boards. CU shot just 41 percent (21-for-51) but also collected 15 points off 19 Oregon State turnovers.

"That's testament to our players and what they're capable of," Boyle said. "They really responded to the challenge that we gave them earlier this week and we put back-to-back efforts together. We weren't at our best offensively, but when you can win going away and you're shooting 41 percent, you know you're doing something really good on the other end."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs jumped out to an early lead and never trailed. Colorado built a 9-2 edge five minutes in, thanks in large part to a defense that forced six straight empty OSU possessions to open the game.

Colorado then steadily built its margin. A 7-0 run gave the Buffs a 19-6 edge midway through the half as the Buffs continued to exert defensive pressure on the Beavers. CU held Oregon State to 8-for-23 shooting in the first half, and a 10-0 run that included a Hadley dunk and a Simpson 3-pointer gave Colorado a 20-point cushion, 33-13, with 2:36 to play in the half.

"We're a versatile team," Hadley said. "When we dig down deep, we can be a really good defensive team."

Colorado's 10-0 run sparked an OSU timeout and the Beavers responded with five points in the final two minutes of the half.

Still, the Buffs had a comfortable 33-18 edge at intermission and they didn't let up in the second half. CU pushed its lead to as much as 21 early in the period on a Clifford 3-pointer and maintained a comfortable double-digit edge for the rest of the game.

OSU never came closer than 14 in the second half and the Buffs pushed their lead back to 20 down the stretch.

Simpson, who missed the Oregon game with an illness, struggled from the floor, shooting just 1-for-8. But he made big contributions in other areas, dishing out six assists and grabbing seven rebounds.

"He was really unselfish tonight," Boyle said. "Six assists is a good number for him. There's gonna be nights we need him to score and there's going to be nights we need him to distribute. It was good to have him back."

One critical element of Saturday's win was that Colorado never allowed the Beavers to mount a serious rally — the second game in a row the Buffs built a big lead and protected it to the end.

"The key is keeping the intensity level up and the focus level up for 40 minutes," Boyle said. "We've done that back-to-back games now."

LOS ANGELES — Colorado gave up a decisive 17-0 run to UCLA in the second half Saturday, part of a 33-10 finishing surge by the Bruins, and the Buffaloes dropped a 68-54 decision at Pauley Pavilion.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 11-8 overall and 3-5 in Pac-12 play with their second straight loss. UCLA won its 13th straight game to improve to 16-2, 7-0.

The Buffs led by three at the half and by nine midway through the second half, 44-35, despite a raft of turnovers. But the Bruins stormed back with a 17-0 run over a five-minute span and ended up outscoring the Buffaloes 33-10 over the final 10 minutes.

KJ Simpson led the Buffs with 17 points, **Javon Ruffin** added 11 and **Tristan da Silva** scored 10.

Jaime Jaquez led UCLA with 23 points.

Turnovers plagued the Buffs for the second straight game. After committing 22 miscues in a loss Thursday to USC, Colorado turned it over 23 times against UCLA, leading to 25 UCLA points. While the total rebounds were even at 39-39, Colorado gave up 18 offensive boards that led to 14 second-chance points for UCLA.

Colorado shot a season-low 31 percent from the floor (15-for-49) and the Bruins finished with 11 blocked shots. Thus, CU finished its Los Angeles road swing with 45 turnovers and 20 shots blocked by the opponent.

The Bruins shot just 38 percent (24-for-63) and just 4-for-19 from 3-point range. But all four of their 3-pointers came in the finishing 3-10 run.

"Our inability to take care of the basketball was the difference — that and 18 offensive rebounds," Boyle said. "We played well enough defensively to win. But they just beat us on the boards. The fact that we were in this game is amazing. Our guys compete. They play hard. I don't question their grit. We competed, but we weren't tougher than them."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado weathered an early storm that saw the Buffs commit six turnovers in the first nine minutes to take a 31-28 lead at the half.

CU trailed 16-13 at the 9:21 mark but put together an 8-0 run to take the lead. Simpson had a pair of buckets in the surge, da Silva added a pair of free throws and a **Luke O'Brien** basket gave the Buffs a 21-16 lead.

Colorado then pushed its lead to 29-20 on the heels of a 6-0 run. Simpson hit a pair of free throws, **Javon Ruffin** drove for a bucket and **J'Vonne Hadley** scored inside to give Colorado its biggest cushion of the half.

But the Bruins put together an 8-2 run over the final two minutes of the half, leaving CU with a three-point edge at intermission.

The Buffs committed 10 turnovers in the first half that led to 14 UCLA points, and they also allowed the Bruins to turn eight offensive rebounds into seven second-chance points.

But Colorado was stellar on the defensive end, holding UCLA to 11-for-28 shooting in the first half, including an 0-for-7 goose egg from long range.

The Buffs appeared ready to take control in the opening minutes of the second half. Colorado built its lead to nine when a Simpson three-point play gave the Buffs a 44-35 edge with 10:21 to play.

But the wheels fell off in a hurry. The Bruins proceeded to fashion a 17-0 run that included their first 3-pointer of the game and with 6:09 on the clock, UCLA held a 52-44 lead.

Ruffin finally ended a 4:24 scoring drought for the Buffaloes with three free throws, but the Bruins responded with a 7-0 run to push their lead to double digits, 59-47, with under four minutes to play.

At that point, UCLA's run had hit 24-3 and the Buffaloes had gone seven minutes without a field goal, a drought that ultimately hit 10 minutes.

"Our defense was good enough tonight," Boyle said. "Our defense was good enough against USC the other night. It's just our offense. Our inefficiencies and turning the ball over is not good enough right now to beat anyone. They turned up the heat defensively and we couldn't answer."

Colorado did manage to cut the deficit back down to 10 in the final minutes but never really threatened to come any closer down the stretch.

BOULDER — Colorado struggled against Washington's zone all night Thursday and a furious CU rally came up just short at the end as the Buffaloes dropped a 75-72 decision at the CU Events Center.

CU fell to 11-9, 3-6 in Pac-12 play while Washington improved to 12-8, 4-5.

The Buffs trailed for nearly the entire game and Washington led by as much as 13 early in the second half. But CU managed to shave the deficit down to 73-72 in the final minute and had a chance to take the lead after collecting a steal with 16 seconds remaining.

But the Buffs turned the ball over with six seconds left and Washington hit two free throws with 4.7 on the clock to complete the scoring.

Sophomore guard **Julian Hammond III** led CU with 18 points while **Tristan da Silva** scored 17 and **KJ Simpson** added 11.

Keion Brooks scored 25 for Washington. Colorado shot just 44 percent from the floor (28-for-64), including a season-low 3-for-19 (16 percent) from 3-point range.

But the big difference for the Buffs came on the defensive end. The Huskies shot 54 percent from the floor for the game (27-for-50), including a 64 percent effort in the second half (14-for-22). UW also hit nine of its 20 3-point tries.

The Buffs connected on just 13 of their 20 free throw tries while the Huskies were 12-for-14 from the line.

Colorado's defense did force 22 turnovers and collect 25 points off those UW miscues, but it wasn't enough.

"This was a really, really disappointing loss," Boyle said. "You score 72 points at home, it's good enough to win. There's a lot of ways you can look at this game and see how we lost it. You can look at the free throw line, you can look at our defense in the second half when they shoot almost 64 percent in our building. We did a great job creating turnovers but we just couldn't get over the hump."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado trailed by as much as 11 in the first half and by seven at intermission, 33-26.

UW then built its lead to 13 on a Brooks 3-pointer seven minutes in before the Buffs began chipping away. A 6-0 CU run that included buckets from **Lawson Loving**, **Ethan Wright** and **Luke O'Brien** pulled Colorado to within 48-41 with 12:08 still to play.

Minutes later, CU shaved the deficit to six on two Hammond free throws and another O'Brien bucket.

But the Huskies responded with a 3-pointer and two unanswered baskets to push their cushion back to double digits, 58-47, with 8:42 remaining.

The Buffs, though, refused to quit. Colorado closed the gap to five on a da Silva dunk with 4:38 to play and after a UW bucket, pulled to five again on another da Silva basket. With 3:52 to play, the Buffs had cut Washington's lead to 65-60.

The Huskies briefly pushed their lead back to eight on two free throws and a basket from Brooks.

A Hammond steal and 3-pointer pulled CU to within three, 71-68, with 1:48 to play. Two more Hammond free throws and a Simpson basket then cut Washington's lead to one, 73-72, with 43 seconds remaining.

Colorado then had possession and a chance to win the game after collecting one more steal on the defensive end with 18 seconds left. But a Simpson turnover with 6.2 on the clock handed the ball back to Washington and the Huskies then hit two free throws for a 75-72 lead.

CU's last possession ended with a loose ball to hand UW the victory.

Colorado started slowly and remained out of synch for most of the first half. Washington used an early 9-0 run to take an 11-4 lead and the Buffs didn't hit as much as 11 late in the half.

CU struggled to find a weakness in the Huskies' zone defense. Colorado endured an 0-for-7 stretch from the floor early and with under five minutes left in the half the Buffs were 1-for-9 from 3-point range.

The Huskies, meanwhile, made a living from beyond the arc, hitting five of their first 11 tries from long distance.

But Colorado did manage to close the gap in the final minutes, holding Washington scoreless over the last 2:59. **J'Vonne Hadley** cashed in a fast break layup and Loving closed with a follow jam in that span to pull CU to within 33-26 at intermission.

EUGENE, Ore. — Colorado kept it close down the stretch but could never quite get over the hump Thursday and the Buffaloes dropped a 75-69 decision to Oregon at Matthew Knight Arena.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 12-10 overall and 4-7 in Pac-12 play with their sixth loss in seven road games while the Ducks improved to 12-9, 6-4.

Tristan da Silva led CU with 23 points and **Nique Clifford** added a career-high 17. **KJ Simpson** had eight points — only the second time this year he has not scored in double digits — and **Luke O'Brien** had a team-high seven rebounds.

Quincy Guerrier led the Ducks with 16.

Colorado trailed by six at intermission and by as much as 11 midway through the second half. But the Buffs' full-court press forced a string of Oregon turnovers and CU managed to cut the gap to one, 63-62, with five minutes to play.

That, however, was as close as the Buffs could come. Oregon stretched its lead back to six, then hit six free throws in the final 1:08 to keep Colorado at bay.

The Buffs managed to stay in the game despite shooting just 37 percent from the floor (24-for-65) while Oregon shot 26-for-53. CU forced 18 Oregon turnovers and converted them into 13 points — but the Buffs still fell to 1-6 this year when forcing at least 18 miscues by the opponent.

"Our guys battled their tails off," Boyle said. "When you shoot 36 percent and they shoot 49 percent and you're still in the game, it shows our fight, our competitiveness and our grit. All you can ask us is that they give you everything they've got and I felt like they did tonight — but we didn't finish."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs trailed by six at the break and Oregon extended the deficit to 11 less than five minutes into the second half.

But Colorado stayed within striking distance. With 12:07 to play, the Buffs sliced the deficit to five, 51-46, on three free throws and a Clifford steal and bucket.

Oregon answered with a 6-0 run to bump its lead back to 11, but Colorado responded with a 9-0 run to cut Oregon's lead to just two, forcing five straight UO turnovers to fuel the surge. Da Silva had a dunk and two free throws and Clifford tallied a dunk and a 3-pointer to pull Colorado to within 57-55 with 7:43 still to play.

Clifford finished 7-for-11 from the field and had a career-best three 3-pointers.

"That's the Nique Clifford we need," Boyle said. "Hopefully that's something that he can build on."

The Ducks again answered with a 6-0 run to push their lead back to eight but the Buffs ran off seven in a row to narrow the deficit to one. Da Silva scored all seven in the burst, including a 3-pointer that cut Oregon's lead to 63-62 with five minutes still to play.

Clifford and da Silva shot a combined 15-for-25 from the field, but the rest of the Buffs were just 9-for-40.

"Tristan gave us everything he had," Boyle said. "We've just got some inconsistencies in our lineup that we've got to figure out."

But after closing the gap to one, the Buffs couldn't regain the lead. CU endured three straight empty possessions and the Ducks got five straight points from Guerrier, including a dagger 3-pointer just before the shot clock buzzer, to build their lead back to six, 68-62, with 2:30 to play.

CU did manage to pull within four in the final minutes but the Ducks made their free throws down the stretch to hand the Buffs the loss.

"We just couldn't get the stops when we needed them," Boyle said. "We had it down to one and then Guerrier hits the three at the end of the shot clock. We just couldn't get over the hump."

Colorado led for much of the first 10 minutes of the opening half. Da Silva, O'Brien and **Ethan Wright** all drained 3-pointers and the Buffs held a 17-13 lead at the 9:50 mark.

But the Ducks answered with an 8-0 run that included back-to-back 3-pointers to take the lead. CU momentarily regained the edge on a Clifford 3-pointer and Simpson drive to the rim, but the Ducks responded to close the half on an 11-4 run and Colorado trailed, 32-26, at the half.
