PAC-12 POSTSEASON FACTS: Colorado, 22-9 overall, is in its 13th Pac-12 Tournament, coming in as the No. 3 seed after finishing in sole possession of third place in the final Pac-12 standings at 13-7. The No. 3 seed matches the Buffaloes' highest in the Pac-12 era joining the 2020-21 team. Colorado receives a first round bye for the third time in four seasons and will play the winner of No. 6 Utah and No. 11 Arizona State in a quarterfinal game Thursday.

Colorado holds an overall record of 17-11 in the championship and has won at least one game in 11 of 12 tournaments. The Buffaloes have two Pac-12 Tournament championship game appearances, winning the inaugural Pac-12 Tournament title in 2012, as the No. 6 seed, winning four games in four days in Los Angeles. The Buffaloes were the runner up in 2021.

Colorado is 9-2 in the championship as the higher seeded team and 8-9 as the lower seed. Seven of Colorado's 11 Pac-12 Tournament losses have come to the top two seeds.

The Buffaloes were the last Pac-12 program to walk away from the annual event without a win. Colorado had won eight-straight first round games before falling to Washington State in 2020, just hours before the rest of the Pac-12 Tournament, and NCAA Tournament, was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic. The Buffaloes followed up that setback with a run to the 2021 championship game and the 2022 semifinals.

Colorado is 30-46 all-time in conference postseason tournaments. The Buffaloes were 4-20 in the Big Eight Tournament between 1977-96 and 9-15 in the Big 12 Championship between 1997-2011.

Head coach Tad Boyle owns nearly two-thirds of Colorado's all-time conference tournament wins. He is 19-12 in conference tournament action, including a 2-1 mark in Colorado's final year of the Big 12.

THE BUFFALOES: Colorado enters the Pac-12 Tournament riding a six-game winning streak after securing a road sweep of Oregon and Oregon State in the final week of the regular season.

Colorado's six-game winning streak during conference play is its most since the 1996-97 team won the first six of the Big 12 schedule. It's the first time the Buffs have won the final six games of the conference regular season since the 1954-55 Final Four team won their last six before heading to the NCAA Tournament.

Colorado's 13 conference wins tie for the second-most in a single-season. The 2020-21 team was 14-6 in Pac-12 play (finished 3rd) and the 1961-62 Big Eight championship team was 13-1.

Colorado's 22 regular season wins is a school record. Four teams had reached 21 during the regular season prior to this year: 1996-97, 2013-14, 2015-16, 2019-20.

Colorado has a winning record in conference play for the ninth time in 13 Pac-12 seasons. CU had nine seasons with winning conference records from 1963-64 through 2010-11 (9 winning, 36 losing, 3 at .500). Boyle has nine, Sox Walseth five and Ricardo Patton four. The third-place finish matches Colorado's best in the Pac-12 (2013-14, '20-21). The Buffaloes have won at least 12 conference games in three of the last four seasons.

Colorado is .500 or better in conference play for the 10th time in head coach Tad Boyle's 14 seasons. It's the ninth conference season in the Boyle era with double-figure wins.

20 WINS: Colorado has 14 20-win seasons in program history, 10 of which have come under head coach Tad Boyle. The Buffaloes have won 20 games by the close of the regular season nine times (1968-69, '96-97, 2012-13, '13-14, '15-16, '19-20, '20-21, '21-22 & (23-24). Boyle coached teams own the top five and seven of the top eight single-season win totals in team history.

Overall, Colorado is one of the top all-around shooting teams in the country, ranking in the top 15 nationally in all three percentage categories: overall field goal, 3-point and free throws. The Buffaloes are fourth in the nation in 3-point percentage (.400), fifth in overall shooting (.499) and 15th from the free throw line (.777).

Colorado is one of only two programs in NCAA Division I in the nation's top 15 of all three categories, joining Indiana State (through games of March 11). Colorado also sports top 40 marks nationally in rebound margin (+8.0, 14th), assists (16.1, 32nd), defensive rebounds (27.4 drpg, 35th), fouls (14.9 fpg, 35th) and scoring (80.6 ppg, 37th).

Colorado leads the Pac-12 in all three shooting categories as well as rebounding defense (29.6 rpg) while ranking second in scoring margin (+8.5) and rebound margin, third in scoring offense, scoring defense (72.1 ppg), 3-point defense (.329) and defensive rebounds and fourth in assists and overall rebounding (37.7 rpg).

During regular season league play, the Buffaloes took top honors in free throw percentage (.770), 3-point shooting (.395), 3-point defense (.334) and rebounds allowed (30.9 rpg)

**INDIVIDUALLY SPEAKING:** All-America candidate **KJ Simpson** tops Colorado at 19.6 points, 4.9 assists and 1.7 steals per game while ranking third in rebounding (5.5 rpg). He is Colorado's leader in all shooting made and attempted categories as well as total defensive rebounds with 145. Simpson is averaged 6.1 rebounds during Pac-12 play, ranking 12th on the conference charts.

During Colorado's six-game winning streak he is averaging 23.2 points, 6.0 assists and 5.7 rebounds while shooting 51.2 percent from 3-point range (21-of-41) and 49.5 percent overall.

Simpson has 18 games with 20 or more points this season, the most by a Buffalo since Alec Burks had 24 20-point games in 2010-11. He is the only major conference player averaging 19.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game and is one of five in all of NCAA Division I with those numbers.

Simpson is second among all major conference players in rebounding during conference games (third for all games) for those listed at 6'2" and under. He leads the Pac-12 in rebounding for all players listed at 6'5" and under during conference play (second in overall games).

On the Pac-12 charts, Simpson is first in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.3), second in scoring, 3-point percentage (.451) and assists, third in steals, fourth in free throw shooting (.865), sixth in minutes (34.4 mpg), 11th in defensive rebounds (4.7 drpg) and 16th in overall rebounding and shooting (.488).

Simpson has become and 'iron man' of sorts. He lead the Pac-12 in minutes played during league games (34.4 mpg). Over the final four games of the regular season he sat for a mere 1:27 of game time. He played 178:33 of 180:00 minutes over those four games including a stretch of 111:38 straight minutes played between the second half of the California game and the first half at Oregon State.

Senior forward **Tristan da Silva** is second on the team in scoring (16.2 ppg), field goals made (162), 3-pointers (51) and steals (33) while ranking fourth in rebounding (5.4 rpg). During Colorado's sixgame run, his points have jumped up to 18.8 points on 47.8 shooting with a team-best 11 steals.

Da Silva had a team-high 22 points on 9-of-17 shooting in the win at Oregon. It was his third-straight 20-point game, seventh of the season and 20th of his career.

He had season-highs with 27 points and 11 rebounds on Senior Day against Stanford. It was his second double-double of the season and fourth of his career. He set career-highs in 3-pointers made and attempted hitting on 5-of-10 beyond the arc.

On the Pac-12 charts, da Silva ranks sixth in free throw percentage (.840), ninth in scoring, 11th in minutes (33.5 mpg), 14th in defensive rebounds (4.4 drpg), 18th in 3-point percentage (.375) and 20th in rebounding.

McDonald's All-American **Cody Williams** is third on the team in scoring at 13.7 points per game while shooting a team-best 59.0 percent from the field. He had 18 points at UCLA leading the Buffaloes in scoring for the third time. Williams hit his first eight field goal attempts; finished 8-of-9 after missing a desperation 3-point attempt at the buzzer with the Bruins up by the final margin of four.

Williams had 14 points of 5 of 6 shooting at USC. Overall he has made 15 of 19 field goal attempts in his last three games (.789).

Senior **J'Vonne Hadley** averages 12.3 points per game while ranking second on the team in rebounding (6.2 rpg) and shooting (.568) and third in steals (32).

Hadley picked up his first career Pac-12 Player of the Week honor on March 11 after averaging 17.5 points, 9.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists to lead the Buffaloes in the road sweep of Oregon and Oregon State last week. He shot 63.2 percent from the field (12-of-19) while hitting 5-of-6 from 3-point range and sinking all six of his free throw attempts.

Hadley had 20 points and a career-high 12 rebounds at Oregon, recording his third career double-double (all this season). He was a perfect 4-of-4 from 3-point range, setting personal bests for 3-pointers made and attempted. His four 3-pointers made is the most without a miss since Julian Hammond III went 4-for-4 against Washington on Jan. 9, 2022.

Against Oregon State, Hadley had 15 points, seven rebounds and three assists. He made 4-of-8 from the field and 6-of-6 from the line.

On the overall Pac-12 charts, he is sixth in field goal percentage, seventh in free throw accuracy (.836), ninth in rebounding and minutes (33.8 mpg) and 10th in defensive boards (4.7 drpg).

Senior **Eddie Lampkin**, **Jr.**, leads the Buffaloes and ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in rebounding at 7.1 per game. He is averaging 10.1 points per game and is third on the team in shooting at 56.7 percent.

Lampkin had 17 points and 11 rebounds at Oregon State to secure his team-best eighth double-double of the season. He has 14 in his career adding in his six at TCU. In all he has 10 double-digit rebounding games for the Buffaloes.

Lampkin had a season-high eight field goals against the Beavers and has made 26 of his last 39 from the field (.667). He has shot 50 percent or better in the last five games and in 23 of 31 games this season. Lampkin led the Buffaloes in scoring for the second time this season and in rebounding for the 16th time.

On the Pac-12 leaderboard, Lampkin is also third in offensive rebounds (2.5 orpg), seventh in field goal percentage and 12th in defensive boards (4.6 drpg).

Junior **Julian Hammond III** is averaging 7.4 points and is fifth on the team in assists with 44. Hammond is ninth in the Pac-12 in 3-point percentage (.400). He has missed the last five games with a knee injury.

Senior **Luke O'Brien** is averaging 6.5 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. He is third on the team in blocked shots with 12 and is fourth in steals (21) and fifth in rebounding. O'Brien had 10 points against Oregon State, scoring in double figures for the eighth time this season. All 10 points came in the first half. The 10 points are his most since he scored 10 in the first Oregon State game in Boulder on Jan. 20.

BOYLE MILESTONES: Head coach Tad Boyle, in his 14th season, has 294 wins at Colorado, the most in program history.

Boyle-led teams own 10 of the 14 20-win seasons in team history, the top five single-season win totals and seven of the top eight. With a record of 294-181 at CU, his 61.9 winning percentage is second all-time just behind Forrest "Frosty" Cox at 62.3 from 1936-

Boyle has 131 Pac-12 regular season wins, tying with Ernie Kent (Oregon 1998-2010 & Washington State 2014-19) for 17th in conference history.

In the regular season finale against Oregon State, Boyle picked up his 350th head coaching win and is now 350-247 (.586) in 18 years between Colorado and Northern Colorado.

Boyle is three wins away from becoming the all-time winningest head coach at any state of Colorado NCAA Division I institution. Jim Williams won 352 games in 26 seasons at Colorado State from 1954-80. Boyle is currently sixth in career wins for a head coach at any Colorado four-year school.

SERIES RECORDS: Colorado has met both possible quarterfinal opponents in Pac-12 Tournament action once with the Buffaloes winning both. No. 6 Colorado defeated No. 11 Utah in the first round of the 2012 Tournament, 53-41, as the Buffaloes began their run of four wins in four days in Los Angeles for the inaugural tournament championship. The No. 8 Buffaloes defeated No. 9 Arizona State, 97-85 in a 2018 first round game.

Colorado split with both Arizona and Utah during the regular season with the home team winning all four games. The Buffaloes won both home games by double-digits. The two road losses went down to the wire with Arizona State holding onto a three-point win and the Utes a five-point advantage.

Overall, Colorado has a 16-12 series lead over Arizona State and has won nine of the last 14. The Buffaloes have a 2-0 advantage on a neutral floor: the 2017 Pac-12 Tournament first round win and in the 2018 Pac-12 China Game in Shanghai.

Colorado owns a 34-27 series lead over Utah. The teams have met just twice on a neutral court: CU's 2012 Pac-12 Tournament first round win and on Dec. 23, 1936, where the Utes claimed a 32-30 decision in a game played in Denver.

SEASON NUMBERS WATCH: KJ Simpson scored 15 points at Oregon State to become the 10th Buffalo to reach 600 points in a single season. He enters the Pac-12 Tournament in ninth with 609. six points shy of seventh place and current NBA star Derrick White.

TURNOVER NUMBERS DROPPING: Turnovers have been a struggle at times for Colorado, averaging nearly 13 per game. However, one factor in Colorado's recent winning streak is a decline in those numbers.

Since a season-high 21 turnovers at USC, the Buffaloes have averaged just 9.6 over the last five games.

Against Utah, the Buffaloes turned it over just four times, matching the fewest in a conference game in team history. The Buffaloes also had four at Iowa State on Jan. 30, 2010.

Colorado had seven turnovers at Oregon State, its second fewest of the season.

**FIVE IN DOUBLE-FIGURES:** Colorado had five players score in double-figures in the win at Oregon State, hitting that mark for the 11th time this season (11-0 in those games). Colorado's 11 games with five in double-digits is tied for the sixth-most in the nation:

**SHARP-SHOOTING BUFFS:** Colorado shot 55.2 percent from the field against Oregon (32-of-58) marking the 18th time the Buffaloes have shot 50 percent or better from the field this season, the most in one season in team history. Colorado is 16-2 this season, and 110-9 in the Tad Boyle era when shooting at least 50 percent.

Colorado's 55.2 percent at Oregon was its second best in a road Pac-12 game, trailing only a 55.8 percent performance (29-52) in an 80-71 loss at Arizona on Jan. 25, 2018.

The Buffaloes saw a string of six-straight games of shooting at least 50 percent end at Oregon State. It was the most consecutive games hitting at least 50 percent since the first seven games of the 1985-86 season. The Buffs are shooting 52.1 percent during their six-game winning streak (186-of-357).

The Buffaloes shot 52.2 percent at UCLA. It was the first time in the Pac-12 era where Colorado shot 50 percent or better in consecutive games on a conference road trip. In February 2022, the Buffaloes shot 50 percent twice on the same trip, 50 percent at Oregon State (Feb. 15) and 52.2 percent at Stanford (Feb. 19) with a sub-.500 game at California (Feb. 17) in between.

**OVERTIME & COMEBACKS:** With it's double-overtime win at USC, Colorado improved its record in overtime games to 1-1 this year and 55-57 in its history. The Buffaloes have won their last eight multi-overtime games, dating back to 1991. It was CU's first double-overtime game since a 112-103 win over South Dakota State on Dec. 15, 2017. Colorado's only other overtime game against USC was a 98-84 triple-overtime win on Jan. 29, 2015, at the Galen Center.

Colorado's 16-point deficit was the biggest overcome on record (since 1947) with under 10 minutes remaining and tied for the third-biggest in a second half. Overall it's tied for the 11th-biggest comeback, including the win in Boulder over USC on Jan. 13 (led by 16 in the first half).

**SIMPSON AWARD LISTS:** Junior guard **KJ Simpson** was one of 20 late season watch-list members for the 2023-24 John R. Wooden Award the Los Angeles Athletic Club announced on Jan. 30.

Chosen by a poll of national college basketball experts based on their performances during the 2023-24 season thus far, the list comprises

of 20 student-athletes who are front-runners for the sport's most prestigious honor, the Wooden Award All America Team and Most Outstanding Player Award.

Simpson is one of 30 NCAA Division I players on the Naismith Trophy Men's Basketball Player of the Year Midseason Team, announced Feb. 15.

Simpson is Colorado's first player to advance to this stage of both awards since Alec Burks in 2010-11.

Simpson is one of 40 on the watch list for the US Basketball Writers Association All-America team and Oscar Robertson Trophy for that organization's Player of the Year honor.

**IN THE POLLS:** Colorado was ranked in the first two Associated Press regular season polls, with a high of No. 18 on Nov. 20, the program's best since hitting No. 18 on Feb. 7, 2020. Colorado debuted at No. 25 in the first regular season Associated Press Top 25 Men's Basketball Poll released on Nov. 13.

It was just the second time since 1970 the Buffaloes appeared in the first regular season AP Poll. Colorado appeared in the exact same spot, No. 25, on Nov. 11, 2019; a season where the Buffaloes were ranked for a school-record 13 weeks, climbing as high as No. 16.

Overall Colorado has 57 all-time appearances in the AP Poll. Colorado made its lone appearance this season in the USA Today Sports Coaches Top 25 poll on Nov. 20, coming in at No. 21.

**AGAINST RANKED TEAMS:** Colorado is 1-3 against ranked teams in 2023-24 after falling to No. 8 (AP & Coaches) Arizona on Feb. 10. The Buffaloes ranked win came against then-No. 15 (AP & Coaches) Miami (Fla.) on Dec. 10. It was Colorado's third-straight neutral site win over a ranked nonconference opponent and best since defeating No. 11 Tennessee in Nashville last season.

Colorado fell to No. 20/21 Colorado State on Nov. 29. It was the first time the Rams were ranked in the 131 games of the hardwood edition of the Rocky Mountain Showdown.

Colorado's 26 wins over ranked opponents in the Tad Boyle era is by far the best in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 26-49, have accounted for 37 percent of wins over ranked opponents (70) since 1949-50.

**ROLLIN' IN THE 90s:** Colorado has hit the 90-point mark nine times in 2023-24, the most in one season in school history (9-0). The Buffaloes had a school all-time best four consecutive games scoring at least 90 during the nonconference schedule. Colorado had just two games of 90-plus points last season and just three in 2021-22.

The Buffs have won 35 games in a row when reaching the 90-point plateau (9-0 this season), last losing on March 7, 2015 at Washington State, 96-91 in overtime. CU is 56-2 under Tad Boyle when scoring 90-plus (5-0 with 100 or more), and has at least one 90-point game in 15 straight seasons.

Colorado's 98 points at Washington tied for the most in a road conference game in the Pac-12 era, matching a 98-94 triple overtime win at USC on Jan. 29, 2015. Overall, it was the most points on the road in a regulation game since a 105-61 win at Saint Mary's on Dec. 6, 2000.

**SHARING THE BALL:** Colorado had 20 assists against Utah Tech, hitting the 20-assist mark for the seventh time; matching the most in one season since 2010-11.

The Buffaloes tied a season-high with 28 assists against Miami, matching the effort against Grambling State a month earlier and tying for the 19th most in a single game in team history. Colorado's 28 assists against Miami was its most away from home since recording 28 at Texas A&M on Feb. 26, 2002.

1,000-POINT CLUB: Tristan da Silva became the 39th member of Colorado's 1,000-point club after scoring 17 points in the win over Iona. He hit the 1,000-mark on a 3-pointer in the final two minutes of the first half (scored 14 of his 17 in the first period). He had 22 against California, becoming the 20th player in team history to reach 1,300.

**KJ Simpson** became the 40th member of the 1,000 point-club after scoring 23 at Arizona State on Jan. 6. After his 27-point performance against Cal, he moved into the top 25 on CU's all-time list.

The last time Colorado had two active players in the program's 1,000-point club was at the end of the 2020-21 season in McKinley Wright IV (1,857) and D'Shawn Schwartz (1,026), with Schwartz reaching that milestone during the 2021 NCAA Tournament.

PAC-12 WEEKLY AWARDS: Colorado has been honored four times this season with Pac-12 Weekly Awards. Tristan da Silva was named Player of the Week on Dec. 11, Cody Williams Freshman of the Week on Jan. 22, KJ Simpson earned Player of the Week honors on Feb. 26 and most recently J'Vonne Hadley earned his first career weekly award on March 11.

Da Silva was named Pac-12 Player of the Week after his fantastic effort against Miami. He had 22 points, 10 rebounds, a career-high nine assists and a pair of steals against the Hurricanes. It was his third career double-double and first this season, missing a triple-double by a single assist. He had a season-best nine field goals made which matched the team's season-high. The Pac-12 Player of the Week honor for da Silva is the second of his career and first this year.

Williams earned Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors after averaging 19.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 steals to lead the Buffaloes in the home sweep of Oregon and Oregon State. He shot 69.6 from the field including 5 of 7 from 3-point range.

Williams was also honored as Dick Vitale's "Diaper Dandy" of the week, recognizing the nation's best performances in his Dickie V's Stars of the Week.

Simpson earned Pac-12 Player of the Week honors after recording 28 points, four rebounds, three assists and a steal in the win over Utah. He hit 10-of-15 shots from the floor, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range, while going a perfect 3-of-3 from the free throw line. The Player of the Week honor is his first of the season and third of his career.

Hadley averaged 17.5 points, 9.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists to lead the Buffaloes to a road sweep of Oregon and Oregon State. He shot 63.2 percent from the field (12-of-19) while hitting 5-of-6 from 3-point range and sinking all six of his free throw attempts.

It's only the second time three different Colorado players have been conference player of the week in the same season. David Harrison, Stephane Pelle and Blair Wilson earned separate Big 12 Conference weekly honors in 2002-03.

**SIMPSON'S STRONG OPENING WEEK:** Junior **KJ Simpson** had impressive opening league week averaging 27.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.0 steals against the Washington schools.

Simpson had a career-high 34 points, hitting 10 of 18 from the field and 13 of 14 from the line, against Washington State. It was his fourth career 30-point game and second this season (30 vs CSU). Simpson scored the most points by a Buffalo since Derrick White

had 35 at Arizona State on Jan. 5, 2017. Most by a CU player in the CU Events Center since Alec Burks had 36 vs. Missouri on Jan. 8, 2011. The 34 points tie for the fourth-most in the Pac-12 this season.

Against Washington, Simpson had a game-high 21 points, 10 rebounds, seven assists - with just one turnover - and three steals. It was his second career double-double and matched his personal-best in rebounds (both figures vs. Tennessee last season).

**DA SILVA'S PERFECT GAME:** Tristan da Silva had a game-high 22 points in the win over Pepperdine, sporting a "perfect game" in the process. He was 5 of 5 from the field, including 2 of 2 from beyond the arc, and 10 of 10 from the free throw line. He's the only Colorado player since 1951-52 with at least five field goals and 10 free throws without a miss. Since the 1996-97 season, da Silva is the only Pac-12 player with those numbers and only one of 12 nationally. Da Silva had a 6 for 6 game from the field against Oregon State in 2020-21, but went 3 for 4 from the line finishing with 15 points.

**GOLD STANDARD:** Colorado is 90-6 in the Tad Boyle era when meeting the program's "Gold Standard" of holding an opponent to 40 percent or less from the field and having a plus-8 rebounding edge. The Buffaloes are 6-0 this season hitting those marks, most recently at Oregon State, holding the Beavers to 37.5 percent from the field while holding a plus-14 advantage on the boards (43-29).

**RIGHT AT HOME:** Colorado finished the home regular season with a 16-1 record at the CU Events Center, tying for the most regular season home wins in a season joining the 2015-16 (16-1) and 2013-14 (16-2) teams at that mark (the 2010-11 team won a school-record 18 home games, which included three postseason NIT victories).

Colorado started 13-0 at home for the first time in team history after defeating Arizona State on Feb. 8, eclipsing previous best of 12-straight to begin a season last achieved by the 1968-69 Big Eight Championship team which won all 12 of its games in that title season. Although the run came to an end against No. 8/8 Arizona two nights later, the 13-game home winning streak was the program's best since a 14-game span over two seasons from Feb. 17, 2010 to Jan. 15, 2011. Colorado's win over USC on Jan. 13 was the 500th at the facility in program history.

**NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS:** Colorado is 127-39 (.765) in nonconference regular season games under head coach **Tad Boyle** including an 80-22 mark (.784) since the beginning of the 2014-15 season.

Colorado is 96-8 (.923) in nonconference home games under Boyle, a record which includes a 7-2 mark in postseason action.

DA SILVA HONORS: Preseason honors for senior Tristan da Silva:

Da Silva was a 2022-23 All-Pac-12 Conference First Team selection as a junior, leading Colorado at 15.9 points per game on just under 50 percent shooting. He led the Buffaloes with 54 3-point field goals and 44 steals while ranking second on the team in rebounding with 168.

**SIMPSON & WILLIAMS ALSO HONORED:** Along with senior Tristan da Silva, junior **KJ Simpson** and freshman **Cody Williams** received recognition on the Preseason Pac-12 All-Conference teams. Simpson was named to the media's 10-member All-Pac-12 First Team. Williams earned honorable mention, receiving at least five votes from the media panel.

Simpson was named to The Almanac's Preseason All-Pac-12 Second Team and ranked as the 91st best player in the nation. Williams came in at No. 92 on The Almanac's Top 100 List.

**HONORING BURDETTE** "BURDIE" HALDORSON: Colorado is wearing a patch with the initials "BH" on their jerseys this season to honor Former All-American and CU Athletics Hall of Famer Burdette "Burdie" Haldorson who passed away on Oct. 13 at the age of 89.

As a senior in 1954-55, Haldorson led the Buffaloes to a 19-6 record, 11-1 in conference play and the Big Seven title by averaging 21.0 points and 13.8 rebounds per game (upping his averages from 16.7 and 9.0, respectively, from his junior season). He was a first-team All-Big Seven performer for the second straight year and was named a first-team All-American. CU eventually went on to finish third in the nation, losing in the Final Four to eventual champion San Francisco and the legendary Bill Russell. The Buffs defeated lowa in the then-third place game to match the '42 team for the school's still highest finish ever in the NCAA tournament.

Haldorson's No. 22 is one of two retired Colorado Basketball jersey numbers.

**OPENERS:** Colorado improved to 86-35 (.711) in all-time season openers and has won its last eight. The Buffaloes are 12-2 under head coach **Tad Boyle** and 39-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes are 97-24 (.802) all-time in home openers, have won their last 16 and 22 of their last 23. Boyle's teams are 13-0 in home openers.

**PRESEASON POLL:** Colorado was picked to finish fifth in the annual Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll released Oct. 11. Arizona, which received 18 first place votes, was picked to win the league, followed by USC, UCLA, Oregon, Colorado and Arizona State.

**BOULDER** — Colorado's defense set the tone in the first half and the Buffaloes' offense came alive in the second Monday as CU rolled to a 75-57 win over Towson in the season opener at the CU Events Center.

The Buffs led by four at the half but exploded with a 17-1 run to open the second half and Towson never threatened again, as CU pushed its lead to as much as 28 down the stretch.

Colorado improved to 14-0 in home openers in the Tad Boyle era.

KJ Simpson led the Buffs with 22 points and Tristan da Silva added 13, all in the second half. J'Vonne Hadley added 13 points and a game-high nine rebounds and Luke O'Brien had seven points and seven boards.

Dylan Williamson led Towson with 15 points.

Colorado shot 52 percent from the floor, including 8-for-17 from 3-point range. The Buffs missed all seven attempts from beyond the arc in the first half but then hit eight in a row in the second half to build their lead.

CU held the Tigers to 35 percent shooting and had a 38-26 edge on the boards. The Buffs are now 85-6 under Boyle when holding an opponent to 40 percent or less shooting and having at least a plus-8 rebounding edge.

Colorado finished with 21 assists on 26 baskets, with the only downside of the night 16 turnovers.

"That was a good first game," Boyle said. "A tale of two halves, obviously. I thought we fought adversity in the first half offensively and came out in the second half and figured things out a little bit. I was really proud of our defensive effort that first 20 minutes. We really guarded at a high, high level and we did that pretty much the whole game. I'm really happy with this team's defense and rebounding."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado led 28-24 at the half after the Tigers sliced a 13-point deficit to four with a late 11-2 run.

"It's not how we wanted to start offensively," Simpson said. "There was a lot of standing around and not moving the ball. But we got better in the second half." Indeed, the Buffs needed just a few minutes after intermission to blow the game onen.

After missing all seven of their 3-point tries in the first half, the Buffs drained eight in a row to start the second half. Simpson hit two in the first three minutes of the period and da Silva and O'Brien each hit one in the span as Colorado quickly rebuilt its lead to double digits, 40-24.

Towson never threatened again as Colorado steadily built its lead. Another da Silva 3-pointer pushed Colorado's edge to 20 less than six minutes into the period and the cushion ballooned to 28 with 5:26 to play.

Boyle had no gripes about the Buffs' defense in this one. Colorado held Towson to just four points in the first seven minutes of the second half and limited the Tigers to under 30 percent shooting for much of the period.

"We have a chance to be a really good defensive team," Boyle said.

Colorado's defense established the tempo early as the Buffs jumped out to a 14-4 lead in the first eight minutes. The Buffs forced a 6-minute scoring drought from the Tigers in that stretch and got six points from Simpson on the offensive end.

The Buffs continued to apply the pressure and with 6:39 left in the half, pushed their lead to 13 when an **Eddie Lampkin Jr.** bucket inside gave Colorado a 24-11 edge.

But CU's offense then went stagnant and Towson put together an 11-2 run, thanks in part to a handful of Colorado turnovers. A 3-pointer from Messiah Jones with 1:34 left in the half pulled the Tigers to within 26-22 and the two teams traded buckets in the final minute to send Colorado into the break with just a four-point lead 38-24

Along with eight turnovers in the opening half the Buffs also shot 0-for-7 from 3-point range.

**BOULDER** — From the very beginning Friday night, the Colorado Buffaloes made it clear they wouldn't set themselves up for another upset at the hands of Grambling State.

Instead, the Buffs avenged last year's loss at GSU with a dominating 95-63 win over the Tigers at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 2-0 while Grambling State dropped to 1-1. A year ago, the Tigers shocked the Buffs with an 83-74 win in Grambling.

Friday, Colorado left no doubt that another upset wasn't in the cards. The Buffs built a 10-point lead six minutes in, extended it to 20 midway through the first half and had a 30-point cushion at the break, 50-20.

The second half proved to be more of the same. The Buffs extended their edge to as much as 34 early in the second half and GSU never came closer than 25 again.

Colorado put six players in double figures, led by 21 points from senior Tristan da Silva. J'Vonne Hadley added 17 points, Julian Hammond III scored 14, Ku Simpson had 12 points and Luke O'Brien and Eddie Lampkin Jr. each tallied 10. Hadley and Lampkin each had eight rebounds for Colorado and Simpson had a career-high eight assists and just one turnover while Hammond tied his career high with six assists.

Tra'Michael Moton led GSU with 26 points.

The Buffs dominated virtually every statistical category. CU shot 55.6 percent from the floor (35-for-63) while holding GSU to 38.9 percent from the floor (21-for-54). CU also finished with 28 assists and held a 41-24 rebound edge. Colorado is now 86-6 in the Boyle era when holding an opponent to 40 percent shooting or less and having at least a plus-8 rebound edge.

"I was pleased with everything except for the second half defense," said Boye, whose Buffs outscored Grambling 45-43 after the break. "I thought we got a little soft."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs were in control from the outset. CU jumped out to a 14-2 lead after six minutes, then bumped the margin to 20 when a Hadley three-point play gave the Buffs a 30-10 cushion with just under eight minutes to relay in the buffs.

By halftime, Colorado's lead had been extended to 30 as the Buffs put three players in double figures en route to building a 50-20 edge at the break. Da Silva led CU in the first half with 16 points, Hammond — who hit his first three 3-point tries — added 11 and Hadley had 10.

The Buffs also delivered a clinic on sharing the ball and making the extra pass in the first 20 minutes. CU finished with 17 assists on 21 baskets in the opening half as Hadley and Hammond each had four assists. The Buffs also dominated the boards, finishing the half with a 25-11 rebound edge as da Silva and Lampkin each hauled down five boards.

"J'Vonne Hadley, I can't say enough good things," Boyle said of his do-everything wing, "His grit, his toughness, his hustle. He handles the ball, he passes the ball, he's just doing so many good things."

Defensively, the Buffs forced two four-minute scoring droughts from the Tigers in the first half and the offense took advantage.

Colorado continued the onslaught early in the second half, building the edge to as much as 34 and the Tigers never cut the deficit below 25 again.

Simpson, who scored 22 points in CU's opening win, turned his attention to

Simpson, who scored 22 points in CU's opening win, turned his attention to making plays for his teammates and had five of his eight assists in the second half.

"K Lead eight assists and one turneyer, that's phonomenal." Bould said."

"KJ had eight assists and one turnover — that's phenomenal," Boyle said. "I talked to KJ before the season. There's gonna be some nights where you need to distribute the ball rather than score the ball and tonight was one of those nights. He made a lot of plays."

Da Silva's 21 points came on efficient 8-for-12 shooting and he also had seven rebounds and three assists.

**BOULDER** — Colorado put six players in double figures Tuesday and the Buffaloes celebrated their No. 25 national ranking with a 106-79 win over Milwaukee at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 3-0 while Milwaukee dropped to 1-2.

Colorado was dominant from the outset, building a double-digit lead four minutes in and extending the cushion to 20 by halftime. The Buffs then hit their first 10 shots of the second half to bump the edge to 30 and they led by as much as 38 down the stretch.

Guard KJ Simpson led Colorado with 23 points on 7-for-9 shooting and a game-high six assists while freshman Cody Williams scored 17 points to go with five rebounds and four assists. Eddie Lampkin Jr. had his first double-double as a Buff with 14 points and 12 rebounds, Tristan da Silva tallied 17 points, Julian Hammond III chipoed in 14 and RJ Smith scored 11.

Zach Howell led Milwaukee with 15 points, all on 3-pointers.

Colorado surpassed the 20-assist mark for the third straight game, finishing with 25, and the Buffs shot 59 percent from the floor (37-63), including 13-for-20 from long range. Colorado has hit 31 of its 60 3-point tries thus far this season.

CU held Milwaukee to 37 percent shooting (27-for-73), but the Panthers did hit 11 of their 34 3-point tries. The Panthers also had 19 offensive rebounds for 18 second-chance points.

"We obviously shot the ball well — offensively we were as good as we've been all year tonight," Boyle said. "(But) with that being said, we still have a lot of room for improvement. Nineteen offensive rebounds given up is something that's not acceptable and we gave up 11 threes against a team that we knew was a good shooting team ... Those are the two areas I'm dialing in on because what I've got to do with these guys is make them understand that we can maybe get away with some things early in the season with our schedule that we're not going to be able to get away with as we move forward."

HOW IT HAPPENED: On this night the Buffs got away with just about everything they wanted. CU took control early and the Panthers were on the ropes for the rest of the evening.

Williams, CU's highly touted freshman, came back from missing Colorado's last game with an injury to score seven points in an early CU surge that gave the Buffs a 17-4 lead less than four minutes. Da Silva had two 3-pointers in the burst, including one that sparked a 10-0 run that finished with a thunderous Williams

CU also held Milwaukee scoreless for 3 minutes in the stretch

Milwaukee did manage to temporarily narrow the deficit back to single digits but Colorado responded with another double-digit run. CU held the Panthers scoreless for another 3 minute stretch, Lampkin sparked an 11-0 surge with four straight opints and Colorado pushed its lead to 20.

Four consecutive points from Simpson gave the Buffs a 37-17 edge midway through the half and the Panthers never seriously threatened again. Colorado kept the pressure on down the stretch and the Buffs took a 53-33 lead into the break.

Williams led CU with 13 points in the first half and Simpson added 11. Colorado shot almost 63 percent (20-for-32) in the half, including 7-for-11 from long range. The Buffs also had 12 assists — three each from Simpson and Williams — and Lampkin had five rebounds.

This is the best passing team we've had since I've been here, without a doubt," Boyle said. "The strength of this team is our depth and our quality depth. Twenty-five assists is fantastic."

The Buffs picked up in the second half where they left off in the first as Colorado hit its first 10 shots of the half to build its lead into the 30s. A Simpson 3-pointer seven minutes into the period gave the Buffs an 80-48 lead and they pushed the cushion to as much as 38 down the stretch.

CU hit the century mark with 5:29 still to play when an RJ Smith 3-pointer gave Colorado a 100-63 lead.

**DAYTONA BEACH, Fla.** — Colorado's **KJ Simpson** scored 23 points and the No. 18 Buffaloes survived a tough shooting night Monday to take a 64-59 win over scrappy Richmond in the Sunshine Slam semifinals.

Tad Boyle's Buffs, who jumped seven spots in the AP poll released Monday, improved to 4-0 while Richmond fell to 2-2.

The Buffs will next face Florida State in Tuesday's championship game at 2 p.m. (CBSSN) at Ocean Center.

Monday's game, CU's first away from home this season, wasn't decided until the final minutes.

Colorado led for the majority of the game, jumping out to a quick 6-0 lead and taking a 28-25 edge into intermission. But the Spiders wouldn't go away and took their second lead of the game, 44-42, with nine minutes to play.

The Buffs, though, responded with a quick 6-0 run to regain control. Richmond managed to cut the deficit to one point again before the Buffs finally put the game away. A **Tristan da Silva** basket with just more than a minute to play bumped CU's edge to five and following a pair of defensive stops, Simpson, da Silva and **J'Vonne Hadley** each hit two free throws to give Colorado a nine-point edge, 62-53, with 32 seconds remaining.

Simpson had three rebounds and a pair of assists to go with his 23 points, bolstered by a 9-for-10 effort from the free throw line. Da Silva added 15 points and eight rebounds while Hadley had six points and six boards.

Jordan King led Richmond with 23 points.

Colorado entered the game as the nation's leading 3-point shooting team (51.7 percent) and the sixth-best field goal shooting team (55.7 percent). But the Buffs struggled to find their shooting eye all night, finishing just 20-for-47 from the floor. They did, however, hit 21 of their 25 free throw tries while also holding a 32-26 rebound edge.

Pichmond hit 23 of its 51 field goal tries but was just 5-for-20 from long range.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led 28-25 at the break and pushed the cushion to seven early in the second half on four Simpson free throws.

But the Buffs could never shake the Spiders. Richmond stayed within range and finally took its second lead of the game, 44-42, when King hit two of three free throws at the 9:07 mark.

Colorado answered with a 6-0 run, getting a Simpson 3-pointer and a Cody Williams layup in transition for a 48-44 lead.

But Richmond stayed within striking range and with just more than four minutes to play, cut Colorado's lead to one on a long King 2-pointer.

colorado then pushed its lead but one on a long king 2-pointer.

Colorado then pushed its lead back to five on a pair of free throws from Simpson and Hadley before Richmond narrowed the gap to three one more time.

CU's defense then stepped up. **Eddie Lampkin Jr.** forced a turnover, then found da Silva underneath with a beautiful pass. Da Silva rammed it home and Colorado had a 58-53 lead with 1:29 to play.

Colorado then recorded back-to-back stops and the Spiders had to foul. Simpson, da Silva and Hadley all hit free throws in the final 1:03 to keep the Spiders at bay and give Colorado the win.

Colorado jumped out to a quick 6-0 lead, sparked by a pair of buckets from Tristan da Silva.

But the Spiders answered with an 8-0 run to take their only lead of the half. Colorado endured a three-minute scoring drought that covered five straight empty possessions, including two turnovers.

CU finally ended the drought on a Lampkin bucket, then regained the lead when **RJ Smith** drained a long 3-pointer to give Colorado an 11-8 lead.

Richmond did manage to tie the game again at 13-13 before the Buffs took the lead on a Simpson 3-pointer. The Buffs then used a 6-0 run to take their biggest lead of the half, 22-15, on the heels of a **Cody Williams** steal and basket, two free throws from **Julian Hammond III** and a Lampkin basket inside.

But Richmond once again battled back to close the gap to two and Colorado led by just three, 28-25, at the break.

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — Colorado overcame a 10-point second-half deficit Tuesday to force overtime but the No. 18 Buffaloes came up short in the extra period, falling 77-71 to Florida State in the Sunshine Slam championship game.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 4-1 overall while the Seminoles improved to 4-1.
Cold shooting doomed the Buffs, as CU shot just 35 percent from the floor (2c5-for-72), including 5-for-20 from 3-point range. Colorado also committed 20 turnovers, which the Seminoles converted into 19 points.

The Seminoles shot 47 percent for the game (25-for-57), but were 15-for-28 in the second half and overtime, including 4-for-4 in the extra period.

Cody Williams led CU with 17 points on 6-for-10 shooting. Colorado's two leading scorers for the young season, KJ Simpson and Tristan da Silva, both suffered poor shooting nights. Simpson finished with 15 points on 5-for-22 shooting (1-for-6 from long range) while da Silva had eight points on 2-for-9 shooting.

FSU had four players in double figures, led by Jalen Warley with 19. In a game that featured nine lead changes and 13 ties, Colorado held a 30-27 edge at the break. FSU used a 20-7 run early in the second half to take a 10-point lead, but Colorado quickly put together a 10-0 run to tie the game.

The Buffs fell behind again but used an 8-0 surge to regain the lead, only to go scoreless over the last 2:48 of regulation as FSU rallied to force overtime.

Florida State then scored the first nine minutes of the extra period to take control for good.

"We gave one away," a disappointed Boyle said after the game. "We were not very good. We knew Florida State was going to pressure, but when you have 20 turnovers against anybody, it's going to be hard to win. ... When something like this happens, it's hard to blame anyone but the coach. I've got to do a better job."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado led 30-27 at the half but a cold start and some hot Seminole shooting from long range resulted in FSU taking a 10-point lead early in the second half. Florida State opened the period with a 20-7 run that included four 3-pointers and CU trailed, 47-37, less than seven minutes into the half.

But the Buffs rallied. Colorado put together a 10-0 run, capped by a Simpson 3-pointer, to tie the game at 47-47.

FSU then regained the lead, taking a 55-49 edge before Colorado staged another rally. **J'Vonne Hadley** sparked an 8-0 run with a pair of baskets and two da Silva free throws gave CU a 57-55 edge with 4:24 to play in regulation.

CU then took a 60-57 lead on a 3-pointer from Julian Hammond III before the Seminoles tied it with 1:15 on the clock — and that's how regulation play ended, with both teams coming up empty on offensive possessions in the final minute.

Florida State then took control early in the overtime, scoring the first nine points of the period and a CU rally in the final minute came up short.

"Our guys battled, our guys competed," Boyle said. "It's not a toughness factor, it's not a competitiveness factor, it's not not being ready to play. It was just simply taking care of the basketball and taking great shots and the ability to finish and we weren't good enough with that tonight."

Shooting woes hounded the Buffs for nearly the entire game. CU was just 4-for-17 from the floor to open the first half and while the Seminoles were also having a tough time finding the bucket, FSU finally put together a 6-0 run to take an 18-12 lead with 7 minutes to play in the half.

But the Buffs finally found their shooting eye coming out of a timeout. Williams hit a bucket from the lane to start a 9-0 run that included a pair of Simpson buckets (both off feeds from da Silva), a Williams free throw and two charity tosses from da Silva

With four minutes to go in the half, Colorado held a 21-18 lead, and they extended the margin to 23-19 on a **Luke O'Brien** dunk at the 3:31 mark.

Florida State rallied to tie the game at 27-27 before Hammond III drained a 3-pointer just before the halftime buzzer to give Colorado a 30-27 lead at the break

**BOULDER** — Colorado broke open a tight game early in the second half Sunday and the No. 18 Buffaloes carved out an 85-68 win over Iona at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 5-1 with the win while Iona dropped to 2-4.

Tristan da Silva led the Buffs with 17 points and he surpassed the 1,000-point mark for his career. KJ Simpson added 15. Cody Williams and J'Vonne Hadley each scored 12 and Julian Hammond III chipped in 11. Luke O'Brien and Eddie Lampkin Jr. each had seven rebounds and Simpson added six, and Simpson also had five of CU's 17 assists.

Colorado led by five at the half, 42-37, and then used a 14-9 surge in the opening minutes of the second period to take control. The Buffs steadily built their lead for much of the rest of the game, extending their cushion to as much as 20 down the stretch.

CU dominated most of the statistical categories. The Buffs shot 61 percent from the floor (31-for-51) while holding the Gaels to a 24-for-57 day. Colorado also held a 35-25 edge on the boards and the Buffs converted 14 Iona turnovers into 25 points.

"I think our depth wore down a little bit and offensively, you shoot 61% from the field, you feel pretty good about things," Boyle said. "So it was a great night from that standpoint. Once we strung together stops in the second half, we blew the game open."

The road for the Buffs becomes much more difficult in the upcoming week.

CU travels to Fort Collins on Wednesday for a meeting with unbeaten Colorado State. The Rams will likely be ranked in the nation's top 25 when the new polls come out Monday after their 69-48 throttling of No. 8 Creighton last week.

CU then hosts Pepperdine on Sunday (3 p.m., Pac-12 Network) before traveling to Brooklyn for a matchup against No. 10 Miami on Sunday, Dec. 10 (12 p.m., ESPN2) in the NABC Brooklyn Showcase at the Barclays Center.

"Still a lot of room for improvement," Boyle said. "It's still November. And what I don't want to do is get complacent and get happy with where we're at or be satisfied. We have to stay hungry and humble."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After a first half that featured four lead changes and two ties, Colorado took control in the first four minutes of the second half. Williams had six points, including a monster dunk, to fuel a 14-9 surge and the Buffs turned a five-point halftime edge into a double-digit cushion, 56-46.

Colorado then steadily built on its lead for much of the rest of the half, using an 11-0 run midway through the half to put the game away. Lampkin started the burst with a basket inside and Hammond capped the run with a pair of 3-pointers to give Colorado a 70-51 lead with just under nine minutes to play.

The Buffs then stretched their cushion to 20 with four minutes left when a da Silva 3-pointer gave Colorado an 83-63 edge and the Buffs cruised down the stretch to the win.

"We know we have people who can score," Hammond said. "We just have to

make sure our defense comes with us to Fort Collins on Wednesday."

Colorado looked ready to take control early after back-to-back baskets from

Lampkin and Hadley gave CU an 11-4 lead less than four minutes in.

But the Gaels kept the game close and finally took their first lead of the game,

23-22, with 9:10 to play in the half after a 7-0 run.

The two teams then traded the lead over the next two minutes before the Buffs finally went ahead for good with a 6-0 run. Da Silva had two baskets and an assist in the surge as Colorado took a 34-28 lead and the Buffs kept the edge at five at

the half, 42-37.
While da Silva finished as CU's leading scorer, he didn't register his first field goal until seven minutes remained in the first half.

Colorado shot 61 percent in the opening half (14-for-23) and held lona to 12for-30 shooting.

FORT COLLINS — Colorado staged a furious second half rally Wednesday but the Buffaloes came up just short against No. 20 Colorado State, dropping an 88-83 decision at Moby Arena.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 5-2 while the Rams improved to 7-0.

The Buffs trailed by 15 at the half but cut the deficit to five early in the second half and were still within five in the final minutes, thanks to 21 second-half points from freshman **Cody Williams** and 20 second-half points from **KJ Simpson**.

But the Buffs could never completely close the gap as the Rams had an answer on the offensive end at every critical moment and held CU at bay down the cretch.

Colorado ended up shooting 54.5 percent from the floor (30-for-55), including a 20-for-29 second half (69 percent). The Buffs also had a 34-21 edge on the boards. But the Rams were 27-for-53 from the floor, including 9-for-22 from 3-point range, and they converted 15 Colorado turnovers into 17 points.

Simpson finished as the game's leading scorer with 30 points. Williams tallied 21 and Tristan da Silva scored 11.

Isaiah Stevens led five Rams in double figures with 20 points and he had 11 assists — five more than the entire Colorado team.

Defensively, Colorado failed to string together three stops in a row even once

the entire game.

"Disappointing," Boyle said. "The second half we fought our tails off but we weren't good enough defensively all night long. We never strung together stops and that puts a lot of pressure on your offense. Our offense was good enough in the second half but not in the first half because they were the aggressors. Colorado State is good but that was really disappointing because that was a winnable game. It was a great college basketball atmosphere and we didn't do our part."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado trailed by 15 at the break, 41-26, after committing nine turnovers in the first half and shooting just 10-for-26 from the field, including 0-for-5 from long range.

The Rams, meanwhile, were 14-for-28 in the first period, including 7-for-14 from beyond the arc.

But the Buffs burst from the gate in the second half with a 22-12 surge to cut CSU's lead to 53-48 with 13:18 still to play. Williams fueled the surge with 10 points after a scoreless first half and Simpson added seven in the run.

"We switched some things offensively in the second half to get the ball moving side to side," Boyle said. "We have some success with it there."

But CSU pushed its lead back to double digits, building its cushion to 64-52 on four free throws from Stevens. Two of those came after a technical on Boyle, who was vehemently protesting a pair of questionable calls against Colorado.

But the Buffs didn't go away quietly. **Luke O'Brien** and **Julian Hammond III** hit buckets inside to cut the deficit to eight and a Williams basket with 6:13 to play shaved the CSU lead to six, 68-62, with 6:13 to play. Colorado then managed to stay within striking range over the next six minutes but could not come closer than five as the Buffs could not come up with steady defensive stops.

The Buffs pulled within five with just under a minute to play on a Williams drive but the Rams answered with a dunk to break CU's full-court press and a free throw to clinich the win

Colorado started slowly but took a 10-9 lead seven minutes in when da Silva scored off a lob from Hammond.

But the Rams responded with a 10-0 run to take control and the Buffs had no answer. CU did manage to pull within five, 21-16, on a Simpson drive to the bucket but Colorado State reserve Joe Palmer drained a pair of long 3-pointers to push CU's deficit to nine. 27-18.

The Buffs shaved the deficit back to six when a Hammond basket with 2:41 left in the half cut CSU's cushion to 28-22.

But Colorado State closed the half on a 13-4 surge in the final 1:41, aided by a pair of Colorado turnovers down the stretch. Colorado's ninth miscue of the half came with just 2 seconds on the clock, leading to a CSU layup and 41-26 lead at the break.

**BOULDER** — Colorado built a big early lead Sunday and never let up as the Buffaloes rebounded from a loss to Colorado State to post a 91-66 win over Pepperdine at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 6-2 overall — 5-0 at home — while the Waves dropped to 4-6.

Colorado put four players in double figures, with **Tristan da Silva** leading the Buffs with 22 points on 5-for-5 shooting. CU freshman **Cody Williams** had his second straight 20-point performance, finishing with 21 on 9-for-13 shooting, **KJ Simpson** tallied 15 points and four assists and **Julian Hammond III** added 10 points and four assists.

CU never trailed, jumping out to a 17-9 lead less than four minutes in, then using al 11-0 run to push the cushion into double digits. A J'Vonne Hadley bucket at the 8:02 mark pushed Colorado's lead to 38-18 and the Waves never cut the deficit below 20 again.

The Buffs dominated the stat sheet, shooting 57 percent (31-for-54) from the floor, including 7-for-13 from long range. CU held the Waves to just under 38 percent from the floor (24-for-64) and the Buffs had a 41-29 edge on the boards.

Colorado also finished with a 48-22 edge in the paint and the Buffs finished with 22 assists.

Houston Mallette led Pepperdine with 15 points while the Waves' leading scorer, Michael Ajayi, had just 13 points on 4-for-18 shooting.

"I challenged a couple of our guys I met with after the Colorado State game," Boyle said. "We had a team a couple years ago that didn't lose back-to-back games until late January, maybe February...! I think this team can be that kind of team in terms of their resolve and learning from the things that we don't do well and taking that into the next game. I thought we bounced back emotionally, we bounced back with the way we played and had some really efficient officient of performances tonight and some really good defensive performances."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led from the outset, taking a 17-12 lead less than six minutes in after a pair of offensive rebounds and buckets from Williams.

CU then put the game away over the next seven minutes as Hammond sparked a 23-6 surge to give the Buffs a 22-point lead. Hammond had seven points and three assists in the run, including a beautiful alley-oop pass to Williams for a thunderous dunk. Williams also had seven points in the run and with 7:19 to play in the half. Colorado held a 40-18 lead.

In his last four games, Williams has shot 68 percent from the floor (28-for-41) while averaging almost 18 points per game.

"We wanted to come out and be the aggressor," said Williams. "Our defense kind of dictated the game. We came out aggressive on offense, moving the ball. Just coming out with that intensity, that energy to start the game off really gets us going fast."

The Buffs didn't let up in the final minutes of the half. CU pushed its cushion to 29 points over the ensuing five minutes as da Silva caught fire. The Colorado senior had nine points over a five-minute stretch and his 3-pointer with 2:14 on the clock gave the Buffs a 29-point edge, 49-20.

The Waves did manage to cut the deficit down to 24 by halftime, but Colorado still held a comfortable 52-28 edge at the break.

The Buffs had an outstanding first half on the offensive end. shooting almost

63 percent (20-for-32), including 5-for-7 from 3-point range.

They also had a solid showing on the defensive and holding Pennerdine lead

They also had a solid showing on the defensive end, holding Pepperdine leading scorer Ajayi to just 5 points on 2-for-13 shooting.

Colorado continued to dominate in the second half. The Buffs opened the period with a 10-0 run with Williams scoring five in the burst, then built their cushion to 34 when a Williams bucket gave Colorado a 64-30 edge less than two minutes into the half.

Pepperdine never mounted anything resembling a threat for the rest of the game as the Buffs kept their lead in the 20s for the remainder of the contest.

BROOKLYN, N.Y. — Colorado's Tristan da Silva recorded a 22-point, 10-rebound double-double and the Buffaloes used a dominant second half Sunday to roll to a 90-63 win over No. 15 Miami in the NABC Brooklyn Showcase at the Barclays Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 7-2 with the win while the Hurricanes fell to 7-2. The Buffs led by just one at halftime but used a 37-13 run over an 11-minute span in the second half to take firm control and the Hurricanes never had an answer.

The Buffs were playing without the services of star freshman **Cody Williams** (injury) but da Silva more than made up for Williams' absence. The CU senior had 18 of his 22 points in the second half and just missed a triple-double, finishing with a career-high nine assists to go with his 10 rebounds.

Colorado finished with six players in double figures. KJ Simpson finished with 20, Luke O'Brien added 13 and J'Vonne Hadley, Eddie Lampkin Jr. and Julian Hammond III all tallied 11.

Matthew Cleveland led Miami with 17 points.

The Buffs led for most of the game but put the game away with a huge second half, outscoring the Hurricanes 53-27 in the final 20 minutes. CU finished with 28 assists — 16 in the second half — on 37 baskets while shooting 37-for-63, including a red-hot 21-for-30 in the second half. Colorado forced 20 Miami turnovers — 14 in the second half — which the Buffs converted into 25 points.

CU also had a 33-21 edge on the boards, including 12 offensive rebounds that led to 13 second chance points.

Miami shot a respectable 22-for-49 but the Buffs held the Hurricanes to 9-for-22 shooting in the second half, including 2-for-9 from 3-point range. HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led from the outset and had as much as an

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led from the outset and had as much as an eight-point lead in the first half before the Hurricanes closed with a 10-3 run to send Colorado into the break with just a one-point edge, 37-36.

The Hurricanes then took their first lead of the game early in the second half on a Nigel Pack 3-pointer and they quickly pushed their edge to three, 46-43.

But the Buffs responded, outscoring the Hurricanes 37-13 over the next 11 minutes to turn the game into a rout.

Simpson started the surge with four points in a quick 13-3 Colorado run before da Silva added a three-point play and Hammond tallied back-to-back buckets to give Colorado a 56-48 lead with 12 minutes remaining.

Defensively, the Buffs forced a pair of turnovers and four straight empty Miami possessions to fuel the run.

Da Silva, who hadn't hit a 3-pointer away from Boulder this year, buried one at the 10:42 mark and O'Brien drained another less than a minute later to push CU's lead into double digits, 62:50, at the midway mark of the half. A da Silva three-point play gave CU a 73-57 lead with just more than six minutes to play and Colorado finally pushed its cushion into the 20s, 80:59, on another O'Brien 3-pointer with just more than four minutes remaining.

Da Silva scored just four points in the first half, but had seven rebounds and five assists before the break. He finally broke the 3-point ice after halftime and poured in 18 points in the second half.

Colorado didn't let up down the stretch, building its lead to as much as 29 in the final minutes before settling for the final 27-point margin.

Colorado led from the outset and never trailed in the first half

Back-to-back buckets from Lampkin gave the Buffs an early 12-6 lead and CU pushed its margin to eight less than six minutes in when a Simpson 3-pointer gave CU a 15-7 lead.

Miami managed to cut the margin to one with a 7-0 run but the Buffs responded to push their margin back to eight with under three minutes to go in the half. Hammond hit a 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 32-24 lead and a da Silva basket inside with 2:44 to play in the half helped Colorado to a 34-26 edge.

But the Buffs hit a cold spell over the final few minutes of the half as Miami closed with a 10-3 run, fueled by two straight CU turnovers that led to Miami buckets.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 8-2 with their third straight win while the Bears fell to 4-6

One of Boyle's main goals all week had been to make sure the Buffs didn't experience a letdown in the wake of last Sunday's big 90-63 win over No. 15 Miami.

Colorado put those worries to rest in a hurry. The Buffs used a 21-5 surge over the final nine minutes of the first half to take a 48-27 lead at the break, then opened the second half with a 22-7 run to put the game away.

Guard  $\mbox{KJ Simpson}$  led CU in scoring with 21 points to go with five steals, five rebounds and four assists. Eddie Lampkin Jr. recorded his second double-double of the season with 10 points and 10 rebounds to go with six assists, J'Vonne Hadley tallied 15 points and six assists, Luke O'Brien scored 14, Tristan da Silva added 12 and Julian Hammond III chipped in 10.

Saint Thomas led UNC with 27 points, but he shot just 10-for-22.

Colorado finished with 23 assists, the Buffs' sixth game this season with at least 20 assists. CU shot 49 percent from the floor (35-for-71) and held a 43-32 edge on the boards.

Defensively, the Buffs held UNC to 42 percent shooting (25-for-60) and also forced 15 Bears turnovers, which Colorado converted into 28 points.

CU hit the 90-point barrier for the fifth time this season and Colorado improved to 95-8 in home non-conference games in the Boyle era.

"Overall — you get 23 assists and six guys in double figures, that's good," Boyle said. "Our team is starting to come together."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado fell behind in the opening minutes but took the lead four minutes in when a Hadley bucket gave the Buffs an 8-7 edge.

CU never trailed again.

After missing their first two shots of the game, the Buffs hit their next 11 in a row to take a 24-15 edge with 11:33 on a Simpson basket before the Bears momentarily closed the gap, shaving Colorado's lead to five, 27-22, on back-to-back baskets inside.

But the Buffs then took control for good, outscoring the Bears 21-5 over the final nine minutes of the half to take a 48-27 lead into the break.

Da Silva had five points early in the run to push CU's lead into double digits. Simpson then added back-to-back baskets, including a steal and breakaway dunk before nailing a long 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 20-point edge, 45-25, and CU took a 21-point cushion into halftime, 48-27.

"These games can be trap games if you feel too comfortable after beating a really good team like Miami," Simpson said. "That's why we wanted to set the tone with our defense."

The Buffs dominated nearly every statistical category in the opening 20 minutes. CU had 13 assists in the half — including four from big man Lampkin — and the Buffs defense forced 10 UNC turnovers which the Buffs converted into 19 points.

CU shot 56 percent from the floor in the half (20-for-36) while enjoying a 28-18 edge in points in the paint.

Colorado made sure the Bears harbored no thoughts of a comeback in the second half. The Buffs outscored UNC 22-7 over the first six minutes of the period to take a 36-point lead, 70-34, with Simpson recording another steal and dunk in the surge and O'Brien adding a pair of 3-pointers.

The Bears never threatened to slice the margin under 20 again.

Simpson continues to make his case as being one of the best point guards in the country. Friday was his sixth game with at least 20 points and he now has three times as many assists (44) than turnovers (14) to go with his 20 steals.

BOULDER — Colorado wrapped up its non-conference schedule Thursday with a workmanlike 98-71 win over Utah Tech at the CU Events Center

Tad Boyle's Buffaloes won their fourth straight to improve to 9-2 while the Trailblazers fell to 5-7.

Colorado took care of business early, making sure there would be no pre-holiday slip-up. The Buffs scored the first 10 points of the game to take control and built their cushion into the 20s midway through the half when a quick 7-0 run gave CU a 32-9 lead.

Colorado scored on 13 consecutive possessions in that stretch and led by as many as 26 in the first half before taking a 46-25 lead into halftime

The Trailblazers never came closer than 18 in the second half as the Buffs hit the 90-point mark for the sixth time this year and fourth game in a row. CU also finished with 20 assists, the seventh time this season the Buffs have dished out at least 20 assists.

KJ Simpson led five Buffs in double figures with 23 points, and he added five rebounds and six assists. Eddie Lampkin Jr. had his third double-double as a Buff, finishing with 16 points and 10 rebounds, while Luke O'Brien tallied a career-high 18 points. Tristan da Silva added 15 points and seven rebounds and J'Vonne Hadley chipped in 11 points.

Aric Demings led Utah Tech with 15.

The Buffs dominated the stat sheet, shooting 57 percent from the floor (35-for-61) while holding the Blazers to 44 percent shooting (28-for-64). Colorado held a commanding 44-21 edge on the boards, along with a 48-26 edge in points in the

The only downside for the Buffs came in the turnover category, as CU committed 15 miscues in the game that led to 14 UTU points. The Blazers also shot 51.5 percent from the floor in the second half.

Still, it was overall a solid finish to the non-conference portion of the schedule, and the Buffs will now turn their attention to next week's opening of Pac-12 play when they host Washington and Washington State.

"A good, hard-fought win," Boyle said. "These games are tough mentally on our team coming out of finals. It's hard to get a great week of practice during finals but our guys I thought did a pretty good job of it. I thought we were dialed in from the beginning, which was nice to see."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After missing their first four shots of the game, the Buffaloes hit their next nine to take control.

Five straight points from Simpson gave CU a 10-0 lead less than four minutes in and the Buffs built their lead to 21-4 four minutes later on the heels of a 9-0 run, capped by a Hadley bucket.

"I love our offense," said O'Brien, whose early 3-pointer sparked Colorado's 10-0 start. "Everyone shares the rock."

The Trailblazers never threatened to cut the deficit to single digits again as the Buffs steadily built their lead. A Lampkin free throw at the 2:43 mark gave CU its biggest lead of the half, 43-17, and the Buffs took a 46-25 lead into the locker room at the break.

Colorado's offensive onslaught featured a balanced attack. O'Brien and Simpson each scored 11 points in the first half and Lampkin added 10. Colorado finished the first half with 12 assists while shooting 5-for-8 from 3-point range

Defensively, the Buffs held Utah Tech to 11-for-30 shooting, including 0-for-6 from long range.

Colorado maintained control throughout the second half, never allowing the Trailblazers to cut the lead under 18 again. The only drama of the half came less than five minutes in when UTU coach Jon Judkins was issued back-to-back technicals and ejected.

The Buffs maintained their lead in the 20s for most of the second half as they hit the 90-point mark for the sixth time this season and fourth game in a row.

BOULDER — Colorado's KJ Simpson and Eddie Lampkin Jr. stepped up

BOULDER — Colorado's KJ Simpson and Eddie Lampkin Jr. stepped up with double-doubles Friday right to lead the shorthanded Buffaloes to a gutsy 73-69 win over Washington in their Pac-12 opener at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs, playing without injured stars Tristan da Silva and Cody Williams as well as RJ Smith and Bangot Dak, won their fifth in a row to improve to 10-2 overall and 1-0 in Pac-12 play. Washington fell to 8-4, 0-1. Simpson finished with 21 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists while Lampkin had his third straight double-double with 17 points and 12 rebounds. Luke O'Brien just missed a double-double, finishing with 11 points and nine rebounds, and J'Vonne Hadley and Julian Hammond III each added 11 points. Keion Brooks Jr. led Washington with 20 points, on 7-for-17 shooting.

The Buffs led by six at the half, 32-26, but the Huskies slowly chipped away at the lead, then used a 9-0 run to take a 63-56 edge with 55-50 to play.

Colorado, though, wouldn't quit as the Buffs answered with a 17-6 surge over the final 5:13 to take the win. Hadley had six points in the run and Simpson had five in the final 1:46.

five in the final 1:46.

Colorado shot just 44 percent from the floor (26-for-59) but the Buffs held UW to 38.5 percent shooting (25-for-65). CU also held a commanding 49-31 edge on

Da Silva, CU's second-leading scorer and third-leading rebounder, went down with an ankle injury in the final minutes of Thursday's practice. Williams has missed the last four games with a wrist injury. Boyle admitted, "I didn't sleep very well last night," but he told his team they still had the talent to win and his players proved him right. The Buffs wer

The Buffs were by no means at their best. They committed 15 turnovers and Simpson and Lampkin — the only two Buffs to shoot free throws — combined to hit just 15 of their 24 attempts from the line.

Still, they made plays when most needed.

"Gritty win, obviously, with adjusting to being without one of your best players,"
Boyle said. "I knew we had enough talent in that locker room to win this game but I also knew that our margin for error went down significantly. Good news is we didn't play our best and we found a way to win this game. That's what good teams do."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led by six at the half and the Buffs maintained

But the Huskies finally caught fire and used a 15-2 surge to take a 63-56 lead with 5:50 to play. UW hit three 3-pointers in the run and with just more than five minutes to play, the Buffs were on the verge of letting the game get away.

But instead of folding the tent, Colorado fought back, Baskets from Hammond, Hadley and Lampkin pulled CU to within one, 63-62, and following a timeout, Lampkin hit a pair of free throws to stretch CU's run to 8-0 and give the Buffs a 64-63 lead with 2-50 to play. 64-63 lead with 2:50 to play.

Washington briefly regained the lead after Lampkin's free throws but Hadley scored again to give Colorado a 66-65 lead with 2:18 remaining and the Buffs never trailed again.

Simpson gave CU a three-point lead with 1:46 to play when he forced a UW miss on the defensive end and then took the ball coast-to-coast for a layup and

65 edge. Colorado then forced another UW miss on the defensive end but Simpson missed the front end of a one-and-one with a minute to play. But he then grabbed a rebound on the defensive end, was fouled and hit one of two free throws for a 69-65 CU lead with 46 ticks left on the clock.
Washington again cut the lead to two with two Sahvir Wheeler free throws but

Simpson answered with a pair of free throws and the two teams traded buckets in The final seconds to complete the scoring.

Colorado trailed early in the game after the Huskies opened with a pair of

quick 3-pointers. But Simpson sparked a quick 6-0 run to give Colorado an 18-12 lead at the 11:15 mark, with O'Brien and Harrison Carrington adding baskets in

the surge.

CU then continued the run after a timeout, with a Simpson steal and layup parl of a 13-2 surge that gave the Buffs a 25-17 cushion with 6:33 to play in the half. Hammond hit a 3-pointer in the run and Simpson added a pair of free throws.

Defensively, the Buffs forced a 1-for-12 Washington drought and Colorado seemed to be in control. But the Buffs suddenly went cold and the Huskies ended their cold streak with

a 7-0 surge to cut CU's lead to one, 25-24, with just more than 3 minutes to play in the half.

Simpson finally ended an 0-for-8 CU stretch with a 3-pointer from the top and Hadley nailed a corner 3-pointer to give CU a 31-26 lead. Lampkin then added a free throw at the 1:31 mark to send Colorado into the break with a 32-26 lead.

Tad Boyle's Buffs, once again without Tristan da Silva and Cody Williams (injuries), improved to 11-2 overall and 2-0 in Pac-12 play with their sixth straight win. WSU dropped to 9-4, 0-2.

The win gave CU its first 2-0 start in conference play 2014-15.

He has solidified himself as one of the great point guards in Colorado basketball history.

Simpson certainly fit the bill against the Cougars.

With 2:01 to play, he delivered a bucket off the glass — his 29th and 30th points of the game — to give CU a 67-64 lead. He then hit two free throws after Hadley had a big block on the defensive end, and seconds later Hadley delivered a dagger 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 72-64 lead with less than a minute to play, basically clinching the win for Colorado.

The 3-pointer was Hadley's second of the game and just his third in his two years with the Buffs.

Colorado took control early with a 9-0 run after an opening bucket from WSU,

with Simpson scoring five points in the surge.

The Cougars briefly cut the Colorado lead to five but the Buffs responded with an 8-2 burst to push their cushion to double digits. Julian Hammond III drained a

and 3-2 burst to pust free rushion to double digits. Jurian Hamilhold in drained a long 3-pointer to start the run and Hadley added a corner trey to give the Buffs a 23-12 edge with 9 minutes to play in the first half.

But WSU didn't go away quietly. Jakimovski nailed three straight 3-pointers for the Cougars and with 3:24 to play in the half, Colorado's lead had been narrowed to four, 29-25.

Simpson, though, responded with a personal 6-0 run. The junior point guard hit three free throws, then recorded a steal and layup to bump Colorado's lead back to nine, 34-25. Colorado then closed the half with a **Harrison Carrington** bucket and free throw to take a 10-point edge into the break, 39-29

TUCSON, Ariz. — Colorado fell behind early Thursday and the shorthanded Buffaloes never recovered, dropping a 97-50 decision to 10th-ranked Arizona at the McKale Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs, still without standouts Tristan da Silva (ankle) and Cody Williams (wrist), saw their six-game win streak come to an end and fell to 11-3 overall and 2-1 in Pac-12 play. The Wildcats bounced back from a weekend loss to Stanford to improve to 11-3, 2-1.

This one got away from the Buffaloes early. Arizona used a 13-0 run to build a 23-6 lead six minutes in and three minutes later CU's deficit hit 20 when the 'Cats assumed a 31-11 lead. Arizona took a 50-23 edge into the break and the Buffs never mounted a serious threat in the second half as Arizona steadily built its lead. pushing it to 50 in the final seconds.

Javon Ruffin scored 11 for Colorado and KJ Simpson added 10 as the Buffs shot just 36 percent from the floor (20-for-55). Simpson, CU's leading scorer this season, shot 5-for-17 and had a career-high eight turnovers.

Pelle Larsson led four Wildcats in double figures with 18.

Arizona shot 56 percent (40-for-71), including 11-for-20 from 3-point range. Colorado hit just four of its 15 attempts from beyond the arc and the Buffaloes were dominated on the boards, 45-25, the first time this year Colorado has lost the rebound battle.

The Buffs also finished with 18 turnovers that led to 25 Arizona points, with the Wildcats cashing in 24 points on fast breaks.

"It was not our night in any facet of the game," Boyle said. "We had some really good looks offensively early that didn't go in and in our heads got down. Our key was to keep these guys out of transition and we didn't do a good job of that. We got our tails kicked on the glass and we obviously weren't very good offensively."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Turnovers and poor shooting hit Colorado hard in the

After pulling to within 10-6 early, the Buffs came up empty on their next seven possessions, enabling the 'Cats to put together a 13-0 run.

Ruffin momentarily halted the surge with a 3-pointer, but the Wildcats an-

swered with a 10-4 burst to push their cushion to 33-13 at the midway point of the half

The Buffs didn't help their own cause, committing nine turnovers in the first half that led to 16 Arizona points, many coming in transition. Arizona tallied 14 fast break points in the half and Colorado trailed, 50-23, at the break.

Colorado's woes continued in the second half. Arizona quickly built its lead to 30 in the opening minutes and the Buffs never managed to make anything resembling a serious run for the remainder of the game. Arizona steadily built its lead, even with reserves in the game, and CU's deficit hit 50 in the final seconds.

"I have to take as much responsibility for this loss as our players because we got beaten in every facet of the game," Boyle said. "I know this team has confidence in each other and we can't lose that after a game like this. We still have to believe in each other and in the system.'

Now, the Buffs have to figure out a way to bounce back in a hurry, as they head to surging Arizona State on Saturday.

"We have to look ourselves in the mirror - players, coaches, everybody," Boyle said, "Do we put this one behind us? Absolutely, But we don't ignore it. We watch a little film, flush it out of our system and then figure out a way to win on

Colorado shot a respectable 48 percent from the floor (23-for-48) but hit just seven of its 20 3-point tries. ASU shot 44 percent (25-for-57) while hitting eight of 22 from beyond the arc (Charada alsa had a 35-30 edge on the bands).

The Buffs led by 20 late in the first half and held a 50-31 lead early in the second period. But the Bears got hot from 3-point range, draining nine treys in the

second period. But the Bears got hot from 3-point range, draining nine treys in the second half, and the Buffs never came up with an answer on the defensive end.

Colorado still had a chance to get the win in the final seconds. After Cal hit one of two free throws to take an 80-78 lead with 12 seconds remaining, CU's Tristand as Silva had an open 3-pointer from the wing. But his shot drew iron, the Bear rebounded and hit two more free throws to finish the scoring.

Eddie Lampkin Jr. led four Buffs in double figures with a career-high 22 points and 11 rebounds. Da Silva added 20, Cody Williams scored 16 in his return to the lineup after missing seven games with an injury and KJ Simpson chipned in 12.

chipped in 12.

Jaylon Tyson led Cal with 30 points, 23 coming in the second half.

CU shot a respectable 49 percent from the floor (29-for-59) while the Bears shot just 40 percent (26-for-65). But Cal also hit 14 of its 30 3-point attempts, including a 9-for-15 effort from long range in the second half.

The Buffs did hold a 39-35 edge on the boards and a 42-18 edge in the paint, but Colorado had no answer for the Bears' offense down the stretch as Cal hit 13

of its last 17 field goal attempts.

The Buffs thus ended up 0-3 on their road trip, with two of the losses — to ASU and Cal — coming down to the final seconds.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado dominated the first half, leading by as much

as 20 and taking a 40-26 lead into the break.

The Buffs then built their lead to 19 early in the second half when a da Silva 3-pointer gave the Buffs a 50-31 lead less than three minutes in.

At that point, the Buffs looked firmly in control and ready to salvage a win out of their road trip.

But the Buffs defense that had been terrific in the first half suddenly took a

break and the Bears staged a furious rally. Cal outscored Colorado 32-12 over the next 12 minutes to finally take a 63-62 lead with 5:38 to play, the Bears' first lead

Colorado trailed by as much as 16 in the first half and the Trojans led 37-24 at
the break. But the Buffs bust from the gate after intermission with a 12-2 run and

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 11-0 at home while pushing their record to 13-5 overall and 4-3 in Pac-12 play. The Ducks, who fell to 1-12 all-time in Boulder, saw their six-game win streak come to an end and dropped to 13-4, 5-1.

Williams shot 10-10-13 from the floor, including 3-for-4 from long range, to lead five Buffs in double figures. Along with Simpson's 22 points, five assists and five rebounds, **Tristan da Silva tallied 13** points to go with eight rebounds, **J'Vonne Hadley** scored 11 and **Luke O'Brien** chipped in 10.

Jadrian Tracey led Oregon with 14 points while UO's leading scorer, Jackson Shelstad, finished with just nine, nearly six under his season average.
Colorado led by nine at the half, 43-34, only to see a rash of turnovers to open the second half pave the way for a 16-6 Oregon run as the Ducks regained the lead.

But the Buffs recovered from their miscues. After a see-saw five minutes, Colorado sandwiched a pair of 7-0 runs around one Oregon basket to take control and CU outscored the Ducks 30-13 over the final 11 minutes to collect the win.

CU shot 51 percent from the floor (30-for-59), including a 16-for-29 effort in the second half. CU's defense forced 13 UO turnovers to produce 24 points and Colorado also held Oregon to just 41 percent shooting in the second half (14-for-

The Buffs also held a 37-25 edge on the boards and they outscored the Ducks 40-28 in the paint.

"Our guys competed," Boyle said. "They competed on offense and competed on defense. Cody was terrific, KJ was terrific, Luke gave us phenomenal minutes off the bench. Just a good all-around team victory."

Colorado then took control with a 17-2 run that included 11 unanswered points. Williams had five points in the run, including a long 3-pointer, and Hadrey added four. BOULDER — Colorado put six players in double figures Saturday and the Buffaloes took control early and never let up, rolling to a 90-57 win over Oregon State at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs won their third in a row to improve to 14-5 overall and 5-3 in

Pac-12 play while also improving to 12-0 at home — CU's best home start since the 1968-69 Buffs had a 12-0 home record.

Oregon State lost its fifth in a row to fall to 9-9, 1-6.

Tristan da Silva led CU with 19 points. Eddie Lampkin Jr. added 17, Cody

Williams scored 16, KJ Simpson tallied 13 and Luke O'Brien and Assane Diop each chipped in 10 for Colorado (a career high for freshman Diop). Lampkin led CU with eight rebounds while Simpson and da Silva each grabbed seven. Julian Hammond III had five assists and Simpson dished out four.

Tyler Bilodeau led OSU with 18 as CU held the Beavers' leading scorer. Jor-

dan Pope, to just 10 points — seven under his season average.

The Buffs were in control of this one from the outset. Colorado built a 20-point edge midway through the first half, pushed the margin to 45-23 at the break and extended the cushion to 33 early in the second half. Oregon State never came closer than 23 after intermission and CU led by as much as 37 in the final minutes.

The Buffaloes dominated nearly every statistical category. CU shot 52.5 per-cent from the floor (32-for-61) while holding the Beavers to 20-for-60 shooting, and Colorado also had a 41-31 edge on the boards. CU is now 89-6 all-lime under Boyle (5-0 this season) while hitting the "gold standard" — holding an opponent to 40 percent or less shooting and having at least a niles. Bearding in rehounds

least a plus-8 margin in rebounds.

Colorado also had a 52-32 edge in the paint and the Buffs finished with 19 assists and just eight turnovers, matching their season low in that department.

"We challenged them at halftime to come out and not do what we've done all year, which is kind of let teams back in," Boyle said. "We did that. Six guys in double figures, 19 assists, eight turnovers — a lot of good things. Just a workmanlike

effort by our guys."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado assumed control early on both ends of the floor, taking a 15-4 lead less than seven minutes in and stretching the cushion to 26-6 midway through the half.

The Buffs were efficient on the offensive end, hitting eight of 13 field goal tries in a 19-2 run over a seven-minute stretch. Da Silva scored four in a row to start the surge, Williams added a dunk and Simpson scored six in the run to give CU a 20-point lead, 26-6, at the 9:12 mark.

Defensively, the Buffs held OSU scoreless for five minutes in the run, forcing

nine consecutive empty possessions.

While OSU's Bilodeau did finish with 18 points, 12 of those came in the second half, long after the game had been decided. Pope, meanwhile, shot just 3-for-

ond nair, long after the game had obeen decided. Pope, meanwhile, short just 3-for11 for the game and had only one 3-pointer.

"KJ did a terrific job on Pope and I thought Tristan defensively on Bilodeau
was phenomenal," Boyle said. "Those two defensive efforts were great."

The Buffs kept the pressure on until halfitime, stretching their lead to 22 in
the final minutes of the half. Williams, who shot 6-for-10 from the floor, had two
3-pointers in the final five minutes while Simpson and da Silva both added buckets
in the final minute to send Colorado into the break with a 45-23 lead.

Da Silva led CLI with 11 points in the first half and Williams chinged in 10.

Da Silva led CU with 11 points in the first half and Williams chipped in 10. Colorado shot 17-for-34 in the opening 20 minutes and the Buffs had 11 assists on those 17 baskets while OSU shot just 10 for 29.

Colorado then made sure the Beavers didn't have a comeback in their pocket

in the second half. The Buffs opened the half with a 14-3 run to build a 33-point cushion, 59-26, and CU's lead never dipped below 23 again the rest of the game. "Every game matters," da Silva said after the game. "We can't be lackadaiscial with certain opponents. We have to make sure that we dig in every single time that we step on the floor, whether it's from one half to another or from one game to

The Buffs played without regular starter **J'Vonne Hadley**, who missed the

game with an injury, but 11 Buffs did see action. Along with his career-best 10 points, Diop also had a career-high four rebounds and two assists. Now the Buffs turn their attention to an upcoming three-game road trip that will see CU play the Washington schools and Utah.

"We just went on a three-game road trip and came back 0-for-3," Boyle said. "Now we have another opportunity with a three-game road trip. It's not going to be easy and we just have to show what we can do."

SEATTLE - Colorado's J'Vonne Hadlev led five Buffaloes in double figures with 24 points Wednesday and Eddie Lampkin Jr. tallied his sixth double-double of the season as CU collected a 98-81 win over Washington at Alaska Airlines Arena

Tad Boyle's Buffs won their fourth in a row and collected their first true road win of the season to improve to 15-5 overall and 6-3 in Pac-12 play. Washington fell to 11-9, 3-6.

Hadley shot 8-for-10 from the floor and 7-for-8 from the free throw line to give him his best point total as a Buff. Lampkin scored 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds and KJ Simpson had a terrific all-around night, finishing with 16 points, eight rebounds and eight assists. Cody Williams added 19 points on 7-for-10 shooting and Tristan da Silva chipped in 10 points.

Keion Brooks led Washington with 22.

The Buffs took control in the first half to lead by nine at intermission, then extended their lead to as much as 21 after the break and Washington never really threatened down the stretch.

Both teams shot well from the field, with the Buffs hitting 55 percent of their attempts (33-for-60) while Washington shot 54 percent (33-for-61). But the big difference came at the free throw line, where CU hit 26 of its 28 attempts while the Huskies were just 10-for-18 from the stripe.

Colorado also held a dominant 38-22 edge on the boards, including 11 offensive rebounds that the Buffs converted into 15 second-chance points

"I thought our guys really came together tonight," Boyle said. "I told them for the last two days that now is the time to go get a road win — and they went out and did it. They played with great toughness, overcame some adversity early and were really dialed in

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs took a nine-point lead into the break, 50-41, and quickly built their edge into double digits early in the second half.

Da Silva opened the half with a short jumper for the Buffs, then added a threepoint play on CU's next trip down the floor to give Colorado a 55-41 lead less than two minutes into the half. Washington then managed to narrow the deficit back to 10 before the Buffs took firm control for good with a 10-0 run.

Luke O'Brien started the surge with a bucket inside before Hadley scored four in a row to give CU a 67-51 edge.

Hadley missed the final few minutes of the first half after taking a vicious shot to the face. CU personnel evaluated him closely at halftime. But Hadley said he was fine and returned in the second half to play a key role in the victory

Washington called a timeout after CU's quick 6-0 burst but the Buffs kept the pressure on after the break. Julian Hammond III hit two free throws with 11:08 to play and Lampkin followed with a bucket a minute later to give Colorado a 71-51 lead at midpoint of the half.

Washington then answered with a quick 6-0 run but Lampkin stopped the run with a tip-in and Colorado then maintained a comfortable lead down the stretch to collect the win.

After a slow start, neither team managed to string together defensive stops in the first half. Colorado took a four-point lead with 11:36 to play on a da Silva bucket and free throw after a behind-the-back pass from Lampkin but UW came back to momentarily take a 19-18 edge.

But the Buffs rallied to regain a 21-19 lead on three free throws from Simpson, then pushed their edge to five, 27-22, on a Williams 3-pointer

The Huskies never led again.

The Buffs finally extended their cushion to seven on a Williams drive to the hoop with 4:13 to play, then took a nine-point lead on another Williams basket, fueled by an Assane Diop steal and assist.

UW then cut the margin back to six on a Moses Wood 3-pointer. CU, though, took its lead back to nine after a 3-pointer from Bangot Dak at the buzzer off a drive-and-dish from Williams, sending the Buffs into the break with a 50-41 edge.

PULLMAN, Wash. - Colorado narrowed a 13-point deficit to three in the final minutes Saturday but the Buffaloes couldn't completely close the gap and CU dropped a 78-69 decision to Washington State at Beasley Coliseum.

Tad Boyle's Buffs saw their four-game win streak come to an end and fell to 15-6 overall, 6-4 in Pac-12 play. WSU improved to 15-6, 6-4.

KJ Simpson led Colorado with 25 points and eight rebounds, Tristan da Silva scored 16 and Eddie Lampkin Jr. chipped in 10. CU freshman Cody Williams had a rare off day, finishing with just six points, all from the free throw line.

Jaylen Wells and Myles Rice each scored 17 for the Cougars.

The Buffs trailed by eight less than eight minutes in. They briefly managed to tie the game at 22-22 with five minutes left in the first half but the Cougars pushed their lead back to six at intermission, 36-30.

Colorado then gave up an 11-2 run midway through the second half that allowed WSU to build its big lead of the game, 59-46. CU did slowly chip away at the lead, using a 7-0 run to close the gap to three several times in the final minutes, but that was as close as the Buffs could come.

Colorado shot just 22-for-57 (38.6 percent) while WSU was 28-for-62 (45 percent). The big difference came in turnovers and second-chance points. WSU outscored the Buffs 13-5 in points off miscues and the Cougars also had a commanding 16-4 edge in second-chance points.

"It was a physical game and we knew that coming in," Boyle said. "I love our fight. I love our competitiveness. This team's got a lot of grit to it but (WSU's) physicality bothered some of our guys and we weren't good enough to overcome

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado trailed by six at the break, 36-30, and the Cougars extended their lead to 13 midway through the second half. The Buffs committed three turnovers in a two-minute span that fueled an 11-2 run and the Buffs trailed 59-46 with just under nine minutes to play.

"We lost this game in two areas," Boyle said. "If you take the points off turnovers and the second-chance points and you cut them in half, it's a ballgame."

But the Buffaloes did battle back to close the gap to three down the stretch, using a 14-4 run. A Simpson 3-pointer pulled CU to within 63-60 with 3:28 to play and the Buffs twice cut the deficit to three with less than two minutes to go on two Simpson free throws and a Lampkin basket inside.

That, though, was as close as the Buffs could come. Colorado couldn't come up with a critical defensive stop in the final minutes and the Buffs returned to Boulder in the midst of a logiam in the Pac-12 standings.

"Going on the road in this league — in any league — is not easy," Boyle said. "I told our team that good teams come back. Great teams come back and win on the road. We were a good team, we want to be a great team."

The Buffs have one more road game - next Saturday at Utah, their only game next week — before returning home for a pair the following week.

"There's a lot of basketball to be played," Boyle said. "We're halfway through (the Pac-12 season) and we're not satisfied with where we are. We'd love to have this one back but it doesn't work like that."

The Buffs struggled to find any offensive rhythm the entire game. The Cougars used a 9-0 run early — all from 3-pointers — to take a 10-4 lead four minutes in and the Buffs never led again.

WSU then pushed its cushion to eight, 18-10, before the Buffs battled back to tie the game. CU used a 6-1 surge to knot the score at 22-22, getting a Simpson drive and two free throws each from da Silva and Williams.

But the Cougars answered again, pushing their lead back to six at the half,

SALT LAKE CITY - A late Colorado rally came up just short Saturday and the shorthanded Buffaloes dropped a 73-68 decision to Utah at the Huntsman

Tad Boyle's Buffs, playing without starter Cody Williams and key reserve Luke O'Brien (both injured), fell to 15-7 overall and 6-5 in Pac-12 play while the Utes improved to 15-7, 6-5.

The Buffs trailed by as much as 13 in the second half before narrowing the deficit to three in the final minutes. But that was as close as they could come as CU fell to 1-6 on the road this season.

KJ Simpson led the Buffs with 25 points, J'Vonne Hadley added 15, Eddie Lampkin Jr. had an 11-point, 10-rebound double-double and Tristan da Silva scored 10.

Gabe Madsen led Utah with 21.

Colorado, one of the top shooting teams in the nation, shot just 25-for-66 (38 percent), CU's second-worst outing in Pac-12 play. Utah, meanwhile, shot 26-for-56, including a 14-for-27 mark in the decisive second half.

CU did have a 43-34 edge on the boards but the Utes outscored Colorado 21-7 in fast-break points, one of the big differences in the game.

"Disappointing," Boyle said "We didn't have the same defensive intensity for the first 32 minutes that we had down the stretch. We had some good looks offensively but they didn't go in and we had some guys who were frustrated on offense and they let that affect their defense. It was a five-point game because our guys are competitive and they play hard. I love them for that. But we have to play better on both sides."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The two teams were tied 31-31 at intermission, but the Utes slowly pulled away in the opening minutes of the second half when Colorado's offense went cold.

A 6-0 Utah burst pushed Colorado's deficit to 10 at the 12:32 mark before the Utes extended their edge to 13 when a Hunter Erickson 3-pointer left the Buffs trailing 55-42.

Colorado missed nine field goal attempts in a row in the stretch before Julian Hammond III ended the drought with a 3-pointer.

But the Buffs didn't go away quietly after the Utes built their big lead. CU put together a 6-0 run following a timeout, getting a Simpson steal and dunk, a Hammond offensive rebound and basket and another putback from Lampkin.

With 6:27 still to play, Colorado trailed by just seven, 55-48.

The Utes then rebuilt their lead to double digits, 62-50, with four minutes to play before the Buffs staged one more rally by forcing three Utah turnovers. Hadley hit two free throws, Simpson scored inside and da Silva hit a free throw to pull CU to within 62-55 with 2:12 still to play. Simpson then sandwiched a pair of treys around a Utah basket and with 1:02 remaining, Colorado had whittled the gap to 66-63.

That, though, was as close as the Buffs could come in the final seconds as the Utes hit their free throws to hold on for the win.

"We had some good looks and they didn't go in, especially coming out of halftime," Boyle said. "I keep talking to the guys about the fact that you have to figure out a way to win games on nights like that and this team hasn't figured that out vet."

After falling behind early in the opening minutes, CU battled back to take a 16-15 lead nine minutes into the game when Hadley scored four points and da Silva added a bucket in a 6-0 Colorado run.

The two teams then traded the lead five more times over the next 11 minutes. Colorado led by three, 27-24, after Simpson put together a personal 5-0 run before the Utes rallied to regain a 31-29 edge.

Hadley then finished the first half scoring with his basket inside to knot the score at 31-31 at the break.

Frankie Collins led ASU with 18.

The Buffs led by as much as 18 in the first half, by nine at intermission and by 16 early in the second half. But the Sun Devils refused to go away and cut Colorado's edge to just five, 73-68, with 2:13 to play.

But Hadley, who had a three-point play a minute earlier, drained a long 3-pointer just before the shot clock buzzer to put the Buffs back up by eight, 76-68, with 1:35 to play.

Colorado then hit six free throws in the final 1:28 to salt away the win.

The Buffs shot 24-for-51 (47.1 percent) while ASU was 27-for-61 (44.3 percent) from the floor. Colorado also held a 37-29 edge on the boards.

But the big difference came at the free throw line. CU hit 26 of its 29 attempts from the stripe while ASU shot 9-for-14.

"Winning a game in February is like finding gold," Boyle said. "ASU has a competitive coach and competitive players. I thought we could have blown it open in the second half when we got up 16, but they came back. Competitive teams are going to do that. But our guys did what they had to do."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs led by as much as 18 in the first half before the Sun Devils cut the deficit in half by intermission, 44-35.

CU then quickly pushed its lead to 16 in the opening minutes of the second half on a 3-pointer from Williams and a four-point play from da Silva. Colorado appeared to be on the verge of blowing the game open.

Instead, the Sun Devils slowly whittled away at the lead. ASU used an 8-0 run midway through the half to cut Colorado's lead to nine, 57-48, then pulled to within seven, 63-56, with seven minutes to play.

"I've been working on my shot and it's just repetition," Hadley said. "My teammates trust me and I was confident letting it go and it went in."

CU then hit six free throws down the stretch to cement the win and notch the program-record 13-0 home mark.

"Our guys did a good job tonight," Boyle said. "We didn't play our best offensively and we had a few breakdowns defensively, but we did what we had to do and put away a really competitive Arizona State team."

Colorado threatened to turn the game into a blowout early, jumping out to an 18-1 lead. Simpson had six points in the early surge and Eddle Lampkin Jr. and Hadley each added four and Colorado had a 17-point cushion less than six minutes in.

The Sun Devils, meanwhile, missed their first seven shots from the floor before finally getting a Collins bucket at the 14:25 mark.

CU kept the pressure on. A Lampkin free throw with 8:57 to play in the half gave Colorado an 18-point edge, 31-13, and the Buffs looked firmly in control.

But the Sun Devils' offense suddenly woke up. Alonzo Gaffney hit two of three ASU 3-pointers in an 11-0 run that was aided by four straight empty CU possessions, including a pair of turnovers. That cut CU's lead to seven, 31-24.

CU momentarily stopped the slide with two free throws each from Simpson and da Silva, plus a Williams dunk — only to see ASU answer with a 7-0 surge. That added up to a 20-6 Arizona State run over a six-minute span and with 2:48 to play in the half, Colorado's lead had been shaved to four, 37-33.

But the Buffs finally righted themselves over the final minutes of the half, getting a basket and two free throws from da Silva and a Hadley basket to send Colorado into the break with a nine-point edge, 44-35.

But the big difference came in points off turnovers and second-chance buckets. Arizona turned 16 Colorado turnovers into 23 points and also scored 23 points off 12 offensive rebounds. CU had 12 points off turnovers and 15 second-chance

The Bruins then pushed their lead back to seven before Colorado crafted a 10-3 run to tie the game at 51-51 with 6:50 to play. Williams had five points in the burst, including a 3-pointer, and a da Silva dunk off a nice feed from Simpson tied the game.

Colorado shot just 10 free throws in the game — tying a season low — and made six. The Bruins hit 12 of their 18 opportunities from the line.

The Buffs then tied the game again at 54-54 on a da Silva 3-pointer and were still within two, 58-56, when Lampkin hit a pair of free throws with 3:19 remaining.

But the Bruins responded with five in a row before CU got a Lampkin bucket inside, then a defensive stop. That gave Colorado possession with 1:16 to play and a five point deficit, 63-58.

Williams then banked his eighth basket of the night off the glass to cut UCLA's lead to 63-60 and the Buffs recorded another defensive stop on the opposite end

CU then called timeout with 17 seconds remaining.
But the Buffs couldn't get a clean shot out of the break. A late da Silva drive at the bucket came up short and a scramble for the ball after the shot resulted in a held ball, giving UCLA possession with just 3 seconds remaining.

The Bruins then hit a free throw with 2 seconds left to clinch the win

Colorado jumped out to an early 8-5 lead on a pair of baskets from da Silva. But the Bruins answered with a 7-0 run, thanks to a pair of CU turnovers, and

the Buffs never led again.

Turnovers continued to plague the Buffs the rest of the period, and they finished the half with nine, leading to 15 UCLA points.

Colorado did manage to close UCLA's cushion to two when a Williams bucket

pulled CU to within 18-16, only to see the Bruins deliver another 7-0 run two minutes later to stretch their edge to 30-20.

LOS ANGELES — Colorado erased a 16-point second half deficit to force overtime Saturday and the Buffaloes then fought through a second and elect to force overtime Saturday and the Buffaloes then fought through a second overtime to collect a 92-89 victory over Southern California at the Galen Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 17-9 overall and 8-7 in Pac-12 play while the Trojans stipped to 10-16, 4-11.

KJ Simpson led CU with 30 points — 24 coming in the second half — and nine

KJ Simpson led CU with 30 points — 24 coming in the second half — and nine rebounds as the Buffs collected a much-needed road victory. J Vonne Hadley had a 13-point, 10-rebound double-double, his second of the season, Tristan da Silva tallied 18 points and Cody Williams chipped in 14.

Boogie Ellis led USC with 30 points.

The Buffs trailed by 16 with 92.2 to play in regulation but never quit, slowly chipping away at the lead. CU used a 9-9 run to narrow the deficit to single digits with just under six minutes to play, then whittled the USC lead to one with just more than a minute to play. Colorado finally tied the game at 73-73 with 3 seconds remaining in regulation when Simpson dished a pass underneath to Luke O'Brien, who delivered a thundering dunk to force overtime.

force overtime.

USC then forced a second overtime with a layup to tie the game at 83-83 at the end of the first extra period but the Buffs outscored the Trojans 9-6 in the second overtime to collect the win. Simpson hit two free throws with 1:09 remaining to give the Buffs the

cushion they needed.

The Buffs were once again hampered by turnovers, committing 21. But they made up for the miscues by shooting \$2.5% from the floor (31-for-59) while also holding a commanding 47-22 edge on the boards.

LSC shot 47% from the floor (34-73), but the Buffs held the Trojans to just 15-for-35 shooting over the last 17 minutes of regulation and 10 minutes of extra play.

"I'm not big on historical wins and stuff like that, but I know this was the grittiest, gritti-

"I'm not big on historical wins and stuff like that, but I know this was the grittlest, grittlestwin I've experienced at Colorado in a long, long time," Boyle said. "Our guys deserved it for all the things we've been through. All the injuries and just coming up short so many times. Tonight we figured out a way to come out a winner. Sometimes it's not pretty but you find a way to win and our guys did that."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado trailed by just six at intermission, 39-33, after a first haff that saw CU turn the ball over nine times, leading to eight USC points.

But the Buffs dug their hole deeper in a hurry in the opening minutes of the second half. CU turned the ball over on each of its first three possessions and less than five minutes in, the Trojans extended their cushion to 14. With 9:52 to play, the deficit reached 16 when an Eilis 3-pointer and a Bronny James layung ave USC a 65-49 lead.

Colorado refused to go away. Simpson pulled Colorado to within 10 with a pair of free throw and Simpson buried a long 3-pointer and CU trailed just 68-66 with 3:42 on the clock. clock

USC then temporarily bumped the lead back to four before the Buffs got another

USC then temporarily bumped the lead back to four before the Buffs got another Simpson 3-pointer to cut the Trojans' lead to one, 70-69, with 1:58 to play.

The Trojans then got two free throws from DJ Rodman before da Silva answered with a bucket underneath to keep CU with one, 72-71, with 1:05 to play.

Both teams then came up empty on ensuing possessions before USC's Isaiah Collier hit one of two free throws with 11 seconds remaining to give the Trojans a 73-71 lead.

Colorado then called timeout and drew up the perfect play. Simpson brought the ball down court, dribbled underneath into a crowd and dished to O'Brien, who slammed home a dunk to tie the game with 3 seconds remaining in regulation, sending the game into overtime.

Colorado then took its first lead since early in the game halfway through the extra period. Simpson delivered a layup to give CU a 78-77 edge, then forced a turnover and handed another assist to O'Brien underneath to give CU an 80-77 lead with 1:58 to play. USC cut the lead back to one with two free throws but da Silva answered with a 3-pointer with 1:08 to play to give the Buffs an 83-79 lead.

The Trojans answered with two more free throws and the Buffs came up empty on their next possession. That left just enough time for USC's Collier to hit a driving layup with four ticks left on the clock to tie the game at 83-83, sending the game into a second overtime.

Tad Boyle's Buffs won their fourth straight game to improve to 20 and 11-7 in Pac-12 play. Stanford lost its sixth straight game to fall to 12-17, 7-12. Colorado also improved to 16-1 at home this season as the Buffs cliched their

10th 20-win season in Boyle's 14 years in Boulder. Along with da Silva's second double-double of the season, KJ Simpson added 22 points and seven assists for the Buffs, J'Vonne Hadley scored 15 and

Eddie Lampkin Jr. chipped in 11.

Maxime Raynaud led Stanford with 26 points and 12 rebounds.

Colorado trailed at the midway point of the first half but used a 23-6 run to take control and the Buffs led by seven at the half, 44-37. Stanford briefly cut the lead to just three early in the second half but Colorado quickly responded to push the lead into double digits and led by as much as 20 down the stretch.

The victory moved the Buffs into a tie for third with Oregon in the Pac-12 standings, with the top four in the league earning a first-round bye in the conference person.

ence tournament. The win also guaranteed the Buffs a winning conference record, Boyle's ninth winning conference mark in 13 Pac-12 seasons.

The Buffs were once again without the services of starter Cody Williams and key reserve Julian Hammond III (injuries), but the Buffs had more than enough firepower to dispatch the Cardinal.

Colorado shot 53 percent from the floor (33-for-62), including 11-for-25 from long range. CU also had a 38-27 edge on the boards and tallied 13 second-chance

points.
Stanford shot 25-for-57 (44 percent), but the Buffs limited the Cardinal to just 11-for-29 shooting in the second half, including a dismal 3-for-18 effort from long

Da Silva finished 11-for-18 from the floor (5-for-10 from beyond the arc) while

EUGENE, Ore. — Colorado rallied from a 12-point first-half deficit Thursday and the Buffaloes' men's basketball team took a crucial 79-75 win at Oregon to clinch the third spot in the Pac-12 standings.

Tad Boyle's Buffs won their fifth in a row to improve to 21-9 overall and 12-7

in Pac-12 play while the Ducks dropped to 19-11, 11-8.

The Buffs thus guaranteed themselves of a first-round bye in next week's Pac-12 tournament and will open play Thursday at 9:30 p.m. (MT) against the winner of the No. 6 seed and No. 11 seed.

Equally importantly, the victory is a huge boost to CU's NCAA Tournament resume, giving the Buffs another much-needed Quad 1 victory.

CU's JVonne Hadley delivered a 20-point, 12-rebound double-double on 8-for-11 shooting, with 18 of those points coming in a second half that included a 4-for-4 effort from 3-point range. Tristan da Silva scored 22 points and KJ Simpson added 17 points, six rebounds and six assists.

Jackson Shelstad led Oregon with 23 points.

Colorado fell behind early, 18-6, after the Ducks opened with an 11-0 run. But the Buffs didn't flinch and slowly climbed back into the game. CU put together its own 11-0 run to close the gap and the score was tied at 37-37 at the break.

Neither team managed to create anything resembling a big lead for much of the second half as there were seven lead changes. But Colorado finally took the lead for good with a 9-0 run that gave the Buffs a 70-61 edge with 3:20 to play.

Oregon then battled back to close the gap to one, 75-75, in the final minute. But the Buffs of a bjb bucket from Hadley with 13 seconds remaining, then notched a defensive stop and added one more free throw from Luke O'Brien with 2 seconds left to clinch what is arguably CU's biggest win thus far this season.

The Buffs were once again missing starter Cody Williams (ankle injury) and Julian Hammond III (knee) but CU still had enough firepower for the win. Colorado shot 55 percent from the floor (32-for-58), including 8-for-17 from 3-point range, and the Buffs had a dominant 36-24 edge on the boards.

we just didn't get our heads down. We just kept battling, kept battling, and got back
in the game. Just a gut-check win and it was not easy. Our guys really executed
down the stretch and I'm really proud of them."

The two teams then traded the lead five times over the first nine minutes of the second half. Colorado took a 47-46 lead on a Hadley 3-pointer and then grabbed a 50-48 edge on an O'Brien offensive board and putback.

Hadley then unleashed a hot streak. He hit his third 3-pointer of the half to give the Buffs a 56-52 edge midway through the half, grabbed an offensive rebound and scored to end a mini-Oregon run a minute later, then drained another trey to give Colorado a 61-57 lead with eight minutes remaining. Oregon then hit a pair of buckets to lie it up at 61-61 but the Buffs answered

with their decisive 9-0 run to take a lead they never relinquished.

Da Silva hit a 3-pointer from the win off a nice feed from O'Brien before Simpson recorded a steal and layup to give the Buffs a 66-61 edge with 4:10 to play.

That run prompted an Oregon timeout but the Buffs kept the pressure up after the break. Simpson grabbed a long defensive rebound and cashed in a transition layup and Hadley drove to the hoop to extend CU's run to 9-0 and the Colorado lead to 70-61.

Oregon, though, didn't go away quietly. The Ducks shaved CU's lead down to four with a 3-pointer and finally pulled to within two with 40 seconds remaining on an NFaly Dante bucket.

Colorado pushed its lead back to four with two Simpson free throws with 40 seconds remaining before the Ducks answered with a Jermane Couisinard 3-pointer to cut Colorado's lead to 76-75 with 36 seconds to play.

But CU took care of business in the final seconds. After a block by Dante sent

the ball out of bounds on CU's ensuing possession, Hadley delivered again with a bucket off a Simpson assist to give CU a 78-75 lead with 13 seconds on the clock. Oregon then missed a 3-pointer on the ensuing possession and O'Brien grabbed the rebound and was fouled. The CU senior hit one free throw with two seconds left to clinch the critical win
