THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 11-17 overall and 2-15 in Big 12 Conference play after falling to Kansas, 71-64, on Feb. 24. The Buffaloes have won two of four since snapping a 13-game losing streak, the program's longest since 1985-86.

The Buffaloes are looking for their first true road win, having lost all eight Big 12 road games this season. Colorado is 1-10 away from Boulder this season, that win coming at the Maui Invitational against defending NCAA champion UConn.

Colorado is averaging 70.2 points per game, shooting 44.7 percent from the field, but those numbers have dipped to 66.0 points on 43.0 percent shooting during conference games. The Buffaloes have scored 76 points in each of their two Big 12 wins, their highest

total in a league game this season. Colorado had four players score in double figures for just the third time this season (3-0) in the win over Baylor.

Defensively, Colorado is allowing 71.9 points per game overall while opponents are shooting 43.4 percent. During Big 12 games, Colorado is allowing 74.2 points while opponents shoot 45.0 percent.

The Buffaloes rank fourth in the Big 12 in free throw percentage (.755), sixth in defensive rebounds (25.6 drpg), seventh in rebounding defense (32.9 rpg) and eighth in blocked shots (3.9 bpg). During Big 12 games, Colorado is in the top half of the league in free throw percentage (4th, .749), blocked shots (7th, 3.8 bpg), rebounding defense (8th, 33.8 rpg) and defensive rebounds (8th, 23.8 drpg).

Colorado has seen an uptick in its rebounding efforts the last four games. The Buffaloes are averaging 40.0 rebounds in those contests, up 4.9 per game over its season average of 35.1. Colorado had a season-high 52 in the win over UCF and its total of 46 against Kansas is the second best this season.

Colorado, which ranks 14th in the Big 12 in offensive rebounds at 9.1 per game, has vaulted that number up to 12 per outing during that four-game span. The Buffaloes had a season-high 18 offensive boards against Kansas, the team's most since securing 19 against Florida State on Nov. 21, 2023. Colorado nabbed 16 offensive rebounds in the win over UCF.

Julian Hammond III, the most experienced player in terms of games for the Buffaloes (played in his 116th career game vs. Kansas), leads Colorado at 12.8 points and 3.1 assists per game. Hammond also tops the Buffaloes in steals (33), 3-point field goals made (45), free throws made (73) and free throw percentage (.901).

Hammond is second in the Big 12 and ranks 13th in the nation in free throw percentage. He has made 74 of 82 on the season (.902) which includes consecutive made streaks of 21 (between UNC and UCF) and 18 which ended against Cincinnati. He is on pace for the second-best single-season free throw percentage in team history.

Recently, Hammond has picked up his rebounding numbers. He is averaging 4.0 rebounds over the last four games, including five against Baylor. He has 16 total in that span after having just two over the four games before that.

Hammond had a game-high 22 points against Houston, highlighted by a career-best five 3-point field goals. It was his team-best sixth 20-point game of the season.

Andrej Jakimovski, a four-year standout at old Pac-12 rival Washington State, is averaging 10.1 points ranking second on the team in 3-point field goals (43) and rebounding (4.6 rpg) and is third in steals (25).

Jakimovski is averaging 12.5 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting 47.4 percent from the field (18-38) the last four games. He had 17 points, hitting 5 of 9 from downtown, seven rebounds and five assists against Baylor. It was his 12th double-figure scoring game of the season and led the Buffs for the sixth time.

Jakimovski's five assists against Baylor are his CU best, and tied for this third-best collegiate game overall. He had back-to-back nine assist games as a freshman with Washington State against California and Stanford, Feb. 18 & 20, 2021. His five 3-pointers tied a career high, done twice this season (CSU Fullerton) and five times overall (three with WSU).

Bangot Dak is averaging 8.2 points and 3.9 rebounds per game while shooting 51.4 percent from the field and leading the Buffaloes in blocked shots (40). During conference games, Dak is Colorado's leading shooter (.535), rebounder (4.5 rpg) and shot blocker (31) and ranks second in scoring at 9.4 points per game.

Dak had a team-high 16 points on 7 of 10 shooting in the home game with Kansas. He scored a game and career-high 20 points on 8 for 14 shooting at Iowa State. Dak is averaging 11.2 points, 4.9 rebounds and 1.8 blocks over the last nine games.

Dak just missed a double-double with nine points and a career and team season-high 12 rebounds at TCU. It was his first double-figure rebounding game of his career.

Dak is seventh in the Big 12 in overall blocked shots (1.4 bpg) and fourth in league only games (1.8 bpg). He ranks 95th in the nation in total blocks (40).

Elijah Malone, the 2024 Bevo Francis Award winner as the best small-school player in the nation (Grace College [Ind.] - NAIA) tops the Buffaloes in shooting at 56.7 percent while averaging 7.7 points an outing. Malone is third on the team in blocks (15), fourth in scoring and fifth in rebounding at 3.0 per game.

Trevor Baskin, an NCAA Division II All-American at Colorado Mesa, leads Colorado in rebounding (4.7 rpg), is second in steals (29) and blocks (17), tied for second in assists (53) and third in overall shooting at 50.4 percent.

Javon Ruffin is averaging 5.9 points and is tied for second on the team in assists (53) and fourth in 3-point field goals (23). He led the Buffaloes in scoring for the first time this season with 13 at Utah while matching a personal best with three 3-point field goals.

Freshman Sebastian Rancik is averaging 6.0 points on the season, but since entering the starting lineup against Arizona State he is averaging 8.6 points and 4.6 rebounds per game. Rancik had 10 points and six rebounds in the win over Baylor. He averaged 14.5 points and 8.0 rebounds during the two-game span at Kansas and home vs. UCF. Rancik had a career-night at Kansas leading the Buffaloes with 19 points and nine rebounds, both personal bests.

Sophomore **Assane Diop** is averaging 3.7 points and is third on the team in rebounding at 4.1 per game. Diop matched his career-best 10 rebounds in the win over UCF, also hitting that mark against Northern Colorado. Diop has made 33 of 40 free throw attempts during the conference season (.825).

Sophomore **RJ Smith** is averaging 5.4 points and is second on the team in 3-point percentage (.375), while ranking third in 3-pointers made (27), fourth in assists (50) and fifth in steals (18). Smith had 13 points against Baylor recording his fifth career double-figure scoring game and fourth this year. He has blocked a shot in six-straight games with seven overall during that span. He had two blocks in his first 28 career games.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: Kansas State is 13-15 overall and tied for 10th in the Big 12 at 7-10. The Wildcats have lost their last four, most recently an 80-76 setback at UCF on Feb. 26. Kansas State averages 72.6 points per game on 44.8 percent shooting. The Wildcats are in the top half of the Big 12 in assists, ranking sixth at 15.8 per contest. Defensively, Kansas State allows 70.8 points per game while opponents shoot 43.7 percent.

Senior wing David N'Guessan leads Kansas State at 12.7 points and 7.1 rebounds per game. He leads the Big 12 and ranks 11th in the

nation in shooting at 62.8 percent. Junior guard Brendan Hausen averages 11.8 points and is second in the Big 12 in 3-point field goals made (83) and percentage (.397). Junior guard Dug McDaniel leads the Wildcats in assists (131) while averaging 11.1 points per game. Senior wing Coleman Hawkins, who has missed the last two games, averages 10.7 points, 6.7 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game.

Jerome Tang is in his third year as the head coach of Kansas State with a record of 58-40 (.592).

THE SERIES: This will be the 145th meeting between Colorado and Kansas State in a series that dates back to 1934. Kansas State holds a 96-48 all-time lead in the series. Colorado has won the last four meetings, including a nonconference win at Bramlage Coliseum on Nov. 27, 2020. Kansas State holds a 54-12 all-time advantage in Manhattan.

Tad Boyle is 4-0 against Kansas State as a head coach. Bill Self is 20-1 against Colorado as a head coach. Jerome Tang has not faced Colorado as a head coach, although he was 7-6 against the Buffaloes during his 19 years as a Baylor assistant/associate head coach (2003-22).

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Taking the latest rankings into account, the Buffaloes are projected to have eight games against ranked opponents this season, which would fall one game short of the most in program history. Colorado played nine games against ranked teams in 1989-90, 1991-92 and 2010-11. Colorado is 1-6 against ranked opponents in 2024-25.

The win over No. 2/2 UConn marks the highest-ranked win away from Boulder in program history. Colorado has two previous wins over No. 2 teams, both coming in Boulder (Feb. 12, 1992 vs. #2 Oklahoma State, 57-53 & Feb. 26, 2022 vs. #2 Arizona, 79-63). Senior **Julian Hammond III** and redshirt junior **Javon Ruffin** were both on that team that defeated Arizona. The previous best neutral site win came against No. 4 Washington on Dec. 30, 1953 in Kansas City (Big 7 Holiday Tournament).

Colorado's last win against a defending national champion came against the 1952 NCAA champion Kansas Jayhawks on Jan. 20, 1953, 72-68 in Boulder.

Colorado's 28 wins over ranked Associated Press ranked opponents in the Tad Boyle era is by far the best in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 28-55, have accounted for 39 percent of wins over ranked opponents (72) since 1949-50.

Colorado faced two ranked nonconference opponents on back-to-back days for the first time in 26 years, Nov. 26-27, 1998, when the Buffaloes played No. 4 Kentucky (L, 52-64) and No. 10 Xavier (L, 61-74) in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

TOP 5 RARITY: The game against Houston was Colorado's fourth top 5 ranked opponent this season. It's just the fourth time in the AP rankings era (since 1948-49) the Buffaloes have played four top 5 opponents in one season. The others were 1957-58, 1989-90 and 2001-02.

In 2001-02, Colorado played three games against Kansas teams ranked either No. 1 or No. 2 and once against No. 5 Oklahoma - then coached by current Houston coach Kelvin Sampson. Colorado's first three top 5 battles this year came within the first 12 games of the season.

The most top 5 teams Colorado has faced in one season came in 1989-90 when the Buffaloes had five games against top 5 opponents shared between Oklahoma, Kansas and Missouri.

Hammond is also on pace to rank highly on a pair of career shooting percentage lists. He is shooting 83.8 percent (160-191) from the free throw line for his career which currently is the third-best mark in program history. Hammond has made 37.9 percent of his career 3-point field goals (118-311) which is currently 11th.

RETURN HOME TO THE BIG 12: Colorado returns to the Big 12 where it had been a charter member for the 1995-96 season when the old Big Eight Conference and four teams from the dissolved Southwest Conference merged to form the Big 12. The Buffaloes left for the Pac-12 for the 2011-12 season.

In their last Big 12 season in 2010-11, led by then first-year head coach Tad Boyle, the Buffaloes tied for fifth place in the league standings that season at 8-8 advancing to the Big 12 Championship semifinals. Colorado won a then-school record 24 games in 2010-11 (24-14), finishing its season in the NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden.

BD's BIG DAY: Sophomore forward **Bangot Dak** had a career-night against Cincinnati with 19 points, eight blocks and eight rebounds. He recorded career highs in points, blocks, 3-point field goals (2) and overall field goal attempts (13) while matching personal bests in rebounds and field goals made (7).

His eight blocks are the third-most in a single game since the stat became official in 1977-78.

SEASON BLOCK NUMBERS: Bangot Dak's 40 blocked shots are the most by a Colorado player in a season since Tyler Bey had 44 in 2018-19. He's tied for 21st on Colorado's single-season list, just one outside the single-season top 20.

ROAD RARITY: Colorado's game at Arizona State on Jan. 4, the 13th of 2024-25, was the latest for the Buffaloes' first true road game in any season in program history. It's the latest in a calendar year since the Buffaloes traveled to play at Colorado College on Jan. 5, 1945, but that was only the fourth game of the season.

Colorado did play three high-level games at the prestigious Maui Invitational away from home. A thrilling 73-72 win over then-No. 2/2 ranked UConn on the tournament's second day (Nov. 26) highlighted the trip for the Buffaloes who eventually fell to No. 5/5 Iowa State 99-71 in the consolation final (fifth place game) on Nov. 27 to round out the event with a 1-2 record.

STEALS AND TURNOVERS: Colorado recorded 15 steals in the win over Bellarmine, the program's most since having 15 against USC on Jan. 10, 2013. The Buffaloes have five games of double-digit steals (12 at OSU, 10 at ASU and 12 in each of the first two games against UNC & Eastern Washington). Colorado had just one game of double-digit steals all of last season (11 vs. Miami, Fla., in Brooklyn, Dec. 10, 2023).

Colorado had a season-low eight turnovers at Kansas.

RIGHT AT HOME: At the CU Events Center, the Buffaloes have won:

In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is 203-47 at home (.812). The Buffaloes are 516-198 (.723) all-time at the CUEC. The Buffaloes have won at least 10 games at home each of the last 16 seasons.

Colorado was 16-1 at the CU Events Center in 2023-24, tying for the most regular season home wins in a season joining the 2015-16 (16-1) and 2013-14 (16-2) teams at that mark (the 2010-11 team won a school-record 18 home games, which included three postseason NIT victories).

BOYLE MILESTONES: Head coach **Tad Boyle**, in his 15th season, picked up his 300th win at Colorado during the win over Northern Colorado, the most in program history.

Boyle-led teams own 10 of the 14 20-win seasons in team history, the top five single-season win totals and seven of the top eight. With a record of 309-200 at CU, he owns the second-best winning percentage in team history with at least four seasons coached at .607, trailing Forrest "Frosty" Cox who was 147-89 (.623) from 1936-50.

During Colorado's 13-year stint in the Pac-12 Conference, Boyle won 131 regular season league games, tying with Ernie Kent (Oregon 1998-2010 & Washington State 2014-19) for 17th in conference history.

Boyle owns the most wins at a state of Colorado NCAA Division I institution. He is 365-266 (.578) in his 19th year between Colorado and Northern Colorado (four seasons, 2006-10). Boyle is currently fifth in career wins for a head coach at any Colorado four-year school.

GOLD STANDARD: Colorado is 96-6 in the Tad Boyle era when meeting the program's "Gold Standard" of holding an opponent to 40 percent or less from the field and having a plus-8 rebounding edge. The Buffaloes have met that mark six times this season (6-0) after holding UCF to 34.4 percent from the field and enjoying a plus-23 advantage on the boards (52-29).

COMEBACK WINS: Colorado has had to overcome double-figure deficits in three wins including a rally from 11-down in the win over Pacific. The Buffaloes erased a 17-point deficit in the opener over Eastern Washington.

In the comeback win over Eastern Washington, Colorado trailed 27-10 at the 6:44 mark of the first half but was able to cut the margin to six at halftime thanks to a 10-2 run over the last 3:30 of the period. The Buffaloes then took over in the second half, outscoring the Eagles 51-25.

The 17-point deficit tied for the Buffaloes' eighth-best comeback since 1947. Colorado had overcome a 17-point deficit on three other occasions, with one being another game against Eastern Washington on Dec. 22, 2016. The Buffaloes trailed 19-2 right out of the gate in that contest before fighting back for a 76-68 victory.

IN THE OT: Colorado defeated Northern Colorado in double overtime on Nov. 8, improving to 56-57 (.496) all-time in overtime games. The Buffaloes are 33-23 (.589) in overtime games at the CU Events Center and are winners in their last six OT contests at home. The Buffaloes moved to 10-5 in double overtime games. It was the first double overtime home game since a 112-103 win over South Dakota State on Dec. 15, 2017.

NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS: Colorado is 136-41 (.768) in nonconference regular season games under head coach **Tad Boyle** including an 89-24 mark (.788) since the beginning of the 2014-15 season.

Colorado is 104-8 (.929) in nonconference home games under Boyle, a record which includes a 7-2 mark in postseason action.

OPENERS: Colorado improved to 87-35 (.713) in all-time season openers and has won its last nine. The Buffaloes are 13-2 under head coach **Tad Boyle** and 40-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes are 98-24 (.803) all-time in home openers, have won their last 17 and 23 of their last 24. Boyle's teams are 15-0 in home openers.

WALL OF HONOR: A new display at the CU Events Center will honor a select group who's on the court achievements have expanded well beyond their days in Boulder.

The Men's Basketball Wall of Honor will celebrate those former Buffaloes that have achieved at least five years of service in the NBA or competed on the world stage as an Olympic Gold Medalist. The initial 10 legends to be honored are:

The honorees will have their Colorado jersey displayed high above the concourse on the northwest corner of the CU Events Center. Wall of Honor members will be recognized in person with their jerseys officially unveiled at upcoming games.

Haldorson, Meely and Davis were the first Wall of Honor members to be recognized on Jan. 28 during the Arizona State home game. Humphries was celebrated at Colorado's game with Houston on Saturday, Feb. 8. White had his jersey unveiled during the UCF game on Feb. 15. The schedule for the remaining honorees will be announced at a later date.

CLASS OF '25: Colorado has added five nationally acclaimed prospects for the 2025-26 season Colorado head coach Tad Boyle announced on Nov. 13.

Jalin Holland (Los Lunas, New Mexico), Fawaz "Tacko" Ifaola (Lagos, Nigeria), Ian Inman (The Woodlands, Texas), Isaiah Johnson (Valley Village, Calif.) and Josiah Sanders (Denver, Colo.) have signed Financial Aid Agreements to join the Buffaloes next winter, a group that, on signing day, ranked No. 23 in the country by Rivals and No. 32 by 247Sports.

PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish 15th in the annual Big 12 Preseason Coaches Poll released Oct. 10. Kansas, which received nine first place votes, was picked to win the league, followed by Houston, Iowa State, Baylor and Arizona to round out the top five.

COLORADO TO THE NBA: Colorado had seven players listed on NBA rosters to begin the 2024-25 season, the fourth most of any Big 12 school, trailing only Arizona (12), Kansas (11) and Baylor (11).

Tristan da Silva, Orlando Magic Alec Burks, Miami Heat Spencer Dinwiddie, Dallas Mavericks KJ Simpson, Charlotte Hornets Jabari Walker, Portland Trail Blazers Derrick White, Boston Celtics Cody Williams, Utah Jazz

White became Colorado's fourth alum to win an NBA championship doing so with the Celtics this last spring.

The Buffaloes had a historic 2024 NBA Draft, with three selections including two in the first round. Cody Williams became the fourth-highest pick in team history going 10th overall to the Jazz. Tristan da Silva was selected at No. 18 by the Magic. KJ Simpson was selected as the 12th pick of the second round (42nd overall) by Charlotte.

It was the first time in team history Colorado had two first round draft picks and the first time with three in the first two rounds. It was the eighth time in 14 years the Buffaloes have been represented in the draft tying for the ninth-most in the nation over that span.

Colorado's three draft picks in 2024 tied with Kentucky for the second-most. Defending national champion UConn led the way with four.

In addition, Chauncey Billups (Portland) and Jamahl Mosley (Orlando) are in their fourth seasons as NBA head coaches.

BOULDER — Colorado overcame a 17-point first-half deficit Monday night to take control in the second half and collect a 76-56 win over Eastern Washington in the Buffaloes' season opener at the CU Events Center.

Colorado improved to 13-2 in season openers under head coach **Tad Boyle**

and 15-0 in home openers in the Boyle era.

But this one didn't come easily. The Buffs were plagued by turnovers and poor shooting early and trailed, 27-10, with just under seven minutes to play in the first

nair.

But Colorado shaved the deficit to six points, 31-25, at the break, then slowly erased the deficit in the second half. The Buffs took their first lead of the game, 48-47, with just under 10 minutes to play, then cranked up the pressure with a 17-2 run to take control down the stretch and collect the win.

Colorado put four players in double figures, led by 13 points from freshman Sebastian Rancik, who was 4-for-5 from long distance. Javon Ruffin and Trevor Baskin each tallied 12 and Andrej Jakimovski added 11.

Nic McClain led EWU with 16.

The Buffs had 13 turnovers in the first half but just five after the break. After shooting just 33 percent in the first half, CU shot 56 percent after the break to finish the game 27-for-59 (45.8 percent).

the gaine 27-i07-36 years percent. Colorado held the Eagles to 36 percent shooting (21-for-58) and the Buffs also held a commanding 45-28 edge on the boards. Jakiovski and Elijah Malone each had seven rebounds for CU while Julian Hammond III led CU with four assists.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs were plaqued by turnovers from the outset. Colorado committed six miscues in the first six minutes and with 13:54 to play in the first half, Colorado trailed 14-4.

CU's troubles continued over the next seven minutes. The Buffs hit just five of

their first 21 field goal attempts, including an 0-for-8 effort from 3-point range, and with 6:45 remaining in the half, the Eagles held a 27-10 lead.

But the Buffs finally found their footing and began to narrow the gap.

Hammond started a 9-2 CU run with a drive to the hoop, followed by a Ruffin

field goal and Baskin free throw

EWU momentarily stopped the run with a basket inside but Colorado quickly responded with a 3-pointer from Rancik and a free throw from Jakimovski to complete a 9-2 surge.

Colorado continued to chip away at the deficit over the final two minutes.

Ruffin hit another bucket in the paint before Jakimovski connected on two free throws to pull the Buffs to within single digits, 31-23.

The Buffs then cut the EWU to six just before halftime. Baskin made a nice hustle play on the baseline to keep a loose ball alive and flipped it back to Ham-mond, who scored just before the buzzer to send the Buffs into the break trailing 31-25.

Colorado opened the second half with a 6-0 run, getting a Baskin bucket and free throw and a Jakimovski 3-pointer to tie the score at 31-31. But the Eagles answered with a 6-0 run of their own and held onto the lead over the next six

But the Buffs finally shifted momentum in their favor. After pulling to within 44-40 on a Bangot Dak 3-pointer and Ruffin basket inside, Colorado hit seven straight field goal attempts coming out of a timeout to take the lead.

Rancik started the surge with a free throw before following with a 3-pointer to tie the game at 44-44. EWU temporarily regained the lead before Ruffin scored to tie it again at 46-46.

EWU once again regained the lead with a free throw but Ruffin finally gave CU

its first lead of the game, 48-47, with a basket inside.

Colorado then followed with five points in a row to take control. Hammond hit a 3-pointer off a nice feed from Diop and Diop followed with a basket off the glass. That completed a CU 7-0 run and elicited a timeout from EWU with the Buffs

holding a 53-47 lead with 8:29 to play.

Defensively, the Buffs were also much better in the second half, holding EWU to just 9-for-28 shooting after the break. The Buffs forced six straight empty Eagles possessions in the decisive stretch.

The Buffs then pushed their run to 12-0 after the timeout. Rancik hit another 3-pointer and Baskin scored off an offensive rebound, and with just under six minutes to play, Colorado was in control with a 58-47 lead.

The Buffs continued to exert their will over the next three minutes. Jakimovski scored in the paint, RJ Smith hit a 3-pointer and Baskin hit a layup to complete a 17-2 Buffs run and give CU a 63-49 lead with 3:43 to play.

The Buffs then maintained control over the final minutes. Another Smith

3-pointer with 2:34 to play gave the Buffs a 17-point lead, 68-51, and Colorado kept the Eagles at bay down the stretch for the season-opening win.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 3-0 with the win while the Titans dropped to 0-3. The Buffs led by just six at the half, 35-29, but used a decisive 16-6 run midway through the second half to push their lead to 20, then slowly built the cushion down the stretch.

CU's Andrej Jakimovski, a grad transfer from Washington State, tied his

"You win by 30 at home and you defend pretty well, you rebound the ball pretty well, a lot to be pleased with," said Boyle, whose Buffs are now 99-8 in non-conference home games in his tenure. "I thought we really took a step forward offensively tonight in terms of our ball movement and the ball not sticking in people's hands. We had 22 assists on 30 baskets, which is phenomenal. We'll take

that every night."

BOULDER — Colorado put four players in double figures Sunday and the Buffaloes pulled away from Harvard down the stretch to take an 88-66 win at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 4-0 as Colorado won its seventh straight game at home and 20th in the last 21. Harvard dropped to 1-4.

Andrej Jakimovski led CU with 20 points. Elijah Malone scored 16 and added seven rebounds, Javon Ruffin scored 15 and Trevor Baskin added 13 points and seven boards in his first start as a Buff.

Evan Nelson and Chandler Pigge each scored 11 for the Crimson.

Colorado led by 12 at the half and pushed the lead to 17 early in the second period. Harvard managed to cut the deficit to just six midway through the half before the Buffs put the game away with a 21-4 run that gave Colorado a 77-54 cushion with 5:42 to play.

The bigger Buffs finished with a 43-30 edge on the boards while holding Harvard to 37 percent shooting (24-for-65). Colorado is now 93-6 in the Boyle era when hitting the "gold standard" of having at least a plus-eight rebound advantage and holding opponents to 40 percent or less shooting.

Colorado did finish with 13 turnovers, but just five in the second half when the

Buffs put the game away.

"A good win against a really, really good program," Boyle said. "I've got a lot of respect for Harvard as an institution, but also (coach) Tommy Amaker and the kind of coach he is, kind of human being he is .. We did a much better job in the second half, much better job taking care of the ball. We had three turnovers the first 17 minutes in the second half. They only made two threes in the second half, we had

18 assists and we were pretty efficient offensively. Overall, pretty pleased."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Harvard led early before the Buffs took the lead for good on an Malone bucket inside, the beginning of a 9-0 run that gave the Buffs a 14-6 edge eight minutes into the game.

But the Crimson managed to stay close, cutting the deficit down to three, 18-

15, with a 3-pointer at the 8:38 mark, one of five treys Harvard hit in the opening minutes.

Colorado, though, pushed its lead to 10 three minutes later on the heels of a 10-4 run. Malone tallied a three-point play, Jakimovski scored inside, Julian Hammond III drained a 3-pointer and Baskin connected from the lane to give the Buffs a 31-21 edge.

Harvard answered one more time, putting together a 7-0 run to pull back within three, 31-28.

But Colorado finished the half with a 15-6 run to take control. Ruffin hit two treys in the surge and Jakimovski added five points and the Buffs took a 46-34 lead into the break

The Buffs threatened to blow the game open early in the second half with a quick 5-0 run. Malone hit two free throws and Baskin swished a 3-pointer to give Colorado a 17-point edge, 51-34.

But the Crimson answered with a 14-3 run that included two 3-pointers while the Buffs endured a 1-for-7 shooting stretch. With 11:41 to play, Colorado's lead had dwindled to just six. 56-50.

Colorado's shooting wees contributed to Harvard's brief surge as the Buffs hit just five of their first 21 field goal tries of the half.

But just as quickly as Harvard pulled back within range, the Buffs put the game away with a 21-4 run that saw CU hit seven of eight field goal tries.

Sebastian Rancik started the surge with a drive inside, RJ Smith hit a 3-pointer and Ruffin sank three free throws to give CU a 64-52 lead. Baskin then hit back-to-back baskets inside. Jakimovski and Hammond drained 3-pointers and

a Malone dunk gave Colorado a 77-54 cushion with just under six minutes to play. After giving up six 3-pointers to Harvard in the first half. Colorado held the Crimson to just two after the break.
"We really just took away the threes," Ruffin said. "That was a big emphasis of

ours coming into the game. We knew that they shot 31 threes last game, which is a lot. Our goal was to take away as many as possible and we didn't do that in the first half. We also gave them easy offense by just giving them turnovers and free buckets. I think that's what changed in the second half.

LAHAINA, Hawai'i — Colorado started fast but couldn't keep pace with Michigan State on Monday, as the Buffaloes dropped a 72-56 decision in the opening round of the Maui Invitational at the Lahaina Civic Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs suffered their first loss of the season, falling to 4-1 while Michigan State improved to 5-1.

The Buffs got off to a good start, taking an early lead on 3-pointers from Julian Hammond III and Andrei Jakimovski. The Buffs were still tied with the Spartans midway through the first half when Elijah Malone scored inside to knot the score

But the Buffs went cold from that point on and the Spartans closed the half with a 17-4 run to take a 38-25 lead at halftime.

CU then briefly cut the lead back to seven early in the second half on two more 3-pointers from Hammond. But the Spartans then slowly pulled away, building their lead to 17 at the midway point of the half and pushing it to as much as 20 down the stretch.

Hammond led CU with 15 points while Malone added 14 points on 7-for-10 shooting along with five rebounds.

Jase Richardson led MSU with 13 points.

Colorado was dominated inside as the Spartans held a 50-28 edge in points in the paint, including a 22-6 edge in fast break points. CU also shot just 37 percent from the floor (20-for-56) while MSU shot 49 percent (40-for-61) despite hitting just two of 21 3-point tries.

Michigan State also held a commanding 42-29 rebound edge. "They didn't do anything that we didn't expect," Boyle said. "Unfortunately, we

But then the roof caved in on the Buffs. CU endured a 1-13 shooting slump over the final nine minutes of the half, including an 0-for-7 stretch. That paved the way for a 17-4 MSU run, sending Colorado into the locker room at halftime trailing

"We didn't do a good job of adjusting and getting back to what we did in the first 10 minutes of the game," said Buff Trevor Baskin, who finished with nine points and three rebounds.

Along with their shooting slump, the Buffs were also pounded inside. While the Spartans missed all nine of their 3-point attempts in the first half, they still held a decisive 26-10 edge in points in the paint to take their halftime lead.

"We knew they were going to crash the boards, we knew they were going to get out and run on makes and misses," Boyle said. "We knew they wanted to get downhill, get the ball in the paint. We just didn't do anything to stop them."

Colorado started again fast in the second half, getting a Malone bucket and back-to-back 3-pointers from Hammond to cut MSU's lead to seven, 40-33.

But the Buffs then turned the ball over on their next three possessions and couldn't come any closer.

The Spartans then finally found their 3-point shot after missing their first 14 from long distance. MSU hit a pair from beyond the arc, with the second from Frankie Fidler putting Colorado in a 52-37 hole with 12:09 to play

LAHAINA, Hawai'i — Colorado's Andrei Jakimovski hit a driving lavup with 8 seconds left Tuesday for the winning bucket as the Buffaloes staged a big second-half rally to knock off No. 2-ranked UConn, 73-72, in the Maui Invitational.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 5-1 with the win while two-time defending na-

tional champion UConn lost its second straight to slip to 4-2.

Julian Hammond III and Elijah Malone each had 16 points for the Buffs while
Jakimovski had a 12-point, 10-rebound double-double, his first as a Buff.

Liam McNeely led UConn with 20 points. Both of UConn's starting big men, Samson Johnson and Tarris Reed Jr., fouled out of the game in the second half, with CU's Malone drawing the majority of those fouls.

Colorado trailed by as much as 11 in the first half and by eight at the half,

Colorado trailed by as much as 11 in the first half and by eight at the half, 40-32. The Huskies rebuilt their edge to nine early in the second half, but the Buffs used an 11-0 run to take their first lead of the game, 44-5, with 14-02 to play. The lead then see-sawed for the remainder of the game, leading to Jakmovs-ki's winning basket. Uconn had one last chance to win the game but the CU defense forced the Huskies to settle for a tough 3-pointer with 2 seconds remaining. The shot drew iron to give Colorado the win.
"Less than 24 hours ago, I was sitting here questioning the fight of these guys," Boyle said in his post-game press conference. "I said we'd find out a lot about our team in the next 18 to 24 hours and I think we found out about this team, the fight that they have. Everybody that played for us played well, contributed to this win, and I couldn't be more proud of this group."

Colorado shot just 38 percent from the floor (8-for-21) in the opening half but came back to blister the nets at a 62.5 percent clip after the break (15-for-24),

At the same time, the Buffs held UConn to just 41 percent shooting after the

break (11-for-27), including 4-for-15 from beyond the arc.

CU also finished with a 28-26 edge on the boards and outscored the Huskies

The win was Colorado's third ever against a No. 2 team (Oklahoma State in 1992 and Arizona in 2022) and the highest-ranked team CU has ever beaten away

But the Buffs refused to fold, After UConn built a nine-point edge, Colorado put together an 11-0 run to take its first lead of the game.

Hammond started the run with a 3-pointer, Malone scored on an alley-oop

layup and Hammond tailled a bucket in transition. **Bangot Dak** then hit one free throw before Hammond connected on another trey — the Buffs' sixth straight successful field goal attempt — to give CU a 48-46 lead with 14:02 to play. The Huskles regained the lead with a quick 5-0 surge but Colorado had an-

LAHAINA. Hawai'i - Colorado had no answer for Iowa State's pressure defense Wednesday and the Buffaloes dropped a 99-71 decision in their final game of the Maui Invitational.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 5-2 while the fifth-ranked Cyclones improved to 5-1. The two teams will meet again Dec. 30 when they open Big 12 play with a 7 p.m. game in Boulder.

Julian Hammond III led CU with 20 points and Andrei Jakimovski scored 18. Trevor Baskin led the Buffs on the boards with eight rebounds.

lowa State put six players in double figures, led by 24 points from Milan Momcilovic.

ISU's defense caused problems throughout the game for CU. The Buffs finished with 18 turnovers that led to 37 lowa State points, including a 22-6 edge in fast break points.

The Buffs got off to a good start and held a 22-20 lead with nine minutes to play in the first half. But the Cyclones continued to force turnovers and finished the half with a 25-12 surge to take an 11-point edge into the break, 45-34.

But unlike Tuesday's game, when the Buffs overcame an 11-point first-half deficit against No. 2 UConn to get the win, CU had no comeback in the second half. The Cyclones built their lead into the 20s and finally into the 30s as Colorado's turnover woes continued, resulting in a 54-37 scoring edge for ISU in the second half.

Colorado shot just 42 percent from the field (23-for-55) while the Cyclones shot 60 percent (35-for-58). ISU also held a 31-25 edge on the boards, including seven offensive rebounds that produced 14 points.

"I wasn't a math major but I can add, and 51 of their 99 points came off offensive rebounds where we don't box out and the other 37 come off turnovers," Boyle said, "That's 51 of their 99 points that we have a direct result of causing. You put the combination of turnovers and not boxing out and not guarding, this is what you get against a good team and Iowa State's a hell of a program, hell of a team.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado started well, then survived a 1-for-9 shooting stretch to overcome a 15-11 deficit and take a 22-20 lead.

Bangot Dak hit a 3-pointer to pull Colorado within one before RJ Smith hit back-to-back trevs to give the Buffs a 20-17 lead. A minute later, an Elijah Malone bucket inside gave CU a 22-20 edge with 8:45 to play in the half.

"When we were strong with the ball and had strong cuts, good things happened for us." Boyle said, "We got good looks and we made some baskets."

But there weren't enough of those moments for the Buffs as the Cyclones controlled the game for the rest of the half with their swarming defense. ISU ripped off a quick 10-0 run as the Colorado committed four turnovers in five possessions before Jamikovski hit two free throws to pull CU within six, 30-24.

ISU, though, continued the onslaught. The Cyclones stretched their run to 15-4, pushing their cushion into double digits, 35-24, on a long 3-pointer thanks to a pair of offensive rebounds.

Colorado did get a pair of Jakimovski 3-pointers in the final two minutes of the half but CU couldn't come up with a defensive stop. By the time the halftime buzzer sounded ISU had a 25-12 run on the board over the final 8 minutes of the period to take a 45-34 lead into the break.

The Buffs committed nine turnovers in the first half leading to 20 points for ISU and the Cyclones also reaped nine second-chance points. Colorado shot just 11-for-26 in the opening half while lowa State shot 19-for-33.

The Buffs never found their rhythm in the second half. Iowa State's defense continued to cause problems for CU while the Cyclones continued to roll on the offensive end. ISU slowly built its lead over the first 10 minutes of the half, finally opening up a 25-point edge, 75-52, with nine minutes to play.

lowa State then built its edge to as much as 33 in the final minutes as the Buffs never threatened to close the gap.

Dak then added a free throw after a timeout to give Colorado its biggest lead of the game, 67-56, as CU's turnaround run hit 29-8.

Pacific's Elijah Fisher finally stopped the run with a three-point play but the Buffs kept the Tigers at bay over the final two minutes to collect the win.

Colorado opened the game on a hot note as the Buffs hit their first three shots, including 3-pointers from Jakimovski and Julian Hammond III, to take an early

8-4 lead.

But things went south for Colorado in a hurry. The Buffs went cold on offense, missing their next 10 shots, and were equally inefficient on defense. That opened the door for a 15-0 Pacific run that included a 6-for-6 stretch from the floor for the Tigers, giving Pacific a 19-9 lead with 12-55 still to play in the first half.

Sebastian Rancik finally ended Colorado's nearly six-minute scoring drought with a 3-pointer but that didn't immediately cure the Buffs' woes. Pacific built its cushion back to 11 before finally began to chip away at the deficit.

Colorado pulled to within five on a pair of Hammond free throws, then cut the Pacific lead to four 32-90 on a lakingwisk 3-pointer with 3-printures left in the half

Pacific lead to four, 33-29, on a Jakimovski 3-pointer with 3 minutes left in the half. But the Buffs again went cold, coming up empty on six straight possessions end the half while Pacific went on a 5-0 run in the final three minutes to take a to end the half while Paci 38-29 lead into the break

BOULDER - Colorado used a 16-0 run to take control in the first half Saturday and the Buffaloes went on to collect a 72-55 win over in-state rival Colorado State at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 7-2 while Colorado State fell to 5-4.

Colorado never trailed in the game, taking the lead for good early on a Bangot Dak 3-pointer. The Buffs then used a 16-0 run to build a 30-11 cushion with just under 8 minutes to play in the first half and extended the margin to 43-21 by the

CU pushed its lead to as much as 26 early in the second half, 56-30, before the Rams managed to shave the deficit into the teens down the stretch. But CSU never managed to get back within single digits and the Buffs held on for the win.

Dak led the Buffs in scoring with a career-high 16 points, Julian Hammond III added 13 and Elijah Malone chipped in 10. Trevor Baskin scored nine points and grabbed 11 boards and Assane Diop had eight rebounds.

Jalen Lake led CSU with 18 points while the Buffs held Rams leading scorer (and former Buff) Nique Clifford to just 10 points — two in the first half — on 4-for-

CU shot 50 percent (28-for-56) while holding the Rams to just 31 percent (20-for-64). The Buffs had a dominant 44-33 edge on the boards, finishing with 11 second-chance points on eight offensive rebounds, and also recorded 18 assists.

"Really a step in the right direction tonight for our team, our program," Boyle said "I thought we brought the fight to Colorado State from the get-go defensively. I felt like we exerted our will and they felt our presence a little bit in that first half . The (defensive) job that Andrei Jakimovski did on Nigue Clifford I thought was the individual defensive performance of the game, but I thought our team defense was really good as well. When you hold someone to 31 percent shooting, you're going to live with that every night."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs jumped out to an early lead and never trailed. A Diop 3-pointer broke a 5-5 tie and the Buffs quickly built the lead to seven on a Malone bucket inside.

CSU managed to shave the Colorado lead to three, 14-11, with a basket inside at the 12:15 mark but the Buffs then broke the game open with their decisive 16-0 run.

Baskin started the surge with a baseline drive and dunk, followed by a pair of Dak haskets inside

CU continued to pour it on after a timeout. Malone scored five in a row, getting a dunk inside before draining a 3-pointer from the top of the key, then handed out an assist to Harrison Carrington to push the run to 14-0.

Dak then finished the run with another basket inside and Colorado had a 30 11 lead with 7:38 still to play in the half.

CSU finally ended a five-minute scoring drought and 10 straight misses from the floor with a Keshawn Williams 3-pointer, but the Buffs didn't stop, pushing their lead to 35-14 on an Jakimovski offensive rebound and basket.

Colorado's offense then hit a brief lull that saw the Buffs commit three straight turnovers, allowing the Rams to cut CU's lead to 16.

But the Buffs finished the half on a strong note, out-scoring the Rams 8-2 over the final three minutes, with an RJ Smith 3-pointer just before the buzzer giving the Buffs a 43-21 lead at the break.

CU finished the half shooting 18-for-33 from the floor with 11 assists on those 18 buckets. The Buffs defense held CSU to 9-for-34 shooting and Colorado also had a 24-12 rebound edge in the first 20 minutes.

"I feel like we put a big emphasis on making them feel our pressure," Dak said. "We thought we made them feel our pressure from the start and that got them off their game. So I think that helped us all throughout the game."

Colorado then quickly built its lead to 26 early in the second half as five unanswered points from Dak gave CU a 56-30 cushion at the 12:10 mark.

The Rams then managed to cut the Buffs' edge to 14 down the stretch but the Buffs kept CSU at bay in the final minutes to secure the win.

BOULDER — Colorado's Julian Hammond III scored a career-high 23 points Friday to lift the Buffaloes to an 81-70 win over South Dakota State at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs won their third in a row to improve to 8-2 overall while SDSU

Hammond scored 10 of his 23 in the final four minutes of the game, including a clutch 3-pointer and free throw with 49 seconds remaining to salt away the win. He also had seven assists and just one turnover. Elijah Malone had 15 points on 7-for-8 shooting and nine rebounds for CU and RJ Smith added 11 points.

Joe Sayler led the Jackrabbits with 16 points.

While the Buffs led for almost the entire game, they never pushed their lead into double digits until the final minutes. SDSU staved close by hitting 11 3-pointers, including seven in the first half, but the Buffs shot 50 percent from the floor (28-for-56) for the game to make the difference.

Colorado finished with a 34-26 edge on the boards and the Buffs were better defensively after the break, holding the Jackrabbits to just 4-for-12 shooting from

CU also hit 18 of its 19 free throw attempts, including 16 in the second half.

"I've got a lot of respect for them, and I knew it wasn't going to be easy," Boyle said. "I was disappointed in our ability to guard the 3-point line tonight \dots I thought we did some really good things offensively, but defensively, if we take away their threes and make those tough twos, you know, it's a 20-point game. But overall it's a good win and we'll take it."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led by as much as nine in the first half and had a five-point edge at the break, 40-35.

But the Buffs couldn't break away from the Jackrabbits. CU used quick buckets from Malone and Hammond to build a nine-point edge early in the second half, but the Jackrabbits answered with an 11-2 run to tie the game at 46-46 seven minutes in.

Colorado then went ahead again and protected its narrow margin over the next three minutes. But SDSU finally took its first lead of the game, 56-55, at the 10:08 mark on back-to-back baskets inside.

But CU quickly answered. After missing their first seven 3-point shots of the half, the Buffs got back-to-back treys from Malone and Hammond to take a fivepoint lead with 8:17 to play.

SDSU stopped the run with a quick basket inside before Colorado put up six more unanswered points. Assane Diop hit two free throws, Andrej Jakimovski scored a transition layup and Trevor Baskin hit two free throws to complete a 12-2 CU run and give the Buffs a 67-58 edge with under six minutes to play.

CU then built its lead to 10 on a Hammond floater with 2:22 to play and the Buffs held the Jackrabbits at bay over the final minutes. Hammond hit a 3-pointer and free throw with 49 seconds remaining to give CU a 79-70 lead, then added two more free throws with 36 seconds remaining to put the game away.

The victory was the Buffs' 10th in a row on their home court.

The Buffs jumped out to an early lead, taking a quick 13-4 edge after six quick points from Malone and a Smith 3-pointer.

But CU's lead never hit double digits in the first half as the Jackrabbits stayed close with 3-pointers

SDSU pulled within three, 22-19, on a Jaden Jackson 3-pointer before the Buffs pushed their edge back to eight, 30-22, when Smith drained his third trey of

But the Jackrabbits didn't go away quietly. CU led by seven with just 1:35 left in the half on another Malone bucket inside but SDSU cut the margin to five, 40-35, by the halftime break.

Colorado shot a comfortable 17-for-34 in the first half but just 4-for-12 from long range. The Jackrabbits, meanwhile, were more accurate from long range than they were from 2-point range (5-for-13).

 BOULDER — Colorado took care of business Saturday at the CU Events Center as the Buffaloes rolled past Bellarmine, 79-55, in their final tuneup before

Big 12 play. Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 9-2 with their fourth straight win while the matched Knights dropped to 3-10.

Colorado used a 25-4 run in the first half to cruise to a 45-16 edge at the break and the Knights never threatened to make it a game after halftime.

CU led by as much as 37 early in the second half but the Buffaloes' defense let up down the stretch, allowing the Knights to outscore Colorado 39-34 in the final

The Buffs put three players in double figures, led by a career-high 15 points from sophomore forward **Assane Diop** on 7-for-11 shooting. Sophomore guard **RJ Smith** had 11 points and a team-high five rebounds while senior point guard Julian Hammond III had 10 points, five assists and four rebounds.

Dezmond McKinney led Bellarmine with 12 points.

Colorado shot 29-for-62 (47 percent) from the floor while the Knights were 21-for-53 (39.6 percent). CU also had a 38-30 edge on the boards, making th Buffs 95-6 in the Boyle era when hitting the "gold standard" of holding a team to 40 percent or less shooting and collecting at least a plus-8 rebound edge.

But despite the lopsided win, Boyle wasn't pleased with CU's second-half ef-

fort. Bellarmine outscored Colorado in the second half by five points while shooting almost 62 percent from the floor (16-for-26, including 6-for-12 from 3-point

I was really, really disappointed in the second half," said Boyle, whose Buffs open Big 12 play on Dec. 30 at home against No. 3 Iowa State. "I thought we kind of mailed it in at halftime, and that was a challenge I gave to our team — don't play the scoreboard, play the possession — and we didn't do that at all ... (The Knights) scored more points in the first eight minutes of the second half than they did the whole first half. That means our defense really took a step backwards and for us to be successful in the league we're going to play in starting December 30,

that ain't good enough. You have to play for 40 minutes, not 20."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The second-half lapse came after the Buffs put the game away in the first 20 minutes. After Bellarmine took a quick 6-4 lead Colorado responded with a 25-4 run to take control.

Diop started the surge with his third bucket of the game, part of an 8-0 CU

surge. Hammond added a three-point play, **Trevor Baskin** scored inside and Bangot Dak tallied a free throw to give CU a 12-6 edge.

Bellarmine momentarily stopped the run with a free throw and 3-pointer but Colorado then answered with a 15-0 surge to basically put the game away.

Dak scored on a dunk, Diop scored five in a row and Smith buried a corner 3-pointer to give CU a 24-10 lead. Elijah Malone then got into the act with three points and Diop scored again to give Colorado a 29-10 cushion with just more than five minutes to play in the half.

Defensively, the Buffs held Bellarmine to 1-for-11 shooting in the run, with the Knights going almost seven minutes without a point.

Colorado kept the pressure on after a timeout, building its lead to 45-16 by

halftime. Hammond added a 3-pointer, Felix Kossaras scored four in a row and Sebastian Rancik and Smith each hit 3-pointers in the final two minutes to give the Buffs their 29-point halftime cushion.

Colorado shot 16-for-31 from the floor in the opening half, with 13 assists on

the 16 baskets. The Buffs held the Knights to just 6-for-27 shooting, including 1-for-14 from long range, while also recording eight steals.

Boyle clearly liked what he saw from his squad in the first half, particularly on

"It's got to be that way for 40 minutes," he said, "Defense does not have possessions off, it doesn't have games off, doesn't have nights off. We don't understand that. We think, 'Oh, well, we were up by 29, game's over.' Well, the game's not over. They beat us. They scored 39 in the second half, and beat us."

Colorado built its lead to as much as 37 early in the second half before the

Knights found their shooting eye and managed to cut the deficit into the 20s

Boyle emptied his bench with just more than three minutes to play, giving several walk-ons a chance for court time down the stretch.

BOULDER - Colorado threw a scare into No. 3 Iowa State on Monday in their Big 12 opener but the Buffaloes couldn't close the deal down the stretch and dropped a 79-69 decision at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 9-3 overall and 0-1 in Big 12 play. Iowa State improved to 11-1, 1-0.

Colorado overcame a 12-point deficit early in the second half to take a 53-48 lead with 13 minutes to play. But the Buffs couldn't hold the lead as ISU took advantage of a CU cold streak to regain the edge, then used an 8-0 run in the final three minutes to put the game away.

Julian Hammond III led CU with 21 points on 9-for-17 shooting and also had four rebounds, four assists and no turnovers. RJ Smith added 14 points and Bangot Dak led the Buffs with eight rebounds.

Curtis Jones led ISU with 20 points.

The Buffs shot the ball well, hitting 49 percent from the floor (28-for-57) while holding the Cyclones to 43 percent (29-for-68).

But the difference came in turnovers and offensive rebounds. Colorado committed 19 miscues that ISU converted into 24 points and the Cyclones grabbed 20 offensive rebounds that led to 21 second-chance points.

Colorado also shot just eight free throws and made six while the Cylones were 17-for-22 from the line.

"I was pleased with our effort and our competitiveness." Boyle said, "But we had the answer to this test before the test. We talked about it in pregame - second-chance points, points off turnovers. They have 20 offensive rebounds and we turn it over 19 times, and still somehow we staved in the game until the end ... But we didn't do what we knew we had to do to beat this team.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs trailed by six at the half, 37-31, and the deficit ballooned to 12 when the Cyclones scored the first six points of the second half.

But just when ISU threatened to blow the game open, the Buffs responded with a 22-5 run.

Smith started the surge with back-to-back 3-pointers, followed by an Elijah Malone dunk. ISU momentarily halted the run with a free throw but the Buffs answered with 3-pointers from Sebastian Rancik and Hammond.

Colorado finally took its first lead of the half when back-to-back baskets from Trevor Baskin gave CU a 49-48 edge at the 13:58 mark. The Buffs then extended the margin to 53-48 on a Dak basket inside and a Javon Ruffin steal and layup.

But the Cyclones wouldn't go away, ISU used a 6-0 run to take a 56-55 lead. then answered a Colorado bucket from Assane Diop with five more points to take a 61-57 lead with just under eight minutes to play.

Colorado managed to close the gap to one, 64-63, with five minutes remaining

but the Cyclones responded with a 6-0 burst to take control and CU never got closer than four again.

lowa State then put the game away with an 8-0 run in the final three minutes. Colorado opened the game by taking a quick 5-0 lead on a pair of buckets from Hammond before ISU scored six in a row to take its first lead.

The two teams then traded the lead four times over the next five minutes as urnovers began to plague the Buffs.

Colorado then hit a hot streak midway through the period, using a 10-2 run to take a 23-19 lead with 6:32 to play in the half. Smith hit a 3-pointer, then set up

Baskin for a breakaway dunk with a steal. Hammond wrapped up a 7-0 run with a basket inside, then drained a 3-pointer after a Dak offensive rebound to give the Buffs a four-point edge.

But the Buffs then turned it over on two of their next three possessions and the Cyclones turned both miscues into baskets, part of an 8-0 run.

Smith temporarily halted the surge with a pair of baskets to keep the Buffs within two 29-27

But the Cyclones came back with a 3-pointer, then got a second-chance. buzzer-beating trey at the end of the half to take a 37-31 lead into the break, finishing an 18-8 run.

TEMPE, Ariz. — A first half offensive explosion by Arizona State along with some Colorado shooting woes led to an 81-61 decision in favor of the Sun Devils Saturday afternoon at Desert Financial Arena.

Colorado trailed by double digits early in the game and could not mount a comeback to capture its first Big 12 Conference win of the season, falling to 9-4 (0-2) on the year while ASU improves to 10-3 (1-1).

Trailing by as much as 23 in the first half, the Buffaloes went on a 10-0 run in the final 2:35 minutes of the period to cut the deficit to 13 with another 20 minutes to play.

Graduate transfer Trevor Baskin scored a season-high 23 points on 9 of 14 from the floor with 10 rebounds, four steals, two assists, and a block. It marks his second double-double as a Buff and 24th of his collegiate career. It's also the first time he has logged 20 or more points in his time at CU.

The Buffs got a hefty 40 points from their bench. Javon Ruffin, Sebastian Rancik, and Harrison Carrington combined for 17 of those points, in addition to Baskin's 23

Arizona State's BJ Freeman posted a season-high 19 points in the win

The difference was a season-low field goal percentage (34.8%) and three point field goal percentage (12.5%) by the Buffaloes, with the combination of the Sun Devils shooting 51.9% from the field and 46.4% from beyond the arc.

'They just had whatever they wanted," head coach Tad Boyle stated. "They'd beat us inside, they'd beat us outside. They got whatever they wanted. And we just didn't. We didn't dictate at all with our defense. We were on our heels. It felt like the whole night, both offensively and defensively.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffaloes trailed 40-17 late in the first half before going on a 10-0 run in the final minutes to cut the Arizona State lead to 13 at the break

Colorado shot just 34.3 percent in the first half (12 for 35) while Arizona State shot over 50 percent as a unit and over 40 percent from three.

Andrei Jakimovski and Baskin combined for the Buffs 10 points through the first eight minutes of the second half while the team continued to struggle to knock shots down, going 3-for-16 to start the half.

Sun Devil Jay Quaintance entered double-digit scoring figures thanks to a jumper with nine minutes left in the game, giving ASU a 25-point lead, their largest of the night.

Arizona State would go on to hover around a 20-point lead the rest of the way, continuing to be more efficient from the field than Colorado.

"When we hold people under 40% field goal percentage and we out rebound them by eight or more, we're not undefeated," Boyle said. "It doesn't guarantee you're going to win the game...you got to be able to score the ball at some point and make open shots. So that was really disappointing we didn't."

ORLANDO, Fla. - Colorado got a career-night from senior guard Julian Hammond III and shot over 50 percent as a team, but a season-high 22 turnovers allowed UCF to squeak out a 75-74 Big 12 Conference win over the Buffaloes

allowed OCF to squeak out a 7-74 Big 12 Conference win over the Bullaloss Wednesday night at Addition Financial Arena.

Colorado, 9-5 overall, drops its third-straight to fall to 0-3 in conference play for the first time since 2016-17. UCF improves to 11-3, 2-1 in the Big 12.

Hammond, shaking off a scoreless performance at Arizona State, scored a career-high 26 points on 8 of 14 from the field and 8 of 9 from the line. Andrej

Bangot Dak pitched in 10 points while RJ Smith grabbed career-high eight rebounds. Jordan Ivy-Curry led UCF with 22 points. Colorado, coming off a season low 34 8 percent at Arizona State, hit 52.2 per-cent from the field. The Buffaloes made 7 of 13 from 3-point range against UCF, compared to just 3 of 24 at ASU. Colorado also held UCF to 39 percent shooting and had a Jules 5 advantage on the boards (33.28).

The Knights cashed in off Colorado miscues, scoring 24 points off turnovers compared to 10 Colorado points off 12 UCF turnovers.

Despite the turnovers, the Buffaloes had several shots at the end to put the game in their favor. Tied at 74-74, Jakimovski missed on a drive to the basket game in their favor. Tied at 74-74, Jakimovski missed on a drive to the basket with 42 seconds left. Dak got the offensive board, but his put-back bounced out. UCF's Dallan Coleman got the rebound and was fouled by **Trevor Baskin** in the backcourt – his fifth foul of the game. Coleman missed the first free throw attempt but made the second to give the Knights the one-point lead. After a timeout, Hammond got a slightly off-balanced look from the top of the key as the clock wound down but missed and UCF got the ball as it bounced out, off of Colorado, with just four seconds left. The Knights had trouble getting the ball in and were called for a five-second count which gave the Buffaloes the ball back. Elligh Malone got the ball in the paint of the inbound, but his attempt at a layup from the left side was blocked by Keyshawn Hall. A Dak 3-pointer gave the Buffs their largest lead at 56-46 with 14:16 remaining.

Although the Buffs continued to hit shots, empty possessions allowed UCF to storm back. Fourteen of Colorado's 22 turnovers came in the second half with eight coming during a five-minute span which fueled a 14-2 UCF run that kept the game tight down the stretch.

UCF then went on an 8-0 run. Johnson got three shots at the line, Moustapha Thiam hit a hook shot and Ivy-Curry nailed his second 3-pointer of the game giving him 10 points early and UCF a 15-11 advantage.

Colorado regained the lead with a 6-0 run of its own. Baskin had a steal and layup and Hammond hit a 3-pointer as CU led 17-15 with 10:44 left in the first half. The teams traded baskets as the lead changed hand four times and tied three others late in the first half. Jakimovski hit his second 3-pointer to give CU a 24-21 lead. but Hall resoonded with one for UCF.

Dak gave Colorado a little breathing room with five in a row, including a free throw that gave Colorado its largest first half lead at 35-28 with 3:06 left.

UCF scored four points from the line to cut CU's lead to three. Hammond hit a pair of foul shots but Johnson had a late basket to counter as Colorado led 37-34 at the break.

BOULDER - Despite Colorado's second-half resurgence during Sunday afternoon's contest, the Buffaloes could not overcome their early turnover struggles, leading to a 78-70 win by West Virginia.

The Buffs, 9-6 overall and 0-4 in the Big 12, drop their fourth-straight, the program's longest since dropping the final five games of the 2019-20 season. West Virginia improves to 12-3, 3-1 in the conference.

"Well, another disappointing loss," head coach Tad Boyle said, "It's been like that now four games in a row. So I take responsibility for this. I'm the head coach. We let a team that's averaging 62 points a game come in our building and score 78 on us.

Julian Hammond III, coming off a career-high 26 points against UCF, led the Buffaloes with 23 points on 6-for-13 shooting. It was a team effort from CU, with nine different Buffs logging points in the score column.

"It's definitely frustrating losing four games in a row," Hammond said. "We haven't had a four game losing streak in a while, I can't remember last time. I don't even know if it's since I've been here, but obviously it's frustrating, but we try to keep our team together and keep our guys together because we know we have another game on Wednesday. So we got to be ready, we got to be ready for that."

Assane Diop had 15 points while going 3-for-4 from the field. Javon Ruffin chipped in with a season-high seven rebounds and four assists, leading the team in both categories.

Javon Small led West Virginia with 26 points, shooting 4-10 from the three.

The Buffs went 20-for-48 from the floor as a unit, for a 41.7 percent clip. They shot 6-for-19 from three, nailing just one in the second period. Hammond made three of the six three-pointers for Colorado.

Despite an impressive second-half defensive effort, Colorado's ball security issues turned out to be the difference in this one. West Virginia capitalized on Colorado's 11 first-half turnovers, outscoring the Buffs 12-0 on points off turnovers in the first 20 minutes of play.

It led to seven of the eight-man rotation for the Mountaineers to score at least

"We had some silly silly turnovers," Boyle stated. "We had 11 turnovers in the first half. And two illegal screens, two three balls, throwing it out of bounds, one dribble into traffic, it was just silly stuff. I like that we did a much better job in the second half. Only had three turnovers in the second half."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After a quick score from Diop to tip off the game. West Virginia scored 10 unanswered points from Jonathan Powell and Small to give them an early cushion. RJ Smith nailed a three to break up the scoring run for WVU

Eight CU turnovers within the first eight minutes of the game led to more WVU opportunities, giving them a chance to build a double-digit lead at halftime, 40-29.

Small, WVU's leading scorer, opened the second half with back-to-back-toback three-pointers, but Hammond kept Colorado on the attack, scoring backto-back buckets of his own. Andrej Jakimovski had a pair of scores to cut the Mountaineers' lead to single digits.

Some strong defense paired with some West Virginia shooting woes brought the Buffs within four points with 11:06 remaining in the game. Harrison Carrington registered two blocks during the Mountaineers' 1-for-8 shooting run.

The Buffs were able to cut the West Virginia lead to just two points several times in the last eight minutes of the game. Trading free throws and possessions. WVU built the lead back up to five with a few minutes to play.

BOULDER - A sluggish start offensively for Colorado was too much to handle against Cincinnati, leading to a 68-62 Bearcats win Wednesday night in the CU Events Center.

The Buffs have now dropped their fifth straight contest, falling to 9-7 overall and 0-5 in the Big 12. It's the first time Colorado has lost five consecutive games since the final five games of the 2019-20 season.

"I sound like a broken record here the last five games, but really, really disappointing, and we drop our third game at home," head coach Tad Boyle said. "We lost one in this building the entire season last year, and now we've lost three and all winnable games that we weren't good enough to win. And I told the team I feel like this is the poorest coached team in America. That's how I feel, because the stuff that we talk about in practice, the stuff we talk about in huddles, it doesn't translate to the games, for whatever reason which is really frustrating.

Bangot Dak had an impressive night for the Buffs, posting a career-highs with 19 points and eight blocked shots. It's the third most blocks ever by a CU player in a single game.

Dak also matched personal bests in field goals made, hitting 7 of 11, and eight rebounds, as the sophomore led the charge for the Buffaloes on both ends of the

Trevor Baskin notched eight points, six rebounds, and two steals on the night. Freshman Sebastian Rancik added nine points on 3-for-6 shooting.

Simas Lukoius led Cincinnati with 16 points, including going 3-for-8 from the three-point line.

Similar to the last game against West Virginia. CU lost the battle for points off turnovers, with the Bearcats outscoring the Buffs 18-11 in that category. Colorado had 15 turnovers while Cincinnati had 10.

It was an off-night shooting from the floor for Colorado, going 23-for-56 (41.1%) overall but a season-low 3-for-13 (23.1%) from the three-point line, tying the lowest number of three-pointers made this season as a unit.

"All I want are great shots for our team, and I can't make the shots for them. but we got to get great shots and and in order to win games down the stretch, you have to have players that make plays, or I got to do a better job of crafting some stuff offensively for them, and have more sound defensively." Boyle stated, "And when you break down in this league, you're going to pay for it, and that's what our guys were doing."

HOW IT HAPPENED: It was a slow start for both sides, with Cincinnati opening the scoring with a bucket from the inside, earning an and-one. The Bearcats climbed up to a 6-0 lead after a three-pointer from Dan Skillings. Hammond struck first for the Buffs, nailing three free throw attempts after being fouled on the perim-

After a layup from Dak at the 15:11 mark in the first half. Colorado went on to shoot 1-for-14 from the floor before catching a rhythm again but not before Cincinnati was able to build a double-digit lead. The Bearcats went 5-12 (41.7%) from three-point land in the first half.

A tip-in dunk from Dak at the 1:46 mark followed up by a made free throw with a minute remaining brought CU within seven points at the break, 34-27.

Four turnovers early in the second half by the Buffs led to Cincinnati rebuilding their lead back to double digits. Back-to-back buckets inside the paint from Harrison Carrington cut the Cincinnati lead to 44-36 with 12:34 remaining in the game.

Baskin assisted Dak on an impressive alley-oop dunk. It brought the CU deficit to just three points with 8:54 remaining in the contest. The Bearcats responded back with a three-pointer the next possession.

After recording his eighth block of the game. Dak knocked down a jumper with 5:07 remaining, cutting Cincinnati's lead to 50-49. Baskin then grabbed the first lead of the night for Colorado with a bucket in the paint.

Trailing 57-53 with 2:41 left to go. Andrei Jakimovski had three free throws. but missed them all. Cincinnati got a three-pointer from Lukosius to extend its lead to 60-53 with under two minutes remaining and kept it a two possession game the rest of the way.

with 15 points shooting 6 of 8 from the field and 3 of 3 from the free throw line to go with five rebounds and a block.

Two other Buffs scored in double-digits. Sebastian Rancik had 11 on 3 of 5 from the floor and 1 of 2 from three as well as 10 from senior point guard Julian Hammond III.

Avery Marchelus and Bryce Thompson led the Cowboys in points with each putting up 14 on 4 of 10 from the field. Thomspon would go 7 of 9 from the charity stripe, along with Marchelus going 2 of 5 from 3-point range.

Despite a few 3-point makes late Colorado shot just 5 of 22 (22.7%) and was outrebounded 36-23 by Oklahoma State.

"I thought they were the more aggressive team and that really shows up in the rebounding column, and they out rebounded us in a big way 36 to 23 that's minus 13," Boyle said: "We knew the only chance we had to win this game is two ways. One was to take care of the basketball, against their pressure, which we knew was coming, and then the second thing was keep them off the offensive glass, because they averaged 13 offensive rebounds a game, and they out their average. they out they averaged 13 offensive rebounds a game, and they got their average, they got their 13, and they scored 22 points off of those. So nobody to blame but ourselves. But give Oklahoma State credit, they were the tougher team, the more aggressive team, the better team tonight. We knew what we had to do to win this game. HOW IT HAPPENED After going down 3-0 just over a minute into the game, Colorado would go on a quick 6-0 run to take the lead behind a basket by Andrej Jakimovski and free throws by Hammond and Dak.

The next 6:22 Oklahoma State was unable to make a field goal but stayed in the game making six free throws to keep the game close 10-9 with 13:06 in the first half.

Like the Cowboys, Colorado struggled to make shots but were able to keep the game close making six free throws of their own before Jakimovski made the only 3-pointer in the first half to cut the lead to 24-21 with 8:16 in the half. Immediately Oklahoma State went on a 6-0 run to push the lead to 10 with

5:51 left in the half. Despite Colorado making four of its next five shots the lead still stayed at nine points with Oklahoma State continuing to get to the free-throw line. Colorado turned the ball over 10 times and allowed the Cowboys to shoot 21-26 from the free throw line in the first half. Colorado shot 12-12 from the line

21-25 from the free infrow line in the first fail. Colorado shot 21-21 from the line themselves and 9-14 from inside the arc but went 1-9 on 3-point attempts.

"When we get good shots, we're pretty darn good," Boyle said on the turnovers. "The problem is we turn it over before we get good shots. Dead last in the league in that category (turnovers), and Oklahoma State knew it. That's why they pressed us, why they doubled our ball screens, and we've got to be able to handle

Foul trouble hurt the Bufts with three - Harrison Carrington, Elijah Malone, and Javon Ruffin with three fouls each in the first half. They weren't the only Buffs who committed fouls early with three other players with two fouls apiece. Down 10 points to start the second half, Colorado opened on a 5-0 run behind a basket by Hammond and an and-1 by Dak. Following a basket by Oklahoma State, Ruffin made his ninth three-pointer of the season to cut the lead to 45-41 the closest it would be for the rest of the game. Turnovers and fouls continued to plaque the Buffs who ended with 16 turnovers and 29 fouls committed. A late flurry by the bench who scored 39 points kept

the Cowboy lead hovering around 10 points before the clock ran out and ended

BOULDER - After a back-and-forth first half. Colorado couldn't keep up with BYU in the final 20 minutes, leading to a Cougars 83-67 win over the Buffaloes Tuesday night in the CU Events Center.

Colorado drops its seventh game in a row, falling to 9-9 overall and 0-7 in the Big 12. It marks the first time the Buffaloes have lost seven consecutive contests. since 2016-17, when they started the Pac-12 Conference schedule 0-7.

"Their energy level, their toughness, their everything, you name it, they were the aggressor," head coach Tad Boyle said, "They were better, And it wasn't just one guy. It was the their whole team. This doesn't fall on one guy for the Buffaloes. I mean, if it did, I'd fix that. It falls on our entire group."

Colorado trailed by a single bucket to end a competitive first half, 38-36, but it was all BYU in the second half. The Cougars opened the second period with a 23-2 run, leading by as many as 23 at one point.

After starting the game 11-for-15 from the floor, the Buffs shot 0-for-16 as a unit from the 6:23 mark in the first half to 12:39 in the second half.

Julian Hammond III led CU with 17 points on an efficient 3-for-6 from the perimeter. Harrison Carrington had seven points, three rebounds, and two assists. Richie Saunders led BYU with 25 points on 10-for-15 overall from the field.

Colorado shot 11-for-22 (50%) overall as a team in the first half, but struggled finding the back of the net in the second half, shooting 10-for-24 (41.7%).

HOW IT HAPPENED: BYU nabbed the first points of the game on a baseline layup. The Buffs answered back with a pair of Hammond scores and an Andrej Jakimovski bucket down low, heading into the first media break at 15:38 with a 6-4 lead

The Buffs committed five turnovers in the first five minutes, opening the door for the Cougars to build a four-point lead, 17-13, at the 12:25 mark. Javon Ruffin drilled his second three of the game to cut the deficit to one, only for Saunders to respond back with a three of his own for BYU.

Trailing by four, 22-18, with 9:53 remaining, the Buffs went on a 14-0 run to re-capture the lead. Jakimovski gave the Buffaloes the lead with a basket. Hammond extended the CU lead to four with a shot from deep. Hammond scored seven-straight points, including a pair of free throws. Assane Diop added two foul shots as the Buffaloes led 32-22 with 5:54 left in the half.

Three consecutive buckets from Saunders cut the Buffs lead to three 32-29. with 3:36 left in the period. BYU would continue their run with the next four points, an 11-0 run, to reclaim their lead 33-32 with just over two minutes left in the half. Trading buckets to end the half, the Cougars headed to the break with a 38-36 advantage.

A pair of 3-pointers from Trevin Knell and Saunders propelled BYU to a 9-1 run to start the second half, giving them a 47-37 lead with 17:41 left in the contest. The Cougars would then go on a 14-1 run, giving them a 61-38 lead, a 23-2 run to start the second half.

Colorado would end the game outscoring the Cougars 29-22 in the final 12:39 minutes of regulation, but it wouldn't be nearly enough as the Buffs fell by a score of 83-67.

TUCSON, Ariz. - An efficient second-half shooting performance from Arizona was too much for Colorado to handle, leading to a Wildcats 78-63 win Saturday afternoon in the McKale Center.

The Buffs dropped their eighth consecutive game, falling to 9-10 on the season and 0-8 in the Big 12. It's the first time Colorado has dropped eight games in a row since losing its last 12 of the 2008-09 season.

"I'm proud of our guys for not losing their fight, and that's what it's going to take to win a game in this league," head coach Tad Boyle said. "And eventually I think we will, but I thought our game plan was good coming in here."

After a close first half, Colorado was unable to find a rhythm from the floor in the second period, shooting just 12-for-27 (44.4%) as a unit while Arizona shot 17-for-30 (56.7%) from the field.

Colorado lost the turnover battle 15-10, with the Wildcats capitalizing on it. outscoring the Buffaloes 19-10 off those miscues. Arizona also outscored Colorado 36-24 on points in the paint.

Julian Hammond III led CU with 19 points, including going 4 for 6 from downtown. He also had a team-high four assists.

Javon Ruffin chipped in 12 points and two assists on 5 for 9 shooting overall. Anthony Dell'Orso led Arizona with 20 points, nailing 6 of 9 from the 3-point line.

DECISIVE MOMENT: After a Hammond 3-pointer with 8:33 left in the second half pulled the Buffaloes to within six at 52-46, the Wildcats drilled back-to-back 3-pointers from Dell'Orso and Henri Veesaar. It gave Arizona a double-digit lead that the Buffaloes could not catch up with the rest of the way.

WHAT IT MEANS: Boyle and the Buffs drop their eighth contest in a row, still looking to crack through in the win column in Big 12 play.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Arizona came out of the gates with a 9-3 run, forcing a Colorado timeout at the 17:18 mark. Back-to-back scores from CU freshman Sebastian Rancik and RJ Smith brought the Buffaloes deficit to just two, 14-12, with 12 minutes left in the first half.

A shot beyond the arc from Andrei Jakimovski brought him to eight points on the afternoon with just under eight minutes to go, with the Buffs trailing by four. He would score again on the next CU possession, reaching double-digit points in the score column. Hammond captured the first lead for Colorado with a mid-range jumper at the 3:54 mark, giving his team a 26-25 advantage. A pair of Caleb Love 3-pointers propelled Arizona back into the lead headed to break up 33-31.

Five points out of the break from Dell'Orso pushed the Wildcats lead to 40-35, at the first media timeout of the second half. The Buffs responded quickly with buckets from Hammond and Malone to tie the game up.

A near three-minute scoring drought for the Buffs opened the door for Arizona to build an eight-point lead, forcing a timeout with 10:15 left in the game.

Colorado struggled to nail shots consistently like Arizona over the final 10 minutes, with Dell'Orso drilling another four 3-pointers.

BOULDER - Colorado overcame a slow start, battled back, but fell just short to Arizona State, 70-68, Tuesday night at the CU Events Center.

Colorado falls to 9-11 on the year and 0-9 in the Big 12 Conference. It's the

ninth-consecutive loss for the Buffaloes, their longest streak since 2008-09.

Trevor Baskin led the Buffs with 19 points on 7 for 11 shooting with fou rebounds and four steals. Baskin also led CU in scoring with 23 points in the last match-up with Arizona State earlier in the month.

Julian Hammond III and Bangot Dak each chipped in 13 points for Colorado. Dak had a team-high six rebounds while shooting an efficient 5-for-8 from the

Adam Miller led Arizona State with 18 points and six assists, going 4-for-5 from the 3-point line.

Colorado trailed nearly the entire game, but had four looks to either tie the game or take the lead in the final minute. Freshman **Sebastian Rancik** had a chance to tie the game after being fouled on a 3-point play, but made just two of the attempts. Rancik had a second 3-point look just rim out from the baseline that would have given the Buffaloes the lead with :04 left.

Andrei Jakimovski had one final desperation shot from half court at the buzzer that sailed just off to the side.

"Well, I'm not sure I've ever felt as bad for a group of guys as I do for this group that was in the locker room because they are, as BD [Bangot Dak] and Trevor [Baskin] said, they're trying," head coach Tad Boyle said. "They really are. Now, we're not playing smart enough, we're not playing lough enough, we're not playing consistent enough. And that's my job. If you can do it once, you should be able to do it twice. If you do it twice, you should be able to do it three times. And look, the shots sometimes aren't going to go in. That's part of it. But this team, this program, I should say, this program, has set a standard of defending at a high level and rebounding at a high level consistently throughout the 14 years we've been here. This team is nowhere near good enough defensively or rebounding the basketball to win a game like tonight."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Sun Devils opened the scoring with a shot from deep to go up 3-0 early on. Buffs got on the board via tip-in layup from Dak. ASU then gained an 11-2 lead over Colorado after another pair of 3-pointers with 14 minutes remaining in the half.

A Harrison Carrington dunk along the baseline cut ASU's lead to 14-9 at 9:43 mark in the first half. Arizona State responded with their fourth 3-pointer on the night followed up with a steal and score to go up double-digits.

Javon Ruffin drilled the first shot from deep for the Buffs at 7:33, cutting the ASU deficit to 21-15.Forcing a couple of turnovers, the Buffs found themselves trailing by just two after a Baskin layup and a Jakimovski 3-pointer with five minutes to go in the half.

Arizona State ended the half shooting 7-for-9 from the field, giving them a 33-26 edge headed into the break

Hammond and Rancik led the charge for the Buffs coming out of the second half, scoring 14 of the team's 17 points in the first few minutes, tying the game at 43 with 11:59 remaining in the contest. An Arizona State technical foul led to two free throws awarded to Colorado, giving the Buffs their first lead of the night, 47-45.

With under four minutes to go, both teams traded buckets back-and-forth, with ASU clinging on to a five-point lead. Dak brought Colorado within two points after a mesmerizing dunk at the 2:38 minute mark. Rancik tied the game at 64 the next possession with a lavup.

A score inside the paint with an and-one pushed the Arizona State lead back to three, 67-64, with just under a minute and a half to go. With 20 seconds to go in the game, Rancik was fouled from deep, sending him to the line for three shots with the potential to tie the game but was not able to sink the first attempt. Trailing by one with 16 seconds on the clock, ASU traveled to give CU one last possession. Another Rancik 3-pointer from the corner came up short, leading to the Arizona State win.

FORT WORTH, Texas - TCU used a late 15-2 run to break open a close game, taking a 68-57 decision over Colorado Sunday afternoon at Schollmaier

Colorado, 9-12 overall, falls for the 10th-straight time and is 0-10 in league play for the first time since 1985-86. TCU snaps a three-game skid to improve to 11-10 overall, 4-6 in the Big 12.

Andrej Jakimovski scored a team-high 13 points, hitting 5 of 9 from the field with four rebounds. Bangot Dak just missed a double-double with nine points and a career-high 12 rebounds. Leading scorer Julian Hammond III was held to six points on 2 of 8 shooting but tied a career-high with seven assists.

David Punch led TCU with a game-high 19 points, hitting 7 of 10 from the floor

including a perfect 3 of 3 from 3-point range.

Colorado shot well at 46.7 percent, shared the ball by dishing out 19 assists and enjoyed a plus-12 advantage on the boards (34-22) but as has been the case most of the year, turnovers were the Buffaloes' undoing. Colorado committed 19 turnovers, compared to just eight for the Horned Frogs. TCU took advantage outscoring the Buffaloes by 20 points (28-8) off miscues.

"We did some good things to have 19 assists on the road, that's hard to do," Colorado head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "The unfortunate thing is, we have 19 turnovers. And the bottom line, when you're playing on the road in the Big 12, you turn it over 19 times, and your opponent only turns it over eight times. It's really, really hard to overcome that. It's an 11-point game, we lose the turnover differential by

 That's pretty much it. And it's been that way, pretty much since 2025 started.
 The Horned Frogs built a 10-point lead early in the second half at 39-29. Jakimovski scored five points, including a traditional 3-point play, and Sebastian Rancik made a layup off a fast break to narrow the gap to four at 40-36 at 16:28

TCU's Isaiah Manning hit a 3-pointer and Noah Reynolds got a steal which turned into a pair of free throws as the Horned Frogs pushed the lead back to nine at 49-40

Elijah Malone stopped TCU's run with a layup. Consecutive buckets by Dak, including a flying alley-oop dunk from Hammond, cut the deficit to five. Manning scored in the paint, but Rancik hit a pair of free throws to keep pace as TCU led 53-48 with 8:52 remaining.

TCU then put the game away with its 15-2 run which included 12 straight points following the Rancik free throws. Punch scored 11 of the Horned Frogs points during that stretch, including two 3-pointers.

Colorado was scoreless for 5:17, missing four shots and committing four turn-overs during that span. Hammond stopped the 12-0 run with a floater in the lane, but Punch responded with his third and final 3-pointer to give TCU its largest lead at 68-50. The Buffaloes scored the final seven points in mop up time.

Colorado got off to a fast start, scoring the game's first eight points. Back-to-back transition dunks by **Trevor Baskin** and Dak forced a TCU timeout less than three minutes into the contest. Jakimovski hit a 3-pointer to extend CU's lead to 11-2 with 15:49 remaining.

Four CU turnovers led to a 9-2 TCU run that closed the Buffaloes' lead to 13-12. Malone converted a pair of free throws and a Javon Ruffin 3-pointer gave the Buffaloes an 18-14 lead with 11:40 in the first half. Colorado made 7 of its first

9 shots with assists on all seven, four coming from Hammond. Colorado maintained its hot shooting by hitting 4 of 6 from 3-point range in cluding three consecutive makes from Ruffin, Felix Kossaras and Jakimovski to

rebuild a 24-18 advantage. The Buffaloes couldn't expand on that early shooting success. Colorado had 10 turnovers in the first half alone, four coming off shot clock violations. An 8-0 run

Colorado, 9-13 overall, drops its 11th-straight game and is 0-11 in league play for the first time since 1985-86. Utah is 13-9, 5-6.

Colorado shot just 38.2 percent from the field, but 50 percent in the second half. Utah held a sizeable lead in both rebounds, a 39-31 advantage, and free throws. The Utes went to the line 35 times, and while they made only 18, it was a considerable margin over CU's 10 for 13 night.

The Buffaloes trailed by 11 points early in the second half but had it down to a two-point game with just under eight minutes remaining. Saturday afternoon, the Buffaloes went against one of the elite teams in the country in those two categories, one of which proved to be the difference in the

ball game.

No. 5 ranked Houston used a dominant performance on the glass to defeat the Buffaloes 69-59 at the CU Events Center

Colorado falls to 9-14 overall and 0-12 in the Big 12 Conference. The Buffaloes have lost their last 12, their longest losing streak since the end of the 2008-09 season. Houston, 19-4 overall, maintains at least a share of the Big 12 lead at

Julian Hammond III led all scorers with 22 points which included a career-high five 3-point field goals. He was Colorado's only player in double figures, Sebastian Rancik and Bangot Dak each had six points.

J'Wan Roberts led Houston with 20 points on 9 of 11 shooting

All season, and especially during conference play, turnovers and inconsistent rebounding have hurt the Buffaloes. On Saturday, Colorado had 12 turnovers, tying for its lowest figure in Big 12 play, but Houston had a 38-26 edge on the boards. The Cougars had 15 offensive rebounds which led to 18 second-chance points, compared to just seven second-chance points for the Buffaloes.

Houston also had a 42-20 advantage inside the paint. The Cougars shot 48.2 percent from the field, including 60 percent in the second half. Colorado shot 41.3

Houston quickly pushed a four-point halftime lead to nine when Roberts scored right out of the break and Terrance Arceneaux and LJ Cryer hit back-to-back 3-pointers to give the Cougars a 39-30 lead. Hammond made back-to-back 3-pointers of his own to cut the margin to three at 39-36 with 14:44 left.

Hammond, who entered the game having hit just 1 of 10 from deep over the

last three games, was 5 for 7 on his career-best day from long range.

Every time Colorado got close, it was Roberts that had the answer. He scored

seven of Houston's next nine points as the Cougars once again led by nine.

Still, that didn't keep the Buffaloes from battling. Hammond and Dak hit consecutive 3-pointers to trim Houston's advantage to 44-45 with 8-49 remaining.

Arceneaux and Milos Uzan led a small 7-2 run to get Houston's lead back to 54-47. Colorado kept the pressure on Houston, getting to the foul line. Hammond, the second-best free throw shooter in the Big 12, made a pair of freebies. On the ensuing possession, Hammond got the steal, found **Andrej Jakimovsk**i who was fouled by Joseph Tugler on a 3-point attempt in transition. Jakmovski made all three free throws, making it a one-possession game at 54-52 Houston with 5:49

The fifth-ranked Cougars kept answering the call. Arceneaux stopped Colorado's run with a contested layup. Mylik Wilson got a steal on the next possession and went coast-to-coast for a dunk and a 58-52 lead.

Colorado stayed right with Houston. Hammond responded on another drive to the basket. Rancik aggressively drove the lane resulting in a thundering dunk with 3:45 left and the game was still a four-point contest at 60-56.

Roberts once again took over. He scored five points including back-to-back jumpers in the paint in Houston's decisive 7-0 run in the final two minutes, putting the lead in double-digits and out of reach at 67-56 with 1:12 left.

Houston opened the game with a 9-0 run as the Buffaloes missed their first

Elijah Malone got the Buffaloes on the board with a three-point play. A Uzan

3-pointer and Cryer basket gave Houston a 14-3 lead at the 13:43 mark.

Colorado ramped up its intensity, scoring 11 straight to tie the game at 14-14.

Javon Ruffin hit a deep 3-pointer and RJ Smith nailed a deep ball off a Dak offensive rebound. Felix Kossaras then scored five-straight points, joining the mini-3-point barrage then scoring on a slashing layup on a Dak assist to tie the game

The Buffaloes could never get over that hump. Houston settled down to score the next seven, and kept Colorado at arm's length, eventually taking a 31-27 lead into halftime.

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Colorado's shaky first-half shooting was too much to overcome against a ranked Kansas team on the road, as the Javhawks defeated the Buffaloes by a score of 71-59 Tuesday night in Allen Fieldhouse.

The Buffs fall to 9-15 overall and 0-13 in Big 12 play this season, dropping their 13th straight overall.

"I thought our fight in the second half was good," head coach Tad Boyle said. "Our defense was better in the second half. I thought we lost this thing in the first half. The whole key with Kansas we wanted was to keep the ball in front of us."

Freshman Sebastian Rancik led the Buffs with a career-high 19 points and nine rebounds on 7 for 13 shooting from the field. His previous career-high was set in the season opener against Eastern Washington when he had 13 points in

"His [Sebastian] toughness, he's not afraid, and he's going to keep getting better and better," Boyle stated. "But I'm proud of all of our guys, but Sebastian played well at times tonight on the offensive end."

Elijah Malone pitched in 10 points on an efficient 5 for 7 shooting from the floor. Andrei Jakimovkski drilled three 3-pointers for nine points along with four

Hunter Dickinson led No. 17 Kansas with 19 points on 8 for 11 shooting with nine rebounds.

The 33.3% (9-27) shooting clip overall for the Buffs in the first half was their downfall in this one, while Kansas knocked down a scorching 57.1% (16-28) of their shots, leading to their 14-point lead at halftime.

Colorado outscored Kansas 33-31 in the second half, but the CU struggles in the first half kept KU out in front comfortably for the rest of the game.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Bangot Dak kicked off the scoring for the Buffs on the night, getting them out to a 2-0 lead. After a pair of Kansas buckets, Rancik then drilled a 3-pointer to reclaim the lead. A 6-0 KU run put them up 10-7, but a Rancik score down low with an and-one tied the game at 10 at the 15:34 mark in the first half.

Kansas got out to a 19-14 lead after making 4 of 5 attempts, with 12:17 remaining in the period. The third 3-pointer of the game for the Jayhawks gave them a 24-16 lead, with just under 10 minutes to go in the half. They got out to a double-digit lead after a KJ Adams dunk, putting his team up 31-20 with five minutes to go in the half. Kansas outscored CU 9-6 over the final minutes of the first half. heading into the break with a 40-26 advantage.

Jakimovski entered the scoring column for Colorado with back-to-back 3-pointers to start the second half. Another Dak basket in the paint forced a KU timeout with 18:28 left in the game, with Colorado trailing 42-34. Jakimovski brought the Buffs within six, 45-39, with his third bucket from beyond the arc.

Consecutive scores from Malone at the 13:16 mark brought the CU deficit to just five, 50-45, forcing a Kansas timeout. The Jayhawks went on an 8-3 run over the next few minutes to recapture their double-digit lead.

Kansas had an answer for every Colorado score in the final eight minutes, never giving the Buffs a chance to gain momentum.

BOULDER – The Colorado Buffaloes snapped their 13-game losing streak Saturday afternoon at home over UCF, taking down the Knights by a score of 76-63 for their first Big 12 Conference win of the season.

With the win, the Buffs move to 10-15 overall and 1-13 in Big 12 play. The UCF Knights fall to 13-12 overall and 4-10 in conference games. Both teams split the season series. 1-1.

"I'm happy for these guys, everybody in that locker room, what we've been through over the last month and a half," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "Just battling, fighting, and scratching and clawing while just coming up short. And these guys have stuck together. They haven't lost their belief in each other or themselves, which is a testament to them. So it's nice to see them rewarded and really rewarded in a game where we were far from our best."

Andrej Jakimovski led all Colorado scorers with 15 points on 3 for 6 shooting from beyond the arc, along with seven rebounds. Assane Diop contributed a season-high 10 rebounds and six points off the bench for the Buffs.

"I thought his (Jakimovski) defensive effort on (Keyshawn) Hall was terrific," Boyle stated. "He had to work for everything he got, and he really battled him all cidet."

Hall led UCF with 19 points on 6 for 14 shooting while also grabbing nine rebounds.

The Buffs held the Knights to a 34% (21-61) shooting percentage, while shooting 42% (25-59) from the floor as a unit themselves.

All nine Buffaloes who saw the floor on Saturday logged at least one point in the contest. Eight of the nine scored at least six points.

Colorado was a dominant force on the glass, nabbing a season-high 52 re-

Colorado was a dominant force on the glass, nabbing a season-nigh 52 rebounds as a team. Their previous high was 45 rebounds collected in each of the first two games of the season. UCF had just 29 total rebounds in the contest.

DECÍSIVE MOMENT: A 13-5 run by the Buffs in the first eight minutes of the second half got them a double-digit lead for the first time in the contest, a lead UCF would not be able to catch up with. Ten quick points in the paint and a Jakimovski 3-pointer propelled the second-half offense for Colorado.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Bangot Dak started the game off with a tough bucket down low that drew an and-one foul. Dak missed the following free throw. Keyshawn Hall hit a 3-pointer and a layup to give the Knights a 7-6 lead over CU at the 16-minute mark in the first half. RJ Smith drilled the first shot from distance for the Buffs, giving them an 11-9 lead with just over 13 minutes left in the period.

Back-to-back **Javon Ruffin** 3-pointers gave CU their biggest lead at the time, 22-16, with 8:48 remaining in the first half. Multiple turnovers led to a four-minute scoreless drought from the Buffs, opening the door to an 8-0 UCF run, giving the Knights a 29-27 advantage with three minutes left in the half. A 7-2 run in the final 1:30 of the half gave Colorado a one-possession lead, 38-36 headed into the break.

Colorado started the second half with a 9-3 run thanks to five quick points from Jakimovski, including his second 3-pointer of the afternoon. The Buffs gained their first double-digit lead of the day with 12:16 remaining, after a Ruffin layup in the paint to put CU up 51-41. The Knights managed to cut the deficit to five, 55-50, with just under eight minutes left, but another Jakimovski shot from deep put the Buffs back up by eight.

An Elijah Malone bucket at the 4:35 mark put Colorado up by 11, 64-53, their largest lead of the day. One free throw made by Malone followed up with a miss, but a tip-in layup from Sebastian Rancik gave CU a three-point swing. The 14-point Colorado lead was too much for UCF to catch up to in the final three minutes, giving the Buffs their first Big 12 win of the season.

AMES, lowa – Colorado trailed by double-digits within the first seven minutes, which proved to be too much against a blistering lowa State offense Tuesday night, with the Buffaloes falling by a score of 79-65 at Hilton Coliseum.

The Buffs fall to 10-16 overall and 1-14 in Big 12 play. Iowa State sweeps the season series over Colorado and improves to 21-6 overall and 11-4 in conference.

"They were the better team tonight," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "They deserved to win, and I was really proud of our guys the last 10 minutes. If we would have played the first 30 minutes like we played the last 10 in terms of our aggressiveness and toughness and handling their pressure, attacking their pressure, and guarding them, I think it would have been a different game, but we didn't, and they deserve the credit "

Sophomore **Bangot Dak** led Colorado with a career-high 20 points on 8 for 14 shooting from the floor and four rebounds. His previous high was 19 points earlier this season against Cincinnati.

Harrison Carrington put up a career-high 11 points while going an efficient 4 for 5 overall shooting. Freshman Felix Kossaras led the Buffs with five rebounds in just 15 minutes of game action.

"I still want to see improvement for this team, this year, and I think we saw that with both Harrison and Felix tonight, who didn't play against Central Florida, and tonight they they got their chance," Boyle stated. "I thought they played really well, especially in the second half. We've got 11 guys I feel really comfortable with in that rotation, and it's hard to play all 11 every night, but those two kids showed great character tonight, with with being resilient and being ready when their number was called."

Dishon Jackson led the Cyclones with 13 points on 3 for 4 shooting along with three rebounds.

Early shooting struggles for the Buffs in the first half (11% 3FG) were the x-factor in this one, allowing lowa State to start the game with a pair of 10-0 runs after CU managed to put up just five points in between those stretches.

The Cyclones' entire eight-man rotation logged at least one bucket in the first 20 minutes of play, en route to outscoring the Buffs 45-28.

Colorado had committed the same amount of turnovers as lowa State (14), but it was the Cyclones who capitalized, earning 18 points off turnovers in comparison to CU's 10 points.

The Buffs shot 59% (13-22) from the free-throw line on the night, their second-lowest shooting percentage of the season.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Dak scored the first points of the game via a free throw line after getting fouled on the way up to the rim. The Cyclones would score the next seven points to go up 7-2 at the first media break with 15:58 remaining in the half. An lowa State 3-pointer out of the break made it a 10-0 run.

Julian Hammond III nailed a deep 3-pointer of his own to bring the CU deficit to five, but the Buffs got themselves in foul trouble early on. ISU entered the bonus with 12 minutes left in the first half, which led to their second 10-0 run of the game, putting them up 20-5.

The Cyclones ended the half shooting 6 for 11 (55%) from beyond the arc, putting up 45 points of offense. The Buffs got a Hammond floater to hit for their final basket of the first half, putting up 28 as a team.

Both teams went to the free-throw line multiple times early on in the half, but the Oyclones built their lead to 20 over the Buffs after a Nate Heise 3-pointer with 13:10 remaining in the contest. Colorado responded with a Dak three and Harrison Carrington bucket down low.

Iowa State gained a 24-point advantage over the Buffs at the 10-minute mark thanks to a Joshua Jefferson shot from deep. Dak would go on to capture a career-high in points, but it wouldn't be enough for Colorado to catch up to Iowa State

BOULDER – A stout defensive performance from Colorado was enough to shut down Baylor in a thrilling contest, with the Buffaloes taking down the Bears by a score of 76-74 Saturday afternoon in the CU Events Center.

Colorado improves to 11-16 overall and 2-14 in Big 12 play. Baylor falls to 16-11 overall and 8-8 in conference play.

"We made that a little bit harder than we needed to down the stretch," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "There's no doubt about that. We made it interesting, but it shouldn't have been. So we've got to learn from that. But I was proud of our guys' flight and competitiveness."

Andrej Jakimovski led the Buffs with a season-high 17-points on five 3-point shots. Jakimovski had a game-high seven rebounds and five assists for the Buffs, and accounted for five of the pine 3-pointers by Colorado in this one.

and accounted for five of the nine 3-pointers by Colorado in this one.

"Andrej deserves a lot of credit," Boyle stated. "To have 17 points and seven rebounds and five assists and zero turnovers, plus he made some threes that were big. That's what seniors do down the stretch of their senior year, and you need your seniors to play well."

RJ Smith and Sebastian Rancik, combined for 23 points including three 3-pointers. Rancik also chipped in six rebounds in the contest.

Norchad Omier led the Bears with 18 points on 7 for 11 shooting along with 13 rehounds

The Buffs held Baylor to just a 36% (25-69) shooting percentage overall from the floor, the second-lowest shooting percentage from an opposing team in Big 12 play for Colorado this season.

A 12-2 run by the Buffaloes with six minutes left in the second half was the deciding factor in this one. Colorado would cling onto that lead the rest of the way to close out Baylor in the final minutes.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Baylor kicked off the afternoon with a bucket down low after an offensive rebound. Julian Hammond III answered with a shot from beyond the arc, giving the Buffs a 3-2 lead. The Bears scored again after possessing an offensive rebound, tying the game at 5-5 with a Langston Love 3-pointer. A Jakimovski 3-pointer at 13:53 gave CU a 10-5 advantage over Baylor.

Colorado got out to a 16-12 lead at the eight-minute mark thanks to a Hammond basket after a six-minute dry spell from the Buffaloes' offense. A Smith three gave the Buffs an 18-12 lead. The Bears tied the game at 23 with another Love 3-pointer with just under four minutes left in the half. Bangot Dak slammed one home to to give the Buffs back the lead at 25-23.

A technical foul call on the CU bench gifted the Bears a pair of free throws to tie the game at 27 with 1:27 left in the half. Another Jakimovski 3-pointer put the Buffs up by one in the final seconds of the period, but another Love three of his own at the buzzer put his team up 32-30 over the Buffaloes at the break.

Omier opened the second half with another bucket in the paint. Smith responded for Colorado with a tough layup off the glass. Rancik's first 3-pointer of the day brought CU within one point, 36-35, with 18:17 remaining in the game. Another Smith bucket from beyond the line put the Buffs back on top by two.

A Robert Wright 3-point shot for the Bears after an offensive rebound, gave them a 45-40 lead with just about 14 minutes left in the game. Baylor responded with another shot from deep, A 6-0 scoring run by CU kept it close, with the Bears up 48-46, until their third consecutive 3-pointer gave them a little more breathing room. Jakimovski drilled his fourth three of the day to tie the game at 51 with 10:14 remaining.

The games was tied at 59 with seven minutes left, CU's **Trevor Baskin** earned a bucket-and-one to give the Buffs a three-point lead in the home stretch. The lead extended to six for the Buffs with a pair of Rancik free throws at the 5-42 mark. Two Dak free throws got the CU lead up to 10, 71-61, with 4:32 left in the contest.

Baylor brought the game within five points after a Jalen Celestine 3-pointer at the 1:20 mark. Smith nailed two free throws after the possession to put CU back up by seven. A Baylor bucket followed by a Buffs turnover made it a 74-72 game with 17 seconds left. Hammond then went to the free throw line, making both of his attempts.

Edgecombe slammed a tip-in dunk home with four seconds left, with CU clinging on to a two-point lead. Baylor fouled Baskin out of the break, leading to two missed free throws, but with virtually no time left Baylor could not get a shot off for a potential game-winning basket, leading to a CU 76-74 win.

BOULDER – In front of a packed house inside the CU Events Center Monday night, Colorado kept it close with Kansas throughout the game but could not pull off the win in the final minutes, as the Jayhawks held on to a 71-64 victory over the Buffaloes.

The Buffs fall to 11-17 overall on the season and 2-15 in Big 12 play. Kansas improves to 19-9 overall and 10-7 in conference play.

"Our guys battled tonight," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "There's no doubt

And that was one of the keys of the game...our guys battled, and they played hard, and I don't fault our effort. I don't fault our toughness. We just have to be more consistent in various parts of the game, not just one on any given night."

Bangot Dak led the Buffs on the offensive side of the ball tonight, putting up 16 points on 7 for 10 shooting along with five rebounds. Dak was a force in the paint, slamming it home four separate times.

Julian Hammond III chipped in 11 points while shooting 2 for 5 from beyond the arc. He also led the Buffs on the night with three assists.

Hunter Dickinson led the Jayhawks with a season high 32 points and 13 rebounds on 13 for 18 shooting from the floor.

Neither team could find their footing shooting from deep in this one, which led to a plethora of points scored in the paint. Combined, the two teams scored 74 points down low (38 KU; 36 CU).

Colorado shot 26-68 (38%) as a unit on the court, while Kansas shot 26-53 (49%) overall from the floor.

Despite the loss. Colorado outrebounded Kansas 46-31 overall, along with 18

offensive boards to Kansas' five offensive rebounds.

The Buffs also had more second-chance points (16-1) and bench points (20-

6) than the Jayhawks.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Dickinson claimed the first bucket of the game for Kan-

sas, while Dak answered for the Buffs on the other end. After four KU points, Dak scored the Buffs' second bucket of the contest. An 8-0 run in the next 1:54 of gameplay by the Jayhawks put them up 14-4 with 15:51 left in the first half.

Colorado cut the deficit back to seven with just under 11 minutes to go, but a deep 3-pointer from David Coit made it a 26-16 KU advantage with 9:19 left in the period. Back-to-back Dak dunks for CU forced a Kansas timeout at 8:40 with the Jayhawks still holding the lead, 26-20.

The second Andrej Jakimovski three of the game cut the Jayhawks' lead to

The second **Andrej Jakimovski** three of the game cut the Jayhawks' lead to four, 32-28, with 2:14 left in the half. A **Javon Ruffin** layup as time expired in the first half made it a 37-32 game headed into the break.

Sebastian Rancik registered the first basket of the second half to bring the Buffs within three points. Hammond tied the game at 37 at the 16:41 mark with a nifty euro-step move while getting fouled in the process, converting the following free throw. Hammond gave CU its first lead of the game, 39-38, the next possession with another score down low. Kansas responded with a quick score before heading into the media timeout at 15:06, relaking the lead 40-39.

Buffs' Felix Kossaras knotted the game up at 43 with 12:45 on a tough driving layup that was goaltended. A three-minute scoring drought for the Buffs put Kansas up 51-46 with under 10 minutes left, until a deep 3-pointer from Hammond made it a one-possession game once again.

Both squads continued to trade buckets down low with KU clinging on to a 59-55 lead with five minutes to go. A stellar Dak put-back dunk at the rim made it a one-score game. The Jayhawks went to the line for three free throws the next possession, sinking all three, building the lead back up to five. A Hammond corner three was the response from CU, continuing to keen it close down the stretch.

A 5-0 run from Kansas under four minutes had the Buffs trailing 67-60 with just over a minute of game action left. Another Dickinson bucket for KU put the game out of reach for the Buffs, as they would fall by a score of 71-64.
