**THE BUFFALOES:** Colorado is 15-12 overall and tied with Arizona State for 11th in the Big 12 Conference standings with a league record of 5-9. The Buffaloes and Sun Devils are two games out of a three-way logjam for eighth place, currently occupied by TCU, West Virginia and Cincinnati, all with 7-7 conference marks.

Colorado is 3-3 over its last six games with all three wins coming at the CU Events Center. Colorado's 78-70 win over Arizona State on Feb. 7, allowed the Buffaloes to match their 35-game win total from a year ago in 11 fewer games. The Buffaloes have also surpassed their conference win total from 2024-25.

Colorado ranks among the top 50 teams in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (39th, 1.6) and turnovers per game (44th, 10.0 topg). Colorado was right on that assist-to-turnover mark once again in the win over Oklahoma State, dishing out 20 assists against 12

turnovers (1.7 a/to). The Buffaloes hit the 20-assist mark for the fifth time this season.

At No. 22 BYU, the Buffaloes dished out 18 assists against only seven turnovers (2.6 a/to). In the win over TCU, Colorado matched a season high with 24 assists while committing only eight turnovers (3.0 a/to). The 24 assists were the most against a conference opponent since the Buffaloes had 25 in a 91-72 win over Stanford on March 2, 2017.

Colorado's 10.0 turnovers allowed per game ranks second in the Big 12, behind only No. 2 ranked Houston (8.3 topg). The Buffaloes have recorded single digits in turnovers 11 times this season. Colorado has a long-standing single-game team goal of allowing 11 turnovers or fewer, a mark they've hit in 19 of 27 games. In contrast, the 2024-25 team only achieved that feat seven times in 35 games and only once recorded single digits (8 at Kansas, Feb. 24, 2025).

**SCORING BALANCE:** Colorado has had at least four players score in double figures in 18 of 27 games, including the first nine. The Buffaloes have had five games with at least five scoring in double digits.

Colorado had only four games with four players scoring in double figures in 35 contests last year (3-1 record) and none with five. Prior to this season, the NCAA Tournament win over Florida on March 22, 2024 was the last instance of five double-digit scorers.

The Buffaloes have had six different players lead the team in scoring this season and four have had 20-point games. Colorado is averaging a Big 12-best 28.7 points per game from its bench accounting for 36 percent of the team's scoring.

**Isaiah Johnson** is Colorado's leading scorer at 16.3 points per game, which ranks fourth in the Big 12 and 17th in the nation in scoring by a freshman (based on qualifying individuals). He has a team-best seven 20-point games, including a career and team season-high 27 at BYU. His 27 points were the most by a Colorado freshman since McKinley Wright IV had 30 in a double-overtime game against South Dakota State on Dec. 15, 2017, and the most against a conference opponent since Alec Burks had 27 against Missouri on Feb. 6, 2010. Overall the 27-point effort ties for the ninth best by a freshman in team history.

Johnson leads the Buffaloes in free throws made (130) and attempted (161), 3-pointers made (45) and steals (28) while ranking second in assists (72), and 3-point percentage (.3778).

Johnson is 10th in the nation for free throws made by a freshman and 25th in free throw percentage (.807).

Junior **Barrington Hargress** leads Colorado in assists (120), overall shooting (.543), 3-point percentage (.500) and overall field goals made (146) while ranking second in scoring (14.2 ppg) and 3-pointers made (43) and third in steals (24).

Hargress had 16 points, eight assists and three steals against Oklahoma State. It was his fourth game with at least eight assists this season, and first against a Big 12 opponent. Hargress had 20 points on 7 of 11 from the field, including 4 of 6 from 3-point range, at BYU, his fourth 20-point game of the season.

Hargress is second in the Big 12 and 11th in the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.5 and leads all conference players in league games with a 4.0 mark. He has 16 games with no more than one turnover. Hargress has nine games with at least five assists. Over the last 12 contests he has 48 assists against just 10 turnovers (4.8 a/to).

Additionally on the Big 12 charts, Hargress ranks fifth in field goal percentage and 13th in assists. He is the best field goal shooter in the Big 12, and ninth in the country, from the guard position.

Sophomore **Sebastian Rancik** is second on the team in rebounding (5.6 rpg), free throws made (101) and attempted (118) and steals (25) and third in scoring (12.3 ppg) and assists (55). Rancik leads the team and ranks third in the Big 12 in free throw percentage at 85.6 percent.

Rancik pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds against Oklahoma State to go along with seven points and a pair of assists. The performance gave him double figures in rebounds for the third time in the last four games and is averaging 9.0 rebounds per game during that span. He also had 10 rebounds at BYU while dishing out a career-best six assists with nine points and a team-high three steals.

Rancik recorded his first career double-double with 17 points and a personal-best 11 rebounds in the home win over Arizona State. Four of those rebounds came off the offensive end, which is also a career high.

Junior forward **Bangot Dak** leads the Buffaloes and is 14th in the Big 12 at 6.6 rebounds per game and 11th in blocks at 1.4 per outing. He is fourth on the team in scoring at 10.8 points per game while shooting 47.5 percent from the field.

Dak was named to the **Big 12 Starting Five** on Feb. 23, honoring his standout performance against Oklahoma State. Dak scored a game-high 17 points, hitting 5 of 8 from the field and 6 of 7 from the free throw line, along with seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots.

It marks the first Big 12 weekly honor of any kind for Dak and the first for the Buffaloes since rejoining the conference last season. This is the first season of the Big 12 Starting Five, which honors strong performances across the conference. Dak is joined on the Big 12 Starting Five by Arizona's Anthony Dell'Orso, UCF's Themus Fulks, Cincinnati's Moustapha Thiam and BYU's AJ Dybantsa who claimed both Player and Newcomer of the Week honors.

**ABOUT THE WILDCATS:** Kansas State is 11-16 overall and tied for 15th in the Big 12 at 2-12. The Wildcats have dropped seven of their last eight overall and five-straight on the road. Kansas State is averaging 80.3 points per game and shooting 46.0 percent from the field. Kansas State gets out in transition, scoring 15.0 fast break points per game, second in the Big 12 and 27th nationally. Defensively, the Wildcats are allowing 81.1 points per game, and have held opponents to 45.5 percent shooting. Kansas State shares the ball, averaging 17.4 assists per game, ranking second in the conference and 25th in the country.

The Wildcats are led by junior guard P.J. Haggerty, who is third in the nation in scoring at 23.5 points per game. He leads the country in field goals made with 236. Kansas State has two other players who average double figures in points: senior guard Nate Johnson (12.1) and sophomore guard David Castillo (11.1). Johnson leads the team with 4.5 assists per game and is first in the Big 12 with 57 total steals this season.

**MANHATTAN, Kan.** – Cold shooting early and turnovers derailed Colorado's chance at a first Big 12 Conference road win as Kansas State took a 65-56 decision at Bramlage Coliseum Sunday afternoon.

Colorado drops to 11-18 overall and 2-16 in the Big 12. Kansas State halts a four-game skid, improving to 14-15, 8-10 in conference play.

Sophomore **RJ Smith** led Colorado with 11 points, hitting 5 of 8 from the field. **Bangot Dak** and **Sebastian Rancik** each had 10 points. **Elijah Malone** had seven points and led the Buffaloes with six rebounds and three blocks. **Javon Ruffin** had five points and matched a career high with five assists.

Colorado's leading scorer **Julian Hammond III** was scoreless, leaving the game eight minutes in with a lower back issue.

David N'Guessan led all players with 21 points and eight rebounds for Kansas State.

Neither team was very good offensively. Colorado shot 39 percent from the field and continued its season-long struggles from long-range making just 4 of 23 3-point attempts (.174). Kansas State shot 34.4 percent from the field but had more success from 3-point range hitting 7 of 21 (.333).

The Wildcats gained their advantage scoring 20 points off 15 Colorado turnovers and getting to the free throw line. The Wildcats, who entered the game shooting less than 68 percent from the free throw line made 16 of 19 (.842) including all nine attempts in the first half.

"Our defense was good enough tonight," Colorado head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "We held them to 34 percent, so when our defense got set, it was good enough to win this game. But the problem, and we know this coming in, is we have to take care of the ball. And that's been who we are. We can't take care of the ball. Tonight, it's a nine-point game, and we lose the turnover battle 20-5."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Kansas State built a 10-point lead right out of the gate. N'Guessan scored the Wildcats' first five points. Colorado had three early turnovers as Kansas State jumped out to a 12-2 lead four minutes into the first half.

Colorado made just three of its first 14 shots. The Buffaloes had a little success early getting into the paint. **Dak**, **Assane Diop** and **Rancik** scored Colorado's first three field goals on inside feeds for layups. Malone drew a foul inside and hit a free throw to cut the K-State lead to 14-7 with 12:47 left.

Kansas State took advantage of Colorado misses by getting down the floor quickly. The Wildcats scored six-straight points finished off with a Dug McDaniel layup that gave the Wildcats a 20-7 lead. Smith broke the Wildcats' streak with a layup at the 8:24 mark.

Colorado missed its first nine 3-point attempts until **Andrej Jakimovski** broke the string at 6:11 in the first half as the Wildcats led 23-12. **Jakimovski** scored six straight for the Buffaloes and Smith added coast-to-coast layup off the steal to cut the Kansas State lead to 26-17 with 4:24 left in the half.

Kansas State padded its lead back to double digits thanks to five straight points by David Castillo and a N'Guessan dunk off a turnover. Smith made a 3-pointer and Diop got a late layup to cut the deficit to 33-22 at the half.

"At some point you got to be able to make some shots," Boyle said. "And we're really struggling making shots right now for whatever reason. We missed a lot of open looks tonight, and K State was the toughest team, and they deserve to win, because you know, if you're going to miss a bunch of shots, you better get some offensive rebounds. We had five at halftime. We had one in the second half, so you're going to miss shots. You better go try to find second shots or get to the free throw line, which was really difficult to do tonight, do the physicality of the game, and came up short."

Kansas State used a 7-0 run early in the second half to extend its lead. Macaleab Rich scored on an alley-oop from McDaniel as the Wildcats held their largest advantage at 46-29 with 14:12 left.

Colorado had its best stretch midway through the second half. The Buffaloes found some rhythm, hitting six consecutive shots with **Dak** scoring twice and a Smith layup which cut Kansas State's lead back down to 11 at 54-43.

Rich and N'Guessan ended that run with back-to-back scores to put the Wildcats back up by 15. Colorado closed the gap back to 11 on free throws from **Dak** and **Diop** and a Malone tip in off a missed free throw as K-State led 58-47 with 5:25 left.

Colorado got as close as eight thanks to five-straight points from Ruffin. He hit a 3-pointer with 3:23 left to cut the lead to 60-50. **Dak** stole the ball on the other end, which Ruffin turned into a fastbreak layup for a 60-52 margin with 3:01 remaining.

The Buffaloes missed their next four shots and had a pair of turnovers before Rancik scored once more with the clock running out.

**THE SERIES:** This will be the 146th meeting between Colorado and Kansas State in a series that dates back to 1934. Kansas State holds a 97-48 all-time lead in the series. Colorado has won four of the last five meetings, including a nonconference win at Bramlage Coliseum on Nov. 27, 2020. The series is tied at 32-32 in Boulder. This will be Kansas State's first visit to Boulder in 15 years, since a 58-56 Colorado win on Feb. 12, 2011.

**BD CAREER BLOCKS:** Junior **Bangot Dak** had a pair of blocks against Oklahoma State to move into sole possession of 15th on CU's all-time list. He is 13 away from becoming the 11th Buffalo to reach 100.

**JOHNSON CLIMBING FRESHMAN SCORING LIST:** **Isaiah Johnson** has 439 points on the season, the fifth-most by a freshman in team history. He needs 15 points to catch McKinley Wright IV for fourth and 26 for Chauncey Billups in third. With his current 16.3 points per game average, and a minimum of five games remaining, he is on pace to catch Alec Burks' all-time mark of 512 set in 2009-10.

Johnson's 16.3 points per game average currently sits as the third-best in a freshman season, trailing only Chauncey Billups' 17.9 points per game in 1995-96 and Alec Burks' 17.1 in 2009-10. He's also on pace to become the eighth Colorado freshman to lead the team in scoring, since the NCAA made freshmen eligible in 1972.

**PROTECTING THE ROCK:** Colorado put together three straight games with turnovers in single digits (at West Virginia, vs. Kansas, vs. UCF). It's the first time the Buffaloes have had a stretch of three games in single digit turnovers since Dec. 16-22, 2020. It's the first time against conference opponents since Mar. 7-13, 2019.

Colorado committed just three turnovers against Kansas, setting a team record for fewest turnovers in a conference game. The previous mark was four, done twice, against Utah on Feb. 24, 2024 and against Iowa State on Jan. 30, 2010. It was the second-fewest in team history, trailing only the two given up at San Jose State on Dec. 19, 1978.

**Holland** and **Josiah Sanders** each made their first career starts in the TCU game and it couldn't have gone much better as that trio sparked the Buffaloes to their 87-61 win over the Horned Frogs.

The three newcomers to the starting lineup combined for 23 points, 14 assists and 10 rebounds while shooting 10 of 18 from the field (.556).

Sanders had 12 points, six assists and hit 5 of 9 from the field, all career highs. Ifaola had career highs with six points and six rebounds, hitting all three of his field goal attempts. Holland had five points, five rebounds and a personal-best four assists.

Adding in **Isaiah Johnson**, **Alon Michaeli** and **Ian Inman**, Colorado freshmen accounted for 43 of the Buffaloes' 87 points against TCU.

That group was featured once again at Baylor and while the outcome wasn't as the team had hoped, the contributions were once again significant. Holland had a career-high 12 points, leading the Buffaloes in scoring for the first time in his career. Sanders had seven points while Ifaola grabbed three boards against the Bears.

**AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS:** Colorado is 0-5 against ranked opponents this season after falling at No. 22/22 BYU on Feb. 14.

Colorado's 28 wins over ranked Associated Press ranked opponents in the Tad Boyle era is by far the best in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 28-61, have accounted for 39 percent of wins over ranked opponents (72) since 1949-50.

**NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS:** Colorado's 10 wins during the nonconference season are the most for the Buffaloes since 2019-20 (11-2).

Colorado is 146-44 (.768) in nonconference regular season games under head coach **Tad Boyle** including a 99-27 mark (.786) since the beginning of the 2014-15 season.

Colorado is 112-9 (.926) in nonconference home games under Boyle, a record which includes a 7-2 mark in postseason action.

**NOTING STREAKS:** Colorado's eight-game winning streak to begin the season is the program's best since an eight-game run at the tail end of 2023-24 where the Buffaloes set the single-school record for wins with 26. Colorado won its first eight games in a season for the first time in 76 years. The 8-0 start tied for the second-best in school history, last achieved in the 1949-50 season.

**BD MVP:** Junior forward **Bangot Dak** earned most valuable player honors at the Acrisure Holiday Classic. Dak averaged 14.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.5 blocks with zero turnovers at the two-game classic. Against San Francisco, Dak had 13 points, five rebounds and a career-high six assists. In the championship game against Washington, Dak recorded his first career double-double, leading the Buffs with 15 points, 11 rebounds and three blocks.

**JOHNSON'S MONSTER DEBUT:** **Isaiah Johnson's** 24 points against Montana State marked the second-most by a Colorado freshman in a debut. Johnson made 6 of 9 from the field, including 2 of 3 from 3-point range, while hitting 10 of 12 free throw attempts.

The record for a CU freshman debut is 31 points by Emmett Lewis, who had 31 against New Mexico on Nov. 29, 1975. Lewis would go on to become the first of seven Buffs to ever lead the team in scoring for a season, averaging 15.0 in 1975-76.

All 24 of Johnson's points came in the second half, the most in any one half by a Colorado freshman. Overall his 24 points in one half ties for the 12th-best mark by a Buff, regardless of class.

**MALONE'S IMPRESSIVE LINE:** Graduate center **Elijah Malone** filled up the stat line nicely against Montana State finishing with 10 points and a trio of CU personal-bests with 13 rebounds, five assists and four steals.

He is the one of only seven players in NCAA Division I basketball to have a game with at least 10 points, 13 rebounds, five assists and four steals.

The double-double was his second as a Buffalo, and actually is second in a row as he finished off the 2024-25 season with a 17-point, 10-rebound performance against Villanova in the College Basketball Crown Tournament. Overall it's the 28th double-double of his collegiate career (26 at Grace).

Malone's 13 rebounds are his best at Colorado and fifth overall; he had 17 with Grace against Cornerstone on Dec. 30, 2021. His four steals are a career-high, both CU and Grace. Malone's five assists are one off his Grace best, as he dished out six at Taylor (Ind.) on Feb. 13, 2021.

**CENTURY MARK:** With the win over Eastern Washington, Colorado improved to 44-2 all-time when scoring 100 points. Before the win over the Eagles, Colorado's last 100-point game came in an NCAA Tournament win over Florida, 102-100, on March 22, 2024. It was Colorado's first 100-point game at home since a 106-79 win over Milwaukee on Nov. 14, 2023. Colorado's 11 3-pointers made were its most since the Buffaloes had 13 in that same Milwaukee game.

**IN THE OT:** Against Eastern Washington, Colorado climbed to .500 all-time in overtime games, now with a record of 57-57. The Buffaloes have won their last three overtime games and five of the last six. Colorado's win over Eastern Washington came exactly one-year to the date of the Buffaloes' last overtime match up, also the second game of the season and against a Big Sky team. On Nov. 8, 2024, the Buffaloes needed two extra sessions against Northern Colorado to scratch out a 90-88 victory. Colorado improved to 34-23 in overtime at home (.596).

**BOYLE MILESTONES:** Head coach **Tad Boyle**, in his 16th season, is the winningest men's basketball head coach in program history with a career record of 327-216. He picked up milestone win No. 300 against his former team, Northern Colorado, on Nov. 8, 2024.

Boyle-led teams own 10 of the 14 20-win seasons in team history, the top five single-season win totals and seven of the top eight. He owns the second-best winning percentage in team history with at least four seasons coached at .602, trailing Forrest "Frosty" Cox who was 147-89 (.623) from 1936-50.

During Colorado's 13-year stint in the Pac-12 Conference, Boyle won 131 regular season league games, tying with Ernie Kent (Oregon 1998-2010 & Washington State 2014-19) for 17th in conference history.

Boyle owns the most wins at a state of Colorado NCAA Division I institution. He is 383-282 (.576) in his 20th year between Colorado and Northern Colorado (four seasons, 2006-10). Boyle is currently fifth in career wins for a head coach at any Colorado four-year school.

**RIGHT AT HOME:** At the CU Events Center, the Buffaloes have won:

In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is 216-51 at home (.809). The Buffaloes are 529-202 (.724) all-time at the CU Events Center. The Buffaloes have won at least 10 games at home each of the last 17 seasons.

**GOLD STANDARD:** Colorado is 98-6 in the Tad Boyle era when meeting the program's "Gold Standard" of holding an opponent to 40 percent or less from the field and having a plus-8 rebounding edge. The Buffaloes are 3-0 this season when meeting that standard, most recently against UTSA, holding the Roadrunners to 39.1 percent and winning the battle of the boards by 12 (46-34).

**OPENERS:** Colorado improved to 88-35 (.715) in all-time season openers and has won its last 10. The Buffaloes are 14-2 under head coach **Tad Boyle** and 41-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes are 99-24 (.805) all-time in home openers, have won their last 18 and 24 of their last 25. Boyle's teams are 16-0 in home openers.

**DEBUTS:** Seven Buffaloes saw their first action in a Colorado uniform in the opener against Montana State. **Barrington Hargress** played in his first Colorado game after two seasons at UC Riverside. Six freshmen made their collegiate debuts: **Jalin Holland, Isaiah Johnson, Josiah Sanders, Ian Inman, Andrew Crawford** (redshirt) and **Fawaz "Tacko" Ifaola**.

**Alon Michaeli** became the eighth Buffalo to make his season debut in the win over Eastern Washington, pitching in 11 points off the bench.

**PRESEASON POLLS:** For the second-straight season, Colorado was picked to finish 15th in the annual Big 12 Preseason Coaches Poll released Oct. 16. The conference debuted a Media Preseason Poll this which also slated the Buffaloes for a 15th place finish. Arizona State took the bottom spot in both polls.

Houston was the consensus favorite to repeat its Big 12 title. Both polls had the same teams in the top five. BYU was second in the coaches' poll and Texas Tech third with those teams swapping places in the media version. Arizona was picked fourth with Iowa State fifth in both polls.

**BUFFS ADD PORTELA FOR 2026-27:** With only one senior on the 2025-26 Colorado roster, the Buffaloes had a single signee during the NCAA early signing period, adding Rider Portela, a stand-out small forward from Phoenix on Nov. 12.

Portela is a 6-foot, 6-inch, 175-pound small forward from Sunnyslope High School in Phoenix, one of the state of Arizona's premier basketball programs. Coached by his father, Ray, Rider Portela has helped the Vikings reach two of the last three Arizona Open Division state title games.

Portela averaged 13.2 points, 5.1 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals as a junior in 2024-25, helping Sunnyslope to a 21-9 record. He was named to the Arizona Republic's All-Arizona Team.

As a freshman, Portela averaged 10.5 points, 6.3 rebounds, and 2.2 assists, aiding the Vikings to the state title game before falling to a Perry squad that featured former Buff and NBA Lottery Pick Cody Williams in 2022-23.

Over his three-year varsity career, Portela has averaged 11.8 points and 5.4 rebounds in 86 games, shooting 44 percent from the field and 78 percent from the line. He made 102 of 118 free throws his junior year (.864).

Portela is rated as the ninth-best player in the state of Arizona and 45th-best small forward in the nation by 247Sports.com.

**AUSTRALIA TRIP:** Colorado enjoyed a summer to remember with a four-game exhibition tour in Australia (July 23-Aug. 5).

Colorado finished its tour of Australia with a 2-2 record. The Buffaloes opened with a 92-82 win over Hoop City in Melbourne. Sebastian Rancik led the Buffaloes with 25 points, hitting 7 of 13 from the field, knocking down three 3-pointers and 8 of 9 from the line. Elijah Malone had 15 points and a team-high eight rebounds.

Colorado then rolled to a 100-88 win over the Gold Coast Rollers, an NBL1 North team that competes in the Gold Coast City Regional Basketball Association. It was a well-balanced effort for the Buffaloes. Six players scored in double figures while six collected at least four rebounds. Malone topped the team in scoring with 15 points, hitting 6 of 7 from the field, missing only on a 3-point attempt.

The marquee event of the trip was a meeting with The Boomers, Australia's Men's National Team. The Boomers held off the Buffaloes, 93-87 in front of 5,000 fans at the Gold Coast Leisure Centre. Isaiah Johnson led Colorado off the bench with 19 points, hitting 6 of 10 from the field. Rancik scored 16 points while grabbing five rebounds. The Boomers used this game as a tune-up for the upcoming FIBA Asia Cup, which they eventually won in August.

Colorado wrapped up the four-game tour by dropping a 93-74 decision to the Sydney Kings in Sydney. No official stats were kept during the contest, but it was a tight battle through three quarters before the host Kings pulled away in the fourth. Colorado led by two at the half (34-32) and trailed by only four through three (59-55). Sydney, affiliated with the NBL, Australia's professional basketball league,

wore down the young Buffaloes down the stretch, outscoring Colorado 34-19 over the final 10 minutes.

The tour took place at an ideal time for Colorado, which features 10 newcomers, including eight freshmen. Along with the four exhibition games, the Buffaloes were allowed 10 practices leading up to the trip.

Along with competing in exhibition games, the Buffaloes explored some of Australia's finest attractions, including tours of the Great Barrier Reef and the Sydney Opera House. Colorado also attended an Australian Football League game in Melbourne and the Australia Zoo near Brisbane.

**WALL OF HONOR:** The Wall of Honor display at the CU Events Center honors a select group who's on the court achievements have expanded well beyond their days in Boulder.

The Men's Basketball Wall of Honor celebrates those former Buffaloes that have achieved at least five years of service in the NBA or competed on the world stage as an Olympic Gold Medalist. The initial 10 legends to be honored are:

The honorees will have their Colorado jersey displayed high above the concourse on the northwest corner of the CU Events Center. Wall of Honor members will be recognized in person with their jerseys officially unveiled at future games.

Burks was recognized during the Texas Tech game on Jan. 10. Wedman was honored on Jan. 20 vs. Kansas.

Last season, Haldorson, Meely and Davis were the first Wall of Honor members to be recognized on Jan. 28 during the Arizona State home game. Humphries was celebrated at Colorado's game with Houston on Saturday, Feb. 8. White had his jersey unveiled during the UCF game on Feb. 15. The schedule for the remaining honorees will be announced at a later date.

**COLORADO TO THE NBA:** Colorado had five players listed on NBA rosters to begin the 2025-26 season, the fourth most of any Big 12 school, trailing only Arizona (14), Kansas (11) and Baylor (9).



**BOULDER** – Colorado overcame a seven-point second-half deficit Monday night, led by true freshman **Isaiah Johnson's** 24 second-half points, to outlast Montana State 84-78 in the season opener at the CU Events Center.

Colorado improved to 14-2 in season openers and 16-0 in home openers under head coach **Tad Boyle**.

With the game tied at 62 with 7:09 remaining, Johnson scored 16 of the next 18 points for the Buffs, including the game-winning free throws to put Colorado up for good.

All of Johnson's game-leading 24 points came in the second half. He went 6-of-7 from the field, 2-of-2 from deep, and 10-of-12 from the line all in the final 20 minutes.

"I just kept wanting to be aggressive," Johnson said on the second half. "My teammates, my coaches, they kept telling me to be aggressive, even though I struggled in the first half."

Johnson was one of five true freshmen to see minutes, along with **Jalin Holland**, **Fawaz "Tacko" Ifaola**, **Ian Inman**, and **Josiah Sanders**, who all made contributions.

Four other Buffs reached double-figures in points, transfer **Barrington Hargress** and returners **Bangot Dak**, **Elijah Malone**, and **Sebastian Rancik**. Malone added 13 rebounds for his first double double of the season and his second at Colorado.

Patrick McMahon led Montana State in scoring with 24 points, including 20 of his own in the second half.

Colorado's offense improved in the second half after struggling to end the first half. After shooting just 42 percent on the first half, CU shot 62 percent in the second half to finish the game 27-of-52 (51.9%).

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado opened up the 2025-26 season by making its first three shots and scoring on the opening four possessions. Malone got the Buffs started, knocking down two free throws. A Rancik 3-pointer, followed by a layup by Dak, and a **Felix Kossaras** mid-range jump shot led to an early 7-0 run to give a 12-5 lead.

Sanders made the first shot of his career after an offensive rebound to push the lead to eight points. He was one of four true freshmen to play in the first eight minutes of the game.

Fellow true freshman Inman made his impact on both sides of the court, diving on the floor for a steal before kicking it ahead to Kossaras for the fastbreak dunk to go up 22-14 with 10:45 left in the first half.

After going up nine points, Montana State started to stiffen the Buffs, leading to a 13-1 run to take the lead 31-28 with three minutes left in the opening half. The Buffs ended the half, making only two of their final 13 shots, going into the break down 33-32.

Colorado struggled shooting the ball in the first half, going 1-of-7 from behind the arc and 7-of-14 from the free-throw line. They used turnovers and the fast break to score early. They forced eight Bobcat turnovers and turned that into eight points. The Buffs outscored Montana State 10-0 in points of turnovers and 5-0 in fastbreak points in the opening 20 minutes.

Malone again started the half scoring, this time on a layup from a Dak pass. He followed that up by picking up his third foul, leading to the fifth true freshman to make his debut in Ifaola.

After some back-and-forth, Dak put down an and-1 followed by a Johnson layup, the fifth straight make to cut the Bobcat lead to 50-47.

Johnson added a 3-pointer to his night, putting one down on a kickout from Malone after an offensive rebound for only the second shot from deep.

As the intensity ramped up, Rancik completed the third and-1 of the half for the Buffs to retake the lead 56-54 for the first time since 28-27 with six minutes left in the first half.

After trading baskets, the scoring for the Buffs came from Hargraves and Johnson, who scored eight straight, leading to a 70-69 advantage.

Montana State scored two straight baskets and Johnson responded with three free throws after being fouled on a shot from deep to cut the lead back to 74-73 with 3:07 remaining.

Johnson continued his scorching hot second-half with a pull-up transition 3-pointer and a circus layup to put the Buffs up 78-76.

Following a Bobcats basket to tie the game, Johnson hit two game-winning free throws to win his total for the night to 24 points. After a stop, Rancik and Kossaras each hit free throws of their own to ice the game 84-78.

**BOULDER** – Colorado drained 11 3-pointers, and the Buffaloes outlasted Eastern Washington in overtime Saturday afternoon for a 102-97 win at the CU Events Center.

The Buffs trailed 68-67 with 6:32 remaining in the game but rallied to lead by three points, with 19 seconds remaining. The Eagles, though, rallied to force overtime, hitting a 3-pointer with just three seconds left on the clock to tie the game at 85-85. The Buffs couldn't get the potential game-winner to go down in the final seconds of the second half.

**Sebastian Rancik** led the way for Colorado, scoring a team-leading and career-high 24 points, going 11-of-12 from the free throw line. Freshman **Isaiah Johnson** added to the hot start to his career with 17 points off the bench. **Barrington Hargress** added 14 points, and freshman **Alon Michaeli** put up 11 points off the bench in his first career game.

**Isaiah Moses** led the Eagles with 30 points, including the game-tying 3-pointer at the end of regulation.

The Buffs struggled to slow down the Eagles, who shot nearly 60% from the field and 56% from behind the arc. But in the second half, Colorado forced eight turnovers, leading to 11 points.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Hargress got the scoring going for Colorado with a mid-range shot off the dribble in the left corner.

Early in the first half, Michaeli earned the first minutes of playing time in his career and scored his first six points in the opening 20 minutes. Fellow freshman Johnson followed that up with four-straight points to cut the lead to 12-11.

Unable to pull away, the Buffs stayed ahead using the 3-point shot. Three deep shots from Rancik and **Ian Inman** put the Buffs up 25-21 with 8:41 remaining in the first half.

Eastern Washington used an 8-0 run to take the lead, holding CU's offense scoreless for nearly four minutes of gametime.

Two more 3-pointers, first by Hargress, then by Rancik, gave the Buffs a two-point lead, but two Eagles free throws tied the game before an Inman layup to give Colorado a 41-39 lead at the break.

Colorado's defense struggled to stop Eastern Washington in the first half, allowing them to shoot 54% on 14-of-26 shots and get to the free-throw line 12 times. The Buffs stayed ahead by shooting 43% from behind the arc on six makes.

The Buffs opened the second half, forcing two turnovers and blocking a shot, leading to a 6-0 run and a **Bangot Dak** alley-oop dunk.

Foul trouble began to plague the Buffs with both **Felix Kossaras** and **Elijah Malone** picking up their third fouls early in the second half.

After a Hargress layup put the Buffs up nine, Eastern Washington responded with a 12-2 run over three minutes to retake the lead 51-49. Layups by Dak, Rancik, and **Josiah Sanders** gave Colorado the lead 55-53, but the defense still struggled to get a stop with the Eagles answering with makes of their own.

Both teams struggled to get stops, keeping the game close. The Buffs turned defense into offense, scoring off turnovers to retake the lead 67-66.

Leading by two points, Johnson drained a 3-pointer from the top of the key to push the lead to 75-70 with 3:25 remaining.

Only leading by one, Rancik kicked it out to Kossaras for his first 3-pointer of the game and the team's ninth for a 79-75 lead.

Following free throws from Michaeli and a 3-pointer from the Eagles, the Buffs led 81-80. Hargress responded by putting in a runner in the middle of the court to lead 83-80. But just as it had been all game, Eastern Washington responded with a Moses layup to keep the game at a one-point lead.

In the bonus, the ball found Rancik, who hit both free throws to put the Buffs up 85-82 with 19 seconds remaining.

Eastern Washington's Moses followed that up with a deep 3-point shot with 3.1 seconds to tie the game at 85. Rancik had a shot at the buzzer that missed, pushing the game to overtime.

After making a free throw for the opening points of overtime, Kossaras got four free throws and made them all with Johnson and Rancik splitting them, giving a 90-85 lead.

The Eagles responded by making two straight shots, including an and-1 by Johnny Radford, to tie the game up at 90-90.

Needing a basket, Johnson knocked down another 3-pointer, this time on the right wing. After a block by Malone, he took his turn behind the arc off a pass by Hargress to the left corner to give the Buffs a 96-90 lead.

Rancik iced the game at the free-throw line, keeping the Buffs ahead for good.

**BOULDER** – Colorado took care of business Monday night as the Buffaloes rolled past Alabama State, 94-66 at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 4-0 with the win, while the Hornets dropped to 2-2.

Leading 11-8, Colorado broke the game open with a 23-3 run that spanned over nine minutes of game time. The Buffs built as much as a 29-point lead in the first half and led by as much as 15 the rest of the way.

Junior **Bangot Dak** led the way for Colorado by filling the stat sheet. He finished with 16 points, seven rebounds, three blocks, and two steals as well as setting a new career-high in free throws made, shooting 8 of 9. Sophomore **Sebastian Rancic** added 14 points and five rebounds while also knocking down 10 of 10 from the line.

"I feel like the past couple of games we had, I haven't been showing my effort, besides the first game," Dak said. "I've been struggling offensively, so if I get myself going defensively, I can get myself going offensively. So that helped me tonight."

The freshmen trio of **Isaiah Johnson**, **Alon Michaeli**, and **Josiah Sanders** each put in 10 points off the bench.

Asjon Anderson led the Hornets with 15 points.

Colorado finished with a season-best 20 assists while shooting 30-for-56 from the field (53.6 percent), including 6-for-16 from long range. The Buffs also had a 46-33 edge on the boards while holding the Hornets to 36 percent shooting (24-for-67).

"We knew we had to be on point defensively," Boyle commented. "I thought in the first half our defense was terrific. We made some strides in that area. We got a little complacent on defense in that second half and gave up 44 points. There's some things to build on, and that's the one thing you want to do. We were able to play a lot of guys which I was hoping that we could. We have to build some depth here in November, because you never know what's going to happen as this season rolls on. A good win with 20 assists, 11 turnovers. Really good numbers for this group offensively. I thought we really shared the ball extremely well tonight. That's the thing I was most pleased with."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Dak got the Buffs out of the gates strong, scoring the first six points with four coming from the foul line. A driving layup and a 3-pointer by Felix Kossaras gave Colorado a 13-8 lead and 100% from the field at the first timeout.

Colorado used a suffocating defense to fuel an extended 17-1 run that saw six different Buffs score, including shots from deep by Kossaras, Johnson and **Barrington Hargress**, and assists on five of the first six made shots.

Defense continued to ramp up for the Buffs, forcing Alabama State into misses on 15-of-16 shots after they opened making three of the first four shots of the game to continue extending the lead to 32-11 with 7:21 left in the first half.

At the offensive end, the ball was moving and getting into everyone's hands. Ten different Buffs scored in the first half, with assists coming on 11 of 14 made shots. CU used six Hornet turnovers and turned them into 16 fast break points to build a 46-22 lead. On the flip side Alabama State only converted three fast break points in the opening 20 minutes.

After holding Alabama State to only two 3-pointers in the first half, they made six in the first 12 minutes of the second half to begin to cut into the lead. Colorado used the free throw line to keep them at bay, making 10-of-12 to keep a 68-51 lead with 7:54 remaining.

Despite a shaky start to the second half, the Buffs got back to work and pushed the lead back up to 29 with 3:45 left and rode it the rest of the way.

**BOULDER** – Colorado used a late second-half run to outrun UC Davis 95-79, Saturday night at the CU Events Center.

With the win, the Buffaloes improve to 5-0, their best start since 2019-20. UC Davis falls to 4-2.

Five players scored in double figures for Colorado. Junior **Bangot Dak** led the way for the second-straight game with 18 points on 8 of 10 from the field. Sophomore **Felix Kossaras** had a career-high 17 points with a personal-best three 3-pointers. **Sebastian Rancic** had 15, **Barrington Hargress** just missed a double-doubt with 13 points and nine assists. **Alon Michaeli** pitched in 10 points off the bench.

UC Davis guard Marcus Wilson led all players with 21 points. "Another good win," Colorado head coach Tad Boyle said. "I think UC Davis is good. I think they're going to win a lot of games this year. They're well coached. They got good players. I thought our depth kind of wore them down a little bit tonight. People are going to see this score that weren't here tonight, and they're going to say, 'Oh yeah, Colorado took care of UC Davis, as they should have and it was an easy victory.' It wasn't easy."

UC Davis held a four-point lead midway through the second half, but Colorado outscored the Aggies 36-16 over the final 9:35 to secure the win. The Buffaloes shot 59.6 percent in the game and shared the ball with a season-high 24 assists on 34 made field goals.

UC Davis had it going on offense as well. The Aggies shot 51.7 percent, making 31 of 60 attempts, and hit all nine free throws.

Colorado used its depth and pace to wear down the Aggies during the stretch run. While the Buffaloes shot well the entire game, they were exceptional at the end. Colorado made 65.5 percent from the field in the second half and made 13 of 15 attempts during that final 20-point run.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado held a 43-39 lead at the half, but UC Davis made 8 of 13 from the field to open the second period and took their first lead, 58-57, on a Connor Sevilla fast break basket off a Colorado turnover with 12:03 left.

Michaeli briefly gave the Buffaloes back the lead, but Rocak baited **Elijah Malone** into his fourth foul on a 3-point attempt. Rocak made all three free throws to give UC Davis back the lead. Wilson, got a steal and was fouled by Hargress, and the ensuing free throws gave the Aggies their largest lead at 63-59.

Colorado quickly took the lead back for good. Kossaras scored on a dunk off a nice pass from Dak to cut the lead to two. After a Wilson miss, Hargress pushed the pace and had an and-one, scoring on a fast break layup and, following the free throw, the Buffaloes recaptured the lead at 64-63.

That sequence sparked a 10-0 run that gave the Buffaloes a 69-63 advantage before UC Davis scored again.

Colorado pushed that lead to double digits as Dak scored five straight points and Hargress had another basket and free throw as the run grew to 20-6 in favor of the Buffaloes who led 80-69 with 4:40 remaining.

**Isaiah Johnson** and Rancic helped put the game out of reach down the stretch, each nailing a 3-pointer. Kossaras scored his final points on a layup as Colorado led 90-75 with only 2:03 remaining.

Colorado jumped out to a 10-0 lead. Dak scored four points, including a high-light-reel alley-op from Hargress. The Buffaloes started off well on the defensive end as UC Davis missed their first five shots of the game.

Colorado's bench, which had played so well over the first four games, struggled early. After the first media timeout and round of substitutions, UC Davis erased the Buffaloes' lead with an 8-0 run.

Colorado regrouped to take a double-digit lead late in the half. The Buffaloes used the long ball to their advantage, making 5 of 7 from downtown during the first 20 minutes. Following a Dak blocked shot, **Josiah Sanders** found Hargress on the wing for a 3-pointer as the Buffaloes had their largest lead at the time at 37-24 with 4:50 left.

Wilson, who had 13 of his points in the first half on 3 of 4 from 3-point range, rallied the Aggies before the break. UC Davis went on a 13-2 run to cut Colorado's lead to two. Johnson ended that run with a pair of free throws and Sanders added a late layup to give Colorado a 43-39 lead at the break.

**PALM DESERT, Calif.** – Junior **Bangot Dak** recorded his first career double-double, leading the Buffaloes to the 2025 Acrisure Holiday Classic title with an 81-68 win over Washington, Friday afternoon at the Acrisure Arena.

Dak, who was named the tournament's most valuable player, had 15 points and 11 rebounds, while adding three blocked shots and two assists.

Colorado, 7-0 for the first time since 2019-20, once again featured a balanced attack with five players in double figures. **Isaiah Johnson** had 13 points and **Alon Michaeli** had 12, both off the bench. **Felix Kossaras** and **Sebastian Rancic** both had 11 points as the Buffaloes claimed their first multi-team event tournament title since the MGM Main Event in Las Vegas in 2019-20.

Quimari Peterson led Washington (5-2) with 18 points. Desmond Claude added 14.

"When our team puts the Colorado name ahead of the name on the back of their jersey, really good things can happen," Colorado head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "And you can win championships. This is a small championship, but every one of these tournaments played throughout the country, you have an opportunity to compete for a championship. That's something we relish."

It was quite a roller coaster day for the young Buffaloes. The first half was a complete domination by Colorado, which opened the game on a 22-9 run. The Buffaloes shot 55 percent in the first half while holding Washington to just 28 percent from the field as Colorado built a 17-point lead.

But a little adversity came quickly in the second half. Washington flipped the script on the Buffaloes, finding its rhythm with the shooting of Peterson and the rebounding of Frank Kepnang who had nine rebounds, six on the offensive end. Peterson hit a pair of 3-pointers to lead a 22-5 run that completely erased Colorado's lead in the first nine minutes of the second half. Jasir Rencher hit a 3-pointer to finish off that run, tying the score at 52-52 with 11:41 remaining.

While the Buffaloes could have fallen apart at that point, they simply regrouped and got back to work. Kossaras ended Washington's run and gave Colorado back the lead for good with his second of three 3-pointers on the day. After a Washington miss, **Elijah Malone** looked to score on the other end. His shot was off the rim but Dak was there for the flush off the rebound and the Buffs' lead was back up to five at 57-52.

From there the Buffaloes had an answer for every Washington basket. Peterson hit another 3-pointer, but Kossaras countered with his own. Claude cut Colorado's lead to four, at 62-58, only to have Michaeli with a step-back 3-pointer to extend the lead back to seven at 66-59 with 5:56 remaining.

The Buffaloes kept that momentum down the stretch. Malone scored two straight baskets and Rancic hit two free throws to get the lead back to double digits. Colorado, which didn't have a great start on the day at the free throw line, hit 7 of 8 down the stretch to hold the Huskies in check.

It was a great start for the Buffaloes, scoring the first seven points and hitting their first three shots. Rancic and Dak both hit 3-pointers as Colorado held a 10-2 lead and forced an early Washington timeout.

Colorado kept the gas pedal to the floor, making 9 of 13 shots to open the game, Michaeli had an early seven off the bench as the Buffaloes led 22-9 at 11:44. The Buffaloes had seven assists on their first nine field goals, with five of them coming from Barrington Hargress, who would finish with eight assists, along with seven points and three steals.

Colorado's biggest struggle came with some foul trouble and at the line as well. Malone picked up this third foul midway through the first half. Colorado was able to get to the line, but made just 10 of their first 16.

Washington shot just 28 percent in the first half but stayed relatively close thanks to its success at the foul line, making all 11 of its shots. Two Wesley Yates free throws and a JJ Mandaquit floater cut Colorado's lead to 12 at 42-30, but the Buffaloes ended the half on a 5-0 run, with three free throws and a **Jalim Holland** layup that matched the biggest lead at the break at 47-30.

**BOULDER** — A 16-0 Colorado run spanning more than seven minutes in the second half enabled the Buffaloes to fend off a feisty California Baptist squad 78-70 Monday night at the CU Events Center.

In the only Division I match-up of the day between undefeated teams, the Buffs were the ones able to improve to 8-0 on the season, hitting that mark for the first time in 76 years since the 1949-50 season. The Lancers fell to 7-1 on the season.

"They're a well coached team," CU coach **Tad Boyle** said. "Obviously, they're 7-0 coming in here, just like we were. We were lucky to get out there with a win, we were not ready to play from the get go, for whatever reason. I knew how good they were, Coach (Danny) Manning did the scout, he knew how good they were, but I don't think our players, for some reason, were ready to play."

**Isaiah Johnson** led the way offensively for the Buffs with 17 points, regularly getting to the free throw line where he hit 9-of-11 from the stripe. Four Buffs hit double figures with **Sebastian Rancic** and **Barrington Hargress** both scoring 12 points and **Alon Michaeli** 11. Defensively, CU was paced by **Bangot Dak**, who struggled at first offensively but had eight rebounds and a pair of blocks.

The Buffs, averaging over 90 points per game, managed to hit the 78-point mark despite scoring just nine points in the first 12 minutes of the game. CBU built a 14-point first half lead before CBU cut it to just two at the half, 34-32.

"I don't know how, I'll have to watch it, but I don't know how we were down two at halftime," Boyle said. "I felt like we should've been down 20 if we play like that." Even after CU's 16-0 run opened up a 12-point lead with 5 minutes to play, Cal Baptist would not get away, as they quickly cut the lead to five points less than a minute later, 64-59. The Lancers' Dominique Daniels Jr. wouldn't go out without a fight, as he hit a 3-pointer with 2:11 left and a layup with 1:22 left to make it a four point game with just over a minute left before CU was able to hit all six of its free throws in the final 31 seconds of the game to hold on to the win.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** The Buffs scored the first bucket of the game with an **Elijah Malone** layup just 19 seconds into play, but the Buffs only managed a free throw in the next 4:41 as Cal Baptist went on a 10-1 run and extended that run to 19-5 over a nine minute stretch. The Buffs were well below their average of 90 points a game, managing just nine points in the first 12 minutes of the game.

Hargress finally put a spark of energy into the CU offense, hitting two free throws and a jumper before the under-8 minute timeout after CBU built its biggest lead of 14 at 23-9. Hargress layup started a 7-0 run that included four points from Johnson in that run.

Rancic broke the Buffs scoring lull from deep, hitting the first 3-pointer of the night to bring CU with eight at 28-20 and forcing CBU to call a timeout, which was the final media break of the first half.

CU had three mini 5-0 runs over the final five minutes of the half, outscore CBU 15-6 in that span. Michaeli and **Josiah Sanders** joined Rancic from deep and a nifty Johnson layup tied the game at 32-32 with a minute left in the half. CBU hit a bucket just before the half to take a 34-32 lead into the locker room.

The second half opened a bit sloppy for both teams, and after CBU opened up a seven point lead at 41-34, Michaeli had a nice move in the post for a bucket and then Rancic's second 3-pointer brought the Buffs back with in two at 41-39 at the first media timeout.

After a CU foul was called a flagrant, CBU put up four quick points to open up a 45-39 lead. CU again chipped away with Hargress hitting a jumper from the middle of the lane and Johnson hit a layup before Michaeli hit his second 3-pointer of the game to tie it up at 48-48.

The Buffs finally took their first lead since that 2-0 lead in the opening seconds when Hargress hit a driving layup to make it 53-52 at the midpoint of the second half. Rancic hit two free throws and then a Dak block led to another Hargress fast break layup as CU pushed its run to 11-0 to take a 59-52 advantage into the under 8 media timeout.

When Dak hit a 3-pointer with 5:12 left in the game, it extended that run to 16-0. The run was more of a defensive effort than offensive, as that Dak block also was the first field goal for the Buffs in over four minutes. CU held the Lancers scoreless for more than seven minutes in that run.

CU never gave up, however, and after it broke that seven-minute scoreless stretch, rebounded off seven quick points to bring the game back within five at 64-59. A Malone tip-in with 3:40 gave CU a 66-59 lead at the final media timeout.

After Daniels hit two free throws, CBU had a mini 4-0 run to build the lead back to nine at 70-61. Daniels wouldn't go away, however, and he hit a 3-pointer with 2:11 left and another layup at 1:22 to bring the Lancers within four at 70-66.

**Felix Kossaras** hit a tough turnaround jumper with 46 seconds left and Dak got a steal on the other end of the floor to ice the game. CBU was forced to foul and the Buffs hit 6-of-6 from the line in the last 31 seconds to hold on.

**BOULDER** – Colorado used a big second-half run to post an 88-64 win over UTSA Saturday afternoon at the CU Events Center.

Rebounding from last week's loss to Colorado State, Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 9-1 overall — 7-0 at home — while the Roadrunners dropped to 4-6.

After a close first half, Colorado figured it out in the second, behind senior guard **Barrington Hargress**, who scored 10 of his season-high 23 points in the final 20 minutes. Two other Buffs reached double figures with **Sebastian Rancik** adding 15 points and **Bangot Dak** scoring 10 of his own.

"Just the aggression, and then our teammates were being very open with one more [pass] so it was big," Hargress said on his big scoring game. "Teams have played me a little bit loose from three lately, so I wanted to be aggressive, and I feel like I've been shooting it well in practice. So I was aggressive today."

Colorado used an extended 17-3 run to take control of the game in the second half. A Josiah Sanders fastbreak layup at the 12:39 mark pushed the Buffs' lead to 61-42, and the Roadrunners never cut the deficit below 15 again.

The Buffs controlled the game inside and on the break, outscoring UTSA 42-28 on points in the paint and 23-5 on fastbreak points. They also outrebounded the Roadrunners 48-34.

"We were plus (12) on the glass," Boyle said. "We held them under 40% from the field, those are two important numbers for us. We got like 50% of our misses in offensive rebounds. I know in the first half we had 11 offensive rebounds and only four second chance points. I think we only had eight, but we got 50% of our rebounds, which means we got more possessions. That's a good thing, so we have to do a better job of finishing when we get offensive rebounds, whether that's going back up with it or kicking it out for a three, because that's the best time to get a three. So we'll figure that out as we watch the film, but overall, I was really on our guys about not offensive rebounding against Colorado State. We were much better tonight."

Defensively, Colorado improved drastically from its previous outing against Colorado State, holding UTSA to 39.1% shooting on 25-of-64 shots and 33.3% from deep while forcing 16 turnovers, 10 of which came in the first half.

Jamir Simpson led the way for UTSA with 19 points, six rebounds, and five assists.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado opened with multiple different players scoring, with an and-1 by Rancik, a layup by **Elijah Malone**, and a 3-pointer by Hargress to take an early 9-7 lead over UTSA.

After a couple of minutes with both teams struggling to score, Dak got the Buffs back on the board with a long 2-point jump shot, followed by a thunderous and-1 dunk of the assist by **Alon Michaeli**.

The Roadrunners kept pushing for the lead, but three straight 3-pointers from **Felix Kossaras** and two from Hargress extended the Buffs' lead to 26-21 with 5:56 left in the first half.

Turnovers kept the game close as the half came to a close, but four points, including an and-1 by **Isaiiah Johnson** and another jump shot by Hargress, gave Colorado a 35-32 lead at halftime.

The Buffs led for 14 minutes in the first half thanks to 11 points off three 3-pointers from Hargress, but committed seven turnovers and shot just 34% on 11-of-32 from the field.

Defensively, Colorado created 10 turnovers in the opening 20 minutes to hold UTSA to 32 points. All but two players who saw the court in the first half for the Roadrunners committed a turnover.

Hargress continued his hot shooting, scoring eight points in the first four minutes of the second, including two more 3-pointers; his total of five on the day tying a career-high going back to his time at UC Riverside.

The defense continued to ramp up, leading to a 13-2 run that included points from five different Buffs, while holding the Roadrunners to just 33% shooting in the first six minutes of the second half, pushing the lead to 57-41.

CU used the paint to continue extending the lead with 18 straight points coming inside.

UTSA never mounted anything resembling a threat for the rest of the game as the Buffs kept their lead above at least 19 points for the remainder of the contest.

**BOULDER** — Colorado freshman **Isaiiah Johnson** scored 20 points off the bench and helped spur a late 11-2 run that lifted the Buffaloes to a hard-fought 84-73 win over Portland State Wednesday evening at the CU Events Center.

Due to high winds, power outages throughout Boulder and the surrounding area, as well as potentially hazardous road conditions, the decision was made by CU Athletics and the CU Division of Public Safety to play tonight's game without fans. The announced attendance of 101 fans consisted of family and friends of players from both teams.

"Kind of a weird night tonight for the Buffaloes," CU Coach **Tad Boyle** said. "It took me back a few years ago when we played in this building with hardly anyone here — except there weren't even as many fans as there were tonight. It was basically just some employees and family friends."

"It was a good win in a very unique environment, more like a scrimmage than a basketball game. But we beat a good team — that's a good basketball team we beat — so you've got to take that, be proud of it, and move on."

**Bangot Dak** had a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds and **Alon Michaeli** was one point shy with nine points and 10 rebounds of his own. **Barrington Hargress** scored 15 points and **Sebastian Rancik** 12 to hit double figures. Seven Buffs had seven or more points with **Josiah Sanders** scoring nine points and **Felix Kossaras** seven.

Hargress dished out six assists and Rancik led the defensive effort with four steals. Hargress and Johnson both added three steals and Dak led the team with two blocked shots.

Colorado trailed the first 12 minutes of the game and, except for a 17-second span late in the first half, never trailed after that point, but were also unable to build a double-digit lead until the final minutes of the game. The majority of the second half was played with CU holding a two-to-five-point advantage.

"We finally got some stops strung together down the stretch, and that allowed us to take it from two or three points to eight or 10, and then we were able to hold them off," Boyle said.

The Vikings were led by Jaylin Henderson and Terri Miller Jr., who scored 23 and 16 points, respectively, and at one point in the second half scored 18 of 20 of the Vikings points to keep them in the game.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** The game was a back-and-forth affair most of the first half. The Vikings were up for the first 12 minutes of the game, opening up a big lead of eight points after a 6-0 run pushed their lead to 14-6 after five-and-a-half minutes in.

CU slowly chipped away at that lead, pulling within two after a 7-1 CU run made it 15-13 in favor of the Vikings. Johnson had a plus-one at the 10:24 mark to bring CU within one at 19-18 before the Vikings rattled off two straight buckets to take a 23-18 lead with 8:28 left in the half.

CU then had its big run of the half, a 10-0 run over the span of the next three-and-a-half minutes to take a 28-23 lead with 5 minutes left in the first half. The Vikings briefly took the lead back after a 5-0 run in the final three minutes of the half, going up 33-32 before CU scored five of the final seven points of the half to lead 37-35 at the break.

The two teams kept it close to open the second half, with CU opening a quick four point lead with a Dak bucket before the Vikings tied the game at 39-39 two minutes into the half. A Colorado 5-0 run keyed by a Rancik 3-pointer was pushed to a 9-2 run and seven point lead for the Buffs at 48-41 at the first media timeout of the second half.

The Vikings needed just over a minute to tie the game with a quick 7-0 run, knotting the game at 48-48 five minutes into the half. CU then had a pair of 4-0 runs over the next few minutes to build a 58-53 lead at the under 12 media timeout. Johnson hit 4-of-4 from the line and had a tough contested layup in that time frame.

Colorado maintained the lead the next several minutes, but were unable to push the lead to greater than five points, which it did three more times, a Johnson 3-pointer giving CU a 63-58 lead, a Sanders layup making it 67-62 in favor of the Buffs, and a Hargress layup giving CU a 69-64.

CU finally pushed the lead past two possessions with a 5-0 run to push the lead to 74-68 after a pair of Johnson free throws and Rancik layup just prior to the final media timeout of the game.

That run was extended to a 11-2 run after that timeout to give CU a 12-point lead at 80-68 with under two minutes left in the game. The Vikings made a quick 5-0 run but the Buffs hit all four free throws down the stretch to secure the 11 point win, 84-73.

**BOULDER** – Colorado's defense collapsed in the second half Sunday as the Buffaloes gave up 49 points after halftime, allowing Northern Colorado to take an 86-81 win at the CU Events Center in the final nonconference game of the season for both teams.

Tad Boyle's Buffs dropped their second straight game to fall to 10-3 while Northern Colorado improved to 10-3.

After starting the game ice cold on the offensive end, the Buffs, led by freshman guard **Isaiah Johnson's** 19 first-half points, kept the game close at the break, but the defense went away in the second half. The Bears shot 73.9% from the field after halftime, only missing six shots in the second half.

"In the first half we were 5 for 22 at the rim," Boyle said. "To get 22 shots at the rim in a half is really good. That means you're getting the ball inside. You're getting shots at the rim, that's what you want as a coach. Now when you don't finish those it's tough, and we didn't finish the ball well tonight, and that shows up in our field goal percentage. We shot 39% from the field. They shot 52%. I asked myself, 'How's it a five point game?' I feel like we should have lost by 25 with those numbers, but they shot 73.9% in the second half. You ain't beating anybody doing that."

Colorado still had a chance to force overtime, trailing by three points with 23 seconds left. The Buffs got two looks from deep by **Sebastian Rancic**, followed by Johnson, but both shots drew iron; the Bears rebounded and hit two more free throws to finish the scoring.

Johnson finished the game as the Buffs' leading scorer with a career-high 25 points and added eight rebounds. Three other players reached double figures with 18 from **Barrington Hargress**, 16 from **Bangot Dak**, and 14 from **Rancic**.

Quinn Denker was the game's leading scorer with 33 points, eight rebounds, and eight assists, filling up the stat sheet. Coupled with the second half defensive struggles, UNC made 11 3-pointers on 52% from deep to only seven on 30% for the Buffs.

"We need to stick to our principles," Hargress said. "We're letting teams shoot 21 threes and hit 11. They hit 11 tonight. So we want to keep it to 6. Allowing teams too much freedom and not making their best players feel uncomfortable. 33 (Egan Shields) with six free throws, so I mean, he was getting to his spots whenever, we've got to be better with just being disruptive."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado's big men got started early with **Elijah Malone** getting a putback for the first basket of the game, followed by a 3-pointer by Dak. Northern Colorado countered with a 10-0 run to take a 12-5 lead early.

The offense continued to struggle, with Johnson and Dak being the only players to make a basket in 11 shots as a team. Johnson was the one to spark the Buffs' offense, making three straight shots, including an and-1, as well as an assist in transition, to cut the lead to 19-18.

Johnson continued his scorching start with a pull-up 3-pointer in transition to give him 14 points in the first half and tie the game at 30-30 with three minutes left. He added an and-1 and a layup through traffic at the end of the half to bring his total to 19 points and keep the Buffs close at 37-35.

Outside of Johnson, the offense struggled in the first half, going 6-31 from the field and 2-10 from deep. Defensively, the Buffs held the Bears in check, holding them to 38.9 percent from the field, but allowed them to shoot 50% from deep on 6-12 shooting.

Dak started the second half strong, putting up six points, including a fastbreak slam off the assist from Johnson, to get the crowd on its feet. Hargress continued the Colorado run with eight points of his own, including an and-1 and a 3-pointer to put the Buffs up 49-43.

Both teams started shooting the ball with success, pushing the score higher. Dak continued to be the scorer for Colorado, pushing his second-half total to 11 points after making another 3-pointer to tie the game at 66 with seven minutes left.

Following an 8-0 UNC run, Hargress finished two highly contested layups to cut the deficit to four points with four minutes remaining. A quick layup by Johnson and two free throws by Rancic out of the timeout tied the game at 76.

Down three with 23 seconds left, Colorado got two shots at the tie from Rancic and Johnson, but both came up short, giving the Bears an 86-81 victory.

**TEMPE, Ariz.** – Colorado's **Barrington Hargress** scored 17 points in the first half and **Isaiah Johnson** scored nine of the Buffaloes' final 13 points to secure CU's first Big 12 road win since rejoining the league last season.

Colorado snaps a two-game losing streak and improves to 11-3 on the season and opens 1-0 in the Big 12. ASU falls to 9-4 overall and 0-1 in league play. Colorado, in its 10th year ago in road league games, claims its first conference road win since taking its final two Pac-12 Conference games against the Oregon schools in the 2023-24 season. It's the Buffs' first win in a road conference opener since beating ASU back in the 2019-20 season.

"Shows they got grit, they got gumption, they got toughness," **Tad Boyle** said when asked about winning for the first time on the road. "I thought we made some really big plays down the stretch. Now we didn't make enough of them, you got to continue to learn, especially with a young team like this. You have to learn every single day in practice, you have to learn every single game."

Johnson led the Buffs in scoring with 19 points, hitting 7-of-8 from the line and two from behind the arc. **Sebastian Rancic** had a stellar game, as well, scoring 18 points, hitting 12-of-14 from the line, including the final two to ice the game. Hargress' 17 points in the first half allowed the Buffs to take a 48-38 lead into the break.

All nine Buffs that played scored four or more points, with **Jalim Holland** scoring seven, **Felix Kossaras**, **Elijah Malone** and **Alon Michaeli** six apiece and **Josiah Sanders** rounded it out with four points.

Dak added 10 rebounds for his third career double-double, and Sanders led the way with five assists in the game. Sanders and Johnson each had two steals, Johnson's second one key in the final minute of the game, and Rancic added six rebounds and led the way with two blocks.

In a physical game that saw 49 fouls called between the two teams, the Buffs used a 13-3 run mid way through the first half to turn a tied game (14-14) into a 27-17 lead. The Buffs held that lead in double figures into the second half before ASU began to chip away, briefly taking two leads late in the game before Johnson had his late flurry of points to allow the Buffs to hang on for the victory.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Both teams got off to a cold start with just six points scored the first four minutes of game action before the first media timeout. Malone got the Buffs on the board first just over a minute into the game and after a quick ASU bucket, Hargress hit a jumper in the paint and then the game was scoreless for the next two-and-a-half minutes with the Buffs holding the early 4-2 lead.

The next four minutes was a different story, with CU outscoring ASU 15-12 to take a 19-14 lead. ASU came out of the previous timeout with a quick 5-0 run that was quickly answered by a CU 5-0 run when Rancic was fouled on a 3-pointer and hit all three freebies and then Hargress got a layup. The two then traded the lead the next five possessions as Hargress stayed hot, hitting a jumper and then 3-pointer on consecutive free possessions. Holland then hit a three and Dak had a last break on another CU 5-0 run to take the 19-14 lead at the 12-minute mark of the first half.

The Buffs extended that run to 7-0 after Johnson quickly hit a layup after that timeout. ASU just managed one 3-pointer the next four minutes and Hargress hit double figures with another layup at about the 3-minute mark of the first half and a Sanders layup extended the Buffs lead to eight points at 25-17 prior to the under-8 media timeout.

The last five minutes of the first half took a long time, with both a flagrant and technical foul called on the Buffs, and those four free throws were the difference in the scoring over that time frame. Malone hit two field goals on back-to-back possessions, Hargress had a contested layup and Michaeli hit two free throws. Kossaras hit a 3-pointer with 34 seconds left and Hargress a layup at the first-half buzzer to keep the Buffs lead in double figures, 48-38, at the break, giving him 17 points in the first half.

The Sun Devils came out hot in the second half and quickly cut CU's lead to six points at 50-44 before Dak went on a 7-2 run by himself and pushed the lead back to 11 at 57-46. But by the time the first media timeout had been called, ASU went on a 6-0 run to cut that lead back down to five points at 57-52.

ASU extended that run to 6-0 and cut the lead to 57-54 before the Buffs responded with a Holland jumper. Rancic got an and-one to push the CU lead back to eight almost exactly one minute later at the 13-minute mark and Johnson hit a layup. ASU responded to that 5-0 run to cut the lead to six points, 64-58, at the under-12 media timeout.

The Sun Devils took their first lead since 12-11 heading into the final media timeout at 81-80 by extended its run to 10-0 over a stretch of three minutes of game action. Rancic was fouled going into that break, and he hit both free throws coming out to give CU a 82-81 lead.

Johnson was fouled and hit both free throws to put CU back up two possessions at 82-89. On the next possession, Kossaras blocked a huge 3-pointer from ASU with 10 seconds left and Rancic secured the rebound, was fouled and hit two free throws for the final score, Buffs win 95-89.

**BOULDER** – Colorado staged a furious second-half rally Saturday, but the Buffaloes came up just short against No. 14 ranked Texas Tech, dropping a 73-71 decision at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 12-4 and 2-1 in the Big 12, and the Red Raiders improved to 12-4, 2-1.

After trailing by as much as 24 points early in the second half, the Buffs, sparked by a 20-3 run, rallied back. Down five, **Sebastian Rancic** hit a 3-pointer to cut the lead to two points. After getting a stop, Colorado had a chance to win the game on a **Barrington Hargress** 3-pointer, but the shot rimmed out.

Colorado was led by freshman **Isaiiah Johnson**, who scored all of his 21 points in the second half and shot 13-13 at the free-throw line. Hargress scored 17 points, and Rancic added 13 points and eight rebounds.

Texas Tech had four players in double figures, led by Donovan Atwell, who made five 3-pointers. JT Toppin filled the stat sheet with 16 points, 13 rebounds, and four assists. LeJuan Watts also had a double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

The stretch to end the first half and start the second led to a big deficit, but in the final 13 minutes of the game, Colorado outscored Texas Tech 36-15. In the first half, the Red Raiders made eight 3-pointers on 47.1%, but in the second half, they were held to 21.4% on three makes.

"We found out when we took our trip to Australia that we have a really competitive team that won't budge for anything," Boyle commented on the comeback. It took us a while to wake up, and the biggest thing we talked about after the game was that if we can be that competitive team you guys saw in the last six minutes of the game, we can play with anybody. So, that really has to be our consistent approach."

As has been a common problem so far this season, Texas Tech finished with 16 offensive rebounds and converted them into 10 second-chance points.

"This year's Achilles heel is our inability to finish possessions," Boyle said. "It's not about winning and losing to me, I told myself that I'm not going to let my emotional state be dictated by wins and losses. I'm going to let my emotional state be dictated by how our team is executing, how we are, how we execute, and every game plan is to finish possessions when we get our stops. You don't get an offensive rebound unless a shot goes up and doesn't go in. So when they shoot it and it goes in, that's a basket. There's no offensive rebound when they shoot it and miss it. Now there's either a defensive rebound or an offensive rebound. Our problem is too many offensive rebounds for the opponent, and it's happened all year."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado got off to a fast start, making its first three shots of the game, which included 3-pointers by Rancic and Hargress to take an early 10-4 lead. Hargress opened the game 3-3 from the floor with seven points in only four minutes of game time.

After building a lead as big as seven points, the Buffs' offense went into a lull and allowed Texas Tech to get back into the game and build a lead of its own with four 3-pointers in six scoring possessions to lead 27-20.

The Colorado offense continued to struggle, not making a field goal in the final four minutes of the first half. Coupled with the deep range success of the Red Raiders, the lead extended to 16 points after a last-second 3-pointer by Anderson.

Offensively, the Buffs started strong, making eight of their first 14 shots, but then went ice cold, making only two of their final 15 in the first half. From behind the arc after knocking down the first two, he missed the next eight.

On the flip side, Texas Tech finished the half, making seven of its last 12 3-point attempts, shooting 47.1% overall in the first half, as well as outscoring Colorado 16-10 on points in the paint.

The second half began much as the first half ended. Colorado's offense struggled to gain rhythm. The Red Raiders' offense started slowly but picked up steam, reaching as much as a 24-point lead.

Colorado responded, ratcheting up defensive intensity and taking advantage of entering the bonus halfway through the second half. The Buffs started chipping away using a 16-3 run to cut the lead down to 11 points.

Johnson knocked down a 3-pointer, followed by a layup from **Alon Michaeli** to cut the lead to six points, a part of an extended 20-3 run by the Buffs.

Texas Tech responded with a five-point burst, but Colorado kept pace with a 3-pointer by Johnson and layups by Hargress and Michaeli. Following more back-and-forth play, the Buffs cut the lead to five points with 55.2 seconds remaining.

Following a Texas Tech turnover, Rancic hit a 3-pointer in the left corner out of the inbound to cut the lead to 73-71 with 42.3 seconds left.

After getting a stop, Colorado had a chance as time expired, but the 3-pointer by Hargress rimmed out, giving Texas Tech the win.

**CINCINNATI** – A slow start doomed Colorado Wednesday night against Cincinnati, as the Buffaloes fell to the Bearcats, 77-68, at Fifth Third Arena.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 12-5 and 2-2 in the Big 12 while the Bearcats improved to 9-8 and 1-3 in conference play.

The game mirrored the last outing against Texas Tech in Boulder. The Buffs got down big, this time as much as 21 early in the second half, and just like before, a furious run gave Colorado a chance.

Throughout the second half, Colorado chipped into the lead. Down 12 points with four minutes left, an 8-0 run cut the lead to four with 1:27 remaining. Cincinnati wouldn't make another basket, but hit nine free throws to ice the game and the fend off the Buffaloes' comeback attempt.

"Cincinnati was the tougher team tonight, and that was evident from the jump," Boyle said. "We wanted to really come out and be the ones to throw the first punch and get them on their heels, but they did to us, and we knew this was going to be a physical game. We knew they'd be aggressive. We lost this game in the first half, there's no doubt about it."

Freshman guard **Isaiiah Johnson** led the team in scoring with 18 points, 16 coming in the second half. **Bangot Dak** added 12 points and a team-leading seven rebounds and four assists, while **Barrington Hargress** contributed 14 points.

Cincinnati was led by Baba Miller, who finished with 25 points, 11 rebounds, four assists, and two blocks. Moustapha Thiam was the only other Bearcat in double figures and finished with 15 points to go along with two blocks and two steals.

Turnovers were the swing factor of the game. Colorado finished with 17 that led to 30 points for Cincinnati. That compares to only 10 turnovers that led to 18 points from the Bearcats.

"They're (Cincinnati's defense) in the ball, they're showing hard on ball screens, they weren't trapping, but they were getting their hands on passes," Boyle commented on the turnovers. "We were getting passes deflected that turned into steals, so it was just their pressure. We knew the pressure was coming. We talked about it. You have to attack pressure, and you have to attack it under control. That's how you end up with 17 turnovers, and they have 30 points off those, and that's the game. It's the points off turnovers. Their defense won the game, and our softness, which I've used that word, unfortunately, a lot with this team on offense, cost us the game."

The Buffs outshot the Bearcats from the 3-point line, making seven on 35 percent shooting compared to only three makes on 19 percent for Cincinnati. But the Bearcats made 24 free throws to only 11 for Colorado to make up for the margin.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado struggled to begin the game, turning the ball over on five of the first seven offensive possessions. On the other end, Cincinnati made its first five shots to take a 10-0 lead early.

Offensively, the Buffs started to take better care of the ball, but were still unable to score, missing six of their first seven shots, allowing the Bearcats to push their lead to as much as 17.

With the offensive struggles, the Buffs looked to freshman guard **Ian Inman** for a spark, and he delivered a 3-pointer and a pair of assists to cut the lead to 14 points.

At the end of the first half, the Buffs trailed 43-25. Colorado committed 10 turnovers in the first half that led to 19 points for Cincinnati. The Bearcats also had 20 points in the paint compared to only eight for Colorado.

The second half began better for Colorado. Five minutes in, Dak gave the Buffs a spark, which led to a 6-0 run, including baskets from him and **Josiah Sanders**, and a 3-pointer from Johnson, cutting the lead to 12 points with 13:34 remaining.

Colorado continued to cut into the Cincinnati lead, led by seven straight points from Johnson. That was coupled with a ramped-up defensive intensity, forcing misses on nine of the Bearcats' next 10 shots. The Buffs cut the lead to seven points for the first time since the opening minutes of the game.

After cutting the lead to five points on an **Alon Michaeli** layup, the Bearcats responded with two quick baskets to push the lead back to double digits.

The Buffs started to cut back into the lead at the free throw line, then forced a Bearcat turnover that led to a Hargress 3-pointer, cutting the lead to 68-64 with 1:22 remaining.

As was the case throughout most of the game, turnovers did the Buffs in, as well as strong free throw shooting from Cincinnati to close the game.

**BOULDER** — Colorado battled with No. 19 Kansas late into the night on Tuesday, but the Jayhawks outlasted the Buffaloes to the final whistle, 75-69, at the CU Events Center. The loss drops the Buffaloes to 12-7 overall and 2-4 in Big 12 play, while Kansas moves to 14-5 overall and 4-2 in conference play.

The late-night tipoff didn't dissuade fans from coming out on Tuesday. A season-high crowd of 8,356 stuck around well into the night. Colorado student tickets also sold out for the first time since hosting Colorado State last season (Dec. 7), and for the first time in a conference matchup since playing Arizona on Feb. 10, 2024.

"It meant a lot having the student body there," **Isaiah Johnson** said. "It helped us with our energy. It's great to see everybody come and support us; we need that every game."

Colorado was led by Johnson, continuing his standout freshman year with a game-high 19 points. Johnson has now led the Buffs in scoring nine times this season and continues to climb up the CU freshman scoring list. He became just the 14th KU rookie to score 300 points, jumping into 13th with 304 points.

**Barrington Hargress** and **Alon Michaeli** also hit double figures on the night. Hargress finished 6-for-15 from the field with 17 points, while Michaeli totaled 13 points on 5-of-12 shooting.

"Tough loss for the Buffaloes," head coach **Tad Boyle** noted. "Kansas was better tonight. Obviously, they out-rebounded us. I love the fight of our guys. I love the fight of this team, and we cannot lose that, and we will not lose that. You know, it starts with me, but I love our team, I love our guys, I love our fight. We're not catching many breaks, and that's just the way it is."

KU, playing without head coach Bill Self, who remained in Lawrence for health reasons, had four players score in double figures. Melvin Council Jr. led the way with 18 points, helping the Jayhawks outshoot the Buffs 46.2% to 35.7%.

Kansas won the battle on the boards, 45-33, but Colorado held the advantage on the offensive glass, 12-9, and second-chance points, 15-13. Colorado won the turnover advantage, forcing 12 KU mishaps and committing just three.

"You have got to build on the positive and to have three turnovers against a team like KU, which is a good defensive team," Boyle explained. "They were switching. They've got good guys that can guard the ball; they're good athletes. I mean, Melvin Council Jr. is a good defender. I think they have got multiple guys that can guard, and their bigs do a good job. And with Elijah out, they were able to switch a lot in the second half, and that was effective for them."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** The Buffs and Jayhawks played a nearly identical first half on the stat sheet, with Kansas claiming a slight 40-38 lead. Both sides shot over 40% from the field with each team hitting six 3-pointers in the half. Kansas' Tre White totaled 12 points, while Hargress matched his effort with 12 points on 3-of-5 shooting. Neither side turned the ball over, with KU forcing KU into three turnovers in the half, while committing just one.

Colorado put the first points on the board with Johnson converting from behind the arc on the Buffs' first shot of the night. The CU freshman scored the team's first five points, giving KU the early 5-4 advantage.

KU had a pair of 3-pointers fall from Darryn Peterson, snapping the Jayhawks' 0-for-4 shooting start. Melvin Council Jr. hit KU's third straight 3, extending the visitors' lead to 13-5 with 15:26 left to go in the half.

**Bangot Dak** scored four of the Buffs' following six points, including an emphatic dunk in front of two KU defenders to cut the lead to 15-12, forcing KU acting head coach Jeremy Case to take a timeout with 12:54 left in the half.

KU used a quick 5-0 run to gain its largest lead of the half, 28-20, but **Felix Kossaras** immediately answered back with a shot from long distance to get back within five, 28-23. KU's lead didn't hit more than six the rest of the half, with the Buffs closing to within one on four occasions.

Hargress scored CU's last four points, including flying to the rim from across the baseline for a last-second tip-in to beat the buzzer.

The Buffs were slow to start out of the break, hitting just 3-for-11 from the field in the opening eight minutes. Dak got the period started, tying the game at 40-40 on the opening possession, but CU followed with a 0-for-6 slump—but was able to keep pace with KU, keeping the two-point halftime deficit intact at 51-49 with 11:53 to play.

Kansas extended its lead to seven, 56-49, with 11:03 to play, but a 3-pointer from Johnson sparked him to five straight points to get the Buffs back within four, 58-54, with 9:00 on the clock.

The Buffs' offense kept scoring in bunches with Michaeli putting in five straight points to cut the Jayhawk lead to 60-59, but Kansas responded with four quick points from Council Jr., including a controversial steal on the CU inbound pass, to push the lead back to five, 64-59, with 4:58 on the clock.

Colorado's offense stalled down the stretch, suffering through a 0-for-10 shooting streak, and Kansas was able to take advantage, gaining its largest lead of the night, 71-60, by the 1:07 mark.

Kansas finished the half hitting 52.2% from the field (12-23), including hitting 6 of its last 8 shots in its momentum-shifting run.

Johnson led all players with 12 of his 19 points coming in the second half.

**BOULDER** — Colorado's defense struggled against UCF, allowing 15 3-pointers as the Buffaloes dropped a 95-86 decision Saturday afternoon at the CU Events Center. Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 12-8 overall and 2-5 in Big 12 play while the Knights improved to 15-4-3.

The Buffs trailed by as many as 15 points with 6:48 left in the game, and, as in the past few games, Colorado mounted a late rally but couldn't get closer than six points. UCF built its lead back up to double figures before a last-second basket cut the final difference to nine points.

"We want to take away three-point shooters," **Barrington Hargress** said. "Some of the shooters got off. No. 11, Carmelo (Pacheco) had three in the first half. So that's a shooter on our scout. So some of it was our defense, some of it was shots that we were willing to live with. But either way, you can't let a team hit 15 (3-pointers) on your home court."

Colorado had three 20-point scorers with Hargress, **Isaiah Johnson**, and **Sebastian Rancic** scoring 20 points. This was the first game with three 20-point scorers since February 9, 2014, against Washington. Bangot Dak added 11 points and nine rebounds.

Riley Kugel led the way for the Knights, scoring 22 points off six 3-pointers.

UCF shot over 60 percent from the field and from the 3-point line, both the highest marks allowed this season. The Knights finished with 15 makes from deep, which is the second most allowed this season.

"UCF played their tail off tonight," Boyle said. "We didn't do anything to slow them down or shut them down by any means. When the team comes in your building and shoots 61 percent and out rebounds you by nine and you miss 27 shots. We only had four offensive rebounds. So we have to get better."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Hargress jump-started Colorado, scoring eight points in the first four minutes of the game off two 3-pointers and a couple of free throws to put the Buffs up 12-7 early.

Behind an opportunistic defense and a continued offensive explosion by Hargress, Colorado's lead was pushed to eight points, led by 16 points from Hargress with eight minutes left in the first half.

The offense began to struggle controlling the ball, leading to turnovers that allowed UCF to get back into the game. The Knights used their 3-point stroke, making two in a row to cut the lead to one point.

Finishing the first half, the Buffs used **Jalin Holland** to get out in transition. He played 14 minutes in the first half, already more than in all but eight games this season, and scored six points.

"Jalin (Holland) has been great," Rancic commented. "He learned to embrace his role. He plays really hard in practice. He's just one of those guys that comes in every day and brings a lot of effort and energy into our practices and works hard. So I'm really happy for him that he's getting the time he deserves and the production that we all know in the locker room that he's capable of."

Down five points, Johnson knocked down a buzzer-beating 3-pointer as the time expired to cut the lead to 49-47.

Neither team excelled on the defensive side of the ball, with both shooting above 60 percent from the field and beyond the arc. Colorado used transition scoring to keep pace, outscoring UCF 9-0 on fast break points. UCF used the 3-point line, going 10-of-13 in the first half.

Hargress led the Buffs with 18 points in the first half, but picked up his third foul early in the second half, forcing him to the bench.

After an offensive masterclass in the first half, both teams struggled to begin the second half, shooting below 40 percent with 12 minutes left.

UCF found its footing first, returning to the 3-point line for success. After hitting four more, the lead ballooned to 13 points with 8:37 remaining.

As the Colorado offense hit its stride, making five straight shots, UCF kept pace scoring and keeping the lead in double figures.

After back-to-back 3-pointers from Holland and Johnson, cutting the lead to six, UCF had an inbound with 0.6 seconds left on the shot clock, and Kugel banked in a 3-pointer to go back up nine points. UCF controlled the game the rest of the way, winning 95-86.

"We hadn't seen that Colorado Buffaloes team in November, December or January, but we finally saw it on February 1," Boyle said. "I told our team, better late than never on that, but I was really, really proud of the response that we got from everybody involved tonight. And it just shows how good this team can be. But we have to play with that energy and that effort, that toughness, and we showed it tonight, and the results speak for themselves."

After an extended stretch of struggles, Boyle made a big change to the starting lineup. He featured four true freshmen, including three who made their first career starts in **Jalyn Holland**, **Fawaz "Tacko" Ifaola**, and **Josiah Sanders**.

The four freshmen who started, plus **Ian Inman** and **Alon Michaeli**, who came off the bench, combined for 43 points.

Five Buffs scored in double figures, with **Sebastian Rancik** leading the way with 17 points. **Isaiah Johnson** finished with 16, **Bangot Dak** had 14, Sanders set a new career-high with 12, and **Barrington Hargress** added 10 points.

Xavier Edmonds led TCU with 13 points and 12 rebounds before having to leave the game in the second half after a flagrant two foul.

The Buffs took a 13-point lead at the break off a strong first half. Colorado opened it up in the second half, pushing the lead to 20 points with 13 minutes remaining, and as much as 28 points. TCU never came closer than 23 in the last 10 minutes.

Colorado controlled the game defensively. TCU shot just 33.3 percent from the field and 21.7 percent from deep. There were six instances during the game when the Buffs forced TCU into four consecutive missed shots.

"It was just playing together, it wasn't one guy, it was all five who were on the court, and then energy from the bench as well," Sanders said on the defensive effort. "We've been talking about that a lot in practice, so it's really good just to come out here and see that we could really do that. We have to hold ourselves to that standard, and come out here and do that the next game, the next game, and the next game."

On the offensive end, Colorado tied its season-high with 24 assists on 35 made baskets. Four of the five starters finished with at least four assists, led by Sanders, who set a new career-high with six.

"We got back to playing good basketball," said Rancik on the high assist numbers. "(Previously) we were dribbling the ball too much and it's nice that we just played good basketball tonight."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** With the new starting lineup, the Buffs came out of the gates strong, with the opening 10 points coming from players making their first career starts. Holland had the opening five points with a driving layup and a left corner 3-pointer. Sanders followed that up with a right corner 3-pointer, and Ifaola got his on a layup with the dish coming from Holland to go up 10-7 with 15:21 left in the first half.

Colorado's hot shooting continued as the bench trickled in. Rancik and **Felix Kossaras** connected on 3-pointers of their own, as the Buffaloes made their first four from downtown. After forcing TCU into six straight missed shots on the defensive end, the Buffs added some scoring to extend the lead to 30-21, with a Sanders fast break and-1 to cap it off.

The defensive intensity continued, as TCU made only three of its last 19 shots of the first half, including a stretch of over seven minutes without scoring.

A putback by Dak gave Colorado a 38-25 lead at the half. This is the first time leading at the end of the first half since playing Utah at home on Jan. 7.

Defense was the story of the first half. Colorado held TCU to 32.1 percent (9-of-32) from the floor and 18.2 percent (2-of-11) from 3-point range with seven turnovers forced. On the other end of the court, the Buffs outscored the Horned Frogs 20-10 on points in the paint and had seven second-chance points off five offensive rebounds.

After struggling to shoot the ball in the first half, Johnson and Hargress scored eight quick points before Johnson threw an alley-oop to Dak to give the Buffs a 17-point lead.

As the Buffs looked to extend their lead, TCU lost its most productive player in Edmonds after a flagrant two foul.

Colorado continued to push its lead, taking scoring contributions from everyone in the lineup. The lead grew to 28 points after Johnson hit his third 3-pointer of the game.

**WACO, Texas** – Colorado had no answer for Baylor on either side of the ball, dropping an 86-67 decision Wednesday night at Foster Pavilion.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 13-10 and 3-7 in the Big 12, while the Bears improved to 13-9 and 3-7 in the Big 12.

"I thought in the first half, our youth really showed in terms of letting our frustrations on offense bleed over into defense and that can't happen, not on the road," Boyle commented. "We're going to struggle at times on offense, and we did tonight. We miss shots at the rim that we normally finish. Missed some free throws, just little things like that that we just didn't quite have it."

**Jalyn Holland** led the team in scoring and had a new career-high 12 points. Three other Buffs scored in double figures, with **Barrington Hargress** scoring 11 and **Isaiah Johnson** adding 10 points. Freshman **Ian Inman** also got into double figures for the first time with 10.

They only played seven players for most of the night and was led by freshman Tounde Yessoufou, who ended with 27 points and seven rebounds.

"They like to play through him in the post," Boyle said. "He's big, he's strong, he's athletic, and he can get his own shot. He was a man amongst boys tonight."

Baylor's defense caused problems throughout the whole game for CU. The Buffs finished with 10 turnovers, with nine in the first half. As a team, the Buffs shot 40.0 percent from the field only after making eight of the last 11 shots of the night.

Colorado trailed by nine points with 7:53 remaining in the first half after holding Baylor in check offensively, but a 22-7 run to end the half gave the Bears a 24-point halftime lead that they would never relinquish.

Early in the second half, the Buffs found some success, forcing turnovers and making shots on the other end, but could never string together enough stops to cut the lead below 19 points.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Starting with the same lineup as the previous game, Colorado forced Baylor into tough shots, but on the other end, turned the ball over three times in the first four minutes and struggled to get shots on the rim.

Baylor found some offensive success while Colorado struggled to find good shots, allowing the Bears to go on an 11-2 run to push the lead to double digits at 16-6.

After making only one of their last 11 shots, Johnson took the lid off the basket with an off-the-dribble 3-pointer at the top of the key, followed by a Hargress mid-range jumper to cut the Baylor lead to 23-14.

Defensively, the Buffs found success, but turnovers on offense allowed Baylor to push the lead to 14 and keep Colorado off the board.

A 19-7 run late for the Bears pushed the halftime lead to 45-21 after hitting more 3-pointers late in the half.

Turnovers plagued the Buffs throughout the first half, leading to nine turnovers that resulted in 13 points for Baylor. On defense, the Buffs held the Bears to 2-of-7 from 3-point range to start the game, but they ended the half 7-of-15.

Cameron Carr, Baylor's leading scorer on the season, opened the game missing his first four shots, but made three of his last four, including a deep 3-pointer, to tally 10 points in the first half. Three Bears scored in double figures.

A sloppy start to the second half from both teams favored the Buffs after forcing four early Baylor turnovers that ended in five points for Holland.

Colorado continued to have some offensive success early in the second half, but Baylor found its footing to keep pace with the Buffs, still leading 62-38 with 11:58 left in the game.

Baylor then built its lead to as much as 30, and the Buffs never threatened to close the gap. Late shot making by the Buffs, particularly Inman, cut the final deficit to 86-67.

**LUBBOCK, Texas** – Colorado couldn't overcome poor shooting, falling to No. 16 Texas Tech 78-44 Wednesday night at the United Supermarkets Arena.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fall to 14-11 overall and 4-8 in the Big 12. The Red Raiders improved to 18-6 overall and 8-3 in the Big 12.

"Texas Tech has a motto with their program, that the toughest team wins," Boyle said. "There wasn't any question who the tougher team was tonight, and that was that was Texas Tech, and we weren't."

The Buffs trailed by as much as 16 early in the first half before narrowing the deficit to eight after Ian Inman exploded for 12 points. But the Red Raiders pushed their lead over 20 points early in the second half, and Colorado never had another answer, as CU struggled to rebound the basketball.

Freshman Isaiah Johnson led Colorado in scoring with 13 points. Fellow freshman Inman set a new career-high with 12 points, all in the first half. He scored all his points on four 3-pointers, also a new career-high.

Donovan Atwell led the Red Raiders with 20 points and made six 3-pointers. JT Toppin scored 16 points and recorded 18 rebounds.

CU shot 29 percent from the floor (16-for-55), including 6-for-25 from 3-point range. The Red Raiders shot 45 percent (28-for-62) and outrebanded the Buffs, 47-30, including a 21-0 edge in second-chance points.

"It was 13 to zero at halftime on second-chance points, 13 to zero," Boyle commented. "When you can't make a shot, maybe you can get an offensive rebound and get a put back. But we're not tough enough to do that and Texas Tech is."

Texas Tech also had a 24-14 edge in points in the paint, and the Buffs were blocked nine times.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** The game began at a furious pace with both teams committing three turnovers in the first five minutes. Texas Tech was able to convert five second-chance points along with two 3-pointers to give the Red Raiders an early 10-4 lead.

After five missed shots by the Buffs, Jalin Holland came in and scored a tough layup to stop the scoring drought. Texas Tech responded with a layup from Christian Anderson to go back up 14-6 with 11:32 left in the first half.

Offensively, the Buffs struggled, going down by as much as 16 points after another stretch of five straight missed shots. That changed after Inman checked into the game and knocked down two straight 3-pointers, followed by a Johnson layup to cut the Red Raider lead to 27-16 with 3:56 left in the first half.

Inman kept his hot shooting going, hitting on two more 3-pointers, but Texas Tech kept pace and extended the lead to 39-22 at halftime.

Texas Tech controlled the first half, turning nine offensive rebounds into 13 points compared to seven offensive rebounds for the Buffs that did not amount to any points. The Red Raiders blocked six shots and made eight 3-pointers in the first half.

Colorado stayed in the game early thanks to the four 3-pointers from Inman, who scored 12 of the 22 points for the Buffs. Turnovers were how the Buffs stopped the Red Raiders, as they forced eight turnovers and converted them into 10 points.

The second half began with Texas Tech going on an 11-1 run to push the lead to 27 with 16 minutes remaining.

The Buffs found some success on offense, making four straight shots at the rim to cut the lead to 20 points, but Texas Tech responded, taking advantage of second-chance points to go up 58-34 with 11 minutes remaining.

Texas Tech extended its lead to 30 points with 4:44 left in the game, and the Buffs never threatened again as the final score finished 78-44.

**PROVO, Utah** – Colorado pushed No. 22 BYU Saturday afternoon, forcing overtime, but the Buffaloes came up short in the extra period, falling 90-86 at the Marriott Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 14-11 and 4-9 in the Big 12. The 22nd-ranked Cougars improved to 19-6 and 7-5 in the Big 12.

After a big shot from freshman Isaiah Johnson to end the first half down five, the Buffs came up and used a 13-0 run in the second half to get out to a six-point lead. After surviving multiple BYU runs, the Buffs were down 78-74. Colorado scored the final two baskets of regulation, the last of which was a layup by Johnson to send the game to overtime.

In overtime, the Buffs struggled to shoot, going 2-for-10. Despite the offensive struggles, they had the ball down three points with a minute remaining. They found three open looks from deep, but couldn't capitalize, sending the game to the free-throw line, where the Cougars iced the game.

Johnson led the Buffs in scoring, setting a new career-high 27 points with 16 coming in the second half and overtime. Barrington Hargress finished with 20 points, and Bangot Dak recorded 15 points and seven rebounds. Sebastian Rancic filled up the stat sheet with nine points, 10 rebounds, and a career-high six assists.

BYU was led by Robert Wright III, who scored a career high 39 points while going 4-of-4 from deep and 11-of-13 from the line. Freshman phenom AJ Dybantsa filled up the stat sheet but struggled from shooting from the field. He ended with 20 points but went 6-of-20 overall, 1-of-8 from downtown, and committed seven turnovers. He added 13 rebounds, eight assists, and three steals.

Coming off Wednesday's 34-point loss at Texas Tech, Colorado responded against one of the best teams in the country.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Both teams opened up the game struggling to find a rhythm on offense. Colorado had a layup from Johnson and a putback by Dak, but missed four straight shots. BYU only made two shots as well, but hit on a 3-pointer to go up 7-4 with 15:45 left in the first half.

After a slow start from both teams, the lid came off the baskets, especially from deep. On six straight possessions between both teams, 3-pointers were made on all but one play, which was an and-1. Hargress and Johnson each knocked down one from beyond the arc, with Hargress also getting the layup for the and-1, but did not make the free throw. After the final 3-pointer from BYU, the Cougars led 18-14 with 11 minutes left in the opening half.

Colorado took the lead after a four-point burst from Jalin Holland and a mid-range jumper from Hargress to put the Buffs up 21-18.

BYU responded with a 15-6 run with three more 3-pointers to take a 33-27 lead with 3:40 left in the first half.

As the first half was coming to a close, Johnson hit a step-back 3-pointer on the right wing to go into halftime down five, 37-32.

Colorado bothered BYU, forcing seven turnovers in the first half, with Dybantsa committing four. The Cougars used their 3-point shooting to stay ahead, making seven of their first eight from beyond the arc, but finished the half 7-of-11.

The Buffs shot 14-of-34 from the field and 3-of-11 from deep, but took care of the ball, only committing three turnovers. Of the five offensive rebounds for BYU, they only converted two into second-chance points.

The second half started, and it was all CU. The Buffs went on a 13-0 run after two BYU free throws to start the half. Dak scored seven straight before a Hargress transition layup gave Colorado its largest lead of the game, 45-39, with 15:20 left in the game.

BYU made a run to tie the game at 45, but Hargress pushed the lead back with two straight 3-pointers to grow the lead up to 51-45.

After six straight from the Cougars to tie the game up, the score stayed at one score four over four minutes before BYU's 12th 3-pointer of the game and the third for Wright to go up 65-60 with eight minutes left.

Down the stretch of the game, both teams went back-and-forth scoring, with Hargress and Johnson carrying the load for Colorado and Wright for BYU. The CU duo scored seven straight for the Buffs while Wright put in eight of the last 11 points for the Cougars to take a 76-71 lead with 3:16 left in the game.

Colorado cut the lead to two points twice and took a timeout with 25 seconds left, trailing 78-76 after two straight stops on defense. Johnson took the inbound pass, drove past Dybantsa, and put it in over the BYU shot blocker.






