2007 DARTMOUTH FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

When Buddy Teevens returned to Dartmouth two years ago, he was honest about the extent of the task he faced. Rebuilding a proud Big Green program that hadn't enjoyed a winning season since 1997, he said, was going to take time.

After back-to-back 2-8 seasons, Teevens is confident that three recruiting classes, hard work in the weight room and two full years in his system will be reflected in the 2007 campaign.

An area-by-area look at the Big Green heading into the 2007 spring drills (*with players listed according to their year in the fall*):

OFFENSE

Offensive Line

Buddy Teevens: "This has been a concern since our arrival. We are more seasoned at this point. We have guys who understand systemically what we are doing. We've added depth. The key thing is having young, inexperienced guys stepping up and performing at a high level."

Seniors Jared Dowdakin (6-2, 295), Taylor Layman (6-1, 280) and Ben Goeke (6-4, 311) are returning starters up front with the ability to play different positions. Classmate Tim Wheeler (6-4, 325) also has seen starting time.

The line graduated a pair of starters in left tackle Preston Copley and center Mike Shannon. Wheeler and junior Alex Rapp (6-5, 265) are probably the leading candidates to replace Copley at the critical left tackle spot heading into camp. Dowdakin, Layman and Wheeler all have experience snapping the ball and might get a look at stepping in for Shannon at center.

Junior Eddie Tabasky (6-3, 290) and sophomore Jon Summers (6-5, 300) are bigger linemen who saw action last year and will push for playing time as will sophomore Alex Stonehouse (6-2, 305). A wild card is junior Dustin Adkins (6-6, 302) who missed his entire freshman year and finally got on the field with the junior varsity midway through last season as a center.

Receivers/Tight Ends

Teevens: "We have good depth here. We are adding speed and will be working with a lot of height."

Dartmouth loses leading receiver Ryan Fuselier, a second team All-Ivy League choice, and steady Sam McDonald, but both starting tight ends, the wide receiver who led the Ivies in yards per catch and an intriguing corps of receivers all return. Seniors Mark Brogna (6-3, 250) and Brett Lowe (6-2, 225) have manned the tight end spot for two years. Brogna averaged a healthy 15 yards on his nine catches last year while Lowe had two touchdowns among his eight receptions. Add to the mix sophomore Carroll Papajohn (6-5, 235), who averaged a mind-boggling 28.6 yards per grab on 10 catches with the jayvee team last year. He also had three touchdowns.

Senior Brian Evans (6-1, 195) returns outside after using his sprinter's speed to lead the Ivies with 17.8 yards per catch on 22 grabs in 2006. Speedy Phil Galligan (5-11, 181) added 15 catches last fall. Senior Brendan Holm (6-5, 220) is a big target who will challenge for time if he stays healthy. Junior Eric Paul (6-4, 190) caught four balls and showed promise last year. Sophomore Ian Ferrell (6-5, 215) caught a team-high 13 passes with four touchdowns for the jayvees last fall while athletic classmate Jordan Kling (6-3, 205) pulled in 11 throws after making the transition from quarterback. Mix in a handful of other prospects and competition at the receiver slot figures to be intense.

Tailback/Fullback

Teevens: "We are almost morphing the tailback and fullback positions. We've got some guys who can do the job as a bigger back, but they can also load it up as a fullback. And they catch the football."

With the graduation of leading rusher/quarterback Mike Fritz and proven tailback Jason Bash, exactly who will top the Big Green in rushing next fall is an open question. Expected to get long looks at the hybrid tailback-fullback slot are sophomore Tom Brown (6-0, 220) and senior Julian Collins (6-0, 215). A bruising fullback, Brown opened eyes with his running ability with the jayvees last year, averaging 5.6 yards per carry, albeit in limited action. Collins, who moved over from linebacker and enjoyed his first healthy year last fall, had six carries in the varsity fullback rotation. Junior Hudson Smythe (6-3, 210), who had 231 yards on 70 carries in 2006 and classmate Nate Servis (5-10, 200), who came on strong late in the season, will be in the running for time as the big back while flashy junior Milan Williams (5-9, 175) and sophomores Rob Mitchelson (5-10, 190) and Chris Burns (5-9, 175) bring added quickness to the table. As there are at virtually all positions, a few wildcards like junior Cole Springer (6-3, 205) could surprise.

Quarterback

Teevens: "We believe the guys we have can run the offense we used a year ago although we always will play to the strength of the guy behind center. In terms of determining a depth chart at this point, none of them have any real experience so it's pretty much wide open."

Mike Fritz, who led Dartmouth in rushing and was second in the Ivy League in passing efficiency, is graduating, leaving a big hole. Taking the first snaps in spring -- based on seniority according to Teevens -- will be senior Tom Bennewitz (6-0, 192). Sophomores Max Heiges (6-3, 212) and Alex Jenny (5-11, 180) will both get a shot at winning the

starting job with the wildcard being Josh Cohen (6-4, 220) who threw for 1,529 yards as a freshman in 2005 after wresting the starting job from Charlie Rittgers. Cohen missed last season while he was out of school.

Bennewitz, an elusive runner with a good downfield touch, started last fall's opener at Colgate but was injured late in the contest and never regained the starting role after Fritz came on and played well. Bennewitz completed 14-of-24 passes for 102 yards in the Colgate game and one mop-up effort. Heiges and Jenny had similar stats with the junior varsity with Heiges completing 51 percent of his throws for 421 yards with four touchdowns while Jenny was hitting 56.9 percent of his attempts for 536 yards with four touchdowns.

DEFENSE

Defensive Line

Teevens: "We have more athleticism and depth and probably more speed, but the pass rush is still a concern."

Senior Dan Cook (6-2, 240) and Jack D'Angelo (6-4, 265) were listed as starters in the finale last year. The quick-footed Cook, who had 30 tackles last year, is back for a fifth season after losing one season to injury. D'Angelo, who had 23 tackles a year ago, is being listed inside as a defensive tackle in spring. Senior Matt Dratch (6-3, 245) and fifth-year senior Cullen Gilchrist (6-5, 260) will be in the defensive end rotation. Junior Rehan Muttalib (6-1, 245) and Malcolm Freberg (6-2, 215) also saw time outside last year where sophomore Marlon Alebiosu (6-1, 210) has the speed and motor to make things happen.

Inside, the starting duo of Brian Osimiri and Mike Rabil has graduated, but Rabil's season-ending injury gave junior Max Copello (6-1, 295) and freshman Kyle Brong (6-3, 280) the chance to get important experience last fall. Junior Rich Cummings (6-3, 260) also got some seasoning here a year ago.

Linebacker

Teevens: "We have experience and depth and have some good, young guys who will add to our depth."

Senior Justin Cottrell (6-0, 235) anchors arguably one of the deepest and strongest areas of the team. Cottrell led Dartmouth (and was fourth in the Ivies) last fall with 95 tackles while winning a spot on the All-Ivy honorable mention team. He also tied for the team lead with five passes defended. Although the graduation of Joe Gibalski and his 86 tackles will be felt, junior Andrew Dete (6-1, 220) is a two-year starter and senior Mike Whitticom (6-0, 230) is a seasoned player. Senior Joe Battaglia (6-1, 230) is another experienced linebacker ready to step right in. Sophomore Phil McKeating (6-2, 225) won plaudits for his toughness last year while classmate Zech Glaize (6-2, 205) brings an aggressive athleticism to the position.

Secondary

Teevens: "We're more experienced with more depth and competition. If you get bumped or bruised there's a guy who could step in."

The starting secondary from last fall returns in its entirety with a raft of young and talented players figuring to push the starters for time. Senior John Manning (5-10, 185) and fifth-year senior Chris Blanco (5-9, 170) are back at the corners with senior John Pircon (6-2, 205) returning at free safety and classmate Ian Wilson (6-0, 205) back at strong safety. Blanco had 35 tackles and Manning 34 last year, with each credited with four pass breakups. Pircon had 72 tackles and tied for the team lead with five breakups to make the All-Ivy honorable-mention team while the hard-hitting Wilson had 89 stops and three breakups while making the All-Ivy second team. Sophomores Muhammed Abdul-Shakoor (5-10, 175) and Niles Murphy (6-0, 175) will push for time at the corners after seeing some action last year. Depth and competition at safety will come from junior Kyle Cavanaugh (6-2, 186), a starter each of the last two seasons before being lost for injury in the early going, and junior converted quarterback Casey Frost (6-3, 215), a big hitter. Sophomore Pete Pidermann (6-0, 190), who can play the corner, and classmate Tony Pastoors (6-2, 190) will also bid for time at safety while sophomores Matt Dornak (5-11, 195) and James O'Brien (5-11, 185) can play either corner or safety.

Punter/Kicker

Teevens: "We need more consistency. We have shown the ability but we need to be able to count on them with regularity."

Junior Brian Scullin (6-5, 215) began to live up to his potential last fall when he averaged 35.4 yards per punt. He has the leg to lead the Ivy League in punting if he develops the consistency Teevens covets. Senior Andrew Kempler (5-10, 195) and junior Erik Estabrook (6-4, 195) split the kickoff duties last fall and Teevens hopes one will jump ahead and demonstrate the ability to get the ball deeper this year. Kempler was 16-for-17 on PATs and 7-for-13 on field goals with a long of 39 twice and will battle with Estabrook for the first line on the depth chart.

Returns

Teevens: "We're looking for more production this year."

Phil Galligan (5-11, 181) and Milan Williams (5-9, 175) shared kickoff and punt return duty last year and both are back. The Big Green was next-to-last in the Ivies in kickoff returns and last in punt returns a year ago.

BUDDY TEEVENS

ROBERT L. BLACKMAN HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Eugene F. (Buddy) Teevens III, who as a player led Dartmouth to the 1978 Ivy League championship and as a coach led Dartmouth football to back-to-back Ivy League titles in 1990 and 1991, returned as the head coach of the Big Green football program in 2005.

Teevens, 50, coached Dartmouth from 1987 through 1991. During his final two seasons, the Big Green posted identical overall records of 7-2-1. With a 6-1 record, Dartmouth shared the 1990 Ivy title with Cornell. In 1991, Dartmouth won the outright championship with a 6-0-1 mark. His overall record at Dartmouth is 30-38-2.

Teevens holds the Robert L. Blackman Endowed Coaching Position, named in memory of Bob Blackman, who coached Dartmouth from 1955 to 1970, and created through the gift of Henry M. (Hank) Paulson '68, an outstanding offensive tackle who played for Blackman from 1965-67.

In addition to restoring Dartmouth's rich football tradition, Teevens has been an integral force in a major series of improvements to Dartmouth's football facilities that are in progress, including installation of a FieldTurf surface on Memorial Field for the 2006 season, and a new varsity house that includes training, dressing and meeting facilities. This new building, scheduled for use in 2007, is part of a project that includes the refurbishment of the east grandstand at Memorial Field.

Teevens succeeded John Lyons at the helm of the Big Green and is the 21st coach in the program's 125-year history. Teevens was Dartmouth's 19th coach during his first tenure.

From 2002 through 2004, Teevens was the head coach at Stanford University. Prior to that, Teevens was on Steve Spurrier's staff at the University of Florida from 1998 to 2001. In 1999, Teevens was Florida's running backs coach. In 2000, he was the passing game coordinator while also coaching tight ends, wide receivers, kickers, snappers and holders. The following year, he was the assistant offensive coordinator and tight ends coach.

His first game with the Gators was the 1999 Orange Bowl. In his three full seasons at Florida, the Gators went 29-9, participated in three bowl games and finished among the top-12 in the final polls each season. In his final year in 2001, the Gators went 10-2, defeated Maryland in the Orange Bowl and finished ranked third in both national polls.

From 1997 to 1998, Teevens was the offensive coordinator and receivers coach at the University of Illinois under Ron Turner.

From 1992-96, Teevens was the head coach at Tulane University. He rebuilt that program and recruited most of the team that went 11-0 in 1998.

Teevens began his coaching career in 1979 as the running backs coach at DePauw University. In 1980, he became the offensive coordinator at Boston University and remained with the Terrier program until 1985 when he was appointed the head football coach at the University of Maine.

He led the Black Bears to a 6-5 record in 1985 and a 7-4 mark in 1986, the

program's first back-to-back winning seasons in 21 years.

In 17 years as a head coach, Teevens' record is 64-115-2.

At Dartmouth, Teevens was honored as the New England Coach of the Year for the 1991 season. The Big Green's Ivy title that year was the school's first outright championship since 1978.

Born October 1, 1956, Teevens earned an A.B. degree in history from Dartmouth in 1979. An honorable mention All-America quarterback in 1978, he led the Big Green to the Ivy title that year. He was named the Ivy League and ECAC player of the year and played in the Blue-Gray Classic. Co-captain of the 1978 team (6-3, 6-1 in Ivy games), Teevens was the squad's most valuable player. He also lettered in hockey, helping Dartmouth to a third-place finish at the 1979 NCAA championship. He was voted the Alfred W. Watson Trophy as Dartmouth's outstanding athlete.

The name Teevens is intertwined through Dartmouth athletic history. Buddy's father, the late Eugene F. Teevens II '52, was a hockey letterwinner. His younger brother, Shaun '82, was a two-sport athlete in football and hockey and also a recipient of the Watson Trophy. A sister, Moira '87, captained the women's cross country and track teams and earned All-Ivy and All-East recognition as a runner.

A native of Pembroke, Mass., Teevens and his wife, Kirsten, have two children, Lindsay, a student at the University of Florida, and Eugene IV, a student at Salisbury School.
