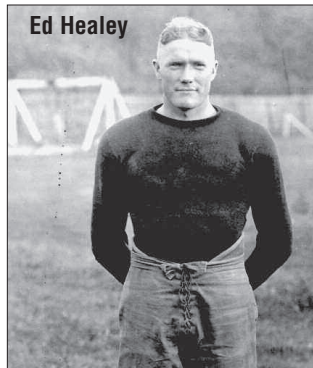
FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

Ed Healey

Clarence (Fat) Spears 1917 (1955) - All-America guard in 1914-15 and Dartmouth's head coach from 1917-20.

Edward Healey 1918 (1974) - A tackle at Dartmouth before and after World War I. He was the first player in pro football history to be sold, to the Chicago Bears for whom he played from 1922-27. Healey is also in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Andrew (Swede) Oberlander 1926 (1954) - All-America halfback and passer who led Dartmouth to the national championship in 1925.

Myles Lane 1928 (1970) - Dartmouth's all-time scoring leader (307 points from 1925-27). Lane is also enshrined in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame.

William (Air Mail) Morton 1932 (1972) - All-America quarterback in 1931. Also a two-time All-America in hockey.

Robert MacLeod 1939 (1977) - All-America halfback in 1938.

Murry Bowden 1971 (2003) - All-America defensive back in 1970.

Reggie Williams 1976 (2007) - All-America linebacker in 1975.

DARTMOUTH'S HALL OF FAME COACHES-ADMINISTRATORS

Edward K. Hall 1892 - (1951, charter inductee) - An end at Dartmouth in 1890-91 and coach at Illinois in 1892-93, he became a member of the Football Rules Committee in 1905 and wrote the first Football Code for players. He served as successor to Walter Camp as chairman of the Football Rules Committee from 1911-32.

Frank W. Cavanaugh 1899 - Coached Dartmouth to a 42-9-3 record from 1911-16. Also coached at Holy Cross, Boston College and Fordham.

D. O. (Tuss) McLaughry - Dartmouth's coach from 1941-42 and from 1945-54 (44-58-3). Also coached Brown from 1926-40 (76-58-5).

Earl H. Blaik - Dartmouth's coach from 1934-40 (45-15-4). Later coached at West Point.

Robert L. Blackman - Had three undefeated teams as Dartmouth's coach from 1955-70 (104-37-3). Later coached at Illinois and Cornell.

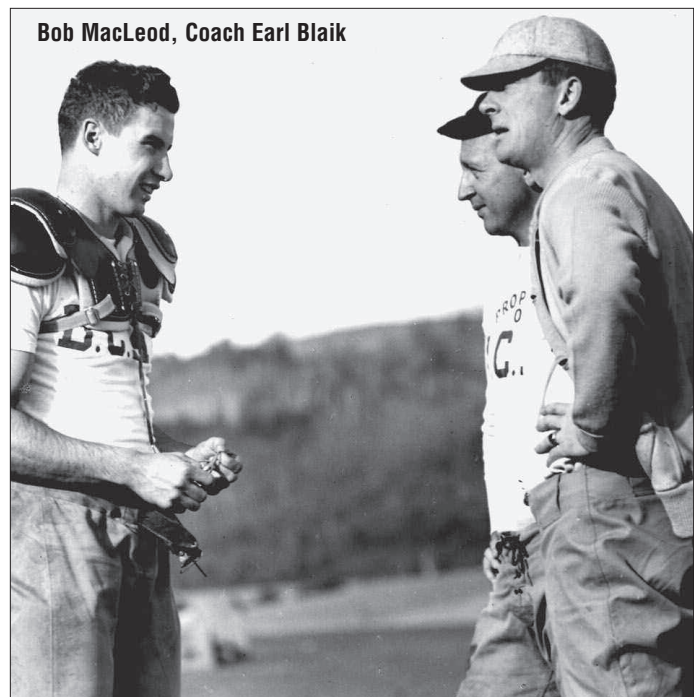

Murry Bowden's election to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003 recognizes his individual achievements on the gridiron but he's first to say, "...this recognition is really a tribute to our team and brings honor to Dartmouth and the Ivy League."

Bowden was co-captain and All-America rover back of Dartmouth's 1970 team that was undefeated Ivy League champion and shut out six of nine opponents. Dartmouth won the Lambert Trophy as the East's outstanding team. With Bowden in the lineup in 1969 and 1970, Dartmouth won 17 of 18 games.

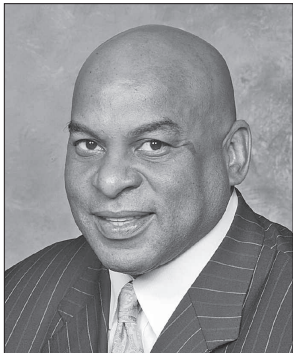

FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

REGGIE WILLIAMS '76: DARTMOUTH'S 2007 FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE



In 1975, Reggie Williams was recognized as the most conspicuous player in Dartmouth football annals since halfback Bob MacLeod was a consensus All-America in 1938.

In 2007, Williams's achievements on the college gridiron were crowned by the All-America linebacker's introduction with 11 other players and one coach from across the nation into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's Class of 2007. They were formally enshrined in the Hall of Fame

at South Bend, Ind., in July 2008.

He joins MacLeod and eleven other Dartmouth football players, coaches and administrators whose contributions, spanning more than a century, have been previously rewarded with college football's highest honor.

A three-time All-Ivy League first team selection from 1973-75, Williams's place among the greatest players in Ivy League history was reinforced by his subsequent 14-year career (1976-89) with the Cincinnati Bengals.

"Being selected for the College Football Hall of Fame is a great honor and a culminating moment for me, for Dartmouth College, and for the Ivy League," said Williams whose post-NFL career over the past 15 years has been devoted to developing sports programs and being a positive role model for boys and girls of all ages from across the nation.

In 1993, Williams joined the Walt Disney Company and championed Disney's involvement in sports, particularly amateur sports. He oversaw the creation of Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex, a state-of-the-art multi-sport complex that opened in 1997 in Lake Buena Vista, Fla. From 1998 until he retired in early 2008, Williams was vice president of Disney Sports Attractions that annually sees about 220,000 athletes of all ages utilize the nation's preeminent multi-sports complex for amateur and pro sports.

Growing up in Flint, Mich., Williams overcame a severe hearing disability and became an outstanding student-athlete at Southwestern High where his academic record drew the attention of Dartmouth's football coaching staff. He wanted to go to the University of Michigan but Coach Bo Schembechler felt he was too small (6-1, 215) to play football in the Big Ten.

He arrived at Dartmouth in the fall of 1972, uncertain of his place, academically or athletically. During his freshman year, those doubts were erased.

"(Head coach) Jake Crouthamel made the best personnel decision of my athletic career," said Williams, when Crouthamel immediately switched him from running back to linebacker. "Jake (and his staff) believed in my ability."

Williams broke into the varsity lineup as a sophomore in 1973, helping Dartmouth win its fifth straight Ivy League title. For three seasons he became the Ivy League's most dominant defensive player, using his speed and intelligence to cover the field from sideline to sideline. His career total of 243 unassisted tackles remains a Dartmouth record and his 370 total tackles ranks second all-time for the Big Green. He also had four interceptions.

He was named to every All-East, All-Ivy and All-New England team in 1974 and 1975. In 1975 he was named to the American Football Coaches Association All-America team. Williams was invit-

ed to three post-season college all-star games after the 1975 season and played in the Hula Bowl and the Japan Bowl.

Williams also was the Ivy League's heavyweight wrestling champion in 1975. Since he completed his undergraduate degree requirements as a psychology major after the fall term in 1975-76, he didn't defend his wrestling title in 1976.

"My parents (Eli and Julia Williams, who still live in Flint) instilled in me that education is the path to success," said Williams. "Mental preparation that I learned in the classroom and on the football field at Dartmouth helped me in pro football and throughout my career."

His career with the Bengals included appearances in the Super Bowl in 1982 and 1989. He was selected to the NFL's All-Rookie Team in 1976. He won the NFL's Byron (Whizzer) White Award for Humanitarian Service in 1985 and was the NFL's Man of the Year in 1986. In 1987, he was Sports Illustrated's Co-Sportsman of the Year. In 1988 he was appointed to an open seat on the Cincinnati City Council and was elected to a second term in 1989. In 1990 he received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Dartmouth.

Williams has been recognized for his role as a leader within the Walt Disney Company and the world of sports by his ranking in 2003 in Sports Illustrated's list of "101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports." In 2005, he was named one of the "50 Most Powerful Blacks in Sports" by *Black Enterprise Magazine*.

IVY FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION

Since 2001, the Ivy Football Association has recognized the unique aspects of Ivy League football and the history and tradition of the League. Biannually, the Association honors a distinguished alumnus from each of the eight Ivy League colleges who played football as an undergraduate and has achieved prominence in his chosen field.

On January 22, 2009 in New York, Jake Crouthamel '60 will be among the eight honorees. An outstanding halfback at Dartmouth from 1957-59, Crouthamel was Dartmouth's head football coach from 1971-77 and then was director of athletics at Syracuse University from 1978 until he retired in 2005.

Dartmouth's other recipients of this recognition include: Bill King '63, an attorney in Richmond, Va., and former chair of Dartmouth's board of trustees; Henry (Hank) Paulson '68, former chairman and chief executive officer of the Goldman Sachs Group and now Secretary of the Treasury; Jeff Immelt '78, chief executive officer of General Electric, and Reggie Williams '76, who recently retired as vice president of Disney Sports Attractions.

ACADEMIC HONORS

Student-Athletes

At a time when some would suggest that the phrase "student-athlete" is an oxymoron, Dartmouth continues to demonstrate that excellence in academics and athletics are not mutually exclusive.

"Athletics and athletes have played and will continue to play an important part in the life of the College," said President James Wright. "Today, athletics are an integral part of the Dartmouth experience."

Dartmouth has one of the nation's highest graduation rates of football players in the country. Since 1970, 40 student-athletes at Dartmouth—15 of them football players—have been honored with Academic All-America selection. Twelve Dartmouth football players have also received NCAA post-graduate scholarships and six have received National Football Foundation scholar-athlete grants.

These statistics illustrate the premium that Dartmouth places on the blend of academic achievement with athletics and general fitness. Dartmouth encourages a well-rounded interest in many activities—from music and art to student government and volunteer community service.

Academic All-America

The Academic All-America team is sponsored annually in several sports by GTE and the College Sports Information Directors of America. Players selected must be either a starter or key reserve and have at least a 3.20 grade point average.

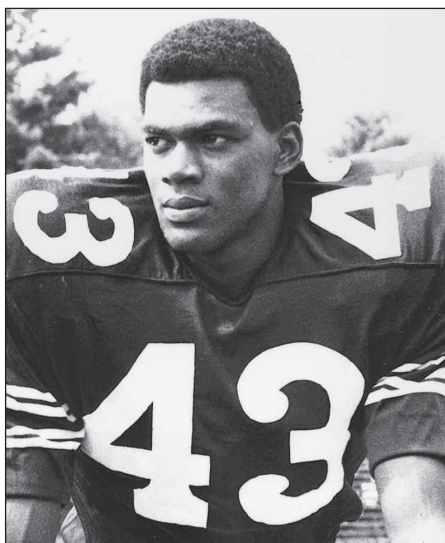

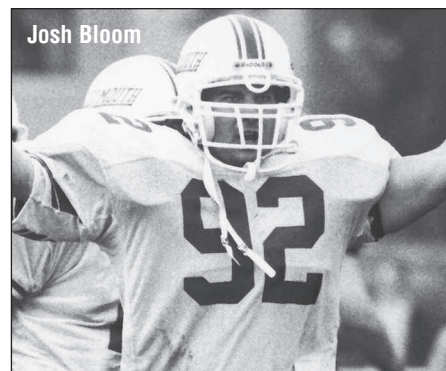

DARTMOUTH IN PRO FOOTBALL

The academically prestigious Ivy League may seem a long way from the bone-jarring world of professional football but more than 40 Dartmouth football alumni have reached this level over the years, including one Pro Football Hall of Famer. Among Dartmouth players in the professional ranks:

Dartmouth's most recent NFL draftee is **Casey Cramer '04**, the All-America and All-Ivy tight end who became one of Dartmouth's all-time receiving leaders from 2000-03. Cramer was taken in the seventh round of the 2004 draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as a tight end-fullback. He played with the Carolina Panthers in 2004-05 and joined the Tennessee Titans in 2006.

Jay Fiedler '94, the Ivy League player-of-the-year in 1992 who holds virtually every Dartmouth passing record, succeeded Dan Marino in 2000 as the Miami Dolphins' quarterback and helped the Dolphins reach the NFL playoffs. During five seasons with the Dolphins, Fiedler had a 36-23 record as a starter, passing for 11,040 yards and 66 touchdowns. He played for the New York Jets in 2005, a season punctuated by injuries that continued to plague him with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and prompted his retirement in 2006. Over 11 seasons Fiedler had a career won-lost record of 37-23 with 11,844 yards passing and 69 touchdowns.

Fiedler signed originally as a free agent with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1994. He later moved to the Minnesota Vikings. After a tour in NFL Europe in 1998, he was the backup quarterback with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 1999 as the Jags also reached the playoffs.

Linebacker **Zack Walz '98**, one of four Dartmouth players to be voted first team All-Ivy three times, was drafted in the sixth round by the Arizona Cardinals in 1998. Walz was the first Dartmouth player taken in the draft since **Gregg Robinson '78** was tapped by the New York Jets in the sixth round in 1978.

During five seasons, though dogged by leg injuries, Walz saw special teams and starting action with the Cardinals. He was a teammate of and roomed with Pat Tillman who left pro football to become an Army Ranger and was killed in Afghanistan in 2004.

Walz's Dartmouth teammate, defensive back **Lloyd Lee '98**, signed in 1998 as a free agent with the San Diego Chargers and saw spot duty with the Chargers for two seasons. He remained in pro football on the staff of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He is now a coach with the Chicago Bears who went to the Super Bowl in 2007.

In 2000, tight end **Adam Young '99** signed a free agent contract with the New York Giants. Young owns a ring from New York's 2001 Super Bowl appearance.

Caleb Moore '01, captain and All-Ivy guard in 2000, signed as a free agent with the Tennessee Titans but was an unsuccessful candidate with both the Titans and Arizona Cardinals.

OVER THE YEARS IN THE NFL

Dartmouth has been represented in the NFL from the league's beginning when Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle **Ed Healey '18** was the first player in the NFL to be traded, moving from the Rock Island Independents to the Chicago Bears after player-coach and future owner George Halas acquired his services for \$100. Healey played with the Bears from 1922-27 and was called by Halas "the most versatile tackle in history."

Drafted in the third round of the 1976 draft by the Cincinnati Bengals, **Reggie Williams '76** enjoyed a 14-year career as an All-Pro linebacker for the Bengals. Williams made two Super Bowl appearances with the Bengals (1982, 1989). He was named the NFL's Man of the Year in 1986.

After persevering through 11 cuts by eight different teams, **Nick Lowery '78** broke into the NFL in 1980. He had an 18-year career with the Kansas City Chiefs and New York Jets and set the NFL record for career field goals. He remains the league's most accurate field goal kicker of all time (80 percent).

Jeff Kemp '81 followed his father, Jack Kemp, into the NFL. He spent more than a decade as a quarterback with the Seattle Seahawks, Los Angeles Rams, San Francisco 49ers and Philadelphia Eagles.

Kemp's classmate, **Dave Shula '81**, made his mark with an NFL coaching career that included stops with Miami and Dallas. In 1992, the Cincinnati Bengals made him the youngest head coach in NFL history. At age 31, he edged his famous father, Don Shula, by a few months.

Quarterback **Mike Brown '57** followed his father, legendary coach Paul Brown, into NFL management. He is president and general manager of the Bengals. Brown's daughter, **Kate Brown Blackburn '86**, now is the Bengals' executive vice president.

For the past 15 years, **John Idzik '82**, a wide receiver in 1981, has been an NFL administrator. He spent 11 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and three with the Arizona Cardinals. He became vice president, football administration for the Seattle Seahawks in 2007.

OTHER DARTMOUTH PROFESSIONALS

Other Dartmouth players who have gone into pro football (but not the NFL) include: **Anthony Gargiulo '06** was a defensive end with the Calgary Stampeders (CLF) in 2007 and is trying to make a comeback from a broken leg suffered in the final game of the season. **Derham Cato '05** was a defensive tackle with the Toronto Argonauts in 2007 and is pursuing other pro football options this season.

Wide receiver **Craig Morton '89** and **David Clark '90** played for Frankfurt and Birmingham respectively in the World League of American Football. Quarterback **Jim Chasey '71**, co-recipient with Cornell's Ed Marinaro of the first Bushnell Award as the Ivy League's outstanding player in 1970, played with the Montreal Alouettes in the Canadian Football League in the early 1970s.

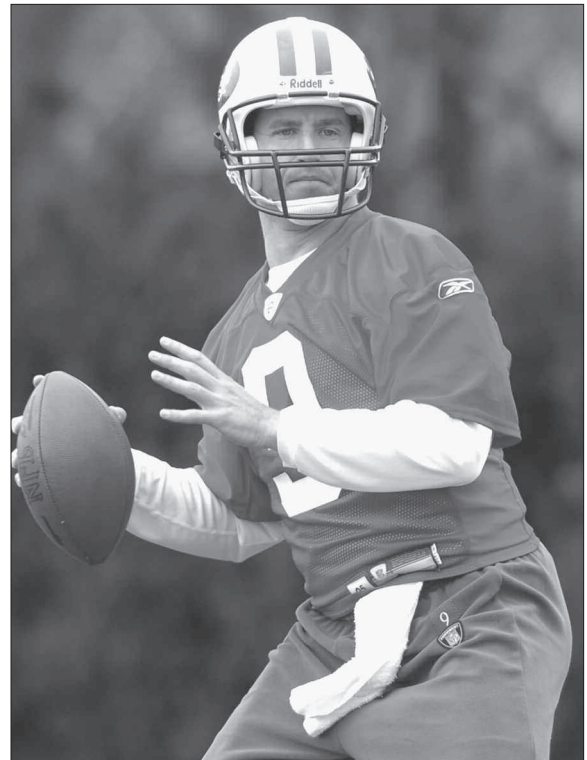
Kyle Schroeder '00, a standout defensive end at Dartmouth in 1998-99, played with the XFL's Birmingham Thunderbolts in 2001.

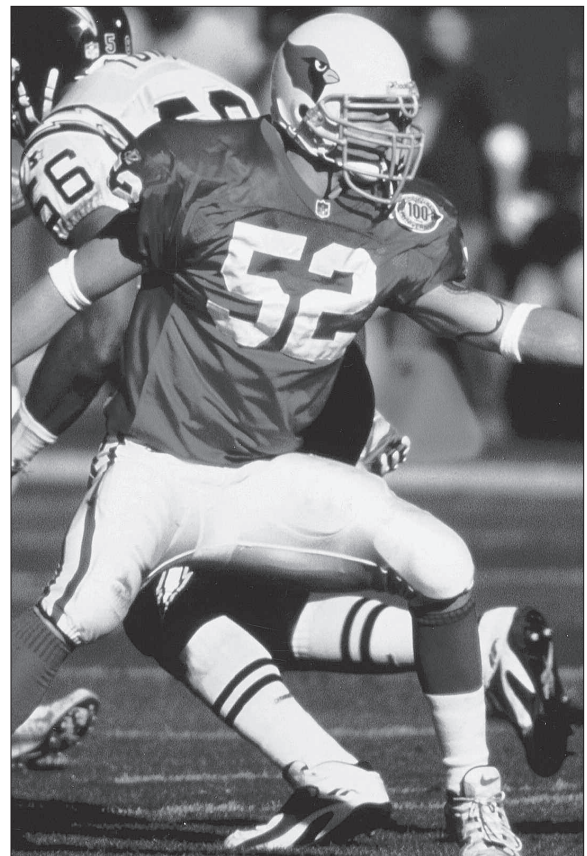

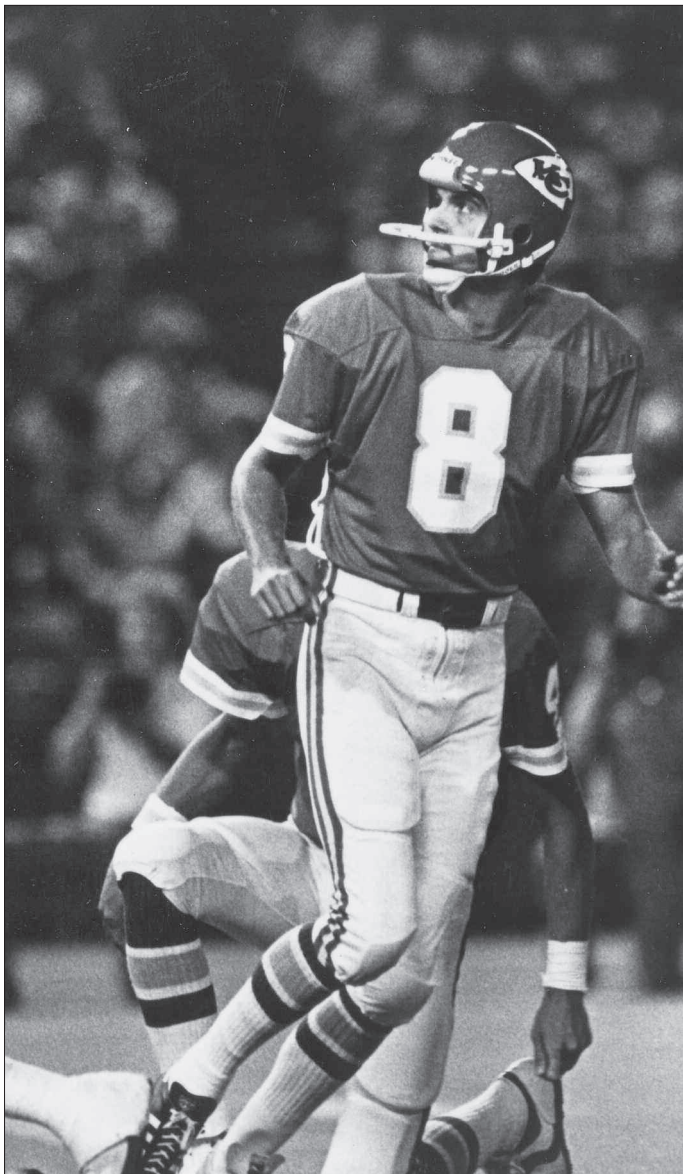

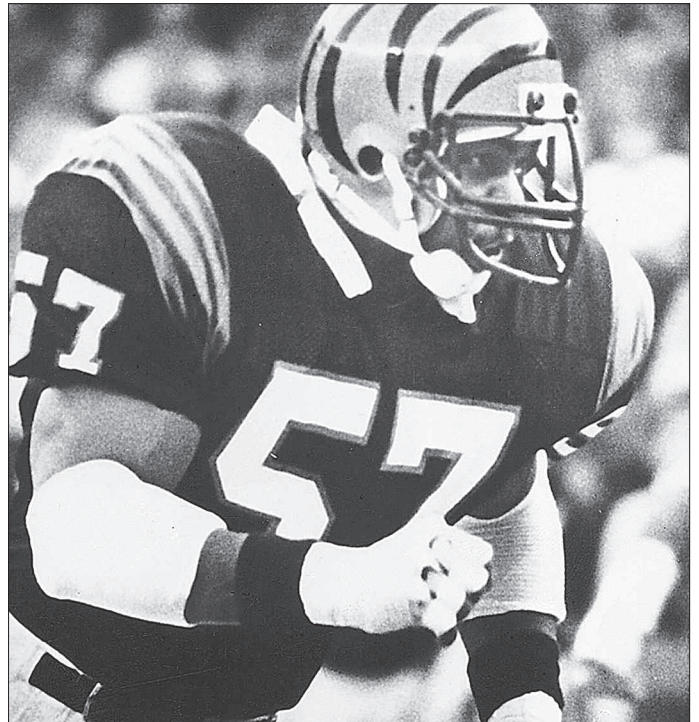
