25TH SEASON HEAD COACH CHRIS WIELGUS

DARTMOUTH: 365-265 (25) • OVERALL: 402-286 (27) • IVY: 210-84 (24)

With 12 Ivy League championships, one Patriot League title and seven NCAA Tournament appearances, Dartmouth College head women's basketball coach Christina "Chris" Wielgus has established herself as one of the nation's elite coaches. Entering her 25th year at the helm, Wielgus has not fallen out of step, recently leading the Big Green to four of the last five Ivy League Championships (2005, 2006, 2008 and 2009) and five straight postseason appearances since 2005.

Wielgus is entering her 25th season and in her second

stint (1976-84, 1993-present) as the head coach of the program she built from the ground up, also coaching the first Dartmouth team that competed in the Ivy League in 1976. She is the winningest coach in the illustrious history of Dartmouth College, amassing a stellar record of 365-265 in 25 seasons. Including her two years as a head coach with Fordham, Wielgus sports a 402-285 overall record in 27 years as a head coach.

Wielgus has been particularly successful against the Ivy League. During her 25-year career the Big Green boasts a staggering 210-83 record against Ivy opponents, as well as 12 conference titles and all seven of Dartmouth's forays into the NCAA tournament. In 1980-81, Wielgus led the Big Green to a 20-9 record, earning Dartmouth a spot in the EAIAW tournament.

During her tenure, Wielgus has created one of the most consistent programs in the Ivies. The Big Green has finished third or better in the conference standings in 19 of her last 21 years at the helm. She is responsible for 12 of Dartmouth's 17 Ivy League championships. She has mentored five Ivy League players of the year honored seven times and eight Ivy League rookies of the year, including Brittney Smith '11, who won both awards back-to-back in her first two seasons. Wielgus' players have put up staggering numbers for All-Ivy recognition as well, with 16 first-team players honored 27 times and 34 total All-Ivy players recognized 77 times.

In its most recent Ivy Championship season, 2008-09, Dartmouth was just five points — an overtime loss — away from the first undefeated Ivy campaign in program history. But with a 13-1 mark the Big Green still brought home its 17th Ivy title, six more than Harvard, which ranks second. The season was sweet for Wielgus, who started two seniors and two sophomores and coached one of her best defensive teams ever. The Big Green took power conference members Michigan State and Arkansas to the wire while finding the gritty identity that would allow it to run through the Ivy slate, including an 11-game winning streak.

On March 10, 2009, Wielgus won her 400th career game in fitting fashion as Dartmouth topped Harvard, then one game back, to clinch its first outright Ivy Championship since 2000 in front of 1,700 fans at Leede Arena.

The previous championship season, 2008, was one in which most had written off the Big Green after a slow start. Wielgus and her squad rallied to post an 11-3 Ivy record and force a three-way playoff for the NCAA Tournament bid. After topping Harvard in the first round, Dartmouth fell to Cornell, who had received a first-round bye after a coin pull, in the final game, but still advanced to the Post-season WNIT.

Wielgus continues to be a big-game coach, winning playoffs in 2005 and 2006 for the league's NCAA Tournament bid. The Big Green is in a streak of five consecutive postseason appearances dating back to 2005, going to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, 2006 and 2009 and earning a Postseason WNIT bid in 2007 and 2008. At the 2006 NCAA Tournament, the Big Green put forth a tremendous effort against third-seeded Rutgers. Dartmouth valiantly came back from an 11-point deficit late in the game, but eventually fell 63-58 to the Big East Champions. The 2009 Big Green lost to eventual Elite Eight team and #1 seed Maryland.

Wielgus first took over the program in just its fifth year of existence (1976-77) and led the Big Green to unprecedented heights. The 1976 season was Dartmouth's first in which it competed against Ivy League opponents, with the Ancient Eight women's teams playing a tournament each season. In just four years, Wielgus established her team amongst the elite, winning four consecutive Ivy League

titles from 1980-83.

After eight years, Wielgus departed Hanover and collegiate coaching following the 1984 season. Seven years later, the game called the coach back and she assumed the head coaching position at Fordham University from 1991-93. Under her tutelage, the Rams had back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in 13 years, highlighted by the 1991-92 campaign — Wielgus' first at Rose Hill — when they went 21-8 and won both the Patriot League regular-season and postseason tournament titles.

Dartmouth came calling in the spring of 1993 and Wielgus returned to the college on the hill prior to the 1993-94 season.

In between her first Dartmouth stint and her two-year stay at Fordham, Wielgus remained actively involved in women's basketball around the country. She served as training camp coordinator for the United States women's basketball teams that won gold medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and the 1986 World Championships. Wielgus also directed the Developmental Basketball Program in Hilton Head, S.C., and the All-Star Basketball Camps in Baton Rouge, La., and Jacksonville, Fla. Today, she is director of the Chris Wielgus Basketball School that runs during the summer in Hanover.

Wielgus holds the unique honor of being the only active Dartmouth coach to be a member of the college's "Wearers of the Green." Under criteria for admission into the athletic honor society, Big Green coaches may be inducted only after retiring or leaving the college. Wielgus was a 1989 inductee and was also the keynote speaker at that awards presentation.

A 1974 graduate of Springfield, Wielgus was a physical education instructor before coming to Dartmouth. Wielgus was inducted into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame in 2004 and the Springfield College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

Wielgus resides in Hanover and has two grown sons, Chip and Thomas.

QUICK TAKE ON THE BIG GREEN

• Freshman Faziiah Steen earned her first collegiate start at #25 Syracuse. While she didn't have her best shooting day, Steen played a career-high 31 minutes and contributed to a tremendous defensive effort.

• Steen took the place of senior Betsy Williams in the starting rotation at Syracuse, but Williams responded with a big game off the bench. Naturally athletic, Williams played tough defense on the Orange ball-handlers and scored a season-high 13 points.

• For the first time all season, Dartmouth took fewer free throws than its opponent when it lost at #25 Syracuse on Dec. 13. The Big Green was 5-of-7 from the line, still managing to hit more than the Orange, who went 4-of-11.

• The Big Green let it fly at #25 Syracuse, taking a season-high 28 threes, most since attempting 21 in an epic comeback attempt at Michigan in Dec. 2006.

• Dartmouth got a balanced attack at Stony Brook on Dec. 11, scoring a season-high 77 points with 18 points each from Sasha Dosenko and Faziiah Steen and 17 from Brittney Smith.

DEFENSIVE EFFORT

Dartmouth turned in perhaps its best defensive effort of the season on Dec. 13 at #25 Syracuse, holding the Orange to just 56 points - nearly 23 below their season average of 78.9 per game. The Big Green also forced Syracuse into a season-high 26 turnovers. The 14-point differential was also the second-closest game that Syracuse had played all season.

HOLIDAY ROAD

In keeping with its tradition, Dartmouth has traveled far from home for its pre-holiday trip. With players hailing from all over the country, the Big Green traditionally uses this time to travel to players' home states. While rookie Kelsey Byrd hails from California, this is not truly a trip for her, as her hometown of Saratoga is about six hours north of Los Angeles. In recent seasons, Dartmouth has brought players home to Arkansas, Texas, Colorado and Michigan.

BACK HOME FOR BLUE SKY

Also in the spirit of tradition, Dartmouth hosts an annual tournament uninterrupted for 33 straight years. Now called the Blue Sky Classic, it has been held after the holidays, Dec. 29-30 for many of those seasons. The Big Green's annual winter classic is the longest running uninterrupted women's college tournament in the country. This year's tournament features Dartmouth, Vermont, Rhode Island and nationally-ranked Dayton.

THE BIG GREEN WANDERERS

Dartmouth plays its fifth and sixth road games of the season this weekend, in the midst of a stretch of 36 days without a home game. The Big Green will not be back at Leede Arena until the Blue Sky Classic on Dec. 29-30. Last season, Dartmouth endured a stretch of 40 days without a road game. Dartmouth faced Stony Brook and Syracuse on the road after exams (Dec. 11 & 13) before heading to California.

SCHEDULING UP

Once again, Dartmouth is playing a challenging non-conference schedule to prepare itself for a run at the Ivy League title. The Big Green's strength of schedule ranked as high as eighth in the nation in the Sagarin ratings and 14th in Jerry Palm's. Three of the Big Green's first four opponents - Temple, Hartford and Vermont - were receiving votes in the coaches top-25 and each had defeated at least one team from a BCS conference. Dartmouth then held #25 Syracuse to just 56 points and still takes on USC, Dayton, who ranked as high as 20th, and Boston College this season.

SETTING A NEW HIGH MARK FOR SCORING

At Stony Brook on Dec. 11, Dartmouth scored a season-high 77 points thanks in part to 18 points each from Sasha Dosenko and Faziaah Steen and 17 from Brittney Smith.

The 77 points scored is the most in any game since the Big Green tallied 79 in a win over New Hampshire on Jan. 10, 2007. Primarily a defensive team, Dartmouth scored 70+ points just three times in 2008-09, twice in overtime and three times in 2007-08, once in overtime. Dartmouth did reach the 70+ point mark eight times in 2006-07.

GETTING TO THE LINE ...

And keeping opponents off it. The Big Green has picked up where it left off last season by getting to the free throw line often and keeping its opponents away from it. In just seven games, Dartmouth has taken 149 free throws to its opponents 92. At Stony Brook on Dec. 11, Dartmouth reached one of its individual game goals by making more free throws (22) than its opponent took (19). The Green could stand to improve on its 67.1 percentage but opponents are also only connecting on 63 percent. Last season, Dartmouth nearly doubled up its opponents by taking 602 free throws to others 345 on the season.

BIG LEADS DON'T ALWAYS HOLD

Dartmouth jumped out to an 18-3 lead on Stony Brook and led by as many as 19 points in the first half before holding a 39-27 halftime advantage. The Seawolves came out on fire in the second, however, eventually slicing the lead to just two points, but were never able to tie or take the lead. Dartmouth got a tremendous effort from Brittney Smith during a five minute stretch before fouling out with 2:24 to play. The Big Green used key free throws and a big defensive stand with 5.6 seconds left to ice the 77-72 win.

FINALLY BACK ON THE COURT

At Stony Brook on Dec. 11, Dartmouth played a game for the first time since Nov. 29 after an 11-day final exam break. Because of its exam schedule, the Big Green is forced to cram an extra game into its first two weeks, playing five games in 16 days to open the season.

COMING UP BIG EARLY ON

The Big Green has gotten some strong performances from players who are seeing significant minutes for the first time in their careers. Sophomore Sasha Dosenko, who was used sparingly last year, is averaging 8.2 points and 5.2 rebounds, starting the last three games. She has reached double-digits in scoring in the past two games including a career-high 18 points at Stony Brook. Rookie Faziah Steen has made her presence known in just four games played off the bench, lighting up Stony Brook for 18 points and six boards and tallying nine points at Vermont.

NOT OFTEN ALLOWING 80

Dartmouth gave up 83 points to Vermont on Nov. 25, marking just the fourth time since 2006 that the Big Green has allowed that many points, with two of those coming in overtime and triple overtime games. Dartmouth allowed 82 points to #1 Maryland in the NCAA Tournament last season and to UConn (95) in the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

BIG BOOST OFF THE BENCH

The Big Green got a big surge from its players off the bench against Temple, with the six subs contributing 24 points. That was a bigger bench effort than Dartmouth ever had last season, with its highest total at 18 points in the win over Wagner on Dec. 30. Meghan McFee contributed 14 of those 18 points and one game later was in the starting lineup for good.

RARE HOMESTAND TO START

Against Hartford, Dartmouth closed out a three game homestand (1-2) to open the 2009-10 campaign — the first such since the 1984-85 season. Such a homestand is so rare that the Big Green has only opened with two home games twice in that span, in 1985-86 and 2002-03.

STARTING ON THE RIGHT NOTE

Dartmouth opened its 37th season of varsity women's basketball with a 57-47 victory over Bryant on Saturday, Nov. 14. The Big Green moved to 19-18 all-time in season openers, and 4-6 since 2000. It was the first season-opening victory since a 90-42 win over Quinnipiac in 2005. Being at home to start the season for the first time since 2005 helped as Dartmouth is now 13-4 all-time when opening the season at home, but 7-14 on the road.

HOME SWEET HOME

Dartmouth is in its 23rd season of play at Leede Arena and since opening the doors in 1987, the women are 13-10 in home-openers and 175-86 overall at home. The Big Green went 9-3 including a perfect 7-0 in Ivy play at Leede in 2008-09.

RAISING ANOTHER BANNER

The 2008-09 Dartmouth women's basketball team brought home the program's 17th Ivy League Championship with a near-perfect 13-1 Ivy record, 18-11 overall. The title was Dartmouth's second straight and fourth in the last five years. The banner marking the Ivy title and NCAA Tournament appearance made its debut at Leede Arena this season. Staffers actually had to make room for the newest banners, shifting all the previous 16 over to fit it.

POSTSEASON PLAYERS

Since 2005, Dartmouth has made five-straight postseason appearances, finishing first in the Ivy's in four of the last five years. The Big Green padded its Ivy record for consecutive postseason appearances last season with its bid to the 2009 NCAA Tournament. Dartmouth also made the Big Dance in 2005 and 2006 and the WNIT in 2007 (second place in the league) and 2008 (tied for first, lost in the second game of a three-way playoff).

PUT A RING ON IT

Every Dartmouth class but one since 1980-2009 has graduated with at least one Ivy League Championship ring. The trend now holds true through at least 2012.

PRESEASON POLLING

Dartmouth is the media's pick to three-peat in the Ivy League this season, predicted to finish first in the conference. In a poll of 16 media members and sports information directors, Dartmouth garnered 11 first-place votes and a 123 of a possible 128 points. The predicted order of finish (first-place votes):

FAMILY TIES

Dartmouth currently has sisters on its squad in senior Margaret Smith and junior Brittney Smith. Margaret has consistently sacrificed for her team and endured the transition from forward to guard, where she is now comfortable as a shooter and a matchup nightmare at 6-1. Other players with family ties to Dartmouth include Betsy Williams' five alumni family members including father, Bruce '73; Michelle Meyer's brother Jason '06, a men's basketball captain; and Meghan McFee's cousin, Brian Otley '89 and his wife, Ute Bowman Otley '90, an All-Ivy basketball player.

ATTENDANCE IS TOPS

The Dartmouth women are one of the hottest tickets in town, leading the Ivy

League in attendance for the past seven seasons and averaging 1,000+ fans per game in four of those seasons. The Big Green added another top-10 crowd on March 10, 2009 when 1,710 turned out to see the team clinch the Ivy Title with a 64-51 win over Harvard. During the 2006-07 season, Dartmouth hosted three new top-20 Leede Arena crowds including the record-breaking attendance of 2,153 against #3 Duke.

SILVER ANNIVERSARY

Head coach Chris Wielgus embarks upon her 25th year at Dartmouth this season and 27th as a collegiate head coach, all at the Division I level. Wielgus coached the first Dartmouth team to compete in the Ivy League in 1976-77 and picked up 107 wins and four Ivy titles in eight seasons. She got out of coaching to raise her sons but returned just seven years later for a two-year stint at Fordham, going 37-21 and winning a Patriot League title (1991-93). She returned to Dartmouth in 1993 and has been here ever since, picking up 256 wins and eight more Ivy Championships since.

MORE THAN THEIR SHARE OF HEARTACHE

Oh so close is always the story for Dartmouth against the power conferences, who the Big Green never hesitates to play. In 2008-09 alone the Big Green nearly knocked off Michigan State and Arkansas. In 2007-08 there was a loss to Marquette on a half-court buzzer beater and an overtime loss at Virginia Tech. In 2006-07 the Big Green had Michigan on the ropes before an improbable buzzer-beating three lifted the Wolverines. And many will recall the 2006 NCAA Tournament when #14 seeded Dartmouth nearly knocked out #3 seed Rutgers.

A LITTLE COMPANY AT THE TOP

Dartmouth's 17 conference championships are far and away the most in the league, but this number also puts the Big Green among the nation's leaders for league dominance. Since the Ivy League does not play a postseason tournament, regular season results matter more than in any other league. Only Stanford, with 18 Pac-10 regular season titles is above Dartmouth nationally.

Last year, the 6-1 Smith was a force inside throughout the season, averaging 14.1 points, 8.2 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game overall. This preseason, Smith has garnered praise from two national publications. First, USA Today put her on its "All-Brittney" team, which was published in the annual college basketball preview magazine. In addition, Full Court Press online women's basketball journal named Brittney honorable mention on its Preseason Mid-Major Top-25 players.
