A true collegiate experience

Founded in 1769, the nation's ninth-oldest college and a member of the Ivy League, Dartmouth is a private, four-year, liberal arts, coeducational college with schools of business, engineering and medicine as well as 18 graduate programs in the arts and sciences. Its 200-acre main campus features state-of-the-art academic facilities including the Berry Library, the Hood Museum of Art, the Hopkins Center for the Arts and the Rauner Special Collections Library.

- ♦ Located in Hanover, N.H. on the Connecticut River; two hours northwest of Boston, five hours north of New York City.
- ♦ Annual undergraduate enrollment of 4,100, graduate enrollment of 1,700 and endowment of \$3.092 billion (market value).
- ♦ Dartmouth students hail from all 50 states and 60 countries.
- ♦ Features a unique academic calendar known as the Dartmouth Plan, a year-round calendar of four 10-week terms that allows flexibility in scheduling.
- ♦ Undergraduates have the opportunity to study in 42 off-campus programs in 22 countries.
- ♦ Dartmouth employs 494 full-time faculty members and sponsors \$185 million in research funding.
- ♦ For the class of 2012, there were 16,538 applications and 2,228 admissions; 1,095 students enrolled.
- ♦ Admission to the college is need-blind; financial aid in 2007-08 totaled approximately \$60 million; 51 percent of undergraduates received financial aid.

Dartmouth football players have use of the 10,000 square-foot Strength Training Center housed in the Floren Varsity House, exclusively for varsity teams. Opened in 2007, the state-of-the-art facility allows for multiple varsity teams to train simultaneously under the watchful eye of Bob Miller, Holekamp Family Strength & Conditioning Coach, and his assistants, Kaitlin Sweeney and Amanda Bayliss. A 1994 graduate of Southern Connecticut State, Miller, pictured above, came to the Big Green in March, 2001 after stints at Iowa and Yale.

Serving all 34 of Dartmouth's varsity sports, equipment in the expansive center includes:

- 20 platforms and racks
- 8 glute and hamstring machines
- 6 sets of cable columns
- 4 cable lat pulldowns
- 4 Russian boxes
- 3 sets of iron dumbbells
- 3 belt squat machines
- Assorted cardio machines

Sponsoring conference championships in 33 men's and women's sports, and averaging more than 35 varsity teams at each school, the Ivy League provides intercollegiate athletic opportunities for more men and women than any other conference in the country.

The Ivy League's successful competition in Division I national athletics is achieved by approaching athletics as a key part of the student's regular undergraduate experience: with rigorous academic standards, the nation's highest four-year graduation rates and without athletics scholarships. Ivy athletic programs receive multi-million-dollar institutional support as part of each institution's overall academic programs.

Since 2000 alone, the Ivy League:

- Produced 47 NCAA individual/event champions in fencing, women's swimming and diving, women's rowing, men's indoor track & field, men's outdoor track and field, women's indoor track and field, women's outdoor track and field and wrestling while earning 11 NCAA team championships in fencing, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse and women's rowing.
- Amassed nearly 100 All-Americans each year.
- Averaged more than a dozen Academic All-Americans each year, including an all-time high of 18 in 2006-07, for a total of 136 student-athletes honored.
- Had 204 competitors at the five Olympic Games (2000, 2002, 2004, 2006 and 2008). Those 204 athletes collected 81 medals, including 28 gold. At the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China, the League boasted 42 athletes who took home 14 medals.
- Boasts numerous athletes currently in the professional ranks of Major League Baseball, Major League Lacrosse, the National Football League, the National Hockey League, and the recently founded Women's Pro Soccer League.
- Became the first conference to sweep the four major NCAA Honors in the same year (2006) — Columbia's Robert Kraft claiming the Theodore Roosevelt Award; Princeton's John Doar the Inspirational Award; Yale's Susan Wellington a Silver Anniversary Award; and Brown's Nick Hartigan a Top VIII Award.
- Became the second conference with three of the six NCAA Silver Anniversary Award winners in the same year (2007) — Dartmouth's Gail Koziara Boudreaux, Brown's Steve Jordan and Yale's Patricia Melton.
- Posted far and away the best record in Division I, across all sports and conferences, in the first three annual compilations (2007-09) of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate.

FRIENDS OF FOOTBALL

What is Friends of Dartmouth Football?

The Friends of Dartmouth Football is an organization of former players, alumni, parents, students, faculty and Big Green fans who provide support through a wide variety of functions in coordination with the Dartmouth football program.

The support and generosity of many Friends is essential to the success of Dartmouth football.

What does Friends of Dartmouth Football do?

Given budgetary issues and uncertain economic times, the Friends of Dartmouth Football provides generous financial support and volunteer services during the football season and throughout the year. The Friends of Football is a source of support for some of the highest priorities of Dartmouth's football program, including:

- Part-time coaches salaries
- Recruiting services
- Video equipment
- Weight room equipment
- Annual highlights video
- Travel warm-up gear
- Annual team banquet
- Post-game receptions

What are some of the Friends of Football special programs?

Under Coach Buddy Teevens, two programs have been established that focus on the future of Dartmouth football players:

Interviews, Internships, Jobs — Over 200 alumni volunteers participate in a program that helps Dartmouth players explore different career fields with informational interviews, secure off-campus internships (usually during sophomore winter-spring), and generally helps Big Green student-athletes plan for their futures. This formalized relationship with alumni, and their business and professional organizations, gives Dartmouth football players greater opportunities to identify undergraduate internships and post-college job opportunities.



The Dartmouth Football Career Day brings Big Green alumni and current players together to discuss business and professional opportunities.

Dartmouth Football Career Day — Since 2005, the Friends of Football has sponsored a Career Day for Big Green players. Each year, varsity players meet with alumni who have played football at Dartmouth and have gone on to successful careers in their chosen profession. These Big Green alumni share their experiences in investment and commercial banking, law, high technology, medicine, advertising and marketing, sales, finance and financial planning, commercial real estate, construction, economic development, venture capital, military service and the clergy.

Dartmouth Athletic Sponsors Program

The Friends of Dartmouth Football is part of the Athletic Sponsors Program that supports intercollegiate athletics at Dartmouth. The Athletic Sponsors Program is the sole source of funds for bringing top athletic prospects to campus each year for a first-hand view of "The Dartmouth Experience." Additional Sponsors Program funds are allocated for recruiting brochures, rental cars and coaches' recruiting trips.

FRIENDS OF FOOTBALL GOLF CLASSIC

The Friends of Dartmouth Football annual Golf Classic at Hanover Country Club is one of the biggest sources of financial support for Dartmouth football and a great opportunity for former Big Green players, coaches and friends to gather for an informal afternoon of golf and reminiscing.

Annually, this special event raises about \$60,000 that benefits Dartmouth football. Proceeds from the outing are used to purchase strength and fitness equipment and digital video equipment. These funds also help meet the cost of salaries for part-time assistant coaches and professional development opportunities for the Dartmouth football staff.

The 2008 Golf Classic brought over 110 former players and friends, representing Dartmouth classes from the early 1950s to 2006, to Hanover Country Club. The date for the 13th Golf Classic is June 19, 2009.

ADMINISTRATION



JIM YONG KIM, M.D., PH.D.

PRESIDENT OF THE COLLEGE
BROWN '82;
HARVARD '91, '93

Dr. Jim Yong Kim, an internationally recognized physician and humanitarian and an accomplished educator and anthropologist, became the 17th president of Dartmouth College on July 1, 2009.

Dr. Kim, 49, has had a profound impact on a wide range of organizations throughout his distinguished career, including, among others, the Harvard Medical School, the World Health Organization and Partners In Health, a non-profit organization that supports health programs in poor communities worldwide. He is widely respected for his leadership in the fight against HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and other diseases.

Dr. Kim's academic, humanitarian and global health work has earned him widespread recognition. He was awarded a MacArthur "Genius" Fellowship in 2003; was named one of America's 25 "Best Leaders" by US News & World Report in 2005; and was selected as one of TIME magazine's "100 Most Influential People in the World" in 2006.

Dr. Kim has been committed to educating young people since his first teaching experience more than 20 years ago at Harvard University. Since that time, he has taught undergraduate and graduate courses in anthropology, social analysis, social medicine and global health.

Dr. Kim is renowned for his leadership in the global fight against HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and other diseases that disproportionately affect the world's poorest people. While at WHO, Dr. Kim led an unprecedented initiative to expand access to HIV/AIDS treatment worldwide. By 2007, the initiative had helped provide lifesaving antiretroviral therapy to more than three million people worldwide and accelerated global efforts to fight other diseases such as tuberculosis and malaria.

Born in Seoul, Korea in 1959, Jim Yong Kim moved with his family to the United States at the age of five and grew up in Muscatine, Iowa. He graduated magna cum laude with a B.A. from Brown University in 1982. He was awarded an M.D. from Harvard Medical School in 1991, and a Ph.D. from Harvard University, Department of Anthropology, in 1993.

Dr. Kim is married to Dr. Yoonsok Lim, a pediatrician, and the couple has two young sons. He is actively involved in a variety of sports including basketball, volleyball, tennis and golf.



ROBERT CEPLIKAS

ACTING DIRECTOR OF
ATHLETICS AND RECREATION
DARTMOUTH '78

Robert A. Ceplikas, a 1978 graduate of Dartmouth College and 30-year veteran of the college's staff in athletics and admissions assumed the role of Acting Director of Athletics and Recreation on July 1, 2009.

Ceplikas will serve for the 2009-2010 academic year while the college conducts a national search for a successor to Josie Harper, who served as the college's seventh athletics director for the past seven years before retirement.

As Acting Director, Ceplikas oversees 34 varsity sports (16 men's, 16 women's and two coed) as well as comprehensive club sports and intramural programs in which nearly three-quarters of Dartmouth's undergraduates participate.

Ceplikas has been the Deputy Director of Athletics for the past 15 years, serving under both Harper and former Athletics Director Dick Jaeger. He currently oversees the department's annual giving programs including the Athletic Sponsor Program (to support recruiting) and individual sports' Friends Groups. Total donations have grown nearly four times from approximately \$500,000 to nearly \$2 million annually during his tenure.

With extensive supervisory experience, Ceplikas has most recently overseen varsity athletics communications, and marketing and promotions. He has also played a pivotal role in long-range planning and assisted the athletics director with external relations and overall management of the department.

Upon graduating from Dartmouth in 1978, Ceplikas joined the college's admissions office, where he held four different positions in his 11 years on staff. For six of those years (1979-85), he also was an assistant coach for the Big Green women's hockey team, helping build that program from a fledgling varsity squad to a competitive team. HEAD COACH BUDDY TEEVENS

THE ROBERT L. BLACKMAN HEAD FOOTBALL COACH



Eugene F. (Buddy) Teevens III, who as a player led Dartmouth to the 1978 Ivy League championship and as a coach led Dartmouth football to back-to-back Ivy League titles in 1990 and 1991, returned as the head coach of

the Big Green football program in 2005.

Teevens, 52, was Dartmouth's coach from 1987 through 1991. During his final two seasons, the Big Green posted identical overall records of 7-2-1. With a 6-1 record, Dartmouth shared the 1990 Ivy title with Cornell. In 1991, Dartmouth won the outright championship with a 6-0-1 mark. His overall record at Dartmouth is 33-45-2.

Teevens holds the Robert L. Blackman Endowed Coaching Position, named in memory of Bob Blackman, who coached Dartmouth from 1955 to 1970, and created through the gift of Henry M. (Hank) Paulson '68, an outstanding offensive tackle who played for Blackman from 1965-67.

In addition to restoring Dartmouth's rich football tradition, Teevens has been an integral force in a series of major improvements to Dartmouth's football facilities, including installation of a Field-



Turf surface on Memorial Field for the 2006 season and, in 2007, opening of the new Floren Varsity House that includes training, dressing and meeting facilities. This new building is part of a project that included the refurbishment of the east grandstand at Memorial Field.

Teevens succeeded John Lyons at the helm of the Big Green and is the 21st coach in the program's 125-year history. Teevens was Dartmouth's 19th coach during his first tenure.

From 2002 through 2004, Teevens was the head coach at Stanford University. Prior to that, Teevens was on Steve Spurrier's staff at the University of Florida from 1998 to 2001. In 1999, Teevens was Florida's running backs coach. In 2000, he was the

passing game coordinator while also coaching tight ends, wide receivers, kickers, snappers and holders. The following year, he was the assistant offensive coordinator and tight ends coach.

His first game with the Gators was the 1999 Orange Bowl. In his three full seasons at Florida, the Gators went 29-9, participated in three bowl games and finished among the top 12 in the final polls each season. In his final year in 2001, the Gators went 10-2, defeated Maryland in the Orange Bowl and finished ranked third in both national polls.

From 1997 to 1998, Teevens was the offensive coordinator and receivers coach at the University of Illinois under Ron Turner.

From 1992-96, Teevens was the head coach at

THE ROBERT L. BLACKMAN ENDOWED COACH POSITION

A gift from a 1968 Dartmouth graduate and former football star endowed the College's head football coaching position in honor of his former coach.

Henry M. (Hank) Paulson, of New York, N.Y., gave \$2 million to establish the Robert L. Blackman Endowed Coaching Position at Dartmouth. The gift was announced in November 2000 during a reunion of players from Bob Blackman's 16 Dartmouth teams.

"As much as he wanted to win and as intensely as he cared—and no one who knew him ever doubted that he was absolutely driven to win—Bob Blackman always stressed clean, honorable play," said Paulson.

Blackman died in March 2000. He is remembered as Dartmouth football's most successful coach, a master of recruiting, innovation and strategy whose imprint on Ivy League football is indelible.

From 1955-70, Blackman's teams compiled a record of 104 wins, 37 losses and three ties. Those teams, representing the most successful era in



Dartmouth football history, won seven Ivy League championships. Three teams—in 1962, 1965 and 1970—were undefeated and untied. The Big Green squads of 1965 and 1970 were also awarded the Lambert Trophy as the outstanding team in Eastern major college football.

As a member of Blackman's teams from 1965-67, Hank Paulson was an integral part of Dartmouth's football success. As a sophomore in 1965, he led the team in minutes played. In his senior season of 1967, Paulson was named All-Ivy, All-New England and All-East and received the New England Football Coaches Award as Offensive Lineman-of-the-Year.

Paulson's success on the gridiron was matched by his success in the classroom. A citation-winning English major, he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa and was awarded an NCAA Scholar-Ath-



lete postgraduate fellowship. He was chief executive officer of Goldman Sachs, a leading investment banking firm until being named by President George W. Bush to be Secretary of the Treasury in 2006.

Tulane University. He rebuilt that program and recruited most of the team that went 11-0 in 1998.

Teevens began his coaching career in 1979 as the running backs coach at DePauw University. In 1980, he became the offensive coordinator at Boston University and remained with the Terrier program until 1985 when he was appointed the head football coach at the University of Maine.

He led the Black Bears to a 6-5 record in 1985 and a 7-4 mark in 1986, the program's first back-to-back winning seasons in 21 years.

At Dartmouth, Teevens was honored as the New England Coach-of-the-Year for the 1991 season. The Big Green's Ivy title that year was the school's first outright championship since 1978.

Born October 1, 1956, Teevens earned an A.B. degree in history from Dartmouth in 1979. An honorable mention All-America quarterback in 1978, he led the Big Green to the Ivy title that year. He was named the Ivy League and ECAC player of the year and played in the Blue-Gray Classic. Co-captain of the 1978 team (6-3, 6-1 in Ivy games),

Teevens was the squad's most valuable player. He also lettered in hockey, helping Dartmouth to a third-place finish at the 1979 NCAA championship. He was voted the Alfred W. Watson Trophy as Dartmouth's outstanding athlete.

The name Teevens is intertwined through Dartmouth athletic history. Buddy's father, the late Eugene F. Teevens II '52, was a hockey letter-winner. His younger brother, Shaun '82, was a two-sport athlete in football and hockey and also a recipient of the Watson Trophy. A sister, Moira '87, captained the women's cross country and track teams and earned All-Ivy and All-East recognition as a runner.

A native of Pembroke, Mass., Teevens and his wife, Kirsten, have two children: Lindsay graduated from the University of Florida in 2008 and Eugene IV is a junior at Coastal Carolina University.

Cedric Calhoun is in his fourth season on the Dartmouth staff. This year he will be working with the outside linebackers after spending three years with the defensive line-men. In 2007, one of his players, DE Cullen Gilchrist, earned All-Ivy honorable mention.

Calhoun joined the Big Green staff in 2006 after serving as defensive line coach at Alabama A&M University from 2002-05. He helped fashion a unit that led the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in total defense and sacks for four straight seasons. Six of his players won All-SWAC honors, contributing to a 32-15 record and a nine-win season in 2005.

Alabama A&M won the SWAC Eastern Division title in 2002 and 2005. The Bulldogs were nationally ranked in Division 1-AA in total defense, finishing second in 2002, third in 2003, fourth in 2004 and seventh in 2005.

Among the Bulldogs players coached by Calhoun is Robert Mathis, the SWAC defensive player-of-the-year in 2002. A fifth-round draft pick in 2003, Mathis is now in his seventh season as a defensive end with the Indianapolis Colts.

Calhoun was an all-conference defensive end at Grossmont Community College in San Diego and then received his bachelor of arts degree in health and physical education from Morehouse College in 1995.

He began his coaching career at Idaho State University in 1997, serving as the head strength and conditioning coach and also assisting the defensive line coach.

He returned to Morehouse in 1998 and spent four seasons as defensive line coach, including back-to-back eight-game winning seasons. One of his players, Isaac Keys, signed as a free agent with the Minnesota Vikings and was a linebacker with the Arizona Cardinals in 2006.

Keith Clark is the newest member of the football coaching staff under head coach Buddy Teevens. Clark is a 17-year veteran of the Ivy League and has over 20 years of coaching experience.

Clark spent the past 12 seasons on the sidelines at Yale. He began his tenure as the offensive line coach before being elevated to associate head coach in 2003. He also spent time as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator as Yale broke 75 school offensive records. During his 12 years at Yale, he helped them to an overall record of 70-49 and two Ivy Championships (1999 and 2006). No less than 11 Bulldog offensive linemen earned first team All-Ivy honors under his watchful eye.

Clark got his start in the Ivy League at Columbia, spending five years with the Lions as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator. He also oversaw the strength program and team travel as part of his duties. In his final season at Columbia, the Lions posted a record of 8-2, their best showing in 50 years.

"Keith is a great addition to our staff," Coach Teevens stated. "He is a veteran of the Ivy League and has a deep understanding of what it takes to be successful on the field and on the recruiting trail in this conference. You cannot underestimate the experience he brings to the table and his ability to translate that experience into helping us become a better team."

Prior to his Ivy League service, Clark spent three seasons at Wagner College, serving as the offensive line coach, recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and strength coach. The Seahawks posted a 16-13 mark with Clark on the staff. He coached for single seasons at Rutgers as a graduate assistant coach in 1988, Maine as the Black Bears won the Yankee Conference and advanced to the I-AA playoffs, and his alma mater, Lafayette in 1986. In addition, he was the head coach of the Bolzano Jets in Italy for two seasons, posting an overall mark of 21-6.

Clark has been a member of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) since 1987 and is chairman of the FCS Assistant Coach's Committee. He also has been a member of the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame since 1997. Clark has been active in the community as well, participating in Reading for Elementary Schools Program and Middle School Football Mentoring Program.

"I am excited to be a part of a program that has such a great tradition," said Clark. "One thing that attracted me to Dartmouth was the college's commitment to football and athletics in general as evidenced by all the recent upgrades to the facilities. Another draw is Coach Teevens' vision for the program to restore the excellence for which the program is known."

A 1985 graduate of Lafayette with a bachelor's degree in metallurgical engineering, Clark was a three-year starter at offensive left tackle for the Leopards, plus wrestled for two years.

Jarrail (J.J.) Jackson joined the Dartmouth staff in 2006 and is working with the Big Green's corps of wide receivers, a position he knows well in recent years as a continuing standout in arena football competition.

Originally from Houston, Texas, Jackson graduated from the University of Oklahoma in 2000 and has combined coaching and playing over the past nine years.

With the Sooners from 1996-99, Jackson earned All-Big 12 Conference recognition as a wide receiver and punt return specialist. As a senior, he had 54 catches for 659 yards and seven touchdowns. He set eight Sooner records for receiving and returns and still holds the Independence Bowl record with 10 catches against Mississippi in 1999. He ranks second in OU history with 1,238 punt return yards. He was also an outstanding centerfielder for the Sooner baseball team.

From 2000-02, Jackson was on the practice squad with the NFL's Buffalo Bills and now is in his sixth season of arena football play, currently as a member of the Tulsa Talons of the ArenaFootball2 League, the team he launched his af2 career with in 2000.

Jackson played with the Arena Football League's Buffalo/Columbus Destroyers and then with the Austin Wranglers from 2003-05. In 2006, with the af2 Oklahoma City Yard Dawgz, Jackson caught 125 passes for 1,541 yards and 37 touchdowns (all team highs). In 2007 he played 10 games with the Manchester Wolves (470 yards on kick returns, 79 yards on field goal returns and 1,199 all-purpose yards). He finished the 2007 season with the Yard Dawgz. He is the third player in af2 history to score over 900 career points.

Chris Wilkerson, who became associate head coach in 2007, joined Dartmouth's staff in 2005 as defensive coordinator and coach of the linebackers after spending three seasons at San Jose State University of the Western Athletic Conference. He now is in

charge of the running backs and special teams.

In his first season as Dartmouth's defensive coordinator, the Big Green secondary moved from last to first in the Ivy League in pass defense and was ranked 14th nationally in Division I-AA. Over the past three seasons, two of Wilkerson's players, Josh Dooley '06 and Justin Cottrell '08, have joined the ranks of Dartmouth's leading all-time tacklers and been among the Big Green's most honored student-athletes, on the field and academically.

In 2004, Wilkerson coached San Jose's linebackers and was co-special teams coordinator as the Spartans finished second in the WAC and in the top 20 nationally in pass defense. He was the secondary and special teams coach in 2003 and was a nominee for the Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Wilkerson helped the Spartans post their first shutout in 15 years in 2003 when San Jose ranked 11th nationally in kickoff return yardage.

During his first season at San Jose, Wilkerson coached defensive ends and special teams. In 2002 and 2003, the Spartans achieved several national defensive and kicking game statistical rankings.

THE TEAM



2009 SEASON OUTLOOK

Dartmouth head football coach Buddy Teevens makes his point loud and clear for the players, coaches, fans and media. And he says it several ways — new year; clean slate; fresh start. What it means is that no one associated with the team should dwell on the struggles of the 2008 Big Green because the 2009 squad begins the year with a record of 0-0.

“The bad news about last year is that we played 32 freshmen and sophomores,” Teevens stated. “The good news is those freshmen and sophomores are now sophomores and juniors with a good deal of experience and another year of physical maturity.

“We are not going to dwell on the struggles we went through last year,” he continued. “But there were lessons learned throughout the season that will prove to be valuable as we prove our ability to compete in the Ivy League.”

Charged with leading the team and keeping the players focused on the present are co-captains Peter Pidermann and Tim McManus. The duo returns with the most impressive statistics on each of their respective sides of the gridiron. But it is the work they do in practice and the weight room that earned them the respect of their teammates and got them elected co-captains.

It was no surprise to Coach Teevens that Dartmouth finished eighth in the preseason Ivy League poll of the conference’s media members after finishing last a year ago. But that doesn’t mean he can’t utilize that fact to motivate his troops.

“This team has a good nucleus of experienced talent combined with an influx of 32 freshmen,” noted Teevens. “The team speed and athleticism keeps getting better and better, and I have no doubt we are going to surprise quite a few people this year.”

OFFENSE

When people ask about a team’s offense, what they are really asking about is the quarterback. The Big Green started three different players behind center in 2008, but senior Alex Jenny (5-11, 185) emerged as the forerunner for the job this past spring. He began last fall with an impressive game at Colgate, throwing for 343 yards on 29 completions with nary an interception.

But as opponents focused on the defending the passing game, he started to force some plays. Jenny re-established himself last spring, however, by making quality decisions and playing within himself. Reading defenses effectively and taking what they give him to maneuver downfield will be essential to the Big Green’s success this fall.

Waiting in the wings is sophomore Conner Kempe (6-4, 210), who saw action in five of the games last year, starting three. He certainly showed promise, throwing for more than 530 yards in his first two starts while earning an Ivy League Rookie of the Week award in the process. Like Jenny, Kempe has to make consistently effective decisions to garner more time, something which the coaching staff is confident he can do with more seasoning.

Senior Max Heiges (6-3, 200) has great knowledge of the offensive schemes and provides experienced depth, while sophomore Dan Rooney (6-3, 210) continues to develop. One rookie will join the quarterbacking corps in Greg Patton (6-0, 190), a native of College Park, Ga.

The ability of Jenny and company to perform their best will not be dependent on great receivers,

but rather a consistent ground game. “We got into trouble last year when we could not effectively run the ball,” said Teevens. “Our top priority is establishing the run to take pressure off our quarterbacks.”

Sophomore Nick Schwieger (5-10, 200) opens the year at the top of the depth chart as the lead back. He is a power runner who got more time last year as a blocker in the backfield. Spelling Schwieger will be veteran Rob Mitchelson (5-10, 190), a senior who has run for 333 yards in his Big Green career.

Others will have an opportunity to display their skills and work their way into games as well, particularly junior T.J. Cameron (5-11, 200). Cameron has been stifled by injuries his first two seasons, but was the most productive back last spring thanks to good health. If Coach Teevens needs a change of style, he can call upon sophomore Chris Hardy (6-2, 225), a bruising runner that performed well in junior varsity games last fall.

Senior Matthew Dornak (5-11, 200) pleasantly surprised the coaching staff as he made the switch this spring from defensive back to his original position when he arrived on campus three years ago. Another senior defender making the transition to running back is Michael Dearwester (6-1, 200).

Although the passing game needs a balanced attack to ultimately succeed, it doesn’t hurt to have talented receivers, something Dartmouth gladly will put on the field. McManus (6-0, 190), a junior who split time as a quarterback and wide receiver his first two years, will focus solely on his pass-catching skills. The co-captain was an honorable mention All-Ivy pick last year as he ranked fourth in the conference with 60 receptions, which is also the fifth highest total for a Big Green player ever. Whenever he touches the ball, the crowd tenses with excitement, anticipating his elusive moves as he works his way downfield.

The remaining wideouts don’t have the track record of a McManus, but they are talented nonetheless. Sophomore Michael Reilly (6-1, 190) had his development slowed by injuries in the fall, but made up for lost time in the spring. The return

of senior speedster Niles Murphy (6-0, 170) is a welcome addition as he gives Dartmouth a legitimate deep threat. The younger brother of Matthew Dornak, Brad (6-0, 195), is a sophomore that has quickly matured and will be in the regular rotation of receivers.

Another quarterback-turned-receiver is junior Will Deevy (6-5, 205), a rangy athlete with terrific hands, the perfect fit for those fade patterns in the corner of the end zone. Sophomore Garrett Babb (5-9, 165) may be the smallest wideout on the squad, but he makes up for any shortcomings with terrific precision routes.

With veterans like senior James O’Brien (5-11, 185), and juniors Tim Vanderet (6-5, 210) and Tanner Scott (6-4, 190), plus a strong group of rookies, the Big Green will not have a position with greater depth than wide receiver.

Then again, tight end has four very capable athletes who can catch the ball and block defenders with equal aplomb. Battling for the starting role will be sophomore John Gallagher (6-3, 245) and senior Carroll Papajohn (6-5, 245). Gallagher took advantage of his opportunities as a rookie, catching 12 passes for 111 yards — only McManus returns with more receptions and yardage. Papajohn hauled in nine passes himself, and the pair will quite likely share the bulk of the playing time.

Juniors Kevin Gallagher (6-3, 240) and Mike Cummings (6-5, 265), who missed most of last season with an injury, will also play some snaps.

Remember those freshmen and sophomore who absorbed valuable experience last year? Nowhere on the roster will that be better demonstrated than the offensive line. The 10 players listed on the preseason two-deep chart at the five positions are all sophomore and juniors this year. Overseeing the line this year is the newest addition to the staff, Keith Clark, a 17-year veteran of the Ivy League.

Anchoring the line will be sophomore center Austen Fletcher (6-1, 275) who started every game as a freshman. His physical maturity is quickly catching up with his acumen for the blocking schemes. Sophomores Zach Wodka (6-3, 270) and Kyle Cook (6-5, 255) are strong reserves that will push Fletcher to maintain his starting role.

Flanking the center will be a pair of sophomores in Patrick Lahey (6-3, 280) and Ryan O’Neill (6-4, 255) at left guard, and Cook and junior Alex Wodka (6-3, 295) at right guard. The three sophomores in the group all saw most of their action on the junior varsity, but have rapidly established themselves. The elder Wodka started every game last year, yet will be in a battle all year to continue in that role.

The starters at the left and right tackles are expected to be a couple of juniors in Will Montgomery (6-5, 280) and John O’Sullivan (6-5, 295), giving the Big Green great size on the flanks of the line. Serving as backups will be sophomores Grant Palmer (6-4, 250) and Brock Middleton (6-5, 275).

A pair of wild cards up front are senior Alexander Toth (6-5, 280) and junior Shane Peterlin (6-4, 285), both of whom began the 2008 season as starters. But Peterlin missed the second half of the season and all of the spring, while Toth was unavailable in the spring as well. If those two can return to form, the outlook for the line will be that much greater. And it remains to be seen what the seven incoming freshmen — three tip the scales around 300 pounds — might be able to provide.

DEFENSE

Just as the focus of the offense is on improving the running game, the defensive priority is containing it. Opponents racked up more than 230 yards per game against the Big Green defense last year.

"We simply cannot afford to let teams push us around up front which leads to the big plays that killed us last year," emphasized Teevens. "Containing the run starts on the defensive line, and I like the personnel we have there."

The veteran of the line is junior Charles Bay (6-3, 245), an end that started every game last year and recorded 30 tackles. He combines the strength to power through the line, as he showed by blocking a pair of kicks in 2008, with the quickness to get around the line and into the backfield. The coaches expect for Bay to enjoy a banner season and improve upon his 30 tackles.

Several will compete for the other starting end slot, led by junior Buddy Benaderet (6-3, 240). He only had three tackles in a limited role last year, but when he made a tackle, it made an impression. In the first game Benaderet forced a fumble on a sack, and in another contest dropped a runner for a two-yard loss.

Also in the mix are senior Matt Oh (6-2, 230) and sophomore Connor Phillips (6-3, 230). Oh plays at one speed — all out, all the time — and has an infectious energy. Phillips played some snaps in the final four games, gradually asserting himself as a viable option.

Between the ends, junior Lane Shipley (6-2, 250) and sophomore Eddie Smith (6-3, 285) are the front-runners to start. Shipley has endured through a significant knee injury that caused him to miss his freshman season and still slowed him a year ago. But he broke through with a great spring and established himself at nose guard. Smith, meanwhile is physically maturing, giving him the size and strength to overpower blockers and disrupt plays in the backfield.

Coach Teevens has several viable options at either defensive tackle as well, between seniors Jeffrey Smith (6-3, 245) and Michael Wu (6-0, 260), junior Tyler Green (6-4, 265) and sophomore Mark Dwyer (6-4, 270). The Smiths are not related, and they also possess distinctive styles. Whereas Eddie Smith will utilize brute strength quite often, Jeffrey Smith relies more on quickness off the ball to get the job done.

Green, the lone New Hampshire native on the

roster, and Dwyer both saw limited action in 2008, appearing in four games. Wu is back on the field after missing last year with an injury.

The linebacking corps suffered perhaps the greatest losses to graduation with the departure of Andrew Dete, Joe Battaglia and Tony Bates, Dartmouth's second-, third- and fifth-leading tacklers last year, respectively. A stable of sophomores are expected to compete for most of the positions, but one senior will be looked upon to provide experience and leadership from the strong side.

Marlon Alebiosu (6-0, 210) shuttled between the line and linebacker last year, but settled into the latter position during the spring. His knowledge of the game and foot speed make him equally adept at stepping up to fill a hole and stuff the run, and dropping back into pass coverage.

Backing him up will be sophomore Tyler Melancon (5-11, 205) who has made a rather seamless adjustment from safety to linebacker. Junior Alex Johns (6-4, 230) is coming off a great summer of training, putting on 15 pounds to give the Big Green a larger option as well.

In the middle of the field will be sophomore Royce Egeolu (5-10, 240), who lined up as a defensive tackle last year. He combines the strength of a lineman with surprising speed and agility, making him an ideal middle linebacker. Sophomore Bruno Vetter (6-1, 235) was hobbled by an ankle injury last year, but has parlayed a strong spring into a spot on the preseason two-deep with an eye on the starting job.

Over on the weak side, sophomore Diego Fernandez-Soto (6-0, 205) really impressed during the spring, enough to warrant the early edge on the starting spot. But fellow sophomore Aaron Limonthas (6-0, 210) will push hard to create a great competition between the two. Junior Spencer Hood (6-2, 205), who posted 29 tackles last season, could quickly re-establish himself as well after missing the spring while studying abroad.

"The recruiting we've done in recent years has really improved the speed at the linebacker position," Teevens said. "The athletic depth we have at those positions will be very important as the season wears on."

The Big Green haven't forgotten the importance of defending the pass, and in sophomore cornerback Shawn Abuhoff (5-10, 180), Dartmouth has one of the top cover men in the Ivy League. He intercepted three passes and broke up five others, leading the team in both categories and ranking in the conference's top 10. His ability to blanket receivers will help give the line that extra split-second to put pressure on the quarterback, which in turn will force more mistakes and turnovers.

At the other corner is junior Robbie Krattiger (5-10, 190), who started eight games in 2008 and broke up four passes as well. There will also be several capable cornerbacks to allow Coach Teevens to mix nickel and dime packages and keep fresh bodies in the defensive backfield at all times. Senior Chris Burns (5-9, 175), junior Steven Morris (6-0, 185), and sophomores

Chad Hollis (5-10, 180) and J.B. Andreassi (5-10, 180) all distinguished themselves in the spring.

The senior co-captain Pidermann (6-0, 190) returns for his final year at free safety. Last season he registered 59 tackles, the most among returning players, while intercepting a pass and breaking up three others. He has great field vision and delivers some of the hardest hits on the squad.

Getting the unenviable task of replacing the Big Green's top tackler and All-Ivy performer at strong safety, Ian Wilson, will be the duo of senior Tony Pastoors (6-2, 195) and junior Pat Scorah (5-8, 205). The pair will likely be interchanged regularly as Coach Teevens pits the strengths of each according to the game situation. Pastoors, coming off two seasons marred by injury, is back to full health and ready to put his length to good use in coverage.

Then there is Scorah, who closes fast and hard, making him particularly well-suited against the run.

Providing depth will be sophomores Joey Casey (5-10, 180) and Anthony Diblasi (6-1, 180), each of whom made significant progress in their development in the spring.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Dartmouth excelled at special teams last year, and this year should be no different. Foley Schmidt (5-9, 195) emerged as a consistent place kicker from within 45 yards as a rookie, connecting on 9-of-13 field goals and all but one of his 13 PATs. Punter Brian Scullin averaged over 40 yards a punt and earned honorable mention All-America honors as he helped the Big Green lead the nation in net punting. And Donald Kephart (5-11, 220), now a junior, regularly boomed the ball on kickoffs, greatly helping the Green in the battle of field position.

Only Scullin in that group does not return, as he graduated and moved on to tryouts with NFL squads. His departure does not cause Coach Teevens much concern due to the presence of junior Matthew Kelly (6-3, 205). After serving as an apprentice of sorts to Scullin, he gets his chance to show off his strong leg this fall.

The kick returners are just as accomplished, headlined by Abuhoff and Pidermann. Each returned a kickoff for a touchdown last year, while Abuhoff averaged over 30 yards on his kickoff returns. Schwieger and Andreassi have also shown a knack for returning kicks, and will also line up deep on kickoffs and punts. That may be crucial when teams try to avoid kicking to either Abuhoff or Pidermann.

Coach Teevens recognizes that all the potential in the world doesn't win ball games. That potential must become realized in the heat of competition.

"We have the players to be competitive in this league," he stated directly when asked for an overview of the squad. "We show it every day in practice. But we have to be able to produce against others on game day and prove it to everyone — the fans, parents, alumni and media. We have a winning tradition at Dartmouth, one that we need to restore."

2008 GAME RECAPS

GAME 1, SEPT. 20 — COLGATE 34, DARTMOUTH 20



HAMILTON, N.Y. — Junior Alex Jenny threw for a career-high 343 yards for Dartmouth, but the Colgate tandem of Jordan Scott and Greg Sullivan stole the show by rushing for a combined 375 yards and four touchdowns to lead the host Raiders.

Making just his second career start, Jenny displayed poise under pressure while making good decisions, completing 29 of his 48 pass attempts without throwing an interception. One of Jenny's completions was a three-yard score to senior wide receiver Eric Paul, who caught five passes for 87 yards. The leading receiver for the Big Green was senior Philip Galligan who hauled in 10 passes for 146 yards, both career highs in his first 100-yard game.

Scott, a preseason All-American tailback and the leading active career rusher, barreled for 239 yards on 29 carries and a pair of touchdowns for his 16th consecutive 100-yard game. He also broke the Patriot League rushing record and surpassed 5,000 yards for his career (5,015). Sullivan became the first Colgate quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a game (136) in 10 years, also reaching the end zone twice.

Tied at 13 in the third quarter, Dartmouth took a seven-point lead following a touchdown toss to

Paul. But Colgate countered by converting a 3rd-and-34 with a 35-yard pass to Sam Breslin, setting up the tying score.

The Big Green had an opportunity to break the tie with a 22-yard field goal attempt, only to have the Raiders deflect the ball enough to leave it short

of the crossbar. Even after Colgate took the lead mid-way through the fourth quarter, Dartmouth drove back into the red zone. The drive stalled at the 17, taking the steam out of the Big Green. Scott barreled for 49 yards before Sullivan burst through for a 31-yard score, putting the game out of reach.

GAME 2, SEPT. 27 — #7 NEW HAMPSHIRE 42, DARTMOUTH 6



HANOVER, N.H. — Dartmouth had few answers for seventh-ranked New Hampshire in the Big Green's home opener as the Wildcats built a 28-0 lead en route to a 42-6 victory. The victory was the 11th straight for UNH against the Big Green, dating back to 1992.

The Wildcat offense was as stout as advertised entering the game (19th nationally in total offense), amassing 525 yards — 265 on the ground and 260 through the air. Quarterback R.J. Toman topped 200 yards via the pass, completing 17-of-23 for 208 yards and one touchdown, plus had 46 yards rushing.

The Big Green, on the other hand, managed only 238 total yards, 146 of which came in the second half. Junior Alex Jenny was pressured all afternoon, yet still completed 18-of-32 passes for 130 yards and a touchdown.

Field position gave New Hampshire a strong advantage at the outset of the game with the Wildcats starting the game at the Dartmouth 48 and their next possession at midfield. The Big Green, meanwhile, began inside their own 10 twice in their first three possessions. The disparity allowed UNH to build a 14-0 lead in the first quarter.

The lone score for Dartmouth came on an

impressive 15-play, 72-yard drive late in the third quarter. Twice New Hampshire had goal-line stops at the one, but on third-and-goal from the three, Jenny lofted a pass to Philip McKeating, a linebacker

helping out on the short-yardage team, for the score.

Nine different receivers caught passes for the Big Green, including quarterback Jenny on a reverse pass from sophomore Tim McManus.

Neither team could run the ball in the first half, with Dartmouth gaining 13 yards on the ground and the Quakers just one. That changed for Penn in the second half as it gobbled up 138 rushing yards, thanks mostly to Mike DiMaggio, who ran for 123 of his 129 yards after the half.

A Milan Williams fumble at the Big Green 18 set up Penn's first touchdown. Less than three minutes later, Dartmouth freshman Royce Egeolu forced a fumble, scooped it up and stumbled 16 yards — just one yard shy of the end zone. No matter as senior Hudson Smythe plunged in to tie the game.

Just before the half, the Quakers tried to mount a drive, only to have safety Peter Pidermann corral an interception at the Quaker 22 on a 4th-and-5.

A 38-yard pass from Alex Jenny to Tim McManus in the third quarter put the Green inside the 10, but they ended up settling for a 27-yard field goal from freshman Foley Schmidt and a 10-7 lead.

A 33-yard Dimaggio run was the big blow in the ensuing Quaker touchdown drive spanning six

plays and 73 yards as Penn retook the lead, 14-10. A fake punt kept Penn's next possession alive as it got a field goal to extend the lead to seven in the fourth quarter.

HANOVER, N.H. — Dartmouth turned the ball over four times, and Yale turned each of those miscues into touchdowns en route to a 34-7 Ivy League victory. Yale recovered one fumble and intercepted three passes, the last of which was returned 24 yards by cornerback Paul Rice

with 3:39 to play for the last score of the day.

The game started well for Dartmouth as it marched right down the field to the Yale six after the opening kickoff, only to have Yale linebacker Bobby Abare force the first turnover with an interception in the end zone for a touchback.

The Bulldogs marched back the other way, scoring a touchdown to finish off a 10-play, 80-yard drive after the pick. The extra-point attempt, however, was blocked by sophomore Charles Bay, who burst through the line.

HANOVER, N.H. — Harvard entered the game with the ninth most passing yards in the FCS at nearly 300 per game. Although the Big Green kept the Crimson under 100 yards through the air, they could not contain the visitor's surprising rushing attack as Harvard ran for 368 yards

on 63 carries in a 35-7 triumph.

While the Crimson were running all over the field, their defense completely shut down the Dartmouth rushing attack, to the tune of minus-two yards on 19 attempts, the fewest attempts ever by a Harvard opponent. Overall the Big Green managed 123 yards of total offense, nearly half of which came on their final drive of the game that resulted in their lone score.

GAME 8, NOV. 8 — CORNELL 37, DARTMOUTH 14



ITHACA, N.Y. — Two blocked field goal attempts in the first quarter set the tone for the game as host Cornell snapped a four-game losing streak by defeating Dartmouth, 37-14. Big Red quarterback Nathan Ford passed for 306 yards to lead Cornell.

Ford was rarely off-target all afternoon, completing 25-of-30 passes to post his third 300-yard game of the season with one touchdown and one interception. His lone scoring pass was a 96-yard bomb, the second longest pass in Cornell history. The running game was led by Randy Barbour with 70 yards on 13 carries with one touchdown, while Luke Siwula scored twice on the ground.

For Dartmouth, freshman Conner Kempe made his first collegiate start at quarterback, completing 25-of-52 passes for 256 yards, but he also had three passes intercepted.

The Big Red went right to work at the outset of the game, covering 76 yards in 13 plays for an early 7-0 lead. Kempe completed his first five passes for Dartmouth and guided the offense down to the Cornell 14 before the drive stalled. The 31-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Graham Rihn, and Andy Wade scooped up the ball and returned it for a Big Red touchdown. The point after gave

Cornell a 14-point advantage.

Another blocked field goal at the end of the first quarter kept the Big Green off the board, and by the half, Cornell had a 17-point lead. It was 30-0 before Dartmouth score on a Milan Williams run

from three yards out late in the third quarter.

Kempe also took Dartmouth on a 13-play, 71-yard drive on its final possession of the game, with Kempe scoring his first collegiate touchdown on a fourth-down, one-yard keeper.

HANOVER, N.H.

— The final home game of the season was spoiled by Brown on a rainy Saturday afternoon as the Big Green allowed 510 yards in a 45-16 defeat. Bear quarterback Michael Dougherty completed 16-of-22 passes for 238 yards with a pair of touchdowns, plus led

the team with 73 rushing yards, 69 of which came on a third-quarter touchdown run.

Dartmouth freshman Conner Kempe (Tequesta, Fla.) topped Dougherty with 275 yards through the air, connecting on 27-of-42 with one touchdown. Fellow freshman Shawn Abuhoff set a Dartmouth record with 190 kickoff return yards, including a 94-yard touchdown.

Brown marched 75 yards in eight plays on the opening possession to take a 7-0 lead as Dougherty completed all five of his passes during the drive.

On Dartmouth's first play, Kempe had his pass tipped, and Nkosi Still snagged the ball at the Big Green 43. Seven plays later Sewall scampered in for a touchdown from a yard out. A Robert Ranney field goal brought Brown's total to 17.

Abuhoff brought the crowd to its feet on the ensuing kickoff, catching the ball at the six near the far sideline, then scooting to his left across the field and up the other sideline for a touchdown. Junior

Tony Pastoors provided a crushing block that allowed Abuhoff to turn the corner up the field. It was the first kickoff returned for a touchdown by the Big Green since Steve Jensen brought one back 94 yards against Columbia in 2001.

But Brown could not be contained, needing just

seven plays to reach the end zone again, then returning a pick 31 yards for another touchdown with more than 13 minutes remaining in the half.

A Foley Schmidt field goal and a Philip Galligan six-yard catch in the end zone as the game ended made up the rest of Dartmouth's points.

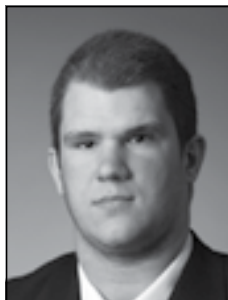

ACADEMIC HONORS

Student-Athletes

At a time when some would suggest that the phrase “student-athlete” is an oxymoron, Dartmouth continues to demonstrate that excellence in academics and athletics are not mutually exclusive.

“Athletics and athletes have played and will continue to play an important part in the life of the College,” said President James Wright. “Today, athletics are an integral part of the Dartmouth experience.”

Dartmouth has one of the nation’s highest graduation rates of football players in the country. Since 1970, 40 student-athletes at Dartmouth—15 of them football players—have been honored with Academic All-America selection. Twelve Dartmouth football players have also received NCAA postgraduate scholarships and six have received National Football Foundation scholar-athlete grants.

These statistics illustrate the premium that Dartmouth places on the blend of academic achievement with athletics and general fitness. Dartmouth encourages a well-rounded interest in many activities—from music and art to student government and volunteer community service.

Academic All-America

The Academic All-America team is sponsored annually in several sports by GTE and the College Sports Information Directors of America. Players selected must be either a starter or key reserve and have at least a 3.20 grade point average.

17-TIME IVY LEAGUE CHAMPIONS

DARTMOUTH IN PRO FOOTBALL

The academically prestigious Ivy League may seem a long way from the bone-jarring world of professional football but more than 40 Dartmouth football alumni have reached this level over the years, including one Pro Football Hall of Famer. Among Dartmouth players in the professional ranks:

Dartmouth's most recent NFL draftee is Casey Cramer '04, the All-America and All-Ivy tight end who became one of Dartmouth's all-time receiving leaders from 2000-03. Cramer was taken in the seventh round of the 2004 draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as a tight end-fullback. He played with the Carolina Panthers in 2004-05 and joined the Tennessee Titans in 2006.

Jay Fiedler '94, the Ivy League player-of-the-year in 1992 who holds virtually every Dartmouth passing record, succeeded Dan Marino in 2000 as the Miami Dolphins' quarterback and helped the Dolphins reach the NFL playoffs. During five seasons with the Dolphins, Fiedler had a 36-23 record as a starter, passing for 11,040 yards and 66 touchdowns. He played for the New York Jets in 2005, a season punctuated by injuries that continued to plague him with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and prompted his retirement in 2006. Over 11 seasons Fiedler had a career won-lost record of 37-23 with 11,844 yards passing and 69 touchdowns.

Fiedler signed originally as a free agent with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1994. He later moved to the Minnesota Vikings. After a tour in NFL Europe in 1998, he was the backup quarterback with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 1999 as the Jags also reached the playoffs.

Linebacker Zack Walz '98, one of four Dartmouth players to be voted first team All-Ivy three times, was drafted in the sixth round by the Arizona Cardinals in 1998. Walz was the first Dartmouth player taken in the draft since Gregg Robinson '78 was tapped by the New York Jets in the sixth round in 1978.

During five seasons, though dogged by leg injuries, Walz saw special teams and starting action with the Cardinals. He was a teammate of and roomed with Pat Tillman who left pro football to become an Army Ranger and was killed in Afghanistan in 2004.

Walz's Dartmouth teammate, defensive back Lloyd Lee '98, signed in 1998 as a free agent with the San Diego Chargers and saw spot duty with the Chargers for two seasons. He remained in pro football on the staff of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He is now a coach with the Chicago Bears who went to the Super Bowl in 2007.

In 2000, tight end Adam Young '99 signed a free agent contract with the New York Giants. Young owns a ring from New York's 2001 Super Bowl appearance.

Caleb Moore '01, captain and All-Ivy guard in 2000, signed as a free agent with the Tennessee Titans but was an unsuccessful candidate with both the Titans and Arizona Cardinals.

Over the Years in the NFL

Dartmouth has been represented in the NFL from the league's beginning when Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle Ed Healey '18 was the first player in the NFL to be traded, moving from the Rock Island Independents to the Chicago Bears after player-coach and future owner George Halas acquired his services for \$100. Healey played with the Bears from 1922-27 and was called by Halas "the most versatile tackle in history."

Drafted in the third round of the 1976 draft by the Cincinnati Bengals, Reggie Williams '76 enjoyed a 14-year career as an All-Pro linebacker for the Bengals. Williams made two Super Bowl appearances with the Bengals (1982, 1989). He was named the NFL's Man of the Year in 1986.

After persevering through 11 cuts by eight different teams, Nick Lowery '78 broke into the NFL in 1980. He had an 18-year career with the Kansas City Chiefs and New York Jets and set the NFL record for career field goals. He remains the league's most accurate field goal kicker of all time (80 percent).

Jeff Kemp '81 followed his father, Jack Kemp, into the NFL. He spent more than a decade as a quarterback with the Seattle Seahawks, Los Angeles Rams, San Francisco 49ers and Philadelphia Eagles.

Kemp's classmate, Dave Shula '81, made his mark with an NFL

coaching career that included stops with Miami and Dallas. In 1992, the Cincinnati Bengals made him the youngest head coach in NFL history. At age 31, he edged his famous father, Don Shula, by a few months.

Quarterback Mike Brown '57 followed his father, legendary coach Paul Brown, into NFL management. He is president and general manager of the Bengals. Brown's daughter, Kate Brown Blackburn '86, now is the Bengals' executive vice president.

For the past 15 years, John Idzik '82, a wide receiver in 1981, has been an NFL administrator. He spent 11 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and three with the Arizona Cardinals. He became vice president, football administration for the Seattle Seahawks in 2007.

Other Dartmouth Professionals

Other Dartmouth players who have gone into pro football (but not the NFL) include: Anthony Gargiulo '06 was a defensive end with the Calgary Stampeders (CLF) in 2007 and is trying to make a comeback from a broken leg suffered in the final game of the season. Derham Cato '05 was a defensive tackle with the Toronto Argonauts in 2007 and is pursuing other pro football options this season.

Wide receiver Craig Morton '89 and David Clark '90 played for Frankfurt and Birmingham respectively in the World League of American Football. Quarterback Jim Chasey '71, co-recipient with Cornell's Ed Marinaro of the first Bushnell Award as the Ivy League's outstanding player in 1970, played with the Montreal Alouettes in the Canadian Football League in the early 1970s.

Kyle Schroeder '00, a standout defensive end at Dartmouth in 1998-99, played with the XFL's Birmingham Thunderbolts in 2001.

Quarterbacks Greg Smith '02 and Brian Mann '02 have recent Arena Football League experience. Mann played for several seasons with the Los Angeles Avengers and also made his debut as an actor as the stand-in for Adam Sandler in the movie, *The Longest Yard*, released in 2005.

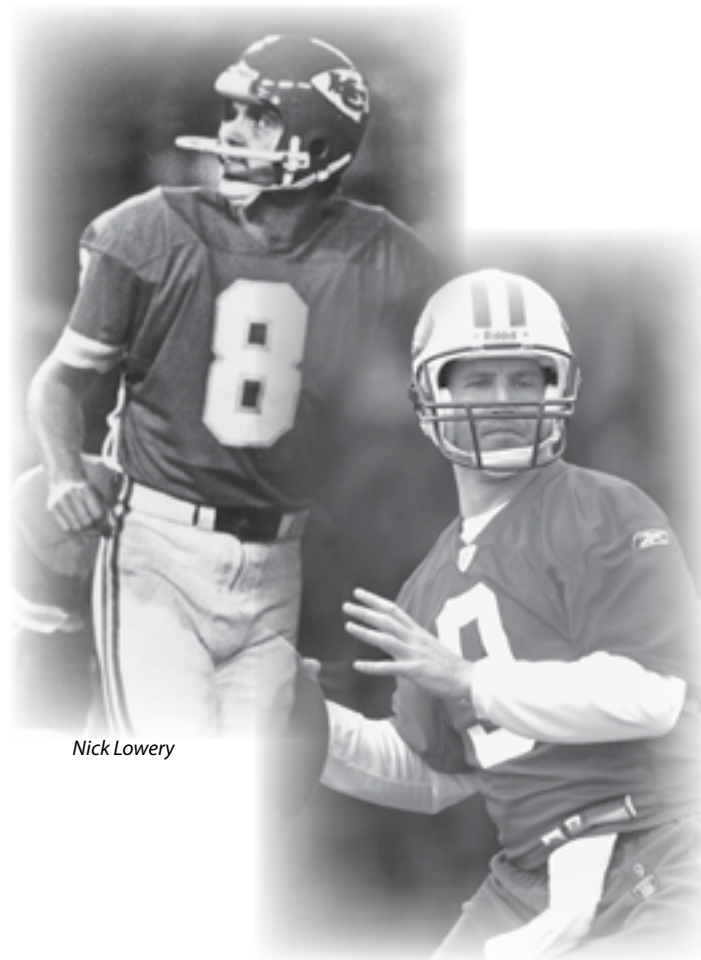

In addition, five Dartmouth coaches or administrators are in the College Hall of Fame.

Dartmouth's Hall of Fame Players

Year of induction in parentheses



Ed Healey

Clarence (Fat) Spears 1917 (1955) — All-America guard in 1914-15 and Dartmouth's head coach from 1917-20.

Edward Healey 1918 (1974) — A tackle at Dartmouth before and after World War I. He was the first player in pro football

history to be sold, to the Chicago Bears for whom he played from 1922-27. Healey is also in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Andrew (Swede) Oberlander 1926 (1954) — All-America halfback and passer who led Dartmouth to the national championship in 1925.

Myles Lane 1928 (1970) — Dartmouth's all-time scoring leader (307 points from 1925-27). Lane is also enshrined in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame.

William (Air Mail) Morton 1932 (1972) — All-America quarterback in 1931. Also a two-time All-America in hockey.

Robert MacLeod 1939 (1977) — All-America halfback in 1938.

Murry Bowden 1971 (2003) — All-America defensive back in 1970.

Reggie Williams 1976 (2007) — All-America linebacker in 1975.

Dartmouth's Hall of Fame Coaches and Administrators

Edward K. Hall 1892 (1951, charter inductee) — An end at Dartmouth in 1890-91 and coach at Illinois in 1892-93, he became a member of the Football Rules Committee in 1905 and wrote the first Football Code for players. He served as successor to Walter Camp as chairman of the Football Rules Committee from 1911-32.

Frank W. Cavanaugh 1899 (1954) — Coached Dartmouth to a 42-9-3 record from 1911-16. Also coached at Holy Cross, Boston College and Fordham.

D. O. (Tuss) McLaughry (1962) — Dartmouth's coach from 1941-42 and from 1945-54 (44-58-3). Also coached Brown from 1926-40 (76-58-5).

Earl H. Blaik (1964) — Dartmouth's coach from 1934-40 (45-15-4). Later coached at West Point.

Robert L. Blackman (1987) — Had three undefeated teams as Dartmouth's coach from 1955-70 (104-37-3). Later coached at Illinois and Cornell.

Murry Bowden '71



Murry Bowden's election to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003 recognizes his individual achievements on the gridiron but he's first to say, "...this recognition is really a tribute to our team and brings honor to Dartmouth and the Ivy League."

Bowden was co-captain and All-America rover back of Dartmouth's 1970 team that was undefeated Ivy League champion and shut out six of nine opponents. Dartmouth won the Lambert Trophy as the East's outstanding team. With Bowden in the lineup in 1969 and 1970, Dartmouth won 17 of 18 games.

A psychology major from Snyder, Texas, Bowden graduated cum laude and earned a law degree from the University of Texas. In 1984 he co-founded The Hanover Company, a private real estate development company in Houston.

Reggie Williams '76



In 1975, Reggie Williams was recognized as the most conspicuous player in Dartmouth football annals since halfback Bob MacLeod was a consensus All-America in 1938.

A three-time All-Ivy League first-team selection from 1973-

75, Williams was named to every All-East, All-Ivy and All-New England team in 1974 and 1975, earning a spot on the American Football Coaches Association All-America Team the latter year. His place among the greatest players in Ivy League history was reinforced by his subsequent 14-year career (1976-89) with the Cincinnati Bengals.

"Being selected for the College Football Hall of Fame is a great honor and a culminating moment for me, for Dartmouth College, and for the Ivy League," said Williams, whose post-NFL career has been devoted to developing sports programs and being a positive role model for boys and girls of all ages from across the nation.

His career with the Bengals included appearances in the Super Bowl in 1982 and 1989. He was selected to the NFL's All-Rookie Team in 1976. He won the NFL's Byron (Whizzer) White Award for Humanitarian Service in 1985 and was the NFL's Man of the Year in 1986. In 1987, he was Sports Illustrated's Co-Sportsman of the Year. In 1988 he was appointed to an open seat on the Cincinnati City Council and was elected to a second term in 1989. In 1990 he received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Dartmouth.

WINNING TRADITION



DARTMOUTH'S WINNING TRADITION

In the fall of 1876, when football was evolving from the game of rugby and rules were uncertain, a group of Dartmouth students erected the first goal posts on the campus green. They remained in place for several months but were removed before commencement in 1877.

Students arriving as freshmen in 1878 brought with them experience with the new game. In 1880, another freshman, Clarence (Cap) Howland '84 joined them and proved to be the catalyst for the sport that sought recognition on campus. Football suits were purchased from Princeton and a season of practice unfolded.

On November 16, 1881, Dartmouth football began when Amherst visited Hanover. After scoring the game's only touchdown for Dartmouth, Charles Oakes '83 was carried across campus, the center of a jubilant celebration. On November 25, Thanksgiving Day, the teams met again in Springfield, Mass. The game was scoreless when play was terminated due to snow. Dartmouth's newest sport was established and its first football team finished undefeated.

Dartmouth immediately sought out the nation's best teams to learn the intricacies of the game. In 1882, the Green lost to Harvard (53-0). In 1884, Yale visited Hanover (they would not make a return trip until 1971) and tutored Dartmouth to the tune of 113-0. During the next 20 years, against teams with comparable experience, Dartmouth usually won in equally convincing fashion.

The Harvard game in 1903, marking the dedication of Harvard's new stadium, brought Dartmouth football to national prominence. Winless in 18 previous meetings with the Crimson and scoreless in the first 16, Dartmouth won, 11-0.

Dartmouth's winning tradition over the past 126 seasons is measured in achievement on the field and contribution by those who have played and coached at Dartmouth, many of whom took their gridiron experience to other colleges across the country.

The Green's overall record—643 wins versus 410 losses and 46 ties—is among the best in the nation and includes nine undefeated seasons, a national championship and 13 inductees in the College Football Hall of Fame.

The Great Eras

There has been a succession of great eras in Dartmouth football:

From 1901-09, Dartmouth had a record of 58-9-7 under the coaching of Walter McCornack, Fred Folsom and John O'Connor.

From 1911-16, Frank Cavanaugh guided Dartmouth to a 42-9-3 record, then became known as the "Iron Major" for his heroics in World War I. One of his best players, Clarence (Fat) Spears, continued the success as the war ended but it was Jesse Hawley who took Dartmouth to unparalleled heights from 1923-28.

Under Hawley, Dartmouth went 22 games without a loss from 1923-26, including the undefeated (8-0-0) national championship team in 1925 led by two Hall of Fame inductees, Swede Oberlander and Myles Lane, and a Rhodes Scholar, Captain Nathan Parker.

Though the Green had a record of 27-14-3 under Jack Cannell from 1929-33, eight losses in his last two seasons prompted a search for a new coach. President Ernest Martin Hopkins's choice was Earl Blaik who would guide Dartmouth to a record of 45-15-4 over the next seven seasons, then moved on to lead West Point. Blaik's teams at Dartmouth produced another 22-game unbeaten streak from 1936-38. The 1937 team was undefeated but Dartmouth declined an invitation to play in the Rose Bowl. The Blaik years included Dartmouth's first-ever win over Yale (1935) and the famous "Fifth Down" game in 1940, a 3-0 win over previously undefeated Cornell.

The post-World War II years under Hall of Fame coach Tuss McLaughry included the first years of an exclusively "major" schedule.



All-America halfback Jim (Swede) Oberlander ran for 12 touchdowns and passed for another 14 scores as a leader of Dartmouth's national champions in 1925.

The Ivy League Years

In 1955, as formal Ivy League play was about to begin, another Hall of Fame coach, Bob Blackman, succeeded McLaughry and launched a 16-year tenure at Dartmouth that included: 104 wins, three undefeated seasons, selection twice as the East's best team (1965, 1970), and seven Ivy League titles. Blackman's last team, in 1970, was undefeated, ranked 14th in the nation, and shut out six opponents en route to outscoring nine teams, 311-42.

Jake Crouthamel, a standout halfback under Blackman (1957-59) and later one of his assistants, became head coach in 1971 and led Dartmouth to three straight Ivy titles and missed an undefeated season in 1971 by two points.

The championship tradition has continued over the past quarter-century. Under Joe Yukica (1978-86), Dartmouth won three Ivy titles, including 1978 when Yukica's successor as coach, Buddy Teevens, was named the Ivy League Player of the Year.

Teevens revitalized Dartmouth football during his five seasons (1987-91), leading the Green to Ivy titles in 1990 and 1991. When Teevens departed, his defensive coordinator, John Lyons, took the reins.

During 13 seasons, Lyons added two more Ivy championships, the first in 1992 and another in 1996 when Dartmouth finished with a 10-0-0 record, the centerpiece of another 22-game unbeaten streak that ran from 1995-97.

Since formal Ivy League round robin play began in 1956, Dartmouth has won the most league games (217) and championships (17 outright or shared). The Big Green has the Ivy's best won-lost record in 52 seasons of round robin play. The Green has produced 187 All-Ivy first team players, a standard it shares with Harvard.

In 2005, Buddy Teevens returned as head coach to continue the great tradition of championship football at Dartmouth.



Over three seasons (1957-59), Jake Crouthamel ran for 1,763 yards and averaged 4.6 yards per carry. He coached the Big Green from 1971-77.

1867

Various institutions begin to adopt a special college color. The Dartmouth reports, "...Dartmouth claims green." At the time, "Whole Division" is Dartmouth's distinctive predecessor to football, pitting seniors and sophomores against juniors and freshmen in the free pursuit of a ball by every student not physically incapacitated.

Unblemished Teams

Dartmouth has had five undefeated-untied teams—1925, 1962, 1965, 1970, 1996. The 1925 team was named national champion. The 1965 and 1970 teams were awarded the Lambert Trophy as the outstanding Division I team in Eastern college football.

1876

John Ingham '77, Chalmers Stevens '77 and Lewis Parkhurst '78 erect rugby-style goal posts on the campus Green but Dartmouth isn't prepared to support the fledgling sport of football. The goal posts are torn down prior to commencement in 1877. In 1910, Mr. Parkhurst, now a trustee, donates the funds for Parkhurst Hall (today it is Dartmouth's principal administration building).

1880

The arrival of Clarence (Cap) Howland '84, familiar with the game, inspires creation of a football squad that practices but is unable to schedule a game. Howland is regarded as the "father of Dartmouth football."

1881

On November 16, Dartmouth plays its first game, defeating Amherst, 1-0 (touchdowns were valued at one point). Charles Oakes '83 scores the touchdown. His grandson, Abner Oakes '56, will later be a captain and coach of the Dartmouth men's hockey team.

1882

Harvard visits Hanover and beats Dartmouth, 53-0. The Dartmouth comments, "...if there is any other game that Dartmouth can play better than football, it would be well to encourage it."

1884

Yale, considered the best team in the country, is invited to Hanover and wins, 113-0. The "Yale Jinx" is born.

1886

Bill Odlin '90 is captain and coach from 1886-89. His innovations include introduction of the wedge style of rushing offense and calling of signals by numbers. Odlin's leadership firmly establishes the fledgling sport at Dartmouth.

1890

Charles Gill, an All-America tackle at Yale, is Dartmouth's first paid coach, albeit for only three weeks. He returned to New Haven to coach the Yale line. Team captains continue in the dual role of coach.

1893

Wallace Moyle, a substitute end for Yale, is hired as Dartmouth's first "all-season" coach. Losses to Harvard (16-0) and Yale (28-0) are measures of the Green's improved play.

1894

In its first quest for national prominence, Dartmouth travels to Chicago. Playing the Chicago A.C. on Thanksgiving Day, Dartmouth loses, 4-0.

1895

Dr. William Wurttemberg, a four-year player on Yale teams that were 46-1-1 from 1886-89, is Dartmouth's new coach. The Green plays a 13-game schedule (7-5-1), the most games in any season.

1901

Walter McCornack '97 becomes Dartmouth's coach. The Green (9-1) shuts out six teams and loses only at Harvard, 27-12, but scores for the first time in 17 games with the Crimson.

1903

Harvard dedicates the nation's first concrete stadium in Cambridge. Dartmouth beats the Crimson for the first time, 11-0, highlight of a 9-1 season.

1904

A scoreless tie at Harvard is the only blemish on Dartmouth's first unbeaten season (7-0-1) of the century. From 1903-05, Dartmouth builds a 23-2-3 record.

1907

A scoreless tie with Vermont keeps Dartmouth from a perfect season (8-0-1).

1909

A railroad wreck forces Dartmouth to complete its trip from New York to Princeton by trolley. The Green arrives two hours after the scheduled starting time and plays the once-beaten Tigers to a 6-6 tie.

1911

Frank Cavanaugh '99, already a successful coach at Holy Cross, returns to Dartmouth. Over six seasons, he guides the Green to a 42-9-3 record.

1913

The Eastern championship and an undefeated season are in Dartmouth's grasp after a 34-21 win at Penn but Glenn (Pop) Warner's Carlisle Indians uses passing and trick plays to thwart the Green, 35-10, at the Polo Grounds in New York.

1914

Princeton plays its first game in Palmer Stadium and beats Dartmouth, 16-12, the Green's only loss of the season. Dartmouth caps an 8-1 season by beating Syracuse, 40-0, at Fenway Park in Boston.

1917

All-America guard Clarence (Fat) Spears '17 replaces Frank Cavanaugh, bound for service in World War I, as coach.

1919

Penn State visits Alumni Oval (located where Dartmouth now plays baseball) as part of Dartmouth's 150th anniversary celebration. Dartmouth wins, 19-13. Three weeks later, the Green takes a dramatic 20-19 decision over Penn at the Polo Grounds in New York but a 7-6 loss at Brown spoils an unbeaten season.

1920

Led by All-America halfback Jim Robertson, Dartmouth travels across the continent to dedicate the University of Washington's new stadium with a 27-7 win.

1921

A leg injury forces Jim Robertson to move from halfback to the line for his last game. He opens gaping holes as Dartmouth beats Georgia in Atlanta, 7-0.

1923

Jesse Hawley '09 succeeds Jack Cannell '19 as Dartmouth's coach. The Green begins a remarkable era of success with an 8-1 record. The loss comes to Cornell, 32-9, before a crowd of 14,000 in the dedication game of Dartmouth's Memorial Field.

1924

A 14-14 tie at Yale keeps Dartmouth from a perfect season (7-0-1).

1925

Prevailing strategy said that a team scored upon can choose to kick off. Cornell keeps kicking off. Swede Oberlander throws six touchdown passes. Dartmouth wins, 62-13. A week later, Dartmouth travels west and beats Chicago, 33-7, to claim the national championship with a perfect 8-0-0 record. The Green scores 340 points, allows only 29, and has five shutouts.

1926

Dartmouth beats Virginia Tech, 20-0, at Hanover for its 22nd straight game without a loss. A week later, Yale prevails, 14-7. The "Yale Jinx" continues.

Undefeated Streaks

Dartmouth has produced four 15-game win streaks during these seasons: 1924-26, 1961-63, 1970-71, and 1996-97.

1927

Dartmouth finishes 7-1. Halfback Myles Lane scores 18 touchdowns and a record 125 points in all. Lane completes his three-year career as the Green's all-time scoring leader with 307 points (48 TDs, 19 extra points). He then captains the 1927-28 hockey team.

1929

Prior to the Yale game, superstitious All-America halfback Al Marsters misplaces the shoulder pads he's used through high school and at Dartmouth. Wearing borrowed pads, Marsters is leading interference when he's kicked, fracturing his spine. Yale wins, 16-12. Marsters never plays another game.

1931

In 14 previous meetings with Yale, Dartmouth is 0-12-2 and trails the Elis, 33-10, in the second half. Bill McCall scores on kickoff and interceptions returns. A blocked kick produces another score. Dartmouth trails, 33-30, as McCall holds for Bill Morton's 34-yard field goal as dusk settles. Dartmouth "beats" Yale, 33-33.

1934

After successive .500 seasons, Dartmouth hires Earl Blaik as coach. President Ernest M. Hopkins advises, "Earl, always remember that football is incidental to the purpose for which the player is in college. But, let's have a winner." Dartmouth posts a 6-3 record.

1935

Dartmouth takes a 5-0 record to Yale Bowl. Seven times the Green is inside Yale's 10 but leads only 7-6. Then Carl (Mutt) Ray intercepts a pass and makes it 14-6. Dartmouth fans tear down the goal posts with two minutes to play. The "Yale Jinx" is ended.

After seven games, Dartmouth is still undefeated. So is Princeton. In a driving snowstorm, not even a drunken fan who tries to join Dartmouth's goal line defense is enough. Princeton wins the famous "Snow Game," 26-6.

1936

Bill Osmanski's 76-yard interception return gives Holy Cross a 7-0 win over Dartmouth. The Green won't lose another game until Game Eight in 1938 when Cornell ends another 22-game unbeaten streak, 14-7, at Ithaca.

1937

Dartmouth finishes 7-0-2 but declines an invitation to play California in the Rose Bowl. Says President Hopkins, "When our season is over, it's over."

1940

Cornell is undefeated and atop the national rankings. Dartmouth is 3-4 but leads 3-0 in the last minute when Referee Red Friesell loses track of downs and awards Cornell an erroneous extra play. The Big Red scores. The "Fifth Down" error is confirmed on film. The next day Cornell concedes its 7-3 victory, the only time a college game's result has been decided off the field.

After the season, Blaik departs to coach at Army.

1943

In the midst of World War II, Dartmouth beats everyone but Penn, 7-6, to finish an abbreviated 6-1 season, Dartmouth's 43rd straight record of .500 or better.

1945

As World War II ends, Dartmouth's schedule includes only Division I opponents.

1948-49

Back-to-back 6-2 records, all against major opponents and built around Joe Sullivan, Jon Jenkins, Dale Armstrong and Herb Carey, crown Tuss McLaughry's 12-year tenure as Dartmouth's coach.

1955

Bob Blackman's extraordinary 16-year career at Dartmouth starts badly. In his first game as Dartmouth's coach, the Green leads Colgate, 20-0, then yields 21 unanswered points in the final period.

1956

Formal Ivy League play begins.

1957

A tie at Yale and a last-week loss at Princeton leaves Dartmouth a half-game behind the Tigers in the Ivy League title race and 7-1-1 overall.

1958

A 21-12 win at Princeton clinches Dartmouth's first outright Ivy League title.

1959

Dartmouth's scoreless tie with Brown at Memorial Field gives Penn the Ivy title by a half-game over the Green.

1960

A 20-0 win at Cornell is the 400th victory in Dartmouth football history.

1962

Led by quarterback Bill King and center-linebacker Don McKinnon, Dartmouth shuts out five foes, beats Princeton in the finale, 38-27, and gains its first undefeated-untied season (9-0-0) since 1925.

1963

After a 17-13 loss at Harvard ends Dartmouth's 15-game winning streak, the Green rebounds. A comeback 22-21 win at Princeton leaves Dartmouth and the Tigers knotted for the Ivy crown.

1964

Princeton visits Memorial Field for the first time and continues toward an undefeated season with a 37-7 win.

1965

Dartmouth returns the favor: Princeton has won 17 straight games since losing to Dartmouth in 1963. The Green is 8-0. At Palmer Stadium, Mickey Beard's 79-yard pass to Bill Calhoun clinches Dartmouth's win, 28-14. It's the Green's third undefeated season in four years. Dartmouth wins the Lambert Trophy as the East's best team.

1966

Undefeated in 11 straight games, Dartmouth misses a rain-drenched two-point conversion and bows at Holy Cross, 7-6. The Green still gains a three-way tie, with Harvard and Princeton (all 6-1), for its fourth Ivy title in five years.

109-Game Scoring Streak

Beginning with a 28-3 win at New Hampshire in the 1960 opening game, and continuing through a 10-9 loss at New Hampshire in the 1973 opener, Dartmouth scored at least one touchdown in 109 straight games. During the streak, there were only seven games when Dartmouth scored fewer than 10 points.

1967

Pete Donovan's second-chance field goal beats Harvard, 23-21. Four weeks later his fourth period kick beats Princeton, 17-14.

1968

The permanent East Grandstand is completed, increasing Memorial Field's seating capacity to 20,416.

1969

Hank Bjorklund, son of a Dartmouth alumnus, runs all over the Green. Princeton wins, 35-7, spoiling an undefeated season for Dartmouth. The Green shares the Ivy title with Yale and the Tigers.

1970

Is this Dartmouth's best season ever, rivaling the 1925 national champions? Led by rover back Murry Bowden, the Green gathers six shutouts. Quarterback Jim Chasey and halfback John Short guide an offense that outscores the opposition, 311-42. Dartmouth rolls to a 9-0 record, the Ivy title, a second Lambert Trophy, and ranks 14th in the nation. Chasey and Cornell tailback Ed Marinaro share the first Bushnell Trophy as the Ivy's outstanding players. Bob Blackman moves to the Big Ten (Illinois) after 16 seasons, 104 wins, and seven outright or shared Ivy titles.

1971

Ted Perry's field goals decide successive wins over Brown, Harvard and Yale. Then, Columbia turns the tables: A last-minute field goal snaps Dartmouth's 15-game win streak, 31-29. A week after that, quarterback Steve Stetson outshines Marinaro, Cornell's Heisman Trophy runnerup. Dartmouth wins, 24-14, before the then-largest crowd ever at Memorial Field (20,819). Dartmouth and Cornell share the Ivy title.

1972

A 21-21 tie at Harvard and a 31-22 win at Cornell are keys as Dartmouth (5-1-1) edges Yale (5-2) for its fourth straight Ivy crown. Dartmouth becomes a coeducational college.

1973

After losing its first three games, Dartmouth wins its last six, including a defense-inspired 24-18 duel at Harvard, for its fifth straight Ivy title.

1974

The largest crowd in Memorial Field history (21,530) sees Harvard hold off the Green, 17-15.

1975

A 22-17 victory at Columbia makes Dartmouth the 11th team in college football history to win 500 games.

1977

A field goal at the Bowl by Nick Lowery, destined for an 18-year career in the NFL, hands Yale its only Ivy loss, 3-0. Jake Crouthamel departs with a 41-20-2 record after seven seasons as Bob Blackman's successor.

1978

Joe Yukica succeeds Jake Crouthamel. Quarterback Buddy Teevens wins the Bushnell Trophy and Dartmouth wins its fifth Ivy title of the decade.

1980

Dartmouth and the Ivy League adopt a 10-game schedule.

1981

Shaun Teevens, Buddy's brother, is the leading receiver as Dartmouth has a piece of its 12th Ivy League title, this time with Yale.

1982

Dartmouth has its third Ivy title in five seasons under Joe Yukica, sharing the crown with Penn and Harvard.

Dartmouth's Helmet

In 1965, Bob Blackman, Dartmouth's innovative Hall of Fame coach, sought a unique source of pride to identify Dartmouth's successful football team.

He found the answer in a helmet design that became as much a trademark for Dartmouth football as the famed "winged" helmet design that Fritz Crisler brought to Michigan from Princeton in 1938.

The distinctive design was used from 1965-86. It was restored in 1999.



1986

After five successful seasons followed by four of frustration (11 wins), Joe Yukica steps down. His successor: Buddy Teevens.

1990

Tailback Shon Page rushes for a Dartmouth record 1,087 yards and wins the Bushnell Trophy as the Green shares the Ivy title with Cornell.

1991

Shon Page's rushing record lasts one year. Tailback Al Rosier powers for 1,432 yards and keeps the Bushnell Trophy in Hanover. Dartmouth, 6-0-1, is the outright Ivy champ. After the season (and successive Ivy titles), Buddy Teevens leaves to coach Tulane. His assistant, John Lyons, becomes Dartmouth's football coach.

1992

The Jay Fiedler era explodes: The junior quarterback passes for 2,748 yards and 25 touchdowns, both Dartmouth records, and wins the Bushnell Trophy. The Green wins its third straight Ivy title.

1993

Jay Fiedler's last game is his best. Dartmouth trails Princeton, 22-8 with 9:37 to play. He passes for one TD, then runs for another. A conversion pass ties the game, 22-22. In swirling snow, his 38-yard pass to John Hyland with 1:12 left gives Dartmouth a 28-22 win. He finishes with 6,684 career yards passing, 58 touchdown passes, and 7,249 yards of total offense, all Green records.

1995

A 23-7 win at Harvard is Dartmouth's 600th all-time victory. But, when Princeton kicks a field goal with four seconds left to gain a 10-10 tie at Hanover, the final game deadlock gives the Tigers (5-1-1) the Ivy crown and pushes Dartmouth (4-2-1) from a possible four-way title tie to fourth place. A year later, the overtime rule is in place.

1996

Having played the first game at Princeton's Palmer Stadium in 1914, the Green also plays the last, beating Princeton, 24-0, to complete Dartmouth's first 10-0-0 season, its fifth undefeated-undefeated campaign, and 17th Ivy League title.

1997

A Dartmouth unbeaten streak—beginning early in the 1995 season and reaching 22 games—ends against Lehigh. Dartmouth finishes 8-2 with a three-year run with a 25-4-1 record, matching the 1969-71 teams for wins (25-2-0).

2003

Frustration at Harvard in 2001 (a 31-21 loss after the Green builds a 21-0 halftime lead) and 2002 (a 31-26 setback) ends as quarterback Charlie Rittgers passes for 344 yards and two touchdowns and runs for another score. Dartmouth knocks the Crimson from the undefeated ranks, 30-16, a major

Unbeaten Streaks

On three occasions, Dartmouth had built unbeaten streaks of 22 games.

From 1923-26, Dartmouth was 21-0-1 including the national championship season (8-0-0) in 1925.

From 1936-38, the Big Green had a 19-0-3 streak that included the 1937 season when Dartmouth was 7-0-2 and was invited (but declined) an invitation to play in the 1938 Rose Bowl game.

The third 22-game unbeaten streak, from 1995-97 (21-0-1), is the second longest in NCAA Division I-AA history.

step en route to five wins in its last six games.

2004

After 13 seasons that included an undefeated team in 1996 but an overall record of 60-68-1, John Lyons steps down as Dartmouth's football coach.

2005

Buddy Teevens, the Ivy League's player-of-the-year in 1978 and Dartmouth's head coach from 1987-91, returns to the helm of Big Green football. Dartmouth wins its opening game against Colgate but then struggles through an injury-plagued campaign.

2006-09

FieldTurf replaces grass on Memorial Field for the 2006 season. The East Stands are reduced in size to accommodate the Floren Varsity House (opened during the 2007 season) that includes new offices, dressing and conditioning facilities for Dartmouth's football team.

WEARERS OF THE "D"

Since 1881, a total of 2,323 Dartmouth students (including some women who have been team managers in recent years) have been awarded the block "D" for their part in perpetuating Dartmouth's winning football tradition.

Included in this listing are 13 men who were members of Dartmouth's first football team in 1880. While that team did not play an outside game against an intercollegiate opponent (the team was prohibited from playing off campus), letters were awarded.

Dartmouth's first team to play an intercollegiate opponent was the 1881 squad that played Amherst twice, winning on the Green in Hanover and tying a rematch (abbreviated by a snowstorm) at Springfield, Mass.

An asterisk (*) appears beside the year that a player was a captain. Among the players who have been captains are five men who were captains of two teams: Frank Lakeman 1892, Walter McCornack 1897, John Glaze 1908, Jim Robertson 1920 and Caleb Moore 2000.

Two others, Clarence Howland 1884 and Bill Odlin 1890, were four-time captains. Howland was captain and coach of the first Dartmouth teams from 1880-83. Odlin was captain from 1886-89. Until 1892, the captain was also the coach of Dartmouth football.

Team managers are identified by an (M) beside their names.

Beside some names will appear the initials "DMC." These players were enrolled at Dartmouth more than a century ago as members of the "Dartmouth Marine Corps," a device used prior to 1900 to provide intercollegiate eligibility for players from the Hanover area. Rules of eligibility have become more defined since those early days.

With the advent of freshman eligibility in recent years, four-year letter-winners are no longer uncommon. However, there have been two five-year letterwinners at Dartmouth: Charles Boyle 1901 lettered from 1896-1900 and Charles Little 1891 (DMC 1896) lettered from 1888-90 and again in 1893-94.

There are also nearly 40 letterwinners who represented Dartmouth on the gridiron while on campus through the V-12 Program during World War II. These players have "USMC" or "USN" following their names, denoting their service in the U.S. Marine Corps or the U.S. Navy. Many went on to graduate from Dartmouth.

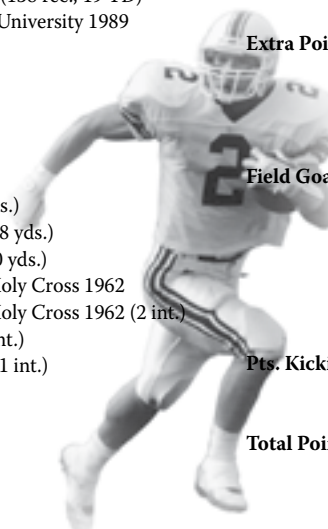

BIG GREEN ON TELEVISION



The Harvard-Dartmouth game on CBS in 1955 was the first televised game at Memorial Field. Dartmouth won, 14-9.

Dartmouth football teams have played before live television cameras 68 times since 1953 when the Big Green met Holy Cross at Manning Bowl in Lynn, Mass., in the first New England college game televised nationally. In 2008, Dartmouth had six games televised live, the most ever in school history.

The 1953 game, won by the Crusaders, 28-6, was carried on NBC's 82-station network as part

of the NCAA's restricted television agreement but wasn't seen on the Dartmouth campus since there were no television stations serving northern New England at that time. The Dartmouth touchdown was scored by end Dave McLaughlin who later would serve as president of the college.

Frequently, during the early years of formal Ivy League football, Dartmouth played before major network regional audiences. Perhaps the most memorable game televised from Memorial

Field in Hanover was the 1971 game with Cornell that was ABC-TV's prime regional game with the broadcast team of Chris Schenkel, Bill Fleming and Bud Wilkinson. Cornell was undefeated and led by Heisman Trophy candidate Ed Marinaro. Dartmouth won, 24-14.

Dartmouth's record in televised games is 24 wins, 43 losses and one tie. The Big Green has a 14-22-0 record in games televised at Memorial Field.

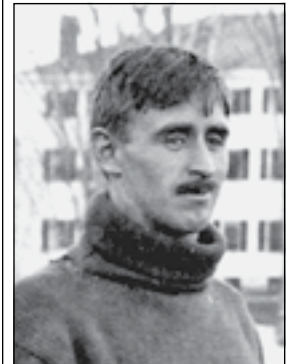

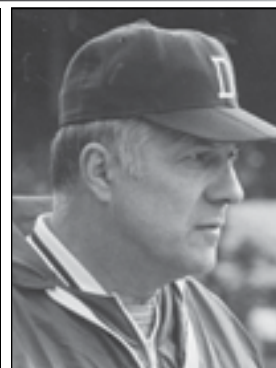
