BIG GREEN GAME NOTES

DARTMOUTH VS. BROWN 2.0

Having just met in Hanover three days prior, the Big Green and the Bears will play for a second time on Tuesday – this time in Providence – in a game reschedule from Jan. 8. This is Dartmouth's first road game since Jan. 23, having been at home for three in a row.

LAST TIME OUT

Dartmouth picked up its first Ivy League win of the season on Saturday when it defeated Brown, 54-58, in a back-and-forth battle at Leede Arena.

- This is the Green's first conference win since downing the Bears on March 7, 2020.
- Doreen Ariik led the way with the team's first double-double of the year, scoring a career-high 11 points while also pulling down 10 caroms.
- Jimena Abejon had a season-high 10 points, hitting a 3-pointer for the second time in her career.
- The team went 9-12 (.750) in free throws and won the rebounding game, 43-29, including an outstanding 20 offensive boards.

• "This first Ivy League win was special for many reasons," Adrienne Shibbes, the Gail Koziara Boudreaux '82 and Family Head Coach of Women's Basketball said after her first conference victory. "I am most proud of the way that each and every player contributed to the effort. The squad has improved so much over the course of the season, and this outcome was

evidence of their hard work, faith and togetherness."

• Dartmouth led by one point after the first quarter (17-16), but it was Brown that had the edge after both the second (29-28) and the third quarters (39-36). There were five lead changes and one tie in the fourth before Dartmouth pulled ahead and stayed ahead halfway through. Brown fouls mixed with a good free throw percentage for the Green put catching up out of reach for the Bears.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

Well, not much has changed for either team since Saturday's game. Brown may be 0-8 in Ivy action, but that isn't really indicative of how they have been playing this season. Only three of those eight games have been decided by more than five points and they're the usual culprits: Penn (66-37), Harvard

(89-58) and Princeton (72-39).

On Saturday, the Bears went 19-46 (4.13) in field goals, 7-22 in 3-pointers (.318) and almost perfect in free throws (9-10, .900). They had 13 bench points (compared to the Green's 29) and shot 41.3 percent from the line to Dartmouth's 33.3.

The teams split games in 2019-20, with Brown winning the first meeting in Hanover on Feb. 7 (81-73) and Dartmouth taking the season finale on the road (72-58).

LEADING THE WAY

Even though she didn't play over the weekend, Mia Curtis is still leading the team with 136 points, but Carrington Washburn and Mekkena Boyd are starting to close in with 116 and 111 points, respectively.

Washburn, Rosie Jennings and Allie Harland have played all 20 games, while Boyd has started all 19 of the contests she has appeared in. The sophomore from Williston, Vermont, also leads with 34 assists and 25 steals. Ariik leads with 103 total rebounds and is creeping her way into the Ivy League top 10.

Adrienne Shibles, just the fifth Big Green head coach in the program's 48-year varsity history, came to New Hampshire in May of 2021 from Bowdoin College.

Since taking over the Bowdoin program prior to the 2008-09 season, she led the squad to a record of 281-67 (.807) and qualified for the NCAA Tournament 11 times, reaching the Sweet Sixteen eight times (including five of the last six seasons) and the Final Four twice.

Shibles was named the Coach of the Year in the state of Maine four times, in the region three times, by the NESCAC twice and once by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association for all of Division III. In 2019, she also served as a coach for the Team USA U16 squad, and in March was pegged to be that squad's head coach in the summer of 2021.

During the 2018-19 campaign, Shibles became the winningest coach in Bowdoin women's basketball history. After guiding the team to its second-straight NCAA Championship Game appearance to conclude that season, she was named the WBCA Division III Coach of the Year.

Bowdoin had a record of 27-2, won the NESCAC Championship and had hosting rights for an NCAA Division III Sectional when the remainder of the 2019-20 season was canceled due to COVID-19.

Shibles' players have enjoyed numerous accolades with two national players of the year, six All-Americans, 13 all-region performers and 23 All-NESCAC honors — 14 on the first team — during her tenure. She also had the conference Player of the Year three times, Defensive Player of the Year four times and Rookie of the Year on two other occasions.

Prior to taking over at the helm of the Bowdoin program, Shibles was the Dean of Athletics and co-curricular programs at Gould Academy in Bethel, Maine for three years. The athletic program she oversaw at the selective college preparatory school was comprised of 40 teams, including nationally competitive squads.

Shibles took over at Gould after spending nine years as the head women's basketball coach and associate professor of physical education at Swarthmore (1996-2005). She inherited a program at the bottom of the Centennial Conference and built it into a conference champion in five years, guiding the squad to the second round of the NCAA Tournament while being named the WBCA District 4 Coach of the Year. Shibles coached a pair of league Players of the Year and two Kodak All-Americans, then finished her stint with the most career wins in Garnet history, posting a record of 138-96 (.590).

Shibles graduated from Bates in 1991 with a degree in history and American studies. A two-time captain of the Bobcats women's basketball team, she scored over 1,000 points in her career. Shibles went on to get her master's in exercise and sports studies from Smith in 1996, serving as a graduate assistant coach for both the Smith soccer team and the Elms College basketball program.

COACHING STAFF



Asst. Coach Megan Phelps
Bowdoin '15

Megan Phelps was named an assistant coach in May of 2021. Like Shibles, Phelps is coming from Bowdoin, where she served as an assistant since the 2017-18 season. The Polar Bears went 87-7 over the following three seasons, making two trips to the NCAA Championship. Phelps

served as interim head coach for the fall semester of 2020 and was responsible for overseeing all aspects of the program.

Before arriving in Maine, Phelps was an assistant coach at Regis in Weston, Massachusetts, from 2015-17. The Pride had a 46-11 record over two campaigns, including two conference championships. Phelps graduated from Bowdoin in 2015 with a degree in government and legal studies. In 2019, she was named a WBCA 30 Under 30 recipient. She completed her master's in communications at Regis in 2017.



Asst. Coach Sarah Assante
St. Joseph's '15

Sarah Assante was hired as an assistant coach in June of 2021. Assante spent two years as an assistant coach at Washington and Lee University, where she helped coach the Generals to an 18-8 overall record in 2019-20 and a 15-3 mark in the ODAC, earning the team the No. 2 seed

for the conference championship. That season also included a program-record 10-game winning streak as the team won all but one of its 14 games that ended the regular season. Before that, Assante was an assistant at Regis for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons, while also serving as the assistant strength and conditioning coach during her second year. A 2015 graduate of Saint Joseph's, Assante was a four-year member of the basketball team and served as captain for her final two seasons. She graduated with a degree in business administration and accounting before getting her master's in organizational and professional communication from Regis in 2019.



Asst. Coach Meredith Mesaris
Scranton '15

Meredith Mesaris was named a volunteer assistant coach in June of 2021.

She arrives in Hanover after spending five seasons as an assistant coach at Williams (2016-21). While there, she helped the Ephs to a 58-45 record, seeing the team make it to the NESCAC

quarterfinals three times before advancing all the way to the NCAA Division III Sweet Sixteen in 2019-20. Before Williams, Mesaris was the assistant coach at Hendrix College in Conway, Arkansas, contributing to the Warriors 19-7 overall record and third-place finish in the Southern Athletic Association. She helped coach both SAA Player of the Year Sara Dylsin and Women's Basketball Coaches Association All-America Honorable Mention Caitlin Kriesel-Bigler. A two-time WBCA All-American and 2015 CoSIDA Academic All-American herself, Mesaris was the leading scorer for the Scranton Lady Royals all three seasons she played there. She graduated magna cum laude in 2015 with a degree in management and a minor in coaching.
