SCOUTING SACRED HEART

▶ 1-0-1 START

Sacred Heart opened the season against Princeton in the Tigers' debut, defeating the NIRA newcomers 53-21. Fabiola Millien-Faustin led the team with two tries, while Alyssa Cunningham was 7-for-8 on conversions. Last weekend, the Pioneers surrendered a late five-point lead against Brown and settled for a 24-24 tie.

► LAST TIME WE MET

The Big Green dominated Sacred Heart a season ago, 63-10. Sophie Ragg, who finished with two, was one of eight players to find the try zone in that early October matchup. Emily Henrich also had two tries, while Kristin Bitter split the uprights four times for eight total points. Sacred Heart was one of just four opponents to score double-digits against Dartmouth.

2021: WHAT A YEAR!

It doesn't get much better than what Dartmouth was able to accomplish in 2021. The first undefeated team in program history only had one match decided by single digits, and that was on the road to the eventual national runner-up Army West Point. Of course, the Big Green would go on to defeat the Black Knights in the NIRA Final a couple months later. Dartmouth dismantled opponents with an average 41-point margin of victory.

► RELOADING

Dartmouth lost some key pieces from that dominant 2021 squad, including MA Sorensen Award honoree Idia Ihensekhien. Seven freshmen and returning contributors will be key in the quest for another title.

PLENTY TO LOOK FORWARD TO

There are some interesting dates on Dartmouth's 2022 slate to mark on your calendar. SOME KEY RETURNERS

Though the Big Green lost some key players from the 2021 championship team like MA Sorensen winner Idia Ihensekhien, there are a number of notable returners who are primed to make major contributions once again. Asialeata Meni, Kristin Bitter and Nikki Ihensekhien each scored at least four tries last season and will look to pace the Big Green offense. Junior Abbey Savin led the team in points last year with 78, coming from 35 conversions, one try and four assists.

NEWCOMERS

Seven talented freshmen join the Big Green ahead of the 2022 season. Simone Bautista, Jordan Duncan, Maura Hough, Vanessa Ortiz-Pallen, Taylor Sadek, Jenna Sheldon and Katelyn Walker are the rookies who seek to make an immediate impact. Dartmouth also welcomes one new assistant coach for the 2022 campaign – former All-American and two-time national champion Gianna Solomon.

WHAT'S AHEAD

Dartmouth returns home to Brophy Field to take on Quinnipiac Saturday, Sept. 24. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. The home opener, along with all home games, will be streamed on ESPN+.

The Big Green wasted no time, getting on the board 41 seconds in with Sophie Ragg's third try of the season. Scores by Henrich and Sadie Schier followed, and Dartmouth soon had a 15-0 advantage. It took another 12 minutes, but Idia Ihensekhien's first try of her fifth year and Bitter's first conversion of the game further increased the Green's lead (22-0).

The Pioneers got three points from a penalty kick and it looked like Nicole Ihensekhien would get a try of her own soon after, but she was held up on the line. In the 37th minute, Asialeata Meni added one, giving Dartmouth a 29-3 advantage to end the half.

After being denied a try in the first, N. Ihensekhien was back for real this time two minutes in. She led the way for Ragg and Henrich to score their second tries of the game, all three happening within six minutes of each other. Bitter went 2-for-3 on conversions, making it a 48-3 contest.

A good effort by Sacred Heart eight minutes later resulted in its first try and, following a good kick, they got to double digits (48-10). Five minutes later, Lauren Ferridge got in on the fun with a try and, with a conversion by Henrich, Dartmouth further increased its lead. A good penalty kick by Henrich and a career-first try by Sophie Opler wrapped things up (63-10).

HEAD COACH KATIE DOWTY

Katie Dowty is entering her eighth year and seventh season at the helm of the women's rugby team in 2022. She became the first varsity head coach of the Dartmouth women's rugby program when she was hired in June 2015. The Big Green have won two national championships with Dowty at the helm.

A 2006 graduate of Harvard, Dowty is a former player and captain with the Crimson. After graduation, she moved on to the Beantown Rugby Club from 2006 to 2011, where she served as a player, captain and fundraising chair.

Dowty brings a wealth of international experience to the Big Green as well. A member of the USA Rugby national team from 2010 to 2014, she played with both the 7s and 15s in her four years and made 12 tours as part of the IRB Women's Sevens World Series.

In that time period with Team USA, Dowty was named the Goff Rugby Report's 7s Player of the Year in 2011.

One of eight original women in the U.S. to sign on professionally by USA Rugby to play 7s and train full-time at the Olympic Training Center in California, Dowty helped lay the foundation for individuals to enter the newly established program in the years to follow.

Dowty first began coaching as a volunteer with her alma mater in 2009, but it wasn't until after her time with the national team that she really started making the move into the coaching field. During the spring of 2014, she worked at American International as an assistant working with backs as the Yellow Jackets' playoff run culminated in a third-place finish at the Division I USA Rugby National Championship.

Prior to her time in Hanover with the Big Green, Dowty has been in the Pacific Northwest, working as an assistant at Central Washington University where she and her fellow coaches have established the first high-performance varsity women's rugby program on the West Coast. Not only did she help cultivate and advance a program to full NCAA status, but also built a winner in the process as the Wildcats claimed second place in the 7s national championship in May 2015, falling to Penn State in the title contest.

STACEY BRIDGES TEXAS A&M '10

Stacey Bridges is in her eighth year and seventh season as an assistant coach with the Dartmouth women's rugby team in 2022. The Big Green have won two national championships with Bridges on the staff.

Bridges is currently a member of USA Rugby's Women's National Team and played in the 2010 World Cup.

A 2010 graduate of Texas A&M, Bridges was not only a member of the Aggies during her time in College Station, but also a member of the US U20 National Team from 2006-09. She would go on to earn a masters degree in kinesiology from UTEP in 2015.

Prior to joining the Big Green, Bridges spent time as an assistant coach at the University of Minnesota (2014-15) and most recently at Navy (2016). Additionally, Bridges was a 7's coach for Totino-Grace High School (2013) in Fridley, Minnesota.

Bridges also continues to play with the Twin Cities Amazons of the Women's Premiership League. She has been a team member since

Gianna Solomon joined the Dartmouth women's rugby staff as an assistant coach in August 2022.

A former collegiate rugby player, Solomon earned All-America accolades and won a pair of national championships at Penn State. She went on to play professionally in the Women's Premier League. Solomon also served as the head rugby coach at Greenwich Area School District and gained additional coaching experience as an assistant coach for Northeast Rugby Academy and The Rugby Advantage.

Solomon graduated from Penn State in 2019 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and received a master's in media management at Wagner in 2022.
