SCOUTING ARMY WEST POINT

3-0 START

Army West Point rolled through Mount St. Mary's 62-7 in its season opener and later dominated first-year program Princeton 87-0. The Black Knights most recently edged Quinnipiac 24-19 in a come-from-behind win. The Bobcats led 19-10 at one point, but eventually succumbed to the visitors' powerful offense. Army West Point was supposed to take on Brown last Saturday, but the match was postponed.

WHO TO WATCH FOR

Codi Butt currently leads the team with six tries on the season. Quinnipiac was able to hold her to one. Alissa Eisenhart has tallied 17 conversions this season. Sydney Schaaf delivered the game-winning try to lift Army West Point over Quinnipiac. It was her second of the season.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

SOPHIE RAGG • 5th Year • Center/Wing

Dartmouth had several players find the try zone in the 41-point effort against Quinnipiac, but Ragg was the only one to do so twice. She has three on the season, tied for the teamlead.

NYAH CORDERO • Jr. • Flanker

Cordero's first try of the season last week was one to remember - a 40 meter run in which the Idaho native accelerated past a host of would-be tacklers.

WE MEET AGAIN

Needless to say, these two premier NIRA programs have a history. This is the one both teams have likely had circled on their calendars for several months - a rematch of the 2021 NIRA Championship. The Big Green won their second title in program history on that November night, and they did it on Army West Point's home field.

BATTLE OF THE UNDEFEATEDS

Put the history aside and this is still a marquee matchup. Both teams enter Saturday undefeated and perhaps on a collision course for another championship meeting. If you put stock into common opponents, there's one so far and that's Quinnipiac, who gave the Black Knights by far their toughest challenge of the season with a 24-19 final.

THE STREAK LIVES ON

Dartmouth's 11-match win streak, the longest active for any Division I NIRA program, survived comfortably last Saturday at Brophy Field. The 41-10 win over Quinnipiac may have signaled midseason form for the Big Green, who had a late start to their season and only had one match under their belts entering the weekend.

The two teams traded lopsided decisions between 2016 and 2017 to begin the all-time series.

HEAD COACH KATIE DOWTY

Katie Dowty is entering her eighth year and seventh season at the helm of the women's rugby team in 2022. She became the first varsity head coach of the Dartmouth women's rugby program when she was hired in June 2015. The Big Green have won two national championships with Dowty at the helm.

A 2006 graduate of Harvard, Dowty is a former player and captain with the Crimson. After graduation, she moved on to the Beantown Rugby Club from 2006 to 2011, where she served as a player, captain and fundraising chair.

Dowty brings a wealth of international experience to the Big Green as well. A member of the USA Rugby national team from 2010 to 2014, she played with both the 7s and 15s in her four years and made 12 tours as part of the IRB Women's Sevens World Series.

In that time period with Team USA, Dowty was named the Goff Rugby Report's 7s Player of the Year in 2011.

One of eight original women in the U.S. to sign on professionally by USA Rugby to play 7s and train full-time at the Olympic Training Center in California, Dowty helped lay the foundation for individuals to enter the newly established program in the years to follow.

Dowty first began coaching as a volunteer with her alma mater in 2009, but it wasn't until after her time with the national team that she really started making the move into the coaching field. During the spring of 2014, she worked at American International as an assistant working with backs as the Yellow Jackets' playoff run culminated in a third-place finish at the Division I USA Rugby National Championship.

Prior to her time in Hanover with the Big Green, Dowty has been in the Pacific Northwest, working as an assistant at Central Washington University where she and her fellow coaches have established the first high-performance varsity women's rugby program on the West Coast. Not only did she help cultivate and advance a program to full NCAA status, but also built a winner in the process as the Wildcats claimed second place in the 7s national championship in May 2015, falling to Penn State in the title contest.

STACEY BRIDGESTEXAS A&M '10

Stacey Bridges is in her eighth year and seventh season as an assistant coach with the Dartmouth women's rugby team in 2022. The Big Green have won two national championships with Bridges on the staff.

A 2010 graduate of Texas A&M, Bridges was not only a member of the Aggies during her time in College Station, but also a member of the US U20 National Team from 2006-09. She would go on to earn a masters degree in kinesiology from UTEP in 2015.

Prior to joining the Big Green, Bridges spent time as an assistant coach at the University of Minnesota (2014-15) and most recently at Navy (2016). Additionally, Bridges was a 7s coach for Totino-Grace High School (2013) in Fridley, Minnesota.



GIANNA SOLOMON PENN STATE '19

Gianna Solomon joined the Dartmouth women's rugby staff as an assistant coach in August 2022.

A former collegiate rugby player, Solomon earned All-America accolades and won a pair of national championships at Penn State. She went on to play professionally in the Women's Premier League. Solomon also served as the head rugby coach at Greenwich Area School District and gained additional coaching experience as an assistant coach for Northeast Rugby Academy and The Rugby Advantage.

Solomon graduated from Penn State in 2019 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and received a master's in media management at Wagner in 2022.
