Defending Champs in Town

Dartmouth has a big test this week with last year's champion invading Memorial Field, and Yale is already fighting for its title hopes after suffering a shocking 23-21 defeat two weeks ago at home to Cornell. But considering the first conference game for every Ancient Eight team was decided by no more than three points, perhaps no win or loss should be shocking this year.

Last year, the Bulldogs were able to hold off the Big Green in New Haven, 24-21, after Dartmouth scored 14 unanswered points in the fourth quarter. The loss snapped a Big Green four-game win streak in the series, but each of the last five meetings here have gone in favor of Dartmouth.

Yale did not have to contend with **Nick Howard** last year, who missed the game while nursing an injury. While the quarterback isn't putting up gaudy numbers this year, he has found a way to help the Green win each of the last two weeks, including against a strong Penn defensive unit last week with a 23-20 overtime victory. This year, Howard leads the team with 190 rushing yards and three scores, and he also tossed his first scoring strike of the season against the Quakers.

The status of his tandem partner behind center, **Dylan Cadwallader**, is uncertain after he left the game last week early with an injury. But should he be unable to go, **Jackson Proctor** has proven capable of stepping up, completing 7-of-9 throws against Penn for a modest 41 yards, not to mention running for 30 yards on only two carries.

Dartmouth will be looking to get RB **Q Jones** going again after he was held to only 12 yards on nine rushes at Penn. **D.J. Crowther** may also get some touches after getting a handful of carries for 22 yards.

Aside from **Paxton Scott's** 153 yards in the opener, the Big Green have not had anyone amass more than 45 yards receiving yards this year. But a dozen players have caught at least one pass, which keeps opposing defenses guessing where the ball is going.

The defense has been the driving force for this team. Three times in the game, Dartmouth recovered fumbles in Penn territory, the last two by **Braden Mullen** and **Joe Onuwabagbe** late in the second quarter that Dartmouth turned into 10 quick points for a 20-10 lead at the half. Mullen finished the game with a pair of sacks, and Onuwabagbe recorded his first career sack on the fumble he recovered as well.

Special teams played a huge role in the victory as well. Freshman place kicker **Owen Zalc** was named the Ivy League Rookie of the Week for the second straight week as he booted three field goals, including the game-winner from 37 yards

out in overtime. Linebacker **Nico Schwikal** set the tone for the game by blocking a punt on the game's first possession and recovering it at the Quaker 1, setting up the first Big Green touchdown. And punter **Davis Golick** averaged over 39 yards on his career-high eight punts, one of which pinned Penn inside its own 1-yard line.

Scouting the Bulldogs

Yale is the defending conference champion and preseason favorite to take home the crown this fall, but the Bulldogs dropped their first two games — one to top-10 Holy Cross, the other to Cornell — before earning their first win last week in a 45-3 blowout of Morgan State.

Running the offense is the reigning Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week in dual-threat QB Nolan Grooms. The senior is completing more than 65 percent of his passes and averaging just over 200 yards a game through the air with seven touchdowns and just one interception. On top of that, he leads the team in rushing with 77 yards a game on 36 total carries.

Tre Peterson primarily shares the running duties with Grooms, picking up nearly 5 yards on his 33 carries with a pair of touchdowns, not to mention another score he caught last week. Last year's Ivy Rookie of the Year, Joshua Pitsenberger, has missed the last two games after picking up 36 yards on nine rushes in the opener.

The receiving corps is led by Mason Tipton with his 15 catches for 248 yards and half of the squad's eight touchdowns. For short yardage situations, watch out for Ryan Lindley, who also has hauled in four throws but with fewer than half of Tipton's yardage (117, 7.8 per catch).

The defense has steadily improved, coinciding with the difficulty of each opponent. Linebacker Joseph Vaughn has been the star with a team-high 25 tackles, three for a loss and one sack, not to mention a forced fumble and an interception. The leading pass rusher is DL Clay Patterson with three sacks and five TFL, while Wande Owens is the Bulldogs' best cover man with a pair of pass breakups and 19 tackles.

Jack Bosman has been solid as the team's punter, averaging 40.3 yards on 10 boots. But he has struggles as the place kicker, converting just 2-of-5 field goals, neither longer than 29 yards, while having one blocked.

Now in his 12th year as the Joel E. Smilow '54 Head Coach of Football, Tony Reno enters today's game with a 61-42 record with the Bulldogs, including conference titles in 2017, 2019 and '22. He is a 1997 graduate of Worcester State College and was hired at Yale as an assistant in 2003 after a successful five-year stint at his alma mater.

Moment of Silence

Prior to kickoff on Saturday, a moment of silence will be observed at Memorial Field in honor of Josh Balara '24. An offensive lineman for the Big Green, Balara passed away this past March after a battle with a lengthy illness. While he never got a chance to play in a game for Dartmouth before his death, his commitment and unselfish dedication to helping the team improve made him a model teammate, and his affable nature and sense of humor made him a friend to all.

Great Start to Ivy Play

For the 10th time since overtime play was adopted by the NCAA, Dartmouth finished regulation in an Ivy League game tied with its opponent, and for the fourth time, that opponent was Penn. Although the Quakers had won each of the three previous overtime games, the Big Green finally got the better of them this time around with a 23-20 triumph. That makes Dartmouth 5-5 all-time in league overtime contests and 7-8 overall. And the Big Green are now 31-35 in Ivy openers — 25-28 against Penn and 6-7 versus Princeton.

Ivy Rookie of the Week Part Deux

A week after **Owen Zalc** was recognized by the Ivy League for his performance against Lehigh as the conference Rookie of the Week, the freshman earned the honor for a second straight week, helping Dartmouth defeat Penn in overtime, 23-20. Not only did he split the uprights in the extra period to lift the Green to the win, he also had two other field goals in the contest to go with a pair of PATs for a season-high 11 points. He is just the third Dartmouth kicker in the last 19 years to get a hat trick of field goals. The last Big Green back-to-back winner of any Ivy League weekly award was Isiah Swann '20 for his defensive work in 2018. But the last to collect the rookie weekly honor twice in a row was return man Shawn Abuhoff '12 in 2009.

Finding a Way to Win

Normally when Dartmouth musters no more than 251 yards of offense (as it did at Penn), the end result hasn't been terribly kind to the Big Green. Since 1969, the team has posted a record of 29-84-2 (.261 winning percentage) when being held to that total yards or fewer. And until the 23-20 overtime win against the Quakers, Dartmouth had lost 22 straight such games, with the last victory coming in Buddy Teevens' first game back as the head coach in his second stint — a 26-21 triumph over Colgate to open the 2005 season (193 yards). Only two of those 22 losses, however, have come in the past 10 years.

Top-12 Defense

The Dartmouth defense has been terrific this season, ranking 12th among FCS schools in yards allowed per game (278.3). Against the run, the Big Green rank 10th (90.0), and they are allowing opponents to convert third downs just 28.9 percent of the time, the third lowest figure in the nation. And the defensive unit is no slouch against the pass either with the 16th-best pass efficiency defense.

Dartmouth fans who are unable to come to Hanover or the various venues on the road can catch every Big Green football game either on television or streamed over the internet on various services, including eight contests on ESPN+ (four of which will also air on NESN), one on ESPNU and one on FloSports. For the 12th straight season, Dartmouth is teaming up with Northeast Sports Network (NSN) to produce the ESPN+ games and provide an enhanced viewing experience in HD.



For those who are unable to watch the ESPN+ stream of the game live, an archived broadcast will be available for 30 days on ESPN+.

Matt Corsetti, who first called a Big Green football game in 2018, will serve as the play-by-play broadcaster for the four home ESPN+ broadcasts. He will be joined by Steve Goldberg in his second season with the team.

Audio broadcasts of every game will be available through the DartmouthSports.com website. Calling the action is Brett Franklin, now in his third season calling the games on the Dartmouth Sports Network. A local broadcaster, Franklin also serves as the voice of Dartmouth softball and also lends his vocal cords to basketball and hockey contests. Providing analysis for a 23rd consecutive year is Wayne Young '72, who will team up with Franklin at Memorial Field. A two-sport athlete at Dartmouth, Young was a linebacker on three Ivy League championship Big Green squads from 1969-71 that went 25-2, earning first-team All-Ivy honors as a senior captain. He is also a member of Wearers of the Green. For the games outside of Hanover, Corsetti will join Franklin in the booth.

Schwikal Schwats

It didn't take long for Dartmouth to assert itself at Penn as the defense held the Quakers without a first down on the opening possession before **Nico Schwikal** promptly blocked the ensuing punt. But the sophomore wasn't finished, pouncing on the ball at the Penn 1. That set up **Nick Howard** to carry it over the threshold on the first offensive play for a quick 7-0 lead. It gave the Big Green punt rejections in consecutive games; **Sam Koscho** had a blocked punt against Lehigh on Sept. 23.

Fumblerama

Dartmouth recovered three fumbles in the 23-20 overtime win at Penn on Sept. 30, its first game with at least three recoveries in five years. DL **Derrell Porter** forced the first one with S **Sean Williams** corralling it, LB **Braden Mullen** (who also had two sacks) pounced on an unforced fumble that set up a Big Green TD, and DL **Joe Onuwabagbe** forced and recovered the third one on his first career sack. Coming up with that many fumble recoveries is also a pretty good barometer of success. The Big Green are 31-12-1 (.716) when scooping up at least three fumbles in a game.

Two Touchdowns for Howard

When **Nick Howard** reaches the end zone in a game, it's a pretty safe bet he will find his way there a second time before the final horn sounds. The fifth-year QB is currently third in program history with 27 rushing touchdowns, and 11 times he has had at least two in a game, most recently against Lehigh. As a matter of fact, when he scored just once at Penn on Sept. 30, it was just the second time he had just one touchdown in a game. Only legendary Myles Lane '28 has had more multi-TD games (14) at Dartmouth.

McCorkle's First Win

Interim head coach **Sammy McCorkle** earned his first victory guiding the Big Green with the 34-17 triumph over Lehigh on Sept. 23. It was also the ninth consecutive win in a Big Green home opener, a streak that began with a 35-25 win over Central Connecticut State in 2014.

First Win Over Lehigh in 27 Years

True, the two teams hadn't played since 1999, but Dartmouth's win over the visiting Mountain Hawks was the first in the series for the Big Green since they topped Lehigh, 21-14, during the 10-0 perfect season of 1996. Dartmouth is now 3-5 in the series that began in 1950.

Fumble Blessed by St. Gourdin

Holding a 17-10 lead in the third quarter, the defense came up with perhaps the most important play of the game as CB **Leonard St. Gourdin** stripped the ball from a Lehigh ball carrier, allowing DL **Ejike Adele** to recover it deep in Mountain Hawk territory. From there, the Big Green needed five plays to reach the end zone and double its lead en route to the 34-17 victory.

99 Rushing Yards on the Wall

Junior **Q Jones** came up a yard shy of recording his second career 100-yard game on the ground with 99 on 17 carries in the 34-17 win over Lehigh. He is just the third player in the last 38 years to fall just a yard shy of 100 rushing yards in a game.

Dishin' Dylan

Senior QB **Dylan Cadwallader** had the most efficient game of his career throwing the ball, completing 16-of-19 passes for 130 yards and the season's first touchdown pass, a picture-perfect 7-yard fade to **Paxton Scott** in the back corner of the end zone. His completion percentage (84.2) is the fifth-best by a Dartmouth QB over the last 25 years.

100th Anniversary of Memorial Field

Memorial Field first opened for the 1923 season, making this the 100th anniversary of the home facility of Dartmouth football. The Big Green has played a total of 426 games on the field

with the team sporting a 274-144-8 record (.653 winning percentage). In the first 17 years of the facility, Dartmouth won 71 of the 78 games on its home field with one tie (.917), including a program-record 21-game home winning streak from 1929-33. That mark was threatened in 1968-72 with 17 straight triumphs in Hanover. More recently, the Green enjoyed a 10-game win streak during 2017-19. The actual dedication for the facility occurred on Nov. 3, 1923, which means Dartmouth's game on ESPN on Nov. 3 will be exactly 100 years later.

Opening Day Win Streak Snapped

Dartmouth entered the 2023 season with the longest active win streak on opening day, emerging victorious in each of the season openers of the previous 12 campaigns. Of those 12 victories, only two were decided by single digits — 30-23 over Butler in 2013 and 22-21 over this year's opening opponent, New Hampshire. But 13 was not lucky for the Big Green as the 11th-ranked Wildcats handed Dartmouth a 24-7 defeat.

INTERIM HEAD COACH



Sammy McCorkle, who was on Buddy Teevens' staff since the head coach's return to Hanover in 2005, is filling in as the interim head coach for the 2023 season following Teevens' bicycle accident in March and subsequent passing on Sept. 19.

The 1996 graduate and three-time letter winner at the University of Florida is in his 19th year on the staff and helped guide the Big Green to the program's 20th Ivy League championship in 2021. From 2013-19, the Big Green were first or second in passes defended in the league, and his secondary was instrumental to the team's top-12 ranking in passing efficiency defense.

His special teams have excelled as well, ranking among the top 25 nationally in each of the four seasons in punt returns between 2017-21, including a pair of top-10 rankings.

McCorkle has coached eight players who have earned All-Ivy League First Team honors a total of 12 times, including two-time All-American CB Isiah Swann. No fewer than 25 of his defensive backs have received All-Ivy honors a combined 40 times, most recently safety Quentin Arello '22 (second team) in 2022.

The Dartmouth defense was 13th nationally in scoring defense in 2022 after placing among the top three in the previous three seasons, and the 2021 squad ranked fourth in fewest passing yards. And in the previous campaign of 2019, McCorkle's players were quite opportunistic during the season with four pick-sixes among the five defensive scores, fourth among FCS programs.

In 2018, the defense ranked second nationally in fewest points allowed and red zone defense, and fourth in total defense as Dartmouth finished the season ranked 15th in the coaches' poll. Three years prior, the squad led the na-

tion in those first two categories and was also fourth in total defense as the Big Green won a share of its first conference crown in 19 years. Cornerback Vernon Harris '16 earned a spot on the All-Ivy First Team in 2014 and '15, and two-time co-captain Garrett Waggoner garnered first-team honors as a safety in both 2012 and '13. McCorkle also mentored one of the finest cornerbacks and return men in Dartmouth history in Shawn Abuhoff '12, who earned first-team All-Ivy honors at both positions in 2010 and 2011.

In 2003-04, McCorkle was the head coach at Martin County High in Stuart, Florida. In 2003, he led Martin County to its best record in 10 years.

McCorkle previously coached at UT Martin, working with the secondary in 2000 before serving as the defensive coordinator (2001-02). From 1997-99, McCorkle was a graduate assistant at his alma mater, assisting the secondary and special teams coaches while also scouting opponents.

During the 1996-97 academic year, McCorkle taught PE while coaching the defensive backs and linebackers, and coordinating special teams at Spanish River High School in Boca Raton, Fla.

McCorkle was a standout defensive back on four SEC championship teams at Florida, competing in four bowl games (Gator, Sugar twice and Fiesta) and a national title game. McCorkle graduated with Florida's single-season and career records for blocked punts. He twice was named Florida's special teams player of the year.

He and his wife, Vicki, have three daughters, Madison, Allie and Campbell.

Helmet Decals in 2023

Dartmouth will sport a pair of decals on their helmets to honor two members of the team. One will have "JB" for offensive lineman Josh Balara '24, who passed away in March after battling cancer. The other will read "BT" for Buddy Teevens, who succumbed to injuries on Sept. 19 following a bicycle accident in March. The Big Green won't be the only team sporting the BT decal as all eight Ivy League teams will wear it throughout the fall in a show of support.

Great Scott!

There is something about Wildcat Stadium that brings out the best in Paxton Scott. Two years ago, the senior wide receiver caught four passes for a season-high 92 yards, including a catch-and-run 52-yard touchdown. In his return trip for opening day, Scott outdid himself with career highs of 10 catches and 153 yards, the most yards for a Dartmouth receiver since the final game of the 2019 campaign. Among his catches was another long catch-and-spring, this time covering a career-long 69 yards to set up the lone Big Green touchdown against 11th-ranked New Hampshire. On top of all that, he became the 24th player in Dartmouth history to collect 1,000 receiving yards (now at 1,050). With five more catches, he will become the 15th player to amass 100 in a Big Green career.

Macklin with the Smacklin

Agreed, that note headline is pretty lame. You come up with something better for senior line-

backer **Macklin Ayers** for recording his first career sack at No. 11 New Hampshire while making a total of nine tackles and breaking up a pair of passes. Last year's Ivy League leader in tackles per game (10.0) is picking up right where he left off, leading the team thus far this year (7.0).

Mullen It Over

That is slightly better, don't you think? Junior LB **Braden Mullen** also registered a sack against the 11th-ranked Wildcats, plus led the team with 10 stops and added another tackle for a loss to his ledger. Those 10 tackles matched his career high set last year against Columbia. And to tie these last three notes together, Scott, Ayers and Mullen were all Academic All-District I selections last season.

Mistakes Prove Costly at UNH

When playing a nationally ranked team, mis-cues on the field are difficult to overcome, something Dartmouth discovered the hard way. The Big Green committed three turnovers without getting one of their own, and those three giveaways turned into 10 Wildcat points. Dartmouth also had a pair of long runs called back — one which ended in the end zone — due to holding penalties. The Big Green had not coughed up the ball three times in any game since the 27-10 win over Princeton at Yankee Stadium in 2019, a span of 22 games, and then did so again the following week against Lehigh, though those turnovers did not matter in the 34-17 victory.

Co-Captains

Dartmouth is employing four captains for just the fifth time in program history. Two of those captains — S **Quinten Arello** and QB **Nick Howard**, both fifth-year players — are the first teammates to serve together in that capacity a second time. Joining those veterans on the leadership team are senior LB **Macklin Ayers** and senior RB **Tevita Moimoi**.

729 Wins All-Time

Back in 2018, Dartmouth won its 700th game, becoming just the sixth FCS teams to reach the milestone. That win came two games after playing its 1,200th contest as well. Now after 140-plus seasons and 1,242 games, the Big Green have a record of 729-467-46, a winning percentage of .605. Only 19 FCS teams can boast a win percentage of .600 or better (minimum 10 seasons). And only five teams have more victories.

Greene on Good Works Team

Allstate and the America Football Coaches Association (AFCA) announced their annual Good Works Team to recognize 22 football student-athletes for their community service on Sept. 12, and fifth-year long snapper **Josh Greene** was

among those selected for the prestigious team. Among his charitable works is founding Off the Bench Foundation, an organization that has collected and donated nearly \$10,000 worth of sporting goods to the Boys & Girls Club in West Palm Beach since 2012.

A Decade-Plus of Success

Dartmouth football returned to prominence throughout the 2010s decade, recording a record of 70-30 (.700) over the 10 years. Only eight teams enjoyed a higher winning percentage in that span. And with a third consecutive 9-1 season in 2021, the Big Green enjoyed more victories over a span of three seasons (27), four (35), five (39), six (48) and seven (56) than at any point in their history. Dartmouth has also added three Ivy League titles since 2015 to boost its conference-record total to 20 crowns since the league first officially formed for the 1956 season.

Preseason Poll

The Ivy League Preseason Media Poll was revealed last month with Dartmouth picked to finish where it ended last year — in sixth place. But generally speaking, the media has a tendency to underestimate the Big Green; Dartmouth has finished higher than its prognosticated place in 11 of the last 13 years, including 2021 when the team ended up sharing the title after being picked third. The Green certainly plan on making that 12 of the last 14 years. The complete poll can be found on page seven of these notes.

National Polls

The national polls don't generally give Dartmouth much credit in the preseason as well. But in three of the last four seasons, the Big Green have ended up ranked in the final polls, which counts quite a bit more. In 2018, the Big Green ended the season listed 15th by the coaches and 18th by Stats Perform. That AFCA ranking was the highest for Dartmouth since the Division I classification split into two subdivisions in 1978. In 2019, the Green managed to be ranked 21st by the AFCA and 22nd by Stats Perform. And just two years ago, Dartmouth ended the year 20th in the Stats Perform poll and 23rd by the AFCA. It marked the sixth time Dartmouth ended up in the final national FCS polls, the other years being 1990 (17th), 1996 (17th) and 2015 (23rd).

Still All-Time Ivy Champs

Since the Ivy League began play in 1956, no other school in the conference has won more football titles than Dartmouth with 20. The last time an Ancient Eight squad had more crowns than the Big Green was in 1961 when Yale had a grand total of two. The next season, Dartmouth equaled that amount and has never looked up at another team since. But Penn isn't far behind with 18 titles, while Harvard and Yale both have 17.

Returning All-Ivy Performers

Dartmouth had five players earn All-Ivy League honors after the 2022 season, three of

But the Green also have three others who have garnered All-Ivy consideration in previous years in QB **Nick Howard** on the first team, LB **Marques White** on the second team and WR **Paxton Scott** getting honorable mention, all in 2021.

Last to Kick Off

The Ivy League football schedule always starts a couple weeks after the rest of Division I, and the Big Green are no strangers to watching everyone else play before it kicks off. For the sixth time since 2012, Dartmouth was the last NCAA team to begin its season with the 6 p.m. kickoff in the Granite Bowl.

Dartmouth football teams have played before live television cameras 114 times since 1953 when the Big Green met Holy Cross at Manning Bowl in Lynn, Massachusetts, in the first New England college game televised nationally.

The 1953 game, won by the Crusaders, 28-6, was carried on NBC's 82-station network as part of the NCAA's restricted television agreement but wasn't seen on the Dartmouth campus since

there were no television stations serving northern New England at that time. The Dartmouth touchdown was scored by end Dave McLaughlin who later would serve as president of the college.

Frequently, during the early years of formal Ivy League football, Dartmouth played before major network regional audiences. Perhaps the most memorable game televised from Memorial Field in Hanover was the 1971 game with Cornell

that was ABC-TV's prime regional game with the broadcast team of Chris Schenkel, Bill Fleming and Bud Wilkinson. Cornell was undefeated and led by Heisman Trophy candidate Ed Marinaro. Dartmouth won, 24-14.

Dartmouth's record in televised games is 50 wins, 64 losses and one tie. The Big Green has a 25-36-0 record in games televised at Memorial Field.

GRANITE BOWL GOES TO NO. 11 NEW HAMPSHIRE
IN 24-7 OPENING DAY DEFEAT

DURHAM, N.H. — With winds gusting up over 30 miles an hour, the 11th-ranked New Hampshire Wildcats pulled away late from visiting Dartmouth on Saturday evening, taking a 24-7 decision over the Big Green at Wildcat Stadium to retain the Granite Bowl trophy. Dylan Laube had 180 rushing yards and scored a pair of touchdowns — one on the ground and one through the air — to lead UNH (2-1) to a victory in its home opener, while Paxton Scott had a career-high 153 receiving yards on nine grabs to lead Dartmouth (0-1) in its season opener.

“We played hard and fast, but we had some penalties and mistakes that put us in tough situations at times,” said interim head coach Sammy McCorkle after his first game at the helm of the Big Green. “We had our chances; we have the skills and the toughness to compete with any team, but we have to correct those mistakes, particularly against a team as good as New Hampshire. But one game does not make a season.”

The Big Green offense struggled through most of the first three quarters and trailed by a 10-0 count before Scott gave the team the jolt it was looking for. Quarterback Dylan Cadwallader found him between a seam 15 yards down the left sideline, and Scott sprinted all the way to the 10 before being corralled for a 69-yard gain. Two plays later, Q Jones burrowed his way up the middle for a 4-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter, suddenly bringing Dartmouth within three points.

A personal foul call after the touchdown, however, meant the Big Green had to kick off into the wind from their own 20. The squib kick was downed near midfield, and six plays later facing 3rd-and-4, Wildcat quarterback Max Brosmer — who was limited to a mere 67 passing yards while completing 11-of-23 throws — used Laube as a decoy on a keeper. He then was able to sprint 31 yards to the end zone, boosting the UNH lead back to 10 at 17-7 with 12:16 to play.

On Dartmouth’s ensuing possession, the Green also faced a crucial third-down situation at midfield. The snap one-hopped Cadwallader, and he was hit as he released his pass, allowing Max Oxendine to pluck the ball from the air and return the interception 43 yards down to the Dartmouth 27. Laube needed five rushes to cover those 27 yards, the last on a 4th-and-1 at the 2 for his second score of the night and a 24-7 advantage with 10:43 remaining.

Twice the Big Green drove into Wildcat territory in the final minutes, but turned the ball over on downs both times before UNH ran out the final 1:17 off the clock to close out its victory.

Both teams had scoring opportunities in the opening quarter but came away empty. On their

initial drive, the Big Green got as far as the UNH 22 before lining up for a 44-yard field goal. The Wildcats blasted through the line, however, allowing Randall Harris to block the kick, and Oxendine scooped the ball up. Only a tackle by Cadwallader (the holder on the attempt) at the Wildcat 47 kept Oxendine from taking the loose ball all the way to the end zone.

New Hampshire responded by marching down to the 2-yard line, but a dropped pass in the end zone on third down followed by a terrific pass breakup by cornerback Leonard St. Gourdin kept the game scoreless.

Once the field flipped to start the second quarter and the Wildcats had the wind at their back, they were able to put the first points of the game on the scoreboard on a 4-yard pass to Laube, his first of six catches for 31 yards on the evening. New Hampshire added a 33-yard field goal in the final minute before halftime to take a 10-point lead into the locker room.

Cadwallader finished the night 16-of-30 through the air for 195 yards, 153 of those going to Scott on a career-best 10 receptions. Scott’s total also pushed him past 1,000 yards for his career, becoming the 24th player in Dartmouth history to reach the milestone. The other half of the Big Green quarterback tandem, Nick Howard, ran for 62 yards on 10 carries while Jones amassed 55 yards on 14 rushes.

Linebackers Braden Mullen and Macklin Ayers led the Dartmouth defense with 10 and nine tackles, respectively, and each recorded a sack while the latter broke up a pair of passes as well. Joe Eichman led the Wildcats with eight tackles, 1.5 going for a loss while helping out on the lone sack.

When asked about how the team will consider this game going forward, safety and co-captain Quinten Arelló said, “Wipe it. Move on from it. We’ll study the film, note our mistakes and how to correct them, then wipe it. We have nine more games this season, and we expect to surprise some people. We know what we are capable of, we just need to execute better.”

Notes: The loss snapped Dartmouth’s 12-game winning streak in season openers, which was the longest among FCS schools entering the season ... UNH won its second straight in the series and holds a 21-19-2 advantage all-time between the only two Division I football teams in the state ... the Big Green have lost three consecutive non-conference games after winning the last 20 prior to this recent skid ... Dartmouth piled up more total yards on the night, 314-274, but the Wildcats won the battle of the clock, holding the ball for 33:26 ... both teams racked up eight penalties with the Big Green losing 70 yards and UNH 80.

Blackman Head Football Coach at Dartmouth, just four days past, the Big Green were able to control the game against Lehigh, running 30 more plays than the visitor as the Big Green (1-1) finished off their home opener with a 34-17 victory over the Mountain Hawks (1-3). The win was the first for interim head coach Sammy McCorkle, who took over leading the team after Teevens' bicycle accident back in March.

"I'm just so proud of the players," McCorkle said during a postgame press conference. "They did a phenomenal job. Everything we've asked them to do, they've done it. They are a fun group to coach, and I enjoy celebrating a win with our players and our coaches. Everyone has put in a lot of time and effort, and we know we have to continue to do that going forward."

Dylan Cadwallader completed 16-of-19 passes, one of which was a 7-yard fade into the end zone to give Dartmouth the lead just before halftime as Dartmouth racked up more than twice as many yards (346-169).

The ground game was running full force for the Big Green as Q Jones just missed out on his second career 100-yard game, taking the ball 17 times for 99 yards including a 10-yard touchdown late in the third quarter that boosted the lead to 21 points. Nick Howard ran for 70 yards on 16 carries, two of which ended in the end zone for his 11-career game with at least two touchdowns runs as Dartmouth finished the day with 219 rushing yards.

Cadwallader added 110 more yards and his scoring strike to the Big Green ledger through the air, and Howard added another 20 on 5-of-7 throws. Jones was the most frequent target with five grabs for a modest 21 yards, and Isaac Boston hauled in four more for a team-high 45 yards as nine different players caught at least one pass.

With the game tied at 10, Sean Williams returned a punt 17 yards (a warmup for a 35-yard return in the second half) to the Dartmouth 33 with 3:07 remaining until halftime. Cadwallader proceeded to guide the team methodically down the field in 11 plays, completing all six of his tosses along the way while Jones and Howard added runs of 11 and 12 yards, respectively. On first-and-goal from the 7, Cadwallader dropped a beautiful pass to Paxton Scott in stride in the back corner of the end zone with 35 seconds to spare for a 17-10 lead at the intermission.

Two plays proved to be difference makers in the third quarter, giving the ball to the Green deep in Lehigh territory. The second half began with five consecutive punts, but shortly after Williams' 35-yard return to midfield, Lehigh cornerback Donovan Lassiter intercepted a deep pass at its own five. That momentum shift lasted about as long as this sentence as cornerback Leonard St. Gourdin punched the ball free from quarterback Brayten Silbor at the Mountain Hawk 16, where Big Green defensive end Ejike Adele covered it up. Five rushes later, Howard had his second 1-yard touchdown run of the game for a 24-10 advantage.

When Lehigh failed to record a first down on its next possession, fifth-year senior Sam Koscho

was there to block the punt. Though the Mountain Hawks recovered it and tried to advance the ball — even trying a lateral to get into open ground — Williams made the tackle a yard shy of the marker, allowing Dartmouth to take over at the Lehigh 32.

"We knew they were blocking down, and it was just a matter of hitting the line correctly to not waste an extra step to get to the punter," Koscho said. "Hats off to (special teams coach Joe) Castellitto for telling me where to be to get that punt block."

Jones quickly converted the field position into points for Dartmouth in the final minute of the third quarter, gobbling up 22 yards on the first play and the final 10 on the next for his first touchdown run of the season.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, nickel-back Tyson McCloud broke up a third-down pass, and linebacker Danny Cronin plucked the ball out of the air for his first career interception at the Mountain Hawk 36. Dartmouth expertly worked the clock, taking up nearly eight minutes to drive a mere 27 yards in 13 plays before settling for a 26-yard Owen Zalc field goal, essentially sealing the game with a 34-10 lead and just 6:55 to play.

Lehigh tacked on a late touchdown by recovering a muffed punt at the Big Green five and took advantage of a pass interference call in the end zone on third down before finally punching the ball in on a 2-yard run by Jack DiPietro.

There was also a Dartmouth miscue on the game's first drive that gave the Mountain Hawks a sudden 7-0 lead. The Big Green drove down inside the 10-yard line, but Howard got stood up at the line of scrimmage on a run and Dean Colton stripped the ball free. Logan Jones spotted the ball on the turf at the 8, scooped it up and ran untouched the length of the field for the touchdown.

That sudden setback didn't faze the Big Green offense, however, as the unit marched 75 yards in 12 plays on the very next drive to tie the score. A 29-yard strike from Cadwallader to Isaac Boston was the big play, and Howard bulled his way in from a yard out.

In the second quarter, the two teams traded field goals — a 35-yarder by Zalc, a 26-yard by Nick Garrido — before Cadwallader found Scott for the go-ahead score.

The Dartmouth defense was stifling, yielding just eight first downs, a paltry 52 rushing yards and just one third-down conversion in 10 opportunities. Williams and Leonard St. Gourdin supplied six tackles apiece to lead the team effort.

The two Lehigh quarterbacks, Silbor and Dante Perri, combined to complete 19-of-30 passes for 115 yards with one interception.

Notes: Dartmouth has won eight consecutive home openers ... the Big Green improved to 3-5 all-time against Lehigh, beating the Mountain Hawks for the first time in 27 years when Dartmouth was a perfect 10-0 ... this was the first meeting between the two teams since 1999 ... following the game, there was a gathering of remembrance for Teevens with the football team, Teevens family and numerous community members in attendance.

BIG GREEN OUTLAST PENN IN OVERTIME
TO START IVY PLAY WITH A WIN

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — A year ago, Penn came to Hanover, kicked a field goal as time expired in regulation and defeated Dartmouth in double overtime. The Big Green did not let history repeat itself after the Quakers booted a game-tying, 51-yard field goal in the final minute at Franklin Field this afternoon, thanks to freshman Owen Zalc and his 37-yard field goal in overtime that lifted Dartmouth (2-1, 1-0 Ivy) to a 23-20 victory to start Ivy League play.

Penn (2-1, 0-1 Ivy) got the ball to start overtime, and was forced to settle for a 42-yard field goal attempt after throwing three incomplete passes. But Graham Gottlieb's kick failed to find its target, giving the Green a chance to win the game with just a field goal. Dartmouth took no chances in making a mistake in a game that featured four fumbles and two blocked kicks with quarterback Nick Howard running the ball three straight times to move the ball to the Quaker 20. Zalc trotted on the field, waited out an icing timeout by Penn and calmly kicked the ball through the goalposts for the Big Green's first overtime victory over the Quakers in four tries.

"I knew our offense was going to give me the best situation possible there," Zalc said during a postgame press conference. "I just do the same thing I do every time, the situation might be different but it's the same kick every time, same snap, same hold. They just put me in a position to do it and I do it."

Penn entered the fourth quarter trailing, 20-10, and it looked like the Big Green had put the game out of reach with a 74-yard touchdown run by quarterback Jackson Proctor, filling in for the other half of the quarterback tandem, Dylan Cadwallader. A holding penalty downfield cut the run short at 29 yards, however, and Dartmouth eventually had to punt, pinning the Quakers inside their own 1-yard line with a little more than 10 minutes to play.

The precarious position did not faze Penn quarterback Aidan Sayin, who finished the day 36-of-55 throwing the ball for 357 passing yards. A play-action pass across the middle turned into a 52-yard gain, and following a fourth-down and a third-down conversion, Sayin connected with Malone Howley on a 16-yard touchdown toss, closing the gap to three with nearly six minutes remaining.

Dartmouth was able to run two-and-a-half minutes off the clock, but that left enough time for Penn to push the ball down to the Big Green 29. But on 3rd-and-1, Sayin pitched the ball to his running back with linebacker Macklin Ayers waiting for him for a 4-yard loss. The Quakers turned to a bigger leg in punter Albert Jang, who supplied plenty of distance to spare on the 51-yard, game-tying field goal, which turned out for naught after Zalc's game-winner.

"We had it pretty locked down all day, but we knew it was going to go all the way to the end and then some," linebacker Braden Mullen said. "We had a couple mental errors in the last couple drives, so still a lot of room for improvement at the end of games. Our goal is to keep them scoreless in the fourth quarter, so we have things we still need to work on."

The first half was a wild affair as big plays on special teams provided scoring opportunities for

both teams early. After Penn failed to get a first down on the game's opening drive, Niko Schwikal broke through the line, blocked the punt and recovered it at the 1. Howard took the honors in carrying the ball over the threshold for a 7-0 lead barely one minute into the contest.

When Derrell Porter forced a fumble and Sean Williams recovered it at the Penn 20, Dartmouth had a golden opportunity to extend its lead. But Quaker Joey Slackman blocked Zalc's 32-yard field goal attempt and his teammate, Jonathan Melvin, scooped up the loose ball, returning it to midfield. Penn was able to advance inside the Big Green 5 before settling for a 21-yard Gottlieb field goal.

The Big Green got those three points back early in the second quarter when Zalc drilled a 28-yarder. But the Quakers pulled even when Sayin faked a keeper to suck in the defense and connected on a short pass with Malachi Hosely, who sprinted the rest of the 52 yards to the end zone.

Two more Penn miscues would play a big role late in the half. Sayin fumbled the snap on a third-down play and linebacker Braden Mullen — who also had a pair of sacks on the day — came up with the ball at the Quaker 36. Seven plays later, Howard dropped a perfect pass in the corner of the end zone to tight end Chris Corbo from 14 yards out, giving the Green the 17-10 lead with 44 seconds still showing.

Defensive end Joe Onuwabagbe forced another Penn turnover with 31 seconds before the intermission, stripping Sayin in the backfield for his first career sack and recovering the fumble at the Quaker 20. Zalc booted a 26-yard field goal as time expired for the 20-10 lead at the break.

Although Penn outgained the Big Green by 143 yards (394-251), the Dartmouth defense completely shut down the running game, yielding a mere 11 yards on 21 carries with the help of three sacks. Cornerback Leonard St. Gourdin had a game-high nine tackles for the Green, which as a team recorded 10 tackles for a loss totaling 38 yards.

"We knew it was going to be a battle, knew that there would be some bad plays on our side, but we just had to forget about it, correct it and move on," said interim head coach Sammy McCorkle. "I thought our guys did a very good job of doing just that. This was a typical Dartmouth-Penn game, always down to the wire, overtime classics. I thought all three phases of our game — offense, defense and special teams — came up with big plays when we needed them, and that was the difference for us."

Howard provided 132 yards of total offense, grinding out 58 yards on 19 carries and completing 9-of-18 passes for 74 more.

Bryce Myers was Penn's leading receiver with 103 yards on eight catches.

Notes: This is just the third game in the last 19 years in which Dartmouth converted three field goals ... the Big Green recovered three fumbles in a game for the first time in five years ... Dartmouth has defeated Penn in five of the last six meetings and is now 39-49-2 all-time against the Quakers.
